The Conservator of Forests reserves the discretionary power to waive the terms of this clause in any degree as he may consider the circumstances justify.

14. The special rules for felling, conversion, and removal which the agreement will require to be observed are specified in the special conditions advertised below. Nothing in these special conditions shall render the purchaser in any way exempt from liability to punishment under the Forest Ordinance of 1907, should he or any of the workmen in his employ be responsible for the commission of a forest offence outside the boundaries of his purchased coupe or coupes.

Special Conditions.

(1) On payment of the full purchase amount the purchaser shall be entitled to fell and remove on or before August 31, 1930, in the manner specified below, all the timber and firewood contained in the purchased coupe or coupes. No extension of the time limit fixed for felling and removal will be granted except under very special circumstances, and all timber and firewood not removed by the date of expiry of agreement, *i.e.*, August 31, 1930, shall *ipso facto* revert to the Crown.

(2) The purchaser shall further agree that should any timber be left standing or lying felled within the coupe on the date of expiry, the expenses incurred by Government for their removal be defrayed from the amount deposited by him as security under clause (b) in paragraph 9 above.

(3) If the purchaser desires to pay by instalments, payment of a first instalment of 40 per cent. of the full purchase price of the coupe or coupes shall entitle him to fell and remove all the trees in an area not exceeding one third of the total area of such coupe. Payment of 70 per cent. of the purchase price by means of a second instalment of 30 per cent. shall entitle the purchaser to fell and remove all the trees in an area not exceeding two-thirds of the total area of such coupe.

(4) The purchaser shall agree to commence felling along the full length of one boundary of each coupe previously pointed out to him by the Range Forest Officer, Dehiowita, and laid down on the plan of the coupe annexed to the agreement. He shall further agree to progress the felling in a direction parallel to the boundary along which the felling has been commenced in the manner prescribed under clauses (a) and (b) below :—

- (a) All tree seedlings and saplings which are under 3 inches in diameter shall be cut out flush with the ground.
- (b) All saplings and trees over three inches in diameter shall be felled within 6 inches of the ground.

(5) If paying by instalments, the purchaser shall pay the second instalment or in all 70 per cent. of the full purchase price within 4 months, and the third and final instalment within 6 months of the date of execution of the agreement.

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Should the purchaser fail to pay either instalment when due, it shall be within the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer to cancel the agreement as from the date of such default, and to declare same to be null and void.

Any unremoved or unfelled timber or firewood lying or standing in the coupe or coupes shall unconditionally revert to the Crown as from the date of such cancellation, and the purchaser shall have no further claim thereto. On no account shall any postponement of the date of such payment be made.

(6) Should the purchaser fell or remove trees or firewood from any area of the coupe or coupes he has not paid for, or from any area of forest outside the demarcated boundaries of his coupe or coupes, nothing in the agreement shall exempt him from liability to punishment for illicit felling and removal under the provisions of the Forest Ordinance, No. 16 of 1907, and of the rules framed thereunder. VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended February 1, 1930.

Births .-- The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 202 (5 Europeans, 3 Burghers, 130 Bittles.—Ine total bit ins registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 202 (5 Europeans, 3 Burghers, 130 Sinhalese, 17 Tamils, 38 Moors, 6 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1930, viz., 269,156) was 39 1, as against 32 2 in the preceding week, 33 9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32 5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.-The total deaths registered were 148 (1 European, 4 Burghers, 81 Sinhalese, 33 Tamils, 18 Moors, 6 Malays, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 28.7, as against 29.4 in the previous week, 32.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.9 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths .- Of the 148 total deaths, 27 were of infants under one year of age, as against 37 in the preceding week, 29 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.-The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 15.

Principal Causes of Death.--1. (a) Twelve deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in Maradana North and Wellawatta North, and 1 each in Kotahena South, (neutring 2 deaths of neutrino), which is a signification of the previous week, and 22 the weekly average for last year. (b) Seven deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 each in New Bazaar and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in San Sebastian,

(b) Soven details and Slave Island, as against 13 in the provious week and 9 the weekly average for last year.
 (c) Four deaths from Bronchitis were registered, 2 each in Kotahena South and Maradana North, as against 8 in the

previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

(a) Thirteen deaths from Phthisis were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents, 4 in Kotahena South, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, Maradana South, and Kollupitiya, as against 11 in the provious week, and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from Phthisis of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. (a) Three deaths from *Enteric Fever*, including 1 death of a non-resident, were registered in Maradana hospitals. The number registered during the preceding week was also 3 and the weekly average for last year was 4.

(b) One death from Enteric Fever, of a jesident of Colombo town occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.

Thirteen deaths from Enteritis were registered, 8 from Debility, 6 from Infantile Convulsions, 4 from Puerperal 4 Septicaemia, 3 each from Worms, Tetanus, and Accidents, 2 each from Diarrhoea and Dysentery, 1 from Suicide, and 64 from Other Causes.

5. Reported Cases .- Twenty-one cases of Chickenpox, 6 of Enteric Fever and 2 of Measles were reported during the week, as against 13, 4, and 1, respetively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was $79\cdot3^{\circ}$ against $78\cdot9^{\circ}$ in the preceding week, and 79.3° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was $29\cdot915$ in., against 29.907 in. in the preceding week, and $29\cdot865$ in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was $0\cdot21$ in., against 0:82 in. in the preceding week, and 3.93 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

The applications of candidates from Assisted Schools shou'd be forwarded by the Managers, from Government Schools by the Head Teachers, and from private candidates direct. (b) Late applications will be received up to February 21, provided stamps to the value of Rs. 15 are affixed.

Refunds.-If a candidate is rejected owing to his not satisfying the conditions for admission to the examination a refund will be made of four-fifths the value of stamps affixed to his entry.

5. (a) Withdrawals.—Except in cases referred to in paragraph 4, no refund will be made; but if notice of a candidate's withdrawal is received in this office by February 21, a voucher will be issued. This voucher will entitle the candidate to enter once more for the same examination, without fee, provided that the examination is held within a year and that the regulations are complied with in other respects.

(b) Candidates who withdraw on account of illness will receive vouchers as in (a) provided the notice of withdrawal is received in this office before the examination commences, and is accompanied by the perfected entry form and a medical certificate from a qualified Medical Officer.

1. The highest bid will be accepted, subject to the approval of the Conservator of Forests. The highest bidder shall sign his name in the register of sale in admission of his bid and deposit the necessary amount.

2. Twenty-five per cent, of the bids to be deposited on conclusion of the sale. The balance should be paid within fourteen days of the receipt of intimation by the purchaser of the approval of sale by the Conservator of Forests, when a permit for removal will be issued.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office D on Saturday, December 14, 1929, at 9 a.m., pursuant to Notice dated December 9, 1929.

Present: Mr. M. M. Weddurburn, Chairman; the Hon. Mr. H. M. Macan Markar, M.L.C.; Mr. D. W. Subasinghe; the Hon. Mr. C. E. de Vos, M.L.C.; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. D. I. Durham; Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe; and Mr. F. W. Sproule.

The Minutes of the General Meeting of November 9, 1929, a copy thereof having been furnished to each member, 1 were taken as read and confirmed.

2. The Chairman made the following statement regarding plague for the period November 9 to December 13:----There have been no further cases of human or rat plague.

In terms of the recommendation of the Standing Committee on Sanitation of November 23, the buildings in No. 1 area (Dangedera) are being reoccupied in accordance with the recommendations of the Director of Medical and Sanitary Srevices.

Four blocks of temporary shops have been completed. On the 10th instant the Medical Officer of Health of the Health Unit, Matara, reported that four persons were suspected to be suffering from pneumonic plague. The first case was brought from Matara to the Galle Hospital on the 7th morning, and the patient died that evening. The four cases reported from Matara occurred in the house in which this man lived. The dead body of this patient was exhumed on the 10th, and a post mortem was held; but a definite diagnosis was not possible. The organs were sent to Colombo for inoculation tests.

The Chairman said he would inquire whether the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services approves of the immediate reoccupation for any purpose of all the premises in area No. 1 when the improvements have been carried out. 3. Supplemental Budget No. 1 for 1929.—Resolved that the Supplemental Budget be passed.

Supplemental Bauget No. 1 for 1325.—Resolved that the Supplemental Bauget be passed.
 Papers re Road Metal.—The Chairman stated that owing to the contractor's failure to supply the required quantity of road metal, the metal purchased from others had cost Rs. 958.69 in excess of the contract rates.

Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe moved that half the amount of the excess, Rs. 479:34, be charged against the contractor.-Mr. F. W. Sproule seconded. The Hon. Mr. H. M. Macan Markar moved, as an amendment, that the contractor be fined Rs. 250 for his failure

to carry out the terms of his contract, in view of his long service. Mr. D. W. Subasinghe seconded.

The amendment was put to the meeting, and declared lost by 3 votes to 4.

The motion was then put to the meeting, and carried.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council :---

5. Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation of November 23, 1929.

(2) Papers relating to the Plague situation.-Read letter No. Y. A. 2,438 of November 20, 1929, from the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services regarding the reoccupation of the vacated buildings in the Dangedera area.—Recommended that area No. 1 should be reoccupied in accordance with the recommendations of the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services.

Resolution.

Resolved that the Chairman be asked to arrange for the immediate reoccupation for any purpose of all the premises in area No. 1 when the improvements recommended by the Sanitary Department have been carried out.

6. Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of November 23, 1929.

(2) To consider by-laws for regulating the number of Gandara fishing boats beached in Galle harbour during the N.-E. monsoon :---Recommended that steps should be taken, even if the amendment of the Ordinance is necessary, to provide for the registration of boats beached in the harbour.

Improvements in Automatic and semi-automatic telephone systems.

Abstract.-The system comprises two or more automatic exchanges and one or more junction lines which extend to a main exchange and are shared by the automatic exchanges, in which connections are automatically set up between subscribers in different automatic exchanges or between subscribers in the same automatic exchange. There are thirty-five claims and three sheets of drawings.

Improvements in the process of producing oil and cake from copra.

Abstract.-A single stage process is used in which the moisture content of the copra is adjusted in relation to its F. F. A. content. It is ground to pass a 0.065 inch opening and tempered and pressed.

The claims are :-

1. The process of treating copra for extraction of all of its cil as high grade oil by grinding the copra, tempering and pressing it, characterized that the copra is finely ground before being tempered and pressed to yield a large percentage of light oil and a light cake.

2. The process as claimed in claim 1, in which the copra is ground to pass a mesh 0.065'' opening.

3. The process as claimed in claims 1 and 2, in which the moisture content of the finely ground copra is adjusted inversely to the amount of free fatty acid in the copra.



To unite, co-operate, amalgamate, or enter into partnership or any arrangement for sharing profits of union of interests or any other arrangement with any person or company already engaged in or hereafter to be established for the purpose of carrying on any business having objects wholly or in part similar or analogous or subsidiary to those of the Company or to any of them, or capable of being conducted so as to benefit this Company, either directly or indirectly, and to subscribe for or otherwise acquire for the benefit and in the name of the Company or otherwise and pay for in any manner that may be agreed upon, either in money or in shares or bonds or otherwise, and to hold any shares, stock, or other interest in any such company, and to promote the formation of any such company.

25. To acquire by purchase in money, shares, bonds, or otherwise, and undertake all or any of the business, property, assets, and liabilities of any person or company carrying on any business in Ceylon or elsewhere which this Company is authorized to carry on, or possessed of property suitable for the purposes of this Company.

26. To sell the property, business, or undertaking of the Company, or any part of parts thereof, for such consideration as the Company shall think fit, and in particular for shares, stocks, debentures, or securities of any other company.

27. To procure the Company to be registered or incorporated in Ceylon, and, if and when necessary or thought advisable, elsewhere.

28. To lend money on any terms and in any manner and on any security, and in particular on the security of plantations, factories, growing crops, produce, bills of exchange, promissory notes, bonds, bills of lading, warrants, stocks, shares, debentures, and book debts, or without any security at all.

29. To invest and deal with the moneys of the Company not immediately required upon such securities and in such manner as may from time to time be determined.

30. To promote and establish any other company whatsoever and to subscribe to and hold the shares or stock of any other company or any part thereof.

31. To pay for any lands and real or personal, immovable or movable, estate or property, or assets of any kind acquired or to be acquired by the Company, or for any services rendered or to be rendered to the Company, and generally to pay or discharge any consideration to be paid or given by the Company, in money or in shares or debentures or debenture stock or obligations of the Company or partly in one way and partly in another, or otherwise howsoever with power to issue any shares either fully or partly paid up for such prupose.

32. To accept as consideration for the sale or disposal of any lands and real or personal, immovable, and movable estate, property, and assets of the Company of any kind sold or otherwise disposed of by the Company or in discharge of any other consideration to be received by the Company in money or in shares, the shares (whether wholly or partially paid up) of any company, or the mortgages, debentures, or obligations of any company or person or partly one and partly the other.

33. To distribute among the Shareholders in specie any property of the Company, whether by way of dividend or upon a return of capital, but so that no distribution amounting to a reduction of capital be made, except with the sanction for the time being required by law.

34. To establish and support or to aid in the establishment and support of associations, institutions, funds and trusts calculated to benefit any of the employees and *ex* employees of the Company or the dependents or con nections of such persons, and to grant pensions and allowances, and to make payments, towards insurance and to subscribe or guarantee money for charitable or benevolent objects or for any exhibition or for any public, general, or useful objects.

35. To promote, join, and subscribe to federations or combinations for the purpose of protecting or encouraging any trade or industry, or for protection of employers or workmen, or for promoting co-operation between employers and employees, and to enter into arrangements or agreements with workmen and employees of the Company for participation in profits or joint control or otherwise as may be deemed expedient.

36. To do all such other things as shall be incidental, or conducive to the attainment of the objects above mentioned or any of them or any one or more of the objects aforesaid, it being hereby declared that in the foregoing clauses (unless a contrary intention appears) the word "Company" includes companies or corporations, and the word "person" any number of persons, and that the other objects specified in any paragraph are not to be limited or restricted by reference to or inference from any other paragraph.

The liability of the Shareholders is limited. IV.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF CANDARSAN, LIMITED.

Company Limited by Shares. 1. THE regulations contained in the table marked "C" in the schedule to the Companies Ordinance No. 4 of 1861 (hereinafter called table "C"), shall apply to the Company and be deemed to be incorporated herewith except so far as they are herein expressly or by implication modified or excluded or declared not to apply and in the construction of them presents words importing the mean der solution that is had the formula of these presents words importing the masculine gender only shall include the feminine gender, and words importing the singular number only shall include the plural number and vice versa and words importing persons shall include corporations. The following new regulations shall be inserted immediately before regulation 1 of Table "C" namely :

BUSINESS.

(a) The Company may proceed to carry out the object for which it is established, and to employ and apply its capital as soon after the registration of the Company as the Directors in their discretion shall think fit; and if the whole of the shares shall not have been subscribed, applied for, or allotted as soon as in the judgment of the Directors' a sufficient number of shares shall have been subscribed or applied for.

(b) The Company shall forthwith adopt the agreement referred to in sub-clause (1) of clause III. of the Memorandum of Association and shall carry the said agreement into effect with such modification (if any) as may be agreed upon. And it is hereby provided and declared that the basis on which the Company is established is that the Company shall acquire the business and property comprised and described in the said agreement on the terms therein set forth subject to such modifications if any as aforesaid, and that S. S. Mason, F. F. Roe, B. M. Selwyn, and J. B. Lang are to be the first Directors of the Company and it shall be no objection to the said agreement that the said S. S. Mason is Vendor Promoter Director Agent or that he stands in a fiduciary position towards the Company or that there is no independent Board of Directors. And the said agreement shall not be set aside or reduced and no claim shall be made by the Company or any member thereof against the parties thereto on any ground whatever and every member of the Company present and future is to be deemed to join the Company on this basis.

CAPITAL.

(c) The nominal capital of the Company is Rupees One hundred Thousand (Rs. 100,000) divided into 10,000 ordinary shares of Rupees Ten (Rs. 10) each.

(d) The Directors may, with the sanction of a special resolution of the Company in General Meeting, increase the capital of the Company by the creation of new shares of such amounts per share and in the aggregate and with such special, preferential, deferred, qualified or other rights, privileges, or conditions attached thereto as such resolution shall direct.

(c) Except so far as otherwise provided by the conditions of issue or by these presents, any capital raised by the creation of new shares shall be considered part of the original capital, and shall be subject to the same provisions in all respects with reference to the payments of allotment money, calls and instalments, transfer, transmission, forfeiture, lien, surrender, and otherwise, as if it had formed part of the original capital.

(f) The Directors may also with the sanction of a special resolution of the Company reduce the capital or sub-divide or consolidate the shares of the Company.

The following new regulations shall be added after regulation 10 of Table "C" namely :--3.

10. (a) The Board may, at their own absolute and uncontrolled discretion, decline to register any transfer of shares by a Shareholder who is indebted to the Company, or upon whose shares the Company have a lien, or otherwise or in case of shares not fully paid up, to any person not approved of by them; and in no case shall a Shareholder or proposed transferree be entitled to require the Directors to state the reason of their refusal to register, but their declinature shall be absolute.

(b) Every instrument of transfer must be left at the office of the Company to be registered, accompanied 10. by the certificate for the shares to be transferred and by such evidence as the Directors may reasonably require to prove the title of the transferor, and a fee of Two Rupees and Fifty cents or such other sum as the Directors shall from time to time determine, must be paid to the Company for the registration of every such transfer ; upon payment thereof the Director, subject to the powers vested in them by article 10 (a) shall register the transferee as a Shareholder and retain the instrument of transfer.

10. (c) The Directors may, by such means as they shall deem expedient, authorize the registration of the transferees as Shareholders, without the necessity of any meeting of the Directors for that purpose.

10. (d) In no case shall the Directors be bound to inquire into the validity, legal effect, or genuineness of any instrument of transfer produced by a person claiming a transfer of any share in accordance with these articles; and whether they abstain from so inquiring, or do so inquire and are misled the transferor shall have no claim whatsoever upon the Company in respect of the share, except for the dividends previously declared in respect thereof, but only if at all, upon the transferee.

The following new regulations shall be added after regulation 20 of Table "C" namely :-4.

BORROWING POWERS.

20. (a) The Directors shall have power to procure from time to time, in the usual course of business, such temporary advances as they may find necessary or expedient for the purpose of defraying the expenses of working the Company's business, or of erecting, maintaining, improving, or extending buildings, machinery, or otherwise. Also from time to time at their discretion to borrow or raise from the Directors or other persons any sum or sums of money for the purposes of the Company, provided that the money so borrowed or raised and owing at any one time shall not without the sanction of a General Meeting, exceed Rupees Twenty-five thousand (Rs. 25,000).

A certificate under the hands of one Director and the Secretary, or of two Directors, to the effect that in taking any loan the Directors are not exceeding their borrowing powers, shall be sufficient and binding on the Company and all concerned, and shall be conclusive evidence thereof in all questions between the Company and its creditors.

20 (c) For the purpose of securing the repayment of any such money so borrowed or raised, or for any other purposes, the Directors may grant, create, execute, and issue any mortgages, cash credits, debentures, debenture stock, bonds, or obligations of the Company, charged upon all or any part of the undertaking, revenue, lands, property, rights, and assets of the Company both present and future, including uncalled capital or unpaid calls, or may make, accept, or endorse on behalf of the Company any promissory notes or bills of exchange.

20 (d) Any such securities may be issued either at par or at a premium or discount, and may from time to time be cancelled, discharged, varied or exchanged as the Directors may think fit, and may contain special privileges as to redemption, surrender, drawings, allotment of shares or otherwise.

20 (e) Every debenture or other instrument issued by the Company for securing the payment of money may be so framed that the moneys thereby secured shall be assignable free from any equities between the Company and the person to whom the same may be issued.
5. Regulations 21 and 22 of Table "C" are expressly excluded.
6. Regulation 24 of Table "C" is expressly excluded and the following regulation substituted therefor namely, "Subse-

quent General Meetings shall he held at least once in every year at such time and place as may be determined by the Directors. 7. A quorum at any General or Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company shall consist of not less than three Shareholders, and regulation 32 of Table "C" is notified accordingly.

8. Regulations 39, 42, 43, and 44 are expressly excluded, and the following regulations substituted therefor, namely:-

(a) On a show of hands every Shareholder present in person shall have one vote. On a poll every Shareholder shall have one vote for each share of which he is the holder.

(b) No Shareholder shall be entitled to vote at any General Meeting unless all calls or other sums presently payable by him in respect of shares in the Company have been paid.

(c) On a poll, votes may be given either personally or by proxy or attorney. (d) The instrument appointing a proxy shall be in writing under the hand of the appointor or of his attorney duly authorized in writing, or if the appointor is a corporation either under the common seal or under the hand of an officer or attorney so authorized.

(e) The instrument appointing a proxy and the power of attorney or other authority (if any) under which it is signed or a notarially certified copy of that power or authority shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than forty-eight hours before the time for holding the meeting at which the person named in the instrument proposes to vote and in default the instrument of proxy shall not be treated as valid.

44 (b) Each Director shall have the power with the consent of the majority of the Directors to appoint in writing any person whether a Shareholder of the Company or not to act as a Deputy Director in his place during his absence or inability to act as Director and at his discretion to remove such Deputy Director.

(c) A meeting of the Directors for the time being at which a quorum is present shall be competent to **4**4 exercise all or any of the authorities, powers, and discretions by or under the regulations of the Company, for the time being vested in or exercisable by the Directors generally. 44 (e) The seal of the Company shall not be affixed to any instrument except in the presence of two or more of the Directors, or of one Director and the Secretary or Secretaries who shall attest the sealing thereof; such attestation on the part of the Secretaries, in the event of a firm or registered Company being the Secretaries, being signified by a partner or duly authorized manager, director, secretary, attorney or agent of the said firm or Company signing for and on behalf of the said firm or Company as such Secretaries.

44 (f) A Director may at any time give notice in writing of his intention to resign by delivering such notice to the Agents and Secretaries of the Company, and on the acceptance of his resignation by the Directors, but not

(a) If he becomes bankrupt or insolvent, or suspends payment or files a petition for the liquidation of his affiairs, or compounds with his creditors.

(b) If by reason of mental or bodily infirmity he becomes incapable of acting.

(c) If he resigns his office under the provisions of regulation 44 (f).

No Director shall be disqualified from holding office by reason of entering into any contract with, or doing any work for the Company or by reason of his being a member of any corporation, company, or firm which has entered into any contract with, or done any work for the Company or by reason of his being agent, or secretary, or solicitor, or being a

· EVIDENCE.

91. On the trial or hearing of any action or suit brought or instituted by the Company against any Shareholder or his representatives to recover any debt or money claimed to be due to the Company in respect of his shares, it shall be sufficient to prove that the name of the defendant is or was, when the claim arose, on the Register of Shareholders of the Company as a holder of the number of shares in respect of which such claim is made, and that the amount claimed is not entered as paid in the books of the Company; and it shall not be necessary to prove the registration of the Company, nor the appointment of the Directors who made any call, nor that a quorum of Directors was present at the Board at which any call was made, nor that the meeting at which any call was made was duly convened or constituted, nor any other matter whatsoever, but the proof aforesaid shall be conclusive evidence of the debt.

PROVISIONS RELATIVE TO WINDING UP OR DISSOLUTION OF THE COMPANY.

If the Company shall be wound up whether voluntarily or otherwise, the liquidator or liquidators may with the sanction of a special resolution of the Company, divide among the contributories in specie any part of the assets of the Company, and may with the like sanction vest any part of the assets of the Company in trustees upon such trusts for the benefit of the contributories as the liquidator or liquidators with the like sanction shall think fit, and if thought expedient any such division may be otherwise than in accordance with the legal rights of the members of the Company and in particular any class may be given preferential or special rights or may be excluded altogether or in part and the liquidator or liquidators shall be entitled to sell all or any of the assets of the Company in consider-ation of or in exchange for shares, ordinary, fully paid, part paid or preference, in the purchasing company but in case any division otherwise than in accordance with the legal rights of the contributories shall be determined on or any sale made of any or all of the assets of the Company in exchange for shares in the purchasing company either ordinary fully paid or part paid or preference. ordinary, fully paid or part paid, or preference, any contributory who would be prejudiced thereby, shall have a right to dissent as if such determination were a special resolution passed pursuant to the section 192 of the Companies (Consolidation) Act of 1908 in England but for the purposes of an arbitration as in the sub-section 6 of the said section provided the provisions of the Ceylon Arbitration Ordinance, 1866 and of the Ceylon Ordinance No. 2 of 1889, shall apply in place of the English and Scotch Acts referred to in the said sub-section 6 of section 192 of the aforewritten Companies (Consolidation) Act, and the said section 192, save as herein excepted, shall be deemed to be part and parcel of these present Articles.
