REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations—
 - "Board" means the Sanitary Board of Kurunegala District.
 - "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Board.
 - "Public Stand" means any space within the administrative limits of the Sanitary Board towns of Polgahawela or Kuliyaipitiya which is defined and reserved for the parking of motor cars or hiring cars by a notice signed by the Chairman and exhibited at the spot.
2. No vehicle other than a motor car shall be parked in or enter a Public Stand.
3. When a Public Stand or any portion of a Public Stand is reserved for the use of motor cabs or omnibuses or hiring cars, no motor car not belonging to the class for which the stand is reserved shall be parked in it or enter it.
4. All motor cars in a Public Stand shall be parked—
 - (a) in accordance with the orders of either the Police Officer on duty at the spot or the person authorized for this purpose by the Chairman; and
 - (b) so as to cause no obstruction to other motor cars entering or leaving the Public Stand.
5. The driver of the motor car or a person capable of driving it shall be in charge while the motor car occupies a Public Stand.
6. No hiring car shall be parked in any public place except a Public Stand; and no hiring car shall enter or remain in a Public Stand—
 - (a) unless its driver is in possession of a valid permit in respect of it issued under rule 7; and
 - (b) unless he produces such permit when required to do so by a Police Officer or a person authorized for the purpose by the Chairman.
7. The Chairman may issue permits authorizing hiring cars to use a Public Stand and charge fees for the permits in accordance with the scale specified in the schedule hereto.

DRAFT SCHEME.

Scheme under Chapter VI. of the Irrigation Ordinance to be laid before Meetings of Proprietors of the following Tracts of Fields, viz.: Murasmoddai, Velikkandal, Pulinkatevanmurippu, Periyaparanthan, and Kunchuparanthan.

1. The scheme provides for the inclusion in Karachchi Scheme specification of such of the fields in the above tracts as the Director of Irrigation may find upon further investigation can conveniently be irrigated under the Karachchi Scheme, and for the construction by Government of such channels and other irrigation works as may be necessary to facilitate the irrigation of such fields by conveying water to the tracts.

2. The scheme provides further for the imposition of an irrigation rate upon the proprietors of such fields, which rate shall, for five years commencing from the date of completion of the aforesaid channels and other irrigation works, be Rs. 2 per acre per annum in respect of all such fields and an additional Rs. 2 per acre, making a total of Rs. 4 per acre, for any particular year in respect of any of such fields as shall be cultivated for sirupokam.

3. The scheme provides further that after the termination of the said five years both the said irrigation rate and the said additional irrigation rate shall be variable periodically in such manner as the Governor may deem fit.

4. Provided that it is hereby specially agreed that up to and including the year 1937 any portion of the said rate or the said total rate, as the case may be, which is in excess of Rs. 2 per acre per annum, shall be remitted in the case of cultivated fields.

12. The contractor's obligations and rights under this contract shall not be assigned or otherwise transferred or sublet without the consent and authority of the Conservator of Forests previously obtained in writing.

13. No contract shall be entered into with any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors, either individually or jointly with any other person, nor shall the contractor employ any person, whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors, or any other person to whom the Conservator of Forests, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, objects after giving due notice of his objection in writing.

Service "C," Kilinochchi Area.

(a) To fell every tree six inches from the ground in 30 acres demarcated in Kilinochchi Reserve Forest and bounded on all sides by cut lines.

(b) To cut into firewood every tree so felled, and every other dead or fallen tree whatsoever in the area, so as to yield 300 tons of firewood, more or less, with the least amount of wastage. All firewood immediately after conversion to be brought to Kilinochchi Siding, loaded into trucks and unloaded at the Jaffna Depôt, weighed and delivered stacked at the Jaffna Depôt, as the Depôt-keeper may direct at an average rate of 75 tons per mensem. Final delivery of the firewood at the Jaffna Depôt to be made on or before July 31, 1930, when any balance firewood remaining out of the total quantity to be supplied should be delivered. Distance of transport to the Kilinochchi Siding is about ½ a mile.

(c) The area should be stripped clean of all firewood, cleared of all undergrowths, burnt and handed over to the Department in a fit state for planting by July 31, 1930.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended January 11, 1930.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 207 (2 Europeans, 12 Burghers, 134 Sinhalese, 20 Tamils, 30 Moors, 6 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1930, viz., 269,156) was 40·1, as against 27·1 in the preceding week, 41·1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32·5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 173 (1 European, 3 Burghers, 108 Sinhalese, 33 Tamils, 15 Moors, 7 Malays, and 6 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 33·5, as against 40·7 in the previous week, 37·6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30·9 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 173 total deaths, 32 were of infants under one year of age, as against 41 in the preceding week, 47 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 20.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty-one deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 10 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in Kotahena South, Maradana North, and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Maradana East, and Maradana South, as against 36 in the previous week and 22 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Eight deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in San Sebastian, 2 each in St. Paul's and Kotahena South, and 1 in Kotahena North, as against 6 in the previous week and 9 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in Kotahena North, Maradana hospital (of a non-resident), and Maradana North, as against 2 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Six deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals, and 1 each in St. Paul's, New Bazaar, and Maradana South, as against 13 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended January 18, 1930.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 198 (5 Europeans, 14 Burghers, 108 Sinhalese, 27 Tamils, 36 Moors, 6 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1930, viz., 269,156) was 38·4, as against 40·1 in the preceding week, 35·8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32·5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 181 (1 European, 9 Burghers, 106 Sinhalese, 35 Tamils, 21 Moors, and 9 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 35·1, as against 33·5 in the previous week, 36·6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30·9 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 181 total deaths, 42 were of infants under one year of age, as against 32 in the preceding week, 39 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 12.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty-two deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 14 in Maradana hospitals (including 8 deaths of non-residents), 2 in St. Paul's, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Kotahena South, Maradana North, Slave Island, and Wellawatta South, as against 21 in the previous week and 22 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Nine deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in Kotahena South, 2 each in St. Paul's and New Bazaar, and 1 each in San Sebastian and Slave Island, as against 8 in the previous week and 9 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Six deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's, Maradana hospitals, Maradana North, Maradana South, Slave Island, and Wellawatta South, as against 3 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

**Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall
on Wednesday, December 4, 1929, at 3 p.m.**

The Council met this day at 3 P.M. pursuant to notice dated November 27, 1929.

Present :—Mr. H. E. Newnham, V.D., M.A., C.C.S., Chairman; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, M.L.C.; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Mr. R. L. Pereira, K.C.; the Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, M.L.C.; Mr. T. G. Jayewardene, V.D., J.P.; Mr. N. R. Blande; Mr. A. H. G. Dawson; Lieut.-Colonel C. D. Myles, O.B.E., M.B., R.A.M.C.; Mr. M. L. M. Reyall; Dr. S. Muttiah; Mr. J. S. Collett; Dr. V. Van Langenberg, V.D.; Mr. F. Dadabhoy, J.P.; and Mr. H. L. Grocock.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of November 6, 1929, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of November 6, 1929, be confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. T. G. Jayewardene asked the Chairman the following question :—*Q.*—Will the Chairman be pleased to call on the Municipal Engineer to submit approximate estimates for the following works to improve the sanitary condition of New Bazaar Ward, as recommended by the Medical Officer of Health, in his report of October 30, 1929, (1) building under ground or covered public drains and (2) building three public lavatories.

The Chairman replied as follows :—*A.*—Inquiries are being made as to what “underground or covered public drains” the Medical Officer of Health recommends and thereafter the feasibility and cost of constructing them will be ascertained.

Steps are being taken to select sites for the lavatories recommended and thereafter the cost of acquisition and construction will be worked out.

3. The following motion stood in the name of Dr. E. A. Coorey :—“That the amendments to the by-laws relating to Bakeries and Eating Houses be referred to the appropriate Committee for reconsideration.”

After the Chairman had explained the present position with regard to these by-laws, the motion was postponed, on the motion of Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded by Mr. T. G. Jayewardene, owing to the absence of Dr. E. A. Coorey, through illness.

The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 4 to 8 (inclusive) on the agenda. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of November 18, 1929.

MUNICIPAL TREASURER'S DEPARTMENT.

(2) To consider :—(a) The tenders received for the supply of disinfectants for the year 1930 (a) Considered. (b) The recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health (supported by the Acting Municipal Treasurer) that the following be accepted, subject to a clause being added in the contract that, if the disinfectants when tested at the Laboratory during the period of contract fail to come up to specifications, the contract will be terminated and the security deposit made in respect of the contract forfeited to the Council, also that the procedure recommended by the City Microbiologist in his letter No. 352 of October 21, 1929, be adopted in future in calling for tenders for disinfectants :—(i.) McDougalls' Corporation White Fluid co-efficient 6-7 at Rs. 71.60 per 40-gallon drum from Messrs. Cargills, Ltd.; (ii.) McDougalls' “M. O. H.” Black Fluid co-efficient 18-22 at Rs. 104 per 40-gallon drum from Messrs. Cargills, Ltd.; and (iii.) Jeyes disinfectant powder at Rs. 11.10 per cwt. from Messrs. E. B. Creasy & Co.

Note.—The prices of Messrs. Cargills, Ltd., are subject to an increase in the event of the Ceylon Government increasing the duty on imports.—(b) Recommended (i.), (ii.), and (iii.) and that the procedure suggested by the Medical Officer of Health and the City Microbiologist, respectively, be adopted.

MUNICIPAL ENGINEER'S DEPARTMENT.

(11) To consider the case of Mr. T. W. Lappen, Apothecary, Maradana Dispensary.—Recommended that Mr. T. W. Lappen be dismissed.

VETERINARY DEPARTMENT.

(9) To consider :—(a) The tenders received for a further supply of stoneware pipes.—(a) Considered. (b) The recommendation of the Municipal Engineer (supported by the Acting Municipal Treasurer), that the following be accepted: (1) Messrs. Woodwards' quotation for items 1 to 14 at £2,472 and items 15 to 22 at £265, for ordinary best quality pipes, (2) Messrs. Johns' quotations for item 23 at £99, and (3) Messrs. Doultons, quotation for item 24 at £83.

Note.—The cost of the materials will be £2,919, *c.i.f.* (approximately Rs. 39,407). The sanction of Council is necessary. Funds are available. The cost, in the first instance will be charged to Advance Account, Stores, and debited to votes as and when the materials are issued.—(b) Recommended (1), (2), and (3).

(10) To consider :—(a) Letter No. 12,428 from the Superintendent of Police suggesting that spot lights be fixed at the following junctions as the experiment has proved very satisfactory :—Two at Galle Face Hotel junction, Hyde Park—Union place corner, Regent street—Dean's road, Castle street—Horton place, Galle road—Lawrie's road, Timbiri-gasyaya road—Havelock road, and Galle road—High street.—(a) Considered. (b) An estimate of the Municipal Engineer requesting a vote of Rs. 2,000 for the initial outlay and an additional sum of Rs. 600 annually on the street lighting vote. (c) A memorandum of the Chairman inquiring “are you prepared to vote this—or some of this?”—Recommended that Rs. 1,000 be voted, the sites to be selected by the Police.

(11) To consider the recommendation of the Municipal Engineer (supported by the Acting Municipal Treasurer), that two steam roller wheels be purchased, as per makers' quotation, at a cost of £75, F.O.B., London, the cost to be met from the maintenance vote.—Recommended.

(12) To consider the question of the widening of Buller's road from Kanatta road to Model Farm road.—Recommended that Rs. 25,000 be voted for widening Buller's road from Kanatta road junction to Castle street junction for acquisition, any balance remaining to be used for construction.

(28) To consider plans and detailed estimates from the Municipal Engineer, as follows, in connection with the laying of proposed soil sewers :—(1) 9-in. soil sewer in De Kretser place, Wellawatta, Rs. 6,800 ; (2) 9-in. soil sewer 592 lineal feet in Duplication road and Joseph lane, Bambalapitiya, Rs. 14,000 ; (3) 9-in. soil sewer in Dickman's road from manhole No. 1 of W36 to manhole No. 2 of W30, Rs. 8,000 ; (4) 9-in. soil sewer from Dickman's road to 14th lane through Stubbs place and private property, Rs. 15,000 ; (5) 9-in. soil sewer in 14th lane and from 14th lane to Vajira road through private property, Rs. 16,000 ; (6) 9-in. soil sewer in Davidson road, Rs. 9,750 ; (7) 9-in. soil sewer in Hampden lane, Wellawatta, Rs. 7,500 ; (8) 9-in. soil sewer in Vihara lane from manhole No. 3 of X2 to manhole No. 13 of X5, Rs. 5,000 ; (9) 9-in. soil sewer in McCallum road from a point 286 lineal feet from bridge near Lockgates up to 5th Cross street through Railway premises, Rs. 72,000.

(29) To consider plans and detailed estimates from the Municipal Engineer, as follows, in connection with the laying of proposed rainwater drains :—(1) Riffe street, Slave Island, Rs. 2,800 ; (2) Saunder's court, Slave Island, Rs. 1,500 ; (3) Skinner's road south through grass field from Princes gate junction to canal, Rs. 17,000 ; Havelock road to Jawatta road through private property, Rs. 23,000 ; (5) Havelock road to Timbirigasyaya road through private property, Rs. 13,250 ; (6) Timbirigasyaya road to Jawatta road through private property, Rs. 10,500 ; (7) Jawatta road 655 lineal feet through private property, Rs. 13,500.

Note.—These plans and estimates are in support of a part of the item for Rs. 131,550 proposed by the Four Standing Committees for inclusion in the 1930 Budget.—Recommended.

(30) To consider two detailed estimates amounting to Rs. 5,800 from the Municipal Engineer for the purchase, delivery, and erection of :—(a) One " National " " E " Type Suction Gas Producer, to be erected at the Eastern Pumping Station ; (b) One " National " " D " Type Suction Gas Producer, to be erected at the Polwatta Pumping Station.

Note.—This item is included in the draft Budget for 1930.—Recommended.

(31) To consider detailed estimates of the Municipal Engineer, as follows, in connection with street lighting extensions :—(1) Street lighting, Jawatta road, Rs. 4,170 ; (2) Street lighting, Buller's road, Kanatta road to Castle street, Rs. 2,350 ; Rs. 6,520.

Note.—Provision is made in the draft Budget for 1930.—Recommended.

(32) To consider a plan and a detailed estimate of Rs. 54,000 from the Municipal Engineer for the construction of north road, Rajamalwatta.

Note.—This item is included in the draft Budget for 1930.—Recommended.

(33) To consider a plan and detailed estimate of Rs. 17,050 from the Municipal Engineer for improvements to Yakbedda road and Yakbedda lane.

Note.—Provision is made in the draft Budget for 1930, under I.-74 " Private streets."—Recommended.

(34) To consider plans and detailed estimates of the Municipal Engineer, as follows, in connection with Road Improvements—Taking over Private streets :—(1) Karlsrhue gardens, Rs. 11,500 ; (2) Lane off Flower road, Rs. 11,000 ; (3) Boswell place, Wellawatta, Rs. 15,600 ; (4) First lane, Colpetty, Rs. 5,500.

Note.—Provision is made in the draft Budget for 1930, under I.-74 " Private streets."—Recommended.

WATERWORKS DEPARTMENT.

(35) To consider :—(a) Letter No. 1,786 dated October 31, 1929, from the Chairman, Urban District Council, Ratnapura, asking for the loan of the services of an expert Waterworks Engineer to advise the Council on the Town Water Supply Scheme which is now in progress. (b) A report of the Waterworks Engineer.—Recommended that the services of Mr. Thyne be lent at a fee of Rs. 500, half the amount to be credited to the Council and half to be paid to Mr. Thyne. Mr. Grocock dissents.

(36) To consider :—(a) An application from Mr. M. B. M. Makeen for water service to his premises situated in a private lane off Piachaud's lane, Maradana.—(a) Considered. (b) A plan and an estimate of Rs. 714 from the Waterworks Engineer for laying a 4-in. diameter water main for a distance of 72 yards in the lane. The lane being a private lane, the application will have to be dealt with under Ordinance No. 9 of 1916. The applicant agrees to pay the amount by instalments of Rs. 59.50 per mensem with interest at the rate of 6 per cent. per annum on balances outstanding from time to time.

Note.—The Waterworks Engineer recommends the laying of the main under the conditions specified in Ordinance No. 9 of 1916.—(b) Recommended.

Resolutions.

The Chairman informed the meeting of the considerations which induced the Committees to reject the lowest tender. The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded the motion.

Mr. M. L. M. Reyal moved, as an amendment, that the recommendation of the Standing Committees be adopted. Mr. T. G. Jayewardene seconded.

The amendment was put to the meeting and carried.

With regard to item No. 35, the Chairman stated that the Chairman of the Ratnapura Urban District Council had since written to him withdrawing his application.

It was resolved that the item be withdrawn.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committees with regard to the remaining items be adopted.

McDougall's Corporation White Fluid co-efficient 6-7 at Rs. 71·60 per 40-gallon drum from Messrs. Cargills, Ltd. (ii.) McDougall's "M. O. H." Black Fluid co-efficient 18-22 at Rs. 104 per 40-gallon drum from Messrs. Cargills, Ltd. (iii.) Jeyes' disinfectant powder at Rs. 11·10 per cwt. from Messrs. E. B. Creasy & Co.

Note.—The prices of Messrs. Cargills, Ltd., are subject to an increase in the event of the Ceylon Government increasing the duty on imports.—(b) Recommended (i.), (ii.), and (iii.), and that the procedure suggested by the Medical Officer of Health and the City Microbiologist respectively, be adopted.

(9) To consider the case of Mr. T. W. Lappen, Apothecary, Maradana Dispensary.—Recommended that Mr. T. W. Lappen be dismissed.

(10) To consider applications from the Medical Officer of Health (supported by the Municipal Treasurer) for supplemental provision, as follows :—(1) Vote H (b) 18, Wages of Coolies, Child Welfare Branch, Rs. 65.

Note.—The excess is due to the payment of the 7½ per cent. increase of wages granted by the Council in May, 1929.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Special Budget Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Town Hall on Wednesday, December 11, 1929, at 3 p.m.

THE Council met this day at 3 P.M. pursuant to notice dated December 4, 1929, to consider finally the Budget for the year 1930, in accordance with the provisions of section 98 of Ordinance No. 21 of 1929.

Present :—Mr. H. E. Newnham, V.D., M.A., C.C.S., Chairman; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy; Mr. T. G. Jayewardene, V.D., J.P.; Mr. N. R. Blande; Lieut.-Col. C. D. Myles, O.B.E., M.B., R.A.M.C.; Mr. M. L. M. Reyal; Dr. S. Muttiah; Mr. J. S. Collett; Dr. V. van Langenberg, V.D.; Mr. F. Dadabhoy, J.P.; Mr. H. J. Hutchings; and Mr. H. L. Grocock.

(Mr. G. H. N. Saunders, Municipal Treasurer; Mr. E. H. Joseph, Secretary; and Mr. Vivian Pereira, Assistant Municipal Treasurer, were also present.)

The Chairman moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider the Budget for 1930. Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy seconded.—Carried.

A Budget for 1930 containing:—(a) An estimate of the available Municipal income, (b) details of proposed expenditure for 1930, as circulated among the members and submitted to Council on December 4, 1929, according to the provisions of section 97 of Ordinance No. 21 of 1929, was laid before the Council in Committee.

Before proceeding to consider the Budget, Mr. T. G. Jayewardene stated that there was a statement in the press that malaria had largely increased in the city and he invited a statement from the Chairman on the subject so that, if necessary, money might be voted to combat the disease.

The Chairman stated that the recent reports in the press with regard to malaria seemed merely to contain quotations from the Administration Report of the Medical Officer of Health for 1928. So far as the Medical Officer of Health knew—and he had consulted him that morning—there had been no recrudescence whatever.

The Chairman pointed out the following amendments which should be made in the Budget since it was considered by the Four Standing Committees and gave reasons for each amendment:—

Mr. de Silva seconded.

The vote of condolence was passed, all the members standing.

(2) Shop-keepers in Kandy complaining against the levy of a fee for sunshades which had been in existence for years and on which no fee had been previously demanded. (3) President, Kandy Cricket League, *re* the necessity for the erection of a public pavilion on the Bogambara Grounds and matters connected with the use of Bogambara Ground. (4) Mr. J. G. de Saram *re* the permit issued to him to construct a tenement in place of the watcher's hut in premises No. 274, Peradeniya road. (5) Mr. A. C. Soysa *re* repairs to Bahirawakande road.

Mr. de Silva presented petition from Hony. Secretary, Sri Kalyanodaya Society, applying for a grant for a free Vernacular Reading Room.

The Chairman undertook to look into the matters referred to in the several petitions.

The Chairman tabled the Draft Budget for 1930, which had been previously circulated among the Members and been open to public inspection at the Municipal Office, and spoke on the financial position of the Council and the programme of expenditure for 1930.

Messrs. de Silva, Ratwatte Adigar, Wijayatilake and Perera offered comments.

The Council then went into Committee and the following amendments were made:—

GENERAL REVENUE FUND.

(1) Mr. A. B. C. Kulasekera was raised to Grade I. from January 1, 1930, and his salary scale was altered to Rs. 2,520—120—Rs. 3,000 from January 1, 1930.

- (2) Mr. L. Don Lewis was allowed to take up the Efficiency Bar before the salary scale of Grade II. and was placed on Rs. 1,320 from January 1, 1930.
- (3) Mr. D. A. S. Senaratne was placed in Grade III. on a salary scale of Rs. 780 from January 1, 1930, with rent allowance.
- (4) Temporary post in Accounts Branch was converted to a Grade III. post.
- (5) An additional post in Grade III. for Additional Accounts Clerk was allowed.
- (6) Mr. D. M. Daniel was placed in Grade III. on Rs. 720 from January 1, 1930.
- (7) Mr. D. G. Dullewe was placed in Grade III. on Rs. 660 from January 1, 1930.
- (8) Additional peon was allowed.
- (9) Dr. Tennekoon's application for increase of pay was considered and it was decided to place him on Rs. 9,000 rising to Rs. 12,000 by annual increments of Rs. 500 from January 1, 1930, with rent allowance from the date he resumed duties after return from leave. Rent allowance for 1929 to be on present salary.
- (10) Transfer of Scavenging Overseer Jayman to Sanitary Inspector's Grade on Rs. 900 from January 1, 1930, with rent allowance and travelling allowance and uniforms was approved.
- (11) Mr. Vanderwall's, Assistant Superintendent of Municipal Works, application for the usual rent allowance and enhanced travelling allowance of Rs. 75 per mensem was considered and allowed.

- (5) Increase of pay to Mr. Shelliah, Assistant Store keeper was disallowed.
- (6) Increase of cycle allowance to 3 Meter Inspectors and Readers to Rs. 10 each per mensem was passed.
- (7) House allowance to the monthly paid staff of the Electricity Department was sanctioned and a vote of Rs. 2,237.05 was allowed for the purpose.

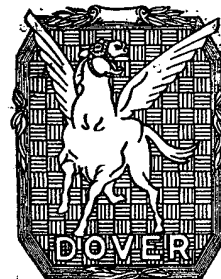
