WHEREAS it is enacted by section 6 (1) of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," that the Governor may, with the advice of the Executive Council, when to him it shall seem advisable, by Proclamation, establish a general cemetery for the burial or cremation of the dead within such limits as shall be specified and defined in such Proclamation:

And whereas it seems advisable to the Officer Administering the Government to establish a general cemetery as aforesaid:

Now know Ye that in exercise of the afore-mentioned powers vested in the Governor, I, the Officer Administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby establish a general cemetery on the land described in Schedule A hereto for the burial or cremation of the dead within the limits specified and defined in Schedule B hereto, as from the date hereof.

Regulations for St. Anne's Festival at Talavillu.

REGULATIONS made by the Governor in Council under section 1 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1896, entitled "An Ordinance relating to Pilgrimages."

REGULATIONS.

- In these regulations the expression "camp area" shall mean the space within the boundaries specified in the schedule hereto,
and "Assistant Government Agent" shall mean the Assistant Government Agent of the Puttalam and Chilaw Districts.
- No person shall camp in any place within the camp area where camping is prohibited by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent.
- No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at the places provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

4. No person shall deposit any liquid or solid refuse or any rubbish within the camp area, except in the places or receptacles provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

5. (a) No cattle shall be kept within the camp area, except those brought there for slaughter and those permitted by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent to be kept within such area.

(b) No cattle shall be kept in the vicinity of the camp area, except at a place especially appointed as a cattle-gala or at a place approved for such use by the Assistant Government Agent.

(c) The person in charge of the cattle shall cause their droppings to be removed to the nearest place provided therefor, and shall at all times keep clean the place occupied by his cattle.

6. All prepared foods sold within the camp area shall be protected from flies and dust by being (a) wrapped in or covered with clean paper or cloth, or (b) kept in closed glass cases, or (c) kept in other covered containers approved by the Medical Officer, or by the Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

7. No person who is likely to affect prejudicially the cleanliness of the camp area, and no person who is suffering from an infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the camp area.

8. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, the Assistant Government Agent may direct the pilgrims to leave the place of pilgrimage, and may prescribe the routes and methods for their conveyance.

9. (a) Every person within the camp area who is suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease, and (b) every person who resides with him knowing that he is so suffering shall report the case to the Medical or Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

10. When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any particular purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use the tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is set apart.

11. No person shall keep bakeries, aerated water manufactories, or galas within the camp area without previously obtaining a licence from the Assistant Government Agent, permitting him to do so. The licence shall be issued free of charge.

12. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building within the camp area so as to encroach on the main or other streets of the camp.

13. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, discharge fireworks and firearms within the camp area, or within a radius of one mile from the boundaries of such area.

14. No person shall slaughter animals within the camp area, except in the place provided for the purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent, and every person slaughtering animals in such a place shall be responsible for its cleanliness.

VITAL STATISTICS.**Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended June 28, 1930.**

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 164 (13 Burghers, 98 Sinhalese, 20 Tamils, 26 Moors, and 7 Malays). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1930, viz., 269,160) was 31.8, as against 32.5 in the preceding week, 28.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 189 (1 European, 5 Burghers, 110 Sinhalese, 34 Tamils, 28 Moors, 7 Malays, and 4 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 36.6, as against 33.7 in the previous week, 28.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.9 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 189 total deaths, 40 were of infants under one year of age, as against 33 in the preceding week, 31 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 6.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Thirteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in Kotahena North and Maradana South, and 1 each in Kotahena South and Maradana North, as against 20 in the previous week, and 22 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Ten deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 4 in New Bazaar, 3 in St. Paul's, and 1 each in Kotahena South, Maradana East, and Slave Island, as against 11 in the previous week, and 9 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Seven deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (of non-residents), 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Maradana North, and Kollupitiya, as against 4 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Thirteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Slave Island, and 1 each in Pettah and Kollupitiya, as against 15 in the previous week, and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Two deaths from *Phthisis* of residents of Colombo town, occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Eight deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), and 1 in Slave Island, as against 6 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. Thirty-three deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 10 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 8 from *Worms*, 7 from *Debility*, 6 from *Dysentery*, 5 from *Diarrhoea*, 2 each from *Tetanus*, *Puerperal Septicæmia* and *Accidents*, 1 from *Homicide*, and 62 from *Other Causes*.

5. *Reported Cases.*—Eleven cases of *Enteric fever*, 10 of *Chickenpox* and 1 of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 12, 11, and 2, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.1°, against 80.7° in the preceding week and 81.0° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.827 in., against 29.799 in. in the preceding week and 29.794 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2.04 in., against 2.01 in. in the preceding week and 1.48 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

9. In the event of any breach of the foregoing conditions the Government Agent will resume possession of the land, and eject the purchaser from the premises without compensation.

Back-Lane Scheme.

Back-lane Scheme for the scavenging of the area of the Town of Kandy, bounded as follows:—North by King street, south by Colombo street, east by Trincomalee street, west by Castle Hill street.

(*Referred to in the notification published in the “Government Gazettes” Nos. 7,550, 7,552, and 7,553 of October 15, 22, and 29, 1926, respectively, and in the “Ceylon Morning Leader” and the “Ceylon Daily News” of October 15, 22, and 29, 1926.*)

NOTICE is hereby given, under section 52 (4) of Ordinance No. 19 of 1915, that the Municipal Council, Kandy, at the meeting held on June 21, 1930, have, upon the consideration of objections lodged against the scheme, made their final determination in regard thereto, and have modified the scheme.

According to this modification the back-lane running behind premises Nos. 229 to 222, situate at Colombo street, and premises Nos. 381 to 389, situate at Trincomalee street, has been taken dead straight eliminating the bends and reducing the width to 12 feet.

Width of the back-lane running behind the following premises has been reduced as follows:—

Premises Nos. 203 to 220, situate at Colombo street, width of lane reduced from 16 feet to an average width of 12 feet.

Premises Nos. 33 to 37, situate at Castle Hill street, width of lane reduced from 17 feet to an average width of 12 feet.

Premises Nos. 12 to 33, situate at King street, width of lane reduced from 16 feet to an average width of 12 feet.

Premises Nos. 372 to 376C, situate at Trincomalee street, width of lane reduced from 16 feet to about 11 feet.

The back-lane running north and south through the existing lane marked 14, situate at King street, terminates at premises No. 142, instead of at 14w, situate at King street.

The section of the back-lane running behind premises Nos. 371 to 373, situate at Trincomalee street, and through

premises Nos. 11 and part of 10, situate at King street, terminates in a cul-de-sac behind premises No. 371, situate at Trincomalee street.

The cost of construction of the scheme as modified is estimated at Rs. 23,600.

Officers entitled to Free Treatment.

(a) Members of the Department of Medical and Sanitary Services who contract disease in the discharge of duty (G. O. 1217 (ii.)).

Viz. :—Medical Officers, Apothecaries, Nurses, Stewards, Vaccinators, Inspectors of Vaccination, Sanitary Inspectors, Laboratory Assistants, and Field Officers of the Anti-Malaria, Anchylostomiasis, and Parangi Campaigns, and the Sanitary Engineers Division, Medical Officers of Health and Inspecting Medical Officers of Estates and Officers of the Health Units.

(b) Foremen Platelayers, Drivers, and Guards on the Northern and Batticaloa-Trincomalee Light Railways who are ordered into hospital by the General Manager, Railways, for treatment of disease contracted in the discharge of their public duties and all officers who meet with accidents in the actual discharge of duty (G. O. 1299). The usual hospital charges are payable to the hospital by the General Manager, Railways, from the votes of his Department.

(c) Non-Commissioned Officers of the Regular Army doing duty with the Ceylon Defence Force (G. O. 1359, 5th Edition). This concession does not apply to families, except in serious cases which will require the special approval of the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services. In other cases the families will be charged the rates applicable to Government Servants according to income.

(d) Mobilized men of the Ceylon Light Infantry and Ceylon Defence Force sent by the Military Hospital.

RULES.

- Charges will be made for "Extras" not included in the scale of diets and for the services of special attendants.
 - Post Office employees will not be charged an Entrance Fee when admitted to the Skinner Memorial Ward, General Hospital. This ward contains six beds for males and two beds for females. Post Office employees (males only) have a prior right to four of these beds and no entrance fee is charged in their case. If no accommodation is available in the Skinner Memorial Ward, Government Subordinate Officers (including Post Office employees) in service will be treated in the Seaman's Ward where males only can be admitted—the wives and other female dependents of the above class of officers will be admitted to the Gnanasekeram Ward—and will be charged in accordance with the scale of charges laid down under rate 10. Employees in Mercantile Firms are also eligible for admission to the First Class Paying Wards, General Hospital, at the rates laid down under 5.
 - Rates 6, 7, and 8 are for accommodation in a ward in the General Hospital, Colombo, and are applicable to males only at present.
 - Rate 10 is applicable to Subordinate Government Officers in service and for accommodation in a ward. Minor Headmen, *i.e.*, headmen not above the rank of Korala, Vidana Arachchi or Udaiyar, are not entitled to the reduced rates under rate 10. Any Subordinate Government Officer in service treated in a single room in a first class paying ward will be charged the scale in rate 5.
 - Government Subordinate Officers in service for the purpose of rate 10 are those drawing salaries of not more than Rs. 4,500 per annum and all officers of the Clerical Service in service.
 - The hospital charges for wives and families will be the same as for the husband, father, mother or guardian respectively.
 - The rate chargeable in the case of Government Officers in service will apply to the following :—
 - in the case of a married officer, his wife and such of his children as are dependent on him ;
 - in the case of a widower, his children and his mother or sister, if dependent on him ;
 - in the case of an unmarried officer, his mother or sister if dependent on him. Males of 18 years of age and upwards will not be regarded as dependent children except in the case of permanent invalids.
 - In the case of children under 15 years of age a reduction of 25 per cent. in the daily charge and in the operation will be made.
 - Operation Fee.*—The amount charged will depend on the nature of the operation, *i.e.*, whether "Major" or "Minor." The decision as to what constitutes a "Major" as distinct from a "Minor" operation will be made by the Medical Officer-in-Charge or the Medical Superintendent as the case may be.
- In maternity cases a fee called an "accouchment fee" will be charged in addition to the other charges and will be on the following scale :—

Rates 1—5 : Rs. 75 to Rs. 150.
Rate 9 : Rs. 20 to Rs. 50.

Rate 10 : Free.

10. Where there are no paying wards paying patients will be accommodated in a screened bed in a non-paying ward, if available, and will be charged the daily rate applicable to the class to which the patient belongs if supplied with paying patients' diet. No entrance fee will be charged.

11. Before a patient is admitted into a paying ward he will be required to make a declaration on form Medical 216 stating his actual income. This will be taken as the basis for the classification of the patient under the proper scale of charges. In the case of a patient who is too ill to make the declaration, the person who accompanies the patient will be required to do so; under rules 6 and 7 above the declaration in respect of the income of the husband, father, mother, or guardian respectively should be made.

12. Before a patient is admitted into a paying ward, he must make a cash deposit equivalent to one week's charges, the entrance fee and the cost of extras and special attendant. This deposit will be held to meet the charges incurred for the last week of the patient's stay in hospital and the entrance fee. Should the patient decline to make the necessary deposit he will be refused admission, or, if too ill to be sent away, he will be admitted to a non-paying ward.

13. Patients admitted for operation, confinement, X'ray or radium treatment must also make a cash deposit to cover the charges payable under the respective heads.

14. Where a patient is brought for admission to a Paying Patients' Ward, and is too ill to make the necessary deposit or to attend to business matters, a deposit will be demanded from the friend or relative who accompanies the patient, should they decline to make the deposit, the Medical Officer or the Medical Superintendent, as the case may be, will use his discretion as to whether or not the patient is too ill to be refused admission to the hospital. In case the patient is too ill, he or she will be admitted to a non-paying ward.

15. Bills for hospital charges must be rendered to the patients or responsible friends or relatives weekly, and they must be settled within three days of the date of presentation. Should such a bill be not settled on the due date, the patient will be discharged from the hospital, or, if too ill to be discharged, he or she will be transferred to a non-paying ward.

16. Admission can only be granted to a ward if accommodation is available.

Non-Paying Section (Paying Patients).

17. The following charges will be recovered from patients treated in the Non-Paying Wards of Government Hospitals:—

- (a) Persons whose wages or income are more than Rs. 83·33 per mensem, cents 50 per diem.
 (b) Persons whose wages or income are Rs. 50 or over but not more than Rs. 83·33 per mensem, cents 30 per diem.

18. Hospital charges for wives and children or dependents are to be the same as for the husband, father, mother or guardian respectively.

19. For accommodation in a ward consisting of one to six beds a charge of Rs. 2 per diem will be made. The diet of the ordinary non-paying section will be supplied with "extras" not exceeding Re. 1 in value.

20. For accommodation in a screened bed in a general ward a charge of Re. 1 per diem will be made in addition to the charges under rule 17. A minimum deposit equivalent to two weeks' charges should be made in advance before a patient is admitted to a ward under rules 17 to 20.

THE following Specifications have been accepted:—

No. 2,470 of May 20, 1930 (Date applied for under Section 48 of the Ordinance: July 27, 1927).

Oscar Dahl and Erik Arnfinn Hallgrim Kjorstad.

Improvements in refrigerating plants more particularly for freezing fish.

Abstract.—The fish are placed in a closed vessel and brine is pumped in under pressure to freeze the fish: a pipe connects the top of the vessel to the atmosphere.

The claims are:—

1. A refrigerating apparatus more particularly adapted for freezing fish on board vessels, which comprises a substantially closed receptacle adapted to contain the goods to be refrigerated and to be supplied with a cooling brine, characterized in that the arrangement is such as to maintain said receptacle constantly and completely filled with brine, the brine having no or nearly no contact with the outer air, and a vent pipe or like means being provided for discharging the air which is disengaged in said receptacle in operation.

2. A refrigerating apparatus according to claim 1, characterized in that the cooling brine is maintained under pressure in said receptacle, a tube or the like being provided for maintaining a head of liquid above said receptacle and the cooling brine being forced into said receptacle by means of a pump or like means.

3. A refrigerating apparatus according to claim 2, characterized by the provision of means for varying said pressure.

4. A refrigerating apparatus according to claim 1, associated with a closed brine-cooling apparatus in communication with said receptacle, and comprising means for maintaining said receptacle and container constantly and completely filled with brine.

5. A refrigerating apparatus according to claim 4, characterized by the provision of means for independently varying the pressure in said receptacle and in said cooling apparatus, for example by means of throttling members in the circuit followed by the brine, at the outlet of said receptacle and at the outlet of the brine-cooling apparatus.

6. A refrigerating apparatus according to claim 1, in which the said receptacle has a pointed shape at the top, said tube opening into said receptacle at the upper pointed part thereof.

7. A refrigerating apparatus according to claim 1, characterized by the provision of packing members between the grates or like permeable receptacles containing the fish or other goods and the inner walls of said receptacle.

8. A refrigerating apparatus according to claim 7, characterized in that the fish is contained in perforated cases, packing bands of rubber or the like being interposed between said cases and the inner walls of said receptacle.

9. A refrigerating apparatus according to claim 1, comprising means for distributing the brine over the surface of the fish, characterized in that said means comprise superposed flat members of increasing size disposed at a distance from each other and having holes coaxially disposed.

10. A refrigerating apparatus more particularly adapted for freezing fish on board vessels, substantially as described and as shown in the accompanying drawings.

Electric air heater, particularly intended for tea drying.

Abstract.—The resistance elements are composed of corrugated metal bands mounted adjacent to insulating plates to which they are fastened at intervals. The air current is parallel to the breadth of the band.

The claims are:—

1. An electric air heater, particularly intended for tea drying, characterized by the heating resistance elements being composed of corrugated metal bands mounted

adjacent to insulating plates to which they are secured at appropriate intervals, said bands and plates being arranged to present their smallest dimension in the direction opposing the air current.

2. An electric air heater according to claiming clause 1, characterized by the band being led in zig-zag manner through holes in the plate which are sufficiently narrow to hold it in place.

3. An electric air heater according to claiming clause 2, characterized by two adjacent bands which are connected to different poles being zig-zagged in opposite senses so that their free portions are not directly above each other.

4. An electric air heater according to claiming clause 1, characterized by the plates being combined into grid-like sectional units adapted to be traversed by the air current one after the other.

Regulating means for electrical tea-drying apparatus.

Abstract.—A combination of two regulators is described: one is affected by the temperature of the outlet air and controls the speed of the air current: the second is affected by the temperature of the air entering the drying chamber and controls the expenditure of electrical energy.

The claims are:—

1. Regulating means for electrical tea-drying apparatus characterized by the combination of a regulator influenced by the temperature of the air entering the drying chamber for the tea leaf and acting to control the quantity of electric power dissipated into heat for heating the said air, and a regulator influenced by the temperature of the air leaving said drying chamber and acting to control the quantity of air per unit time passing through the apparatus.

2. Regulating means according to claiming clause 1, characterized by the regulator influenced by the inlet air being more sensitive than that influenced by the outlet air.

3. Regulating means according to claiming clause 1, in which each regulator controls its quantity in definite steps, characterized by a certain time interval separating the successive steps effected by each regulator.

4. Regulating means according to claiming clause 3, characterized by the time intervals between the controlling steps of the outlet air regulator being greater than those between the controlling steps of the inlet air regulator.

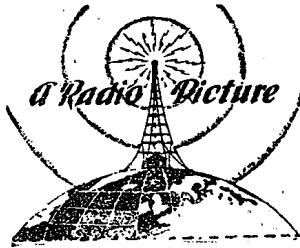

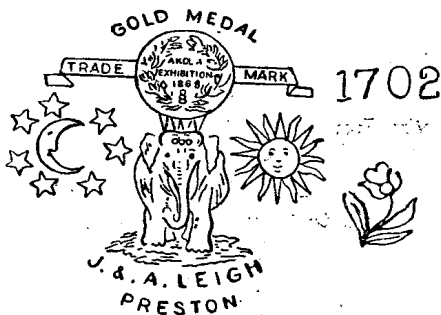
