### A PROCLAMATION.

H. J. STANLEY.

WHEREAS by the 5th section of the Prisons Ordinance, No. 16 of 1877, as amended by section 1 of Ordinance No. 24 of 1890, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to establish any prison for this Island or for any part thereof:

And whereas it is expedient to establish a prison at Kurunegala:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers vested in Us aforesaid, do by this Our Proclamation establish the old jail at Kurunegala as a prison at Kurunegala aforesaid, for the reception of prisoners of every description committed or remanded under the authority of the several courts of the Island for the period of the Kurunegala Sessions of the Supreme Court of the Island of Ceylon, which begin on or about Monday, February 3, 1930.

## GREETING.

WHEREAS We deem it expedient that a Commission should issue appointing the persons named herein to visit the several provinces of the Island and, after hearing such evidence as they may deem necessary, to make recommendations for the division of the Island into fifty electoral districts for the election of members of the State Council proposed in the Report of the Special Commission on the Constitution of Ceylon, the following conditions being observed in the framing of such recommendations:—

- (1) Each electoral district should contain a total population of between approximately 100,000 and 125,000 persons.
- (2) In exceptional circumstances, where the inclusion within one electoral district of a population within the above limits would result in a constituency of too large an area or of inconvenient form, boundaries may be so defined as to include a smaller number, provided that without the sanction of the Governor in Executive Council specially sought and obtained the number included shall in any such case not be less than 75,000.
- (3) Whenever the above conditions permit, the boundaries of electoral districts should coincide with those of revenue districts or of Chief Headmen's divisions or of areas under the jurisdiction of local authorities.

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, reposing great trust and confidence in your prudence, ability, and fidelity, have, with the advice of Our Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers in Us vested by the Ordinance No. 9 of 1872, nominated, constituted, and appointed, and by these presents do nominate, constitute, and appoint you, the Hon. Mr. ROBERT WILLIAM LYALL GRANT, Puisne Justice; WALTER ERNEST WAIT, Esquire; LEWIS JAMES BARNETSON TURNER, Esquire, to be Our Commissioners for the purposes aforesaid, with authority to exercise all the powers which Commissioners appointed under the said Ordinance may lawfully use and exercise.

And We do hereby nominate, constitute, and appoint you, the Hon. Mr. ROBERT WILLIAM LYALL GRANT, Puisne Justice, to be the Chairman of the said Commission.

And We do further hereby authorize and empower you, Our said Commissioners, to make all necessary inquiries in the said matter, and to report to Us under your hands, as early as possible, upon the matters referred to you as aforesaid.

And We do request and require all public officers and other persons to whom you may apply for such information or advice as may properly be given to be assistant to you in your inquiries.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended January 25, 1930.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 166 (7 Burghers, 101 Sinhalese, 24 Tamils, 22 Moors, 6 Malays, and 6 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1930, viz., 269,156) was 32.2, as against 38.4 in the preceding week, 38.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.5 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 152 (5 Burghers, 91 Sinhalese, 28 Tamils, 22 Moors, 2 Malays, and 4 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 29.4, as against 35.1 in the previous week, 39.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.9 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 152 total deaths, 37 were of infants under one year of age, as against 42 in the preceding week, 48 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—1. (a) Fifteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Maradana North, and 1 each in Pettah, San Sebastian, Kotahena South, and Maradana East, as against 22 in the previous week, and 22 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Thirteen deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 each in St. Paul's and San Sebastian, 2 each in Kotahena North and New Bazaar, and 1 each in Kotahena South, Maradana hospitals, and Slave Island, as against 9 in the previous week, and 9 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Eight deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Maradana North, and 1 each in Kotahena South and New Bazaar, as against 6 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Eleven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 8 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents) and 1 each in Kotahena South, Maradana South, and Slave Island, as against 14 in the previous week, and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Two deaths from *Phthisis* of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Three deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident) and 1 in Kollupitiya, as against 5 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. Ten deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 10 from *Debility*, 7 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 3 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Worms*, 2 each from *Dysentery* and *Tetanus*, 1 each from *Homicide* and *Suicide*, and 63 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Thirteen cases of *Chickenpox*, 4 of *Enteric Fever*, and 1 of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 21, 7, and 1, respectively, of the preceding week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 78.9°, against 79.0° in the preceding week and 79.2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.907 in., against 29.931 in. in the preceding week and 29.919 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.82 in., against 2.05 in. in the preceding week and 0.68 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
