Northern Province—Mullaitivu District.

Limits of the Town of Vavuniya as defined by Proclamation dated June 24, 1899.

7.—Vavuniya Town.

Boundaries: North by Vavuniya fields; east by Vavuniya tank and the road from there to Susaippillaiyakulam; south by the bund reservation of Susaippillaiyakulam, north-central road and the outer circular road between it and Vairavarpuliyankulam; west by the outer circular road.

And whereas the Governor in Council is satisfied that the legislature of the British possession hereinafter mentioned has made adequate provision for the recognition in that possession of probates and administrations granted by the Supreme Court of this Colony :

Now, therefore, the Governor in Council doth hereby order and direct that the provisions of Part VI. of the Probates Ordinance, 1897, relating to colonial probates shall apply to the British possession of Ceylon in addition to the British possessions mentioned in the list set forth on pages 175 and 176 of the Regulations of Hong Kong, 1844-1925.

BY-LAWS RELATING TO THE USE OF PUBLIC GROUNDS, &c.

1. No open spaces or places for public recreation within the Matale Urban District Council limits which belong to or are in charge of the District Council, shall without the written permission of the Chairman be used for any purpose prohibited by the Chairman by public notice.

2. (a) No Person using any such space or place shall commit a disturbance there or behave so as to annoy other persons lawfully using it. Such grounds will be open to the use of the public during the hours of daylight, subject to the condition of good behaviour and in conformity with the rules laid down by the District Council.

(b) No person using any such space or place with a tank in it shall bathe in such tank, or do any other act tending to foul the water thereof.

(c) No person using any such space or place shall commit any nuisance thereon, or pluck plants or flowers growing thereon without the leave of the Chairman, or do any injury to the trees and shrubs growing thereon.

3. (a) No person shall use any seat provided by the District Council in any such space or place for any purpose other than sitting, and no person shall place either of his feet on such seats.

(b) No person suffering from any loathsome, infectious, or contagious disease shall make use of any such seat.

(c) No male above the age of 12 years shall make any use of any such seat which is labelled "For Women and Children only." The burden of proving that he is under 12 years shall be on the person charged under this by-law.

4. Any person committing a breach of any of the above by-laws shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs. 50, and in the case of a continuing offence to an additional fine not exceeding Rs. 25 for every day during which the offence is committed after conviction.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended July 27, 1929.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 144 (1 European, 11 Burghers, 73 Sinhalese, 30 Tamils, 21 Moors, 6 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1929, viz., 267,667) was 28.1, as against 35.5 in the preceding week, 30.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 36.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 179 (7 Burghers, 101 Sinhalese, 31 Tamils, 28 Moors, 4 Malays, and 8 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 34.9, as against 29.8 in the previous week, 29.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.3 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 179 total deaths, 38 were of infants under one year of age, as against 32 in the preceding week, 36 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 8.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty-one deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents) 5 in St. Paul's, 4 in Kotahena North, 2 each in Slave Island and Wellawatta South, and 1 each in Maradana East and Maradana South, as against 26 in the previous week, and 23 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Nineteen deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 10 in New Bazaar, 4 in St. Paul's, 2 in Slave Island, and 1 each in Kotahena South, Maradana hospital (of a non-resident) and Wellawatta North. The number registered during the previous week was also 19, and the weekly average for last year was 8.

(c) Five deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 each in New Bazaar and Maradana North, and 1 in Maradana hospital. The number registered during the previous week was also 5, and the weekly average for last year was 3.

2. (a) Twelve deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents) 2 in St. Paul's and 1 each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, Maradana North, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta North, as against 9 in the previous week, and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Three deaths from *Phthisis* of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Three deaths from *Enteric fever* including 2 deaths of non-residents were registered in Maradana hospitals, as against 2 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. Fourteen deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 8 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 7 from *Worms*, 6 each from *Dysentery*, *Debility*, and *Puerperal Septicaemia*, 5 from *Tetanus*, 3 from *Diarrhoea*, 2 from *Accidents*, 1 from *Suicide*, and 61 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Eighteen cases of *Chickenpox*, 12 of *Measles* and 8 of *Enteric fever* were reported during the week as against 26, 18, and 12, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.7°, against 81.5° in the preceding week, and 80.9° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.886 in., against 29.873 in. in the preceding week, and 29.889 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.04 in., against 0.08 in. in the preceding week, and 0.06 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

 - (e) To carry on in the Island of Ceylon or elsewhere the trade or business of ship builders or ship wrights, and of purchasing, hiring, selling, assembling, or otherwise acquiring motor cars, motor vans, buses, motor cycles, cycle cars, motors, scooters, cycles, bicycles, carriages, carts, trucks, launches, boats, vans, aeroplanes, hydroplanes, and other vehicles and conveniences of all kinds, to purchase, take in exchange, sell, hire, or otherwise acquire, and hold boats, barges, lighters, tugs, launches, and vessels of any description whatsoever to purchase, take in exchange, acquire, and hold live and dead stock, chattels, and effects required for the maintenance and working of the business of carriers by land or by water or by air of proprietors of docks, wharves, jetties, piers, warehouses, and boats and of tug-owners and wharfingers for the purpose of landing and shipping passengers or luggage or otherwise, and all machinery materials, component parts, accessories, and fittings of all kinds applicable or used as accessory thereto, and of letting or supplying all or any of the things hereinbefore specified, and of repairing and maintaining the same respectively, whether belonging to this Company or not; and of selling exchanging or otherwise dealing in the same respectively, or of any other business which can or may conveniently be carried on in connection with the above respectively.
 - (f) To carry on in the Island of Ceylon and elsewhere business as tourists' agents and contractors, and to facilitate travelling, and to provide for tourists and travellers, or promote the provision of conveniences of all kinds in the way of through tickets, sleeping cars or berths, reserved places, hotel and lodging accommodation, guides, safe deposits, inquiry bureaus, libraries, lavatories, reading rooms, baggage, transport, and otherwise.
 - (g) To carry on all or any of the business of importers, exporters, charterers of ships or other vessels, warehousemen, merchants ship, and insurance brokers, carriers, forwarding agents, wharfingers, coopers, carpenters, and mechanical engineers.
 - (h) To establish in any part or parts of the world branch establishments (or) agencies for carrying on developing the business of the Company or any branch thereof, and generally to carry on the business of merchants, exporters, importers, traders, engineers, or any other trade, business, or undertaking whatsoever.
 - (i) To carry on in the Island of Ceylon and elsewhere the business of manufacturers and dealers in, plant, machinery, motor cars, boats, aeroplanes, and accessories thereof of garage keepers and suppliers of, and dealers in petrol, electricity, and other motive power to motors and other things mentioned or referred to in the clause (e) hereof and in this clause.
 - (j) To carry on in the Island of Ceylon and elsewhere business as jewellers, gold and silversmiths, dealers in China curiosities, articles of vertu, coins, medals, bullion, and precious stones, and as manufacturers of and dealers in gold and silver plate, plated articles, watches, clocks, chronometers, and optical and scientific instruments, and appliances of every description, and as commission agents and general merchants.
 - (k) To carry on business and to act as merchants, traders, commission agents, ship owners, carriers, or in any other capacity in the Island of Ceylon and elsewhere, and to import, export, buy, sell, barter, exchange, pledge, make advances upon, or otherwise deal in goods, produce, articles, and merchandise by wholesale or by retail.
 - (l) To purchase, lease, take in exchange, hire, or otherwise acquire, or to enter into any agreement for the purchase, lease, exchange, or hire of any other land or lands, or any share or shares thereof, and any buildings, mines, minerals, mining and mineral properties and rights, machinery implements, tools, live and dead stock, stores, effects and other property, real or personal, movable or immovable of any kind, and any contracts, rights, easements, patents, licences or privileges in Ceylon or elsewhere (including the benefit of any copy-right, trade mark, or trade secret), which may be thought necessary or convenient for the purpose of the Company's business, and to erect, construct, maintain, or alter any buildings, machinery, plant, roads, ways, or other works, or methods of communication.

- (m) To clear, open, plant, cultivate, improve, and develop the said properties or any portion thereof, and any other land or lands that may be purchased, leased, or otherwise acquired by the Company in Ceylon or elsewhere; or portions thereof, as tea and rubber estates, or with any other products, trees, plants or crops that may be approved by the Company, and to plant, grow, and produce tea, rubber, coconuts, coffee, cinchona, cacao, cardamoms, rice, rhea, ramie plants, trees, and other natural products in Ceylon or elsewhere.
- (n) To build, make, construct, equip, maintain, improve, alter, and work tea and rubber factories, cacao, coconuts, and coffee curing mills, and other manufactories, buildings, erections, roads, tramways, railways, canals, water ways, and other works conducive to any of the Company's objects or to contribute or subsidize such.
- (o) To enter into any agreement with any company or person for the working of any factories erected or leased, or for the manufacture and preparation for market of tea, rubber, or any other produce in such or any other factories.
- (p) To buy, sell, warehouse, transport, trade, and deal in tea, rubber, coconuts, cacao, coffee, other plants, seeds, rice, other food stuffs, products, wares, merchandise, articles, and things of any kind whatever.
- (q) To work mines or quarries and to find, win, get, work, crush, smelt, manufacture, or otherwise deal with ores, metals, minerals, oils, precious and other stones, deposits and products, and generally to carry on the business of miners, manufacturers, growers, planters, and exporters of tea, rubber, cacao, coconuts, and other products, or any such business on behalf of the Company, or as agents for others, and on commission or otherwise.
- (r) To cultivate, manage, and superintend estates and properties in Ceylon and elsewhere, and generally to undertake the business of estate agents in Ceylon and elsewhere, to act as agents for the investment, loan, payment, transmission, and collection of money, and for the purchase, sale, improvement, development, and management of property, including concerns and undertaking, and to transact any other business of agents of any kind.
- (s) To engage, employ, maintain, and dismiss managers, superintendents, assistants, clerks, coolies, and other servants and labourers, and to remunerate any such at such rate as shall be thought fit, and to grant pensions or gratuities to any such or the widow or children of any such.
- (t) To carry on in the Island of Ceylon and elsewhere all or any of the following business, to wit:—booksellers, stationers, and advertising agents, money changers, dealers in exchange and currency, manufacturers of and dealers in furniture, suppliers of provisions, both solid and liquid refreshment, caterers and contractors, carriers of passengers and goods by land, water, or air, forwarding agents, merchants, exporters, importers, traders, engineers, and any other business or businesses which can or may be conveniently carried on in connection with any of them.
- (u) To enter into any arrangements with any authorities, Government, municipal, local, or otherwise, that may seem conducive to the Company's objects or any of them, and to obtain from any such authority any rights, privileges, rebates, and concessions which the Company may think it desirable to obtain, and to carry out, exercise, and comply with such arrangements, rights, privileges, and concessions.
- (v) To enter into partnership or into any arrangement for sharing profits, union of interest, reciprocal concession, amalgamation, or co-operation with any person, corporation, or company carrying on or about to carry on or engage in any business or transaction which this Company is authorized to carry on or engage in, or any business or transaction capable of being conducted so as directly or indirectly to benefit this Company, to take or otherwise acquire and hold shares or stock in or securities of and to subsidize or otherwise assist any such Company, and to sell, hold, or re-issue with or without guarantee, or otherwise deal with such shares or securities, and to form, constitute, or promote or assist in the information, constitution, or promotion of any other company or companies for the purpose of acquiring all or any of the property, right, and liabilities of this Company, or for any other purpose which may seem directly or indirectly calculated to benefit this Company and to guarantee the payment of any debentures or other securities issued by any such company or companies.
- (w) To procure the Company to be registered or established or authorized to do business in the Island of Ceylon and elsewhere.
- (x) To lend money on any terms and in any manner and on any security and in particular on the security of land, buildings, plantations, factories, growing crops, produce, bills of exchange, promissory notes, bonds, bills of lading, warrants, stocks, shares, debentures, or book debts, or without any security at all.
- (y) To borrow or raise money for the purpose of the Company or receive money on deposit from building contractors or other persons as security for the performance or discharge of any obligation or liability of the Company and to create, execute, grant, or issue any mortgages, mortgage debentures, debenture stock, bonds, or obligations of the Company either at par, premium, or discount, and either redeemable, irredeemable or perpetual, secured upon all or any part of the undertaking, revenue, rights, and property of the Company, present and future, including uncalled capital or the unpaid calls of the Company.
- (z) Generally to purchase, take on lease, or in exchange, hire, or otherwise acquire any real or personal property, and any rights, privileges, licences, or easements which the Company may think necessary or convenient with reference to any of these objects and capable of being profitably dealt with in connection with any of the Company's property or rights for the time being.
- (z 1) To sell the undertaking of the Company or any part thereof for such consideration as the Company may think fit, and in particular for shares, debentures, or securities of any other Company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of this Company.
- (z 2) To invest and deal with the moneys of the Company not immediately required, upon such securities and in such manner as may from time to time be determined.
- (z 3) To sell, let, lease, undertake, exchange, surrender, transfer, deliver, charge, mortgage, or dispose of, turn to account, or otherwise deal with all or any of the property and rights of the Company whether in consideration of rents, moneys, or securities for money, shares, debentures, or securities in any other Company or for any other consideration.
- (z 4) To pay for any lands, real or personal, immovable or movable, estate, property, or assets of any kind acquired or to be acquired by the Company, or for any services rendered or to be rendered to the Company, and generally to pay or discharge any consideration to be paid or given by the Company in money or in shares (whether fully paid up or partly paid up), or in debentures, debenture stock, or obligations of the Company, or partly in one way and partly in another, or otherwise howsoever, with power to issue any shares either as fully paid or partly paid up for such purpose.
- (z 5) To accept for consideration for the sale or disposal of any lands and real or personal, immovable or movable, estate, property, or assets of the Company, or in discharge of any other consideration to be received by the Company, money or shares (whether fully paid or partly paid up) of any Company, or debentures or debenture stock, or obligations of any Company or person or partly one and partly any other.

- (z 6) To distribute among the Shareholders in specie any property of the Company whether by way of dividend or upon a return of capital, but so that no distribution amounting to a reduction of capital be made except with the sanction for the time being required by law.
- (z 7) To cause or permit any debenture stock, bonds, debentures, mortgages, charges, incumbrances, liens, or securities of, or belonging to, or made or issued by, the Company or affecting its property or rights or any of the terms thereof to be renewed, extended, varied, redeemed, exchanged, transferred, or satisfied as shall be thought fit, also to pay off and reborrow the moneys secured thereby or any part or parts thereof.
- (z 8) To draw, make, accept, and endorse bills of lading, warrants, bills of exchange, promissory notes, and other transferable or negotiable instruments for the purposes of the Company.
- (z 9) To acquire by purchase in money shares, bonds, or otherwise, and undertake all or any of the business, property, assets, and liabilities of any person or company carrying on any business in Ceylon or elsewhere which this Company is authorized to carry on or possessed of property suitable for the purposes of this Company.
- (z 10) To promote and establish any other company whatsoever and to subscribe to and hold the shares or stock of any other company or any part thereof.
- (z 11) To establish and support or to aid in the establishment and support of associations, institutions, funds, and trusts calculated to benefit any of the employees and ex employees of the Company, or the dependents or connections of such persons, and to grant pensions and allowances and to make payments towards insurance, and to subscribe or guarantee money for charitable or benevolent objects, or for any exhibition or for any public, general, or useful objects.
- (z 12) To promote, join, and subscribe to federations or combinations for the purpose of protecting or encouraging any trade or industry, or for protection of employers or workmen, or for promoting co-operation between employers and employed, and to enter into arrangements or agreements with workmen and employees of the Company for participation in profits or joint control or otherwise as may be deemed expedient.
- (z 13) To do all such things as may be necessary, incidental, conducive, or convenient to the attainment of the above objects or any of them and in case of doubt as to what shall be so necessary, incidental, conducive, or convenient as aforesaid the decision of an Extraordinary General Meeting shall be conclusive.

It being hereby declared that in the foregoing clauses (unless a contrary intention appears) the word "person" includes any number of persons and corporation, and that the word "company" except where used in reference to this Company shall be deemed to include any partnership or other body of persons whether incorporated or not incorporated and whether domiciled or incorporated in the Island of Ceylon or elsewhere, and that the objects specified in any one paragraph are not to be limited or restricted by reference to or inference from any other paragraph or the name of the Company.

4. The liability of the Shareholders is limited.

5. The nominal capital of the Company is Five hundred thousand Rupees (Rs. 500,000), divided into Five thousand (5,000) shares of Hundred Rupees (Rs. 100) each, with power to increase or reduce the capital, to consolidate or subdivide the shares into shares of larger or smaller amounts, and to issue all or any part of the original or any increased capital with any special or preferential rights or privileges, or subject to any special terms and conditions, and either with or without any special designation, and also from time to time to alter, modify, commute, abrogate, or deal with any rights, privileges, terms, conditions, or designations for the time being attached to any class of shares in accordance with the regulations for the time being of the Company.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF BARTLAM AND COMPANY, LIMITED.

1. The regulation contained in the table marked "C" in the schedule in the Company's Ordinance, No. 4 of 1861 (hereinafter called Table "C") shall apply to the Company and be deemed to be incorporated herewith except so far as they are herein expressly or by implication modified or excluded or declared not to apply and in the construction of these presents words importing the masculine gender only shall include the feminine gender, and the words importing the singular number only shall include the plural number and *vice versa*, and words importing persons shall include corporations.

2. Regulation 24 of Table "C" is expressly excluded and the following regulation substituted therefor, namely:—
"subsequent general meeting shall be held at least once in every year at such time and place as may be determined by the Directors."

3. The following new regulations shall be added after regulation 10 of Table "C" under the Heading "Transfer of Shares," namely:—

TRANSFER OF SHARES.

(10 A) A share may be transferred by a member or other person entitled to transfer to any member selected by the transferor, but save as aforesaid and save as provided by regulation (10 F) hereof, no share shall be transferred to a person who is not a member so long as any member (or person selected by the Directors as one whom it is desirable in the interests of the Company to admit to membership) is willing to purchase the same at the fair value.

(10 B) Except where the transfer is made pursuant to regulation (10 F) hereof, the person proposing to transfer any shares (hereinafter called the proposing transferor) shall give notice in writing (hereinafter called a transfer notice), to the Company that he desires to transfer the same. Such notice shall specify the sum he fixes as the fair value, and shall constitute the Company his agent for the sale of the share to any member of the Company (or person selected as aforesaid) at the price so fixed, or, at the option of the purchaser, at the fair value to be fixed by the Auditor in accordance with these regulations. A transfer notice may include several shares, and in such case shall operate as if it were a separate notice in respect of each. A transfer notice shall not be revocable except with the sanction of the Directors.

(10 C) If the Company, within the space of twenty-eight days after being served with a transfer notice, find a member (or person selected as aforesaid) willing to purchase the share (hereinafter called the purchasing member), and shall give notice thereof to the proposing transferor, he shall be bound, upon payment of the fair value, to transfer the share to the purchasing member.

(10 D) In case any difference arises between the proposing transferor and the purchasing member as to the fair value of the share, the Auditor shall, on the application of either party, certify in writing the sum which, in his opinion, is the fair value, and such sum shall be deemed to be the fair value, and in so certifying the Auditor shall be considered to be acting as an expert, and not as an arbitrator.

(10 E) If in any case the proposing transferor, after having become bound as aforesaid makes default in transferring the share the Company may receive the purchase money, and shall thereupon cause the name of the purchasing member to be entered in the register as the holder of the share, and shall hold the purchase money in trust for the proposing transferor. The receipt of the Company for the purchase money shall be a good discharge to the purchasing member, and after his name has been entered in the register in purported exercise of the aforesaid power the validity of the proceedings shall not be questioned by any person.

(10 F) If the Company shall not within the space of twenty-eight days after being served with a transfer notice find a member (or person selected as aforesaid) willing to purchase the shares and give notice in manner aforesaid, the proposing transferor shall at any time within three calendar months afterwards be at liberty to sell and transfer the shares (or those not placed) to any person at any price.

(10 G) The Company in General Meeting may make and from time to time vary rules as to the mode in which any shares specified in any transfer notice shall be ordered to the members, and as to their rights in regard to the purchase thereof, and in particular may give any member or class of members a preferential right to purchase the same. Until otherwise determined every such share shall be offered to the members in such order as shall be determined by lots drawn in regard thereto, and the lots shall be drawn in such manner as the Directors think fit.

4. A quorum at any General Meeting or Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company shall consist of not less than 3 Shareholders, and regulation 32 of Table "C" is modified accordingly.

5. Regulations 39, 42, 43, and 44 are expressly excluded and the following regulations substituted therefor, namely:—

(a) On a show of hands every Shareholder present in person or represented by attorney or by proxy shall have one vote, and upon a poll every member present in person or represented by attorney or by proxy shall have one vote for each share of which he is the holder.

(b) No Shareholder shall be entitled to vote at any General Meeting unless all calls or other sums presently payable by him in respect of shares in the Company have been paid, and until he has been the possessor of such shares for a minimum period of three months.

(c) The instrument appointing a proxy shall be in writing under the hand of the appointer or of his attorney duly authorized in writing or if the appointer is a corporation either under the common seal or under the hand of any officer or attorney so authorized.

(d) The instrument appointing a proxy and the power of attorney or other authority (if any) under which it is signed or a notarially certified copy of that power or authority shall be deposited in the registered office of the Company, not less than 48 hours before the time for holding the meeting at which the person named in the instrument proposes to vote, and in default the instrument of proxy shall not be treated as valid. No instrument appointing a proxy shall be in force for more than one month from the date of its execution.

(e) An instrument appointing a proxy may be in the following form or in any other form which the Directors shall approve:—

6. Regulation 45 of Table "C" is expressly excluded and the following substituted therefor, namely:—

DIRECTORS.

(45 A) The number of Directors shall never be less than two or more than five, but this regulations shall be construed as being directory only, and the continuing Directors or Director may act notwithstanding any number of vacancies.

(45 B) As remuneration for their services the Directors shall each be entitled to appropriate such sum as shall be provided for by the Company in General Meeting.

7. Regulation 46 of Table "C" is expressly excluded and the following substituted therefor, namely:—

(46) Edward Reginald Bartlam (who is herein referred to as the life Director) shall (subject to the provisions of regulation 48), be entitled to hold office so long as he lives. The said Edward Reginald Bartlam and Peter Wilberforce Robinson shall be the first Directors of the Company. The Ordinary Directors (which term shall mean the Directors for the time being of the Company other than the life Director and any alternate Director appointed by a life Director) shall hold office until the First Ordinary General Meeting of the Company when they shall retire, but shall be eligible for re-election.

(46 A) A life Director shall, subject to the provisions of regulation 48, have power to appoint any member of the Company or any other person to be an alternate Director during his absence from Ceylon, and such appointment shall have effect and such appointee while he holds office shall be entitled to notice of meetings of Directors and to attend and vote thereat accordingly, and generally to exercise all the rights and functions of such absent Director subject to any limitations or restrictions in the instrument appointing him, but he shall not require any qualification, and he shall *ipso facto* vacate office if and when his appointer returns to Ceylon or vacates office as a life Director.

Any appointment under this regulation shall be effected by an instrument in writing under the hand of the appointor, and any appointment so effected can be cancelled by the appointor by an instrument in writing under his hand, and such alternate Director shall vacate office as soon as notice in writing of the execution of such instrument of cancellation shall be received at the office of the Company, such alternate Director may be one of the ordinary Directors of the Company in which case he shall be entitled to vote in both capacities, but one person holding the office of ordinary Director and alternate Director shall not be a quorum under regulation 56. An alternate Director shall in the absence of a Direction to the contrary in the instrument appointing him be entitled to receive notice of and to vote at General Meetings of the Company on behalf of his appointor and generally to represent his appointor in the same manner as if he had been appointed a general proxy under the provisions of these regulations.

(46 B) One or more of the Directors may be appointed by the Director to act as Secretary, Manager or Managing Director, or Managing Directors, and (or) Agent, or Agents of the Company, Visiting Agent or Superintendent, for such time and on such terms as the Director may determine or may fix by agreement with the person or persons appointed to the office, and they may from time to time revoke such appointment and appoint another or other Secretary, Manager, Managing Director or Managing Directors, and (or) Agent, or Agents of the Company, Visiting Agent or Superintendent. The Directors may confer on the Managing Director or Managing Directors all or any duties and powers that might be conferred on any Manager of the Company. If any Director shall be called upon to perform any extra services, the Directors may arrange with such Director for such special remuneration for such services either by way of salary, commission, or the payment of a lump sum of money as they shall think fit.

(46 c) A Director may with the consent of his co-Directors be absent from the meetings of the Directors for such period or periods as the remaining Directors shall think fit.

(46 d) Each Director shall have the power with the consent of the majority of the Directors to appoint in writing any person whether a Shareholder of the Company or not to act as Deputy Director in his place during his absence or inability to act as Director and at his discretion to remove such Deputy Director.

(46 e) A meeting of the Directors for the time being at which a quorum is present shall be competent to exercise all or any of the authorities, powers, and discretions by or under the regulation of the Company for the time being vested in or exercisable by the Directors generally.

(46 f) A resolution in writing signed by all of the Directors shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Directors duly called and constituted, and every such resolution shall be as soon as practicable entered on the minutes of the Directors' meetings.

(46 g) The Directors shall have power to procure from time to time in the usual course of business such temporary advances on the produce in hand as they may find necessary or expedient, Also from time to time at their discretion to borrow or raise from the Directors or other persons any sum or sums of money for the purpose of the Company.

(46 h) The seal of the Company shall not be affixed to any instrument except in the presence of two or more of the Directors or of one Director and the Secretary or Secretaries who shall attest the sealing thereof; such attestation on the part of the Secretaries, in the event of a firm or registered company being the secretaries, being signified by a partner or duly authorized manager, director, secretary, attorney, or agent of the said firm or company signing for and on behalf of the said firm or company as such secretaries.

8. Regulation 48 of Table "C" is expressly excluded and the following substituted therefor, namely :—

(48) The Office of Director shall be vacated :—

- (a) If he accepts or holds any office or place of profit under the Company other than Managing Director, General Manager, Managing Engineer, Agent, Visiting Agent, Secretary of the Company, a Trustee for Debenture holders.
- (b) If he accepts or hold any office or place of profit under the Company in regard to any work which did not have the expressed sanction and approval of the Company at a meeting of the Directors.
- (c) If he becomes bankrupt or insolvent, or suspends payment, or files a petition for the liquidation of his affairs, or compounds with his creditors.
- (d) If by reason of mental or bodily infirmity he becomes incapable of acting.
- (e) If he ceases to have his ordinary place of residence in Ceylon or is absent from Ceylon without leave from the Board for a period of three consecutive months, provided that the office of life Director shall not be vacated by reason merely of absence from Ceylon for any period.

No Director shall be disqualified from holding office by reason of entering into any contract with or doing any work for the Company or by reason of his being a member of any corporation, company, or firm which has entered into any contract with, or done any work for the Company, or by reason of his being agent, or secretary, or solicitor, or being a member of a firm who are agents, or secretaries, or solicitors of the Company; nevertheless, he shall disclose to the Directors his interests in any contract work or business in which he may be personally interested, and shall not vote in respect of any matters connected with any such contract, work, or business.

9. Regulation 64 of Table "C" is expressly excluded and the following substituted therefor, namely :—

(64 A) The Directors may at such times as the circumstances of the Company warrant the same declare dividends to be paid to the Shareholders in proportion to the number of their shares and the amount paid up or deemed to be paid thereon respectively.

(64 b) The Directors may if they shall think fit declare from time to time such interim dividends as in their opinion the position of the Company justifies.

Surveying and Levelling Examination.

THE examination for the Surveyor-General's licence in surveying and levelling (Ordinance No. 26 of 1909), will be held in two parts, written and practical. The written examination will begin on October 14, and the practical examination on November 12, 1929.

2. The examination will be held in Colombo only.

5. The subjects of the written examination will be as follows:—

(i.) *English*—one paper.—[An exercise in composition and questions set to test the candidate's knowledge and command of English.]

(ii.) *Arithmetic and Algebra*—one paper.—[*Arithmetic*.—The principles and process of arithmetic applied to whole numbers and vulgar and decimal fractions. The metric system. Approximations to a specified degree of accuracy. Contracted methods of multiplication and division of decimals. Ratio and proportion; percentage. Averages. Practical applications of arithmetic.

Algebra.—Symbolical expression of general results in arithmetic algebraic laws and their applications. Factors of simple binomial or quadratic expressions; Equations of the first or second degree, and problems leading thereto. Square root. Graphs of simple rational integral algebraic functions. Arithmetical and harmonical progression. Geometrical progression. Theory of indices. Logarithms and the use of logarithmic tables. Binomial theorem for a positive integral index.]

(iii.) *Geometry and Trigonometry*—one paper.

[*Geometry*.—The subjects of Euclid I.—IV., with simple deductions, including easy loci and the areas of triangles and parallelograms, of which the bases and altitudes are given commensurable lengths. (All proofs of geometrical theorems must be geometrical. Euclid's proofs will not be insisted upon.) Similar figures. Mensuration of the circle. Mensuration of the simpler solid bodies, namely, the cube, the rectangular block, the tetrahedron, the sphere, the cylinder, the wedge, the pyramid, and the cone.

Trigonometry.—Up to and including the solution of triangles, together with the practical solutions of triangles and applications, and numerical examples involving the use of logarithmic and other tables.]

(iv.) *Surveying*.—one paper.—[Chain surveying. The transit and cradle theodolites, their use and their adjustments. Theodolite and compass traverses. Curve ranging. Subtense methods and tachometry. Plane table surveying. Plane triangulation. The determination of azimuth.]

(v.) *Levelling*—one paper.—[The dumpy, Y and Cooke's reversible levels, their use and their adjustments. The practice and theory of levelling. Computation of earth-work. Road and railway surveys and setting out. Surveys for water supply works. Contours and the calculation of contents therefrom.]

The percentages of marks required for a pass will be: in papers (i.), (ii.), and (iii.) 40 per cent. in each paper and 50 per cent. in aggregate; in papers (iv.), and (v.) 60 per cent.

6. Candidates in surveying only will be required to pass in papers (i.)—(iv.) inclusive; and candidates in levelling only in paper (v.).

7. Candidates who fail in the written examination will not be required to present themselves for the practical examination.

8. Candidates who pass the written examination will be duly notified of the time and place of the practical examination, which will be set on the syllabus in surveying and levelling of the written examination.

9. Candidates will work in the field between hours fixed by the Examiner, and must produce instruments in good order. Defects in instruments will not be accepted

as an excuse for bad work. Candidates found to be in communication with anyone during examination hours will be disqualified.

10. All candidates must provide their own instruments, poles, pickets, drawing boards, drawing materials, stationery, coolies, &c., and no assistance in providing requirements will be given in any way.

11. No application will be accepted after September 13, 1929.

In the event of consent being given by the lessor to the lessee for the erection of any temporary building on the said premises, such building shall be according to a plan to be approved by the Municipal Council of Colombo.

3. The lessee shall cultivate, maintain, and keep up the said premises in a good and husbandlike manner; and shall within one year from the commencement of the term, thoroughly weed and clear the said premises, and shall thereafter, during the continuation of the said term, previously to the month of October in every year, pull and root up all herbs and weeds growing upon the said premises, and once in every year shall cleanse the ditches, gutters, and water-courses; and in case of default thereof in the last year, the lessee shall permit the lessor and all persons authorized by him to enter and weed the said plantation and cleanse the said ditches, gutters, and water-courses; at the cost of the lessee who shall repay the expenses thereof.

4. The lessee shall not plant any other trees, plants, or shrubs, save and except cinnamon bushes and grass, without the written consent of the lessor.

5. The Crown shall be at liberty during the term of the lease on giving one month's notice to the lessee to resume possession of the premises hereby demised or any portion thereof, and to sell or otherwise appropriate such premises or such portions thereof when required by Government, and a proportionate deduction shall be made from the instalments of rent subsequent to the appropriation of such land by the lessor, his agent or agents, such proportion to be estimated with reference to the gross acreage of the premises hereby demised, and without reference to the quality of the land appropriated by the lessor as aforesaid. The lessee shall on receipt of a month's notice of such requirement from the lessor, his agent or agents surrender such portion or portions without compensation.

6. If any portion of the plantation and premises hereby demised be adjudged during the continuance of the tenancy to be private property and not to belong to the Crown, such adjudication shall in no way determine the tenancy, but an abatement in the rent shall be made by the lessor on behalf of the Crown proportionate to the acreage declared to be private property.

7. The lessee shall not during his tenancy cut or peel any cinnamon sticks which shall not have come to maturity, nor shall he at any time destroy or injure any cinnamon bushes or trees or timber on the said plantation growing, nor shall he at any time commit any waste thereon. Provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall prevent the lessee from harvesting such cinnamon as is fit to be harvested in the usual course of husbandry.

8. The lessee shall permit the lessor or his agent or agents at all reasonable times during the tenancy to enter upon the said premises and plantation to view the state and condition thereof.

9. 15. No milch cows or she-buffaloes shall be permitted to graze on the land, and any such animals found grazing thereon will be liable to seizure by the lessor or any person duly authorized by him.

16. If any of the quarterly instalments of rent hereby secured shall be in arrear for more than thirty days, or if the lessee commit any breach of the foregoing covenants, it shall be lawful for the lessor for and on behalf of the Crown to re-enter upon the said plantation and leased premises without making any compensation to the lessee, and thereupon it shall be optional to the lessor on behalf of the Crown either to sell the remainder of the term at the risk of the lessee, or to forthwith determine the tenancy of the said plantation and leased premises.

50 per cent. of the bid and security Rs. 50 to be deposited immediately on conclusion of the sale pending the approval of the Conservator of Forests. Balance to be paid within 14 days of the approval of sale by the Conservator of Forests.

Bids over Rs. 500 and up to Rs. 1,000.

50 per cent. of the bid and security of Rs. 75 to be deposited immediately on conclusion of the sale pending the approval of the Conservator of Forests. Balance to be paid regularly in two monthly instalments within two months of the date of approval of the sale by the Conservator of Forests.

Bids over Rs. 1,000.

50 per cent. of the bid and security Rs. 150 to be deposited immediately on conclusion of the sale pending the approval of the Conservator of Forests. Balance to be paid regularly in three monthly instalments within three months of the date of approval of the sale by the Conservator of Forests.

4. Should the required deposit not be made immediately on conclusion of the sale, the right to collect the produce will be at once offered again to public competition, and the person who failed in the first instance to make the required deposit will not be allowed to bid, unless he deposits in advance a sum of Rs. 50, which will be forfeited if he again refuses to make the required deposit on acceptance of his bid.

5. The balance of the purchase amount, if any, shall be paid as specified in condition 3.

6. Should the person decline or fail to enter into an agreement within ten days of receiving notice in writing from the Divisional Forest Officers of the respective divisions to the effect that his bid has been accepted by the Conservator of Forests or to pay the balance of the purchase amount when due, the deposits already made on account of the purchase and the security shall be forfeited and the right to collect the produce in question resold at the risk of the original purchaser, who shall be held liable to make good any deficiency in the price realized at such resale, but, on the other hand, he shall not be entitled to participate in any profit which may accrue to the Government by any resale.

7. The right to collect the produce in question shall not be assigned, resold, or sublet by the purchaser without the consent of the Conservator of Forests first obtained in writing.

8. Should the purchaser or his employees cause any damage to trees in the forest or commit any forest offence, the purchaser shall be held liable to pay compensation for all such damage or loss, and on failure to pay he shall be liable to prosecution.

9. The collection of all minor forest produce should cease on August 31, 1930, to admit of the minor forest produce collected being transported to the Central Stores before September 30, 1930, after which date the purchasers will not be allowed to transport any produce to the Central Store, no matter when the minor forest produce might have been collected in forest.

5. Separate prices shall be quoted as rent (1) for arrack in bulk and (2) for arrack in sealed bottles per gallon.

6. Every tender shall be placed in a sealed envelope clearly marked on the top left hand corner "Tender for Arrack Tavern No. 1, Point Pedro," and shall be handed to the Government Agent or his Office Assistant or sent by registered post as to reach this Kachcheri before August 24, 1929. No person shall submit more than one tender. All tenderers must be present at this Kachcheri at the time fixed for closing of tenders and are advised to produce a certificate from a Chief Headman regarding their financial status.

MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, June 8, 1929, at 9 a.m., pursuant to Notice dated June 1, 1929.

Present :—Mr. M. M. Wedderburn, Chairman ; the Hon. Mr. H. M. Macan Markar, M.L.C. ; Mr. D. W. Subasinghe ; the Hon. Mr. C. E. de Vos, M.L.C. ; Mr. J. E. Perera ; Mr. D. I. Durham ; Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe ; Mr. S. H. Dahanayake ; and Dr. L. C. Wijesinghe.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of May 11, 1929, a copy thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe asked—What steps have been taken with regard to the acquisition of land for the purpose of widening Richmond Hill road ?

The Chairman replied as follows :—Application for the acquisition of the land was made on November 19, 1928. In February, 1929, mandate for the survey of the land was issued. The survey is just complete ; and the Government Agent, Southern Province, was directed, on May 16, 1929, to take order for its acquisition.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe moved—That the Superintendent of Works be requested to estimate the cost of opening up (a) a cart road connecting Bope with Ossanagoda, (b) a cart road connecting Bope with Richmond Hill road along the Galketiya temple, giving details of probable cost of acquisition and of preparing the road. The Hon. Mr. C. E. de Vos seconded.

The Chairman informed the meeting that a memorial was received last January signed by the President and Secretary of the Bope Sucharitawardena Samitiya asking that a public road be opened through Kovilla watta and Bope connecting Peduruwella Junction with the Bope Cross road at the bridge. The memorialists were asked how long the proposed road had been mooted, and whether the Samitiya can guarantee that there is any such great desire for it in the locality as would induce the land owning residents to give the land free. No reply has been received from the memorialists.

Mr. S. H. Dahanayake and Mr. J. E. Perera spoke in support of the motion.

Mr. D. I. Durham was of opinion that the existing roads should be improved before money was spent on new roads.

The Chairman suggested that the motion be amended as follows :—That the Superintendent of Works be requested to prepare a trace of the following roads (a) a cart road connecting Bope with Ossanagoda, (b) a cart road connecting Bope with Richmond Hill road along the Galketiya temple, for the purpose of estimating the cost of opening them up. The mover and seconder agreed to the amendment, which was put to the meeting and carried.

4. To consider the memorial from the Galle Poor Relief Association.

The Chairman explained the circumstances under which the land at Ettiligoda was vested in the Council.

The Hon. Mr. C. E. de Vos, Mr. J. E. Perera, and Mr. D. W. Subasinghe were in favour of the land being given to the Association on certain conditions.

Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe moved—That a portion of the land asked for by the Galle Poor Relief Association, if available, be granted upon a lease for a period of two years, on the understanding that no buildings of a permanent nature are to be put up during that period. Mr. S. H. Dahanayake seconded.

The motion was put to the meeting and carried.

5. To sanction a supplemental vote of Rs. 6,000 for tarring roads.—Resolved that a supplemental vote of Rs. 6,000 be sanctioned, and a sum of Rs. 2,600, provided for the maintenance of the Fort roads, be also used for this purpose.

6. Application from the Superintendent of Works to exceed the estimate on the maintenance of Dickson road by Rs. 1,500.—Resolved that the excess be sanctioned, to be met from savings on other road estimates.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Municipal Works, Finance and Assessment and Markets and Sanitation of May 11, 1929, were laid before the Council :—

7.—*Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of May 11, 1929.*

(2) To consider the following estimates :—(a) Rs. 250 for building a culvert on Hirimbura road. Recommended. (b) Rs. 700 for procuring materials for the Waterworks Department.—Recommended. (c) Rs. 450 for procuring copper wire cloth for strainers.—Recommended. (d) Rs. 260 for rethatching buildings in the Segregation Camp.—Recommended. (e) Rs. 2,150 for building a drain on the eastern side of Hirimbura road.—Recommended.

(3) To consider the question of the maintenance of Upper Dickson road.—Recommended that the maintenance of this road be undertaken by the Council and that an estimate be framed for putting the road in order.

(4) Papers re payment of compensation for the removal of a boundary wall in connection with the drainage of Talapitiya.—Recommended that—(a) As a matter of equity the Council do contribute a portion of the cost of the wall ; (b) the Superintendent of Works be asked to report on the cost of construction after the completion of the work.

(5) Papers re the Galle Water Supply Scheme :—The Committee agrees that there should be no metering of domestic services. With regard to the suggestion that (a) the rebate allowed under regulation No. 43 on metered services, should be discontinued and (b) a charge should be made for motor vehicles within the water supply area, the Committee is not in favour of any change as the resulting revenue will not be commensurate with the cost of collection. Information should be obtained as to the cost, and details of the working of the Deacon Waste detection system.

Resolution.

With regard to item (3) the Hon. Mr. C. E. de Vos moved—That the road be metalled and tarred as recommended, at an estimated cost of Rs. 2,100, but Government be asked to pay the whole cost, or such lesser portion as it seems fit, in consideration of the special history of the road. Mr. D. I. Durham seconded.—Carried.

With regard to item (4) the Chairman suggested that the Council do contribute Rs. 100 to the cost of the wall, as an act of grace. This was agreed to.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

8.—*Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of May 11, 1929.*

(2) Papers re demolished buildings in Ward 4 East.—Recommended that the rates be struck off.

(3) Fire Insurance of the Power Station.—Recommended that the Power Station be insured for Rs. 150,000 with the Royal Exchange Assurance Co.

(4) Repayment of a part of the loan from the Local Loans and Development Fund for the Electric Lighting Scheme.—Resolved that consideration be deferred *sine die*.

(5) Application from the rat-trapping overseer to be confirmed in his post.—Recommended that the post be made permanent, but non-pensionable.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

9.—*Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation of May 11, 1929.*

(3) To consider the question of establishing a Health Unit for the town of Galle.—Resolved that the Committee is not in favour of any immediate steps being taken, as it is not clear what the Health Unit will succeed in doing which cannot be done by the Council's Health Department.

(4) Petition from stall holders of the Green Market requesting that they may be allowed to keep their goods in the market at night.—It was agreed that no one should sleep in the stalls. Regarding the keeping of goods, the Chairman will investigate, and until he brings the matter up again the by-law re removal of goods will not be enforced.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

10. The Consulting Engineer's Progress Report on the duplication of the pipe line to Hiyare.—Submitted.

11. Meetings of the Standing Committees:—

The Chairman moved that in future the meetings of the Standing Committee be held on the last Saturday of the month at 10 A.M.—Carried.

Improvements in and relating to wireless signalling apparatus.

Abstract.—Oscillations are set up in a system of conductors which is electrostatically coupled to the earth or other conductive medium such as the hull of a ship, but which has a low radiation resistance as regards the dielectric medium.

The claims are:—

1. Wireless signalling apparatus wherein electric oscillations or stationary electric waves are set up in a system of conductors which is electrostatically coupled to earth or other conductive medium such as the hull of a ship, and utilizes the hysteresis in the dielectric between earth and the said system of conductors which includes an inductance and one or more conductors possessing capacity relatively to earth and so acting as an equivalent condenser by matching the lag due to polarization of the dielectric with the lag due to inertia of the inductance which, when charged by currents, creates a weak magnetic field around one armature of the aforesaid equivalent condenser.
2. Wireless signalling apparatus according to claim 1, wherein the interaction of the lag due to polarization of the dielectric with the lag due to inertia of the inductance introduces such a time-constant into the capacity of the equivalent condenser as to change that capacity relatively to the phase of the charging currents, the rate of change determining the position of a nodal or reflecting point for stationary waves while the magnetic field is being built up in one armature of the condenser and the dielectric is being polarized under the electric field.
3. Wireless signalling apparatus according to claim 2, wherein the inductance and capacity are so closely associated at one point where the magnetic and electric fields are out of phase that a nodal point is produced for each frequency.
4. Wireless signalling apparatus comprising an acceptor for electric oscillations electrostatically coupled to the earth or other conductive medium and connected to one pole of a tuned rejector circuit substantially as described.
5. Wireless signalling apparatus according to claims 1 or 4 wherein said system of conductors or acceptor is constructed to accept any frequencies within limits.
6. Wireless signalling apparatus arranged substantially as described with reference to figures 1, 2, 3, 4, or 5 of the accompanying drawings.

Improved manner of and apparatus for separating the stalk from leaf in the manufacture of tea.

Abstract.—The roller of the cutting machine consists of a hollow cylinder with circular holes in the surface.

The claims are :—

1. A manner of separating stalk from tea leaf in the process of manufacture, which consists in pressing the mixed leaf and stalk, already partly manufactured, against a revolving or moving perforated roller or surface perforated with holes of such size that the leaf is being pressed there against will pass through and drop into the interior of the roller or into a space on the further side of the perforated surface, whilst the stalk, being larger or stiffer than the leaf, will remain upon the surface to be scraped off or deflected therefrom by suitable deflector means.
2. A manner of separating stalk from tea leaf in the process of manufacture according to claim 1, wherein the holes or perforations through which the leaf is pressed are circular holes, preferably closely spaced holes of a diameter to suit the size or grade of tea being dealt with.
3. A manner of separating stalk from tea leaf in the process of manufacture according to claim 1 or 2, wherein the sides of the holes or of the perforations through which the leaf is pressed are smooth and have an absence of corners or surfaces meeting at an angle which might tend to cause the leaf to jam or stick in the said holes.
4. A machine for separating stalk from tea leaf in the process of manufacture operating in a manner according to any of the preceding claims, comprising a perforated hollow roller to which the mixed leaf and stalk is fed, said roller being adapted to rotate and having means to press the mixed materials against the sides of the roller, and a guide or deflecting means adjacent to and below said pressing means to scrape or remove stalk from the surface of the roller, the whole being so arranged that the leaf is pressed through the perforations in the roller into the hollow interior thereof to divide the leaf from the stalk.
5. A machine according to claim 4 in which the roller is perforated with circular holes.
6. A machine according to claim 3 or 4, in which the roller is perforated with closely spaced circular holes, and in which the spacing centre to centre of the said holes is approximately $\frac{1}{4}$ in. to $\frac{3}{16}$ in. greater than the diameter of the holes.
7. A machine according to any of the claims 4 to 6, in which the diameter of the holes is from $\frac{1}{4}$ in. to $\frac{3}{8}$ in. according to the size and grade of the tea to be dealt with, and the rollers are preferably arranged to be changeable.
8. A machine according to any of the preceding claims, in which the mixed tea and stalk is adapted to be pressed against the surface of a revolving perforated hollow roller by an angle iron or bar the distance of which from the roller may be adjusted.
9. A machine according to claim 8 in which the said angle iron or bar is applied to the surface of the roller at a point slightly above the horizontal plane passing through the axis of the roller.
10. A machine according to any of the claims 4 to 9, in which the deflecting surface or chute which scrapes the stalk from the surface of the revolving roller is adjustable in position and/or in elevation.
11. A machine according to claim 10 in which the deflecting surface may be applied to the surface of the roller over a vertical elevation varying from slightly below the horizontal plane passing through the axis of the roller to a point slightly above this plane.
12. A manner of operating a machine according to claim 10 or 11, wherein if the tea is coarse and the stalk large the point of application of the surface for deflecting the stalk is adjusted to be above the horizontal plane through the centre of the perforated roller.
13. A manner of operating a machine according to claims 10, 11, or 12, wherein as the machine is running the deflecting surface is raised or lowered to find the best level which gives the optimum conditions in respect to division of stalk dealt with, and the surface is thereupon clamped or fixed in said position.
14. A machine according to any of the claims 4 to 11, wherein two perforated hollow rollers are mounted side by side and caused to rotate outwards when viewed from above, and angle irons or pressure applying plates or bars are applied to the outer sides of these rollers, deflecting surfaces or chutes also being applied to the outer sides, and mixed tea and stalk is fed, for instance from a hopper, upon the revolving rollers, the parts being so adjusted that stalk is delivered to either side by the deflecting surfaces and the leaf falls through and out of the perforations in the rollers into a central space therebelow.
15. A manner of separating stalk from tea substantially as described.
16. Means for separating stalk from tea, constructed, arranged, or adapted to function substantially as described or substantially as described and illustrated.

A preparation for the prevention and treatment of diseases in the bark of rubber trees.

Abstract.—A composition of fuel oil, coal tar, tallow, and Jeyo's fluid is described.

The claims are :—

1. A mixture for prevention and treatment of all diseases in the bark of rubber trees characterized in that it is composed of a most suitable grease and two fungicide disinfectants substantially as described.
2. In the mixture as claimed in claim 1, the use of tallow as a basis for the grease.
3. In the mixture as claimed in the preceding claims the use of tar as water proof and disinfectant.
4. In the mixture as claimed in the preceding claims the use of oil of fuel as a suitable oil for reducing the viscosity of the tar and Jeyo's fluid.
5. In the mixture as claimed in the preceding claims the use of the Jeyo's fluid as fungicide and disinfectant.

Divisions as defined by Notification dated July 1, 1899.

7.—Vavuniya Town.

Boundaries.—North by Vavuniya fields; east by Vavuniya tank and the road from there to Susaippillaiyakulam; south by the bund reservation of Susaippillaiyakulam, north-central road and the outer circular road between it and Vairavarpuliyankulam; west by outer circular road.

8.—Kilakkumulai South (Tamil) Division (excluding Vavuniya Town).

Boundaries.—North by Kilakkumulai North; east by the Sinhalese villages of Kilakkumulai South and Kunjuttu korale of Anuradhapura District of the North-Central Province; south by Sinhalese villages of Kilakkumulai South and Kadawat korale of the Anuradhapura District; west by Naducheddikulam.

SCHEDULE II.

Northern Province—Mullaittivu District.

Divisions as defined by this Notification.

7.—Vavuniya Town.

Boundaries.—North by a straight line from the north-east end of the Tandikkulam tank bund to the right bank spill of Vavuniya tank. East from the right bank spill of Vavuniya tank along the tank contour as far as the Madukanda-oya; thence by a line drawn to the north-east corner of the land called Ittiyadivalevu, the property of Kaittar Adirampillai of Vavuniya, and shown as lot 1 in preliminary plan No. 4,911; thence along the village boundary of Irampaikkulam

village to the south-east contour of Irampaikkulam tank. South from the south-east contour of Irampaikkulam tank northwards along the east contour of the said tank and along the bund to the western end of the tank bund; thence by a straight line to the 110th milepost on the Jaffna-Kandy road; thence to the railway line at a spot shown as 157 miles 13½ chains; thence by a line drawn west to the south contour of the Vairavarpuliyankulam tank and along the tank contour to the western end of the tank bund. West from the west end of the tank bund along the village boundary of Vairavarpuliyankulam village to the channel and along the channel to the north-west corner of lot No. 13323 in preliminary plan No. 3,576 (title plan No. 270,071), the land called Puliyadikkadu owned by Sekiler Matharsaibu and others of Paddanichchipuliyankulam; thence by a line drawn north to the south contour of Paddanichchipuliyankulam and along its east contour to the eastern end of the tank bund; thence a line due north to the 112th milepost on the Jaffna-Kandy road to the south contour of Tandikkulam tank and along the south-east contour to the north-east end of the tank bund.

8.—Kilakkumulai South (Tamil) Division (excluding Vavuniya Town).

Boundaries.—North by Kilakkumulai North; east by the Sinhalese villages of Kilakkumulai South and Kunchuttu korale of Anuradhapura District of the North-Central Province; south by Sinhalese villages of Kilakkumulai South and Kadawat korale of the Anuradhapura District; west by Naduchedikulam.
