VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended April 26, 1930.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 223 (15 Burghers, 130, Sinhalese, 47 Tamils, 24 Moors, 3 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1930, viz., 269,160) was 43.2, as against 24.0 in the preceding week, 33.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 124 (1 European, 7 Burghers, 65 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 17 Moors, 2 Malays, and 3 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 24.0, as against 20.7 in the previous week, 25.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.9 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 124 total deaths, 28 were of infants under one year of age, as against 21 in the preceding week, 22 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 10.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Eight deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 each in Maradana North, Maradana East, and Slave Island, as against 7 in the previous week and 22 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Seven deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 5 in St. Paul's, and 1 each in San Sebastian and New Bazaar. The number registered during the preceding week was also 7 and the weekly average for last year was 9.

(c) Two deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered in St. Paul's, as against 5 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Eight deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Kotahena South, Maradana South, and Slave Island, as against 10 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Phthisis*, of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. (a) Seven deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (of non-residents), and 1 each in Maradana North and Slave Island, as against 4 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Enteric Fever*, of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.

4. (a) One death from *Plague* was registered in Pettah, as against nil in the previous week.

(b) One death from *Suspected Plague*, of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.

5. Eight deaths from *Debility* were registered, 5 each from *Enteritis* and *Accidents*, 2 each from *Dysentery*, *Infantile Convulsions*, and *Worms*, 1 from *Puerperal Septicaemia*, and 66 from *Other Causes*.

6. **Reported Cases.**—38 cases of *Chickenpox*, 13 of *Measles*, 10 of *Enteric Fever*, and 1 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 7, 14, 5, and nil, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.8°, against 81.8° in the preceding week and 81.3° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.831 in., against 29.847 in. in the preceding week and 29.850 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2.33 in., against 1.44 in. in the preceding week and 3.57 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, March 8, 1930, at 9 a.m., pursuant to Notice dated March 1, 1930.

Present :—Mr. M. M. Wedderburn, Chairman; the Hon. Mr. H. M. Macan Markar, M.L.C.; Mr. D. W. Subasinghe; the Hon. Mr. C. E. de Vos, M.L.C.; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. D. I. Durham; Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe; and Mr. T. Amarasuriya.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of February 8, 1930, a copy thereof having been furnished to each member were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. T. Amarasuriya moved, that the night soil bucket depôts at Kaluwella, and other places within the Municipality, where night soil buckets are collected and heaped up during the day, be provided with fly-proofed sheds.

The Hon. Mr. C. E. de Vos seconded, and suggested that the words "and all buckets supplied with lids," be added at the end of the motion.

The mover agreed to the amendment.

The motion was put to the meeting and carried.

3. Election, by ballot, to fill a vacancy on the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation :—The Chairman declared that Dr. S. P. Joseph is elected to fill the vacancy.

4. To consider letter No. 530/22/30 of February 13, 1930, from the Colonial Auditor, relating to the accounts :—The Chairman moved Council into Committee to consider the letter.

Read letter from the Colonial Auditor, and after discussion it was recommended that the Chairman be asked to bring the matter up again in three months' time.

On Council resuming the recommendations of the Council in Committee was put to the Meeting and carried.

5. To receive tenders for supplying and installing a 100 H.P. engine to drive a 55-K.W. alternator :—Resolved that the tenders be forwarded to the Director of Electrical Undertakings, and that he be asked to be so good as to report whether any of the power units are suitable for the existing alternators, and if so to advise which tender should be accepted.

6. To consider an application from the clerical staff that the hours of business may be the same as in Government offices :—Resolved that the office hours should be from 9 A.M. to 4 P.M., Saturdays, 9 A.M. to 1.30 P.M.

7. To consider an application from the Standard Oil Company of New York to erect a petrol service station at Pettigalawatta :—Resolved that consideration be deferred until the next meeting.

8. To consider applications for the post of Council's Lawyer :—The Chairman moved the Council do go into Committee to consider the applications.

Council in Committee considered the qualifications of the candidates, and agreed on selection by ballot. Council resumed and balloted in favour of appointing Mr. G. E. Abeywardena.

9. To consider a letter asking for terms for supplying electric current to St. Aloysius College :—Resolved that the Chairman be authorized to arrange with the authorities of the College on the lines detailed in their letter, and to report to the Council alterations in the present scale of charges.

10. To appoint in terms of resolution 14 (2) of the Minutes of the Meeting of November 9, 1929, a Special Committee to consider applications from Municipal Officers for increase of salary :—Resolved that Messrs. J. E. Perera, D. I. Durham, and T. Amarasuriya, with the Chairman, be appointed a Special Committee.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees of February 22, 1930, were laid before the Council :—

11.—*Extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of February 22, 1930.*

(2) To consider the following estimates :—(a) Rs. 540 for weeding the catchment area of Bikke reservoir.—Recommended. (b) Rs. 600 for weeding the margin of Hiyara reservoir.—Recommended. (c) Rs. 2,500 for maintenance of Victoria Park, the esplanade, and public seats.—Recommended. (d) Rs. 750 for improving the Junction of Morris road and Circular road.—Recommended. (e) Rs. 2,700 for clearing Fort sewers and raising the sills of existing manholes to road level.—Recommended. (f) Rs. 6,750 for rebuilding the drain along Wakwella road.—(i.) Recommended, (ii.) resolved to invite tenders. (g) Rs. 1,150 for improvements to the fruit market.—Recommended. (h) Rs. 1,300 for building 500 feet of drain along Kandewatta road.—(i.) Recommended, (ii.) resolved to invite tenders. (i) Rs. 2,000 for the maintenance of Hiyara service road.—Recommended.

(3) To consider 57 applications for water service and 2 applications for the reconnection of existing services:—(i.) Recommended that the applications for domestic services within the Police limits be allowed. (ii.) Resolved that the Chairman be requested to submit a proposal regarding the terms on which water services may be allowed to premises outside the Police limits of the town, where water rate is not paid.

(4) Papers *re* improvements to buildings in the plague area:—(i.) Considered together with the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment. (ii.) Recommended that (a) the lane at the rear of premises No. 101 to 112, Main street, need not be more than 8 feet in width; (b) the acquisition of No. 154, Fish market, Cross street, is unnecessary; (c) the terms of the notice regarding the improvements of No. 78, Main street must be carried out before the building is reoccupied; (d) in the case of No. 76, Pettigalawatta, the raising of the roof need not be insisted upon; (e) the removal of the wall between No. 94 and No. 95, Main street, should not be insisted upon, as it will endanger the building; (f) the reoccupation of No. 106, Main street, may be permitted on the terms recommended by the Chairman.

Resolution.

With regard to items (2) (a) and (b), it was resolved that the estimates be passed, but tenders should be invited for the services in 1931.

With regard to items (2) (c), (e), (g), (i), it was resolved that the works be carried out departmentally. The recommendations of the Standing Committee, with regard to the remaining items, were adopted.

(2) Papers *re* improvements to buildings in the plague area:—(i.) Considered together with the Standing Committee on Municipal works. (ii.) Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Municipal works of February 22, 1930, be adopted.

(3) Retirement of the Medical Officer of Health:—(i.) Considered together with the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation. (ii.) Resolved to report to Council that unless Council is prepared to pay the scale of salary paid to officers of the Sanitary Department, there is no alternative but to employ a part-time officer.

(4) Appointment of a Sanitary Inspector:—(i.) Considered together with the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation. (ii.) Recommended that applications be invited from trained and experienced Sanitary Inspectors, and that the salary should be the same as that of Inspectors in the Sanitary Department.

Resolution.

The Hon. Mr. H. M. Macan Markar urged the appointment of a full-time Medical Officer.

The Chairman was of opinion that in the present circumstances the Council should continue to employ a part-time officer. The general opinion of the Council in Committee was that a whole-time Medical Officer should be appointed, if it is feasible.

Resolved that applications should be called for, for a whole-time Medical Officer holding British or American Health qualifications, at a salary of Rs. 6,000 rising to Rs. 10,000 by annual increments of Rs. 400, with a motor car allowance of Rs. 1,200.

Council resumed, and the Chairman moved that the resolution of Council in Committee be adopted.—Carried.
