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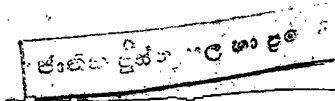

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated January 7, 1893, published in *Gazette* No. 5,199 of January 20, 1893, the portion of forest specified in the schedule hereto was constituted a village forest under the provisions of section 34 of "The Forest Ordinance, 1885":

"THE BUDDHIST TEMPORALITIES ORDINANCE, No. 8 OF 1905."

THE following rules made by the District Committee of Nuwara Eliya, under the provisions of section 12 of the Buddhist Temporalities Ordinance, No. 8 of 1905, and approved by His Excellency the Governor and the Executive Council, are hereby published for general information in pursuance of section 13 of the said Ordinance.

CHAPTER 1.

For determining the Quorum necessary for the Transaction of Business.

1. Three members of the District Committee shall form a quorum.

CHAPTER 2.

For regulating the Time and Place of Meetings and the Conduct and Record of the Proceedings.

2. The meetings of the District Committee shall be held periodically at the Headmen's Lodge, Nuwara Eliya, the Secretary giving the members 10 days' notice. The Committee shall, however, have the power to meet at any other time or place in the district, 10 days' notice being given by the Secretary in writing to the members of the time and place of such meeting.
3. At the instance of the President or any other member of the Committee a special meeting of the Committee shall be convened at any time by giving the other members one week's notice thereof in writing.
4. The Committee shall elect from amongst their members an Honorary Secretary, and they shall have the power to incur expenditure to render clerical assistance to the Secretary.
5. It shall be the duty of the Honorary Secretary to convene meetings to record minutes.
6. The President shall preserve order at meetings, and shall decide on all points of order.
7. The business of the Committee at its meetings shall be taken in the following order, viz.:—
 - (a) The minutes of the previous meeting shall be read and, if necessary, corrected and confirmed, the President signing such confirmation.
 - (b) The accounts of trustees and communications received from trustees shall be submitted to the Committee.
 - (c) Memorials, petitions, complaints, and communications addressed to the Committee or to its President shall be read and orders made thereon.
 - (d) Questions of which previous notice has been given shall be asked.
 - (e) Notices of motions shall be given.
 - (f) Motions shall be made.
 - (g) Reports of Special Committee shall be brought up and a day fixed for their consideration, unless the Committee shall resolve to their consideration at once.
 - (h) Any other matter set down in the notice of meeting shall be proceeded with, provided the Committee may, if it see fit, deviate from the order herein prescribed.
8. Any member presenting a petition or other communication to the Committee shall be responsible for its contents being respectful.
9. When a petition or other communication is presented it shall be read, and if examination of witnesses is found necessary, such witnesses as shall be named by the petitioner shall be summoned, and their evidence shall be recorded by the Secretary in Committee, and read over to the witnesses, who may then desire any correction to be made, and in case no correction is made, the evidence shall stand as taken down and be signed by the witnesses, and not be altered afterwards.
10. Every member giving notice of motion shall deliver to the Honorary Secretary a sufficient number of copies for distribution among them of the proposed question or motion 5 days prior to the date of the meeting.
11. Every member while speaking shall address the Chair, and shall stand while so doing. The speaker may refer to notes, but shall not be allowed to read a written or printed speech.
12. In discussing any motion no member shall be at liberty to speak more than once, except in explanation, or when any matter is under discussion, but a reply shall be allowed to a member who has made a substantive motion, not being an amendment. Immediately after such reply the motion shall be put and every member shall give his vote, the Secretary minuting each vote, after which the President or Chairman shall declare the number of votes for and against the motion.
13. It shall be competent for any member who is in the minority to record the reason of his dissent from the opinion of the majority, and such written dissent shall be sent to the Honorary Secretary within one week, and shall be filed by the Honorary Secretary.
14. In the absence of the President, the members present shall elect their own Chairman of the meeting.
15. The minutes of all meetings shall be recorded by the Honorary Secretary in a book called the minute book.
16. The President shall preside at all meetings convened under section 17 of the Ordinance. In his absence or in the event of his being a candidate one of the members of the District Committee shall be proposed, seconded, and elected by the remaining members of the District Committee, and in the case of a deval by the remaining eligible voters. The only persons who will be entitled to be present at the polling booth will be the members of the District Committee, the candidates, and voters.

CHAPTER 3.

For prescribing the Form in which all Accounts, Statements, and Returns incidental to the Business of the District Committee and that of the Trustees.

17. All trustees shall, within the expiration of every year, make a full return to the District Committee in the Form A hereto annexed, of all movable property and money in their charge.
18. All trustees shall, within three months of their being called upon to do so by the District Committee, furnish to the District Committee a full and correct list of all lands belonging to each temple in the Form B hereto annexed, and shall note thereon all such lands that have been sold, leased, mortgaged, or otherwise alienated before the passing of Ordinance No. 8 of 1905. Every subsequent dedication shall be reported by the trustee to the District Committee within a month of such dedication.
19. All trustees shall on or before October 31 in each year furnish to the District Committee a statement in duplicate of the probable receipts and proposed expenditure for the next ensuing year in the Form C hereto annexed. Such list shall be revised by the District Committee and the original returned to the trustee, who shall on no account exceed the expenditure sanctioned by the District Committee without the further express sanction of the District Committee.

20. All trustees shall keep the following books, to wit:—

Note.—(a) The inventory of movables is meant to be a permanent record of all articles of intrinsic value belonging to each temple and should be added to from time to time as offerings of note which are worthy of permanent preservation are received. Such details of each article should be recorded as will conduce to its easy identification.

(b) The Register of Offerings should show the amounts found in the collection boxes every time they are emptied as well as offerings in kind which have an appreciable value, with the final disposal of the latter.

(c) The Paraveni Pangu Register should contain a complete list of such pangu (but not of the services due from them) and should show whether the services in respect of each were performed or their commuted value paid for the year.

(d) The Land Register must contain a complete list of all other lands belonging to the temple. One page should be allotted to each parcel of land, and details of extent, name of lessee, particulars of lease-bond, rent, &c., must be shown. Each lot should have assigned to it a consecutive number.

(e) The Rent Ledger is based on the Land Register and should show all recoveries, each page will show the number and the name of a series of consecutive lots, with the recoveries for a series of years.

(f) The Paddy Account should show particulars of all paddy received and the manner of the disposal thereof.

(g) Every cash transaction must be shown in the Cash Book.

(h) Receipts must be consecutively numbered and issued from a bound book, the duplicate being initialled by the trustee.

(i) The Register of Cases should be so prepared as to show the final recovery of all claims.

(j) The Voucher Book shall be in the Form F hereto annexed, consecutively numbered, and one of such vouchers shall be filled up for every payment made by them.

21. At the close of every half year a copy of the Cash Book for that period shall be submitted to the District Court as the account to be rendered under section 22 of the aforesaid Ordinance No. 8 of 1905, within the time specified by that section, and with the declaration required by that section inserted on the accounts. At the same time the trustee shall report to the District Committee the date on which he submitted his accounts to the District Court, and shall also forward to the said Committee a copy of such accounts.

22. All trustees shall within a month of the expiration of every year submit a report to the District Committee as to whether all the paraveni tenants have performed the services due for their respective pangus for the past year, and if there were any defaulters, the report shall state the names of the defaulters, and the steps taken against such defaulters.

When a temple is given in charge of a trustee, the trustee shall sign a receipt of acceptance of the temple and all property appertaining thereto in trust in the Form "G" hereto annexed.

24. In the case of a vihare or devale the trustee shall be put in charge by any two members of the District Committee or by the division where such temple is situated in the presence of the incumbent priests or kapurala and two witnesses respectively. The trustee shall sign a receipt in triplicate, one of which shall be by the member of the District Committee, one shall be given to the incumbent, and the other to the trustee.

25. The District Committee shall keep a Cash Book and a Receipt Book and a Voucher Book of expenses in the Forms E, D, and F, and their accounts shall be verified once in six months by an auditor to be appointed by the District Committee.

26. The funds of the District Committee shall be placed in a bank fixed by the District Committee by their resolution, and shall be drawn on cheques to be signed by the President and Honorary Secretary.

CHAPTER 4.

For Regulating the Management of the Temple Schools.

27. The management of all temple schools shall be in the hands of the District Committee. By temple schools shall be understood pansala schools, but not pirivenas.

28. The District Committee may appoint a General Manager for the purpose of administration and management.

29. A temple school where more than 10 priests or laymen are given religious instructions and are taught Elu, Pali, or Sanscrit may be deemed to be registered temple school, and the Principal and the Assistants of such institutions shall be entitled to such maintenance allowance as the District Committee may fix, and such Principals and Assistants shall be nominated and appointed by the District Committee, who shall have the power to remove them for established misconduct.

30. The incumbents of all vihares shall as soon as these rules come into operation furnish the District Committee with a list of all the temple schools within their jurisdiction in the Form H hereto annexed.

31. A Receipt Book, Cash Book, and a Voucher Book of expenditure shall be kept by the District Committee in the Forms D, E, and F for the temple schools, and the accounts shall be verified once in six months by an auditor to be appointed by the District Committee.

32. It shall be within the discretion of the District Committee to furnish such registered temple schools, at the cost of the District Committee with such religious books as may be required, or render such other help as to them shall seem expedient.

33. The District Committee shall periodically inspect such registered temple schools, and shall arrange to have examinations at necessary periods.

CHAPTER 5.

For assessing the Proportions in which each Temple within the District shall contribute a Share of the Cost of carrying out Provisions of this Ordinance.

34. Every temple shall contribute five per cent. of their gross annual income for defraying the cost of carrying out the provisions of this Ordinance, such sum shall be paid by the temples as from January 1, 1928.

35. This contribution shall be placed by the District Committee to the credit of the District Committee, and from that sum shall be met all costs of carrying out all other provisions of this Ordinance.

36. Within thirty days after the confirmation of these rules the trustees of all temples shall remit to the District Committee the contribution due from each temple for the year 1928, and thereafter within the first month of the first half year the trustees shall remit one half of the contribution due for the whole year, and they shall remit the remaining half within the first month of the second half year. The payment of the contributions shall be made by the trustees in the aforesaid manner as long as this rule remains in force. In case of default the amount due shall be recovered by process of law.

CHAPTER 6.

For Determining and Recording the Godurugam or Villages attached to the Temples.

37. The District Committee shall forthwith ascertain from the Chief Headman of the several divisions through the Assistant Government Agent of Nuwara Eliya the names of the godurugam or the villages attached to each temple in each Chief Headman's division.

38. When such information is received, the District Committee shall determine those villages to be the godurugam of the respective temples for the purpose of voting for election of trustees under section 17 of the Ordinance, and shall register them as such godurugam in a book to be kept by the District Committee for that purpose.

CHAPTER 7.

*For every Purpose necessary for the due Exercise of the Powers of the District Committee and the Performance of the Duties of the District Committee under the Ordinance No. 8 of 1905.**Trustees.*

39. A candidate for a Basnayake nilameship or any other trusteeship shall submit at least ten days before the date fixed for election a written application supported by his own affidavit or other satisfactory documentary evidence as to the fact of his being possessed of all the qualifications required by section 8 of the Ordinance No. 8 of 1905. All applications unsupported by such affidavit or other documentary evidence shall be rejected.

Note.—(a) The production of a certificate from either of the Mahanayakas of the Malwatta or Asgiriya vihares of Kandy, or the chief incumbent of a vihare in the District of Nuwara Eliya as to the fact of the candidate being a Buddhist will be sufficient proof that the said candidate possesses the qualifications required by section 8, sub-section (a), of Ordinance No. 8 of 1905, and to his creed or faith.

(b) The production of a certificate from the Assistant Government Agent, the Kachcheri Mudaliyar, a Chief Headman, a Korala, or a President of a Village Tribunal of the District of Nuwara Eliya as to the fact of the candidate being possessed of all the other qualifications (save and except that which refers to his creed or faith) required by section 8, sub-sections (a), (b), (c), (d), and (e); respectively, of the said Ordinance, will be sufficient proof that the candidate possesses the qualifications therein required.

40. At the end of each financial year the trustees shall deposit in a bank to be selected by the District Committee all surplus funds which they may have in their hands, and shall under the directions of the Committee draw therefrom all such sums as may be actually required for the use and benefit of any temple.

41. All "murapolas" appertaining to temples and not belonging to individual chiefs or priests and all "madaran" received on account of temple fields shall form part of temple revenue and shall be accounted for by the trustees as such.

42. No trustee or incumbent of any temple shall on any pretext whatever sell or otherwise dispose of any movable belonging to any temple without first obtaining the sanction in writing of the District Committee, and in case of such sanction being given, the sale shall be by public auction.

43. Copies of all deeds of leases executed by trustees under section 27 of the Ordinance shall be furnished by such trustee to the District Committee, who shall file them of record in their office. Provided always that no lease of a temple land shall twice in two consecutive weeks respectively be granted without the trustee first advertising them at least seven days prior to the date on which the lease shall be granted by beat of tom-tom in the village or place where such land is situated, and in such other manner as shall appear best calculated for giving the greatest publicity thereto.

44. The District Committee, whenever they deem it necessary or expedient so to do, shall authorize one or more of their members or any person or persons to be deputed by them to inspect and report upon the management of any temple and of the lands belonging thereto sought to be leased otherwise, and the expenses of such inspection shall be paid by the Committee.

45. The District Committee shall inspect and examine all the books and movable property and moneys of any temple and the accounts and papers of any trustee by deputing one or more of their members for the purpose at any time, and as often as the Committee deem such inspection as necessary.

46. All repairs to temples and all improvements thereto shall be effected by the trustees with the sanction of the District Committee and upon their directions.

47. Offerings of money made to devales and vihares shall be verified monthly on the last day of the month by the Basnayake nilames or trustees in the presence of the officiating laymen of the temples, and Basnayake nilames or trustees shall on the first day of the following month report to the District Committee the amount of such money offerings.

48. Every trustee who shall be elected after the confirmation of these rules shall, as required by the 17th section of the Ordinance, give security to the District Committee for the due discharge of their trusts, in such sums as may be determined by the District Committee by their resolution, provided that such security shall not exceed Rupees Five thousand (Rs. 5,000) in each case. Such security may be given either in cash or in unencumbered landed property, and the security bonds shall be drawn up at the cost of devales or temples. Such security bonds shall be filed of record in the Office of the District Committee. The Basnayake nilames and other trustees shall receive such remuneration as may be fixed by the District Committee by their resolution, and for the purpose of fixing such remuneration it shall be competent to the District Committee to inquire and ascertain from the Basnayake nilames and other trustees the nature and the value of "bulatturulus" (if any) they are getting, and when such inquiries are made the Basnayake nilames and other trustees shall be bound forthwith to supply such information.

49. A certificate of election under the hand of the President of the District Committee shall be the only proof of the election of a Basnayake nilame or other trustees.

50. The District Committee shall direct any trustees to properly repair any temple and upkeep the roads and buildings belonging thereto, when in the opinion of the District Committee such repairs and upkeep are necessary, and any trustee receiving such directions shall be bound to carry out such directions within the time allowed by the District Committee for that purpose.

51. It shall be competent to the District Committee to make inquiries from the trustees with regard to the internal working of the temples, and the trustees shall on such inquiries being made forthwith supply the information sought for.

52. When a trustee's accounts are transmitted to the District Court and a copy of the same is forwarded to the District Committee as aforesaid, it shall be competent for the District Committee to scrutinize such accounts and find out whether the income of all the lands belonging to such temple and all moneys received have been accounted for, and whether any unauthorized expenditure has been made, and if the District Committee shall detect any deficiency or any irregularity, the District Committee shall call upon the trustee for explanation and shall make all inquiries they deem necessary and expedient and make such necessary orders.

53. The violation by any trustee of the rules referring to trustees and referred to in Chapters 3 and 7 hereof shall amount to gross negligence and misconduct within the meaning of section 16 of the Ordinance.

Sangha.

54. Every charge or charges preferred against any incumbent of Tewakara bikkhu of any temple, whether held under any special tenure or not, shall be referred by the District Committee to the Sangha Sabhawa of the College to which such incumbent or Tewakara bikkhu belongs. The Sangha Sabhawa shall make a careful inquiry into the charge or charges after due notice to the priest in question, and forward the full proceedings of the case, together with their decision, to the District Committee within three months of the date of reference. The District Committee shall have power to refuse maintenance from temple funds to priests who have been found guilty by such Sangha Sabhawa.

"THE SCHOOL TEACHERS' PENSION ORDINANCE, No. 6 OF 1927."

E 18/26

RULES made by the Governor in Executive Council, under section 4 (1) of the School Teachers' Pension Ordinance, No. 6 of 1927.

The School Teachers' Pension Rules, 1927, published in *Gazette* No. 7,631 of February 24, 1928, as amended by Notifications dated October 25, 1928, and February 26, 1929, published in *Gazettes* No. 7,671 of October 26, 1928, and No. 7,695 of March 1, 1929, respectively, are hereby amended by the deletion of rule 6 and the substitution of the following therefor:—

Calculation of
pension.

6. Subject to the exceptions and provisions hereinafter set out, every person whose name has been entered on the Register of Pensionable Teachers who, being a man, has attained the age of 55 years, or who, being a woman, has attained the age of 50 years, may be granted a pension calculated in the following manner:—

(i.) A teacher who shall have served and contributed as provided by rule 5 of these rules for not less than 120 months and not more than 121 months may receive an annuity equal to 180/720ths of the salary as defined below of the permanent post or posts held by him at the time of his retirement.

A teacher who shall have served and contributed under rule 5 for not less than 121 months and not more than 122 months may receive an annuity equal to 181/720ths of such salary.

In like manner an addition may be granted of 1/720th for each additional month of service until the completion of 420 months of service when the maximum pension of 480/720ths of such salary may be granted.

(ii.) A teacher who is in service at the time these rules come into force and whose recorded service on retirement is not less than 120 months, but who has contributed for less than 120 months, may receive for each month of contributory service an annuity of 1/720th of the salary as defined below of the permanent post or posts held by him at the time of his retirement.

(iii.) A teacher or a retired teacher who was alive on October 1, 1926, and who at the time of retirement has or had recorded service of not less than 120 months, may receive for each month of service before these rules came into force an annuity of 1/960th of the salary as defined below of the permanent post or posts held by him at the time of his retirement.

(iv.) The annuity received by the teacher shall be computed upon the salary drawn by him at the time of his retirement in respect of the permanent post or posts then held by him, provided that he shall have held such post or posts, or a post or posts to which the same fixed salary or incremental scale of salary is attached, for at least three years, otherwise the pension shall be calculated upon the average of the salaries attached to the permanent posts held by him during the three years next preceding the commencement of such pension. Provided that where a teacher retires within three years of his promotion to a higher class or grade, he shall have the option of claiming either a pension calculated in manner aforesaid or a pension calculated on the salary he would have been receiving had he not been promoted to the higher class or grade.

Provided that—

- (a) The years of recorded service in each case are not less than ten;
- (b) The years of recorded service in each case are not less than one half the number of years that have elapsed since the date of the teacher's first registration;
- (c) In the case of teachers retiring before May 1, 1928, with less than twenty years' service and in the case of all teachers retiring on or after that date, at least ten years of recorded service fall within the fifteen years preceding the date on which the teacher attains the pensionable age;
- (d) The Director has reported that the teacher's professional record is satisfactory;
- (e) Contributions have been regularly made during the period of recorded service as required by rule 5;
- (f) No teacher who is in receipt of a pension shall be employed on the eligible staff of a school (within the meaning of the Education Code) save in exceptional circumstances and with the approval of the Director, and in such event the provision of section 16 of the Government Pension Minute, in so far as they are applicable under these rules, shall apply to his case.

Provided further that in the case of teachers who prior to March 1, 1928, attained the age of 55 (being a man) or 50 (being a woman), the annuity shall not be less than Rs. 7.50 per mensem.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended September 7, 1929.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 141 (2 Europeans, 6 Burghers, 78 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 17 Moors, 6 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1929, viz., 267,667) was 27.5, as against 30.8 in the preceding week, 32.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 36.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 170 (1 European, 6 Burghers, 95 Sinhalese, 31 Tamils, 28 Moors, 8 Malays, and 1 Other). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 33.1, as against 33.3 in the previous week, 29.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.3 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 170 total deaths, 38 were of infants under one year of age, as against 40 in the preceding week, 35 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 17.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Eleven deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident) and 1 each in Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Maradana North and Wellawatta South, as against 34 in the previous week, and 23 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Six deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 3 in Slave Island and 1 each in San Sebastian, New Bazaar, and Maradana hospital (of a non-resident), as against 2 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Five deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in New Bazaar and 2 in San Sebastian, as against 10 in the previous week, and 8 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Nine deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents) and 1 each in Maradana North, Maradana South, and Wellawatta North, as against 12 in the previous week, and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Phthisis* of a resident of Colombo Town, occurred at the Anti-tuberculosis hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. (a) Three deaths from *Enteric Fever*, of non-residents, were registered in Maradana hospitals, as against 4 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Enteric Fever*, of a resident of Colombo Town, occurred at the Infectious Diseases hospital, Angoda, during the week.

4. Twenty deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 11 from *Debility*, 10 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 6 from *Worms*, 5 from *Diarrhoea*, 4 from *Accidents*, 3 from *Dysentery*, 2 from *Tetanus*, 1 from *Homicide*, and 74 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Twenty-one cases of *Chickenpox*, 7 each of *Measles* and *Enteric Fever*, and 1 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 19, 2, 9, and nil, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82.0° against 80.7 in the preceding week and 82.9° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.873 in., against 29.928 in. in the preceding week and 29.881 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.51 in. against 0.07 in. in the preceding week and 0.04 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on July 20, 1929, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated July 16, 1929.

Present :—Mr. R. H. Whitehorn, Chairman; Mr. J. C. Ratwatte, Adigar; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva; Dr. G. P. Hay; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake; Dr. F. Keyt; Mr. A. V. Perera; Mr. D. K. Mc Minn.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on June 15, 1929, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1928 to June 30, 1929, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's report for June.
- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of June.
- (e) The reservoir readings for June.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 5 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during June.

4. Petitions:—(1) Mr. de Silva presented petition from the residents of Mavilmada complaining against the use of the land acquired for an Infectious Diseases Hospital as a trenching ground.

(2) Mr. Wijayatilake presented petitions from (i.) K. Ally Mohideen for permission to put up a galvanized shed to be used as a tea-kiosk on a site behind the bus stand opposite the Byrde Memorial Hall; (ii.) James Appu for permission to run a tea-kiosk near the Temple street bus stand; (iii.) the rice depôt-keepers at Jail road *re* the order of the Medical Officer of Health about exposing samples of rice on tables, &c., opposite the depôts; (iv.) S. M. Idroos for permission to run a roundabout on the market grounds; (v.) V. A. Hendrick Appuhamy for permission to place a table on the vacant ground opposite his stall to expose groceries; (6) the residents along Peradeniya road *re* the revision of the assessment of properties in Peradeniya road; (vii.) the residents of Buwelikada *re* annoyance caused by undesirables at the Buwelikada-Lewella road junction.

(3) Mr. Ismail presented petition from M. D. Stephen Appuhamy for permission to put up a swing on the market grounds for the perahera.

(4) Mr. Perera presented petition from A. N. P. Widyasekera, Physician-in-charge of the Ayurvedic Dispensary asking that the posts attached to the dispensary be made pensionable.

(5) Ratwatte Adigar presented petitions from (i.) the residents of Udamadapotta *re* the opening of a road; (ii.) the residents of Mapanawatura asking for a burial ground near the village.

The Chairman undertook to look into matters referred to in the petitions.

5. Correspondence:—(1) Letter No. Z 14/29 of June 19, 1929, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating that Mr. Turner will not be able to spare time or staff to examine the organization and systems of the various Departments of the Municipal Office till probably after June, 1932.—Read.

(2) Letter No. W 116/29 of June 22, 1929, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary sanctioning the by-law making Lady Blake's drive a one-way road for motor vehicles.—Read.

(3) Letter No. L 383/29 of June 29, 1929, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating that Government does not consider that the cancellation of the lease of land lying between the Kandy Club and the Planters' Association would be justified.—Read.

Resolved that the papers be circulated.

(4) Letter No. W 153/28 of July 5, 1929, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary inquiring as to the date from which the Board of Improvement should be dissolved.

Resolved that it be recommended that the Board of Improvement Commissioners, Kandy, be dissolved with effect from September 1, 1929.

Mr. de Silva moved that this Council do place on record its appreciation of the good work done by the Board. Mr. Perera seconded.—Carried unanimously.

(5) Letter No. W 191/29 of July 10, 1929, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary *re* the reform of the Kandy Municipal Council.—Read.

6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Ismail asked—Will the Chairman be pleased to state at the next meeting for the information of the members:—(1) What is the value of the electrical accessories at present in stock that are saleable to the public? (2) What is the value of the stock that has been set apart, or is likely to be required, for the use of the workshop of the Electrical Department? (3) What is the full value of the stock arrived at under the two heads enumerated above?

The Chairman replied as follows:—I will, with the honourable member's permission, combine the replies to these three questions into one.

7. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Wijayatilake asked—(1) What is the basis on which property is assessed in the town of Kandy? (2) How often does the revision of assessments take place? (3) Have any complaints been received from ratepayers in regard to the revision of assessment of property on Peradeniya road? (4) In making such assessments is any allowance made for expenses incurred by owners of property on annual repairs and for loss of rent, where houses remain vacant for a time or where rents are not recoverable? (5) Does the Chairman consider the present system of assessment and the present class of assessors satisfactory? (6) How often has the Chairman had to obtain the advice of expert assessors in regard to assessment of property in Kandy town?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) The basis is the definition of "annual value" given in Ordinance No. 6 of 1910. (2) In 1927, Council decided that the town should be re-assessed every five years, and that is the policy at which we are aiming. (3) 82 objections have been received in respect of 209 premises and await investigation. (4) No. There is no provision for such allowances in the definition above referred to. (5) The present system and the present assessors appear to have been satisfactory hitherto. Now that specialist assessors are employed in Colombo and by the Government, more criticism is to be expected and we may have to take measures accordingly. (6) In six cases in all.

8. Pursuant to notice Mr. de Silva moved—(1) That this Council do recommend to Government, that in the event of there being any necessity to examine the corpses of Muslim females before the issue of death certificates, the Registrar be authorized to get the assistance of one of the Municipal Health Visitors for such examination, within the Municipal limits. Mr. Wijayatilaka seconded.—Carried.

(2) That the Electrical Engineer be asked to submit a statement showing (a) whether it would be possible to establish an electric crematorium, and (b) whether it is possible to lower the charges of electricity, if consumers will utilize it for cooking purposes. Mr. Perera seconded.—Carried.

9. Pursuant to notice, Ratwatte Adigar moved—That the building known as the vegetable Market be reserved for the use of vegetable sellers on market days from next year. Mr. Perera seconded.

It was agreed that all the pavements be immediately roofed over, the old pavements being reserved for village produce and the new pavement being reserved for people evacuated from the old pavements.

10. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Wijayatilake moved—That this Council do allow all applications for water service for houses assessed at Rs. 600 per annum. Mr. de Silva seconded.

It was agreed to have a list of all premises where annual value is between Rs. 600 and Rs. 1,200 to which no water service has been laid, prepared from the Assessment Register.

11. Papers *re* pension payable to Mr. S. W. de Silva, Assessment Clerk.

Resolved that a pension of Rs. 2,800 per annum be granted.

Resolved also that this Council do place on record its appreciation of the long and valuable services rendered by Mr. de Silva.

12. Papers *re* applications to erect buildings on the line of a street less than 20 feet in width.

Resolved that the matter be deferred for consideration by the next meeting.

13. To sanction estimate for Rs. 180 for erecting side-rails over the bridge across the Moda-ela near the slaughter house.

Resolved that the estimate be sanctioned.
