#### STATISTICS. VITAL

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended April 26, 1930.

–The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 223 (15 Burghers, 130, Sinhalese, 47Tamils, 24 Moors, 3 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1930, viz., 269,160) was 43.2, as against 24.0 in the preceeding week, 33.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.5 the weekly average for last year.

-The total deaths registered were 124 (1 European, 7 Burghers, 65 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 17 Moors, 2 Malays, and 3 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 24.0, as against 20.7 in the previous week, 25.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.9 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 124 total deaths, 28 were of infants under one year of age, as against 21 in the preceeding week, 22 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 10.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Eight deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 each in Maradana North, Maradana East, and Slave Island, as against 7 in the previous week and 22 the week a variage for last year.

(b) Seven deaths from Influenza were registered, 5 in St. Paul's, and leach in San Sebastian and New Bazaar.

The number registered during the preceding week was also 7 and the weekly average for last year was 9.

(c) Two deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered in St. Paul's, as against 5 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Eight deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Kotahena South, Maradana South, and Slave Island, as against 10 in the previous week and 1 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from Philisis, of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. (a) Seven deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (of non-residents), and 1 each in Maradana North and Slave Island, as against 4 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from Enteric Fever, of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital,

(a) One death from Plague was registered in Pettah, as against nil in the previous week.

- (b) One death from Suspected Plague, of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.
- 5. Eight deaths from Debility were registered, 5 each from Enteritis and Accidents, 2 each from Dysentery, Infantile Convulsions, and Worms, 1 from Puerperal Septicaemia, and 66 from Other Causes.
- 6. Reported Cases.—38 cases of Chickenpox, 13 of Measles, 10 of Enteric Rever, and 1 of Plague were reported during the week, as against 7, 14, 5, and nil, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.8°, against 81.8° in the preceding week and 81.3° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.831 in., against 29.847 in. in the preceding week and 29.850 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2.33 in., against 1.44 in. in the preceding week and 3.57 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

In the event of failure to complete the purchase, all amounts previously paid shall be forfeited and the timber, &c., revert to the Crown, and be liable for resale at the risk of the original purchaser.

Should any successful tenderer decline or fail to pay any sum or sums as above stipulated for, he shall further be

pecuniarily liable for any resultant loss to Government.

The Conservator of Forests reserves however the discretionary power to enforce, modify, or waive any of the provisions in this clause to such extent as he may consider the circumstances justify.

The Conservator of Forests reserves to himself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all offers and of

accepting any offer.

All material shall be removed by purchaser within one month of completion of purchase when a permit for removal will be issued. Extension of time will not be granted except under exceptional circumstances.

All material purchased shall be at the risk of the purchaser until its removal by him on a permit.

10. The buyer, his agent, or his representative shall be liable for punishment under the Forest Ordinance for commission of any Forest Offence in the course of completing the transaction.

Any purchaser violating the conditions of purchase shall be liable to a fine not exceeding 25 per cent. of purchase amount, and to be included in the list of persons to whom no permits will be issued.
