Korea, East Coast—Yusan Harbour—Shoal South-westward of Magnetic Head.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 179 of 1895) of the existence of a shoal about three-quarters of a cable in length north and south, and a quarter of a cable broad with a least depth of $3\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms on it, lying with the southern summit (565) of magnetic head bearing N.E. by E. (N. 56° E.), distant $5\frac{1}{2}$ cables; and Channel rock N.W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W. (N. 53° W.).

Approximate position: lat. $35^{\circ} 5' 55''$ N., long. $129^{\circ} 5' 25''$ E.

BENGAL.—No. 65.

China, East Coast—Hwang Hai or Yellow Sea—Elliot Group—Rocks Northward of Kwanglo tau.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 180 of 1895) of a reef, which dries 3 or 4 ft. at low water, lying

about 3 miles W. by N. (N. 79° W.) from the north point of Kwanglo tau, or approximately in lat. $39^{\circ} 13'$ N., long. $122^{\circ} 20\frac{1}{2}'$ E.

Also, two rocks lying north-north-eastward of Kwanglo tau, the outer one, a pinnacle, dries 2 or 3 ft at low water, and is situated approximately in lat. $39^{\circ} 18\frac{1}{2}'$ N., long. $122^{\circ} 26\frac{1}{2}'$ E. The inner rock lies about one mile W.N.W (N. 67° W.) from the outer rock, is flat-topped, and dries 4 or 5 ft. at low water.

Malacca Strait—Sumatra Shore—Alteration in position of Deli River Lightvessel.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 182 of 1895) that the light-vessel (fixed white light), moored off the entrance to Deli river, has been moved three-quarters of a mile N. 80° W., and now lies N. 3° E. from the outer buoy, or approximately in lat. $3^{\circ} 53' 0''$ N., long. $98^{\circ} 44' 10''$ E.

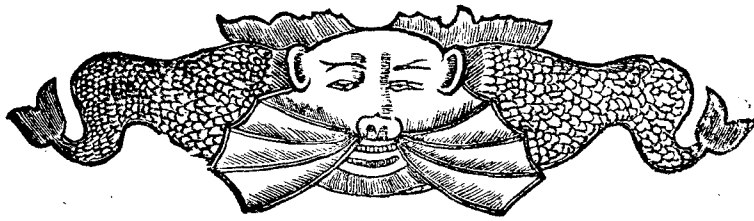
