"THE LOCAL BOARDS ORDINANCE, 1898."

U 331/28

BY-LAW made by the Local Board of Bandarawela, under section 56 (17) of "The Local Boards Ordinance, 1898," and confirmed by the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council.

Colombo, August 13, 1929.

By-law.

It shall not be lawful for any person to erect, re-erect, or add to any hut or house within the limits of the Local Board of Bandarawela except under the following conditions:—

The following clear air space shall be left around any hut or house which is erected or re-erected, or, around any hut or house which is added to with respect to such addition, and no portion of the walls of such building and not more than 2 ft. 6 in. of the projecting eaves of such building shall come within such space:—

(1) On the side of any road or street 25 ft. to the centre of such road or street.

(2) Behind such space up to 50 ft. to any other hut or house except a kitchen, bathing place, or latrine, as the Chairman may require, of which prescribed space at least half shall be land belonging to the same owner as the land upon which the house stands which is erected, re-erected, or added to.

(3) To the side such space up to 15 ft. to the nearest building as the Chairman may require, of which prescribed space at least half shall be land belonging to the same owner as the land upon which the house stands which is erected, re-erected, or added to. Provided that where this requirement reduces the whole buildable frontage of any owner to less than 15 ft., it shall not apply to a building that is re-erected unless the Board makes compensation to the owner of the building for any damage he sustains by reason of its application. And provided further that the Chairman may in his discretion, relax the operation of this rule in any special case, but he shall not do so unless he is satisfied that (1) no detriment is caused thereby to the sanitary condition or amenities of the house or hut to be erected, re-erected, or added to or any other neighbouring house or hut used or intended to be used as a human dwelling place, and (2) that the future alignment, widening or development of any road or street, or the convenience of the public using such road or street will not be interfered with by such relaxation of the rule. Provided further that the Chairman may allow the erection of a kitchen, bathing place, or latrine upon the portion thus reserved for air space on the side of any house furthest from the road or street in such place as the Chairman shall approve.

Provided further that where a conservancy lane shall have been provided or laid out, or projected by the Board, such latrine shall adjoin such lane or projected lane.

Rule 2 (2) of the Wireless Telegraph Rules dated November 12, 1926, and published in Gazette No. 7,555 of the same date, as amended by the rules dated November 23, 1927, published in Gazette No. 7,616 of November 25, 1927, is repealed and the following is substituted therefor:—

2. (2) Any person desirous of obtaining a licence for experimental purposes or for broadcast listening-in shall make application on the appropriate form A or Al to be obtained from any of the principal Post Offices in Ceylon, and every such application shall have affixed to it a stamp of the value indicated in rule 4 (2): provided that the Postmaster-General may grant free of stamp duty (i.) wireless telegraphy licences to any officer of the Post and Telegraph Department who is required to perform duties connected with wireless telegraphy; and (ii.) broadcast listening-in licences (a) to persons certified to be blind by a Government Medical Officer, and (b) in respect of apparatus intended for the use of the immates of hospitals and other similar institutions maintained for the relief of suffering, to the person in charge of the hospital or institution.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the week ended August 3, 1929.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 137 (1 European, 15 Burghers, 68 Sinhalese, 26 Tamils, 19 Moors, 2 Malays, and 6 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1929, viz., 267,667) was 26.7, as against 28.1 in the preceding week, 26.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 36.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 139 (6 Burghers, 76 Sinhalese, 24 Tamils, 20 Moors, 7 Malays, and 6 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 27 1, as against 34 9 in the previous week, 27 5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30 3 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 139 total deaths, 36 were of infants under one year of age, as against 38 in the preceding week, 33 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year. Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 6.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Slave Island, 2 each in New Bazaar, Maradana North, Kollupitiya, and Wellewatta North, I each in St. P al's, Kotahena South, Maradana East, and Wellawatta South, as against 21 in the previous week, and 23 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Ten deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in New Bazaar, 2 in St. Paul's, and 1 each in San Sebastian,

Kotahena South, Maradana North, Maradana East, and Kollupitiya, as against 19 in the previous week, and 8 the weekly

average for last year.

(c) Four deaths from Bronchitis were registered, 2 in Maradana North and 1 each in Maradana hospital and Slave Island, as against 5 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Ten deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Maradana North, 1 each in San Sebastian, New Bazaar; and Maradana East, as against 12 in the previous week, and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Two deaths from Phthisis of residents of Colombo Town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama,

during the week.

3. One death from Enteric Fever was registered in Slave Island, as against 3 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from Bubonic Plague of a resident of Colombo Town occurred at the Infectious Diseases hospital, Angoda, during the week.

5. Ten deaths from Debility were registered, 8 from Dysentery, 7 from Enteritis, 5 from Infantile Convulsions, 4 from Diarrhoea, 3 from Puerperal Septicaemia, 2 from Accidents, 1 from Suicide, and 54 from Other Causes.

6. Reported Cases .- Fifteen cases of Measles, 14 of Chickenpox, and 14 of Enteric Fever were reported during the

week, as against 12, 18, and 8, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81·3°, against 81·7° in the preceding week, and 81·6° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·878 in. against 29·886 in. in the preceding week, and 29·893 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was nil, against 0:04 in. in the preceding week and 0.99 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1929, viz., 267,667) was 31.4, as against 26.7 in the preceding week, 31.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 36.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 185 (9 Burghers, 97 Sinhalese, 40 Tamils, 28 Moors, 6 Malays, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 36.0, as against 27.1 in the previous week, 29.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.3 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 185 total deaths, 42 were of infants under one year of age, as against 36 in the preceding week, 34 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 16.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty-two deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 12 in Maradana hospitals—(including 2 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Maradana North, and Kollupitiya, 1 each in Kotahena North and Maradana South, as against 20 in the previous week and 23 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Ten deaths from Influenza were registered, 3 in St. Paul's, 2 each in San Sebastian and New Bazaar, 1 each in Kotahena North, Maradana North, and Slave Island. The number registered during the preceding week was also 10 and the weekly average for last year was 8.

(c) Two deaths from Bronchitis were registered, I each in Maradana North and Maradana South, as against 4 in

the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

Thirteen deaths from Phthisis were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), 2 each in San Sebastian and Kotahena North, 1 each in St. Paul's, Maradana North, Slave Island, and Wellawatta North, as against 10 in the previous week, and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(Intermediate Examinations in Arts and Science commence on the first Monday in July, and that in Agriculture during the week beginning on the first Monday in July.)

O candidate shall be admitted to these Examinations unless he have passed on home at these examinations unless he have passed, or been admitted under Statute 116 (see Appendix) as exempt from, a Matriculation Examination not later than that of the preceding January.

A candidate who has sat for a January Matriculation Examination may, if he so desire, enter provisionally for an Intermediate Examination, pending the results of the Matricula-

tion Examination.

Applications for entry form, should be made not less than

ten days before the date fixed for closing entries.

The examination shall be conducted mainly by means of printed papers; but for the purpose of ascertaining the competence of a candidate to pass, the Examiners shall not be precluded from putting viva voce questions to any candidate.

In all subjects there will be two papers of three hours each, except in the case of History of Architecture. In Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Geology, and Zoology there will be in addition a practical test.

Botany,

In the Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Geology, and Zoology Papers questions will be set involving (1) the translation of passages in French or in German, and (2) answers with regard to the subject matter thereof. Candidates are recommended to read some books or papers in French or in German on the subjects which they select for the examination. The questions in French and German which are settin papers in Science and Mathematical subjects shall be optional in the case of candidates sitting in the Dominions and in the Colonies.

No candidate offering an Experimental Science subject will be allowed to pass who fails to satisfy the Examiners in the practical. part as well as the written part of the examination in the subjects.

Candidates shall not be approved by the Examiners unless they have shown a competent knowledge in each of the subjects. selected by them

A candidate at the Intermediate Examination who takes all the A candidate at the Intermediate Examination who takes all the four prescribed subjects on one and the same occasion, but who fails to reach the minimum standard in one subject only may be treferred," i.e., he may be permitted, on the recommendation of the examiners, to present himself in that subject alone on one occasion only at one of the next two Intermediate Examinations in Arts. Referred candidates who do not pass in their referred subjects within the above stated limits will be required when re-entering to offer all four subjects again.

The examiners will recommend that a candidate be referred.

Candidates will be expected to have some acquaintance with the chief events in the development of British political

institutions since 1832.

Candidates must bring to the Practical Examination their Notebooks certified by their teachers as being the record of their workoarried out by the candidates in the laboratory, so that the Examiners may inspect them if they so desire. Chemistry (Two Papers and a Practical Examination).

The following outline is given for the general guidance of candidates as indicating the range of the Written Part (I.) and Experimental Part (II.) of the Examination in Chemistry:—

The methods which lead to the discovery of the composition of the common materials occurring in nature. The history of the discovery of the composition of air and water. The laws of chemical combination. The atomic and molecular theories. Equivalent atomic and molecular weights, and the methods of Valency and structural formulæ. The classification of the elements according to the periodic system.

The elements of physical chemistry, including the following—

The elements of physical chemistry, including the following—The properties of gases and solutions. Thermal dissociation. Osmotic pressure, and determination of molecular weights in solution by the freezing point method. Diffusion. Colloidal solutions. Electrolysis and the theory of electrolytic dissociation. Electrical conductivity. Hydrolysis. Strengths of acids and bases. Chemical equilibrium and simple examples of the law of mass action. Catalysis. Thermo-chemistry.

Combustion and flame.

The history, production and properties of the more important and typical elements, and their most familiar compounds (including those of carbon as follows: carbon monoxide, carbon

dioxide, carbon disulphide, methane, ethylene and acetylene).

The whole to be treated as far as possible experimentally, and

in an elementary manner.

in an elementary manner.

One alternative question on elementary organic chemistry will be set in each paper according to the following syllabus—Hydro-carbons, halogen derivatives, alcohols, ethers, aldehydes, ketones, acids and esters, as illustrated by the study of methane, ethylene, acetylene, methyl and ethyl alcohols, diethyl ether, formaldehyde and acetaldehyde, acetone, formic, acetic and oxalic acids, ethylacetate; glycerol, fats and soaps (from an experimental standpoint only); benzene, nitrobenzene, aniline and phenol. Candidates will be expected to show a practical acquaintance with all the particular substances specified.

II. -Practical Examination.

[Candidates will be allowed to bring into the Examination Laboratory any one book on Quantitative Analysis provided that it do not contain any reference to Qualitative Analysis.]

Candidates will be required to show that they are familiar with easy quantitative operations, gravimetric and volumetric, with the radiments of qualitative analysis, and that they have

prepared a number of elements or compounds by processes involving the manipulation of gases and the purification of substances by crystallisation, distillation, etc. Candidates are required to bring to the Practical Examination their original laboratory note-books, for inspection should the Examiners so desire. These note-books must be taken away by the candidates at the close of the Examination. Specimens made by the candidate data attented by the Taylor and also has by the candidate, duly attested by the Teacher, may also be submitted to the Examiners.

Botany (Two Papers and a Practical Examination).

Morphology.—The structure and properties of the cell and of the various kinds of tissues; cell formation and the develop-ment of the tissues. The plant body; its structure, develop-ment, and various modifications.

Special Morphology, Reproduction, and Taxonomy.

The morphological and physiological characteristics of Angiosperms, as exemplified by plants belonging to the following natural orders:—Dilleniaces, Malvaces, Portulacaces, Myrtaces, Leguminoss, Cucurbitaces, Composite, Convolvulaces, Acanthaces, Scrophulariaces, Euphorbiaces, Palmaces or Commelinaces, Orchidaces, Gramines.

The morphological and physiological characteristics of Gymnosperms, as exemplified by Cycas.

The morphological and physiological characteristics of Pteridophyta, as exemplified by Selaginella, Aspidium, Asplenium, or Adiantum.

The morphological and physiological characteristics of Bryophyta, as exemplified by Polytrichum (or Funaria) and by Marchantia (or Lunularia).

The morphological and physiological characteristics of Alge, as exemplified by Fucus, Oedogonium, Pleurococcus, and Spirogyra.

The morphological and physiological characteristics of Fungi, as exemplified by Agaricus, Eurotium, Pythium, Saccharomyces

Bacillus.

Elementary Physiology.

The Chemical nature of the food elements of plants. Their sources, the modes in which they are respectively absorbed by

Practical Examination.

The practical work will include the dissection and examination of plants or parts of plants, and the reference to their systematic position of plants or parts of plants comprised in the foregoing Syllabus.* Simple experiments in Practical Physiology may be

Candidates are required to bring to the Practical Examination their Laboratory Notebooks for inspection, should the Examiners so desire. These Notebooks must be taken away by the candidates at the close of the examination.

Geology (Two Papers and a Practical Examination).

-Physical Geology.—(a) The Earth as a Planet: Origin and general characters of its chief surface features.

(b) The physical condition of the earth's crust and interior : Evidences of internal activity such as volcanic, seismic, and diastrophic phenomena.

(c) General characters and inter-relationships of rocks.
(d) The work of geological agents: The circulation of rock material, including the processes of denudation, transport,

deposition, and deformation.

II.—Mineralogy and Petrology.—(a) Elements of crystallography and crystallographic projection and notation.
 (b) The common rock-forming and vein-forming minerals:
 Their physical characters, chemical composition, and modes of origin and occurrence.

(c) The simpler optical properties of the common rock-forming minerals and the physical principles on which these properties depend.

(d) The general characters and relationships of the chief types of sedimentary, igneous, and metamorphic rocks.

-Historical Geology.-The disposition of rocks and its representation on maps; evidence of relative ages of rocks; fossils, their preservation and distribution in rocks of different ages; the geological systems, their broad characters and distribution in Great Britain.

Practical Work.

Interpretation of simple geological maps in terms of rock-structure and its relation to topography; expression of this interpretation by means of sections; Graphic methods of finding thickness, dip and strike of beds, of completing outcrops, and of tracing the underground extension of strata.

Identification and description of common minerals and typical rocks, with and without the microscope; exercises in projection of crystals; identification and description of crystal forms of common minerals, both on models and on actual crystals.

Reference of fossils to their broad biological groups and geological periods.

History of Architecture.

- (1) Greek and Roman Architecture (one paper).
- (2) History of Greek and Roman Art (one paper).

The characteristics of various periods and their course of development in Egypt, Assyria, Greece, and Rome.

(3) Drawings of Greek and Roman Orders done during the session to be submitted and marked.

Two Imperial size sheets* of drawings will be required, giving examples—one on each sheet—of either the Doric, Ionic, or Corinthian Orders; one must be Greek, the other Roman. Each sheet must contain at least two columns of one order with entablature complete drawn to scale, the columns being not less than ten inches high on the paper, together with details drawn to at least three times the scale of the columns. These drawings are to be sent to the University one week before the date of the examination. Candidates who submit these drawings will be required to sit for the paper in section (1) only, viz., "Greek and Roman Architecture."

Candidates must take section (1) and either section (2) or (3).

History (Two Papers),

English History treated generally so as to include the growth of the British Empire, with a special study of a standard work to be prescribed two years previously.

Due attention to be paid to changes in foreign policy, so ciety government, and customs, and to the development of the material and intellectual life of the nation.

Modern European History (Two Papers).

Modern European History from about 1400 to the present day. One paper will deal with the general History, the other with a prescribed text.

Ancient History (Two Papers).

Either (a) The History of Egypt, Western Asia, Greece, and Rome from the Earliest Dynasties to 30 s.c.

Or (b) Greek and Roman History from 776 B.c. to 330 A.D.

A selected portion of an historical author will be prescribed from time to time.

Candidates will not be required to show more than a general acquaintance with the book prescribed. Knowledge of the Text in the original will not be required.

Geography (Two Papers and Map Work).

1. General Geography.—General principles as exemplified in the world considered as a whole. (One paper).

The Earth's Crust:-Nature of the earth's crust. internal and external forces modifying the crust in so far as they determine:—(a) General structure and leading topographical features of the continental masses and ocean basins; (b) types and distribution of rocks, minerals and soils.

Climate:-Broad seasonal distribution of insolation, temperature, pressure, winds and rainfall, leading to recognition of chief climate types and their associated weather conditions. (The physical conditions and movements of the oceans should be considered only in so far as they affect climate).

Vegetation: -General distribution of forest, woodland, scrub and grassland in relation to climate, soil and topography.

Major Geographical Regions:—The division of the world into major geographical regions.

Human Geography:—The influence of the foregoing physical factors upon the distribution of man and upon the production of food and raw materials, and the consequent development of the geographical regions.

- Regional Geography. (One paper).
- (a) Europe with special reference to the British Isles, France, Germany, Italy, Switzerland and Scandinavia.

- (b) North America with special reférence to the north-eastern industrial areas, and the United States east of the Mississippi
- (c) The Monsoon lands with special reference to the Indian Empire and Ceylon.
 - 3. Map Work.—(One paper).

The map work would be carried on in connection with the general and regional geography and should include:—The study of topographic maps (including section drawing) as exemplified by one-inch and six-inch Ordnance Survey maps of the British Isles; the use and study of atlas maps, including the advantages and disadvantages of the principal projections employed, climate and weather maps; cartographical and diagrammatic representation of geographical data.

Economics (Two Papers).

I.—Industrial and Commercial History.—The outlines of the industrial and commercial development of England, the questions being mainly chosen so as to deal with the period subsequent to 1760.

To include:—The effects of the introduction of machine

To include:—The effects of the introduction of machine industry. The developments of transport. Changes in industrial organization. The Great War (1793-1815) and its economic effects. Tariff policy. Movements of foreign trade. The growth of Banking, the adoption of the gold standard, the history of general prices. Poor Law. Trade Unionism.

II.—Principles of Economics.—Economics, analytical and descriptive, with special reference to the United Kingdom.

To include :- The scope of economics ; meaning of the principal economic terms; causes of differences in productive power; analysis of various forms of organization for production; value in relation to production, exchange, distribution, and consumption; the distribution of income between individuals and classes; causes of variations in wages, profits, interest, and rent; economic effect of the ordinary actions of government. The whole to be illustrated as far as possible by reference to past and present conditions of the United Kingdom.

Zoology (Two Papers and a Practical Examination):

- (1) The fundamental facts and laws of Zoology, as exhibited the following types:—Amœba, Euglena, Parametrium, in the following types:—Amœba, Euglena, Paramecium, Monocystis, Hydra, Obelia, Lumbricus, Distomum, Astacus, Amphioxus, Scyllium, Rana, Lepus.
- (2) The student will be expected to acquire a practical knowledge of the general organization of each of the types above specified, and an elementary knowledge of:—
 - (a) The chief biological laws which the structural phenomena, illustrate, including an elementary knowledge of heredity. variation, and evolution.
 - The structure and properties of the Cell, and the general characters of the Tissues, including Epithelia, Blood, Lymph; Nervous, Muscular, Connective, and Skeletal Tissues; and the microscopic structure of the more important organs of the body.
 - (c) The phenomena of Sexual and Asexual Reproduction; including the general history and characters of the Germ Cells, the chief types of Segmentation of the fertilized Ovum, the Metamorphosis of the Frog, and an elementary knowledge of the Development of the Chick up to the third day of incubation, and the formation of the Festal Membranes in the Bird and Mammal.
- (3) A knowledge of the diagnostic characters of the following groups !-

Protozoa:—Lobosa, Foraminifera, Radiolaria, Sporo Flagellata, Ciliata. Cœlenterata:—Hydrozoa, Anthozoa. Platyhelmia:—Turbellaria, Trematoda, Cestoda. Annelida:—Oligochæta, Polychæta. Articulata:—Crustacea, Insecta, Arachnida. Chordata:—Urochorda, Cephalochorda. Craniata:—Pisces, Reptilia, Amphibia, Aves, Mammalia. Sporozoa

The candidate must be prepared to examine microscopically. to dissect, and to describe specimens or parts of the animals comprised in paragraphs 1 and 2 in the foregoing Syllabus with the exception that for the skuli of Lepus will be substituted that

Candidates are required to bring to the Practical Examination their original Laboratory Notebooks, for inspection should the Examiners so desire. These Notebooks must be taken away by the candidates at the close of the examination.

INTERMEDIATE EXAMINATION IN SCIENCE.

Scheme of Examination.

Candidates shall be examined in any four subjects selected by themselves out of the following subjects of examination, vis., (1) Pure Mathematics, (2) Applied Mathematics, (3) Ex-perimental Physics, (4) Chemistry, (5) Botany, (6) Zoology, (7) Geology, (8) General Principles of Biology, (9) Geography, and (10) General Physiology.

Note.—Candidates must select at least one of their four subjects from among the first three of the foregoing list; candidates effering General Physiology are required to offer also Chemistry; candidates offering "General Principles of Biology," are not are not permitted to offer also Botany or General Physiology or Zoology.

In all subjects there will be two papers of three hours each, and, except in Pure Mathematics, Applied Mathematics, and in Geography, there will also be a three hours practical test.

In each subject questions will be set involving (1) the translation of passages in French or in German, and (2) answers with regard to the subject-matter thereof. Candidates are recommended to read some books or papers in French or in German on the subjects which they select for the examination.

The questions in French or in German, which, by the regulations are set for the home candidates, will be made optional in the examinations as held in the Colonies.

The Examiners shall be at liberty to test any candidate by

means of viod voce questions.

N.B.—No candidate offering an Experimental Science subject will be allowed to pass who fails to satisfy the Examiners in the practical part as well as the written part of the examination in the subject chosen.

Candidates shall not be approved by the Examiners unless they have shown a competent knowledge in all of the four subjects

taken

Reference.

A candidate at the Intermediate Examination who takes all the prescribed subjects on one and the same occasion, but who fails to reach the minimum standard in one subject only may be "referred," i.e., he may be permitted, on the recommendation of the Examiners, to present himself in that subject alone on one occasion only at one of the next two Intermediate Examinations in Science.

Referred candidates who do not pass in their referred subjects according to these conditions will be required when re-entering to offer all four subjects again. The Examiners will recommend that a candidate be referred only if his failure in one subject is not serious, and if his performance in the remaining subjects is

reasonably good.

A student who has completed the Intermediate Examination after having been referred in one subject will be deemed for all purposes to have passed the examination in question on the date of completion.

Supplementary Subjects.

Candidates who have passed the Intermediate Examination in Science may enter for examination in one or more supplementary subjects.

EXEMPTIONS.

Note.—No exemptions are given from this examination in whole or in part except on the results of examinations of this

Candidates who have passed the Internal Intermediate Examination in Science in accordance with the conditions then in force for External Students are entitled to exemption from the External Intermediate Examination in Science; and if the combination of subjects did not comply with the requirements for External Students such candidates may be exempted on passing in the necessary Supplementary Subjects.

Graduates in Arts of this University who become candidates

for the Degree of Bachelor of Science in the Faculty of Science are allowed to present themselves at the B.Sc. Examination immediately following their passing the Intermediate Examina-

tion.

General or Special Examination for External Students, after a lapse of two academic years from the passing of the B.Sc.

Practical Examination.

Candidates will be expected to have made a practical study of the structure, functions, and life history of some typical unicellular organisms, of some typical multicellular plants, and of a limited number of animal types. Only such anatomical details should be studied as are necessary for the comprehension of the physiological principles. Candidates will be examined further in the histology of the chief tissues and organs in a mammal and a more detailed consideration of the part played by each organ in the life of the animal, e.g., the histology and the chemistry of the blood and connective tissues, the histology and the chemistry of the blood and connective tissues, the histology and function of muscle, the circulation of the blood, the lungs and the part they play in respiration, the digestion and absorption of food, excretion by the kidney and by the skin, metabolism and the regulation of the body temperature, co-ordination of the functions of the body by chemical means and by the central nervous system, the organs of special sense and their significance.

Intermediate Examination in Science (Agriculture).

Scheme of Examination.

The Examination shall be a Pass Examination only. Candidates shall be examined in four subjects as follows:

(1) Chemistry .. 2 papers and a practical examination 2 papers 2) Physics

(3) Botany 2 papers and a practical examination

(4) Agricultural Zoology ... papers an examination and a practical

Note.—The candidate will be expected also to have acquired an elementary knowledge of the practical work of the farm.

The examination shall be conducted in the main by means

of printed papers; but for the purpose of ascertaining the competence of a candidate to pass, the Examiners shall not be

precluded from putting vivá voce questions to any candidate.

In each subject questions will be set involving: (1) The translation of passages in French or in German, and (2) answers with regard to the subject matter thereof. Candidates are recommended to read some books or papers in French or

The questions in French or in German, which by the Regulations are set for the home candidates will be made optional in the examinations as held in the Colonies.

No Candidate will be allowed to pass who fails to satisfy the Examiners in the practical part as well as the written part of each subject.

Candidates shall not be approved by the Examiners unless they have shown a competent knowledge in all of the four subjects of the examination.

Reference.

A candidate at the Intermediate Examination who takes all the four prescribed subjects on one and the same occasion, but who fails to reach the minimum standard in one subject only may be "referred." i.e., he may be permitted, on the recommendation of the Examiners, to present himself in that subject alone, on one occasion only, at the next Intermediate Examination in Agriculture. A Referred Candidate who does not pass in the referred subject at the next examination will be required when re-entering to offer all the four prescribed subjects again. again.

The Examiners will recommend that a candidate be referred.

only if his failure in one subject is not serious, and if his performance in the remaining subjects is reasonably good.

A student who has completed the Intermediate Examination after having been referred in one subject will be deemed for all purposes to have passed the examination in question on the date of completion.

Exemptions.

Note.—No exemptions are given from this examination in whole or in part except on the results of the following examinations of this University.

Candidates who have passed the Internal Intermediate Examination in accordance with the conditions then in force for External Students are entitled to exemption from the External Intermedidate Examination in Agriculture.

Arrangement of the alimentary canal in the horse, ox, sheep, and pig. Composition of food of animals. Nitrogenous and non-nitrogenous food-stuffs. Action of Saliva. Castric juice, succus entericus, pancreatic juice, bile on food, and outline of changes food undergoes during digestion. Muscular mechanism. Prehension of food. Drinking. Mastication. Deglutition. Movements of stomach and intestines. Rumination. The fæces and defæcation.

Absorption: Intestinal and general.

Excretion: By the kidneys and skin: Animal metabolism.

Central Nervous System: Its general structure and arrangement. Grey and White Matter. Sensory and motor areas in cortex of cerebrum. Reflex action in relation to glandular secretion.

Generation and development: Sexual season of animals. Ovaries and testes. The ova and spermatazoa. Impregnation. Formation of embryo and feetal membranes. Arrangement of placents in mare, cow, ewe, and sow. The mammary glands and secretion of milk. Terms of pregnancy.

APPENDIX II.

Statute 116:-

116. Every candidate for admission as a student of the University shall pass such Entrance or Matriculation Examination, or fulfil such other tests of fitness to be admitted as a student, as may be from time to time prescribed.

REGULATION AS TO EXEMPTION FROM THE MATRICULATION EXAMINATION.

Graduates of such British, Dominion, or Colonial, and Indian Universities as are approved by the Senate for that purpose, and those who have passed all the examinations required for a degree in those Universities, may on application be registered as Matriculated Students on payment of the registration fee of £3.3s. without passing the Matriculation Examination.

Oxford and Cambridge Graduates in First or Second Class Honours may be admitted to the Degree Examination in any faculty other than Medicine after two years from their faculty other egistration.

"No student shall be admitted to the Final Examination for a degree until the expiration of at least three years after Matriculation, unless the Senate in special cases or special classes of cases otherwise determine."

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Town Hall on Wednesday, July 10, 1929, at 3 p.m.

THE Council met this day at 3 P.M. pursuant to notice dated July 3, 1929.

Present :- Mr. H. E. Newnham, V.D., M.A., C.C.S., Chairman; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, M.L.C.; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; the Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, M.L.C.; Dr. E. A. Coorey; Mr. T. G. Jayewardene, V.D., J.P.; Mr. N. R. Blande; Mr. M. L. M. Reyal; Dr. S. Muttiah; Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike; Mr. J. S. Collett; Dr. V. Van Langenberg, V.D.; Mr. F. Dadabhoy, J.P.; and Mr. W. J. Thornhill.

The Minutes of the General Meeting of June 12, 1929, having been previously printed and copies thereof having

been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of June 12, 1929, be confirmed.

Pursuant to notice, Mr. T. G. Jayewardene asked the Chairman the following questions:—(1) Will the Chairman be pleased to say how permission came to be granted to Messrs. Freudenberg & Co., to erect several buildings for commercial purposes on their property in Layard's Broadway, in an area declared "congested," where no buildings other than dwelling houses could ordinarily be erected. Were any dwelling houses demolished in the erection of these commercial buildings? If so how many? (2) With reference to my motion of January 12, 1927, in regard to a new road between Grandpass and the Canal, will the Chairman be pleased to cause an estimate to be prepared for the construction of about 500 yards of this road, from Armour street eastwards, so that the work may be included in the 1930 Budget, if funds are

available?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) (a) Eleven applications in all are involved and were passed between January 1, 1928, and May 16, 1929, in one case after reference to the questioner, as Ward Member, who, on October 25, 1927, stated that he had no objection. The commercial buildings referred to comprise a Petrol Service Station, a Power House, 5 that he had no objection. The commercial buildings referred to comprise a Petrol Service Station, a Power House, 5 Garages, and certain alterations to an existing building. It is reported that the reasons for allowing this development on this site were:—(i.) It was recently reclaimed swamp, unsuitable as yet for dwelling houses; (ii.) though scheduled in the congested area this portion was not in fact congested and was already essentially commercial. (b) and (c) It is reported that no dwelling houses were demolished. (2) The Chairman will submit to the Works and Finance Committees at their next meeting the following questions:—(a) Do they approve of the proposal that the construction of such a road should be definitely included in the Council's programme of projects? (b) If so, will they indicate the trace on which the wholes road should run? (c) If so, do they wish to make a start with it next year? (d) If so, do they wish plans and estimates to be prepared for a portion of it? It must be borne in mind that the construction alone would cost some half million rupees, to which must be added the cost of acquiring about 7 acres of land, some of which contain expensive buildings, together with compensation, in some cases for loss of access to the canal. If there is no likelihood of any of the work being undertaken in the near future it would be uneconomical for the present shorthanded engineering staff to prejudice the other work of the Council in order to prepare plans and estimates which would be out of date and would require extensive revision by the time the undertaking was finally put in hand.

3. Pursuant to notice, the Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando asked the Chairman the following questions:—(1) When

did Council resolve to grant passages and leave for study purposes to the Council's Officers on the same terms as Government? (2) Were the Council's Officers notified of this resolution, and if so, when? (3) How many officers have applied to avail themselves of these privileges? (4) In view of the serious state of affairs disclosed in the Chairman's reply to the question by the member for New Bazaar at the last meeting of Council, where it was stated that the Chairman finds it impossible to prevent the recurrence of such lapses as recently occurred in the Veterinary Department, will the Chairman prepare a memorandum on the subject and place it before the Four Standing Committees for consideration at their next

meeting?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) The Council on November 7, 1928, sanctioned a Passage Scheme, which included "Study Passages" for officers on the Higher Staff of the permanent establishment to enable them to acquire professional qualifications by a course of study in the United Kingdom, or elsewhere. This scheme is on the same lines as that of Government. Leave for this purpose, without passages, had been granted by this Council on July 9, 1920, to officers with seven years' service. Subsequently on February 22, 1924, this period was reduced to five years. Government has no special regulations regarding leave for this purpose, but afford facilities under their ordinary leave regulations. (2) Copies of the Passage Scheme were forwarded by the Municipal Treasurer, to all the Departments for the information of officers, by his Circular of November 13, 1928. (3) None so far. (4) The Chairman will be very glad to do so.

The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 4 to 9

(inclusive) on the Agenda. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing and the Special Committees named were then laid before the Council in Committee:-

Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of June 24, 1929. PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

(2) To consider—(a) A report of the Medical Officer of Health dated June 7, 1929 (supported by the member for San Sebastian Ward), recommending—(1) That St. Paul's Dispensary be removed to the Gintupitiya Child Welfare Centre; (2) That an ordinary free dispensary be established in San Sebastian Ward. (b) A memoranda thereon of the Chairman dated June 13, 1929.—Recommended that sites be chosen for dispensaries as follows:—One in San Sebastian Ward. One more centrally situated in New Bazaar Ward in the direction of Grandpass. When these new dispensaries

ward. One more centrally situated in New Bazaar Ward in the direction of Grandpass. When these new dispensaries have been established, the Silversmith street and Barber street dispensaries should be closed.

(3) To consider—(a) A report of the Acting Medical Officer of Health dated May 6, 1929, regarding the supervision of Midwives under the regulations published in the Government Gazette of April 26, 1929. (b) Memoranda thereon of the Medical Officer of Health and the Chairman. (1) That the Governor in Executive Council be requested to make a regulation under section 57 of Ordinance No. 26 of 1927, bringing that section into operation for the Colombo Municipal Limits as from a date to be fixed after further inquiry. (2) That the Medical Officer in charge of Child Welfare be appointed Local Supervising Officer of the area under section 2 of the regulations under section 58 of the above Ordinance published in the Gazette of April 26, 1929. published in the Gazette of April 26, 1929.

(5) To consider the question as to whether the Chairman should insist on corpses of persons who die of plague, smallpox, &c., being removed for burial in coffins or in zinc lined coffins on sanitary grounds.—Recommended that those dying of plague should be removed for burial on an impervious zinc tray and that those dying of cholera and smallpox

should be taken for burial in zinc-lined coffins.

The Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando moved that the matter be referred to the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) regarding salaries. Dr. E. A. Coorey seconded.

The Chairman reviewed the facts concerning this appointment, dating back to a year ago. Dr. E. A. Coorey replied.

The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader supported the recommendation of the Standing Committees.

Mr. T. G. Jayewardene supported the motion.

Dr. E. V. Ratnam and Mr. M. L. M. Reyal opposed the recommendation.

Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike spoke to the motion and suggested that the matter be referred to the Four Standing Committees considering salaries for a definite recommendation to be made by them to the next meeting of Council.

The Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando accepted the suggestion.

The motion of the Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando with the addition of this suggestion, viz., that the matter be referred to the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) regarding salaries for a definite recommendation to be made by them to the next meeting of Council, was put to the meeting and carried.

With regard to item No. 25, Mr. T. G. Jayewardene moved that this matter be referred for consideration to the Four Standing Committees considering salaries. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committees with regard to the remaining items be adopted. The following item numbered 31 which was received after the meeting of the Committees, and which was approved

of in circulation was submitted for sanction:

to Vallayan, son of Sollamuttu, Municipal Engineer's Department, who is found unfit by a Medical Board for further service. The gratuity is based on his service of 174 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 19.67.—Recommended.



IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, with the approval of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, has been pleased to sanction the following addition to the Rules dated December 9, 1908, regarding the pensions to be granted to Public Servants of this Colony:-

- (i.) Where an officer's Government service in a post of posts specified in Schedule D is continuous with recorded service (as defined in Teachers' Pension Rules) as a teacher in an Assisted School or Schools, such service in an Assisted School or Schools shall be counted as Government service for purposes of determining whether he is qualified for a pension or gratuity under these rules by age, length of service, and the circumstance of his retirement or, when such officer dies in Government service, whether his dependants are qualified for a death gratuity under section 2B of these rules by his length of service.
- (ii.) The pension or gratuity of such an officer shall be calculated in accordance with such of the principles and methods prescribed in these rules as are not inconsistent with the provisions of this section. Provided
 - (a) The pension of such an officer shall be 1/720ths of the officer's salary for each month of service in a post or posts specified in Schedule D plus an addition as climate bonus which shall bear the same proportion to 60/720ths of such salary as his service in a post or posts specified in Schedule D bears to the total of his contributory service in an Assisted School or Schools and his service under Government in a post or posts specified in Schedule D; provided that no officer shall be eligible to receive the climate bonus unless the total of his contributory service in an Assisted School or Schools and his service under Government in a post or posts specified in Schedule D amounts to at least 120 months.

(b) The word "retirement" in sections 2 and 8 of these rules shall for the purposes of this section be deemed to mean "final transfer from Government service under Schedule D to an Assisted

School" in cases in which final retirement takes place from an Assisted School.

(iii.) The total combined pensions for service under Government and in an Assisted School or Schools shall not exceed the maximum pension allowed by these rules. In any case falling under the limitation laid down in this sub-section the amount of pension to be drawn under these rules shall be determined by the Governor with due regard to he amount of any pension or pensions to be drawn in respect of any service in an Assisted School or Schools.
