VITAL STATISTICS

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended March 15, 1930.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 171 (6 Europeans, 12 Burghers, 95 Sinhalese, 26 Tamils, 25 Moors, 5 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1930, viz., 269,160) was 33·1, as against 41·8 in the preceding week, 32·7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32·5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 134 (1 European, 3 Burghers, 77 Sinhalese, 23 Tamils, 23 Moors, 4 Malays, and 3 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 26.0, as against 25.2 in the previous week, 26.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.9 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 134 total deaths, 24 were of infants under one year of age, as against 19 in the preceding week, 31 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 12.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Eighteen deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, Kotahena South, and New Bazaar and 1 each in Pettah, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta North, as against 15 in the previous week, and 22 the weekly average for last year.

- (b) Four deaths from Influenza were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, New Bazaar, and Maradana East, as against 5 in the previous week, and 9 the weekly average for last year.
- (c) Eight deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 2 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.
- 2. Eight deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, and Kotahena South, as against 13 in the previous week, and 11 the weekly average for last year.
- 3. Four deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 each in Kotahena North and Maradana East, as against 1 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.
- 4. Six deaths from Enteritis were registered, 4 from Diarrhoea, 3 each from Dysentery, Infantile Convulsions, Worms and Debility, 1 each from Tetanus, Homicide, Puerperal Septicaemia and Accidents, and 66 from Other Causes.
- 5. Reported Cases.—Twenty cases of Chichkenpox. 10 of Enteric Fever, and 4 of Measles were reported during the week, as against 31, 9, and nil, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81·2°, against 80·5° in the preceding week, and 79·5° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·910 in. against 29·880 in. in the preceding week and 29·907 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was nil, against 0·28 in in the preceding week, and 1·63 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

By-Laws.

1. In respect of every dog or bitch kept within the limits of the Urban District Council of Matale, the person having custody or possession of it shall pay an annual registration fee of Re. 1 50. For the purpose of this rule a year shall be computed from April 1 of one year to March 31 of the year following.

2. The occupier of every house within the town shall, before January 31 in each year, furnish to the person appointed by the Chairman of the Urban District Council to collect the registration fee (hereinafter called the Collector) particulars required in the annexed Form A in respect of each dog or bitch kept within such house or its premises.

3. A certificate of registration in the Form B shall be issued on payment of the prescribed fee to the aforesaid Collector or to the Secretary of the Urban District Council.

4. The Collector or Secretary (1) may refuse to issue a certificate of registration for any dog or bitch (a) which, in his opinion, is so diseased as to be a source of infection to other dogs, or (b) which, by reason of age, illness, or injury, is in his opinion unfit to live; or (2) the Collector or Secretary may issue such certificate subject to any conditions he may consider suitable. Any owner dissatisfied with such refusal or conditions may appeal to the Chairman of the Urban District Council, who may confirm, modify, or cancel the same.

5. Every certificate of registration shall have the following conditions printed on it, viz.:-

This certificate is liable to be cancelled by the Chairman of the Urban District Council, Matale—

- (a) Should the dog become so maimed or diseased as to be in the opinion of the Chairman unfit to live; or
- (b) Should the Chairman be satisfied that the dog is habitually ill-treated or neglected by its owner; or
- (c) Should the dog be permitted by its owner to associate with dogs belonging to others at a time when it is suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.
- 6. The person having the custody or possession of a dog or bitch in respect of which (a) a certificate is refused or (b) its certificate is cancelled because a condition attached thereto has not been complied with, shall, on being noticed to do so, produce the dog at the Urban District Council Office, at the time stated in the notice, and there deliver it to an officer of the Urban District Council authorized to take charge of it. Such dogs shall then be dealt with in the manner determined by the Chairman.

7. The by-laws made by the Local Board of Matale under the Dog Registration Ordinance, No. 25 of 1901, dated November 22, 1902 (Gazette No. 5,892 of November 28, 1902), are repealed.

14. No tender will be considered unless the procedure laid down above has been strictly complied with. The Conservator of Forests reserves to himself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and of accepting

any portion of a tender.

15. The special rules for felling, conversion, and removal, which the agreement will require to be observed are specified in the special conditions advertised below. Nothing in these special conditions shall render the purchaser in any way exempt from liability under the Forest Ordinance of 1907, should be be responsible for the commission of a forest offence outside the boundaries of his purchased coupe.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS.

(1) All trees to be felled within 1 ft. 6 in. of the ground.

(2) (a) The duration of the agreement shall be nine months from the date of the acceptance of the tender, as intimated by a letter from Divisional Forest Officer.

(b) On payment of the full purchase amount the purchaser will be entitled to fell and remove on or before the expiry date in the manner specified below, all firewood and timber contained in the purchased coupe. Any firewood not removed by the expiry date, shall ipso facto revert to the Crown.

(3) If the purchaser desires to pay by instalments payment of a first instalment of 40 per cent. of the full purchase price tendered shall entitle him to fell and remove one-third of the trees in the coupe. Payment of 70 per cent. of the full purchase price by means of a second instalment of 30 per cent. shall entitle the purchaser to fell and remove not more

than two-thirds of the total number of trees.

(4) The purchaser shall pay for the second instalment, or in all 70 per cent. of the full purchase price, within four months, and the third and the final instalment within seven months of the date of execution of the agreement. Should officer to cancel the agreement as from the date of such default. Any unremoved timber will revert to the Crown as from the date of such cancellation and the purchaser will forfeit all claims thereto.

(5) Should the purchaser fell or remove timber trees in excess of the quantity specified in special condition 2, nothing in the agreement shall exempt him from being liable for illicit felling and removal under the Forest Ordinance,

(6) The purchaser will be required to spread the branchwood evenly over the coupe immediately after conversion, so as to leave no bare patches liable to soil erosion.

(7) The purchaser shall either exercise such personal supervision as will ensure the conditions of this agreement being efficiently executed or employ an efficient supervisor.

(8) The purchaser or his agent or his workmen shall not damage any boundary pillars or calamander plants, or block up the boundaries by depositing any brushwood or branches. All lines so blocked must be recleared by the purchaser.

(9) A general removal permit will be issued by the Divisional Forest Officer authorizing the purchaser to remove the firewood standing in one-third of the trees according to the purchase amount paid, vide conditions 3 and 4 in such daily quantities as will be specified in cartnotes which must accompany each and every cart track in transit. The Forest Ranger or Forest Overseer or the Forest Guard will measure up the wood which is ready for removal twice a week between 9.30 A.M. and 3.30 P.M. and will issue the necessary cartnotes which shall accompany each and every cart in transit.

(10) The purchaser shall agree that, in the event of security money having become exhausted, it shall be within the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer either (a) to accept a further security deposit amounting to 10 per cent. of the full tendered purchase price, or (b) to cancel the agreement and to refund to the purchaser such balance of the paid uppurchase money, if any, as remains after deducting the value of firewood removed by the purchaser on the date of such cancellation. For the purpose of this clause the value of each removed cubic yard of firewood shall be reckoned at full royalty rates.

(11) The purchaser shall have the right of appeal to the Conservator of Forests in the event of the enforcement of any of the penalties specified in the conditions, and the purchaser shall agree to accept the Conservator's decision as

final and binding.

(12) In the case of services "A" and "E" the purchaser shall be required to cut all materials in the coupes in the coppice system by four distinct operations as follows:-

Operation 1.

All herbacious and undergrowth other than tree growth shall be cut out. This operation shall commence along the full length of one boundary of each coupe and proceed in a straight line to the opposite boundary of that coupe. The whole area of each coupe must thus be covered including those portions, if any, which contain no tree growth.

Operation 2.

All tree seedlings and saplings which are under one inch diameter shall be coppied out within two inches of the ground by means of sharp cattles or any other instrument authorized by the Divisional Forest Officer. shall commence from and proceed to the same boundaries and in the same alignments as operation 1. Not less than three days shall have elapsed between the execution of operation 1 and the commencement of operation 2 in any portion of the area, and there shall be an interval on the ground of not less than one chain between operations 1 and 2 except where the terminating boundary is reached.

Operation 3.

All saplings which are overlone inch in diameter and not exceeding eight inches diameter shall be felled within twelve inches of the ground, and on the day of felling the stools shall be coppied by means of sharp adzes cleanly and flush with the ground. This operation shall proceed from and to the same boundaries and with the same intervals in relation to operation 2, as the latter is required to proceed with in relation to operation 1.

Operation 4.

All trees over eight inches in diameter shall be felled within two inches of the ground, and within three days of felling all the stools which are between eight inches and fifteen inches diameter shall be coppied cleanly and to within one inch of the ground. This operation shall proceed from and to the same boundaries and with the same intervals in relation to operation 1.

Separate working parties shall be assigned to these four separate operations, and separate workmen shall be detailed to keep the coppicing tools invariably sharp. The purchaser shall either exercise such personal supervision as will ensure this work being executed efficiently, or employ an efficient supervisor.

(13) In services "A" and "E" if coppicing at any stage of the operations, after the work has commenced is not carried out rigidly as indicated above and is considered unsatisfactory by the Divisional Forest Officer he shall discontinue the issue of permits for removal of timber and firewood until the work is satisfactory: if the work continues to be unsatisfactory after two warnings the Divisional Forest Officer may at his sole discretion stop all felling and removal, cancel the agreement, and confiscate the security and all instalments paid up-to-date.

(14) In services "B," "C," "D," and "F" all brushwood and refuse shall be evenly spread over the ground by

the purchaser and completely burnt before the date of expiry.

Service " A "-Dikkele.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended March 22, 1930.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 164 (2 Europeans, 8 Burghers, 100 Sinhalese, 24 Tamils, 22 Moors, 5 Malays, and 3 Others). aths.—The total deaths registered were 146 (9 Burghers, 84 Sinhalese, 24 Tamils, 18 Moors, 4 Malays, and 7 The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 28.3, as against 26.0 in the previous week, 28.2 in the corresponding Deaths .week of last year, and 30.9 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths .- Of the 146 total deaths, 31 were of infants under one year of age, as against 24 in the preceding week, 32 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 19.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Seventeen deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 12 in Maradana hospitals (including 7 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Maradana North, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, and Maradana East, as against 18 in the previous week, and 22 the weekly average for last year.

- (b) Twelve deaths from Influenza were registered, 3 each in Kotahena South and New Bazaar, and 2 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, and Maradana North, as against 4 in the previous week, and 9 the weekly average for last year.

- (b) One death from Phthisis of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

- 4. One death from Suspected Plague of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.
- Six deaths from Enteritis were registered, 3 from Diarrhoea, 5 from Tetanus, 9 from Debility, 4 from Infantile Convulsions, 2 from Puerperal Septicaemia, and 1 each from Worms, Suicide, and Accidents, and 63 from Other Causes.
- 6. Reported Cases.—Five cases of Chickenpox, 3 of Enteric Fever, and 1 of Measles were reported during the week, as against 20, 10, and 4, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82·3°, against 81·2° in the preceding week, and 80·3° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·876 in., against 29·910 in. in the preceding week and 29·881 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.02 in., against nil in the preceding week, and 1.63 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

(b) The notice shall name a day (not being less than one month from the date of the notice) on, and a place or places at which such call or instalment and such interest and expenses aforesaid are to be paid, the notice shall also state that, in the event of non-payment at or before the time and at the place appointed the shares in respect of which the call was made or instalment is payable will be liable to be forfeited.

The Directors may in their discretion remit or annul the forfeiture of any share within six months from the date thereof upon the payment of moneys due to the Company from late holder or holders of such share or shares, and all expenses incurred in relation to such forfeiture, together with such further some of money, by way of redemption money for the deficit as they shall think fit, not being less than 9 per cent. per annum on the amount of sums wherein default in payment had been made, but no share bona fide sold, reallotted, or otherwise disposed of under Article 41 thereof, shall be

redeemable after sale or disposal.

The Company shall have a first charge or paramount lien upon all the shares of any holder or joint-holder for all moneys for the time being due to the Company by such holder, or by all or any of such joint-holders respectively, either in respect of such shares or of other shares held by such holder or joint-holder or otherwise, and whether due from any such holder individually or jointly with others including all calls, resolutions for which shall have been passed by the Directors, although the time appointed for the payment thereof shall not have arrived, and where any share is held by more persons than one, the Company shall be entitled to the said charge or lien in respect of any money due to the Company from any of such persons. The Directors may decline to register any transfer of shares subject to such charge or lien.

46. Such charge or lien may be made available by a sale of all or any of the shares subject to it, provided that no such sale shall be made except under a resolution of the Directors, and until notice in writing shall have been given to the indebted Shareholder or his executors or administrators, or the assignee or trustee in his bankruptcy, requiring him or them to pay the amount for the time being due to the Company, and default shall have been made for twenty-eight days from such notice in paying the sum thereby required to be paid. Should the Shareholder over whose share the lien exists be in England or elsewhere abroad, sixty days' notice shall be allowed to him.

47. The nett proceeds of any such sale as aforesaid under the provisions of Articles 41 and 46 hereof shall be applied in or towards the satisfaction of such debts, liabilities, or engagements, and the residue (if any) shall be paid to

such Shareholder or his representatives.

A certificate in writing under the hands of two of the Directors and of the Secretary or Secretaries that the power of sale given by clause 46 has arisen, and is exercisable by the Company under these presents, shall be conclusive evidence of facts therein stated.

48. Upon any sale after forfeiture or for enforcing a lien in purported exercise of the powers herein given, the Board may cause the purchaser's name to be entered in the register in respect of the shares sold, and the purchaser shall not be bound to see to the regularity of the proceedings, or to the application of the purchase money, and after his name has been entered in the register in respect of such shares, the validity of the sale shall not be impeached by any person, and the remedy of any person aggrieved by the sale shall in damages only and against the Company exclusively.

PREFERENCE SHARES.

49. Any shares from time to time to be issued or created may from time to time be issued with any such right of preference, whether in respect of dividend or of payment of capital or both, or any such other special privilege or advantage over any shares previously issued, or then about to be issued (other than shares issued with a preference), or with such deferred rights as compared with any shares previously issued or then about to be issued, or subject to any such conditions or provisions, and with any such right or without any right of voting, and generally on such terms as the Company may, from time to time by special resolution, determine.

If at any time by the issue of preference shares or otherwise the capital is divided into shares of different

classes-

(1) The holders of any class of shares by an extraordinary resolution passed at a meeting of such holders may consent, on behalf of all the holders of shares of the class, to the issue or creation of any shares ranking equally therewith, or having any priority thereto, or to the abandonment of any preference or priority or any accrued dividend, or the reduction for any time or permanently of the dividends payable theron,

or to any scheme for the reduction of the Company's capital affecting the class of shares.

(2) All or any of the rights, privileges, and conditions attached to each class may be commuted, abrogated, abandoned, added to, or otherwise modified by a special resolution of the Company in General Meeting, provided the holders of any class of shares, affected by any such commutation, abrogation, abandonment, addition, or other modifications of such rights, privileges, and conditions, consent thereto, on behalf of all the holders of shares of the class, by an extraordinary resolution passed at a meeting of such holders.

Any extraordinary resolution passed under the provisions of this article shall be binding upon all the holders of shares of the class, provided that this article shall not be read as implying the necessity for such consent as aforesaid

in any case in which but for this article the object of the resolutions could have been affected without it.

52. Any meeting for the purpose of the last preceding clause shall be convened and conducted in all respects as nearly as possible in the same way as an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company, provided that no Shareholder, not being a Director, shall be entitled to notice thereof or to attend thereat, unless he be a holder of shares of the class intended to be affected by the resolution, and that no vote shall be given except in respect of a share, of that class, and that at any such meeting a poll may be demanded in writing by any Shareholder presonally present and entitled to vote at a meeting.

CALLS.

53. (a) The Directors may from time to time make such calls as they think fit upon the registered holders of shares, in respect of moneys unpaid thereon, and not by the conditions of allotment made payable at fixed times, and each Shareholder shall pay the amount of every call so made on him to the persons and at the times and places appointed by the Directors, provided that two months' notice at least shall be given to the Shareholders of the time and place appointed for payment of such call.

(b) A call shall be deemed to have been made at the time when the resolution authorizing the call was passed at

a Board Meeting of Directors or by resolution in writing in terms of Article 119.

(c) The Directors shall have power in their absolute discretion to give time to any one or more Shareholder or (c) The Directors shall have power in their absolute discretion to give time to any one or more shareholder or Shareholders, exclusive of the others, for payment of any call or part thereof on such terms as the Directors may determine. But no Shareholder shall be entitled to any such extension except as a matter of grace or favour.

54. Any sum or premium which by the terms of allotment of a share is made payable upon allotment or at any

fixed date, and any instalment of a call or premium shall, for all purpose of these presents, be deemed to be a call duly made and payable on the date fixed for payment, and in case of non-payment the provisions of these presents as to paymade and payable on the date incertor payable, and the like, and all other relevant provisions of these presents as to payment of interest and expenses, forfeiture, and the like, and all other relevant provisions of these presents shall apply as if such sum, premium, or instalment were a call duly made and notified as hereto provided.

55. If the sum payable in respect of any call or instalment is not paid on or before the day appointed for the payment thereof, the holder for the time being of the share in respect of which the call shall have been made, or the instalment shall have been due, shall pay interest for the same at the rate of 9 per cent. per annum from the day appointed for the payment thereof to the time of actual payment but the Directors may, when they think fit, remit altogether or in part any sum becoming payable for interest under this clause.

The Directors may at their discretion receive from any Shareholder willing to advance the same, and upon

such terms as they think fit, all or any part of the amount of his shares beyond the sum actually called up.

MEETINGS.

57. The First General Meeting of the Company shall be held at such time, not being more than twelve months after the registration of the Company, and at such place as the Directors may determine.

58. Subsequent General Meetings shall be held once in every year at such time and place as may be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting and if no time or place is prescribed, at such time and place as may be determined by the Directors.

59. The General Meetings mentioned in the two last preceding clauses shall be called Ordinary General Meetings, all other meetings of the Company shall be called Extraordinary General Meetings.

60. Any General Meeting convened by the Board, unless the time thereof shall have been fixed by General Meeting, or unless such General Meeting be convened in pursuance of such requisition as is hereinafter mentioned, may be post-poned by the Board by notice in writing, and the meeting shall, subject to any further postponement or adjournment, be held at the postponed date for the purpose of transacting the business convened by the original notice.

61. The Directors may, whenever they think fit, call an Extraordinary General Meeting, and the Directors shall do so upon a requisition made in writing by not less than one seventh of the number of Shareholders holding not less than

one-seventh of the issued capital and entitled to vote.

62. Any requisition so made shall express the object of the meeting proposed to be called, shall be addressed to the Directors and shall be sent to the registered office of the Company, and may consist of several documents in like form, each signed by one or more of the requisitionists. Upon the receipt of such requisition the Directors shall forthwith proceed to convene an Extraordinary General Meeting, to be held at such time and place as they shall determine. If they do not proceed to convene the same within twenty-one days from the delivery of the requisition, the requisitionists may themselves convene an Extraordinary General Meeting to be held at such place and at such time as the Shareholders convening the Meeting may themselves fix.

If at any such meeting a resolution requiring confirmation at another meeting is passed, the Board shall forthwith convene a further Extraordinary General Meeting for the purpose of considering the resolution, and if thought fit of confirming it as a special resolution, and if the Board do not convene the meeting within seven days from the date of passing of

the first resolution, the requisitionists or a majority of them in value may themselves convene the meeting.

64. Any meeting convened by requisitionists as aforesaid shall be convened in the same manner, as nearly as

possible, as that in which meetings are convened by the Board.

65. Any holder of an ordinary share may, on giving not less than ten days' previous notice of any resolution, submit the same to a meeting. Such notice shall be given by leaving a copy of the resolution at the registered office of the

Company.

66. Seven days' notice specifying the time and place of a meeting, and specifying also in the case of any special business, the general nature of the business to be transacted thereat, shall be given by the Secretary, or other officer of the Company or any other person appointed by the Board to do so, to such members as are entitled to receive notices from the Company, provided that with the consent in writing of all the holders of ordinary shares a meeting may be convened by a shorter notice and in any manner they think fit. Where it is proposed to pass a special resolution the two meetings may be convened by one and the same notice, and it is to be no objection to such notice that it only convenes the second meeting contingently on the resolution being passed by the requisite majority at the first meeting.

67. The accidental omission to give notice of any meeting to, or the non-receipt of such notice by, any member

shall not invalidate any resolution passed or proceeding had at any such meeting.
68. Every Ordinary General Meeting shall be competent, without special notice having been given of the purposes for which it is convened, or of the business to be transacted thereat to receive and discuss any report and any accounts presented thereto by the Directors and to pass resolutions in approval or disapproval thereof, and to declare dividends, and to elect Directors and Auditors retiring in rotation, and to fix the remuneration of the Auditors, and shall also be competent to enter upon, discuss, and transact any business whatever, of which special mention shall have been made in the notice or notices upon which the meeting was convened.

69. With the exceptions mentioned in the foregoing articles as to the business which may be transacted at Ordinary

General Meetings without notice, no General Meeting, Ordinary or Extraordinary, shall be competent to enter upon, discuss, or transact any business which has not been especially mentioned in the notice or notices upon which it was

convened.

No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting except the declaration of a dividend recommended by a report of the Directors of the election of a Chairman, unless there shall be present in person at the commencement of the business two or more persons being Shareholders entitled to vote or persons holding proxies or powers of attorney from Shareholders entitled to vote.

71. If at the expiration of half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting the required number of persons shall not be present at the meeting, the meeting, if convened by or upon the requisition of Shareholders, shall be dissolved, but in any other case it shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week at the same time and place, and if at such adjourned meeting a quorum is not present, those Shareholders who are present, shall be a quorum, and may transact the

business for which the meeting was called.

72. The Chairman (if any) of the Directors shall be entitled to take the chair at every General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary, but if there be no Chairman, or if at any meeting he shall not be present within 15 minutes after the time appointed for holding such meeting, or if he shall refuse to take the chair, or shall retire from the chair, the Share-holders shall choose another Director as Chairman, and if no Directors be present, or if all the Directorspresent decline to take the chair then the Shareholders present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman.

73. No business shall be discussed at any General Meeting except the election of a Chairman whilst the chair is

vacant. The Chairman, with the consent of the meeting, may adjourn any meeting from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place, unless due notice shall be given.

75. Minutes of the proceedings of every General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary, shall be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose, and shall when so entered be signed as soon as practicable by the Chairman of the same meeting, or by the Chairman of the succeeding meeting, and the same when so entered and signed shall be evidence of all such proceedings and of the proper election of the Chairman.

VOTING AT MEETINGS.

At any meeting every resolution shall be decided by the votes of the Shareholders present. In case there shall be an equality of votes, the Chairman at such meeting shall be entitled to give a casting vote in addition to the votes which he may be entitled as a Shareholder and proxy and attorney, and unless a poll be immediately demanded in writing by some Shareholders present at the meeting and entitled to vote, a declaration by the Chairman that a resolution had been carried, and an entry to that effect in the minute book of the Company, shall be sufficient evidence of the fact without proof of the number of votes recorded in favour of or against such resolution.

If a poll be duly demanded the same shall be taken in such manner and at such time and place as the Chairman shall direct, and the result of the poll shall be deeffied to be the resolution of the meeting at which the poll was demanded. The demand of a poll shall not prevent the continuance of a meeting for the transaction of any business other than the

question on which a poll has been demanded.

78. If at any meeting a poll be demanded by notice in writing signed by some Shareholder present at the meeting and entitled to vote, which notice shall be delivered during the meeting to the Chairman, the meeting shall if necessary be adjourned, and the poll shall be taken at such time and in such manner the Chairman shall direct, and in such case every Shareholder shall have the number of votes to which he may be entitled as hereinafter provided and in case at any such poll there shall be an equality of votes, the Chairman of the meeting at which such poll shall have been demanded shall be entitled to a casting vote in addition to any votes to which he may be entitled as a Shareholder and proxy and attorney, and the result of such poll be deemed to be the resolution of the Company in such meeting.

No poll shall be demanded on the election of a Chairman of the meeting or on any question of adjournment. On a show of hands every holder of an ordinary share or ordinary shares present in person shall have one vote only. In case of a poll every holder of an Ordinary share or ordinary shares present in person or by proxy or attorney shall have one vote for every ordinary share held by him. Preference Shareholders shall not be entitled to be present at or to vote at any meeting of the Company. When voting on a resolution involving the winding-up of the Company every Shareholder shall have one vote for every share held by him, but no such resolution shall be deemed to be carried unless passed by three-fourths in number and value of such Shareholders of the Company for the time being entitled to vote as may be present in person or by proxy or by attorney at any meeting, of which notice specifying the intention to propose such resolution has been duly given.

The parent or curator of a minor Shareholder, the committee or other legal guardian of any lunatic Shareholder. the husband of any female Shareholder not entitled to her share as separate estate, and the executor or administrator of any deceased Shareholder, or any one of such persons, as aforesaid, if more than one, shall not be entitled to vote in the place of such minor, lunatic, female, or deceased person, unless such person shall have been registered as a Shareholder.

Votes may be given either personally or by proxy or by attorney duly authorized.

No person shall be appointed a proxy who is not a holder of an ordinary share of the Company, but the attorney. of a holder of an ordinary share, even though not himself a Shareholder of the Company, may represent and vote for

his principal at any meeting of the Company.

84. No Shareholder shall be entitled to vote or speak at any General Meeting unless all calls due from him on his shares or any of them, shall have been paid, and no Shareholder other than the trustee or assignee of a bankrupt or representative of a deceased Shareholder or person acquiring by marriage, shall be entitled to vote or speak at any meeting held after the expiration of three months from the registration of the Company, in respect of or as the holder of any share which he has acquired by transfer, unless he has been at least three months previously to the time of holding the meeting at which he proposes to vote or speak, duly registered as the holder of the share in respect of which he claims to vote or speak.

85. The instrument appointing a proxy shall be printed or written, and shall be signed by the appointer or his attorney or if such appointer be a corporation, shall be under the common seal of such corporation.

86. The instrument appointing a proxy with the letter or power of attorney under which it may be signed shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than twenty-four hours before the time appointed for holding the meeting at which the person named in such instrument proposes to vote. No instrument appointing a proxy shall be valid after the expiration of twelve months from the date of its execution.

Every instrument appointing a proxy shall, as nearly as circumstances admit, be in the form or to the

effect following:

No objection shall be made to the validity of any vote (whether given personally or by proxy or by attorney) except at the meeting or poll at which such vote shall be tendered and every vote (whether given personally or by proxy or by attorney) to which no objection shall be made at such meeting or poll shall be deemed valid for all purposes of such meeting or poll whatsoever.

No Shareholder shall be prevented from voting by reason of his being personally interested in the result of

the voting.

DIRECTORS.

Until otherwise determined by a General Meeting, the number of Directors shall not be less than two or more 89. than four.

Reginald Abraham de Mel, John Alfred Fernando, and Andrew Hilarian Fernando shall be the first Directors 90. of the Company.

The qualifications of a Director shall be the holding in his own right alone of shares of the Company of any 91. class to a nominal value of Rs. 250.

The remuneration of Directors shall be fixed from time to time by the Company in General Meeting.

- 93. Any casual vacancy occurring among the Directors, may be filled up by the continuing Directors, but any person so chosen shall retain his office so long only as the vacating Director would have retained the same if no vacancy had occurred. The continuing Directors may act notwithstanding any vacancy in their body, but so that if the number falls below the minimum above fixed the remaining Director shall not commit the Company to any new business so long as the number is below the minimum.
 - The Office of a Director shall be vacated-

(a) If he becomes bankrupt, or suspend payment, or compound with his creditors.

- (b) If he engages on his own account in speculative transactions in produce, stocks, or shares without the previous consent of all the other Directors.
- (c) If he absents himself from the meetings of the Company for a period exceeding three months at any one

(d) If he be found lunatic or become of unsound mind.

If he be called upon by all the other Directors to resign his office.

(f) If by notice in writing to the Company he resigns his office.

A Director or intending Director shall not be disqualified by his office from entering into a contract or arrange-95. A Director or incenting Director shall not be disquantied by insolnee from entering into a contract or arrangement with the Company, either as vendor, purchaser, manager, agent, broker, or otherwise, and no such contract or arrangement or any contract or arrangement entered into by, or on behalf of the Company with any person, firm, or company of or in which any Director shall be in any way interested shall be avoided, nor shall any Director so contracting or being so interested be liable to account to the Company for any profit realized by any such contract or arrangement

by reason of such Director holding the office of Director, or of the fiduciary relation thereby established. Any Director so contracting or being so interested as aforesaid shall disclose at the Board Meeting at which the contract or arrangement is determined upon the nature of his interest, if his interest then exists, or in any other case at the first Board Meeting after the acquisition of his interest, and a Director shall not as a Director vote in respect of any contract or arrangement in which he is so interested as aforesaid, and if he do so vote his vote shall not be counted, but this prohibition shall not apply to the purchase and acquisition referred to in Article 3 of these presents, or to any other agreements in connection therewith or to any modification thereof, or to any matters arising thereout, or to any contract by or on behalf of the Company to give to the Directors or any of them security by way of indemnity or of security for advances or to a settlement company to give to the Directors or any of them security by way of indefinity or of security for advances of to a sectional or set off of cross claims, and it may at any times be suspended or relaxed by a General Meeting. A general notice that a Director is a member of any specified firm or company, and is to be regarded as interested in any transaction with such firm or company shall be sufficient disclosure under this Article, and after such general notice it shall not be necessary to give any special notice relating to any particular transaction with such firm or company as aforesaid.

POWERS OF THE BOARD.

96. Subject to any agreement to the contrary, the business of the Company shall be managed by the Board, who may exercise all such powers of the Company, and do on behalf of the Company all such acts as are within the scope of the Memorandum and Articles of Association of the Company, and as are not by the Ordinance or by these presents required to be exercised or done by the Company in General Meeting subject nevertheless to regulations of these presents to the provisions of the Ordinances and to such regulations, being not inconsistent with the said regulations as may be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting, but no regulations made by the Company in General Meeting shall invalidate any prior act of the Board which would have been valid if such regulation had not been made.

LOCAL MANAGEMENT.

97. The Board may from time to time provide for the management of the affairs of the Company in Ceylon or abroad in such manner as they shall think fit, and the provisions contained in the eight next following articles shall be without prejudice to the general powers conferred by this article.

98. The Board, from time to time, and at any time, may establish any local boards or agencies for managing any

of the affairs of the Company in Ceylon or abroad, and may appoint any person to be members of such local boards or

any managers or agents and may fix their remuneration.

99. The Board may appoint any one of their number, or any other person, to be Chairman of any local board, and may lay down such rules and regulations as they may think fit for the conduct of the business of any local appointment,

rules or regulations.

100. The Board, from time to time, and at any time, may delegate to any Managing Director, local board manager or agent any of the powers, authorities, and discretions, for the time being vested in the Board with regard to the conduct of the business of the Company (other than the powers to make calls and to mortgage the Company's assets), with power to sub-delegate and may authorize the members for the time being of any such local board, or any of them to fill up any vacancies therein and to act notwithstanding vacancies.

101. Any such appointment or delegation as aforesaid may be made on such terms and subject to such conditions as the Board may think fit, and the Board may at any time remove any person so appointed and may by letter; telegram, or cablegram, or annul or vary any such delegation, but no person dealing in good faith and without notice of such annul-

ment or variation shall be affected thereby.

102. The Board may, from time to time, and at any time, by power of attorney under the seal, appoint any person or persons to be the attorney or attorneys of the Company for such purposes and with such powers, authorities, and discretions, and for such period and subject to conditions as the Board may from time to time think fit, and any such appointment may (if the Board think fit) be made in favour of any of the Directors or of the members or any one or more of the members of any local board established as aforesaid, or in favour of any Company or of the members, directors, nominees, or managers of any company or firm, or otherwise in favour of any fluctuating body of persons, whether nominated directly or indirectly by the Board, and any such powers of attorney may contain such provisions for the protection or convenience of persons dealing with such attorneys as the Board think fit. Any such attorneys as aforesaid may be authorized by the Board, sub-delegate all or any of the powers, authorities, and discretions for the time being vested in them.

vested in them.

103. It shall be lawful for the Directors, if authorized so to do by the Shareholders in General Meeting, to arrange terms for the amalgamation of the Company with any other company or individual or individuals, or for the sale or disposal of the business, estate, and effects of the Company or any part thereof respectively to any company or person upon such terms and in such manner as the Directors shall think fit, and the Directors shall have power to do all such things as may be necessary for carrying such amalgamation, sale, or other disposition into effect so far as the resolution or special resolution of the Company is not by law necessary for such purpose, and in case any terms so arranged by the Directors include or

make necessary the dissolution of the Company, the Company shall thereupon be dissolved.

104. The Directors shall exercise in the name and on behalf of the Company all such powers of the Company as

are not expressly required to be exercised by the Company in General Meeting.

BORROWING.

105. The Board may at any time borrow, issue, or raise for the purpose of the Company from the Directors, members, or other persons, or any bank, firm, or company, such sums of money, and at such rates of interest as the Board may think proper, and may secure the payment of such moneys by mortgages or charge, or by debentures, debenture stock, perpetual, or otherwise, forming a charge upon the whole or any part of the property, assets, and undertaking of the Company, both present and future, including its uncalled capital for the time being, in such manner, and upon such terms and conditions and with such security as the Board shall determine, but so that the amount at any one time owing in respect of moneys so raised, horrowed, or secured chall not exceed the sum of Paymers 100 000 and shall at arithmet. in respect of moneys so raised, borrowed, or secured, shall not exceed the sum of Rupees 100,000 and shall not without the sanction of a General Meeting exceed the nominal amount of the capital. Nevertheless no lender or other person dealing with the Company shall be concerned to see or inquire whether this limit is observed.

ROTATION OF DIRECTORS.

106. At the Ordinary General Meeting in the year 1931 and in such subsequent year, one Director shall retire

from office, but this provision shall be subject to any agreement to the contrary binding upon the Company. A retiring Director shall retain office until the dissolution or adjournment of the meeting at which his successor is elected.

107. The Director to retire in every year shall be the Director who has been longest in office since their last election. As between Directors of equal seniority, the Directors to retire shall (unless such Directors of equal seniority shall agree amongst themselves) be selected from among them by lot.

108. A retiring Director shall be eligible for re-election.

109. The Company may at the meeting at which any Director retires in manner aforesaid fill up the vacated office of each Director by electing a person thereto. And if at any such meeting the place of a retiring Director is not filled up, the retiring Director shall be deemed to have been re-elected, unless a resolution reducing the number of Directors is passed at the same meeting.

110. No person not being a Director retiring at the meeting shall, unless recommended by the Board for election, be eligible for the office of a Director at any General Meeting.

111. The Company may from time to time in General Meeting increase or reduce the number of Directors, and may alter their qualification and may also determine in what rotation such increased or reduced number shall go out of office.

The Company by an extraordinary resolution may remove any Director, before the expiration of his period of office, and may by ordinary resolution appoint another person to be a Director in his stead. The person so appointed shall retain his office so long only as the Director in whose place he is appointed would have held the same if he had not been removed.

MANAGING DIRECTOR.

113. Subject to any agreement to the contrary the Board may from time to time appoint one or more of their number to be a Managing Director or Managing Directors of the Company, either for a fixed term or without any limitation as to his or their period of office, and may, from time to time, remove any Managing Director and appoint another in his

A Managing Director, while he continues to hold that office, shall not be subject to the provisions of these presents as to retirement by rotation, and shall not be taken into account in determining the rotation of retirement of Directors, but he shall (subject to the provisions of any contract between him and the Company) be subject to the same provisions as to resignation and removal as the other Directors of the Company, and if he ceases to hold office of Director

from any cause he shall ipso facto and immediately cease to be a Managing Director.

115. Subject to any agreement the remuneration of a Managing Director shall from time to time be fixed by the Board, and may be by way of salary or commission or participation in the profits, or by any of all these modes, and shall if so determined by the Board, be in addition to his share of any remuneration payable to the Board or to the Managing Director as one of the Board.

116. A Managing Director may perform such duties and exercise all such powers, authorities, and discretions as are exercisable by the Board (other than the power to make calls and to mortgage the assets of the Company) on such

terms and conditions and with such restrictions (if any) as the Board from time to time may direct.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD.

117. The Board may meet together for the despatch of business at such place and adjourn and otherwise regulate their meetings as they think fit. A Director may at any time, and the Secretary upon request of a Director, shall convene a meeting of the Board. Questions arising at any meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes. In case of an equality of votes the Chairman shall have an additional or casting vote in addition to his vote or votes as a Director. Two Directors shall form a quorum.

Any question which may arise at any meeting of the Board shall be decided by the votes of the Directors 118.

119. A resolution in writing signed by all the Directors shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Directors duly called and constituted.

120. The Board may delegate any of their powers to committees consisting of such member or members of their body as they think fit. Any committee so formed shall, in the exercise of the powers so delegated, conform to any regulations that may from time to time be imposed on it by the Board.

121. The meetings and proceedings of any such committee consisting of two or more members shall be governed by the provisions herein contained for the regulating of meetings and proceedings of the Board so far as the same are

applicable thereto and not superseded by any regulations made by the Board under the last preceding clause.

122. All acts done at any meeting of the Board, or of a Committee of the Board, or by any other person acting as a Director shall notwithstanding that it shall afterwards be discovered that there was some defect in the appointment of such Directors or committee or persons acting as aforesaid, or that they, he, or any of them were or was disqualified, be as valid as if every such person had been duly appointed and was qualified to be a Director.

123. THE SEAL.

124. DIVIDENDS.

125. Subject as aforesaid and to the rights of holders of shares issued upon special conditions, and to any arrangement that may be made by the Company to the contrary, and subject as to shares not fully paid up to any special arrangement made as regards money paid in advance of calls, the profits of the Company shall be divisible among the members in proportion to the capital paid up or credited as paid on the shares held by them respectively.

126. The Company in General Meeting may declare a dividend to be paid to the members according to their rights.

140. EVIDENCE.

160. On the trial or hearing of any action or suit brought or instituted by the Company against any Shareholder or his representatives to recover any debt or money claimed to be due to the Company in respect of his shares, it shall be sufficient to prove that the name of the defendant is, or was when the claim arose, on the register of Shareholders of the Company as a holder of the number of shares in respect of which such claim is made, and that the amount claimed is not entered as paid in the books of the Company, and it shall not be necessary to prove the registrations of the Company nor the appointment of the Directors who made any call, nor that a quorum of Directors was present at the Board at which any call was made was duly convened or constituted nor any other matter whatsoever but the proof aforesaid shall be conclusive evidence of the debt.

WINDING UP.

161. (1) If the Company shall be wound up, whether voluntarily or otherwise, the Liquidator may, with the sanction of an Extraordinary resolution, divide among the contributories in specie any part of the assets of the Company, and may with like sanction vest any part of the assets of the Company in trustees upon such trust for the benefit of the contributories

(2) If thought expedient any such division may be otherwise than in accordance with the legal rights of the contributories (except where unalterably fixed by the Memorandum of Association) and in particular any class may be given preferential or special rights, or may be excluded altogether or in part, but in default of any such provisions the assets shall, subject to the rights of the holders of shares issued with special rights or privileges or on special conditions be distributed rateably according to the amount paid or credited as paid up on the shares, but in case any division otherwise than in accordance with the legal rights of the contributories shall be determined on any contributory who would be prejudiced thereby shall have a right to dissent and anciliary rights as if such determination were a special resolution. resolution.

EDUCATION DEPARTMENT, CEYLON.

Regulations for English Teachers' Certificate Examination, 1931.

-This examination will be held in Colombo and Jaffna commencing on August 31, 1931. Time and Place.-

Eligibility.—Candidates must be registered provisionally certificated teachers or be eligible to be registered as such.

3. (a) Exemptions and Concessions.—Registered teachers who have passed the Intermediate Arts or Science Examination of London University will be exempted from Part II. of the examination, and will on passing Part I. be awarded a Second Class Certificate.

(b) Registered teachers who hold the old Third Class English Teachers' Certificate will be allowed the following

concessions:

- (i.) If they had before June 1, 1925, taught continuously for ten years in recognized English Schools after obtaining the Third Class Certificate, they will be exempted from Part II. and on passing Part I. will be awarded a Second Class Certificate.
- (ii.) If they had before June 1, 1925, taught continuously for five years in recognized English Schools after obtaining the Third Class Certificate, they will be exempted from Part II., Group II., and on passing in the other subjects will be awarded a Second Class Certificate.
- (iii.) If they had before June 1, 1925, taught satisfactorily in recognized English Schools for three years after obtaining the Certificate, they will, on passing this examination be awarded a Second Class Certificate.
- (c) Candidates who have passed the examination for Teachers' Certificate in Drawing will be exempted from drawing at this examination.

4. Applications.—Applications, on forms provided for the purpose, bearing stamps to the value of Rs. 15 for the whole examination or Rs. 10 for one part, duly cancelled, must reach the Education Office on or before June 1.

5. Late Applications.—Late applications will be received up to June 15, provided stamps of the value of Rs. 20 for the whole examination or Rs. 15 for one part are affixed to the applications.

6. Refunds.—If a candidate is rejected owing to his not satisfying the conditions for admission, a refund will be

made of four-fifths the value of the stamps affixed to his entry.

7. (a) Withdrawals.—Except in cases referred to in paragraph 6, no refund will be made; but if notice of a candidate's withdrawal is received in this office by June 15, a voucher will be issued. This voucher will entitle the candidate to enter once more for the same examination without fee, provided the examination is held within a year and the regulations are complied with in other respects.

- 3. A screw threaded male member and a screw threaded female member adapted to be concentrically assembled, the bottom and/or top of the screw threaded hale member forming a supporting and jamming and/or wedging surface and the bottom and/or top of the screw threaded male member being formed with a recess, at that part of the bottom of the screw thread nearest the axis of the male member and the screw threaded female member, the top and or bottom of which serves as a supporting and jamming and or wedging surface having the bottom of the thread formed with a recess at that part of the bottom of the thread furthest from the axis of the screw threaded female member.
- 4. A screw threaded male member substantially as hereinbefore described in connection with the accompanying drawing.
- 5. A screw threaded female member substantially as hereinbefore described in connection with the accompanying drawing.
