# VITAL STATISTICS.

# Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended June 7, 1930.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 148 (10 Burghers, 80 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 19 Moors, 8 Malays, and 6 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1930, viz., 269,160) was 28·7, as against 26·5 in the preceding week, 31·7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32·5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 115 (1 European, 3 Burghers, 63 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 15 Moors, 4 Malays, and 4 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 22 3, as against 26 3 in the previous week, 30 6 in the

corresponding week of last year, and 30.9 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 115 total deaths, 24 were of infants under one year of age, as against 27 in the preceding

30 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 9.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Nine deaths from Pneumonth were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident) and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, Maradana North, Maradana East, and Slave Island, as against 18 in the previous week, and 22 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Fourteen deaths from Influenza were registered, 3 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, and New Bazaar, 2 in Maradana North, and I each in Pettah, Kotahena North, and Wellawatta South, as against 12 in the previous week,

and 9 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from Bronchitis were registered, 1 each in Maradana hospitals, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta South. The number registered during the preceding week as also the weekly average for last year was 3.

The total rainfall in the week was 2 21 in., against 1 89 in. in the preceding week and 4 45 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

week, 23 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 6.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Fourteen deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents) and 1 each in Kotahena North, Maradana North, Slave Island, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta South, as against 9 in the previous week, and 22 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Eight deaths from Influenza were restricted, 3 in Slave Island, 2 each in St. Paul's and New Bazaar, and 1 in St. Sebastian, as against 14 in the previous week and 9 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from Bronchitis were registered, I each in New Bazaar, Maradana hospitals (of a non-resident) and Kollupitiva. The number registered during the preceding week as also the weekly average for last year was 3.

Nothing of these special conditions shall render the purchaser in any way exempt from liability under the Forest Ordinance of 1907, should he be responsible for the commission of Forest Offence outside the boundaries of his purchased coupe or coupes.
- 11. The security to be deposited is between Rs. 50 and Rs. 200 according to the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer.
- 12. Should any offer be accepted and should the successful tenderer after due notification decline or fail to pay any sum or sums stipulated for and to enter into the

necessary contract within the time allowed, or in reasonable time, he will be held pecuniarily liable for any resultant loss to Government. Offers are made and received on this distinct understanding. The Conservator of Forests reserves the discretionery power to waive the terms of this clause in any decree as he may consider the circumstances justify.

#### Special Conditions.

On payment of the full purchase amount the purchaser will be entitled to fell and remove on or before February 15, 1931, in the manner specified below, all the firewood and timber contained in the purchased coupe or coupes. Any firewood or timber not removed by the expiry date shall ipso facto revert to the Crown.

- (2) The purchaser shall agree to commence felling along the full length of the southern boundary of each coupe and to progress this felling line in the direction of the northern boundary, always keeping it parallel to the southern boundary along which felling commences.

- 3. Tenders should either be deposited in the tender box at the Office of the Conservator of Forests or be sent. through the post.
- 4. Tenders should be marked "Tender for purchase of the right to collect Minor Forest Produce, 1930-32," in the left hand top corner of the envelope, and should reach the Office of the Conservator of Forests not later than midday on Tuesday, July 29, 1930.

Kandy, either by post or by personal application. No tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized from. Alterations must be initialled otherwise the tenders may be considered as informal and be rejected.

- 6. A deposit of Rs. 50 will be required to be made either at the Treasury or Kachcheri, and a receipt forwarded or produced before any form of tender is issued.
- 7. A lump sum offer should be made for both products for the full p riod advertised and should be written both in words and in figures.
- 8. No tender form will be issued to any person whose name appears on the list of defaulting contractors or on the list of persons to whom permits to fell and remove timber and fuel from Crown forests should be refused.
- 9. The right to collect the produce hereby offered for competition shall be exclusive of such privileges as villagers have acquired under the provisions of the Forest Ordinance, or by usage for their domestic or village-requirements.
- 10. The Conservator of Forests reserves to himself the right without question of rejecting any or all tenders and of accepting any portion of a tender. The successful tenderer shall, within 10 days of receiving notice from the Conservator of Forests or his duly authorized representative that his tender has been accepted, deposit 50 per cent. of the full amount in the tender and in addition a cash security of Rs. 150. The balance purchase amount to be paid regularly in 3 monthly instalments within 3 months of the date of intimation of acceptance of tender. In the case of sales by auction the highest bidder will be declared the purchaser for the time being, subject to the approval of the Conservator of Forests and shall make the necessary deposits with the officer conducting the sale as specified hereunder and sign his name in the Register kept for the purpose in admission of such purchase.

12. The balance of the purchase amount, if any, shall be paid as specified in clause 10.

13. Should the successful tenderer or the bidder at auction sale decline or fail to enter into an agreement within 10 ten days of receiving notice in writing from the Conservator of Forests or the Divisional Forest Officer concerned to the effect that his tender or bid has been accepted and approved by the Conservator of Forests or to pay the balance purchase amount when due, the deposits already made on account of the purchase and the security shall be forfeited and the right to collect the produce concerned resold at the risk of the original pruchaser; who shall be held liable to make good any deficiency in the price realized at such resale, but, on the other hand he shall not be entitled to participate in any profit which may accrue to the Government by any resale.

- 14. The right to collect the produce in question shall not be assigned, resold, or sublet by the purchaser without the consent of the Conservator of Forests first obtained in writing.
- 15. Should the purchaser or his en ployees cause any damage to trees in the forests or commit any forest effence, the purchaser shall be held liable to pay compensation for all such damage or loss, and on failure to pay he shall be liable to prosecution.
- 16. The collection of Avaram or Ranawars bark and Kandalpattai or Mangrove bark should cease on August 31, 1932, to admit of the bark collected being transported to the Central Stores before September 30, 1932, and in the case of tapping of kitul trees tapping should cease on September 30, 1931.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M. pursuant to notice dated May 3, 1930.

The by-laws relating to "Eating-houses" were reonsidered seriatim.—Recommended that the following amend-

ments, in italies, be made in the present by-laws :-

#### DEFINITIONS.

#### Present Definition.

"Eating-house" includes any premises (other than a house for which a licence has been obtained under the Excise Ordinance, No. 8 of 1912) where meals are prepared or supplied for consumption by the public in the premises or elsewhere for the profit or gain of any person owning or having an interest in or managing such business.

"Meals" includes tea or coffee when either is sold in the form of a beverage.

# Amended Definition.

"Eating house" includes any premises (other than a house for which a licence has been obtained under the Excise Ordinance, No. 8 of 1912) where cooked rice is prepared or supplied for consumption by the public in the premises or elsewhere for the profit or gain of any person owning or having an interest in or managing such business,

The definfition of "Meals" is deleted.

### CONDITIONS OF ISSUE OF LICENCE.

#### Present Conditions.

- I. That the site is approved by the Chairman.
- 2. That the premises are in good repair and are well ventilated and well lighted, and that every room used for the serving of meals has a minimum superficial area of 120 square feet and is provided for the purpose of ventilation with doors or windows opening either directly or through an open verandah into an external open space and having an aggregate opening of not less than 1/7th the superficial floor area of room.
- 3. That the premises include a kitchen, having a minimum superficial area of not less 80 square feet, an efficient smoke vent and at least one window capable of being opened. Such window when open shall have an area of not less than 1/15th of the superficial floor space.
- 4. That the average height of every room is not less than 10 feet and the height is in no place less than 7 feet, and the walls are built of brick, stone, or cabook, with the inside thereof limeplastered and limewashed.
- 5. That all the eaves are at least 6 feet from the ground, and not more than 18 inches in length.
  - 6. That the roof is made of some permanent material.
  - 7. That all the woodwork is oil painted or limewashed.
  - 8. That the ground floor is cemented throughout.
- 9. That the premises are provided with adequate drainage, with a sanitary dust bin, and with sufficient latrine accommodation.
- 10. That the premises to be used as an eating-house have no internal communication under the same roof with any part of a dwelling house or with a bakery.

#### Amended Conditions.

That the site is approved by the Chairman.

That the premises are in good repair and are well ventilated and well lighted, and that every room used for the serving of meals has a minimum superficial area of 120 square feet, and is provided for the purpose of ventilation with doors or windows opening either directly or through an open verandah on to an external open space and having an aggregate opening of not less than 1/7th the superficial floor area of room.

That if any food is cooked on the premises such premises shall include a kitchen, having a minimum superficial area of not less than 80 square feet, an efficient smoke vent and at least one window capable of being opened. Such window when open shall have an area of not less than 1/15th of the superficial floor space.

That the average height of every room is not less than 10 feet and the height is in no place less than 7 feet and the walls are built of *concrete*, brick, stone, or cabook, with the inside thereof limeplastered and limewashed.

That all the eaves are at least 6 feet from the ground.

That the roof is made of some permanent material.

That all the woodwork is oil painted or limewashed.

That the ground floor is cemented throughout.

That the premises are provided with adequate surface drainage, with a sanitary dust bin, and that latrine accommodation is available.

That the kitchen and every room used for serving meals have no direct internal communication on the same floor and under the same roof with any part of a dwelling house or with a bakery.

11. That the premises are connected by pipes with the city water mains where such mains are available.

#### II.—REGULATIONS FOR LICENSED EATING-HOUSES. .

# Existing Regulations.

20. The licensee of an eating-house shall not permit the licensed premises to be used for any other purposes whatsoever.

#### Amended Regulations.

The licensee of an eating-house shall not permit the licensed premises to be used for purpose of any other trade whatsoever on the same floor as the meal rooms or kitchen.

Recommended that of the above conditions of issue of licences the following shall not be enforced in regard to premises licensed, as such, before January 1, 1930:—

Condition No. 1; condition No. 2, as regards the superficial area of the meal rooms; condition No. 3; condition 4, as regards the height of the rooms and materials of the walls; condition No. 5; condition No. 10.

The Chairman moved in Committee that the Council do resume. The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman moved in Council that the resolutions of Council in Committee, and the recommendations of the various Committees, subject to any amendments of such recommendations by the Council in Committee, be adopted. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried.

(7) Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved that Mr. R. L. Pereira, K.C., who ceased to be a member in consequence of having failed to attend three consecutive General Meetings, be restored to office under the provisions of section 30 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910. The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike asked for permission of the Council to move the following motion:—That with a view to payment of compensation to sufferers in the recent floods, the necessary machinery be forthwith set up for the assessment of damages sustained, and that Government be asked whether they are prepared to pay such compensation, or if not all, what proportion thereof.

The Chairman stated that, as mentioned in his statement which he had read, he had already requested the Municipal Engineer to consu't the Municipal Treasurer and the Charity Commissioner with regard to the information that should be collected and the method of its collection. He had also sent word to the refugee centres asking for the names and addresses of the refugees whose houses had been damaged by the floods. Steps had already been taken to devise a procedure for the inspection of the damaged houses with a view to the provision of assistance in cases where such might be necessary, possible or desirable.

The permission having been granted, Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike moved his motion. The Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando seconded. Mr. T. G. Jayewardene supported:

The motion was put to the meeting and carried unanimously. Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike inquired when the schools now being used as depôts would be evacuated. The Chairman stated, in reply, that he had already given instructions that the refugees should quit the Maligakande School by the morning of the 15th, but it was reported that the people had gone away voluntarily from there. With regard to the Dematagoda School, Wesley College, and St. Mathews' School, they had to be disinfected and cleaned after evacuation and instructions had already been issued that the refugees should be informed that they should move into the Cattle Mart. The people actually moved out of the Demetagoda School, but they came back again. He understood that Mr. T. G. Jayewardene, as Chairman of the Education District Committee, had arranged for the school to be closed until May 17. Mr. T. G. Jayewardene stated that that was so. The Council left these matters in the hands of the Chairman.
