IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government in Executive Council has, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 30 (1) of "The Village Communities Ordinance, No. 9 of 1924," been pleased to approve of the following rules made under the provisions of section 29 (1) (4) of the said Ordinance by the Village Committees elected and duly authorized by the inhabitants in the subdivisions of Weligama and Akuressa in Weligam korale, Matara District, Southern Province, and the same are published for general information.

#### RULES.

1. The Committee may by resolution establish markets where it considers such markets to be necessary and fix a scale of fees to be paid for the use thereof and such fees shall be payable on demand to the Chairman or the person authorized by him.
2. The scale of fees leviable under rule 1 in respect of any market shall be printed in English and Sinhalese and exhibited in a conspicuous place in the market, and it shall be unlawful for any person to demand or receive higher sums than those authorized by such notice.
3. The Committee may by resolution set apart any portion of the market for the sale of specified articles, and no person shall expose for sale in any portion of the market so set aside any articles other than those specified.
4. It shall be lawful for the Committee to advertise the annual leasing of the market and by auction or by tender, to lease it to such bidder or tenderer as it may approve.
5. No person shall hold, use, or occupy any stall in a market without the permission of the Chairman of the Committee or the lessee for the year, and no person shall keep or expose for sale in any such stall any article which has been prohibited by the Committee by notice posted in the market.
6. No occupant of a stall shall enclose in any way any portion of a market or erect any awning or screen or fixture of any kind, nor shall he leave any goods in any market between the hours of 9 P.M. and 6 A.M. without having first obtained the sanction of the Chairman.
7. Every occupant of a stall or seat in any market shall keep such stall or seat clean and free from filth or rubbish. No person affected with or suffering from any cutaneous, contagious, or infectious disease shall occupy any stall, seat, or place in any market, or expose for sale thereat any provisions whatsoever.
8. No person using or occupying any market shall—
  - (a) Behave in a disorderly manner or commit any nuisance in the market and its premises.
  - (b) Carry on any cooking in the market.
  - (c) Remain or loiter about in such market after the place is closed for business at 9 P.M. unless he can satisfactorily account for his presence.
  - (d) Damage or in anywise deface any portion of the buildings, stalls, lamps, or any property of the Committee in such market and its premises or defile or pollute in any way the water provided for use in such market.
9. All markets shall be open daily from 6 A.M. to 9 P.M. on the days on which such markets are held.
10. It shall be the duty of the market keeper or of the lessee of the market to maintain order within the limits of the market. No person shall obstruct or resist any person appointed by the Committee (a) to superintend any market, (b) to collect the rents or fees therefor, (c) to enforce order or cleanliness therein whilst such person is engaged in the execution of his duty.
11. It shall be the duty of the market lessee to keep the market premises and buildings clear and free from filth and rubbish and in a sanitary condition.

12. No cart or vehicle shall remain within the premises of any market for a longer period than is necessary for loading and unloading.

13. Every person holding a stall in a market shall keep on or near such stall a receptacle, to be approved by the Chairman, in which shall be deposited all rubbish and refuse matter from the stall.

14. No person shall deposit any rubbish, refuse, bones, skins of animals, or other such thing in any market or its premises except in receptacles provided for such purpose.

15. If any person holding or occupying a stall in any market, without being able to assign a satisfactory reason, wilfully neglects or refuses to serve the public during two consecutive days, the Chairman may suspend or revoke his authority to hold or occupy that stall.

Between October 1 and March 31, no fishing shall take place within the Sally Port fishing area except by means of hand lines or hand nets thrown in either case from the rocks or seashore; or by means of the nets called “adasavalai,” subject, however, in the case of “adasavalai” nets to the rules following.

4. Such “adasavalai” nets as are approved by the Assistant Government Agent of Trincomalee only may be used within the area aforesaid; and on such days of the week as may be appointed by the Assistant Government Agent from time to time.

5. Applications for the approval of “adasavalai” nets to be used for fishing in the Sally Port fishing area shall be made to the Assistant Government Agent between August 15 and September 1 of each year in writing.

6. The Assistant Government Agent may grant such approval after inspection of the nets on a day to be fixed by him, notice of which shall be given by beat of tom-tom not less than 14 days before the date so fixed.

SCHEDULE.

*The Sally Port Fishing Area.*

The area is bounded on the south-east by the rocky shore of Fort Frederick and the Sally Port, on the south-west by the Back Bay seabeach, on the north-east by an imaginary line drawn from the seaward extremity of Fort Frederick (Flagstaff Point) to Elizabeth Point, on the north-west by the extension in a north-easterly direction of a line drawn between two painted wooden posts set in the Back Bay seabeach at a distance of 200 yards from the Sally Port.

This line runs parallel to the rocky shore of Fort Frederick and not more than 200 yards distance from it at any point.

## REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations the expression “camp area” shall mean the space within the boundaries specified in the schedule hereto,

and “Assistant Government Agent” shall mean the Assistant Government Agent of the Puttalam and Chilaw Districts.

2. No person shall camp in any place within the camp area where camping is prohibited by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent.

3. No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at the places provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

4. No person shall deposit any liquid or solid refuse or any rubbish within the camp area, except in the places or receptacles provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

5. (a) No cattle shall be kept in the camp area, and no cattle shall be kept in the vicinity of the camp area except at a place specially appointed as a cattle gala or at a place approved for such use by the Assistant Government Agent.

(b) The person in charge of cattle shall cause their droppings within the camp area to be removed to a place provided therefor, and he shall at all times keep clean the place occupied by his cattle.

6. All prepared foods sold within the camp area shall be protected from flies and dust by being (a) wrapped in or covered with clean paper or cloth, or (b) kept in closed glass cases, or (c) kept in other covered containers approved by the Medical Officer, or by the Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

7. No person who is likely to affect prejudicially the cleanliness of the camp area, and no person who is suffering from an infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the camp area.

8. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, the Assistant Government Agent may direct the pilgrims to leave the place of pilgrimage, and may prescribe the routes and methods for their conveyance.

9. (a) Every person within the camp area who is suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease, and (b) every person who resides with him knowing that he is so suffering shall report the case to the Medical or Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

10. When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any particular purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use the tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is set apart.

11. No person shall keep bakeries, aerated water manufactories, or galas within the camp area without previously obtaining a licence from the Assistant Government Agent, permitting him to do so. The licence shall be issued free of charge.

12. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building within the camp area so as to encroach on the main or other streets of the camp.

13. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, discharge fireworks and firearms within the camp area, or within a radius of one mile from the boundaries of such area.

14. No person shall slaughter animals within the camp area, except in the place provided for the purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent, and every person slaughtering animals in such a place shall be responsible for its cleanliness.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended July 26, 1930.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 146 (1 European, 8 Burghers, 81 Sinhalese, 26 Tamils, 22 Moors, 6 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1930, viz., 270,700) was 28.1 as against 29.1 in the preceding week, 28.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.5 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 189 (1 European, 9 Burghers, 102 Sinhalese, 41 Tamils, 22 Moors, 5 Malays, and 9 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 36.4, as against 39.7 in the previous week, 34.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.9 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 189 total deaths, 33 were of infants under one year of age, as against 48 in the preceding week, 38 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

**Principal Causes of Deaths.**—1. (a) Nineteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals, 3 in Maradana North, 2 each in St. Paul's, New Bazaar, and Maradana East, and 1 each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta North, as against 21 in the previous week, and 22 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Seventeen deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 each in Kotahena South and Slave Island, 2 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, and Kotahena North, and 1 each in New Bazaar, Maradana hospitals, Maradana North, Maradana East, and Wellawatta South, as against 15 in the previous week, and 9 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in Maradana North, Slave Island, and Wellawatta North, as against 5 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Fourteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 12 in Maradana hospitals (including 6 deaths of non-residents), and 1 each in St. Paul's and Kollupitiya, as against 9 in the previous week, and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Three deaths from *Phthisis* of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Eight deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), and 1 each in Kotahena North, Maradana North, and Maradana East, as against 9 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. Twenty-seven deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 12 from *Dysentery*, 6 from *Debility*, 5 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 4 from *Diarrhoea*, 3 each from *Worms*, *Puerperal Septicaemia*, and *Accidents*, and 65 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Nineteen cases of *Chickenpox*, 16 of *Enteric Fever*, and 1 of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 17, 15, and 2, respectively, of the preceding week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 81.3°, against 81.5° in the preceding week and 81.7° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.850 in., against 29.888 in. in the preceding week and 29.886 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.16 in., against 0.61 in. in the preceding week and 0.04 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

## General Meeting.

Wednesday, July 2, 1930, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M. pursuant to notice dated June 25, 1930.

Coorey, M.L.C. ; Mr. G. W. Dodds ; Mr. A. H. G. Dawson ; Mr. M. L. M. Reyal ; Dr. S. Muttiah ; Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike ; Mr. T. C. Dyball ; Dr. V. van Langenberg, V.D. ; Mr. F. Dadabhoy, J.P. ; Mr. H. L. Grocock ; Mr. E. G. Eastman, O.B.E. ; and Lt.-Col. F. A. Ferguson, D.S.O.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of June 4, 1930, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of June 4, 1930, be confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved—(1) That this Council desires to place on record its appreciation of the services rendered to the citizens of Colombo by the late Dr. David Rockwood, who was a Member of this Council, from July, 1908, to December, 1914, and a Member of the Public Library Committee since its inception in November, 1924, and to give expression to the Council's deep regret at his sad death. (2) That the Chairman do convey to his relatives a copy of this resolution with an expression of the Council's sympathy with them in their great bereavement. The Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando seconded.

The motion was put to the meeting and passed in silence, all the Members standing.

2. (a) The Chairman stated that before proceeding further with the business he would like, on behalf of the Council, to offer congratulations to the Hon. Dr. E. A. Coorey on his election to the Legislative Council as the representative for Colombo South Constituency.

The Hon. Dr. E. A. Coorey bowed his thanks.

3. The following motion stood in the name of the Chairman :—" That the Council's resolution of June 4, 1930, that the Council do vote a sum of Rs. 5,000 towards the relief of the Municipal employees, should be amended to read: That the Council do vote a sum of Rs. 5,000 towards the relief of the poor who have suffered from the floods of May, 1930."

The Chairman stated that he had received a communication from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary indicating that under the Municipal Ordinance the Council had no power to vote any money for the flood damage caused to Council's own employees. Council only had power to vote money in this connection "for the relief of the poor." He, therefore, withdrew the motion and suggested that the question of granting relief to Council's employees be dealt with in connection with the relief to other persons.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike was to move—" That, as the sum now being distributed by way of compensation to flood sufferers is only for the loss of movables sustained by occupants of houses and represents only a very small percentage of the losses sustained in that manner, this Council do vote a sum necessary to grant relief to owners of houses affected for purposes of repair and re-erection and also for payment of compensation for loss of movables where the sums now being paid are unreasonably low, and that Government be again asked to inform this Council, without delay, whether they are prepared to pay all or any proportion of this amount"; but, with the permission of the Council, moved—" That the matter be referred to a Special Committee to go into the details and to submit a report to the Council, as to the amount which the Council should vote." The Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando seconded.

The Chairman stated the facts with regard to flood relief up to date.

There was a discussion in which Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike, Dr. S. Muttiah, Mr. R. L. Pereira, and Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy took part.

The motion was put to the meeting and carried.

Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike moved that the Special Committee consist of the following members :—The Chairman, the Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy, Mr. T. G. Jayewardene, Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike, and Mr. E. G. Eastman. Mr. M. L. M. Reyal seconded.—carried.

The Hon. Dr. E. A. Coorey moved that this item be referred back to the Works and Finance Committees for re-consideration. Mr. M. L. M. Royal seconded.—Carried.

(5) To consider the recommendation of the Municipal Engineer dated June 12, 1930 (supported by the Municipal Treasurer), that (1) An additional post of Superintendent of Refuse Destructor be created on the scale of Rs. 1,200 by annual increments of Rs. 96 to Rs. 2,880 in view of the probable completion of the new Destructor for Colombo South by early September. (2) The present Superintendent be given a temporary travelling allowance of Rs. 40 a month for say, 12 months, in order that he may be able to visit the old Destructor and assist in training a new hand inexperienced in this class of work. *Note.*—It is proposed to transfer the present Superintendent to the new Destructor and replace him at the old one. Registered No. 734.—Recommended that a new post of Superintendent of Refuse Destructor be created on the scale of Rs. 1,200 by annual increments of Rs. 96 to Rs. 2,880 for the new Destructor for Colombo South. That Mr. C. B. Lawrence, the Superintendent of the old Destructor, be appointed as Superintendent of the new Destructor on his present pay with a temporary allowance of Rs. 40 a month, for three months, so that he may also supervise the work at the old Destructor daily during that period.

(6) To consider—(a) The draft proposals of the Director of Electrical Undertakings regarding terms and conditions for electricity supply to the Council. (b) Reports thereon of the Municipal Engineer and the Municipal Treasurer. Registered No. 399.—Recommended that the offer of the Director of Electrical Undertakings be accepted, subject to the comments of the Municipal Engineer and the Municipal Treasurer.

(7) With regard to the refusal of the application for permission to use Jampettah street by motor lorries to consider—(a) Letter dated April 1, 1930, from Mr. A. C. M. Abdul Cader, informing the Chairman that he has instructions from his client to move the Supreme Court for a *mandamus* on the Chairman to show cause why the permission asked for should not be granted. (b) The opinion of Mr. E. J. Samarawickreme, K.C., with regard to the Council's legal position in this and similar cases. Registered No. 650.—Recommended that the Council should adhere to its previous decision.

(8) To consider the recommendations of the Drainage Engineer—(1) That the tender of Messrs. Mulgirigama Bros., of Lanka Villa, Cotta road, Colombo, amounting to Rs. 1,369 be accepted for the aided drainage of premises No. 36, Hill street, Kotahena. Registered No. 06,593.—Recommended.

(2) That the tender of Messrs. Dharmalingam Raman & Co., of No. 21, Silversmith lane, Colombo, amounting to Rs. 1,441.41 be accepted for the aided drainage of premises No. 13 A, Messenger street. Registered No. 06,336.—Recommended.

(3) That the tender of Messrs. Samarakone Bros., of Kinross avenue, Wellawatta, amounting to Rs. 1,193 be accepted for the aided drainage of premises Nos. 687/55 I-3, Messenger street, and 801/9 and 12, Armour street. Registered No. 07,683.—Recommended.

(9) To consider an application from the Municipal Engineer (supported by the Municipal Treasurer) for supplemental provision for a further sum of Rs. 50,000 on Advance Account for aided drainage work, as the sum of Rs. 400,000 which has already been provided will be insufficient to carry on this work for a further period. Registered No. 07,338.—Recommended.

(10) To consider two detailed estimates for Rs. 29,500 from the Municipal Engineer (supported by the Municipal Treasurer) for the provision of soil sewers in (1) Skinner's road outh, Rs. 10,500; (2) between Barber street and Messenger street, through private property, Rs. 19,000; Total, Rs. 29,500. *Note.*—A sum of Rs. 45,950 has been provided in the Budget under I. 95 "Sewers in Congested Areas." Five detailed estimates amounting to Rs. 21,000 against the above vote have already been sanctioned by Municipal Council at May 14, 1930. A supplemental vote for Rs. 4,550, in excess of the amount provided in the Budget, is, therefore, necessary. Funds are available. Registered No. 658.—Recommended and that supplemental provision of Rs. 4,550 be sanctioned.

(11) To consider the recommendation of the Municipal Engineer (supported by the Municipal Treasurer) that the quotation of Messrs. the "Sentinel" Wagon Works, Ltd., amounting to £304. 17s. 8d. F.O.B. (approximately Rs. 4,275) be accepted for the Supply of spare parts for Sentinel wagons. *Note.*—The cost will be met from Advance Account, Stores, and then debited to sanctioned votes as and when the spares are drawn. Funds are available. Registered No. 07,701.—Recommended.

(12) To consider an application from the Municipal Engineer (supported by the Municipal Treasurer) for supplemental provision of Rs. 35,000 under Vote I. (h) 58, "House connections" as this vote is in the nature of a provision and not an estimate and the amount cannot possibly be foretold. Registered No. 701.—Recommended.

(13) To consider a detailed estimate of Rs. 425 from the Municipal Engineer for the construction of 6 concrete benches for Mutwal beach. *Note.*—Funds are available under Vote I. 111. Registered No. 711.—Recommended.

(14) To consider a plan and detailed estimate of Rs. 3,850 from the Municipal Engineer for the erection of a set of 4 cooly lines in Municipal Council land opposite Kanatte Cemetery. *Note.*—Funds are available. Registered No. 729.—Recommended.

(16) To consider a plan and detailed estimate of Rs. 69,000 from the Municipal Engineer for the construction of 41 "A" type houses, one of them to be used as Laundry Caretaker's quarters, a block of 12 unit lavatories and baths and a local sewer for the drainage of these houses and the proposed laundry at Armour street. *Note.*—Funds are provided under Vote I. 97/1930, Rs. 57,000. The estimates now submitted are for Rs. 69,000. Supplemental provision of Rs. 12,000 is necessary. Registered No. 735.—Recommended and that supplemental provision of Rs. 12,000 be sanctioned.

(17) To consider plans and detailed estimates from the Municipal Engineer (supported by the Municipal Treasurer) for the provision of sewers as follows:—(1) rain water drain, Malay street, Rs. 4,000; (2) sewer, Fussell's lane, Rs. 18,000; (3) lane off Flower road, Rs. 29,500; (4) sewer, 13th lane, Wellawatta, Rs. 9,500; (5) sewer, Dort lane, Rs. 19,000. *Note.*—Supplemental provision of Rs. 80,000 will be required. Funds are available. Registered No. 738.—Recommended and that supplemental provision of Rs. 80,000 be sanctioned.



(19) To consider—(a) The tenders received for quarrying stone, &c., at “ B ” Quarry, Kirillapone for a period of 6 months from July 1, 1930. (b) The recommendation of the Municipal Engineer (supported by the Municipal Treasurer) that the lowest tender of Mr. D. P. Jayakody, which is as follows, be accepted :—(1) 2-inch metal piled per cube, Rs. 10·80; (2) 4-inch rubble piled per cube, Rs. 9·25; (3) loading from piles into lorries per cube, Re. 1. Registered No. 751.—Recommended that the tender of Mr. D. P. Jayakody be accepted.

## WATERWORKS DEPARTMENT.

(20) To consider a memorandum of the Chairman dated June 2, 1930, regarding the proposal for the housing of Factory employees, Kolonnawa. Registered No. 590.—Recommended that the proposal of the Director of Public Works, in his letter No. B. P. 25 of April 25, 1930, be approved, and that a charge of 50 cents for 1,000 gallons be made.

(21) To consider—(a) An application from Mr. E. Rasiah, for water service to his new building in a private lane off Hampden lane, Wellawatta. (b) A plan and an estimate of Rs. 511 from the Waterworks Engineer for laying a 4-inch diameter water main for a distance of 43 yards. The lane being a private lane the application will have to be dealt with under Ordinance No. 9 of 1916. The applicant has expressed his willingness to contribute his proportion of cost of main, viz., Rs. 257·75. *Note.*—The Waterworks Engineer recommends the laying of the main on payment of the sum of Rs. 257·75. Registered No. 674.—Recommended.

(22) To consider—(a) An application from Mr. N. G. Selvanayagam for water service to his new building situated in Moors road, Wellawatta. (b) A plan and an estimate of Rs. 644 from the Waterworks Engineer for extending the existing water main for a distance of 92 yards in the lane. The lane being a private lane the application will have to be dealt with under Ordinance No. 9 of 1916. The applicant has expressed his willingness to contribute his proportion of cost of main, viz., Rs. 322. *Note.*—The Waterworks Engineer recommends the laying of the main on payment of the sum of Rs. 322. Registered No. 727.—Recommended.

(24) To consider the recommendation of the Waterworks Engineer (supported by the Municipal Treasurer) that the quotation dated May 19, 1930, received from the Jewell Export Filter Co., Calcutta, for Rs. 3,500 for the supply (C.I.F., Colombo) of 2,000 strainers for the filters at Labugama. It is necessary to renew these strainers periodically. *Note.*—The cost will, in the first instance, be charged to Advance Account, Stores. Registered No. 08,244.—Recommended.

## MUNICIPAL TREASURER'S DEPARTMENT.

(25) To consider—(a) A report of the Municipal Treasurer dated May 7, 1930, suggesting that surpluses of income over expenditure of the Waterworks Department or a part of such surpluses be set aside for the purpose of building up a reserve fund in order to meet heavy capital expenditure. (b) A memorandum thereon of the Chairman. Registered No. 624.—Recommended that the Municipal Treasurer's suggestion be approved to the extent annually of seventy-five per cent. of the surplus of the previous year, beginning with that of 1929.

(26) To consider a memorandum of the Municipal Treasurer, dated June 5, 1930, stating that Council on April 2, 1930, sanctioned the acceptance of certain items in the quotations received through the Council's Agents for the supply of printing materials for the year 1930 and that Messrs. John Pook & Co., now inform the Council that Messrs. Wiggins, Teape & Alex. Pirie, Ltd., have advanced the prices of the accepted item by £3. 6s. 8d. as the order has been placed for only 8 cwt. paper and their prices were for quantities over a ton. Sanction of Council may be obtained for the increase of £3. 6s. 8d. Registered No. 702.—Recommended that the increase of £3. 6s. 8d. be approved.

*The following item, which was received after the Meeting of the Works and Finance Committees, and which was approved of in Circulation, is submitted for Sanction.*

28. To consider—(a) The tenders received for the supply of hora timber, &c., as per schedule flagged “ B ” attached to papers. (b) The recommendation of the Tender Board that the tender of Don Jacolis Godamune, at the rates shown in schedule attached to papers, be accepted. *Note.*—The rates recommended for acceptance are much below the rates paid at present. Registered No. 677.

*Resolution of Council in Committee.*

It was resolved, on the motion of the Chairman, that the recommendation of the Tender Board be accepted.

*The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance of June 20, 1930, were considered.*

## GENERAL.

## SECRETARIAT.

4. To consider the question of a retiring allowance for messenger M. G. Silva of the Secretariat. Registered No. 249.—Recommended that on his removal from the service under section 13 of the Council's Pension Rules he be granted a retiring allowance from the date of such removal (*i.e.*, March 1, 1930), of Rs. 213 a year.

## VETERINARY DEPARTMENT.

5. To select from the applicants and submit to the Council the names of three candidates for the post of Municipal Veterinary Surgeon, indicating, if the Committee thinks fit, the candidate whom they recommend the Council to appoint. Registered No. 679.

Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike moved that the recommendation of the Finance Committee be accepted. Mr. M. L. M. Reyal seconded.

The Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, Dr. S. Muttiah, and the Chairman supported the motion. The motion was put to the meeting and carried.

6. To consider an application from the Acting Veterinary Surgeon for supplemental provision as follows for reasons given in his letter No. 42 of May 30, 1930:—Under Votes E.-1 Salaries Rs. 5,900; A.-4 Pensions, Rs. 517.74; E.-10a, Leave and passages to Mr. M. Crawford, Rs. 1,333.33. *Note.*—Funds are available. Registered No. 743.—Recommended.

**PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT.**

9. To select from the applicants and submit to the Council the names of three candidates for the post of Medical Officer-in-Charge of Maternity and Child-Welfare. Registered No. 744.

Resolved that the following names only be submitted to Council as the other applicants were not suitable:—(1) Dr. C. G. Peries, M.B., C.M., and L.M. (Dublin); (2) Dr. J. F. Peries, L.M.S. (Ceylon), L.R.C.P. and L.R.C.S. (Edinburgh), L.R.F.P. and L.R.F.S. (Glasgow) with the recommendation that Dr. C. G. Peries, M.B., C.M., and L.M. (Dublin) be appointed as a temporary officer.

*Resolution of Council in Committee.*

Mr. R. L. Pereira, Dr. V. van Langenberg, Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike, Dr. S. Muttiah, and Mr. M. L. M. Reyal spoke to the recommendation, which was put to the meeting and carried.

10. To consider the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health (supported by the Municipal Treasurer). (1) That the Cemetery-keepers and Assistant Cemetery-keepers be given raincoats as these officers have to work in wet weather in supervising the digging of graves and attending to other work in the cemetery. (2) That the Market-keepers, Assistant Market-keepers, and Public Health Department Overseers be given 7 buttons each instead of 5 buttons each, the two extra buttons being required for pockets with flaps. *Note.*—The alterations will require the sanction of Council as the list sanctioned on May 5, 1926, will be affected. The total cost will be Rs. 141.40. Registered No. 06,363.—Recommended.

**MUNICIPAL ENGINEER'S DEPARTMENT.**

Raymond, Health Visitor, Public Health Department, on her retirement from the Council's service on reaching the age limit. The pension is based on her service of 126 months, and her salary of Rs. 1,500 a year. Registered No. 710.—Recommended.

18. To recommend, under section 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 294.97 to Krishnan, Mason, Public Health Department, who is found unfit by a medical board for further service. The gratuity is based on his service of 121 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 43.88. Registered No. 0,736.—Recommended.

19. To recommend, under section 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 451.09 to the widow of the late Head Cooly Seeni of the Municipal Stores. The gratuity is based on his service of 231 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 35.15. Registered No. 753.—Recommended.

20. To recommend, under section 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 380.29 to Cooly Muttu, B.T. 2,606 of the Municipal Engineer's Department, who is found unfit by a medical board for further service. The gratuity is based on his service of 254 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 26.95. Registered No. 754.—Recommended.

21. To recommend, under section 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 451 to Cooly Vethakkan of the Municipal Stores, who is found unfit by a medical board for further service. The gratuity is based on his service of 225 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 36.08. Registered No. 755.—Recommended.

**WRITE OFF OF ARREARS OF RATES.**

22. To consider a report of the Municipal Treasurer, dated June 18, 1930, recommending that arrears of rates amounting to Rs. 10.25, as per list attached to his report, be written off (3 cases, all on grounds of poverty). Registered No. 08,622.—Recommended.

*The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) of June 23, 1930, were considered.*

3. To consider the reference by Council of March 5, 1930, regarding the proposed acquisition of land for the playground for Wellawatta:—“That the matter be referred to the Four Standing Committees for consideration of the further suggestion referred to by the Chairman and also of the claims of other wards.” Registered No. 275.—Recommended that the Council should purchase the site of a little over an acre in extent at the east end of Fredrica road for a playground.

*Resolution of Council in Committee.*

The Hon. Dr. E. A. Coorey opposed the recommendation of the Standing Committees and moved that the matter be referred back to the Committees for re-consideration. Mr. M. L. M. Reyal seconded.

The Chairman explained that the matter had already been postponed several times and it was after careful consideration that the Committees made this recommendation. The motion was put to the meeting and carried.

5. To consider letter No. E. 101/30, dated May 29, 1930, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, regarding the present provision made by Government for the erection of new schools and the maintenance and equipment of existing schools. Registered No. 675.—Recommended that the Local Authorities should be given the power to provide funds from their ordinary revenue or from a special education rate, towards the cost of primary education, if they so wish, but in such case the Local Authority should be made the local education authority and Government should continue to provide for the same purpose no less funds than it provides at present.

7. To consider a memorandum of the Chairman, dated June 23, 1930, regarding Floods May, 1930, assessment rates and revision of assessment. Registered No. 07,291.

The Ordinance enables the Council to remit rates for a month on the ground that the property is rendered untenable (i.) if it is untenable for a complete month; (ii.) if written notice thereof is given within 7 days of the beginning of the month for which remission is claimed.—Recommended that the following policy be adopted:—

- (a) The Council should extend this principle administratively, in view of the exceptional disaster and following the precedent of 1924, in the case of properties damaged by the flood of May, 1930, only, and allow remission on account of untenability (i.) from May 1; (ii.) without written notice, provided the property as verified by Council's officers was so damaged by the flood as to be untenable when the flood subsided. (b) Occupation, free of charge, by flood refugees should not be held to render properties liable to rates. (c) The rates on grass fields damaged by flood should be remitted for May and June. (d) In the case of revision of assessment owing to demolition or partial demolition by flood the revision in reduction should take effect from May 1, and not from the following quarter, July 1, as is usual. When and if the damage is repaired the revision in enhancement should take effect from the following quarter whenever it may be. (e) Writing off of rates on the ground of poverty should be considered as usual.

Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried unanimously. Dr. V. van Langenberg thanked the meeting.

## MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on June 21, 1930, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated June 17, 1930.

Present : Mr. R. H. Whitehorn, Chairman ; Ratwatte Adigar ; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva ; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake ; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa ; Dr. W. E. de Silva.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on May 17, 1930, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1929 to May 31, 1930, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- Health Officer's report for May, 1930.
- Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of May, 1930.
- The reservoir readings for May, 1930.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house-service taps inspected during May, 1930.

4. Petitions :—Mr. de Silva presented petition from (1) the residents of Kandy complaining about the high price of mutton at the market. (2) S. M. Abdul Majeed applying for the licence of Fishstall No. 67, as the present licensee is not carrying on regular trade in the stall.

Mr. Wijayatilake presented petition from (1) the residents of Katukelle complaining about the insanitary state of the drain passing through premises Nos. 25 and 26, Peradeniya road. (2) A. Kandasamy complaining about the refusal to license his brick kiln at Getambe. (3) E. M. Bandara Menika of Welata objecting to the acquisition of her land for a slaughter-house.

Mr. Soysa presented petition from (1) P. K. Mohamado Cassim objecting to the acquisition of premises No. 202, Colombo street for the proposed back-lane scheme. (2) Col. J. Maxwell Johnstone complaining about the untidy state of the green opposite the Queen's Hotel and suggesting that the buses and the cars be parked elsewhere.

The Chairman undertook to look into the matters referred to in the several petitions.

4A. With the leave of the Council, the Chairman moved—"That Mr. Ismail be restored to Office." Ratwatte Adigar seconded.—Carried.

5. Correspondence :—(1) Letter No. W 44/26 of May 27, 1930, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating that provision for the sum of Rs. 90,000 required on account of the Kandy Town Improvement Scheme, will be included for consideration in the Draft Estimates 1930-1931.—Read.

(2) Letter No. W 383A/29 of May 29, 1930, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating that the Surveyor-General has been authorized to waive half the cost of the survey of the catchment area for the new Kandy Water Scheme, that is, half of Rs. 8,130.

Resolved that payment of half cost, namely, Rs. 4,065 be sanctioned.

(3) Letter No. E 101/30 of May 29, 1930, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary *re* the desirability of amending the existing legislation so as to enable local bodies to contribute towards the provision and maintenance of schools within their limits.

Resolved to circulate papers and bring the matter up at the next meeting.

6. Pursuant to notice Mr. de Silva was to have moved—"That this Council do take steps to put up standpipes at all bus stands in the Kandy Town."

On the Chairman's suggestion Mr. de Silva moved the following amended resolution :—"That the Chairman be requested to report to the Council on the desirability of providing standpipes and lighting for the existing bus stands." Mr. Wijayatilake seconded.—Carried.

6A. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Wijayatilake was to have moved the following :—"That the benefit of the 10 per cent. commission now allowed to the Collectors be given to those ratepayers who pay their rates direct to the Council at least quarterly in advance."

With the leave of the Council he moved the following amended resolution :—"That the proposal that the benefit of the commission now allowed to the Collectors be given to those ratepayers who now pay their rates direct to the Council at least quarterly in advance and that steps be taken to get legislation for the purpose, be considered by the Finance Committee."

Mr. Wijayatilake to be associated with the Finance Committee in considering the matter. Mr. de Silva seconded.—Carried.

6b. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Wijayatilake moved—“That steps be taken to demarcate on the main roads the areas proposed to be reserved for commercial purposes and the areas for residential purposes, and that a Committee of this Council be appointed for the purpose.” Mr. de Silva seconded.

It was agreed to refer the matter to the Chairman for report.

6c. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Wijayatilake moved—“That steps be taken to immediately construct the public drain passing by the premises Nos. 25 and 26, Peradeniya road, Kandy, as its present insanitary state is a source of danger to the residents of the locality.” Mr. Soysa seconded.

It was agreed to ask the Municipal Engineer what the proposal would cost, in the first place.

7. The report of the Chairman on the objections lodged against the back-lane scheme for Block B, submitted in compliance with section 52 (2) of Ordinance No. 19 of 1915, together with plan and estimate for construction of back-lanes amounting to Rs. 23,600.

Resolved that the scheme be finally approved as required under section 52 (4) of Ordinance No. 19 of 1915.

8. To sanction the recovery by instalments, as recommended in Circular No. 558 of June 11, 1930, of the cost of construction of back-lanes in Block J due in respect of premises No. 98, Colombo street, and premises No. 89, Brownrigg street.

Resolved that recovery by instalments be sanctioned accordingly.

9. To sanction the employment at a cost of Rs. 750 of Mr. J. Oorloff for surveying blocks E and E and laying out the course for a scheme of back-lanes for these blocks.

Resolved that the employment of Mr. Oorloff be sanctioned accordingly.

10. Applications for sites for riding galleries, puppet shows, &c., for the Perahera Season.—Resolved to put a many shows as possible on Bogambara, including all riding galleries and to accommodate smaller shows on the Market Grounds at a sufficient distance from road centre and from each other.

11. To obtain the following votes:—(i.) Maintenance of Temporary Infectious Diseases Hospital during 1929–1930, Rs. 300; (ii.) to shift from its present position the overhead electric wire passing over the land of Mr. R. E. S. de Soysa in Gregory road, Rs. 90; (iii.) to purchase from Government two Electricity Balancers, Rs. 600 plus transport.

Resolved that the votes be allowed.

12. Papers *re* notice served on Messrs. W. P. Cader Meera Saibo for the removal of the dwarf wall of the grain store at 43, King street.

Resolved to have the dwarf wall removed and 10 feet space provided round the store.

13. To confirm Mr. X. A. Pillai in his appointment as Internal Audit Clerk.—Resolved that Mr. Pillai be confirmed.

14. To report of the Colonial Auditor for 1929.—Tabled.

15. To elect a member to serve on the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation, *vice* Dr. E. W. Scharenguivel resigned.—Dr. W. E. de Silva was elected.

16. The Chairman's Administration Report for 1929.—Tabled.

17. Recommendations of Standing Committees:—

*Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works held on May 16, 1930.*

(1) Papers *re* encroachments on lots 3 and 10 in preliminary plan No. 7,703 acquired for the construction of back-lanes in Block D.—Recommended to lease the encroachments.

(2) Papers *re* proposal to build a bridge at a cost of Rs. 750 behind Lake Bungalow in Victoria Drive on a fifty-fifty basis.—Recommended to offer to pay half the cost, namely, Rs. 375, if the owner will pay the other half, in default to construct a footbridge only.

(3) To sanction at a cost of Rs. 275 a contour survey of the land required for a car park in Peradeniya road.—Recommended.

(4) To consider the following estimates:—(i.) (25) Memorandum dated May 7, 1930, from the Chairman asking for authority to employ a temporary clerk during the absence, on sick leave, of Mr. A. E. Ratnayake, Clerk, Works Department.—Recommended.

(26) To sanction the installation of a telephone at the bungalow in Lady McCallum's Drive, occupied by the Municipal Engineer.—Recommended to pay the standard rate of rent.
