“ THE QUARANTINE AND PREVENTION OF DISEASES ORDINANCE, 1897.”

M 267/29.

WHEREAS by a declaration dated July 17, 1929, the proper authority, to wit, the Assistant Government Agent, Matara, declared that the area described in the schedule hereto annexed shall be a “diseased locality” within the meaning of “The Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance, 1897,” and the regulations made thereunder:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor in Executive Council, do hereby confirm the said declaration dated July 17, 1929, in accordance with the regulations framed under “The Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance, 1897,” and published in the *Supplement to the Government Gazette* No. 7,481 dated August 28, 1925, and do hereby declare that the area described in the schedule hereto shall until further notice in terms of the said regulations be a “diseased locality” for the purposes and within the meaning of the said Ordinance and the regulations framed thereunder.

SCHEDULE.

The hamlet Badahlegoda in Walgama North of the Four Gravets; bounded as follows:—

- On the north by Wewahamanduwa (Welyaya) paddy fields.
- On the east by Kurunduwatta and Wattegawatta.
- On the south by Baduwatta and Kudaluwala.
- On the west by Kanattegoda.
