AMENDMENTS REFERRED TO.

Clause 18 (vi.).—Insert the word "over" before "60" and "55" in lines 1 and 2.

Clause 19.—Add as fresh paragraph :—

The Manager shall keep an inventory of all furniture and equipment in each school and shall record in such inventory the date on which each additional item is supplied. The inventory shall be kept up to date and submitted at the annual inspection.

Clause 23 (f).—After the word "attendance" insert "of eligible pupils".

Clause 25.—Add a note as follows :—

As from 1931 the Training Schools Entrance Examination will be discontinued. Students will be selected for admission to the First Year class, after interview, by the authorities of the Training Schools, from among those who hold a teacher's certificate (provisional, preliminary, or confirmed). Students must be over 17 years of age at the time of admission to the Training School.

Clause 32 (x).—In line 1 substitute the word "provide" for "hand to" and in line 2 insert the word "with" after "inspection".

Clause 36 (a) and (b).—Alter the amendments published in *Gazette* No. 7,742 of October 25, 1929, to read as follows :—

(a) Primary classes which have an average attendance of less than 60 eligible pupils for the past school year will be allowed to count one teacher for every 18 units of average attendance.

Where the average attendance in primary classes is 60 or over, the allowance will be—

- (i.) for the first 80 units of average attendance, one teacher for every 20 units of average attendance ;
- (ii.) for units of average attendance over 80, one teacher for every 30 units of average attendance.

(b) In post-primary classes (*i.e.*, above Standard V.) the allowance will be one teacher for every 15 units of average attendance. Where the average attendance is not sufficient for the allowance of a teacher, it shall be added to the average in primary classes.

Clause 45.—Delete the third sentence "New appointments . . . same management" and substitute the following :—The date of a teacher's increment is the date of his first appointment, except in the case of a teacher who is promoted to a new grade, when the date of his increment will be the date of his promotion to such grade. A teacher leaving one school for another must take with him (however short his service) the manager's recommendation for increment. No teacher, however, will be granted an increment unless a recommendation covers a period of at least six months' work in one school.

Clause 52 (e).—Add : "and who are not attending a special course approved by the Director".

Clause 60.—Add a note as follows :—As from 1931 clause 60 will be deleted.

Clause 67 (d).—Alter "three" to "five".

Clause 67 (e).—Alter to read : No grant will be paid for a pupil who has not attained the age of 10 or who is over 18 years of age.

1. The scheme provides for the inclusion in Karachchi Scheme specification of such of the fields in the above tracts as the Director of Irrigation may find upon further investigation can conveniently be irrigated under the Karachchi Scheme, and for the construction by Government of such channels and other irrigation works as may be necessary to facilitate the irrigation of such fields by conveying water to the tracts.

1. No person in a state of intoxication shall enter or remain within the Customs premises.
2. No person shall loiter, expectorate, behave in a disorderly manner, fight, indecently expose his person, or commit any nuisance within the Customs premises.
3. No person shall molest passengers within the Customs premises, nor without the permission of the Principal Collector of Customs sell or expose for sale any article or thing therein.

REGULATIONS made by the Sanitary Board of the Kalutara District, under sections 18 and 23 of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," in respect of the general cemetery known as the Wadduwa General Cemetery, situated in the village Maha Wadduwa East in Waddu badda of the Panadure totamune, Kalutara District, Western Province.

REGULATIONS.

1. All applications for graves shall be made to the keeper of the cemetery (hereinafter referred to as the keeper) at least six hours before the time fixed for the burial of the body for which the grave is required.
2. The keeper may prescribe the line to be followed by a funeral party within the cemetery, and if more than one funeral party arrive at the same time, the order in which they are respectively to move to the graves; and funeral parties shall obey the directions of the keeper.
3. To prevent the disturbance of one funeral party by another, and not otherwise, the keeper may direct that one burial service should be concluded before the other commences.
4. The keeper shall be entitled to keep order within the cemetery, and his orders shall be obeyed.
5. No grave shall be less than four feet in depth, or at a distance of less than four feet from any other.
6. No dead body shall be buried in the cemetery without the permission of the keeper; such permission shall not be granted till all fees have been paid.
7. The following fees shall be paid to the keeper in advance:—

Provided (a) that paupers and coolies dying on estates shall be buried free of charge under the directions of the keeper and (b) that if a Minister of any Christian denomination, or a Mudaliyar or Muhandiram of the District, or a Justice of the Peace, or an Inquirer under the Criminal Procedure Code certifies in writing that the relatives and friends of any deceased person are, owing to poverty, unable

to pay the fees herein prescribed for the digging of a grave, the keeper shall free of charge cause a grave to be dug and the corpse to be buried therein.

8. Those concerned may choose the person to perform the burial service, and the fee agreed upon shall be paid to him.
