A PROCLAMATION.

B. H. BOURDILLON.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the 25th June, 1908, published in *Gazette* No. 6,248 of the 26th day of June, 1908, the town of Weligama was brought under the operation of "The Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance, 1892," and its limits were defined for the purposes of the said Ordinance :

And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter the said limits so defined :

Now know Ye that in exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by virtue of section 2 of the aforesaid Ordinance, I, the Officer Administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the schedule to the said Proclamation and substitute therefor the schedule hereto as from the date hereof.

"THE BUFFALOES PROTECTION ORDINANCE, 1920."

RULES.

1. No buffalo shall be slaughtered and no person shall cause or permit a buffalo to be slaughtered except under and in accordance with the terms of a permit in that behalf from the local authority. Every such permit shall be in the Form A in the Schedule II. hereto.

2. No buffalo shall be removed or transported from the area of a local authority to any other area except under a permit in that behalf from the local authority from whose area such removal is to take place. Every such permit shall be in the Form B in the Schedule II. hereto.

3. No buffalo meat shall be transported from the area of a local authority to any other area except under a permit in that behalf from the local authority from whose area such meat is to be transported. Every such permit shall be in the Form C in the Schedule II. hereto.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended June 21, 1930.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 168 (1 European, 15 Burghers, 100 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 21 Moors, 3 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1930, viz., 269,160 was 32.5, as against 30.6 in the preceding week, 34.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 174 (1 European, 6 Burghers, 99 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 34 Moors, 5 Malays, and 7 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 33·7, as against 28·9 in the previous week, 28·4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30·9 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 174 total deaths, 33 were of infants under one year of age, as against 29 in the preceding week, 33 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 9.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 10 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Maradana East, 2 each in Slave Island and Wellawatta North, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, and Maradana North, as against 14 in the previous week, and 22 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Eleven deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 each in St. Paul's and San Sebastian, 2 in Slave Island, and 1 each in Kotahena South, Maradana North, and Maradana East, as against 8 in the previous week and 9 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Four deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in New Bazaar and 1 each in Kotahena North and Maradana hospitals, as against 3 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. Fifteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in St. Paul's and San Sebastian, and 1 each in Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Maradana North, and Slave Island, as against 13 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

3. (a) Five deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident) and 1 each in Maradana North and Maradana East, as against 3 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Enteric Fever* of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.

4. Eighteen deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 7 each from *Infantile Convulsions* and *Debility*, 5 each from *Diarrhoea*, *Dysentery*, and *Accidents*, 3 from *Worms*, 2 from *Suicide*, 1 each from *Tetanus* and *Puerperal Septicæmia*, and 65 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Twelve cases of *Enteric Fever*, 11 of *Chickenpox*, and 2 of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 8, 10, and nil, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80·7°, against 80·2° in the preceding week and 81·4° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·799 in., against 29·885 in. in the preceding week and 29·854 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2·01 in., against 5·36 in. in the preceding week and 1·66 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, May 10, 1930, at 9 a.m., pursuant to Notice dated May 3, 1930.

Present : Mr. M. M. Wedderburn, Chairman ; Mr. D. W. Subasinghe ; the Hon. Mr. C. E. de Vos, M.L.C. ; Mr. J. E. Perera ; Mr. D. I. Durham ; Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe ; Mr. F. W. Sproule ; Mr. T. Amarasuriya ; and Dr. S. P. Joseph.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of April 12, 1930, a copy thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. To submit plans and estimates for building a new ward in the Infectious Diseases Hospital and for providing additional accommodation at the Segregation Camp :—The Chairman explained that the plans were prepared in accordance with the recommendations of the Special Committee on the Infectious Diseases Hospital and Segregation Camp, and moved that the papers be referred to the Standing Committee on Municipal Works for a recommendation as to what section of work should be taken up this year. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

3. To consider the estimate for illuminating the town clock :—The Chairman explained that the cost of wiring and fitting brackets for the external illumination of three dials of the clock would be approximately Rs. 250 ; and the annual cost of the whole-night lighting about Rs. 420.

Mr. D. I. Durham moved that the estimate of Rs. 250 be passed, and that a sum of Rs. 200 be voted for maintenance for the six months. Mr. T. Amarasuriya seconded.—Carried.

4. To consider applications for the post of Medical Officer of Health :—The Chairman moved that Council do go into Committee to consider the applications.

On the motion of Mr. T. Amarasuriya the public and representatives of the press were asked to retire.

Council in Committee.

The Chairman referring to the resolution of Council of March 8, to call for applications for a whole-time Medical Officer of Health, ruled that Council did not resolve to employ a whole-time officer ; and that it is open to Council, having considered the applications, to continue the present arrangement. Council in Committee considered in detail the qualifications of the candidates.

The Chairman moved that the matter be referred to the Standing Committees on Finance and Sanitation, meeting together, for consideration and report as to whether—(a) one or other of the local applicants should be appointed as a whole-time officer ; (b) applications from persons having the Diploma of Public Health should be called for ; or (c) a part-time officer on the present part-time salary should be appointed, and applications called for. Mr. D. W. Subasinghe seconded.—Carried.

Council resumed, and the Chairman moved that the resolution of the Council in Committee be confirmed. Mr. D. W. Subasinghe seconded.—Carried.

5. To open tenders for building a drain on the western side of Dangedera road :—Only one tender was received. Mr. D. W. Subasinghe moved that tenders be again invited, and that the successful tenderer be not required to furnish security. Mr. T. Amarasuriya seconded.—Carried.

6. To consider an application from Messrs. Walkers and Clark Spence to instal a petrol pump within their premises at Queen street, opposite to the Galle Club :—Resolved that Council is not in favour of allowing the pump service because there is insufficient room between the road and the building, and the road is steep.

7. To consider an application from the Standard Oil Co., to instal a petrol service station at Mahamodera :—Resolved that Council approves the location of the service station provided it is otherwise in order.

8. Papers *re* application to erect a building over the grave-stone on the seabeach below the ramparts :—The Chairman moved that no building should be allowed at this place. The Hon. Mr. C. E. de Vos seconded.—Carried.

9. Report of the Colonial and Municipal Auditor for the financial year ending December 31, 1929 :—(1) Submitted. (2) Resolved that the present system of keeping the accounts of the Electricity Department be continued until the Chairman has further consulted the Colonial Auditor.

Improvements in the manufacture of double salts of Calcium Nitrate.

Abstract.—When a monovalent metal nitrate is added to a hot concentrated solution of calcium nitrate in the proportion of one to five and the solution is cooled the salt $5\text{Ca}(\text{NO}_3)_2 \cdot \text{MeNo}_3 \cdot 10\text{H}_2\text{O}$ is obtained in crystals. When Me stands for potassium or ammonium the salt is a useful manure. Partial dehydration prevents caking.

The claims are :—

1. A process for preparing double salts of calcium nitrate in which an additional nitrate having a monovalent kation, *e.g.*, lithium nitrate, sodium nitrate, potassium nitrate, rubidium nitrate, caesium nitrate, ammonium nitrate, or thallium nitrate is added to a hot solution of calcium nitrate, in such quantity that the ratio of calcium nitrate to the added nitrate is about 5 : 1.
2. A modification of the process according to claim 1 in which in place of the nitrate of the monovalent kation, such salts of the desired kation are used as will give the corresponding nitrate by reaction with the calcium nitrate.
3. A process according to Claim 1 or 2 for preparing the double salt containing ammonium or potassium in which the double salt is afterwards partially or wholly dehydrated to prevent caking.
4. Double salts of calcium nitrate when prepared according to any of the preceding claims.
5. The use of the double salt containing ammonium or potassium prepared according to any of the preceding claims, as a manure.

Improvements in or relating to machines for grading materials and extracting stalk from tea.

Abstract.—The tea flows down a sheet of corrugated metal having the corrugations transversely disposed with respect to the slope and having holes in the troughs of the corrugations. When the trays are oscillated the stalk tends to rise to the top and the smaller particles to pass through the holes.

The claims are :—

1. In a sorting machine for tea or other material, a sifting tray or sieve in which the surface is corrugated or formed in an undulating manner.
2. A sifting tray or sieve according to Claim 1 in which the corrugations or undulations on the surface are placed transversely to the inclination of the tray.
3. A sifting tray or sieve according to Claim 1 or Claim 2 in which the slots or holes in said surface are grouped along the sides of the valleys of the said surface.
4. A sifting tray or sieve according to Claim 3 in which the slots or holes are located at a predetermined height from the bottom of the valleys.
5. A tea stalk extracting machine having one or more sifting trays or sieves as claimed in any one of the preceding claims and in which the trays are agitated or oscillated in a substantially horizontal circular manner.
6. A tea stalk extracting machine in accordance with the preceding claims having a plurality of trays placed one above the other and so arranged that each succeeding tray is adapted to sift or separate tea from the stalk to a predetermined grade dependent on the side of the slots or holes which are graded in size from tray to tray.
7. The method of separating tea stalk or other material by flooding same at the upper end of an inclined undulated or corrugated surface whose ridges are placed transversely to the inclination of the tray and which is suitably slotted to form a sieve, agitating or oscillating said surface in a horizontal circular manner so that the larger and coarser particles of the material which are heaped to a suitable depth above the surface is induced to flow over the said ridges down the tray while the smaller particles are sifted through the slots or holes in the said surface.
8. A sorting machine for tea stalk or other material having a sieve or sieves constructed and adapted to operate substantially as herein described.

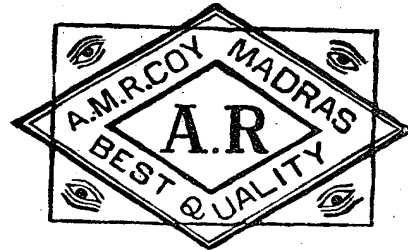

Rule No. 33 of the rules under section 11 of the Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917, dated January 18, 1924, (*Gazette* No. 7,375 of February 15, 1924), is repealed and the following is substituted therefor:—

33. Every proprietor of land irrigated from an irrigation tank shall, in such manner as the Assistant Government Agent after due inquiry may determine, contribute annually—

- (b) towards any other work for the construction or maintenance of which the proprietors are, in whole or in part, responsible under any rule for the time being in force,
