REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

(1) In these regulations—

"Public Stand" means a defined space provided or allotted by the Local Board for the use of hiring cars, and indicated as such by a notice.

"Local Board" means the Local Board of Bandarawela.

(2) The Local Board may issue permits authorizing hiring cars to use a public stand.

(3) A fee of 50 cents shall be payable for a permit to use the public stand for one day, and a fee of Rs. 5 shall be payable for a permit to use the public stand for one month.

REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

(1) In these regulations—

"Public Stand" means a defined space provided or allotted by the Urban District Council for the use of hiring cars, and indicated as such by a notice.

"Urban District Council" means the Urban District Council of Jaffna.

(2) The Urban District Council may issue permits authorizing hiring cars to use a public stand.

(3) A fee of 25 cents shall be payable for a permit to use the public stand for one day, and a fee of Rs. 5 shall be payable for a permit to use the public stand for one month. Provided that when the hiring car is licensed to carry more than seven persons the fee shall be 50 cents and Rs. 10 respectively.

(4) No motor car shall enter or remain in a public stand unless its driver is in possession of a valid permit in respect of it and unless he produces it when required to do so by a Police Officer or Headman.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended September 21, 1929.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 133 (5 Burghers, 83 Sinhalese, 21 Tamils, 17 Moors, 4 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1929, viz., 267,667) was 25·9, as against 28·1 in the preceding week, 35·9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 36·1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 161 (1 European, 4 Burghers, 91 Sinhalese, 30 Tamils, 26 Moors, 3 Malays, and 6 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 31·4, as against 32·5 in the previous week, 28·0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30·3 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 161 total deaths, 25 were of infants under one year of age, as against 40 in the preceding week, 36 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 13.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty-five deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 11 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 3 each in Kotahena North and Wellawatta South, 2 each in St. Paul's and New Bazaar, and 1 each in Kotahena South, Maradana East, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 18 in the previous week and 23 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Seven deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in St. Paul's, 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 each in San Sebastian and Kotahena North, as against 9 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in Kotahena North, Maradana South, and Kollupitiya, as against nil in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Seventeen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 11 in Maradana hospitals (including 6 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Slave Island, and 1 each in Kotahena South, Maradana North, Maradana South, and Kollupitiya, as against 20 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Three deaths from *Phthisis* of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Six deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (of non-residents) and 2 in New Bazaar, as against 2 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. Twenty deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 6 from *Worms*, 5 from *Debility*, 4 from *Dysentery*, 2 each from *Infantile Convulsions and Accidents*, 1 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Homicide*, and 62 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Thirty-one cases of *Chickenpox*, 9 of *Enteric Fever* and 4 of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 16, 12, and 3, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81·1°, against 81·7° in the preceding week and 82·6° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·878 in., against 29·874 in. in the preceding week and 29·888 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2·41 in., against 0·60 in. in the preceding week and 0·29 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

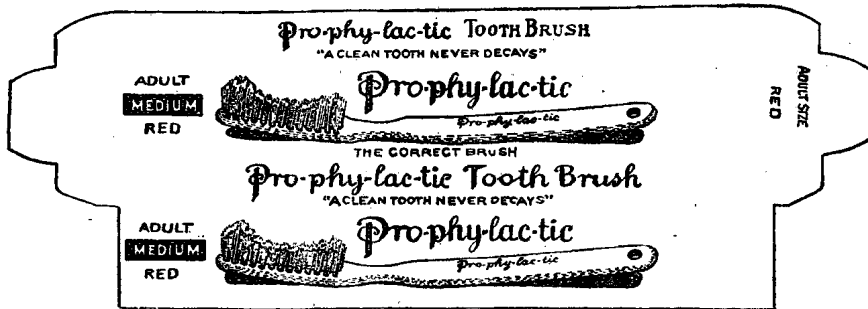

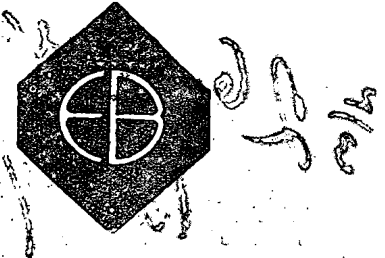

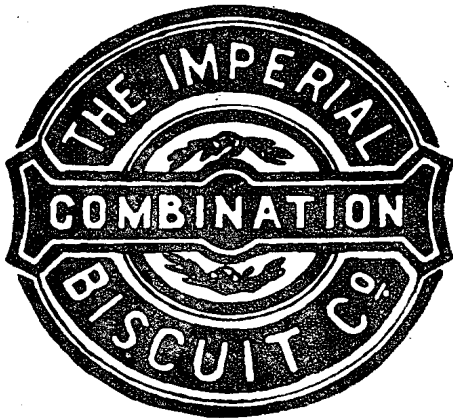
