And I do further hereby define the limits of the said village to be those set out in the schedule hereunto annexed.

Water not to be wasted.

Interference with channels and other irrigation works prohibited.

1. No person shall interfere with, prevent the flow of, distribute, cut off, or divert, the water in any communal channel, except under the direction or with the consent of the Irrigation Headman.
2. Whenever there is any shortage of water, the Government Agent or the Cultivation Officer shall decide upon the quantity of water to be allowed to each holding, and the manner in which it is to be distributed.
3. No proprietor shall use more water than is absolutely necessary for the irrigation of his holding, or allow water to run to waste.
4. No person shall so pollute the water in any channel or other irrigation work as to render it unfit for the purposes of irrigation.
5. No person shall encroach upon, alter, divert, block, obstruct, or in any way interfere with or cause an injury to, any channel or other irrigation work.

Defaulters how to be dealt with.

1. In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires—
The words "Cultivation Officer" mean an officer appointed by the Government Agent under section 20A of the Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917.
The words "Irrigation Works" mean channels and other irrigation works in charge of Irrigation Headmen other than works under direct supervision of the Irrigation Department.
2. In respect of each acre or part of an acre held by him every proprietor shall on or before the thirtieth day of June in each year pay to the Irrigation Headman of the tract within which his holding is situated (as huwandiram for his remuneration) a sum of thirty cents.
3. Every Irrigation Headman shall reside within the tract committed to his charge, and he shall not absent himself from duty, unless he has previously obtained leave from the Government Agent, and has provided a substitute approved by the Government Agent.
4. Every proprietor shall for the construction, repair, upkeep, and improvement of any irrigation work perform each year in respect of every two acres held by him (and proportionately in respect of any fraction of two acres) able-bodied labour for such number of days not exceeding thirty as may be determined by the Government Agent.
Provided that a proprietor may commute such labour by a money payment calculated at the rate of seventy-five cents for each day's labour that he is required to perform, such payment being made on or before the thirtieth day of June in each year, or on or before such other date as the Government Agent shall fix by notice in writing under his hand duly published.
5. The duty of maintaining the field channels shall be apportioned by the Irrigation Headman among the proprietors through whose holdings the channels pass, and every such proprietor shall be responsible for the proper maintenance of the portion of the channel within his holding.
6. The Irrigation Headman shall set out the site and alignment, and prescribe the measurements and quantities of all work to be done by any proprietor in connection with an irrigation work, and every such proprietor shall complete his portion of the work within the time appointed therefor and in the manner required.
7. Notwithstanding anything contained in these rules, it shall be lawful in any case of emergency for the Government Agent or the Cultivation Officer, or any other person acting under the orders of the Government Agent, to call out all or any of the proprietors for the purpose of protecting or repairing any irrigation work for the construction or maintenance of which they are responsible. Such labour shall be performed by any proprietor so called upon either in person or by an able-bodied substitute. The liability to perform labour under this rule shall continue from day to day until the completion of the emergency work.
8. (a) The Government Agent, or the Cultivation Officer, or any other person thereto authorized by the Government Agent, shall whenever necessary call a meeting of the proprietors concerned to fix the days on which any work that is necessary shall be commenced and finished. Ten proprietors shall constitute a quorum at any such meeting, and the decision of the meeting shall be duly observed. But should such meeting not take place owing to the failure to obtain a quorum, or should the proprietors come to no decision, the person calling the meeting may himself make the decision, and his decision shall be as valid and binding, as if it had been made by the meeting of proprietors.
(b) Any decision made under this rule shall be duly published, and any proprietor who shall fail to comply with any such decision shall be guilty of an offence.
9. At least fifteen days before any labour due under these rules is to be performed, the Irrigation Headman shall give notice to the proprietors concerned of the time and place at which such labour is to be performed and the period within which it is to be completed.
10. Within seven days of the expiration of the period prescribed for the performance of any work by any proprietor or proprietors, the Irrigation Headman shall forward to the Village Council a list of those who have failed or neglected to perform the labour for which they were liable within such period.

Provided that when the work is of such a nature that its completion within such period is deemed essential in the interests of the proprietors generally it shall be lawful for the Government Agent or for the Cultivation Officer to get done by hired labour the work which any proprietor has failed or neglected to perform, and recover all expenditure reasonably so incurred in the manner contemplated by section 23 of the Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917.

Provided also that a proprietor, from whom such a recovery of expenditure has been made, shall not be freed from any liability to a fine which he may have incurred under section 29 of Ordinance No. 45 of 1917 in respect of such failure or neglect to perform labour.

11. To the Cultivation Officer and to the Irrigation Headman in the performance of their official duties and to other proprietors while engaged in communal labour, every proprietor shall grant access to his land and render all other reasonable facilities.

12. (a) Any person who shall in any way block up, divert, or interfere with a channel on any land under the scheme shall be guilty of an offence.

(b) The proprietor of any land or lands benefiting by any drainage channel passing through the land of another shall be liable to contribute towards the maintenance of such channel, unless such other proprietor has, in writing addressed to the Government Agent, undertaken the entire liability for its maintenance.

13. The distribution of water passing through channels in charge of the Irrigation Department shall be under the control of the Irrigation Headman, who shall prescribe the order in which the several proprietors shall take water from the field channels.

14. Water shall first be let into the land on the highest level, and thereafter into the lands on the successively lower levels.

15. Every notice required to be published by these rules shall be deemed to have been duly published, (a) if the Irrigation Headman gives notice individually to the proprietors concerned, or (b) if the notice is published by beat of tom-tom in the locality, or (c) if a written notice is pasted up in a conspicuous place within the tract concerned.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended July 12, 1930.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 164 (2 Europeans, 17 Burghers, 88 Sinhalese, 28 Tamils, 22 Moors, 5 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1930, viz., 270,700) was 31.6, as against 29.5 in the preceding week, 28.2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 227 (1 European, 10 Burghers, 123 Sinhalese, 48 Tamils, 36 Moors, 5 Malays, and 4 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 43.7, as against 47.0 in the previous week, 34.7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.9 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 227 total deaths, 48 were of infants under one year of age, as against 69 in the preceding week, 52 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty-seven deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 12 in Maradana hospitals (including 6 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Slave Island, 2 each in Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Maradana North, Maradana South, and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in Kotahena North and Wellawatta North, as against 19 in the previous week, and 22 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Twenty-three deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 5 in St. Paul's, 4 in San Sebastian, 3 in Kotahena South, 2 each in Kotahena North, New Bazaar, and Maradana North, and 1 each in Pettah, Maradana hospitals (of a non-resident), Slave Island, Wellawatta North, and Wellawatta South, as against 17 in the previous week, and 9 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident) and 1 in Wellawatta North, as against 5 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Fourteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 8 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Kotahena South, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Maradana South, and Slave Island, as against 13 in the previous week, and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Phthisis* of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Five deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents) and 1 each in New Bazaar and Maradana East, as against 4 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from *Plague* was registered in St. Paul's, as against nil in the previous week.

5. Thirty-five deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 10 from *Debility*, 9 each from *Diarrhoea* and *infantile Convulsions*, 7 from *Worms*, 5 from *Puerperal Septicaemia*, 3 from *Dysentery*, 2 from *Accidents*, 1 each from *Tetanus* and *Homicide*, and 72 from *Other Causes*.

6. **Reported Cases.**—Nineteen cases of *Chickenpox*, 11 of *Enteric Fever*, 3 of measles, and 1 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 17, 8, 4, and nil, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82.2°, against 81.1° in the preceding week and 79.6° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.856 in., against 29.855 in. in the preceding week and 29.839 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.19 in., against 1.91 in. in the preceding week and 1.53 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Surveying and Levelling Examination.

THE examination for the Surveyor-General's licence in surveying and levelling (Ordinance No. 26 of 1909), will be held in two parts, written and practical. The written examination will begin on October 13, and the practical examination on November 10, 1930.

- The subjects of the written examination will be as follows:—

(i.) *English*—one paper.—[An exercise in composition and questions set to test the candidate's knowledge and command of English.]

(ii.) *Arithmetic and Algebra*—one paper.—[*Arithmetic*.—The principles and process of arithmetic applied to whole numbers and vulgar and decimal fractions. The metric system. Approximations to a specified degree of accuracy. Contracted methods of multiplication and division of decimals. Ratio and proportion; percentage. Averages. Practical applications of arithmetic.

Algebra.—Symbolical expression of general results in arithmetic algebraic laws and their applications. Factors of simple binomial or quadratic expressions; Equations of the first or second degree, and problems leading thereto. Square root. Graphs of simple rational integral algebraic functions. Arithmetical and harmonical progression. Geometrical progression. Theory of indices. Logarithms and the use of logarithmic tables. Binomial theorem for a positive integral index.]

(iii.) *Geometry and Trigonometry*—one paper.
[*Geometry*.—The subjects of Euclid I.—IV., with simple deductions, including easy loci and the areas of triangles and parallelograms, of which the bases and altitudes are given commensurable lengths. (All proofs of geometrical theorems must be geometrical. Euclid's proofs will not be insisted upon.) Similar figures. Mensuration of the circle.

Mensuration of the simpler solid bodies, namely, the cube, the rectangular block, the tetrahedron, the sphere, the cylinder, the wedge, the pyramid, and the cone.

Trigonometry.—Up to and including the solution of triangles, together with the practical solutions of triangles and applications, and numerical examples involving the use of logarithmic and other tables.]

(iv.) *Surveying.*—one paper.—[Chain surveying. The transit and cradle theodolites, their use and their adjustments. Theodolite and compass traverses. Curve ranging. Subtense methods and tacheometry. Plane table surveying. Plane triangulation. The determination of azimuth.]

(v.) *Levelling.*—one paper.—[The dumpy, Y and Cooke's reversible levels, their use and their adjustments. The practice and theory of levelling. Computation of earth-work. Road and railway surveys and setting out. Surveys for water supply works. Contours and the calculation of contents therefrom.]

The percentages of marks required for a pass will be: in papers (i.), (ii.), and (iii.) 40 per cent. in each paper and 50 per cent. in aggregate; in papers (iv.), and (v.) 60 per cent.

6. Candidates in surveying only will be required to pass in papers (i.)-(iv.) inclusive; and candidates in levelling only in paper (v.).

7. Candidates who fail in the written examination will not be required to present themselves for the practical examination.

8. Candidates who pass the written examination will be duly notified of the time and place of the practical examination, which will be sent on the syllabuses in surveying and levelling of the written examination.

9. Candidates will work in the field between hours fixed by the Examiner, and must produce instruments in good order. Defects in instruments will not be accepted as an excuse for bad work. Candidates found to be in communication with anyone during examination hours will be disqualified.

10. All candidates must provide their own instruments, poles, pickets, drawing boards, drawing materials, stationery, coolies, &c., and no assistance in providing requirements will be given in any way.

11. No application will be accepted after September 13, 1930.

A.—Rs. 400,000 was voted this financial year towards the widening of the Galle road between Bagatelle road and Dickman's road which includes the section referred to in the question.

(2) Q.—What progress has been made with regard to acquisition in this section and when the actual construction of widening this section is likely to be taken up? A.—So far as is known no acquisitions have taken place since the temple property was acquired. Until a reasonable section is acquired the construction cannot begin. The Chairman cannot say when this is likely to occur.

(3) Q.—Whether the acquisition is being done by the Government Assessor or the Municipal Assessor? A.—Government have directed that the Government Agent of the Western Province should carry out these acquisitions in future.

(4) Q.—If delay in completing the acquisition is because acquisition is done by the Government Assessor, whether the Chairman will arrange for the Municipal Assessor to undertake the work as he had done in the past so, that the work may be completed as early as possible owing to danger to life due to delay in completing the widening of the road? A.—It is understood that the delay has been in the survey and the issue of the mandate and not as suggested in the question.

(5) Q.—Whether the Government object to the Municipal Assessor doing the acquisition as they have done with regard to the assessing of Government properties, and, if so, whether the Chairman will invite the attention of Government to the urgent need of completing the acquisition in this section so that the work of construction may be undertaken by the Council without delay? A.—Acquisitions are not carried out by Assessors, but by the Government Agent or the Chairman. So far as the Chairman is aware Government has no objection to receiving the advice and assistance of the Municipal Assessor. The Chairman has already requested Government to cause the acquisition to be expedited.

3. Pursuant to notice, Dr. E. A. Coorey moved :—“That this Council do resolve that a reasonable proportion of the cost of construction, drainage, and lighting of private lanes in the city developed after 1915, be borne by the Council and that the Four Standing Committees be asked to report as to what proportion of the cost is to be met by the Council.” The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.

The Chairman stated that a Special Committee of Council considered the whole question of private roads and made certain recommendations which the Council adopted. The resolution before the meeting was a reversal of that policy and he would suggest that it should be referred to either the Works and Finance Committees or to the Committee which originally dealt with the matter. Dr. E. V. Ratnam spoke to the motion.

Dr. E. A. Coorey moved, as an amendment, that the matter be referred to the Four Standing Committees, for consideration and report. The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

4. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved :—That the Council should resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council to consider the following extracts from the proceedings of the Committees annexed to the Agenda. The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

Council in Committee.

The following Extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of May 20, 1930, was considered.

(2) To consider an application from Dr. L. F. Hirst, City Microbiologist (supported by the Medical Officer of Health) for extension of 28 days half-pay leave commuted to 14 days full pay. Registered No. 05,315.

As there was only this item on the Agenda, the Committee did not meet, but signified their approval of the extension being granted.—Recommended accordingly to Council.

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of May 21, 1930, were considered.

MUNICIPAL ASSESSOR'S DEPARTMENT.

(2) To consider a memorandum of the Chairman, dated March 28, 1930, with regard to the calling of “Galle road,” where it goes through Bambalapitiya Ward, “Wellawatta road” inquiring “Do you care to alter the name to “Bambalapitiya road”—a name which has not been used since December, 1925, when it was abolished for the road now called “Havelock road?” Registered No. 349.—Recommended that the portion of the Galle road between Laurie's road and Kirilapone canal be called “Bambalapitiya road,” because it runs through the Bambalapitiya Ward.

MUNICIPAL ENGINEER'S DEPARTMENT.

(3) To consider an application from the Notts C. & A. C. for permission to erect a small temporary pavilion in Victoria Park at the site shown in plan attached to papers. Registered No. 448.

Resolved that the matter be left for the decision of the Council.

Resolution of Council.

Mr. F. Dadabhoy moved that the application be not allowed. Mr. E. G. Eastman seconded. Dr. S. Muttiah and Mr. M. L. M. Royall spoke against the motion. Dr. E. V. Ratnam and Dr. E. A. Coorey inquired about the permanent nature of the building. Mr. R. L. Pereira spoke in support of the motion.

Mr. M. L. M. Royall moved, as an amendment, that the application be referred to the Housing and Town Improvement Committee for consideration and report. Dr. S. Muttiah seconded.—Lost.

The original motion of Mr. Dadabhoy, namely, that the application be not allowed, was put to the meeting and carried.

(4) To recommend that, in terms of section 47 of Chapter VIII. of the Municipal Council by-laws, notices be served on the owners of the following premises for the removal of the dangerous coconut trees standing thereon :—No. 44, Siripina road and Nos. 20 and 21A, New Moor street, (three trees). Registered No. 03,913.—Recommended.

(5) To consider letter No. C 767, dated May 3, 1930, from the Superintendent of Police, Colombo, suggesting that Prince street, Fort, should be made a one-way street for traffic from York to Queen street, and the suggestion of the Chairman that the Governor in Executive Council be asked to make the following by-law under section 18 of Ordinance No. 4 of 1916 :—“ All vehicular traffic (except push bicycles and rickshaws while actually carrying passengers) when proceeding along Prince street, Fort, within the Municipality of Colombo, shall proceed and when halted shall halt only facing the direction towards Queen street ” and the following under section 58 (1) of Ordinance 20 of 1927 :—Add to Regulation in Gazette of October 19, 1928, Prince street, Fort—facing Queen street. Registered No. 617.—Recommended.

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Special Meeting on Law, Works, and Finance Committees (meeting together) of May 21, 1930, was considered.

(2) To consider the petition presented through Dr. E. A. Coorey in Council on May 14, 1930, from Mrs. M. P. Fernando with regard to damage to her house No. 55, Sri Wickrome road, Wellawatta, by drainage works. Registered No. 632. (Dr. E. A. Coorey and Mr. E. G. Eastman were present to consider this item.)—Recommended that the Council should increase its offer to Rs. 15,000 to cover all claims connected with the damage caused to this house.

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Municipal Works and Finance (meeting together) of May 21, 1930, were considered.

MUNICIPAL ENGINEER'S DEPARTMENT.

(5) To consider in terms of the resolution of the Works and Finance Committees of August 20, 1929, a report of Mr. H. Wijenathan, Drainage Engineer, dated April 23, 1930, on the results of his study on the treatment of sewage in England and his application for the payment of £6. 5s. being travelling and incidental expenses incurred by him. Registered No. 609.—Recommended that the expenses amounting to £6. 5s. be paid.

(7) To consider :—(a) A petition from a number of residents and ratepayers of Mutwal (supported by the Ward Member) pointing out the need of appointing a whole time instructress for the Girls' Playground at Elie House Park and suggesting that the present part time playground instructress be given the whole time appointment. (b) Reports thereon of the Municipal Engineer and the Chief Playground Instructor. Registered No. 477. (b) The recommendation of the Librarian (supported by the Municipal Treasurer) that the quotation of Messrs. Gordon and Gotch, Ltd., be accepted as follows :—Non-fiction books published up to 20s., terms 15 per cent. off published price. Non-fiction books published over 20s., terms 20 per cent. off published price, Colonial Cloth Novels published price 7s. 6d. at 3s. 6d. a copy, 3s. 6d. novels at 2s. 8d. a copy, 2s. 6d. novels at 1s. 11d. a copy, 2s. novels at 1s. 6d. a copy. Extras :—Their commission of 7½ per cent. Council's Agents' commission 3 per cent. and packing and forwarding charges. The cost of books during 1930, is estimated at Rs. 7,500 and will be met from the sanctioned vote. Registered No. 636.—Recommended.

LEAVE.

(12) To recommend that, under section 6 of Municipal Council Leave by-laws, the excess leave of 4 days over 42 days granted to Mr. S. H. D. S. de Silva, Division II., Clerk of the Municipal Assessor's Department, be sanctioned. Registered No. 05,035.—Recommended.

(13) To consider the recommendation of the Municipal Treasurer that the excess leave of 13 days over 42 days granted to Miss E. Jansen, Health Visitor of the Public Health Department be allowed on half-pay as she had taken her accumulated vacation leave she was entitled for 1928 and 1929, and as she had exhausted all her lapsed vacation leave. Registered No. 05,307.—Recommended.

(14) To consider :—(a) Letter No. 1,235 of April 5, 1930, from the Colonial Auditor suggesting that a misprint of sub-section (i.) for section (ii.) in the Municipal Leave By-laws No. 10 (ii.) be rectified. PENSIONS AND GRATUITIES.

(17) To recommend, under section 24 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity amounting to Rs. 595, as follows, to the widow and four minor children of Mr. G. A. Hopman, Marketkeeper, Public Health Department, who died on March 3, 1930:—Widow, 3 months' salary, Rs. 255, 1 month's salary to each of the 4 minor children Rs. 340.—Total Rs. 595. Registered No. 604.—Recommended.

(18) To recommend, under sections 2 and 15 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a pension, with effect from May 1, 1930, of Rs. 576·20 per annum to Mr. J. O. Fernando of the Public Health Department, on his retirement on the ground of overage. The pension is based on his service of 141 months, and his salary of Rs. 2,064 per annum. Registered No. 621.—Recommended.

(19) To recommend, under sections 2 (iii.) and 15 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a pension of Rs. 720 per annum, with effect from February 19, 1930, to Mr. I. A. S. Wahid, Compositor, Secretary's Department, on his retirement from the Council's service on reaching the age limit. The pension is based on his service of 452 months and his salary of Rs. 1,080 per annum. Registered No. 178.—Recommended.

APPLICATION FOR ADVANCE.

(20) To consider:—(a) The application of Mr. R. C. Thiedeman, Foreman, Drainage Municipal Engineer's Department for an advance Rs. 780 to enable him to purchase a motor car for official duties. (b) The recommendation of the Municipal Treasurer that the advance be granted on the usual terms, viz., that the amount be repaid in twelve equal monthly instalments and that 5 per cent. a year be charged as interest on the balance outstanding from time to time. Registered No. 05,963.—Recommended.

The following Extract from the Minutes of the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) of May 23, 1930, was considered.

(8) *Relief to Municipal Officers.*—The next item was to consider the question of relief to Municipal Officers who had lost their clothing, furniture, &c., and, in some cases their houses as well, both inside and outside Colombo. A form of claim had been devised and would be distributed to the Council's employees, asking them for details of their losses of house property, cooking utensils, furniture, &c. He would like guidance as to whether any assistance should be given to replace these losses, and if so, from what funds.

A discussion arose with regard to this question.

The Chairman considered that, as private employers were affording relief to their employees, it behoved the Council similarly to help its employees who had been affected by the floods.

Dr. S. Muttiah eventually moved "That the Council do vote a sum of Rs. 2,500 towards the relief of Municipal employees."

The majority of the members of the Four Standing Committees present voted in favour of this motion, but the majority of all the members present were not in favour of it.

Resolution of Council.

The Chairman read a memorandum regarding the action taken as a result of the floods since the last meeting.

Dr. E. A. Coorey moved that the Council do vote a sum of Rs. 2,500 towards the relief of the Municipal employees and thanked the Chairman and the staff for the excellent work done in connection with the flood crisis.

Mr. R. L. Pereira thought the sum of Rs. 2,500 was inadequate in view of the claim that the loss suffered by the Municipal employees amounted to Rs. 45,000.

The Chairman stated that the sum he had in mind was Rs. 5,000.

Dr. E. A. Coorey then moved that the Council do vote a sum of Rs. 5,000 towards the relief of the Municipal employees. Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy seconded. The Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando supported the motion.

Mr. M. L. M. Royal wished to know whether the Chairman intended to place before the Council the question of affording relief from Municipal Funds for damage suffered by other ratepayers.

The Chairman pointed out that he had in his memorandum stated he would do so as soon as the figures had been ascertained.

The motion was put to the meeting and carried.

The following Extract from the Minutes of the Special Committee relating to Bakeries and Eating-houses of May 16, 1930, was considered.

(2) To re-consider the by-laws relating to bakeries, which were considered *seriatim* and in connection with the suggestions made at a previous meeting by the representatives of the Master Bakers' Association.—Recommended that the by-laws should be amended as shown below, the amendments appearing in italics:—

I.—CONDITIONS OF ISSUE OF LICENCE.

Present Conditions.

1. (c) That the average height of every room is not less than 10 feet and the height in no place is less than 7 feet and the walls are built of brick, stone, or cabook with the inside thereof limeplastered and limewashed.

(d) That all the eaves are at least 6 feet from the ground and are not more than 18 inches in length.

(h) That the premises are provided with adequate drainage.

2. (a) That the room in which kneading takes place has a superficial floor space of not less than 180 square feet with a clear space of not less than 2 feet round the kneading tables and that the lower 5 feet of the internal surface of the walls is covered with glazed tiles or is plastered with cement and that the kitchen is not less than 80 square feet in area and is provided with an efficient smoke vent.

3. (a) That the troughs, tables, and all the utensils used in the making of bread are capable of being moved about for the purpose of cleaning the floor and the walls.

(c) That the kneading room shall be rendered fly-proof by means of wire gauze screens in windows and doors and that the flour shall be stored in a special fly-proofed room provided with dovetailed ceiling.

Amended Conditions.

That the average height of every room is not less than 10 feet and the height in no place is less than 7 feet and the walls are built of brick, *concrete*, stone, or cabook with the inside thereof limeplastered and limewashed.

That all the eaves are at least 6 feet from the ground.

That the premises are provided with adequate *surface* drainage.

That the room in which kneading takes place has a superficial floor space of not less than 180 square feet with a clear space of not less than 2 feet round the *main* kneading table and that the lower 5 feet of the internal surface of the walls is covered with glazed tiles or is plastered with cement and that the kitchen is not less than 80 square feet in area and is provided with an efficient smoke vent.

That the troughs, tables, *except the main kneading table*, and all the utensils used in the making of bread are capable of being moved about for the purpose of cleaning the floor and the walls.

That the kneading room shall be rendered fly-proof by means of wire gauze screens in windows and doors and that the flour, *if flour is stored*, shall be stored in a special fly-proofed room provided with dovetailed ceiling.

II.—REGULATIONS FOR LICENSED BAKERIES.

Present Conditions.

1. Every licensee of a bakery shall keep affixed in a conspicuous position on the outside of his premises a board with his name and the words "Licensed Bakery" legibly painted thereon in the English and vernacular languages.

2. Every licensee of a bakery shall cause a copy of these regulations in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil, and the licence to be framed and hung in a prominent place in the licensed premises, and shall also cause a list of the names and addresses of all employees (including the vendors of bread) to be kept in the bakery so as to be available for inspection at all reasonable times by the Chairman or any person authorized by him.

3. Every licensee of a bakery shall cause the walls of every room forming part of the bakery to be limewashed twice a year in the months of June and December; the ceiling to be limewashed four times a year in the months of March, June, September, and December; the woodwork to be limewashed or, if oil painted, to be washed with hot water and soap at least twice a year in the months of June and December, and at any other time if so ordered by the Chairman in writing.

4. Every licensee of a bakery shall cause the floor and the tiled or cemented portions of the walls and the tops of the tables to be washed every day at such hour as shall be specified in the licence. He shall cause every part of the bakery, its surroundings, drains, furniture, utensils, and equipment used in the making of bread to be kept in good repair, clean, and free from effluvia arising from any drain, latrine, cesspit, or other nuisance on the licensed premises. He shall cause all trade and domestic refuse to be immediately placed in an impervious covered receptacle, which shall be removed from the bakery and cleared once a day. The receptacle shall always be kept covered except when refuse is being actually placed therein.

5. Every licensee of a bakery shall use for the manufacture of bread good and wholesome flour, water, and other materials. He shall store the flour on a movable platform constructed in the manner herein specified and in a special room, with adequate ventilation, set apart for the purpose and rendered fly-proof.

The platform shall be of any convenient length and breadth, consisting of a single layer of stout planks supported on legs 3 feet high. The legs of the platform should not be permanently fixed in the floor. The edges of the planked top should stand out 9 inches away from the frame underneath, so as to prevent rats crawling up the legs and round the edge of the planked top. The platform shall be so constructed that there are no shelves or recesses under the planked top to provide harbour for rats.

The platform should be a movable one, so that it may be lifted away from the position and the floor underneath cleaned. It should be placed at least 9 inches away from the wall. He shall keep the space beneath and around the platform free from all obstructions.

10. (b) No licensee of a bakery shall connive at or permit the contravention by any person of the provisions of the above regulation 10 (a).

11. No licensee of a bakery shall store or keep or allow to be stored or kept in the room where bread is prepared or stored, or in which the materials for making bread are stored, any furniture, clothes, sleeping mats, or any articles, other than those used in the manufacture of bread.

16. Every licensee of a bakery shall cause all bread except fancy bread, rolls, biscuits, or confectionery, to be stamped with figures denoting one or other of the following weights, viz. :—

$\frac{1}{4}$ lb., $\frac{1}{2}$ lb., 1 lb., 2 lb., or 4 lbs.

He shall not sell or expose for sale any bread, except fancy bread, rolls, biscuits, or confectionery, which shall not have one of the aforesaid weights stamped on it or which shall be found to weigh less than the weight stamped thereon.

18. No licensee of a bakery shall allow any person to transport bread from his bakery for sale, unless such person is in possession of a card of registration signed by the Chairman and by the licensee of the bakery. Such cards shall not be transferable.

Amended Conditions.

Every licensee of a bakery shall keep affixed in a conspicuous position on the outside of his premises a board with, his name and the words "Licensed Bakery" legibly painted thereon in *one or more languages*.

Every licensee of a bakery shall cause a copy of these regulations in *one or more languages*, and the licence to be framed and hung in a prominent place in the licensed premises, and shall also cause a list of the names and addresses of all employees (including the vendors of bread) to be kept in the bakery so as to be available for inspection at all reasonable times by the Chairman or any person authorized by him.

Every licensee of a bakery shall cause the walls of every room forming part of the bakery to be limewashed twice a year in the months of June and December; the ceiling, *if not oil painted*, to be limewashed four times a year in the months of March, June, September, and December; the woodwork to be limewashed or, if oil painted, to be washed with hot water and soap at least twice a year in the months of June and December and at any other time if so ordered by the Chairman in writing.

Every licensee of a bakery shall cause the floor and the tiled or cemented portions of the walls and the tops of the tables to be washed every day. He shall cause every part of the bakery, its surroundings, drains, furniture, utensils, and equipment used in the making of bread to be kept in good repair, clean, and free from effluvia arising from any drain, latrine, cesspit, or other nuisance on the licensed premises. He shall cause all trade and domestic refuse to be immediately placed in an impervious covered receptacle, which shall be removed from the bakery and cleared once a day. The receptacle shall always be kept covered except when refuse is being actually placed therein.

Every licensee of a bakery shall use for the manufacture of bread good and wholesome flour, water, and other materials. He shall store the flour on a movable platform constructed in the manner herein specified and in a special room, with adequate ventilation set apart for the purpose and rendered fly-proof.

The platform shall be of any convenient length and breadth, consisting of a single layer of stout planks supported on legs *foot* high. The legs of the platform should not be permanently fixed in the floor. The edges of the planked top should stand out 9 inches away from the frame underneath, so as to prevent rats crawling up the legs and round the edge of the planked top. The platform shall be so constructed that there are no shelves or recesses under the planked top to provide harbour for rats.

The platform should be a movable one, so that it may be lifted away from the position and the floor underneath cleaned. It should be placed at least 9 inches away from the wall. He shall keep the space beneath and around the platform free from all obstructions.

No licensee of a bakery shall connive at or *knowingly* permit the contravention by any person of the provisions of the above regulation 10 (a).

No licensee of a bakery shall store or keep or allow to be stored or kept in the room where bread is prepared or in which the materials for making bread are stored, any furniture, clothes, sleeping mats, or any articles, other than those used in the manufacture of bread.

To be deleted and the following to be substituted as 16.

No cooking shall be done on the premises except in the oven of the bakery or in a kitchen of not less than 80 square feet and provided with an efficient smoke vent.

No licensee of a bakery shall allow any person to transport bread from his bakery for sale, unless such person is in possession of a card of registration signed by the Chairman and by the licensee of the bakery. *The licensee shall keep a register of those to whom he issues cards and shall notify the Medical Officer of Health of any change in the persons using cards.*

19. The Chairman shall, on application made to him by the licensee of a bakery, issue cards of registration for use by every person employed by such licensee in transporting bread for sale.

The Chairman shall, on application made to him by the licensee of a bakery, issue cards of registration for use by every person employed by such licensee in transporting bread for sale, provided that such person is free from any infectious, contagious, or loathsome disease.

Recommended that the following by-laws shall not be enforced to the extent indicated in regard to premises licensed as bakeries before January 1, 1930 :—

Condition No. 1 (a) The whole. (c) As regards the height of the rooms and the materials of the walls. (d) The whole.

Condition No. 2 (a) As regards the superficial floor space of the kneading room and as regards the provision of a kitchen and the area and smoke vent of the kitchen, if provided. (b) The extractor fan to be provided only where electric current is available within 50 feet of the premises.

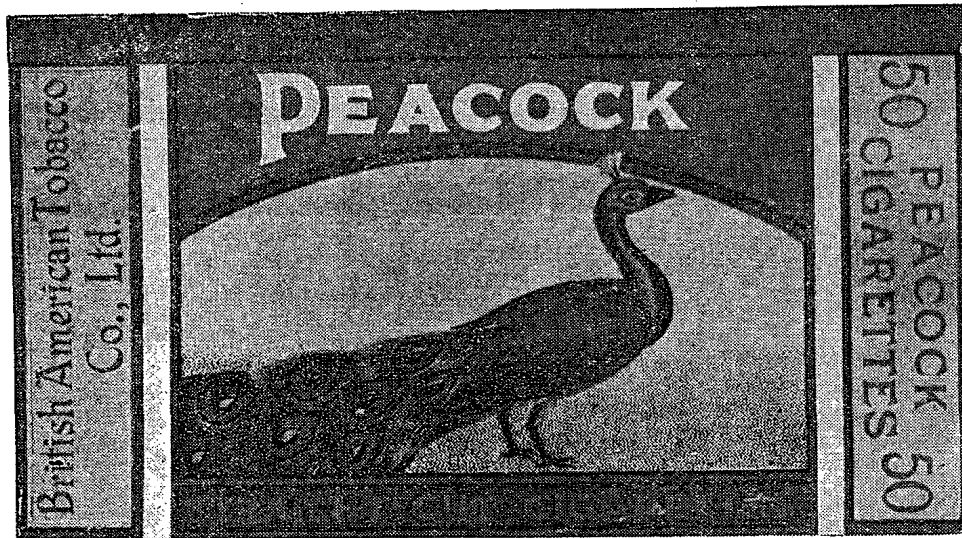

UNDER and by virtue of the powers conferred upon the Clearing Office and the undersigned Administrator of Hungarian Property by section I. (xiv.) of the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Orders 1921-23, a rule was made on the 26th May, 1923, duly approved by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council prescribing the 31st August, 1923, as the final date by which proofs by British nationals of debts due to them by Hungarian nationals or of pecuniary obligations of the Hungarian Government under Article 231 of the Treaty of Trianon must be made upon the prescribed forms and lodged with the Clearing Office, Enemy (Hungarian) Debts in order to participate in the distribution of funds in the hands of the Administrator of Hungarian Property, London, arising out of the liquidation of property, rights and interests of nationals of the former Kingdom of Hungary transferred to or vested in him under the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Orders, 1921 to 1923, or received by him from the Hungarian Clearing Office in pursuance of the Convention between His Majesty's Government and the Hungarian Government of the 20th December, 1921, respecting the settlement of Enemy Debts referred to in section III. of Part X. of the above-mentioned Treaty, or arising out of any other available property, and it was by the said Rule provided that in any case where it is proved to the satisfaction of the undersigned Administrator, that the Claimant should have become aware only at a date subsequent

to the 1st August, 1923, of the existence or amount of a claim, the undersigned Administrator might extend the period for lodging the Proof of Claim with the said Clearing Office until two calendar months after the Claimant should have become aware of the existence and amount of the claim in question.

Now by way of variation of the proviso to the above-mentioned rule and in exercise of the powers conferred upon the Clearing Office and the undersigned Administrator as aforesaid I hereby prescribe the 21st day of July, 1930, as the final date in case of British nationals, whose claims come within the exception contained in the above-mentioned proviso, by which proofs of debts due to them by Hungarian nationals or of pecuniary obligations of the Hungarian Government under Article 231 of the Treaty of Trianon must be made upon the prescribed forms and lodged with the Clearing Office, Enemy (Hungarian) Debts in order to participate in the distribution of funds in the hands of the Administrator of Hungarian Property, London, arising out of the liquidation of the property, rights, and interests of nationals of the former Kingdom of Hungary or otherwise as in the said Rule of the 26th day of May, 1923, particularly mentioned.
