A PROCLAMATION.

H. J. STANLEY.

WHEREAS by section 28 of "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," as amended by section 2 of Ordinance No. 8 of 1929 it is amongst other things enacted that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof or by a Commissioner of Assize duly appointed under the provisions of the said Ordinance for each of the Circuits into which the Island is divided for the hearing, trying, and determining all prosecutions which shall be commenced against any person for or in respect of any crime or offence or alleged crime or offence:

For the Southern Circuit, twice at least at Galle, and such other places in such Circuit as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint, such Sessions commencing at Galle on April 25 and September 15 in every year.

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to order that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden on the days hereinafter mentioned at Matara and Tangalla, places included within the said Southern Circuit:

Now, therefore, know Ye that We, the Governor, for sufficient reasons to Us appearing, and after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do order and appoint that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden at Matara and Tangalla in the said Southern Circuit, on or about Monday, October 14, 1929, and on or about Monday, November 18, 1929, respectively.

REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

(1) In these regulations—

"Public Stand" means a defined space provided or allotted by the Urban District Council for the use of hiring cars, and indicated as such by a notice.

"Urban District Council" means the Urban District Council of Jaffna.

(2) The Urban District Council may issue permits authorizing hiring cars to use a public stand.

(3) A fee of 25 cents shall be payable for a permit to use the public stand for one day, and a fee of Rs. 5 shall be payable for a permit to use the public stand for one month. Provided that when the hiring car is licensed to carry more than seven persons the fee shall be 50 cents and Rs. 10 respectively.

(4) No motor car shall enter or remain in a public stand unless its driver is in possession of a valid permit in respect of it and unless he produces it when required to do so by a Police Officer or Headman.

"THE SOCIETIES ORDINANCE, 1891."

Any person who commits a breach of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs. 50.

Clause 15 (i).—In the first sentence alter "The school must be open for instruction for at least 180 days during the year" to "The school must be open for instruction for at least 180 sessions during the year in a one-session school and for at least 360 sessions during the year in a two-session school."

Clause 15 (viii).—Alter to read as follows: "Pupils from a vernacular or bilingual school who seek admission into the classes of any school where the medium of instruction is English, shall have passed a vernacular standard not lower than the 3rd. Cases in which difficulty is caused by a change of residence on the part of the parent may be submitted to the Inspector for special consideration."

Clause 17.—In line 11 add a new sentence as follows: "Adequate accommodation for physical training must be provided where possible."

Clause 26 (iii).—In line 3 after the word "may" insert "assume the management or."

Clause 29.—Add as fresh paragraph:—

"In the case of full-time vernacular teachers included in the staff for work in the primary classes, the salary of such teachers according to the scale for teachers in vernacular schools (*vide* Code for Assisted Vernacular and Bilingual schools) may be paid as grant."

Clause 30 (a).—Delete.

Clause 30 (b).—In line 1 alter "approved course" to "approved post-primary course."

Clause 38 (i).—Delete, and insert the following as a separate paragraph:—

"The number of eligible pupils will be further subject to the limits of accommodation indicated in Clause 17."

Appendix A.—In Class III. alter "Vernacular teachers in English schools" to "Certificated vernacular teachers in English schools (post-primary classes)."

Alter the scale for uncertificated teachers as follows:—

"After the word "Uncertificated" insert "(appointed before the date of issue of this Code)." Insert the following:—

Tenderers, who have not previously held Government contracts, when applying for tender forms, should furnish the officer issuing the forms with a written statement giving their full names and permanent addresses, stating in which district or districts they own landed property or other interests. The extent of landed property and the nature and extent of other interests should also be given.

In the case of persons who have carried out contracts with the Forest Department, but not in the division or district concerned in the notice calling for tenders, they should state in which division or district or divisions or districts they held contracts.

In the case of persons who have carried out Government contracts with departments other than the Forest Department, the name of such department and the district in which the service was rendered should be stated.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

(1) To fell all trees (except scheduled and marked trees), 12 inches in girth and over. Trees and shrubs under 12 inches in girth are to be left growing in the area and are under no circumstances to be cut.

(2) All trees from 12 inches to 36 inches in girth must be cut within 6 inches from the ground.

(3) The area is subdivided into compartments. Work shall not proceed in more than five compartments at a time and all work shall be completed in compartment No. 1 before compartment No. 6 is entered, &c.

(4) The firewood shall be in lengths of 3 feet, and not less than 2 inches in diameter. All billets over 9 inches in diameter shall be split.

(5) The contractor shall not enter a fresh block or compartment without the written permission of the Range Forest Officer. The compartment lines shall be widened by the contractor sufficiently for the stacking of firewood and for its subsequent transport to the delivery dépôt.

Firewood cut in the compartments should be removed by head-loads and stacked along the compartment lines prior to removal by carts; carts shall under no circumstances be taken inside the felling area except along these compartment lines.

(6) Any tree marked by a Forest Officer as one to be felled and converted, shall without question be felled and converted, and any tree marked by a Forest Officer as tree not to be felled, shall not be either felled or injured.

(7) The contractor shall cut all brushwood, thorns, and woody undergrowth before the firewood is cut, and distribute them together with all inconvertible branchwood and wood refuse evenly and lightly over the area 10 feet away from seed bearers of scheduled species and standards of inferior species immediately after the removal of firewood. He shall further cut all climbers found on stems retained as standards.

(8) Stacks on railway line must be in rows convenient for loading the firewood into railway trucks. To economize ground space and to allow of space between the stacks for inspection, stacks shall be either 3 feet, 4½ feet, or 6 feet in height, as the Forest Officer in Charge, may from time to time direct.

(9) The contractor will be responsible for the safety of the firewood when stacked in the forest or on railway line, and in transit.

(10) The contractor may be required at times to increase the supplies should the railway requirements necessitate, and at time also to decrease supplies, but the average output shall be described in schedule.

(11) It must be clearly understood that for failure to have full monthly supplies ready as required, a penalty of 25 cents for every cubic yard shall be levied.

(12) Nothing in this contract shall preclude the Divisional Forest Officer from taking action in accordance with the provisions of the Forest Ordinance (No. 16 of 1907) against the contractor for felling or allowing his coolies to fell any tree within or outside his area of contract which would not be felled in accordance with the conditions of the said contract or without the necessary permit prescribed by the said Ordinance.

(13) Failure on the part of the contractor to carry out the work efficiently and maintain regular deliveries shall render him liable to have his contract closed and to be fined a sum which will not exceed the sum deposited by him as security.

SCHEDULE.

Vannivilankulam Reserve.

(a) To fell every tree above 12 inches in girth (excepting scheduled trees and those marked by a Forest Officer as trees not to be felled) standing in demarcated blocks containing about 360 acres in strips Nos. 12, 11, and 10 of the Vannivilankulam Reserve; and bounded on the north by plantations, south and east by 10 feet wide demarcation lines, and west by the western boundary of the Vannivilankulam Reserve, 10 feet in width.

(b) To cut and split into firewood every tree so felled, and every fallen tree whatsoever in the area, so as to yield 4,000 cubic yards of firewood, more or less, with the least amount of wastage. All firewood immediately after conversion to be delivered stacked along the Mankulam Railway Station, wood stages at an average rate of 500 cubic yards per month commencing from January 1, 1930. Distance of transport to Mankulam Railway Station is about ½ a mile by jungle track and about 2½ miles by District Road Committee road.

2. Offers should be made by letter, under sealed and registered cover, addressed to the Divisional Forest Officer, North-Western Division, Kurunegala, and posted to reach the Office of the Divisional Forest Officer, Kurunegala, not later than midday on October 15, 1929, the envelope being marked on the left hand top corner, "Offer for the Purchase of Timber and Firewood, North-Western Division," and signed by the tenderer. Alterations must be initialled, otherwise the offers may be treated as informal and rejected.

3. A deposit of Rs. 20 for each of the coupes is required and should be forwarded with the offer by a money order in favour of the Divisional Forest Officer, Kurunegala.

4. The tenderers should satisfy themselves by inspection before tendering as to the acreage and contents of the demarcated coupes referred to in the annexed schedule, as the figures given therein are estimated only and their correctness is in no way guaranteed. The boundaries of each coupe will be pointed out by the local Forest Ranger.

5. The successful tenderer will be required to execute a purchase agreement in respect of each coupe. A copy of this agreement can be seen at the Office of the Divisional Forest Officer, Kurunegala.

6. Before execution of the agreement the purchaser will be required to pay the full purchase amount.

7. After payment of the purchase price, deposit of the security, and execution of the agreement, the purchaser will be entitled on application to refund of his tender deposit. Should the successful tenderer fail to carry out the requirements of clauses 5 and 6 of this notice, within 14 days of receiving notice in writing from the Divisional Forest Officer, that his tender has been accepted, the Rs. 20 deposited for each coupe will be forfeited to the Crown. The successful tenderer will be entitled to a refund of the amount deposited by him on application to the Divisional Forest Officer concerned.

8. Tenderers should make offers, written both in words and figures, for the timber and firewood contained in each of the coupes.

9. No tender will be considered unless the procedure laid down has strictly been complied with. The Conservator of Forests reserves to himself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders and of accepting any portion of a tender.

10. The special rules for felling, conversion, and removal which the agreement will require to be observed are specified in the special conditions advertised below. Nothing of these special conditions shall render the purchaser in any way exempt from liability under the Forest Ordinance of 1907, should he be responsible for the commission of Forest Offence outside the boundaries of his purchased coupe or coupes.

11. The security to be deposited is between Rs. 50 and Rs. 200 according to the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer.

12. For any further information application should be made to the Divisional Forest Officer, Kurunegala.

Special Conditions.

On payment of the full purchase amount the purchaser will be entitled to fell and remove on or before June 30, 1930, in the manner specified below, all the firewood and timber contained in the purchased coupe or coupes. Any firewood or timber not removed by the expiry date shall *ipso facto* revert to the Crown.

(2) The purchaser shall agree to commence felling along the full length of the southern boundary of each coupe and to progress this felling line in the direction of the northern boundary, always keeping it parallel to the southern boundary along which felling commences.

(3) Should the purchaser fell or remove timber trees in excess of the quantity specified in special condition 2, nothing in the agreement shall exempt him from being liable for illicit felling and removal under the Forest Ordinance, No. 16 of 1907.

(4) The purchaser will be required to spread the branch-wood evenly over the coupes immediately after conversion.

(5) The purchaser of the coupe or coupes must obtain removal permits or timber cart notes for all material to be removed from the coupe.

(6) The purchaser shall agree that for each and every infringement of the above conditions he shall become liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 100, to be imposed by the Divisional Forest Officer in writing at his discretion, and to be recovered from the purchaser's security money.

(7) The purchaser shall agree that, in the event of security money having become exhausted, it shall be within the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer either (a) to accept a further security deposit amounting to 10 per cent. of the full tendered purchase price, or (b) to cancel the agreement and to refund to the purchaser such balance of the paid purchase money, if any as remains after deducting the value of firewood removed by the purchaser on the date of such cancellation. For the purpose of this clause the value of each removed cubic yard of firewood shall be reckoned at full royalty rates.

(8) The purchaser shall have the right of appeal to the Conservator of Forests in the event of enforcement of any of the penalties specified in these conditions, and the purchaser shall agree to accept the Conservator's decision as final and binding.

(9) The purchaser shall be required to cut all material in the coupes by three distinct operations as follows:

Operation 1.

All herbaceous and undergrowth other than tree growth and creepers shall be cut out. This operation shall commence along the full length of one boundary of each coupe and proceed in a straight line to the opposite boundary of that coupe. The whole area of each coupe must thus be covered, including those portions, if any, which contain no tree growth.

Operation 2.

All saplings and poles which are under 24 inches in girth shall be felled within 6 inches of the ground. This operation shall commence from and proceed to the same boundaries as in operation 1.

Operation 3.

All trees whether utilizable or otherwise and unless marked for retention as standards which are over 24 inches in girth shall be felled within 12 inches of the ground. This operation shall commence from and proceed to the same boundaries as in operation 1.

2. All tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover, and should be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Office of the Controller of Revenue, Colombo.

3. Tenders should either be deposited in the tender box in the Office of the Controller of Revenue, Colombo, or be sent through the post.

4. Tenders should be marked "Tenders for Firewood to Railway, North-Central Division, 1929-30," in the left hand top corner of the envelope, and should reach the Office of the Controller of Revenue not later than midday on Tuesday, October 15, 1929.

5. Tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application at the Forest Office, Anuradhapura. No tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized form. Alterations must be initialled, otherwise the tenders may be treated as informal and rejected.

6. A deposit of Rs. 20 for each service will be required to be made either at the Treasury or Kachcheri, and a receipt produce for the same before any form of tender is issued. Should any person decline or fail to enter into the contract and bond or to furnish approved security, within ten days of receiving notice in writing from the Head of the Department, or his duly authorized representative, that his tender has been accepted, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown, and the defaulter will render himself liable to be included in the list of defaulting contractors precluded from having any concern in a Government contract. All other deposits will be returned upon signature of a contract.

7. Each tender must be accompanied by a letter signed by two responsible persons, whose addresses must be given, engaging to become security for the due fulfilment of the contract.

8. A rate per cubic yard of firewood delivered should be quoted, written both in words and figures.

9. Sufficient sureties will be required to join in a bond for the due fulfilment of the contract. The amount of cash security required will be 10 per cent. of the value of the contract. All other necessary information can be ascertained upon application to the Forest Office, Anuradhapura.

10. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions above laid down have been strictly fulfilled.

11. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and of accepting any portion of a tender.

12. The contractor's obligations and rights under these contracts shall not be assigned or otherwise transferred or sublet without the consent and authority of the Tender

Board previously obtained in writing. The contractor shall not be a person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors, nor shall he issue a power of attorney to any person whose name is on such list for carrying on work under the contract. Any breach of this article of agreement shall render the agreement liable to cancellation without any compensation to the contractor.

13. No contract shall be entered into with any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors, either individually or jointly with any other person, nor shall the contractor employ any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors, or any other person to whom the Divisional Forest Officer, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, objects after giving due notice of his objection in writing.

16. A penalty of 10 cents for every cubic yard of firewood not stacked or delivered at the monthly rate specified in clause 19 below will be exacted from the contractor at the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer.

17. Each piece of wood to be 3 ft. in length and of 2 in. minimum diameter. Billets over 9 in. diameter should be split. All wood over 12 in. in girth to be billeted into 3 ft. lengths by hand saw or crosscut saw only.

18. Felling must be commenced on October 15, 1929, without fail, and all felling and splitting of logs must be completed by July 31, 1930.

19. All firewood immediately after conversion is to be transported and stacked at the delivery depot at the minimum quantity of 800 cubic yards in the case of service A, and 400 cubic yards in the case of service B per month. The first batch of firewood should be delivered at the depots within a month of notification of acceptance of tenders.

The works are to be completed by September 15, 1929. Any deficiencies in these stipulated quantities are to be made up during the following month.

20. No time extension will be given under any circumstances.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

21. (1) The areas enumerated in the schedule have been demarcated. Felling is to be done in the area to be pointed out by a Forest Officer, commencing from one end and continuing to the other. The areas shall be subdivided into 5-acre compartments in the case of service A and B, the dividing lines being widened sufficiently by the contractor to admit of stacking the firewood and the passage of carts. The contractor shall not work more than two compartments at a time and shall not enter into any fresh compartment until he has received a written certificate from the Divisional Forest Officer that the work in the compartments to which he has been admitted had been satisfactorily completed.

(2) The contractor shall at his own cost and charges furnish the labour and tools necessary for carrying the works on the contract.

(3) All trees should be felled with the saw within 6 in. from the ground unless otherwise ordered by the Divisional Forest Officer, they shall all be converted into firewood and no logs should be left in the area.

(4) Stacks must be 3 ft. in height. Big logs to be split up and not used as foundation for the stacks.

(5) In the event of a dispute between the Railway and the Forest Department as to deductions on account of bad stacking the wood is liable to be removed to the nearest Railway Depot and restacked, the measurement then obtained will be accepted as final for purposes of payment.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS.

22. (1) The following species shall not be felled unless stamped by a Forest Officer :—

(a) Promising seed bearers and sound and healthy saplings of satin, palu, milla, ranaj, halmilla, ebony, kon, ehela, kolon, and other superior species and valuable regrowth.

(2) The following species shall be felled and converted into firewood :—

(a) All inferior species unless otherwise ordered by the Divisional Forest Officer.

(b) All crooked and unsound trees of the superior species stamped by a Forest Officer with due regard to a uniform distribution of standards not less than 50 and not exceeding 100 to an acre.

(3) Brushwood should be spread evenly over the area in which completed block and before a new block is entered. When the whole area is completed brushwood must also be spread over the cart tracks. No brushwood, however, should be spread within 10 ft. of any standard.

(4) There will be no restrictions about carting inside the 5-acre compartments.

(5) Coppicing of stumps will not be done.

(6) A percentage of the standards to be left standing on the area will be marked beforehand by the Forest Department, and the balance marked as the contract progresses according to silvicultural requirements. The number of such standards to be retained will be between 50 and 75 per acre.

23. The contractor will be liable to a fine of Rs. 5 in addition to royalty value for any unauthorized tree felled.

24. For any further information, and for inspection of the draft contract, application should be made to the Divisional Forest Officer, North-Central Division, Anuradhapura.

2. All tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover, and should be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Office of the Controller of Revenue, Colombo.

3. Tenders should either be deposited in the tender box in the Office of the Controller of Revenue, Colombo, or be sent through the post.

4. Tenders should be marked "Tenders for Firewood to Railway, North Central Division, 1929-30," in the left hand top corner of the envelope, and should reach the Office of the Controller of Revenue not later than midday on Tuesday, October, 15, 1929.

5. Tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application at the Forest Office, Anuradhapura. No tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized form. Alterations must be initialled, otherwise the tenders may be treated as informal and rejected.

6. A deposit of Rs. 20 for the service will be required to be made either at the Treasury or Kachcheri, and a receipt produced for the same before any form of tender is issued. 17. Each piece of wood to be 3 feet in length and of 2 inches minimum diameter. Billets over 9 inches in diameter should be split. All wood over 12 inches in girth to be billeted into 3 feet lengths by hand saw or cross cut saw only.

18. Felling must be commenced on October 15, 1929, without fail, and all felling and splitting of logs must be completed by July 31, 1930.

19. All firewood immediately after conversion is to be transported and stacked at the delivery depôt at the minimum quantity of 1,320 cubic yards per month. The work is to be completed by September 15, 1930.

Any deficiency in this stipulated quantity should be made up during the following month.

20. No time extension will be given under any circumstances.

General Conditions.

(5) In the event of a dispute between the Railway and the Forest Department as to deductions on account of bad stacking the wood is liable to be removed to the nearest railway depôt and restacked, the measurement then obtained will be accepted as final for purposes of payment.

Special Conditions.

22. (1) The following species shall not be felled unless stamped by a Forest Officer:—

From sing seed bearers and sound and healthy saplings of satin, palu, milla, ranai, halmilla, ebony, kon, ehela, kolon, and other superior species and valuable regrowth.

(2) The following species shall be felled and converted into firewood:—

(a) All inferior species unless otherwise ordered by the Divisional Forest Officer.

(b) All crooked and unsound trees of the superior species stamped by a Forest Officer with due regard to a uniform distribution of standards not less than 50 and exceeding 100 an acre.

23. The contractor shall be liable to a fine of Rs. 5 in addition to royalty value for any unauthorized tree felled.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended September 14, 1929.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 144 (6 Burghers, 80 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 23 Moors, 6 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1929, viz., 267,667) was 28.1, as against 27.5 in the preceding week, 34.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 36.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 167 (2 Europeans, 7 Burghers, 96 Sinhalese, 33 Tamils, 23 Moors, 2 Malays, and 4 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 32.5, as against 33.1 in the previous week, 31.2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.3 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 167 total deaths, 40 were of infants under one year of age, as against 38 in the preceding week, 21 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Still Births.—The number of still births registered during the week was 10.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Eighteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Kotahena North, 2 each in Kotahena South and Wellawatta North, and 1 each in New Bazaar, Maradana North, Maradana East, and Maradana South, as against 11 in the previous week and 23 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Nine deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in New Bazaar, 2 in Slave Island and 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, San Sebastian, and Kotahena North, as against 5 in the previous week and 8, the weekly average for last year.

2. Twenty deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 12 in Maradana hospitals (including 8 deaths of non-residents), 3 each in Kotahena South and Maradana South and 1 each in St. Paul's and New Bazaar, as against 9 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

3. Two deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 1 in Pettah and 1 in Maradana hospital (of a non-resident), as against 3 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. Twenty-two deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 11 from *Debility*, 9 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 7 from *Dysentery*, 3 each from *Diarrhoea*, *Worms* and *Accidents*, 2 each from *Homicide* and *Puerperal Septicaemia*, and 56 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Sixteen cases of *Chickenpox*, 12 of *Enteric Fever* and 3 of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 21.7 and 7 respectively, of the preceding week. No case of *Plague* was reported during the week, 1 case was reported during the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.7° against 82.0° in the preceding week and 82.2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.874 in. against 29.873 in. in the preceding week and 29.887 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.60 in. against 0.51 in. in the preceding week and 0.13 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

133. *Declaration of Dividend.*—The Company in General Meeting may declare a dividend to be paid to the Shareholders according to their rights and interests in the profits and may fix the time for payment. Regulations governing the Granting of Free Study Passages to Medical Officers and Medical Officers of Health.

NOTICE is hereby given that on and after September 1, 1929, the courses which must be taken by Medical Officers and Medical Officers of Health in order to qualify them for the grant of free study passages are as follows:

A.—*Medical Officers, Grade II. (not possessing British Qualifications).*

(1) To obtain, either—

(a) the Triple Qualifications of Edinburgh and Glasgow; or (b) the M.R.C.S. England, L.R.C.P., London—

together with in each case the Certificate of the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine granted to those who have passed the School Examination;

or (2) To attend the course in Tropical Medicine and Hygiene at either the School of Tropical Medicine in London or in Liverpool and to obtain the Diploma in Tropical Medicine and Hygiene (D.T.M. & H.) of the Conjoint Board of the Royal College of Physicians, London, and the Royal College of Surgeons, England, or of the University of Cambridge, or of the University of Edinburgh, or the Diploma in Tropical Medicine (D.T.M.) and the Diploma in Tropical Hygiene (D.T.H.) of the University of Liverpool.

In addition to (1) or (2) above, all officers shall be required to obtain a certificate, signed by the Dean of a Medical School in the United Kingdom, recognized as such by the General Medical Council of Great Britain, to the effect that the holder of such certificate shall have satisfactorily attended, for a period of not less than six months, courses of instruction in Clinical Medicine and Surgery at the hospital attached to such Medical School. This course of Clinical study shall not run concurrently with any of the courses to be attended at either the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine or the Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine.

B.—*Medical Officers, Grade I., and Medical Officers, Grade II. (possessing British Qualifications).*

(1) To obtain the Diploma in Tropical Medicine and Hygiene or the Diploma in Public Health for the purpose of qualifying for transference to the Sanitary side of the Department.

(2) To obtain a higher qualification in Medicine, Surgery, or Midwifery, which must be approved by the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services.

In the above two categories, the period of study shall not be less than twelve months.

C.—*Medical Officers of Health, Grade II.*

To obtain a Diploma in Public Health or other Public Health qualification in order to become eligible for promotion to Grade I.

D.—Medical Officers of Health, Grade I.

To follow a course of study of not less than twelve months duration in some specialized branch of Public Health which must be approved by the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services.

The number of free study passages which may be granted to an officer is limited to two return passages during his whole period of service.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Town Hall on Wednesday, August 7, 1929, at 3 p.m.

THE Council met this day at 3 P.M. pursuant to notice dated July 30, 1929.

Present :—Mr. H. E. Newnham, V.D., M.A., C.C.S., Chairman; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, M.L.C.; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Mr. R. L. Pereira, K.C.; Dr. E. A. Coorey; Mr. T. G. Jayewardene, V.D., J.P.; Mr. M. L. M. Reyal; Dr. S. Muttiah; Mr. J. S. Collett; Dr. V. van Langenberg, V.D.; Mr. F. Dadabhoy, J.P.; Mr. A. H. Morgan; and Mr. H. J. Hutchings.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of July 10, 1929, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of July 10, 1929, be confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Dr. E. A. Coorey presented a petition from cattle importers and requested that it be put before the Sanitation Committee.

3. In the absence of the Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, M.L.C., Mr. T. G. Jayewardene asked the question standing in the name of the former—Will the Chairman be pleased to draw the attention of the Colonial Secretary to the urgency of introducing the proposed amendment of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance in order to enable the surplus in the hands of the Council after the outright sale of property to be returned to the original owner of the same.

The Chairman replied as follows :—The Chairman has done so and has been informed that the draft Ordinance will shortly be published.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. T. G. Jayewardene asked the Chairman the following questions :—(1) With reference to his answer to my question at the last Meeting of Council, *re* permission to erect commercial buildings in Layard's Broadway, where it was stated that the premises in question though scheduled in a congested area were not in fact congested, will the Chairman be pleased to call for a report from the Municipal Engineer on the whole matter, and place the same before the Housing and Town Improvement Committee, as the papers on the subject disclose irregularities on the part of certain officers in the Municipal Engineer's Department? (2) On the return from leave of the Municipal Engineer, will the Chairman be pleased to obtain his views, and submit a report to the Works and Finance Committees, as to the desirability of giving Mr. Wijenathien, the Drainage Engineer, leave with pay and allowance to study the question of the purification of the sewage now being discharged into the Kelani river, by visiting some of the sewage works in Europe and the East? (3) Will the Chairman be pleased to give a list of outstanding matters affecting Municipal administration, where Government have been requested either to amend existing legislation, or introduce fresh legislation? How often after the first request has the attention of Government been called to the necessity of expediting such legislation, and with what result?

The Chairman replied as follows :—(1) and (2) Yes. (3) The following is the list :—

(a) *Anti-Mosquito Ordinance*.—The Mosquito Ordinance was first suggested by Major James in March, 1913. In January, 1914, Government intimated that they did not propose to proceed with the legislation. There is record of attention having been subsequently invited by the Chairman to this desired legislation in October and December, 1919. In reply to the latter letter the Colonial Secretary undertook to effect necessary legislation by amendment to an existing Ordinance. Attention was again invited in September and October, 1921. In January, 1922, Government replied proposing to introduce a new Ordinance instead of the previously proposed amendment. In May, 1922, Government conveyed its decision not to proceed with this draft bill. Council in June, 1922, resolved to pass by-laws providing powers for the purpose, and the Attorney-General was informed that it would be advisable to include all the amendments to Ordinance No. 6 of 1910 for current administrative purposes. The draft Mosquito Ordinance appeared in the *Gazette* of August 3, 1928, but the Ordinance has not been passed yet.

(b) *Food and Drugs Ordinance*.—In August, 1912, a Committee appointed by Government drafted a Food and Drugs Ordinance. In August, 1917, in reply to an inquiry by the Chairman, the Colonial Secretary said that the draft Ordinance could not be proceeded with. In March, 1920, acting upon a resolution of Council, the Chairman asked Government to introduce legislation. The attention of Government was invited in April, July, August, September, and October. The Colonial Secretary on October 25, 1920, informed the Chairman that Government could not proceed with the bill. In June, 1921, Chairman again invited attention to the matter and was informed that it had been decided to defer introduction of legislation. In August, 1923, and May, 1925, Government was again urged to pass a Food and Drugs Ordinance without success. In November, 1928, the Colonial Secretary stated that Government awaited the report of the Committee which was considering the question of the reorganization of the Government Analyst's Department, a matter which was closely connected with the introduction of the proposed Ordinance.

(c) *Amendments to the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance*.—In March, 1922, the Council forwarded to Government certain amendments it desired made to the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance, No. 19 of 1915. Various conferences ensued, and in March, 1925, Government appointed a Committee to consider a draft bill which had by then been prepared. The Committee has not yet reported.

(d) *Amendments to the Municipal Councils' Ordinance*.—Amendments desired by the Council to the Councils' Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, reached the stage of a draft bill in 1923, and were placed before the Legislative Council, whence they were referred to a Select Committee, which reported in January, 1924. Meanwhile the whole question of the alteration of the Council's Constitution has been under consideration. Conferences have been held and decisions reached. A draft Ordinance has been prepared.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. M. L. M. Reyal moved—A Special Committee be appointed to consider the regulations insisting upon taximeters being fitted to all passenger-carrying motor cars plying for hire in Colombo. Mr. T. G. Jayewardene seconded.

The Chairman stated the facts in regard to this matter.

Mr. R. L. Pereira opposed the motion.

Dr. S. Muttiah wished to know whether any firms hiring motor cars were exempted from this regulation.

The Chairman stated that all cars plying for hire on the streets and from the public stands would have to comply with the regulations.

Mr. M. L. M. Reyal replied.

The motion was put to the meeting and lost.

5. (1) Dr. E. A. Coorey sought and obtained the permission of Council to move the following motion which he thereupon moved:—That this Council do request the Chairman to apply to the Municipal Magistrate to grant an extension of time for the demolition of premises No. 84, Buller's road. Mr. M. L. M. Reyal seconded.

Mr. T. G. Jayewardene and the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader opposed the motion.

The question was raised as to whether the motion was in order.

The Chairman ruled that under section 75 (g) of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910 the motion was in order. The motion was put to the meeting and lost.

The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 6 to 13 (inclusive on the agenda). Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing and the Special Committees named were then laid before the Council in Committee:—

Extract from the Minutes of the Special Committee regarding the Public Library of July 6, 1929.

(4) To consider the Chairman's memorandum dated June 2, 1929, regarding the appointment of a clerk to the Public Library.—Recommended that (1) Mr. E. van Twest, Assistant Librarian, be called on to retire from that post and that he be offered the post of care-taker of the Library on a salary of Rs. 540—60—1,320 per annum with free quarters. The post of care-taker should be abolished when he gives it up. (2) Applications be called for for the post of Assistant Librarian on a salary of Rs. 1,200—96—2,400 per annum. (3) A clerk in Division II. be appointed to the Library.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Special Committee be adopted.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of July 24, 1929.

(2) To consider a report of the Engineer, Buildings, dated July 18, 1929, requesting sanction to lay street lines at 431, Fussells lane (marked E-F on street line plan No. 1,333, dated July 2, 1929, and signed by Mr. H. L. de S. Kulatileke, Assistant Municipal Engineer) to permit of a building being erected.—Recommended.

MUNICIPAL ENGINEER'S DEPARTMENT.

(2) To consider a letter dated July 12, 1929, from Mr. T. G. Jayewardene, V.D., J.P., suggesting the desirability of voting at least a portion of the amount required for the construction of the road from Old Moor street to Armour street, the acquisition of land for which has been practically completed.—Recommended that the detailed plan and estimate be approved and that Rs. 40,000 be voted at present towards the construction.

(3) To consider—(a) The quotations received for quarrying at Biyagama for 6 months.—(a) Considered. (b) The recommendation of the Acting Municipal Engineer that the quotation of Mr. N. S. Thasan be accepted as follows:—2-inch metal delivered at river bank, per cube, Rs. 9·73; 2-inch metal piled, per cube, Rs. 9·23; rubble piled, per cube, Rs. 5·98; load from measured piles and deliver 2-inch metal alongside crane, per cube, 85 cents; load from measured piles at the quarry and deliver 2-inch metal on barges, per cube, Re. 1·30; load from measured piles at the quarry and deliver rubble on barges, per cube, Re. 1·09.

Note.—The lowest tenders for rubble and metal delivered on the barge are from Mr. N. S. Thasan, and they aggregate per cube to Rs. 7·07 and Rs. 10·53. His tender for both of them at the pit mouth and river bank are not the lowest. It is not practicable to put another contractor on the job for the separate produce of rubble and 2-inch metal at pit and river bank.

(6) Recommended (1) that Mr. O. P. Gunawardene be appointed Superintendent of Services on a salary of Rs. 3,960 a year. (2) That Mr. E. G. B. Calyanaratne be appointed Superintendent of Mains on a salary of Rs. 3,960 a year. The appointments to date from August 8, 1929.

Resolutions.

With regard to items 4 and 5, Mr. T. G. Jayewardene opposed the recommendation of the Standing Committees and moved that the Waterworks Inspectorate consist of one Chief Inspector, two Waterworks Inspectors, and four Divisional Inspectors. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.

The Chairman gave the particulars with regard to the consideration of this question by the various Committees, and the duties suggested for the two proposed Superintendents.

Mr. R. L. Pereira opposed the motion and supported the recommendation of the Standing Committees. Mr. T. G. Jayewardene replied.

The motion was put to the meeting and lost.

It was resolved, on the motion of the Chairman, that the recommendations contained in item 5 be adopted.

With regard to item 6, Mr. T. G. Jayewardene and Dr. E. V. Ratnam opposed the adoption of the recommendation and contended that the usual procedure laid down in the standing orders of the Council, Nos. 20 and 21, should be adhered to.

Mr. T. G. Jayewardene moved that the recommendation be not adopted. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded lost.

It was resolved, on the motion of the Chairman, that the recommendations contained in item 6 be adopted.

Dr. E. V. Ratna and Mr. T. G. Jayewardene dissented. (Their dissent is annexed.)

Extract from the Minutes of the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) regarding Salaries of July 29, 1929.

(3) To consider the reference by Council of July 10, 1929, in connection with the following recommendation of the Works and Finance Committees of June 26, 1929, "that the matter be referred to the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) regarding salaries for a definite recommendation to be made by them to the next meeting of Council."

Recommendation—That as the applicants for the post advertised for in Grade II. do not come up to the standard required, the post of Grade I. Engineer, on the initial salary of Rs. 12,000 a year, rising by annual increments of Rs. 480 to Rs. 15,000, a year, be recreated and that it be offered to the following applicants in the following order:—(1) Mr. J. B. Mayers, B.Sc. (Hons.), A.M.I.C.E., (2) Mr. W. Dixon, A.M.I.C.E., and A.M.I.M. and C.E.—Recommended that, as Mr. N. M. Ingram, the Municipal Engineer, is due to return from leave on August 5, the consideration of this matter be deferred till he returns.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendation of the Standing Committees be adopted.

VETERINARY DEPARTMENT.

(4) To consider a report of the Acting Veterinary Surgeon, dated June 28, 1929, stating that it has not been the practice in the past to charge any fees for calves at the Quarantine Station and Cattle Mart and, as a consequence, no record of calves or deaths of calves is kept and recommending that a small fee be charged on all calves both at the Quarantine Station and Cattle Mart.—Recommended that the recommendation of the Finance Committee of July 24, 1929 (item No. 3), be adopted.

DISSENT.

We have to dissent from the resolution of Council passed at its meeting held on August 7, 1929, appointing Messrs. O. P. Gunawardene and E. G. B. Calyanaratne to the newly created posts of Superintendents of Services and Mains, respectively, in the Waterworks Department, for the following reasons:—

- (1) Because the above-named officers do not possess the qualifications for this grade laid down under the 1924 Salaries Scheme, sanctioned by Council on March 12, 1924, namely, the possession of a licence in surveying or levelling, and sanction of Council not having been obtained to waive this qualification.
- (2) Because the procedure laid down in Standing Orders Nos. 20 and 21, which require a Head of a Department to call for applications to fill the posts, and submit six to ten names of applicants, arranged in alphabetical order, to the relative Committees through the Chairman, to enable the Committees to make a recommendation to Council, was not followed in this instance.
- (3) Because the appointments are illegal, in that they have not been made in accordance with the procedure laid down under by-law 34 for filling appointments, the salary of which exceeds Rs. 1,200 and the Council has thereby laid itself open to an action at law.

Method for tapping the milk or latex from latex containing trees and plants.

Abstract.—The portion of the circumference of the tree on which hitherto a continuous incision has been made is now divided into several parts which are separated from one another by intermediate strips of bark which remain untreated. Each incision is thus interrupted by one or more strips of uncut bark.

The claim is :—

Method for tapping the milk or latex from latex containing trees and plants, characterized in that the field which is to be tapped is divided into two or more fields between which a vertical strip of bark is left intact.

Improvements in building construction.

Abstract.—Improved frame members are composed of a plurality of elongate structural elements preferably with parallel flanges defining the outer faces of the structural wall. Sills are provided with openings into which cementitious material can be poured. Web plates may project beyond the sides of the frame work to carry joists.

The claims are :—

1. A building construction of the type employing a frame member at the intersection of vertical and/or horizontal walls which is connected to elements in each of the intersecting walls, characterized in that the frame member is formed of a plurality of elongate structural elements secured in parallel juxtaposition and has parallel flanges, the elements of one of the intersecting walls lying within the planes of the outer faces of the parallel flanges.

2. The subject matter of claim 1 further characterized in that the frame members have portions extending out of the plane of one of the intersecting walls for engagement with the structural elements of the other wall.

3. The subject matter of claim 1 further characterized in that both the vertical and horizontal frame members are thus formed of elongate structural elements.

4. The subject matter of claim 1 further characterized in that a web plate is located between parallel faces of the structural elements and projects laterally beyond the same to form a ledge for engagement with the structural elements of one wall.

5. The subject matter of claim 4 further characterized in that the ledge is provided with openings spaced at distances which are an integral multiple of the width of the frame member as defined by the outer faces of the parallel flanges.

6. The subject matter of any of the preceding claims further characterized in that the frame elements of one wall are connected to the parallel flanges.

7. The subject matter of any of the preceding claims further characterized in that the horizontal frame members are provided with spaced openings between the flanges to permit the pouring of material into the walls below said members.

8. The subject matter of any of the preceding claims further characterized in that the flanges are provided with means for connection to frame elements, which are spaced at distances that are integral multiples of the width of the frame members.

9. The subject matter of any of the preceding claims further characterized in that the structural elements are angles with aligned legs interconnected and with their other legs providing the parallel flanges of the frame members.

10. The subject matter of any of the preceding claims further characterized in that vertical frame members comprise posts at the intersections or corners of vertical walls, and in that stud members are located between said posts, the posts being formed of a plurality of stud members secured to each other.

11. The subject matter of claim 10 further characterized in that the studs have flanges in the planes of the flanges of the frame members.

Apparatus for effecting catalytic reactions between gases under pressure and at high temperature.

Abstract.—A single apparatus is described in which the catalysis apparatus, the cooler, collector, circulating pump and heat exchanger are combined in a single unit.

The claims are :—

1. An apparatus for the execution in closed circuit of catalytic reactions between gases under pressure and at high temperature, characterized by the fact that it is provided with all the devices necessary to obtain the heating of the reacting gases, their passage through the catalytic substance, the recovery of a part of the heat from the catalyzed gases, the cooling of the gases which have been catalysed, the consequent separation and collection of the products formed, and the continuous circulation of the reacting gases, said circulation being obtained by means of an ejector.

2. Apparatus according to claim 1 formed by a pressure resisting tube containing a series of tubes placed co-axially to it and the innermost of which contains an electric heating device and is surrounded by the space containing the catalyst, the latter being in turn surrounded by a series of annular spaces so disposed as to form a heat exchanger, characterized by the fact that the outmost of said annular spaces through which the catalysed gases pass after part of the heat which they possess has been recovered, is provided with a cooler which cools the gases to a suitable temperature, causing the separation at liquid state of the products formed which are collected in the space comprised between the lower end of the above referred internal tubes and the lower cover, and in which space is also placed an ejector through which pass the fresh gases supplied to the apparatus.

3. Apparatus according to the preceding claims, characterized by the fact that the pressure resisting tube is provided with a device for its cooling.

4. Apparatus according to the preceding claims, characterized by the fact that the upper cover is provided with a device for its cooling.

5. Apparatus according to the preceding claims, characterized by the fact that the simultaneous cooling of the pressure resisting tube and of the catalysed gases is obtained by means of a cooler consisting in a series of grooves in which passes a cold fluid, said grooves being placed along the external surface of a metallic tube lining completely the internal surface of the pressure resisting tube.

An improved self-locking nut and bolt.

Abstract.—The bearing face of the screw thread makes an angle "a" with a parallel to the axis in a plane passing through the axis of the bolt and nut when clamping takes place. Tan "a" must be less than the coefficient of friction and in a limiting case the screw thread may have infinite pitch.

The claims are :—

1. A self-locking screw thread for nuts and bolts wherein the profile comprises a side inclined to the axis and an opposite side less inclined so formed that the sectional contour perpendicular to the axis of the screw threaded member is an interrupted spiral, the pitch being sufficiently great in order that the interrupted part of the spiral may extend along the screw threaded member in a direction practically parallel to the axis in order to obtain an instantaneous wedging by a slight angular displacement.

2. A self-locking screw thread according to claim 1, wherein the profile comprises an inclined side, and an opposed side perpendicular to the axis so that the interrupted part of the spiral is formed by a radial part.

3. A self-locking screw thread according to claim 1, wherein the pitch is infinite so that the interrupted part of the spiral extends along the screw threaded member in a direction parallel to the axis.

4. A self-locking screw thread according to claim 1, wherein the tangent at a point of the spiral makes with a tangent to the circumference of a circle passing through the said point an angle less than the angle of which the tangent is equal to the coefficient of friction of the metals in contact.

5. A self-locking screw-thread substantially as hereinbefore described in connection with the several figures of the accompanying drawing.

California Corrugated Culvert Co.

Fastening lugs for nestable sectional structures.

Abstract.—The nestable culvert is formed of two sheets. Offsets are punched in the edges of the lower sheet and in these the edges of the plain semicircular section are inserted.

A lug of suitable form is inserted in a hole in the lower section and the other end passes through a corresponding hole in the upper section and is bent over by a suitable lever.

The claims are :—

1. The combination of complementary pipe sections, including a fastening lug consisting of a bar adapted to pass through holes arranged adjacent the meeting edges of the pipe section, said lug being of a length greater than the distance between said holes and the ends of said lug protruding from said holes and are bent to prevent their retraction.

2. The combination, as set forth in claim 1, in which said fastening lug has bent end portions, one end portion being adapted for passing through both of said holes successively and for subsequent bending to retain it in position, while the other bent end portion is provided with a stop to limit its passage through the first of said holes.

3. The combination, as set forth in claims 1 and 2, in which the edges of the complementary pipe sections meet in a positive stop joint, said sections being drawn together to tighten their stop joint when the protruding ends of said fastening lug are bent to prevent their retraction.

4. The combination, as set forth in claims 1 and 2, in which said fastening lug has one end bent and an offset near its other end, the bent end and the offset end being relatively flexed to enable the former to find and pass through one hole as the latter fulcrums in the other hole, whereby both ends protrude from said holes and being fashioned with stops to prevent their retraction.

5. The combination of complementary pipe sections, substantially as shown and described and for the purpose set forth.

Improvements in or relating to wave signalling systems.

Abstract.—Resonant oscillatory apparatus having low damping and a high selectivity such as that obtainable by means of resonant piezo-electric devices is used in combination with means for rapidly stopping out oscillations which have been set up. The oscillations may be damped out by intermittently introducing excitation of a reversed phase, the periodicity being higher than that of the signalling frequency but lower than that of the carrier wave. Suitable circuits are described.

The claims are:—

1. A system of wave signalling in which there is employed a resonant apparatus to deal with modulated wave forms which has a high degree of selectivity of the order that is obtained by a piezo-electric device or a still higher selectivity.
2. A system of wave signalling in which the damping of a resonant apparatus employed therein is less than that normally required for true reproduction of the initial signals and by control of the energy in said resonant apparatus true reproduction is obtained therewith.
3. A system of wave signalling (*e.g.*, high frequency electric signalling) which consists in the use of resonant oscillatory apparatus having low damping and a selectivity of the high order that is obtained by means of a resonant piezo-electric crystal device, in combination with means for quickly stopping either periodically or at predetermined times oscillations therein which have been set up by excitation of the apparatus.
4. A system as claimed in claim 3, wherein the stopping of the oscillations is effected rhythmically at a frequency lower than the carrier or basic frequency but higher than any of the frequencies used for signalling *e.g.*, the frequency of dots in Morse telegraphy or modulation frequencies in telephony and allied signalling.
5. A system as claimed in claim 3 or 4, wherein the stopping of the oscillations is effected by intermittently introducing excitation of a reversed phase.
6. A system as claimed in claim 5, wherein a source of oscillatory energy is applied to the resonant oscillatory apparatus in two phases that are opposed and are alternately rendered active upon such apparatus for the purpose described.
7. A system as claimed in claim 5, wherein the reversal of phase is effected by producing a small change in the frequency of excitation for the oscillatory apparatus and employing for that purpose another oscillatory circuit sharply tuned to the mean of the resulting frequencies of excitation.
8. A system of wave signalling employing resonant apparatus having low or negative damping and co-operating valve detecting and/or amplifying devices, wherein the frequency to which the apparatus is tuned in operation is maintained constant, and means are provided for controlling the energy in the apparatus to prevent persistence of oscillation without causing any alteration in the frequency of the resonant apparatus.
9. A system of wave signalling as claimed in claim 8, wherein the controlling means is such as to interrupt the operation at the resonant frequency of the apparatus more frequently than the highest audio or modulating frequency of the signal transmitted.
10. A system as claimed in claim 1, 2, or 3, wherein there is employed at a transmitter or receiver, two oscillatory circuits constituting or coupled to one or more radiating systems tuned to the basic or carrier frequency and excited in opposite phase and also controlled rhythmically (*e.g.*, about 15,000 to 20,000 cycles per second for telephony) in such manner that when the excitation of one oscillatory circuit is at a maximum the other is a minimum and *vice versa*.
11. In a system of wave signalling the combination with an oscillatory apparatus of means for feeding thereto two series of waves of the same basic frequency modulated at the same modulating frequency, in such manner that the two series of waves are in opposite phase both in regard to the basic and modulating frequencies.
12. A system of wave signalling as claimed in claim 1, 2, or 3, wherein signalling is effected by frequency modulation of a carrier wave at the transmitter, and within the limits of the frequency range of the piezo-electric resonator, and at the receiver there is employed a resonator that is non-uniformly responsive to the changes of frequency within these limits, *e.g.*, a receiver as claimed in claim 10.
13. A system of wave signalling as claimed in claim 1 or 2, wherein there is employed a receiver comprising a resonator to which the received energy is fed in two phases that are opposed and means to apply to the resonator a controlling frequency for the purpose described.
14. A system of high frequency wave signalling as claimed in claim 6, wherein the transmission is effected by successive trains of waves of opposite phase which have no effective response in broadly tuned receivers (*e.g.*, other than that such as is claimed in claim 10).
15. A system of high frequency wave signalling as claimed in claim 1, 2, or 3, wherein successive trains of waves which are opposite in phase and are also oppositely modulated by the signal are propagated from aerial system (*e.g.*, beam aeriels) which are spaced apart in order that there shall be equality of the signals only in definite directions.
16. A high frequency electric signalling system substantially as described with reference to the accompanying drawings.
