MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information :—

I. 415. **An Ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 10 of 1902, intituled
“An Ordinance to further amend the Laws relating
to Public Thoroughfares in this Colony”.**

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

Short title. **1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Road Amendment Ordinance, 1929.**

Amendment of section 8 of the principal Ordinance. **2 Section 8 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended as follows :—**

(1) by the renumbering of the section as sub-section (1) thereof, and by the repeal of the words “ which shall be paid by such committee from the moneys received by them in commutation of labour due under the said Ordinance,” in the fifth, sixth, and seventh lines thereof ; and

(2) by the addition of the following sub-section at the end thereof :—

(2) Such salary and remuneration shall be paid out of the funds at the disposal of such committee, and any such salary or remuneration paid out of the said funds prior to the enactment of this sub-section shall be deemed to have been lawfully paid.

Amendment of section 9 of the principal Ordinance. **3 Section 9 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended as follows :—**

(1) by the renumbering of the said section as sub-section (1) thereof, and by the repeal of the following words at the end thereof :—

“ The Provincial Committee shall, subject to such rules, pay such pensions and gratuities from the moneys received by them in commutation of labour due under the said Ordinance ” ; and

(2) by the addition of the following sub-sections at the end thereof :—

(2) It shall be lawful, and shall be deemed always to have been lawful, whether before or after the enactment of this sub-section, by such rules to prescribe that a deduction not exceeding two per cent. per annum shall be made from the salary of every such officer or servant holding a pensionable appointment, as a contribution towards the payment of such pensions and gratuities, and that the sums so deducted shall be credited to the revenue of the committee by whom the salary is payable, and that such pensions and gratuities shall be paid from the said revenue as part of the ordinary expenditure of the committee.

(3) All pensions and gratuities paid in accordance with any such rules, whether before or after the enactment of this sub-section, shall be deemed to have been lawfully paid.

Objects and Reasons.

CERTAIN rules made under section 9 of Ordinance No. 10 of 1902 provide for the deduction of 2 per cent. from the salaries of pensionable Road Committee officers as contribution to the pension fund, and for the crediting of sums so deducted to the revenue of the Road Committee concerned, pensions being paid from the revenue of the Committee as part of its ordinary expenditure.

2. The legality of this deduction has now been questioned, it being suggested that the rules which authorize it are *ultra vires* of the Ordinance under which they are made. The deduction has continued for a period of years, and this Bill is now introduced in order to settle any doubt as to the validity of the deduction, and to provide for its continuance in the future.

3. Clause 3 of the Bill therefore adds two new sub-sections to section 9 of Ordinance No. 10 of 1902, the effect of which will be to validate and authorize the making of such rules as have been already made, and the payment of past and future pensions and gratuities out of the revenue of the Committee. The portion of section 9, which provides for the payment of pensions, &c., from moneys received by the Committee in commutation of labour has been repealed, since no such moneys are now received by them.

4. Clause 2 of the Bill, for the same reason, (a) replaces the provision in section 8 of the principal Ordinance that salaries are to be paid out of moneys received in commutation of labour by a provision that payment is to be made out of the funds at the disposal of the Committee, and (b) validates all past payments of salary made out of those funds.

No. 9 of 1899,
II. 501.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Cemeteries and Burials Amendment Ordinance, 1929.

Short title.

2 Section 40 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the insertion of the following words between the word "authority," and the word "at" in the fifteenth line thereof:—

Amendment of section 40 of the principal Ordinance.

"or, where the proper authority is a Municipality, District Council, or Board, for the Chairman of such proper authority,"

Objects and Reasons.

By section 40 of the Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899, a burial or cremation in a place other than a general cemetery or a burial ground may be permitted only by a "proper authority" within the meaning of section 4 of that Ordinance. When the "proper authority" is a Municipality, District Council, Local Board, Sanitary Board, or Board of Improvement, it is seldom possible to summon the members and secure their permission in time for the burial or cremation. The present amendment meets this difficulty by allowing the Chairman of such a "proper authority" to give the necessary permission.

WHEREAS a Society, styled and known as the Rama-
krishna Mission (Ceylon Branch), has heretofore been
established at Jaffna, Trincomalee, and Batticaloa, for the
purpose of effectually carrying out and transacting all matters
connected with the said Society:

Preamble.

And whereas the said Society has applied to be incorporated
and it will be for the public advantage to grant the application:

Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof,
as follows:—

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Ramakrishna Mission
(Ceylon Branch) Incorporation Ordinance, 1929.

Short title.

2 From and after the passing of this Ordinance, the Presi-
dent, Vice-President, and members of the Board of Management
for the time being of the said Ramakrishna Mission (Ceylon
Branch), as hereinafter constituted, and such and so many
persons as now are or shall hereafter be admitted as members
of the Ramakrishna Mission (Ceylon Branch), shall be a
corporation hereinafter called "the corporation", and shall
have the name of "The Ramakrishna Mission (Ceylon Branch)",

and in that name shall have perpetual succession and shall and may sue and be sued in all courts in Ceylon, and may have and use a common seal and alter the same at their pleasure.

General objects of the corporation.

3 The general objects for which the corporation is constituted are hereby declared to be—

- (a) To impart and promote the study of Hinduism and all its scriptures and the teachings of Ramakrishna Paramahansa ;
- (b) To promote the study of comparative theology in its widest form and assist in bringing about the harmony of all religions ;
- (c) To carry on educational work among the masses in all branches of knowledge ;
- (d) To establish, maintain, and otherwise assist mutts or monasteries, schools, orphanages, and similar educational and charitable institutions ; and
- (e) To undertake and carry on all such works as may appear necessary to attain the aims and objects of the corporation.

Board of Management.

4 (1) The affairs of the corporation shall, subject to any rules made or deemed to be made under this Ordinance, be administered by a Board of Management, consisting of the President, the Vice-President, the Secretary, and the Treasurer, respectively of the corporation, and not more than thirty-six nor less than twelve other members, to be nominated and elected respectively in accordance with the rules in the Schedule to this Ordinance, or any rules amending the same.

- (36) Mr. Kathiramathamby Odayar Velupillai.
- (37) Mr. Kannapper Kandiah.
- (38) His Holiness Swami Yatiswarananda.
- (39) Bramachari Shivadas.
- (40) Bramachari Raman Nambiar.

5 (1) It shall be lawful for the Board of Management at any of its meetings, held after due notice, by a majority of votes of the members present and voting at such meeting, to make rules,— Rules.

- (a) for the admission, withdrawal, or expulsion of members;
- (b) for the conduct of the duties of the Board of Management and of the various local committees, office-bearers, agents, and servants of the corporation;
- (c) for the procedure in the transaction of business;
- (d) for the election or appointment of the officers of the corporation or of the members of the Board of Management and for their tenure of office; and
- (e) otherwise generally for the management of the affairs of the corporation and the accomplishment of its objects.

(2) The rules in the Schedule to this Ordinance shall for all purposes be deemed to be the rules of the corporation in force at the commencement of this Ordinance, and to have been made under this Ordinance, and may be altered, added to, amended, or rescinded by rules to be made under this Ordinance. Schedule.

(3) All rules and resolutions other than those relating to finance or property made by the Board of Management after the commencement of this Ordinance shall be subject to the approval of the President of the Ramakrishna Mission at Belur, near Calcutta, before coming into operation.

(4) All members of the corporation shall be subject to any rules made or deemed to be made under this Ordinance.

6 On the coming into operation of the Ordinance, all and every property belonging to the Ramakrishna Mission (Ceylon Branch) or in the name or names of any person or persons in trust for the Ramakrishna Mission (Ceylon Branch) shall be, and the same are hereby vested in the corporation, and shall be held by the corporation in its corporate name, and the same together with all property hereafter to be acquired by the corporation, both movable and immovable, and all subscriptions, contributions, donations, amounts of loans, and advances received or to be received, shall be held by the corporation for the purpose of this Ordinance, subject to the rules made or deemed to be made under this Ordinance and subject to any trusts under which such property may have been received. Property vested in the corporation.

7 All debts and liabilities of the said Ramakrishna Mission (Ceylon Branch) which were in existence before the coming into operation of this Ordinance, shall be paid by the corporation, and all debts due to and subscriptions and contributions payable to the said Ramakrishna Mission (Ceylon Branch) shall be paid to the corporation for the purposes of this Ordinance. Debts, &c., due by and payable to the corporation.

8 The seal of the corporation shall not be affixed to any instrument whatsoever, except in the presence of three members of the Board of Management, of whom one shall be the President or the Vice-President, who shall sign their names to the instrument in token of their presence, and such signatures shall be independent of the signing of any person as a witness. Seal.

9 The corporation shall be able and capable in law to take and hold any property, which may become vested in it by virtue of any purchase, grant, gift, testamentary disposition, or otherwise, and all such property shall be held by the corporation for the purposes of this Ordinance and subject to any rules made or deemed to be made under this Ordinance with full power to sell, mortgage, lease, exchange, or otherwise dispose of the same. Corporation may hold property movable and immovable.

Application of the funds of the corporation.

10 The income and property of the corporation whencesoever derived shall be applied solely towards the promotion of the objects of the corporation as set forth in this Ordinance, and in no event shall the assets belonging to the corporation be taken outside the limits of the Island of Ceylon or used for any purposes outside the said limits or contrary to the conditions of any trust under which the property is received :

Provided that funds or property donated for local purposes shall be utilized for the purposes for which they are granted and shall not be utilized outside the local limits without the sanction of the local committees.

Decision of disputes, &c., as to principles or policy.

11 Except so far as is provided in this Ordinance or in any rules made or deemed to be made thereunder, any dispute or doubt as to any matter or question affecting or relating to the principles or policy of the Ramakrishna Mission shall be referred to the Governing Body of the Ramakrishna Mission in India, whose decision thereon shall be final.

Saving of rights of the Crown and of certain other rights.

12 Nothing in this Ordinance shall prejudice or affect the rights of His Majesty the King, His Heirs and Successors, or of any body politic or corporate, or of any other persons except such as are mentioned in this Ordinance, and those claiming by, from, or under them.

SCHEDULE. [ss. (1), (2).]

Rules of the Ramakrishna Mission (Ceylon Branch).

Interpretation.

1. In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires—

- (1) "The corporation" mean the Ramakrishna Mission (Ceylon Branch), as incorporated by the Ordinance.
- (2) "The Ordinance" means the Ramakrishna Mission (Ceylon Branch) Incorporation Ordinance, 1929.

Patron.

2. The President of the Ramakrishna Mission at Belur, near Calcutta, shall be *ex officio* Patron of the corporation.

Membership.

3. (1) All followers, whether lay or monastic, of Ramakrishna Paramahansa, above eighteen years of age, are eligible for membership.

(2) The rates of subscription payable by the members shall be as follows :—

- (a) for members of the Board of Management, an annual subscription of Rs. 50, or a contribution of Rs. 1,000 for life membership.
- (b) for ordinary members, an annual subscription of Rs. 5 or a contribution of Rs. 100 for life membership.
- (c) for monastic members, no subscription.

(3) The Board of Management may reject any application for membership without stating reasons.

(4) If any member is in arrears of subscription for a period of six months, the Board of Management may remove his name from the roll of members after a fortnight's notice.

(5) Any member whose conduct is found detrimental to the interest of the corporation may, after investigation, be suspended or removed from the roll, by the Board of Management at a meeting of the same specially convened for the purpose, if two-thirds of the members of the Board present and voting at such meeting approve of such suspension or removal, voting being by ballot. The quorum at such a meeting shall be not less than seven members.

Libraries and classes.

4. All members shall be entitled to use the library of the corporation, and to attend all classes organized for the instruction of the members.

President, Vice-President, &c., and members of the Board of Management.

5. (1) The President and Vice-President of the corporation shall be nominated by the President of the Ramakrishna Mission at Belur, near Calcutta.

(2) Subject to the provisions of paragraph (4) of this rule, the members of the first Board of Management shall hold office for a period of one year only and the members of any Board of Management subsequent to the first, shall hold office for a period of three years.

(3) Every member of the Board of Management may be re-elected on the expiry of his term of office.

(4) At least one month before the expiry of the term of office of any Board of Management, the members of the corporation shall at an annual general meeting elect to the Board of Management a Secretary, a Treasurer, and not more than thirty-six other members. Any such elections shall be subject to the approval of the President of the Ramakrishna Mission at Belur, near Calcutta :

Provided always that, if no Board of Management is duly elected in accordance with the provisions of this paragraph,—

(a) The members of the corporation may elect a Board of Management on any date fixed for the purpose by the President of the corporation ; and

(b) if necessary, the members of the retiring Board of Management shall continue in office until the date of such election ; and

(c) any Board of Management so elected shall hold office for such time only as it would have held office if it had been duly elected in accordance with the provisions of this paragraph.

(5) In the event of any vacancies occurring before the expiry of the term of office of any of the officers or members of the Board of Management or the local committees, the Board of Management may fill such vacancies for the unexpired term.

6. The President, or in his absence the Vice-President, shall be the Chairman at the meetings of the corporation. If neither the President, nor the Vice-President is present, a member authorized by the President or the Vice-President may take the chair. The Chairman shall have a casting vote.

Chairman.

7. The Secretary shall keep a record of all meetings of the corporation and of the Board of Management, a register of members and any other record that may be necessary.

Duties of Secretary.

8. The Treasurer shall receive and keep accounts of all moneys and funds belonging to the corporation and shall make such payments as are authorized by the Board of Management. The Treasurer shall prepare and submit a duly audited statement of accounts at the annual general meeting.

Duties of Treasurer.

9. The Board of Management shall meet once at least in a year. Special meetings may be convened by the President or the Vice-President as often as may seem necessary. At all meetings of the Board of Management, seven members shall form a quorum.

Meetings of the Board of Management.

10. (1) An annual general meeting of the members shall be held once a year.

Annual general meeting.

(2) A fortnight's notice shall be given of any such meeting and twenty members shall constitute a quorum thereat.

11. Local and Departmental Committees may be established under such conditions as shall be determined by the Board of Management. All such committees shall be subject to the general control and supervision of the Board of Management.

Local and Departmental Committees.

12. All bank accounts, securities, notes, and debentures, the property of the corporation, shall be kept in the name of the corporation and shall be under the control of the President, Vice-President, Secretary, or Treasurer in accordance with the resolutions of the Board of Management.

Bank accounts, &c.

II. 70. **An Ordinance to amend further the Chanks Ordinance, 1890.**

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Chanks Amendment Ordinance, 1929.

Amendment of section 9 of the principal Ordinance.

2 Section 9 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended as follows:—

- (1) by the insertion of the words "except in accordance with rules for the regulation, supervision, protection, or control of such operations which may be made by the Governor in Council and published in the Gazette" immediately after the word "hereto" in the third line thereof;
- (2) by the insertion of the words "except in accordance with such rules" immediately after the word "seas" in the sixth line thereof;
- (3) by the addition of the following proviso at the end thereof:—

Provided further that rules made under this section shall not be construed so as to permit any person to fish for, dive for, or collect chanks, bêche-de-mer, coral, or shells within the area specified in Part I. of the First Schedule to the Pearl Fisheries Ordinance, No. 2 of 1925.

- (4) by the renumbering of the section as section 9 (1), and the insertion of the following sub-section at the end thereof:—

(2) All rules made under this Ordinance shall be laid, as soon as conveniently may be, on the table of the Legislative Council at two successive meetings of the Council, and shall be brought before the Council at the next subsequent meeting held thereafter by a motion that the said rules shall not be disapproved, and if upon the introduction of any such motion, or upon any adjournment thereof, the said rules are disapproved by the Council, such rules shall be deemed to be rescinded as from the date of such disapproval, but without prejudice to anything already done thereunder; and such rules, if not so disapproved, shall continue to be of full force and effect. Every such disapproval shall be published in the Gazette.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information :—

An Ordinance to amend the Village Communities Ordinance, No. 9 of 1924.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Village Communities Second Amendment Ordinance, 1929.

Amendment of section 22 (1) of the principal Ordinance.

2 Section 22 (1) of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended as follows :—

- (1) by the substitution of the words " within three months before " for the words " within three months of " in the first and second lines thereof ; and
- (2) by the addition of the following proviso at the end thereof :—

Provided that if, by reason of the inaccessibility of any subdivision, such meeting cannot conveniently be held, within the said period of three months, the Governor may, by notification in the *Government Gazette*, enlarge the said period, in the case of any such subdivision, from three months to six months.

Objects and Reasons.

THIS Bill has been suggested by the difficulties experienced in holding the meeting for the election of the village committee in the Island of Delft within the period now prescribed. Owing to the uncertainties of the weather and the unreliability of the method of transport, it is not possible to fix a day within three months of the expiry of office of the old committee on which the Government Agent will be able to be present in the Island to preside at the election. The amendment will enable the Government Agent to hold the meeting during one of his annual visits in February when weather conditions are most dependable.

2. The opportunity has been taken to remove an ambiguity which exists in the expression " within three months of the date " in section 22 (1) of the principal Ordinance. On a strict interpretation, these words could be taken to mean within three months before or after the date in question, but as it is obvious that the election should precede the expiry of office of an existing committee, the word " before " has been substituted for the word " of " in this expression.
