The Masters cil, do hereby NOW Ye that in exercise of the powers vested in the Governor in Council by section 6 of Attendant's Ordinance, 1865," I, the Officer Administering the Government in Council, frame and establish for the Port of Colombo the rules set out in the schedule hereto as from and after September 15, 1930.

SCHEDULE.

Special signal to indicate entrance by which, and berth to which, a vessel will proceed.

Supply of additional stern moorings by the Master Attendant during north-east monsoon.

Sailing vessels unable to sail to engage a tug.

Definition of "Tindal."

Signals to be made by vessels requiring assistance of Government tug.

Buoys not to be laid without permission.

vessel having es to notify

Agents of vessel expected to arrive with explosives to notify the Principal Collector and the Master Attendant.

Explosives not to be shipped or discharged without permission from the Principal Collector and the Master Attendant. No craft to approach vessels working cargo of explosives.

Masters of vessels to notify the Master Attendant of any fire occurring on board.

Boats beached for repairs or cleaning to be removed when directed by the Master Attendant.

Tindals to produce licences on request of Master Attendant

Cargo boats in the Canal Basin and Canal.

or Police.

Speed of boat or launch not to exceed 12 knots.

Licensing of water

- Section I., Rule 12.—All vessels, before entering the harbour during day light, shall hoist such special flag signal as may be required by the pilot to indicate by which entrance, and to which berth, vessels will proceed.
- Section 1., Rule 13.—During the north-east monsoon vessels berthed in any of the berths stated below will be supplied with additional stern moorings by the Master Attendant. additional moorings are to be returned to the Pilot Station on the departure of the vessel:—Berths numbers 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, and 34.
- Section I., Rule 14.—No sailing vessel shall warp herself to her anchorage within the limits If unable to sail to her intended position she shall anchor immediately and send for a tug and shall be towed to her intended position with as little delay as possible.

The same shall apply to any sailing vessel leaving her anchorage and proceeding to sea.

No sailing vessel shall shift her berth without the assistance of a tug except by permission of the Master Attendant.

- Section III., Rule 7A .- For the purpose of these rules, the word "tindal" shall signify the person responsible for orders to (or manipulation of) rudder and source of propulsion.
- Section IV., Rule 14.—Vessels within the port requiring the assistance of a Ceylon Government tug may make the following signal by steam whistle or syren :-

By day or night .. One long blast followed by four short blasts.

The tug will answer with one long blast in her syren. This signal is only to be made in cases of emergency or when the immediate assistance of the tug is necessary for the safety of the vessel.

- 6. Section VI., Rule 19.—No person shall lay or maintain any buoy or any mark whatever within the limits of the port without the permission of the Master Attendant.
- 7. Section VI., Rule 20.—The master of any vessel arriving at the port of Colombo with explosives, dangerous petroleum, or carbide of calcium on board as cargo shall give immediate notice thereof to the pilot boarding the vessel.
- 8. Section VI., Rule 21.—The agents of any vessel expected to arrive within the port having explosives, dangerous petroleum, or carbide of calcium on board as cargo, shall give notice of the fact of such explosives, dangerous petroleum, or carbide of calcium being on board such vessel to the Principal Collector of Customs and to the Master Attendant not less than 48 hours before the arrival of such vessel.
- Section VI., Rule 22.—No explosives, dangerous petroleum, or carbide of calcium shall be shipped to or discharged from any vessel within the port unless special permission so to do has been previously obtained from the Principal Collector of Customs and the Master Attendant.
- 10. Section VI., Rule 23.—In the case of vessels working cargo consisting of explosives or dangerous substances, no craft shall during such working approach within such limits as may from time to time be prescribed by the Master Attendant.
- Section VI., Rule 24.—In the event of any fire occurring on board a vessel within the limits of the port, the master or owner or agents shall give immediate notice thereof to the Master Attendant, stating whether or no assistance of the Port Authorities is required.
- 12. Section VII., Rule 4A.—Any boat so beached shall be removed if and when directed by the Master Attendant.
- 13. Section VII., Rule 10A.—All licensed tindals shall produce their licence on request at any time from the Master Attendant or from a Police Officer not below the rank of Sergeant.
- Section VII., Rule 14A.—Cargo boats shall not lie alongside the walls of the Lake to Harbour Canal Basin in tiers of more than four abreast on the East Wall and two abreast on the West Wall, and shall at all times leave a clear access channel to the two centre spans of the Railway bridge, Main street.

In the canal itself cargo boats shall not lie more than two abreast alongside either wall, and shall allow clear access through the two centre spans of all bridges.

Barges and boats shall not lie in the Canal or Canal Basin for the purpose of repairs,

- 15. Section VII., Rule 28A.—No boat or launch shall proceed at a greater speed than 12 knots an hour when within the harbour.
- 16. Section VII., Rule 29A.—No water boats shall be licensed which do not comply with the specification approved by the Government of Ceylon Examining Engineer (hereinafter called the Government Surveyor).

Definition of the words "Passenger Jetty" and "Jetty."

Inspection of licensed vessels in harbour.

Tindal, driver, and owner of any mechanically propelled vessel to give every facility to the Government Surveyor to inspect such vessel.

Steam boilers to be removed for inspection if required by Government Surveyor.

Definition of "motor launch."

Motor launch to be constructed in accordance with the requirements of the Government Surveyor.

Petrol tanks on launches not to be manipulated when under weigh.

Petrol in excess of that contained in fuel tanks not to be carried.

Fire extinguishers to be carried when plying for hire.

Definition of "Petrol."

17. Section VIII., Rule 6.—For the purpose of rules 1 to 5 in Section VIII., the words "Passenger Jetty" and "Jetty" include both decks of the Passenger Jetty, the Port Commission bridge from York street to the Baggage Office, the verandah of the Baggage Office adjoining the bridge, and the Examination Halls in the Baggage Office.

- 18. Section IX., Rule 7.—All licensed vessels affoat in the harbour shall be inspected by Government Surveyor annually between December 1 and the end of March in each year.
- 19. Section IX., Rule 8.—The tindal, driver, and owner of any licensed mechanically propelled vessel shall at all times give every facility to the Government Surveyor to inspect such vessel, and the owner shall, if so required by the Government Surveyor, cause such vessel to be removed from the water for the inspection of the under water fittings.
- 20. Section IX., Rule 9.—The owner of any steam launch or tug within the limits of the port shall cause the steam boilers of such launch or tug to be removed from the launch or tug for the purpose of inspection if required so to do at any time by the Government Surveyor.
- 21. Section IX., Rule 10.—For the purpose of these rules the term "motor launch" shall be deemed to mean any craft propelled by mechanical power other than steam.
- 22. Section IX., Rule 11.—No launch or other craft propelled by mechanical power other than steam shall ply for the conveyance of passengers or coolies within the limits of the port unless it is licensed as constructed in accordance with the requirements of the Government Surveyor published by the Colombo Port Commission.
- 23. Section IX., Rule 12.—When a motor launch within the limits of the port is under weigh or has passengers on board no person shall open or manipulate the fuel tank or open any receptacle in it containing petrol.
- 24. Section IX., Rule 13.—No petrol other than that contained in the fuel tank shall be carried in any motor launch within the limits of the port.
- 25. Section IX., Rule 14.—Every motor launch for the conveyance of passengers or goods within the limits of the port shall when plying for hire carry chemical fire extinguishers of an efficient pattern approved by the Government Surveyor, and shall when not plying for hire carry an ample supply of sand conveniently available. A suitable motor horn or syren in good order, of a type approved by the Government Surveyor, shall be carried on every motor launch.

26. Section IX., Rule 15.—For the purpose of these rules "Petrol" shall be deemed to mean any liquid fuel having a flash point of 73° F or lower and shall include the following:—

Petroleum spirit, Benzine, Benzol, Naptha, Alcohol,

and also any mixture of one or more of these aforementioned fuels.

Life buoys to be carried on launches.

27. Section IX., Rule 16.—All launches plying for conveyance of passengers or goods with the limits of the port shall carry at least one life buoy for each ten (or portion of ten) persons while they have been licensed to carry, and such life buoys shall at all times be carried in the position and manner laid down by the Government Surveyor.

These life buoys shall be so fixed as to be easily detachable and at all times ready for immediate use, and shall have the name or number of the launch to which they belong painted on them conspicuously in letters or numbers at least $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches high and $\frac{1}{2}$ inch in thickness.

Notice of warning to occupants. 28. Section IX., Rule 17.—A notice must be placed on every launch in a conspicuous position warning the occupants of the danger which might arise from smoking, striking matches, or carrying a naked light in the engine room or near the petrol when the tank is being replenished.

SCHEDULE.

1. Rule 1 of section I. of the rules dated June 15, 1900 (Gazette No. 5,697 of June 15, 1900), is repealed and the following is substituted therefor:—

Vessels arriving to be reported at Custom House, Master Attendant's Office, and Harbour Police.

Section I., Rule 1.—Masters of all vessels arriving, or their agents, shall fill in and return to the pilot the Arrival Report Form which the pilot will supply on boarding the vessels, and shall report their vessels within 24 hours at the Custom House, and shall furnish the Harbour Police with a list of all passengers embarking or disembarking, and twelve hours before sailing hoist the Blue Peter at the foremast head.

2. Rule 3 of section I. of the rules dated June 15, 1900 (Gazette No. 5,697 of June 15, 1900), is repealed and the following is substituted therefor:-

Vessels to take up the berths appointed for

Section I., Rule 3.—All vessels within the port shall take up the berth appointed for them by the Master Attendant or his representative and shall change their berth or move whenever the Master Attendant requires them so to do.

Rule 4 of section I. of the rules dated June 15, 1900 (Gazette No. 5,697 of June 15, 1900), is repealed and the following is substituted therefor:-

Vessels not to change berth without permission.

Section I., Rule 4.—No vessel within the port shall change her berth or move without permission from the Master Attendant except in case of emergency, which is to be reported immediately by the master, or agents, to the Master Attendant.

4. Rule 5 of section I. of the rules dated June 15, 1900 (Gazette No. 5,697 of June 15, 1900), is repealed and the following is substituted therefor:

Vessels to be moored head and stern. ar grant

Section I., Rule 5.—All vessels within the Harbour shall lie to their own anchors and shall be When this is not practicable, vessels are to be moored head and stern moored head and stern to buoys. as directed by the Master Attendant, Deputy Master Attendant, or Pilot. All vessels are to remain so moored until they are ready to sail, unless otherwise directed by the Master Attendant, Deputy Master Attendant, or Pilot.

5. Rule 7 of section I. of the rules dated June 15, 1900 (Gazette No. 5,697 of June 15, 1900), is repealed and the following is substituted therefor:

Vessels and boats not to ancho-channels. anchor in the

Section I., Rule 7.—No vessel or boat shall without permission of the Master Attendant, anchor in or near the entrances to the harbour in such a manner as to obstruct the free passage of the entrances or in the channels leading to, or from any of the mooring buoys within, the harbour.

Rule 8 of section I. of the rules dated June 15, 1900 (Gazette No. 5,697 of June 15, 1900), is repealed and the following is substituted therefor:

Wharves and jetties to be kept clear.

Section I., Rule 8.—Free passages shall be kept to all piers, jetties, wharves, or landing places, and all vessels or boats shall move when required by the Master Attendant or his representative, to clear such passages.

Rule 11 of section I. of the rules dated November 16, 1905 (Gazette No. 6,088 of November 17, 1905), is repealed and the following is substituted therefor:-

Vessels to tend their own ropes and run out extra mooring ropes when required.

Section I., Rule 11.—All vessels arriving within the port shall, after having been moored to the satisfaction of the Master Attendant, or his representative, tend their own ropes.

If in the opinion of the Master Attendant additional precautions are necessary for the safety of shipping, a red ball will be hoisted at the mastheads of the Flagstaffs at the Master Attendant's Office and Pilot Station during the day and a red light at night, and all vessels shall on such signal being made run out extra mooring ropes to the buoys and prepare a second anchor for letting go.

While these signals are hoisted no vessel shall enter or leave the port except with special

permission from the Master Attendant.

8. Rule 3 of section II. of the rules dated June 15, 1900 (Gazette No. 5,697 of June 15, 1900), is repealed and the following is substituted therefor:

Vessels having dead body on board to communicate with Port Surgeon.

Section II., Rule 3.—If any person die on board any vessel within the port, or if any vessel arrive within the port having on board the body of any person who has died on board since her last port of call, or having on board a dead body picked up at sea, the master of such vessel shall at once communicate the fact to the Port Surgeon, and shall carry out such instructions as may be issued by the Port Surgeon as to the disposal of the body.

9. Rule 4 of section III. of the rules dated March 13, 1919 (Gazette No. 7,001 of March 14, 1919), is repealed and the following are substituted therefor:

Coal, ballast, ashes, &c., not to be thrown into the Harbour.

(a) Section III., Rule 4.—No coal, ballast, ashes, rubbish, or any object or material likely to cause damage to the port or damage or obstruction to shipping shall be thrown overboard or allowed to fall from any vessel or boat into the harbour or into any part of the port where the depth of the water is less than 12 fathoms and, in case of any contravention of this rule, the Master of such vessel or boat shall be deemed to be responsible.

No oils, paints, or oily water shall be discharged or allowed to flow from any vessel or boat in any part of the port, and in case of any contravention of this rule, the Master of such vessel or boat

shall be deemed to be responsible.

No coal, ballast, ashes, rubbish, or any object or material likely to cause damage to the port or damage or obstruction to shipping shall be cast or thrown, or shall be caused to be cast or thrown by any person into the harbour or into or on any place on the shore whence such material is liable to be washed into the harbour.

No oils, paints, or oily water shall be discharged or allowed to flow by any person into the harbour or into or on any place on the shore whence such material is liable to flow or be washed into

Vessels dropping articles overboard should report to the Master Attendant.

(b) Section III., Rule 4A.—The master of, or agents for, any vessel within the harbour from which any article likely to cause damage or an obstruction shall have dropped overboard or sunk, or the owner of or agents for, any boat, barge, or lighter which has sunk in the harbour shall report the same immediately to the Master Attendant by telephone and shall confirm the same in writing stating the nature of the article, boat, barge, or lighter, and the position of the same, and shall take the necessary steps for the immediate recovery of the article, boat, barge, or lighter, and shall report the recovery of the same to the Master Attendant in writing. In default of action being taken as above, such master, owner, or agents may be punishable with a fine not exceeding Rs. 200. If not recovered by the master, owner, or agents, steps may be taken by the Master Attendant for the recovery of the article, boat, barge, or lighter, and all expenses so incurred shall be defrayed by the master, owner, or agents whether the article, boat, barge, or lighter be recovered or not.

The tindal or person in charge of any boat receiving or discharging cargo alongside any vessel shall also report to the Master Attendant as soon as possible after the occurrence all instances of cargo dropping overboard from the vessel's slings in the act of being lowered into or hoisted out of

his boat, or from his boat.

The above also applies to tindals of boats, &c., which have sunk in the harbour.

10. Rule 6 of section III. of the rules dated June 15, 1900 (Gazette No. 5,697 of June 15, 1900), is repealed and the following is substituted therefor:—

Boats receiving coal or ballast to have special temporary bulwarks. Section III., Rule 6.—Any boat or lighter not having a combing and surrounding deck shall not be allowed to receive loose coal or ballast from shoots from vessels within the harbour without having a temporary bulwark of planks or sheet iron 2 feet high by 12 feet long, shipped on the gunwale of the boat or lighter on the offside whilst being loaded, so as to prevent any coal or ballast from going overboard from the boat or lighter; and no boat or lighter shall be loaded with loose coal or ballast heaped up above the gunwales.

11. Rules 10 and 11 of section III. of the rules dated September 24, 1921 (Gazette No. 7,214 of September 30, 1921), are repealed and the following are substituted therefor:—

Live stock not to be landed from a ship or landed into a ship except in a stage boat or pontoon fitted with a flat deck.

(a) Section III., Rule 10.—Live stock shall not be landed from a ship or loaded into a ship except in a stage boat or pontoon fitted with a flat dock of ample strength, intact, unbroken, free from holes, and fitted with cross bars on the floor, spaced at intervals to prevent animals from slipping. The deck shall be fitted with a fence all round not less than 3 feet 6 inches high, and a gate or other approved appliance shall be provided for the purpose of loading and unloading animals from the ship and landing them ashore and for embarking animals from the shore and loading them into the ship.

Canvas sling used for transferring live stock.

Live stock loaded or unloaded in crates or (b) Section III., Rule 11.—When it is not possible to use a gangway on board the ship, the canvas sling used for transferring live stock to and from the vessel shall not be less than 2 feet 6 inches in width.

Provided, however, that Rules (10) and (11) of section III. shall not apply to live stock loaded or unloaded in crates or boxes.

12. Rule 12 of section III. of the rules dated January 18, 1917 (Gazette No. 6,848 of January 19, 1917), is repealed and the following is substituted therefor:—

Ship's tackle.

Section III., Rule 12.—Masters of vessels in the harbour or, in their absence, the officers in charge and contractors or their agents or servants engaged in shipping or discharging cargo, coal, or other articles shall not use or suffer or permit to be used any ropes, tackle, or other gear that may be worn, frail, or otherwise unsuitable from any cause whatever for the purpose of heaving or lowering such cargo, coal, or other articles, nor shall they permit any one of unsound mind or afflicted with deficient eyesight or hearing, or any one under the age of 16 years to drive or in any way control any steam winch or other machine used for heaving or lowering such cargo, coal, or other articles.

The Master Attendant, his representative, or any Police Officer not below the rank of sergeant may at all times inspect and examine such ropes, tackle, other gear and persons controlling winches

and prohibit their use or employment if deemed unsuitable.

13. Rule 1 of section IV. of the rules dated June 15, 1900 (Gazette No. 5,697 of June 15, 1900), is repealed and the following is substituted therefor:—

All vessels and craft to carry lights. Section IV., Rule 1.—All vessels and craft within the port, unless specially exempted by the Master Attendant, shall carry such lights as are laid down for them in the "Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea."

14. Rule 2 of section IV. of the rules dated April 27, 1901 (Gazette No. 5,778 of May 2, 1901), is repealed and the following is substituted therefor:—

Signals.

Section IV., Rule 2.—Except as provided in rule 3 of section IV., no vessel within the port shall fire guns or rockets or burn blue lights, excepting vessels in distress, which may make any of the Board of Trade distress signals.

This rule does not apply to men-of-war firing salutes.

15. Rule 3 of section IV. of rules dated October 22, 1902, and March 28, 1911 (Gazettes Nos. 5,884 of October 24, 1902, and 6,433 of March 31, 1911), is repealed and the following is substituted therefor:—

Pilot signals.

Section IV., Rule 3.—Vessels inward bound requiring a pilot should display the Board of Trade pilot signal, and vessels outward bound or any other vessel requiring a pilot should hoist the jack at the fore by day, and by night two red lights 6 feet apart hoisted well up where best seen. The following signals will be made from the Pilot Station is answer to vessels' signals for a pilot at night time:—

(a) A light showing red and white flashes alternately in quick succession for a period of one minute indicates that a pilot will proceed immediately to the vessel making the signal for a pilot.(b) A fixed red light for the same period indicates that all pilots on duty are engaged, but

that a pilot will proceed to the vessel making signal as soon as he becomes disengaged.
(c) A succession of long white flashes signifies that the vessel should anchor well clear of

either entrance to the Harbour or remain under weigh until daylight.

(d) The above signals shall not be used within the limits of the port for any other purpose than that laid down in these rules.

Vessels desiring to communicate with the Port Signal Station-

- (e) By International Code should hoist the "Code" or "Answering" Pennant in some conspicuous place.
- (f) By Semaphore or Morse Code should hoist the Pennant "F" under the "Code" Pennant.
- (g) At night should make short flashes continuously from a Morse single lamp or other lamp until the Reply Signal "T" is made from the Signal Station.
- 16. Rules 4, 5, and 6 of section IV. of rules dated June 15, 1900 (Gazette No. 5,697 of June 15, 1900), are repealed and the following are substituted therefor:—

Steam whistle or syren not to be sounded by vessels. (a) Section IV., Rule 4.—No vessel within the port shall sound any kind of steam whistle or syren for any purpose whatever except those defined in Articles 28 and 31 of the "Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea" or for the purpose of summoning the immediate assistance of one of the Ceylon Government tugs.

Vessels requiring assistance to apply to the Master Attendant or signal for pilot.

(b) Section IV., Rule 5.—If any vessel within the port at any time requires assistance from the Master Attendant's Department the master of, or agents for, the vessel should make application to the Master Attendant, or in urgent cases make the signal for a pilot.

All launches, tugs, steam, and water boats, and all mechanically propelled oil barges and small craft, when under weigh between sunser and sunrise to carry a bright white light.

(c) Section IV., Rule 6.—All launches, tugs, steam, and motor water boats, and all mechanically propelled oil barges and small craft shall, when under weigh between sunset and sunrise, carry in the fore part of the vessel, or in front of the funnel, where it can best be seen, a bright white light so constructed as to show the light from right ahead to 2 points abaft the beam on each side, and shall also carry the regulation side lights, green on the starboard side and red on the port, or a combined lantern showing a green light and a red light from right ahead to 2 points abaft the beam on their respective sides. Such lantern shall be carried below the line of the bright light. Between sunset, and sunrise launches shall proceed at a moderate speed. Any such craft when towing shall carry a similar additional bright light in a vertical line one above the other 6 feet apart.

Note.—For the purpose of these rules a launch is deemed to be a craft propelled by steam or motor power.

17. Rules 7 and 8 of section IV. of rules dated November 26, 1913 (Gazette No. 6,594 of November 28, 1913), are repealed and the following are substituted therefor:—

All lighters and coal boats, when under weigh between sunset and sunrise to carry a combined green and red light.

(a) Section IV., Rule 7.—All lighters and coal boats, other than those mechanically propelled shall when under weigh between sunset and sunrise carry in the fore part on a short pole or stand to ensure the light being visible well clear over the gunwales, a lantern with a green glass on one side and red on the other so fitted that the green light shall not be seen on the port side nor the red light on the starboard side.

All boats other than those provided for in the two preceding rules to exhibit a white light and to carry a second lantern for use as occasion requires.

(b) Section IV., Rule 8.—All boats other than those provided for in the two preceding rules shall, when under weigh between sunset and sunrise exhibit on the forward awning stanchion a white light of a pattern approved by the Master Attendant. A second lantern shall be carried in the stern sheets for use as occasion requires.

18. Rule 11 of section IV. of rules dated June 15, 1900 (Gazette No. 5,697 of June 15, 1900), is repealed and the following is substituted therefor:—

Yessels not to display are lights which are not shaded.

Section IV., Rule 11.—No vessel within the port shall display at night any arc light unless such light be so shaded as to throw the light on the vessel's deck only.

19. Rule 12 of section IV. of rules dated March 28, 1911 (Gazette No. 6,433 of March 31, 1911), is repealed and the following is substituted therefor:—

Signals to be used by vessels requiring attendance of the Port Surgeon

Section IV., Rule 12.—A vessel requiring the attendance of the Port Surgeon shall hoist where best seen—

By day .. International Code Signal "K."

By night .. Two red lights with a white light between them 6 feet apart hoisted well up where best seen.

20. Rule 1 of section V. of rules dated September 30, 1922 (Gazette No. 7,285 of September 30, 1922), is repealed and the following is substituted therefor:

Pilotage charges.

Rates of Pilotage.

Section V., Rule 1.—All vessels shall pay pilotage at the following rates which shall cover them both inwards and outwards:—

Provided that no extra charge shall be made for vessels moved to and from the Oil Bunkering Jetties or Graving Dock Guide Pier for the receipt of oil, or to and from the Graving Dock Guide Pier or Oil Discharge Jetty for the discharge of oil.

A further charge of half the above sanctioned rates will be levied in respect of any vessel seeking to proceed out of the harbour or to change her berth which calls a pilot before she is ready to proceed and thereby causes any delay whatever to the pilot.

The certificate for this charge is to be signed and handed to the pilot by the master of the vessel before the vessel leaves her berth.

Provided that-

Vessels which, while in harbour, carry out none but the following operations:-

(a) Coaling;

(b) Taking in water;

(c) Taking in provisions;

(d) Awaiting or receiving orders;(e) Taking in or discharging mails;

(f) Discharging sick persons, their attendants, and families;

(g) Discharging or taking in crews;

(h) Going into dock;

(i) Repairs; and

(j) Discharging or shipping overcarried cargo.

shall be charged a special consolidated rate of Rs. 200 only to cover pilotage, entering dues, use of tugs, and bill of health granted by day.

21. Rule 2 of section V. of the rules dated June 15, 1900 (Gazette No. 5,697 of June 15, 1900), is repealed and the following is substituted therefor:

Vessels except Ceylonese, Indian, or Maldivian Sailing Vessels not to enter, leave, or move within the harbour without a Government pilot on board,

Section V., Rule 2.—No vessel other than Ceylonese, Indian, or Maldivian Sailing Vessels shall enter, leave, or move within the harbour without having a pilot on board unless clear permission to do so has been given by the Master Attendant or some Officer empowered by him to give such permission.

22. Rule 3 of section VI. of rules dated June 2, 1925 (Gazette No. 7,467 of June 5, 1925), is repealed and the following is substituted therefor:

Vessels with more than 5 cwt. of explosives on board not to enter harbour.

Section VI., Rule 3.—(1) No vessel (except those belonging to His Majesty or a Foreign Government) having on board more than five hundredweight of gunpowder or any other explosive substance, other than the substances specified in part (2) of this rule, shall enter the harbour unless such gunpowder or other explosive substance is stored securely in a ship's magazine properly constructed or the same shall have been discharged from the vessel.

(2) No magazine need be provided for the stowage of the following explosives, viz.:-

Percussion caps. Safety cartridges. Capped empty cases. Safety fuse Cordeau bickford. Electric fuses. Fog signals. Fuses for shell. Filled gaines. Slow match. Quick match. Port fires

Electrical and shrapnel primers. Tubes for firing explosives.

Mines and counter mines not containing their own means of ignition.

Filled shell, plugged, or fused but not incendiary chemical and smoke shells.

Wet guncotton.

Depth charges filled T. N. T. amatol or wet guncotton.

Sweeping charges. Warheads for torpedoes.

Hand grenades packed with igniters, but not assembled.

These articles may be stowed along with other explosives in a ship's magazine properly constructed, or with "Special Ammunition Stowage," i.e., a compartment in which there are no matches, inflammable liquids, or other dangerous goods.

Note.—For the purpose of this rule a "magazine properly constructed" means a compartment fitted with flooding valves, light boxes, ventilators, similar in every respect to the magazine fitted in vessels of the Royal Navy and Royal Indian Marine according to Admiralty specification and surveyed by a Government Surveyor in England.

Rule 8 of section VI. of rules dated October 25, 1921 (Gazette No. 7,222 of October 28, 1921), is repealed and the following is substituted therefor:-

Parties of foreign soldiers or sailors not to be landed without the permission of the Governor.

Section IV., Rule 8.—No armed parties of soldiers or sailors, except those of His Majesty's Services, shall be landed from any ship of war, transport, or other vessel, without the permission of the Governor to be obtained through the Consular Office of the country to which the troops belong, or, if such country be not represented by a Consul, to be obtained by application by the Senior Officer in charge of such troops.

Power is reserved to the Governor to limit the number of men to be landed, and to forbid the landing of unarmed parties except on such conditions as he may from time to time prescribe.

In the event of foreign ships of war or transports intending to land more than 250 men, a form which will be handed to the master by the Visiting Police Officer shall be filled in and returned to the latter officer.

Should the vessel carrying troops be neither a ship of war nor a transport, the form shall be filled in and signed by the Senior Officer in charge of such troops.

Accommodation hadders.

Section VI., Rule 10.—Every vessel conveying passengers and arriving in the Harbour, unless she be placed in quarantine, shall as soon as possible put down one, or if conveying 100 or more passengers, at least two accommodation ladders, provided with horizontal landing platform of adequte size and suitable height above the water. If the vessel be placed in quarantine, the ladders shall be put down as soon as she is released from quarantine, but not before.

25. Rule 11 of section VI. of rules dated March 10, 1908 (Gazette No. 6,233 of March 13, 1908), is repealed and the following is substituted therefor:

Fishing with nets prohibited.

Section VI., Rule 11.—Fishing with nets inside the Breakwater, that is, within the enclosed harbour, and in the lake to Harbour Canal, Lock Basin, and Locks is prohibited.

26. Rule 12 of section VI. of rules dated November 4, 1908, and September 22, 1910 (Gazettes Nos. 6,272 of November 6, 1908, and 6,404 of September 30, 1910), is repealed and the following is substituted therefor:

Section VI., Rule 12.—Save and except steam trawlers used for fishing, all boats, canoes, kattumarans, and craft of any description kept or used for fishing shall when unemployed be anchored, moored, or hauled up in that part of the port known as the Fishery Harbour, and specially set apart for the use of fishing craft.

(b) No such fishing craft shall be brought within that portion of the port known as the "Harbour" and enclosed within the Breakwaters, except with the written permission of the Master

Attendant.

(c) No such fishing craft shall anchor, fish, or loiter near either of the entrances to the harbour in such a manner as to obstruct the free passage of the entrances.

(d) No fishing nets shall be spread or placed on any portion of the beach, ramp, foreshore, or

reclamation grounds within the limits of the said enclosed harbour.

(e) No cance or kattumaran, except such as have been licensed thereto by the Master Attendant, shall be beached between the western side of the rubble protection mole of the Fishery Harbour and the reef of rocks on the north-west angle of the Modera house property. The Master Attendant is empowered to issue, refuse, cancel, or suspend such licences at his discretion.

(f) No craft of any kind shall be beached nor shall nets be spread on that portion of the shore

between the North-east Breakwater and the rubble protection mole of the Fishery Harbour.

(g) No fish shall be landed or sold within the limits referred to in rules (e) and (f) except from fishing craft so licensed.

(h) Fishing craft not so licensed should be beached, and the fish from them landed, outside the eastern limit and towards Mutwal.

(i) The licences under rule (e) shall be issued in serial order, and be free of charge.

(j) The licensee shall paint, or cause to be painted, the serial number of his licence and the letters "F.H." in letters and numbers 6 inches high and 1 inch in width in black on a white background on each side of each fishing craft, or as the Master Attendant may direct.

(k) The owner or person in charge of, or other person having any interest in, any fishing net or craft or the employer of the persons using such nets or craft shall be liable for any breaches of these

Charges for hire of launches and boats,

Section VI., Rule 13.—Scale of steam launch, boat, and motor launch hire.

4. No person shall deposit any liquid or solid refuse or any rubbish within the camp area, except in the places or receptacles provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

(a) No cattle shall be kept in the camp area, and no cattle shall be kept in the vicinity of the camp area except at a place specially appointed as a cattle gala or at a place approved for such use by the Assistant Government Agent.

(b) The person in charge of cattle shall cause their droppings within the camp area to be removed to a place provided therefor, and he shall at all times keep clean the place occupied by his cattle.

6. All prepared foods sold within the camp area shall be protected from flies and dust by being (a) wrapped in or covered with clean paper or cloth, or (b) kept in closed glass cases, or (c)kept in other covered containers approved by the Medical Officer, or by the Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

7. No person who is likely to affect prejudically the cleanliness of the camp area, and no person who is suffering from an infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the camp area.

In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp during the festival, the Assistant Government Agent area may direct the pilgrims to leave the place of pilgrimage, and may prescribe the routes and methods for their conveyance

(a) Every person within the camp area who is suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease, and (b) every person who resides with him knowing that he is suffering shall report the case to the Medical or Sanitary

Officer in charge of the camp area.

10. When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any particular purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use the tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is set

11. No person shall keep bakeries, aerated water manufactories, or galas within the camp area without previously obtaining a licence from the Assistant Government Agent, permitting him to do so. The licence shall be ment Agent, permitting him to do so. issued free of charge.

12. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building within the camp area so as to

encroach on the main or other streets of the camp.

13. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, discharge fireworks and firearms within the camp area, or within a radius of one mile from the boundaries of such area

14. No person shall slaughter animals within the camp area, except in the place provided for the purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent, and every person slaughtering animals in such a place shall be responsible for its cleanliness. SCHEDULE.

Vessels in roads.

1. No vessels having infectious disease on board and liable to be placed in quarantine shall come quarantine to within the harbour without the permission of the Port Surgeon. Such vessel shall cast anchor in the outer anchor in outer roads in the place appointed by the Master Attendant for quarantine anchorage.

Any vessel within the harbour placed in quarantine shall immediately, if so required by the Port Surgeon, be removed to the quarantine anchorage in the outer roads aforesaid or as directed by the Master

Attendant.

All vessels in quarantine shall display the following signals:

The quarantine flag at the fore.

Two white lights six feet apart hoisted vertically well up at the fore. By night ...

All vessels arriving within the port shall display the quarantine signal until the Port Surgeon has given free or restricted pratique.

All vessels given restricted pratique shall display the following signals:-

The quarantine flag at the fore and the house flag under the national ensign By day at the stern.

One white light hoisted under the stern light. By night ...

Vessels infected with cholera, yellow fever, smallpox or plague.

2. The master of any vessel bound to any port in Ceylon, whose vessel is infected with cholera, yellow fever, smallpox, or plague, shall, when the vessel is within the territorial waters of Ceylon, cause to be hoisted and keep so hoisted:

At the masthead, or where it can be best seen, during the whole of the time between half an hour before sunrise and half an hour after sunset, a day signal (1) By day.. consisting of a large flag of yellow and black borne quarterly.

(2) By night

At the peak or other conspicuous place where it can be best seen, and at a height of not less than 20 feet above the hull of the ship, during the whole of the time between sunset and sunrise, a night signal consisting of three lights, which shall be arranged at a distance of not less than 6 feet apart, in the form of an equilateral triangle, and of which the light at the apex of the triangle shall be white, and the other lights at the ends of the base of the triangle shall be red in colour.

No person shall leave, and no person except a pilot in the employ of the Government of Ceylon shall go on board any such vessel until permission to do so has been granted by the "Proper Authority" appointed under the provisions of Ordinance No. 3 of 1897, or any officer acting on his behalf.

3. Between October 1 and March 31, no fishing shall take place within the Sally Port fishing area except by means of hand lines or hand nets thrown in either case from the rocks or seashore; or by means of the nets called "adasavalai," subject, however, in the case of "adasavalai" nets to the rules following.

4. Such "adasavalai" nets as are approved by the Assistant Government Agent of Trincomalee only may be

used within the area aforesaid, and on such days of the week as may be appointed by the Assistant Government

Agent from time to time.

5. Applications for the approval of "adasavalai" nets to be used for fishing in the Sally Port fishing area shall be made to the Assistant Government Agent between August 15 and September 1 of each year in writing.

6. The Assistant Government Agent may grant such approval after inspection of the nets on a day to be fixed by him, notice of which shall be given by beat of tom-tom not less than 14 days before the date so fixed.

SCHEDULE.

The Sally Port Fishing Area.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended August 2, 1930.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 143 (11 Burghers, 78 Sinhalese, 30 Tamils, 15 Moors, 5 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1930, viz., 270,700) was 27.5, as against 28.1 in the preceding week, 26.7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 201 (3 Europeans, 7 Burghers, 107 Sinhalese, 34 Tamils, 32 Moors, 8 Malays, and 10 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 38.7, as against 36.4 in the previous week, 27.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.9 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 201 total deaths, 46 were of infants under one year of age, as against 33 in the preceding week, 36 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 16.

Principal Causes of Death.-1. (a) Twenty-five deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 4 in Kotahena North, 3 each in Slave Island and Kollupitiya, 2 each in New Bazaar and Maradana East, and I each in St. Paul's and Wellawatta North, as against 19 in the previous week and 22 the weekly average for last year.

- (b) Twelve deaths from Influenza were registered, 4 in New Bazaar, 3 in San Sebastian, 2 in Kotahena North, and l each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, and Slave Island, as against 17 in the previous week, and 9 the weekly average for last year.
- (c) Six deaths from Bronchitis were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals, and 1 each in Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Maradana North, and Maradana East, as against 3 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.
- 2. Eleven deaths from Phthisis were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Slave Island, and 1 each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, and Maradana South, as against 14 in the previous week, and 11 the weekly average for last
- Six deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals and I each in New Bazaar, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta South, as against 8 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.
- 4. One death from Suspected Plague of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week. No death was registered within the city.
