Northern Province-Jaffna District.

Division as defined by Proclamation dated December 21, 1909.

1a.—Jaffna Town Locality No. 1.

Boundaries: North by the village boundary of Kokkuvil; east by the village boundaries of Nallur, Tirunelveli, and Chundikuli; south by the shore of the lake to a point twenty chains from the junction of the Maravakulam road and the Beach road, from that point by a straight line to the south-east corner of the Reclamation road, westward to the south-west corner of the Reclamation road and from that corner by lake shore; west by lake shore up to the village boundary of Anaikkoddai, by that boundary to the Punnalai road, along that road to the south-west corner of the tract of fields called Paddiveli, and along the western and northern boundaries of those fields.

Division as defined by this Proclamation.

Boundaries: From the Fort (Jaffna) by the shore of the lake westward to the junction of Jaffna-Karaitivu road and road connecting Kayts and Punnalai roads, by the latter road eastwards to its junction with the Jaffna-Punnalai road, by that road to the south-west corner of the tract of fields called Paddiveli, along the western boundary of these fields, along the boundary between the villages of Vannarponnai West and Kokkuvil and of Vannarponnai East and Kokkuvil to Brown road, by that road to its junction with Nachchimarkovil road, by the latter road to the boundary between the villages of Vannarponnai East and Tirunelveli West, along the boundaries separating Vannarponnai Fast from the villages of Tirunelveli West, Nallur, and Karaiyur up to the north-west corner of the Lady of Refuge Church, thence along the western and southern boundaries of that church to the Fourth Cross street, by the Fourth Cross street from the end of that street by a straight line to the south-west corner of the Reclamation road and from that corner by a straight line to the Fort.

1b.—Jaffna Town Locality No. 2.

Boundaries: North by the Nariyankundu road, by that road to the Kantharmadam road, the Point Pedro road, the Arasady road, and the boundary of Valikamam East division to the Chemmany road, by that road westward to the northwest corner of the tract of fields called Madattadivayal; east by the western boundary of Madattadivayal and of Putukkulavayal and of the coconut estate commonly called Price's estate; south by lake shore; west by the village boundaries of Karaiyur and Vannarponnai.

In respect of every dog or bitch kept within the limits of the Urban District Council of Kalutara, the person having custody or possession of it shall pay an annual registration fee of Re. 1 in the case of a dog and Re. 1.50 in the case of a bitch. For the purpose of this rule a year shall be computed from April 1 of one year to March 31 of the year following.
- The occupier of every house within the town shall, before January 31 in each year, furnish to the person appointed by the Chairman of the Urban District Council to collect the registration fee (hereinafter called the Collector) particulars required in the annexed Form A in respect of each dog or bitch kept within such house or its premises.

3. A certificate of registration in the Form B shall be issued on payment of the prescribed fee to the aforesaid

Collector or to the Secretary of the Urban District Council.

- 4. The Collector or Secretary (1) may refuse to issue a certificate of registration for any dog or bitch (a) which, in his opinion, is so diseased as to be a source of infection to other dogs, or (b) which, by reason of age, illness, or injury, is in his opinion unfit to live; or (2) the Collector or Secretary may issue such certificate subject to any conditions he may consider suitable. Any owner dissatisfied with such refusal or conditions may appeal to the Chairman of the Urban District Council, who may confirm, modify, or cancel the same.

  5. Every certificate of registration shall have the following conditions printed on it, viz.:—

This certificate is liable to be cancelled by the Chairman of the Urban District Council, Kalutara-

(a) Should the dog become so maimed or diseased as to be in the opinion of the Chairman unfit to live; or

(b) Should the Chairman be satisfied that the dog is habitually ill-treated or neglected by its owner; or (c) Should the dog be permitted by its owner to associate with dogs belonging to others at a time when it is suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.

6. The person having the custody or possession of a dog or bitch in respect of which (a) a certificate is refused or (b) its certificate is cancelled because a condition attached thereto has not been complied with, shall, on being noticed to do so, produce the dog at the Urban District Council Office, at the time stated in the notice, and there deliver it to an officer of the Urban District Council authorized to take charge of it. Such dogs shall then be dealt with in the manner determined by the Chairman.

(b) By law No. 6 of Chapter XII. dated February 20, 1918, and published in Gazette No. 6,928 of March 8, 1918.

2. All householders shall deposit or cause to be deposited the dust, ashes, sweepings, rubbish, and other refuse from their premises in cylindrical galvanized wrought iron bins which they shall provide and they shall place these bins daily on the edge of the road outside their premises between the hours of 6 A.M. and 6.30 A.M. and remove them or cause them to be removed within the space of half an hour after the same shall have been emptied by the scavengers.

3. The bins shall-

(a) be constructed in such a mainer and be of such weight that the whole receptacle with its contents can be easily lifted and emptied into the scavenging cart,

(b) they shall be provided with covers and convenient handles,

(c) they shall have the owner's name or tenement number painted outside, and

(d) they shall be kept clean by the owners.

4. No person shall place or cause to be placed dust, ashes, sweepings, rubbish, or refuse in or on the edge of any road except in bins as aforesaid, at the times specified.

Provided that the Chairman may authorize a householder to use instead of a bin as aforesaid a wooden box provided with a loose lid approved by him, if he is satisfied that, owing to poverty, the immediate provision of such a bin would press harshly on the householder.

Any person committing a breach of the above regulation shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 10 and in the case of a continuing offence to an additional fine not exceeding Rs. 25 for every day during which the offence is committed after conviction or written notice from the Chairman of such contravention.

#### VITAL STATISTICS.

#### Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended November 2, 1929.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 176 (1 European, 10 Burghers, 101 Sinhalese, 23 Tamils, 29 Moors, 7 Malays, and 5 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1929, viz., 267,667) was 34·3, as against 32·1 in the preceding week, 41·9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 36·1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 151 (1 European, 6 Burghers, 81 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 29 Moors, 4 Malays, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 29.4, as against 31.0 in the previous week, 30.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.3 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 151 total deaths, 25 were of infants under one year of age, as against 26 in the preceding week, 34 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 15.

Principal Causes of Dadh.—1. (a) Twenty-two deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 14 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Kotahena South, and 1 each in Kotahena North, Maradana East, Slave Island, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta South, as against 16 in the previous week, and 23 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Eight deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 in New Bazaar and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Kotahena South, Maradana North, and Kollupitiya, as against 5 in the previous week, and 8 the weekly

average for last year.

- (c) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in Maradana North, Maradana South, and Kollupitiya. The number registered during the preceding week as also the weekly average for last year was 3.
- 2. (a) Thirteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 3 in New Bazaar, 2 in St. Paul's, and 1 each in Kotahena South, Slave Island, and Wellawatta South, as against 4 in the previous week, and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from Phthisis of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama,

during the week.

- 3. Five deaths from Enteric Fever (including 2 deaths of non-residents) were registered in Maradana hospitals, as against 8 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.
- 4. Fifteen deaths from Enteritis were registered, 11 from Debility, 4 from Dysentery, 3 each from Diarrhoea, Infantile Convulsions, and Puerperal Septicaemia, 2 each from Worms and Tetanus, 1 from Accident, and 56 from Other Causes.
- 5. Reported Cases.—Twenty-three cases of Chickenpox and 7 of Enteric Fever were reported during the week, as against 35 and 10 respectively of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was  $78 \cdot 9^{\circ}$ , against  $79 \cdot 5^{\circ}$  in the preceding week, and  $79 \cdot 9^{\circ}$  in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was  $29 \cdot 887$  in., against  $29 \cdot 897$  in. in the preceding week and  $29 \cdot 931$  in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was  $2 \cdot 33$  in., against  $0 \cdot 94$  in. in the preceding week and  $2 \cdot 88$  in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Improvements in or relating to forks or similar hand implements for use in land cultivation.

Abstract.—The crutch is composed of drawn steel tubing and is welded at about the middle of its length to one end of a drawn steel tube, the other end of which is welded to the neck of the operative part of the implement.

The claims are :---

- 1. A fork or similar hand implement of the kind herein referred to for land cultivation whereof the handle is composed of welded drawn steel tubing and constructed or arranged substantially as herein described.
- 2. A fork or similar hand implement according to claim 1 whereof the handle comprises a crutch or cross piece composed of drawn steel tubing and a stem or shank also composed of drawn steel tubing; the latter, by its upper end, being welded to the tube of the crutch or cross piece and, by its lower end, welded to the neck of the operative part of the implement.
- 3. A fork or similar hand implement according to claim 1 in which the handle is partly composed of wood whereof the ends are secured in a welded drawn steel tubular T or crutch part and a drawn steel tubular socket part respectively the latter part being welded to the neck of the fork or operative part of the implement.
- 4. A fork or similar hand implement for use in land cultivation having its parts constructed or arranged substantially as hereinbefore described with reference to the annexed drawings for the purposes specified.

Improvements in or relating to aerials for use in wireless telegraphy and telephony.

Abstract.—An aerial, long in relation to the wave length, is substantially reversed in direction at alternate half wave lengths, the arrangement being such that the radiation from these alternate half wave lengths is added to that of the remaining half wave lengths.

The claims are :-

- 1. An aerial whose electrical length is a plurality of half wave lengths, and which is reversed in direction over part of the half wave length at alternate half wave length sections, whereby radiation from the said alternate half wave length sections, is caused to be additive to that from the other sections in a specifically desired direction, substantially as described.
- 2. An aerial as claimed in claim 1, and in which the amount of reversal is made different in different parts of the aerial so as to obtain a desired distribution law, substantially as described.
- 3. An aerial as claimed in claim 2, and in which the amount of reversal is progressively increased in alternate half wave lengths from end to end of the aerial, whereby a substantially uniform radiation per unit linear length of aerial is obtained, substantially as described.
- 4. An aerial as claimed in any of the preceding claims and in which one or more of the half wave sections is or are formed of a plurality of conductors in parallel substantially as described.
- 5. An aerial as claimed in claim 4 and in which alternate half wave lengths are constituted each by a plurality of conductors in parallel, said half wave lengths being joined in series by partly reversed single conductors each a half wave length long, substantially as described.
- 6. An aerial as claimed in any of claims 1 to 3, and consisting of a single conductor formed into a polygonal cagelike structure, substantially as described.
- 7. An aerial as claimed in any of the preceding claims and comprising an absorptive arrangement for substantially eliminating waves reflected from the end of the aerial, substantially as described.
- 8. Aerial arrangements substantially as herein described and illustrated in figures 2 to 6 of the accompanying drawings.

The claims are :--

- 1. In a feed water heater as claimed in specification No. 2,340 the improvement or modification which resides in that the excess of hot water from the heater is delivered directly into a suction vessel, mounted on the suction conduit of the cold water pump of injector, said suction vessel being open to the atmosphere by means of a vent pipe of suitable height.
- 2. In a feed water heater as claimed in specification No. 2,340 the improvement or modification which resides in that the cylinder which contains the pressure-balanced valve or the like, or the lower part of the tube through which the steam pressure prevailing in the heater is transmitted to the upper face of said valve or the like, is provided with a draining orifice of small section adapted to provide for the continuous draining of the condensate.
- 3. In a feed water heater as claimed in specification No. 2,340 the improvement or modification which resides in that the wall of the cylinder which contains said pressure-balanced valve or the like is formed with an annular recess; open to the atmosphere, for discharging any water which would tend to raise above said valve, during the periods where the heater is not supplied with heating steam.

- 4. In a feed water heater as claimed in specification No. 2,340 the improvement or modification which resides in that the excess of hot water from the heater is delivered directly into one of the suction chambers of the double-acting cold water pump, adapted to feed said heater, the other suction chamber being supplied with cold water from the source of cold water exclusively.
- 5. Feed water heaters as claimed in specification No. 2,340 substantially as described and as shown in the accompanying drawing.
