Rule 79 of the rules made under "The Ceylon Post Office Ordinance, 1908," dated February 26, 1909, and published in Gazette No. 6,297 of the same date, is hereby rescinded and the following is substituted therefor, with effect from November 29, 1929:

(1) Every letter tendered for insurance shall be enclosed in a strong cover or envelope Insurance. which shall be securely fastened by means of seals in fine wax, with spaces between, reproducing a private mark, and affixed in sufficient number to hold down all the folds of the envelope. The use of entirely transparent envelopes or envelopes with black or coloured borders or transparent panels is forbidden. Every letter shall be made up in such a manner that its contents cannot be got at without external and visible damage to the envelope or the seals. As an additional precaution (if the contents admit of it) a thread may be passed through the cover and its contents and tied, the knot being placed under the central seal.

(2) Every parcel tendered for insurance shall be packed carefully and substantially, with due regard to the nature of the contents and the length of the journey, and shall be sealed with wax or lead bearing a private mark and made up in such a manner that its contents cannot be got at without external or visible damage to the cover or seals. If a parcel contains gold or silver bullion or coins, it shall be packed in a strong case of wood or metal with

an outer covering of cloth or stout paper.

(3) The seals of an insured article shall be affixed over each fold, join, or seam of the envelope or covering, and if the article is tied round with string or tape a seal shall be placed on the ends where they are tied. If the string or tape is made up of several pieces each knot or join shall be sealed. All the seals shall be of the same kind of wax, and shall bear distinct impressions of the same private device. The device shall not be that of a current coin or merely a series of straight, curved, or crossed lines.

(4) The stamps used for prepayment of postage and other charges shall not be folded over the edge of the cover, and where more stamps than one are used, they shall be affixed with spaces between them so that they may not serve to conceal injuries to the cover of the letter or parcel. It is prohibited to affix to insured letters labels

other than those belonging to postal service.

(5) No postal article shall be accepted at any Post Office for insurance if it is so small or so covered with writing or sealing wax on the address side, or otherwise made up in such a manner as to render it impracticable to affix to the article the prescribed official labels of the Post Office.

The person in charge of any such cab shall always be in attendance on his cab, and shall, when reasonably called upon by the driver of any other cab, move his cab so as to permit the ingress or egress of such other cab.

(1) No public stand provided by regulation 1 of these regulations shall be used by any person for a hiring car without a written permit from the Chairman of the Local Board, which shall be granted for the day, month, or quarter, as the case may be, upon payment of the fee specified in following scale of charges:—

 - 3. No omnibus shall be stopped or allowed to stand on a highway in an urban area, except---

(1) in the event of a breakdown, and then only for so long as may be necessary to enable

reasonable repairs to be effected; or

(2) on a public stand provided or allotted for that purpose and indicated as such by a notice exhibited by the licensing authority and then only on payment of such fees, and subject to such regulations for the use thereof as may be prescribed or made under the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, and subject to the provisions of regulation 4 of these regulations; or

(3) at a stopping place indicated as such by a notice exhibited by the licensing authority, and then only for so long as is reasonably necessary for the purpose of taking up or setting down passengers or goods, and subject to the provisions of regulation 4 of these regulations; or

(4) in a parking place provided or indicated by regulations or notice under section 53 of the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927.

Stopping places and public stands in urban areas.

- Where in an urban area any notice is exhibited by a licensing authority indicating a stopping place or public stand for omnibuses, which has been provided or allotted for the stopping or standing of omnibuses
 - no passengers or goods may be taken up, or set down from, an omnibus in the urban area, except at such stopping place or public stand;
 - (2) no omnibus shall after stopping at any such stopping place or public stand be driven away therefrom, except
 - (a) for the purpose of continuing along its approved or permitted route; or
 - (b) if such stopping place or public stand is the terminus of such route, for the purpose of returning along such route; or
 - (c) for the purpose of proceeding without passengers to the garage or other place where it is usually kept.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended November 16, 1929.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 192 (European, 14 Burghers, 114 Sinhalese, 21 Tamils, 25 Moors, 10 Malays, and 7 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1929, viz., 267,667) was 37.4, as against 38.2 in the preceding week, 41.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 36.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 169 (1 European, 5 Burghers, 84 Sinhalese, 37 Tamils, 30 Moors, 5 Malays, and 7 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 32.9, as against 36.4 in the previous week, 32.2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.3 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 169 total deaths, 32 were of infants under one year of age, as against 44 in the preceding week, 32 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 21.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 13 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 2 in New Bazaar, and I each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, Kotahena South, Maradana North, and Slave Island, as against 26 in the previous week and 23 the weekly average for last year.

(c) I have visited these latrines and do not agree that they are injurious to the health of the neighbouring residents, and the Medical Officer of Health agrees with me. This will remove any possible objections from the owners of neighbouring houses from which the building could be seen. (d) In view of what has been said in reply to (b) above, I do not think that the question of a prosecution arises.

MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, October 12, 1929, at 9 a.m., pursuant to Notice dated October 7, 1929.

Present: Mr. M. M. Wedderburn, Chairman; the Hon. Mr. H. M. Macan Markar, M.L.C.; Mr. D. W. Subasinghe; the Hon. Mr. C. E. de Vos, M.L.C.; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. D. I. Durham; Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe; Mr. F. W. Sproule; and Mr. S. H. Dahanayake.

- 1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of September 14, 1929, a copy thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed.
- 2. Mr. S. H. Dahanayake presented a petition from C. S. Abdul Cader, relating to the contract for the supply of road metal.
- 3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. S. H. Dahanayake moved—(1) That immediate steps be taken to obtain the services of a qualified doctor for the Health Department of the Municipal Council, preferably one already employed in the Sanitation Department. Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe seconded.

In reply to the Chairman's inquiry, the mover and seconder stated that the intention is to employ a whole-time

officer on the retirement of the present Medical Officer, in June, 1930.

The motion was put to the meeting and carried.

(2) That it is the opinion of this Council that the minimum rate of Rs. 5 levied for electric lights should be abolished and that the consumer be charged only for the current consumed. The Hon. Mr. C. E. de Vos formally seconded, and suggested to the mover that the Electricity Special Committee be asked to consider whether the minimum charge of Rs. 5 per mensem should be abolished, the consumer being charged only for the current consumed.

The mover agreed that the matter be referred to the Special Committee, and withdrew the motion with the

permission of Council.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council:-

- 4.—Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation of October 5, 1929.
- (2) To consider the plague situation.—Resolved to report to Council that the Sanitary Department should be asked to consider the voluntary evacuation of the bazaar into a temporary market, or any other proposal which will enable the Department to deal with rat infection and, at the same time, avoid dislocation of trade which is caused by the present system; the alternative being the acceptance of plague being endemic, and stopping the present measures.

The Chairman made the following statement relating to plague between September 14 and October 11:

Human Plague.—The diagnosis of plague as the cause of the death of Sopy Nona's infant child at the Segregation Camp on September 1, has been confirmed; but in the case of the mother, who died at the Infectious Diseases Hospital on September 5, the diagnosis has not been confirmed.

A suspected case of plague was found on the 7th instant at No. 77, Galle-Matara road. The patient has been

removed to the Infectious Diseases Hospital and there are hopes of his recovery.

The total number of human cases to date is 8, with 7 deaths.

Rat Plague.—Two dead rats found on September 21 and 22 at. No. 146, Fish Market street; one dead rat on September 23 at No. 152, Fish Market Cross street, and one dead rat at No. 32A, Galle-Matara road, on September 29, have been reported as being positive for plague.

Two dead rats found on the 5th instant in a parcel at Watareka have been traced to No. 76, Galle-Matara road. The microscopic examination was positive, but the report from the Bacteriological Institute was that the specimen was

too decomposed.

On the 6th instant an infected rat was found in this boutique. It adjoins No. 77 referred to above.

Infected Area.—The fish market area, excluding the fish market, was declared a diseased locality on September 30 and on October 7, the new area (Pettigalawatta) was declared. Both areas have been evacuated.

The Chairman moved that the Council do approve the recommendation of the Standing Committee, and that the Chairman be authorized to spend up to Rs. 15,000 in erecting temporary boutiques on the smaller esplanade, to be let to shopkeepers whose shops have been closed. Mr. J. E. Perera supported.

- Mr. D. W. Subasinghe moved as an amendment—that in view of the fact that the larger portion of the town has already been cleaned up; that the cases of plague—both human and rat—have been so few and far between; that in view also of the incalculable loss and damage done to the traders and the general public, and the utter disorganization of business; and also in view of the fact that the benefits accruing to the public are not in proportion to the loss caused to the people and the expense involved, the control of plague measures entrusted by this Council to the Sanitary Department be withdrawn as from the end of the current month, or soon thereafter not exceeding a fortnight. Macan Markar seconded.
 - The Hon. Mr. C. E. de Vos, Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe, the Chairman, and Mr. S. H. Dahanayake spoke.

Mr. D. W. Subasinghe rose to a point of order, when Mr. Dahanayake was speaking.

The Chairman ruled out of order any remarks which might apply to any member of the Council.

Mr. D. W. Subasinghe replied.

Mr. D. I. Durham asked that warehouse accommodation be provided for rice imported by the bigger traders. The amendment was put to the meeting and lost by 5 votes to 3.

The motion was then put to the meeting and carried.

- 5.—Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of August 24, 1929.
- (4) To consider an application from the Municipal Inspectors for free treatment in a paying ward of the hospital, in case of illness.—Recommended that in the case of Municipal Inspectors the Council should pay the entrance fee and the cost of treatment, not exceeding Rs. 4 per diem, in a paying ward of the hospital, upon the Chairman being satisfied that the case is one needing hospital treatment.

Resolution of Council of September 14, 1929.

Resolved to defer consideration until the next meeting.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted.

6.—Extracts from the Minutes of the Special Committee on Electric Lighting of August 24, 1929.

(2) To consider—(a) A report of the Electrical Engineers on the damaged Campbell engine generator sets, (b) the

report of the Superintendent, Power Station, and (c) a memorandum by the Chairman.

Resolved that—(1) The Committee is in favour of replacing the engine of one 55 k.w. Campbell set by a 100 h.p. National engine at an estimated cost, including the coupling of the existing water tank, of Rs. 25,000, the dismantled engine being stored and used for spares for the other Campbell engine and, later, of replacing the second Campbell set. (2) The Chairman should, if possible, obtain the opinion of the Director of Electrical Undertakings on the recommendation of the Committee before submitting it to the Council, and inquire whether the Director of Electrical Undertakings is in a position to take over from the Council one or both Campbell sets, and if so, what price he would be proposed to pay for them.

Resolution of Council, September 14. 1929.

Resolved that the matter be deferred until the next meeting.

Resolved that the Council, before deciding whether the Campbell engine should be replaced, should call for tenders for an engine to replace the Campbell engine; and thereafter consult the Director of Electrical Undertakings.

7.—Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of October 5, 1929.

(2) To recommend excess expenditure of Rs. 100 over Rs. 350 for the extension of the District Court Clerks' latrine.-Recommended.

(3) To recommend an estimate of Rs. 65 for making a new body for a hand cart.—Recommended.

(4) To consider an estimate of Rs. 600 for the purchase of materials for the Waterworks Department.— Recommended; with the proviso that inquiry be made whether, and at what rate, the Waterworks Engineer, Colombo,

can supply the articles.

- (5) To consider an application from the Superintendent, Minor Roads, Galle, for a contribution of Rs. 1,000 towards the construction of culverts on the Akmeemana-Kurunduwatta road, which were damaged in the laying of the 12-inch main.—Recommended that the Chairman, District Road Committee, be informed that the Council do not admit that anything is due on this account, but are prepared to contribute a sum of Rs. 25 for the rebuilding of each culvert. Application should be made to the Council when each culvert is being rebuilt.
 - (6) To approve the shape of the dog badge to be adopted in 1930.—Resolved that the triangular badge be adopted.

(7) To consider an application from the District Engineer for water service to the new Supreme Court buildings.—

Recommended that the application be allowed.

- (10) Consideration of tenders for services during 1930:—(i.) Supply of bulls and drivers for scavenging, conservancy, and water carts for three years 1930 to 1932.—Recommended that L. O. E. de Silva's tender be accepted, viz., Rs. 63 per mensem per pair of bulls and a driver, and Rs. 45 per mensem per single bull and a driver for scavenging carts; Rs. 70 per mensem per pair of bulls and a driver for night soil carts; Rs. 2.50 per diem per pair of bulls and a driver for water
- (ii.) Supply of road metal for three years 1930 to 1932.—Recommended that E. D. P. de Silva's tender of Rs. 10 per cube be accepted.

(iii.) Supply of gravel for three years 1930 to 1932.—Recommended that E. D. P. de Silva's tender of Rs. 7.50

per cube be accepted.

(iv.) Purchase of house and street rubbish for three years 1930 to 1932.—Recommended that as the offers received are too low for a period of three years, the present contractor be offered it at Rs. 250 per annum for three years, or at Rs. 200 for one year only. If the offer is not accepted tenders to be invited again.

(v.) Supply of coir dust for one year, 1930.—Recommended that E. D. P. de Silva's tender of Rs. 18 per 100 bags

be accepted.

(vi.) Supply of water grass for one year, 1930.—Recommended that W. L. K. Handy's tender of 18 cents per bundle of 20 lb. and 7 cents per bundle of 8 lb. be accepted.

(vii.) Limewashing, Municipal buildings for one year, 1930.—Recommended that C. L. M. Mahamoodu's tender of Rs. 87 per quarter be accepted.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

- 8.—Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of October 5, 1929.
- (2) Consideration of tenders for services during 1930 .-- Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of October 5, 1929, be adopted.

(3) To consider applications from the Municipal Sanitary Staff for subsistence allowance whilst engaged in dealing with the outbreak of plague.—Recommended that all Municipal officers and coolies who were engaged in the plague area should be paid one-third subsistence as a "risk" allowance.

(4) To consider the travelling allowance to be paid to Dr. W. G. Wickramasinghe, Medical Officer of Health, whilst on plague duty.—Recommended that a travelling allowance of Rs. 250 per mensem be paid from August.

(5) To consider the appointment of a typist for the Secretary's office.—Recommended that a typist be appointed on a salary of Rs. 480 to Rs. 960 by annual increments of Rs. 48, and thereafter by annual increments of Rs. 60 to Rs. 1,200.

(6) To declare certain permanent posts in the Municipal service to be pensionable.—Recommended that the following be declared pensionable posts, viz., (a) Superintendent, Electricity Department; (b) Clerk, Electricity Department; and Clerk, Municipal Court.

(7) To consider applications for gratuity from (a) the widow of P. K. Babun, scavenging cooly; (b) the widow of G. L. James, market cooly; and (c) M. Baron, conservancy cooly.—Recommended that a gratuity of Rs. 78 be granted to the widow and the minor child of P. K. Babun; Rs. 78 to the widow and the minor child of G. L. James; and Rs. 177.79 calculated on his service of 251 months to M. Baron.

(8) To sanction the payment of the first increment to the Inspector of Works on September 1, 1928, one year from

the date of his appointment.—Recommended that the payment of the first increment on September 1, 1928, be sanctioned.
