WHEREAS by a Proclamation bearing date the Sixth day of September, 1873, this Island of Ceylon was divided for revenue and administrative purposes into seven Provinces including among others the Northern Province :

And whereas by subsequent Proclamations dated the First day of November, 1898, and Sixteenth day of August, 1906, two of the districts comprised in the said Northern Province, namely, Mullaitivu and Jaffna, were altered and redefined for revenue and administrative purposes :

And whereas it is expedient further to alter and redefine the said districts for the said purposes :

Now know Ye that We, the Officer Administering the Government, do hereby proclaim and appoint that from and after the 8th day of May, 1930, the village of Puttuvedduvanmanatkulam within the jurisdiction of the Police Vidan of Olumadu (division No. 226) in the Udaiyar's division of Karunavalpattu South in the Chief Headman's division of Vavuniya North in the District of Mullaitivu shall form part of the Police Vidane's division of Tunukkai (division No. 169) in the Udaiyar's division of Tunukkai in the Chief Headman's division of Punakari-Tunukkai of the Revenue District of Jaffna, for revenue and administrative purposes.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. No person shall stand or loiter in any street, after having been ordered to move on by a police officer on duty. The penalty for the contravention of this by-law shall be a fine not exceeding ten rupees.

2. Every person who drives or draws when it is disengaged, or when he is not carrying a fare, a vehicle licensed to ply for hire shall keep to the extreme left hand edge of the street. The penalty for the contravention of this by-law shall be a fine not exceeding twenty rupees.

BY-LAW.

By-law No. 2 of Chapter IX. of the by-laws made by the Sanitary Board of the Province of Uva, dated December 9, 1922 (*Gazette* No. 7,314 of March 2, 1923), is repealed and the following is substituted therefor:—

2. It shall not be lawful for any person to erect, re-erect, or add to any hut or house within the limits of any Sanitary Board town except under the following conditions:—

The following clear air space shall be left around any hut or house which is erected or re-erected, or around any hut or house which is added to with respect to such addition, and no portion of the walls of such building and not more than 2 ft. 6 in. of the projecting eaves of such building shall come within such space:—

- (1) On the side of any road or street 25 ft. to the centre of such road or street.
- (2) Behind such space up to 50 ft. to any other hut or house except a kitchen, bathing place, or latrine, as the Chairman may require, of which prescribed space at least half shall be land belonging to the same owner as the land upon which the house stands which is erected, re-erected, or added to.
- (3) To the side such space up to 15 ft. to the nearest building as the Chairman may require, of which prescribed space at least half shall be land belonging to the same owner as the land upon which the house stands which is erected, re-erected, or added to. Provided that where this requirement reduces the whole buildable frontage of any owner to less than 15 ft., it shall not apply to a building that is re-erected unless the Board makes compensation to the owner of the building for any damage he sustains by reason of its application. And provided further, that the Chairman may, in his discretion, relax the operation of this rule in any special case, but he shall not do so unless he is satisfied that (1) no detriment is caused thereby to the sanitary condition or amenities of the house or hut to be erected, re-erected, or added to or any other neighbouring house or hut used or intended to be used as a human dwelling place, and (2) that the future alignment, widening, or development of any road or street, or the convenience of the public using such road or street will not be interfered with by such relaxation of the rule. Provided further, that the Chairman may allow the erection of a kitchen, bathing place, or latrine upon the portion thus reserved for air space on the side of any house furthest from the road or street in such place as the Chairman shall approve.

Provided further, that where a conservancy lane shall have been provided or laid out, or projected by the Board, such latrine shall adjoin such lane or projected lane.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended May 3, 1930.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 140 (15 Burghers, 78 Sinhalese, 19 Tamils, 18 Moors, 7 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1930, viz., 269,160) was 27.1, as against 43.2 in the preceding week, 35.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 137 (1 European, 5 Burghers, 79 Sinhalese, 26 Tamils, 15 Moors, 5 Malays, and 6 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 26.5, as against 24.0 in the previous week, 24.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.9 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 137 total deaths, 26 were of infants under one year of age, as against 28 in the preceding week, 23 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 16.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 12 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 in St. Paul's, and 1 each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Maradana East, Wellawatta North, and Wellawatta South, as against 8 in the previous week and 22 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Ten deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 each in St. Paul's and Kotahena South, and 1 each in Pettah, San Sebastian, New Bazaar, Maradana hospitals (of a non-resident), Maradana East, and Slave Island, as against 7 in the previous week and 9 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 in Kotahena South, as against 2 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. Four deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (of non-residents), and 1 in Maradana South, as against 8 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

3. (a) Five deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered; 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), and 1 in Maradana North, as against 7 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Enteric fever* of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.

4. Seven deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 7 from *Debility*, 6 from *Puerperal Septicaemia*, 4 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 3 from *Worms*, 2 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Accidents*, 1 each from *Dysentery* and *Tetanus*, and 62 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Twenty-seven cases of *Measles*, 15 of *Chickenpox*, and 6 of *Enteric Fever* were reported during the week, as against 13, 38, and 10, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82.0°, against 81.8° in the preceding week and 80.6° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.813 in., against 29.831 in. in the preceding week and 29.825 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 11.16 in., against 2.33 in. in the preceding week and 9.94 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

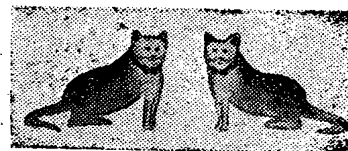
