“THE QUARANTINE AND PREVENTION OF DISEASES ORDINANCE, 1897.”

M 267/29.

WHEREAS by a declaration dated October 7, 1929, the proper authority, to wit, the Chairman, Municipal Council, Galle, declared that the area described in the schedule hereto annexed shall be a “diseased locality” within the meaning of “The Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance, 1897,” and the regulations made thereunder :

Now know Ye that We, the Governor in Executive Council, do hereby confirm the said declaration dated October 7, 1929, in accordance with the regulations made under “The Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance, 1897,” and published in the *Supplement to the Government Gazette* No. 7,481 dated August 28, 1925, and do hereby declare that the area described in the schedule hereto shall, until further notice in terms of the said regulations, be a “diseased locality” for the purposes and within the meaning of the said Ordinance and the regulations made thereunder.

The portion of the Municipal town of Galle, situated within the following boundaries :—

North.—Galle-Matara road.

East.—Sea street-Cross road.

South.—Seashore.

West.—Drain running between premises Nos. 38 and 38A, Galle-Matara road.
