## VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON FOR THE MONTH OF AUGUST, 1929.

### REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.

This report deals with the vital statistics of the 35 principal towns in the Island, proclaimed under sections 31–36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

#### Marriages.

2. The number of marriages of residents in proclaimed towns was 351 (309 General, 6 Kandyan, and 36 Muslim), as against 477 in the preceding month and 485 in the corresponding month of last year.

#### Births.

3. The births registered numbered 1,791 (951 males and 840 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 32·31 per 1,000 of the population, as against 33·91 in the preceding month, 35·33 in the corresponding month of last year, and 29·40 the average for the corresponding months since 1919. The rate ranged from 8·39 in Ambalangoda to 70·21 in Batticaloa. There were 1,585 births of children whose mothers were residents of the towns, equivalent to an annual rate of 28·59, as against 29·64 in the preceding month, and 30·40 in the corresponding month of last year.

4. In the city of Colombo the births registered numbered 694 (372 males and 322 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 30·53, as against 31·36 in the preceding month, 33·99 in the corresponding month of last year, and 25·75 the average for the corresponding months since 1919. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 12·21 in Kollupitiya to 28·89 in Slave Island. There were 582 births of children whose mothers were residents of the city, equivalent to an annual rate of 25·60, as against 27·40 in the preceding month and 28·72 in the corresponding month of last year.

#### Deaths.

5. The total deaths registered during the month numbered 1,864 (971 males and 893 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 33·63, as against 35·74 in the preceding month and 35·05 in the corresponding month of last year. There were 1,416 deaths of residents of the towns, equivalent to an annual standardized rate of 27·63, as against 28·95 in the preceding month, 27·54 in the corresponding month of last year, and 27·79 the average for the corresponding months since 1919. The standardized death rate ranged from 60·81 in Batticaloa to 7·13 in Mullaittivu.

6. In the city of Colombo the deaths registered numbered 719 (379 males and 340 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 31·63, as against 32·82 in the preceding month and 29·12 in the corresponding month of last year. There were 587 deaths of residents of the city, which corresponded to an annual standardized rate of 29·73, as against 29·78 in the preceding month, 25·47 in the corresponding month of last year, and 28·02 the average for the corresponding months since 1919. The death rate of residents, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 7·69 in Kollupitiya to 28·74 in Kotahena North.

7. The stillbirths registered during the month numbered 140 (77 males and 63 females), as against 113 in the preceding month and 165 in the corresponding month of last year.

#### Infant Mortality.

8. The deaths of children under one year of age amounted to 385, and corresponded to a rate of 195 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended August, 1929. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only, the rate was 215, as against 216 in the preceding month, 204 in the corresponding month of last year, and 236 the average for the corresponding months since 1919. There were 354 deaths of children under one year of age whose mothers were residents of the towns, which corresponded to a rate of 223 as against 226 in the preceding month, and 209 in the corresponding month of last year.

9. In the city of Colombo the deaths of children under one year of age amounted to 171, and corresponded to a rate of 220 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended August, 1929. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only, the rate was 246, as against 244 in the preceding month, 181 in the corresponding month of last year, and 253 the average for the corresponding months since 1919. There were 159 deaths of children under one year of age whose mothers were residents of the city, which corresponded to a rate of 273, as against 247 in the preceding month and 183 in the corresponding month of last year.

#### Causes of Death.

10. The highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, to which 18 per cent. of the total deaths were due. *Enteritis* caused 7 per cent.; *Debility* (of children under one year of age) and *Senility*, each 6 per cent.; *Phthisis*, 5 per cent.; *Convulsions*, *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia*, *Dysentery*, and *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, each 4 per cent.; *Anchylostomiasis*, *Diarrhoea*, and *Diseases and Accidents of Childbirth*, each 3 per cent.; *Enteric Fever*, *Accidents and Negligence*, *Diseases due to Intestinal Parasites other than Anchylostomiasis*, *Influenza*, *Prematurity*, *Heart Disease*, and *Bronchitis*, each 2 per cent.; *Paralysis*, *Diabetes Mellitus*, *Tetanus*, *Anaemia*, and *Cancer*, each 1 per cent.

11. In Colombo, too, the highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, to which 14 per cent. of the total deaths were due; *Enteritis* caused 12 per cent.; *Senility*, 8 per cent.; *Phthisis*, 7 per cent.; *Debility* (of children under one year of age), and *Influenza*, each 6 per cent.; *Diarrhoea*, *Heart Disease*, *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, and *Convulsions*, each 3 per cent.; *Enteric Fever*, *Paralysis*, *Accidents of Childbirth*, *Dysentery*, *Diseases due to Intestinal Parasites other than Anchylostomiasis*, and *Malaria and Malarial Cachexia*, each 2 per cent.; *Accidents and Negligence*, *Diabetes Mellitus*, *Bronchitis*, *Other Diseases of the Respiratory System*, *Tetanus*, *Cancer*, and *Anaemia*, each 1 per cent.

12. One death from *Plague* was registered (in Colombo), as against two deaths in the previous month and one death in the corresponding month of last year.

13. *Infectious Diseases reported*.—The infectious disease most prevalent during the month was *Phthisis*, of which 119 cases were reported (100 in Colombo, 4 in Galle); *Chickenpox* followed with 111 cases (95 in Colombo, 5 in Matale); *Dysentery* 83 (56 in Colombo, 6 each in Moratuwa, Panadure, and Vavuniya); *Enteric Fever* 78 (49 in Colombo, 3 each in Panadure, Matara, and Kegalla); *Measles* 47 (41 in Colombo); *Continued Fever* 25 (20 in Colombo); *Mumps* 21 (6 in Colombo); *Diphtheria* 4 (in Colombo); *Whooping Cough* 4 (3 in Colombo); *Plague* 3 (2 in Kandy and 1 in Galle); *Diarrhoea* 2 (1 each in Moratuwa and Galle).

#### Meteorology.

14. *Rainfall*.—*Nawalapitiya* recorded the highest rainfall (9.46 in.). In other towns the rainfall ranged from 7.17 in. in *Trincomalee* to 0.02 in. in *Puttalam*. *Colombo* recorded 0.31 in.

15. *Mean Temperature*.—The mean temperature varied from 83.6° in *Anuradhapura* to 59.7° in *Nuwara Eliya*, and was 80.9° in *Colombo*.
