“THE QUARANTINE AND PREVENTION OF DISEASES ORDINANCE, 1897.”

M 243/30

WHEREAS by a declaration dated May 7, 1930, the proper authority, to wit, the Assistant Government Agent, Nuwara Eliya, declared that the area described in the schedule hereto annexed shall be a “diseased locality” within the meaning of “The Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance, 1897,” and the regulations made thereunder:

Now know Ye that We, the Officer Administering the Government in Executive Council, do hereby confirm the said declaration dated May 7, 1930, in accordance with the regulations made under “The Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance, 1897,” and published in the *Supplement to the Government Gazette* No. 7,481 dated August 28, 1925, and do hereby declare that the area described in the schedule hereto shall, until further notice, be a “diseased locality” for the purposes and within the meaning of the said Ordinance and the regulations made thereunder.
