#### PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS His Excellency Sir Herbert James Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof, has quitted this Colony. It is hereby proclaimed that by virtue of the Letters Patent passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom, constituting the Office of Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Island of Ceylon and its Dependencies, dated the Eleventh day of September, One thousand Nine hundred and Twenty, as amended by Letters Patent dated the Thirteenth day of August, One thousand Nine hundred and Twenty-nine, the Honourable Mr. Bernard Henry Bourdillon, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, has this day assumed the Administration of the Government of the Island, of which all persons concerned are required to take due notice.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Seventeenth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Thirty.
