BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

By-laws regarding the Tax on Vehicles and Animals.

1. In these by-laws—

"Chairman" means the Chairman of the Negombo Urban District Council.
"Ordinance" means the Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920.

2. The returns required to be furnished under section 179 of the Ordinance by an owner or other person whether resident within the urban area or outside and supposed to be liable to pay taxes in respect of animals or vehicles shall be made in a schedule which shall be supplied by the Council and shall be filled up and returned by the person to whom such schedule is addressed.

3. If any person, after having filled up and returned such schedule, shall acquire, keep, or use any vehicle or animal, not mentioned in such schedule, he shall, within one month of acquiring any such vehicle or animal, notify the Chairman in writing of the fact of such acquisition, and further furnish true and correct information in respect of every such vehicle or animal so acquired, kept, or used. Whoever fails or neglects to notify the Chairman or to furnish such information as aforesaid shall be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty-five rupees.

4. Subject to the provisions of section 175 of the Ordinance any person who has furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 2 shall without further notice be liable, in respect of vehicles or animals entered in such schedule, to pay the tax for the year for which such schedule is furnished and any person who has sent the written notice required by by-law 3 shall be liable to pay the tax on vehicles or animals referred to in such notice for the year in which such vehicles or animals were acquired by him or otherwise came into his possession.

5. Any person who, having furnished the schedule required by by-law 2 or the written notice required by by-law 3, claims to be exempt from the liability to pay any tax in respect of a vehicle or an animal which has been in his possession for less than 30 days in any year and is entered in or referred to in such schedule or notice shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Chairman of his claim for such exemption specifying the grounds on which such claim is made.

6. The annual tax prescribed under the provisions of section 175 of the Ordinance shall be paid on or before February 28 in every year in respect of all vehicles kept or used within the limits of the Negombo Urban District Council, and in respect of the animals if any employed in drawing them whether such vehicles have or have not been licensed under the provisions of the Vehicles Ordinance, No. 4 of 1916.

7. On payment of the annual tax the Chairman shall issue or cause to be issued in respect of every vehicle for which such tax is paid a metal plate as specified in the schedule hereto with figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the registers of vehicles. Such plates shall be fixed on a conspicuous part of the vehicle in respect of which the plate was issued.

8. Where the plate prescribed by these by-laws has not been duly affixed to any vehicle kept or used within the limits of the Negombo Urban District Council the owner or person in charge of any such vehicle in respect of which the prescribed plate should have been so affixed shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding fifteen rupees.

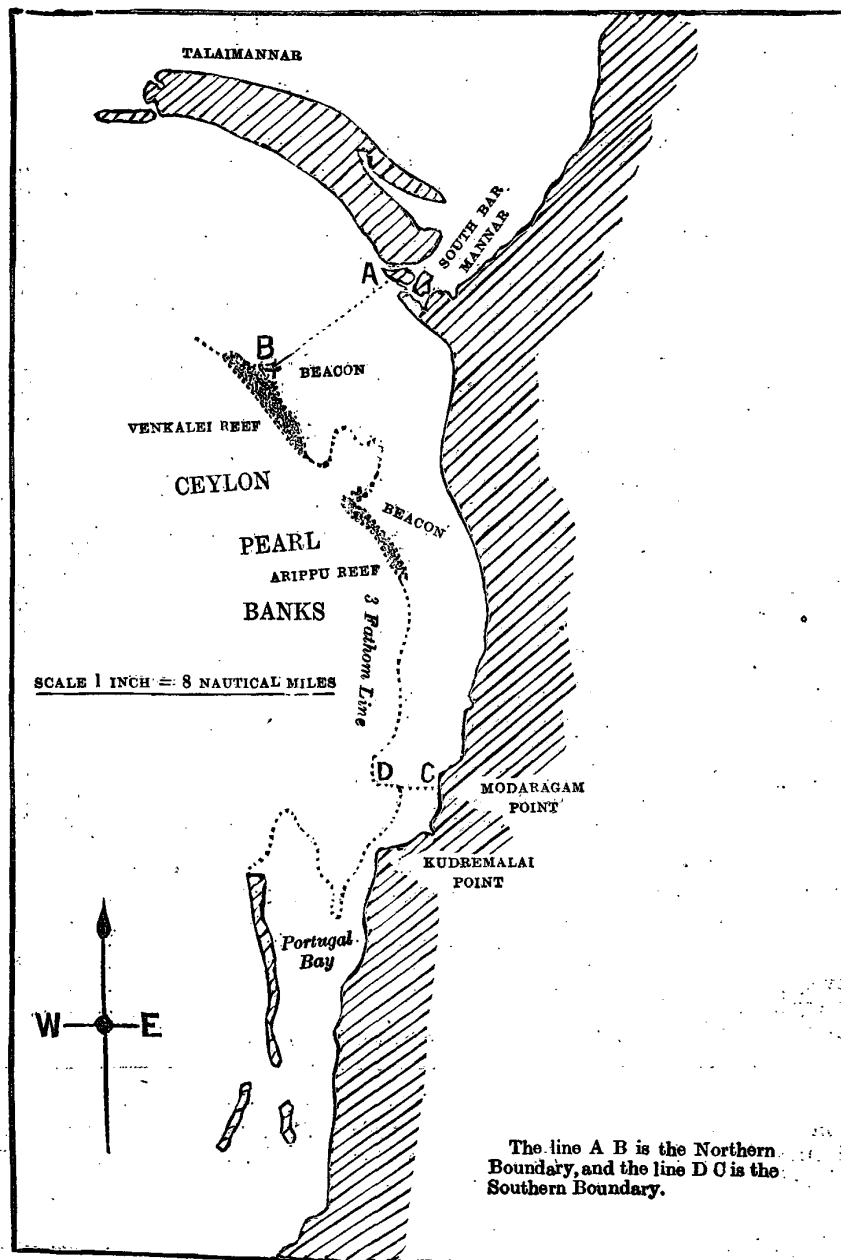

REGULATIONS.

Highways declared suitable for Use by Lorries or particular Types of Lorries subject to stated Conditions or Restrictions.

1. These regulations shall come into operation on December 6, 1929.

2. The highways specified in Schedule A are hereby declared to be suitable for use by lorries other than trailers subject to the conditions or restrictions contained in the said schedule and hereby imposed in respect of the use of any particular highway or part thereof, and provided that—

- (a) The maximum weight of the lorry when fully loaded and equipped shall not exceed six tons in the case of four-wheeled lorries and seven tons in the case of six-wheeled lorries; and
- (b) The maximum axle load shall not exceed four tons in the case of four-wheeled lorries and three tons in the case of six-wheeled lorries.

REGULATIONS.

Highways declared to be suitable for Use by Motor Cars other than Lorries subject to stated Conditions or Restrictions; and Highways of which Omnibuses are prohibited.

1. These regulations shall come into operation on December 6, 1929.
2. Nothing in these regulations shall be construed so as to apply to lorries or the use of highways thereby.

3. The highways outside Colombo specified in Schedule A are hereby declared to be suitable for use by all motor cars other than lorries and trailers, subject to the conditions or restrictions contained in the said schedule and hereby imposed in respect of the use of any particular highway or part thereof, and provided that—

- (a) The maximum weight of the motor car when fully loaded and equipped shall not exceed six tons in the case of four-wheeled motor cars and seven tons in the case of six-wheeled motor cars; and
- (b) The maximum axle load shall not exceed four tons in the case of four-wheeled motor cars and three tons in the case of six-wheeled motor cars.

BY-LAWS.

1. By-laws 37, 38, and 39 of the by-laws of the Kandy Municipal Council dated December 18, 1906 (published in *Gazette* No. 6,165 of January 11, 1907), are revoked and the following are substituted therefor:—

By-laws regarding the Tax on Vehicles and Animals.

37. The return required to be furnished under section 134 of the Ordinance by an owner or other person supposed to be liable to pay taxes in respect of animals or vehicles shall be made in a schedule which shall be supplied by the Council and shall be filled up and returned by the person to whom such schedule is addressed.

38. If any person, after having filled up and returned such schedule, shall acquire, keep, or use any vehicle or animal not mentioned in such schedule, he shall, within one month of acquiring any such vehicle or animal, notify the Chairman in writing of the fact of such acquisition and further furnish true and correct information in respect of every such vehicle or animals so acquired, kept, or used.

Whoever fails or neglects to notify the Chairman or to furnish such information as aforesaid shall be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty rupees.

39. Subject to the provisions of section 132 of the Ordinance, any person who has furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 2 shall without further notice be liable, in respect of vehicles or animals entered in such schedule, to pay the tax for the year succeeding that in which such schedule is furnished; and any person who has sent the written notice required by by-law 3 shall be liable to pay the tax on vehicles or animals referred to in such notice for the year in which such vehicles or animals were acquired by him or otherwise came into his possession.

(a) Any person who, having furnished the schedule required by by-law 2 or the written notice required by by-law 3, claims to be exempt from the liability to pay any tax in respect of a vehicle or an animal which has been in his possession for less than 30 days in any year and is entered in or referred to in such schedule or notice, shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Chairman of his claim for such exemption specifying the grounds on which such claim is made.

(b) The annual tax prescribed under the provisions of section 132 of the Ordinance shall be paid on or before the Thirty-first day of March in every year in respect of all vehicles kept or used within the limits of the Municipality of Kandy and in respect of the animals, if any, employed in drawing them, whether such vehicles have or have not been licensed under the provisions of the Vehicles Ordinance, No. 4 of 1916.

(c) On payment of the annual tax the Chairman shall issue or cause to be issued in respect of every vehicle for which such tax is paid a metal plate with figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the registers of vehicles. Such plate shall be fixed on a conspicuous part of the vehicle in respect of which the plate was issued. The colour and shape of the plates shall be determined by the Chairman.

Provided, however, that the owner or person in charge of any vehicle in respect of which a licence has been issued by the Chairman under the provisions of the Vehicles Ordinance, No. 4 of 1916, shall not be required to affix a plate as required by this by-law.

(d) Should any vehicle licensed under the provisions of the Vehicles Ordinance, No. 4 of 1916, by a "proper authority" other than the Chairman be kept or used within the limits of the Municipality of Kandy, the owner of such vehicle shall, subject to the provisions of section 132 of the Ordinance, be liable to pay the tax prescribed in Schedule D of the Ordinance, in respect of such vehicle and in respect of the animal, if any, employed in drawing it and shall further affix to such vehicle the plate prescribed by these by-laws.

(e) Where the plate prescribed by these by-laws has not been duly affixed to any vehicle kept or used within the limits of the Municipality of Kandy, the owner or person in charge of any such vehicle in respect of which the prescribed plate should have been so affixed shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding ten rupees.

(f) Any Municipal Inspector or Police Officer may detain any vehicle kept or used within the Municipality to which the prescribed plate is not duly affixed in accordance with these by-laws, and in such case shall forthwith bring the owner or person in charge of such vehicle before the Municipal Magistrate.

2. By-laws 41 and 42 of the by-laws of the Kandy Municipal Council dated December 18, 1906 (published in *Gazette* No. 6,165 of January 11, 1907), are revoked.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 160 (1 European, 12 Burghers, 90 Sinhalese, 28 Tamils, 23 Moors, 2 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1929, viz., 267,667) was 31·2, as against 35·8 in the preceding week, 44·4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 36·1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 159 (1 European, 5 Burghers, 86 Sinhalese, 35 Tamils, 24 Moors, 5 Malays, and 3 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 31·0, as against 20·2 in the previous week, 32·4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30·3 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 159 total deaths, 26 were of infants under one year of age, as against 33 in the preceding week, 36 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 18.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Sixteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Maradana East, 2 each in Maradana North and Slave Island, and 1 each in Pettah, Kotahena North, and Kollupitiya, as against 21 in the previous week, and 23 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Ten deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 4 in New Bazaar, 3 in San Sebastian, 2 in Kotahena South, and 1 in Maradana hospital, as against 8 in the previous week, and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Four deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 each in New Bazaar and Kollupitiya, as against 5 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Ten deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), 2 in Kotahena South, and 1 each in Kotahena North, New Bazaar, and Kollupitiya, as against 12 in the previous week, and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Three deaths from *Phthisis* of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Six deaths from *Enteric fever* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), and 1 in Slave Island, as against 3 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. Fifteen deaths from *Debility* were registered, 13 from *Enteritis*, 5 each from *Dysentery* and *Infantile Convulsions*, 4 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Worms*, 1 each from *Tetanus*, *Puerperal Septicaemia*, and *Accident*, and 64 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Thirty-three cases of *Chickenpox* (including 1 in Port), 11 of *Enteric fever*, and 1 of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 21·5, and 1, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79·4°, against 79·2° in the preceding week, and 79·6° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·914 in., against 29·894 in., in the preceding week, and 29·908 in., in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 3·02 in., against 4·00 in., in the preceding week, and 5·94 in., in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Process for the production of non-inflammable materials.

Abstract.—Ammonium bromide is used and to this may be added substances which on heating evolve non-combustible gases.

The claims are:—

1. A process of fireproofing materials such as wood, fabrics, paper and the like which consists in treating these substances which are inflammable *per se*, with ammonium bromide in aqueous or alcoholic solution, and preferably in admixture with other chemical products, and particularly with salts which decompose at elevated temperature and are converted into gaseous and volatile products or in incorporating the aforesaid salts in the substances in any suitable manner and/or condition for example, incorporating the salts in a powdered form.
2. The process of fireproofing combustible materials substantially as described.
3. Wood, fabrics, paper and the like whenever rendered fireproof by the process claimed in claims 1 and 2.
4. A non-combustible material having a base of a material such as wood, fabric, paper, and the like which is combustible *per se*, which has been impregnated or otherwise associated with ammonium bromide, either alone or in admixture with other chemical products, more particularly salts adapted to decompose at elevated temperatures and to liberate gaseous decomposition products.
5. A non-combustible material as set forth in claim 4, which has been impregnated or otherwise associated with ammonium bromide either alone or in admixture with other chemical products as set forth, employed in the form of an aqueous or alcoholic solution.

Improvements in or relating to Screws, Bolts and Nuts.

Abstract.—The inclined face serving as a bearing face during wedging is formed of two parts of unequal lengths in such a manner as to constitute one or more than one bearing face, the two parts of the thread being disposed at different distances from the member carrying the screw thread, one at least of the two parts being inclined relatively to the axis of the member provided with the screw thread.

The claims are :—

1. A screw thread particularly applicable to bolts, nuts, rods, &c., in which the two opposed faces of the same screw thread have different inclinations to the axis, the face serving as a bearing face during wedging making with the axis an angle less than that made by the other face of the same thread characterized in that the face serving as a bearing face during wedging is formed of two parts of unequal lengths disposed at different distances from the axis of the screw threaded member.

2. A screw thread according to claim 1, characterized in that the two parts disposed different diameters from the axis of the screw threaded member have different inclinations, one of which parts can be parallel to the said axis.

3. A screw thread according to claim 1 or 2, wherein the angle of inclination of the inclined part of the bearing face or bearing faces of the threads is such that its tangent is less than the co-efficient of friction between the metals in contact so as to obtain wedging of a nut on the screw thread.

4. A modified form of the screw thread set forth in claim 1, in which the supplementary bearing faces inter-connecting the two parts disposed at different distances from the axis of the screw threaded member are either inclined or perpendicular to the axis or curved.

5. A screw thread according to claim 1, in which the face of each thread which does not act as a bearing face during wedging is inclined, curved, concave, convex or perpendicular to the axis.

6. A screw thread according to claim 1, wherein one of the parts of unequal length is truncated, the said part being itself divided into two parts having different inclinations.

7. A screw thread for nuts, bolts, and the like, substantially as hereinbefore described in connection with the accompanying drawing.

Improved means for connecting Tubes and the like.

Abstract.—The ends of the tubes to be coupled are given the form of an Archimedean spiral so that they fit into one another but jam when one is turned with respect to the other. To get a water-tight joint a coupling piece is used and a washer placed between the ends of the two tubes to be joined.

The claims are :—

1. A method for the coupling of tubes, rods or other similar pieces end to end or at an angle, wherein the ends of the tubes, rods, or other similar pieces have a cross section in the form of an Archimedes' spiral and are fitted into one another, or into a sleeve or union whose internal section has the form of an Archimedian spiral, the connection being obtained by the angular displacement of one of the pieces relatively to the other, or of the sleeve relatively to the piece.

2. A coupling method as claimed in claim 1, characterized in that fluid-tight conditions are obtained by means of a washer whose periphery has the same form as the tubes.

3. Tubes, rods or other similar pieces having an end or their ends formed substantially as hereinbefore described in connection with the accompanying drawings.
