ORDINANCE NO. 17 OF 1869.

REGULATIONS made by the Officer Administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by section 79 of an Ordinance for the General Regulation of Customs in the Island of Ceylon.

REGULATIONS.

1. In order to facilitate the despatch of steamers, the local agent of a steamer or the local agent of a company owning steamers may enter into a bond binding himself in the sum of Rs. 10,000, and by the deposit with the Collector of the sum of Rs. 1,000 to hold himself responsible for the payment upon the order of the Collector of any fine or penalty to which the agent or the master of such steamer, or any person employed in any work on behalf of such agent or master of such steamer, shall have rendered himself liable for any breach of Ordinance No. 17 of 1869 or any Ordinance, amending or modifying the same or any Ordinance, relating to the Customs, and for the payment of any fine or penalty on account of the non-delivery of cargo, and for the payment of any other fine or penalty in or about work performed on behalf of the master or agent of such steamer, and for the payment of any dues, rates, buoy rent, fines, penalties, or charges for which such steamer or the master, owner, or agent thereof is liable under the above-mentioned Ordinances.

Provided that where the local agent of a steamer or the local agent of a company owning steamers is the local agent of more than one steamer the property of different owners,

or the local agent of more than one company owning steamers, the local agent may enter into one bond in respect of the one or more steamers or of the one or more companies owning steamers of which he is the local agent and shall deposit only the sum of Rs. 1,000, which sum shall be taken to be a deposit in respect of each of the steamers of which he is such local agent. The Principal Collector of Customs may, in default of payment on demand by the local agent, deduct out of such sum of Rs. 1,000 any fine, dues, rates, buoy rent, charges, or penalty hereinbefore referred to.

2. The master of any steamer in respect of which a bond has been given as aforesaid may be permitted by the Collector, upon the application of the agent of such steamer, to begin coaling, landing, shipping, or transshipping immediately upon the arrival of such steamer and before she shall have been entered and reported.

3. The agent of the steamer shall, within twenty-four hours of the arrival of the steamer, enter the steamer and deliver the report and manifest, and all other documents required by law; and shall, within seven days of the departure of the steamer, deliver a correct outward content of the said steamer in such form and manner as shall be required by the Collector.

4. All amendments of reports, and all applications required to be made by the master of the steamer, shall be made by the agent of the steamer, who shall for such purposes be deemed and taken to be the agent of the master.

5. Applications to amend manifests whether by the alteration or by the addition of any item may be allowed by the Collector on payment of a penalty not exceeding one rupee in respect of each item altered, or added.

6. The Collector may, on the application of the master or agent of a steamer, permit work to be carried on in respect of the coaling or loading or unloading of such steamer, or the transshipment of cargo to or from each steamer after 4 P.M. (2 P.M. on Saturdays) and before 6 A.M. on any day, provided that if required by the Collector the agent or master shall deposit before the granting of such permission a sum sufficient for the payment of the charges leviable in respect of such working.

7. The Collector may allow any person exporting cargo, who shall have deposited such sum as the Collector shall require, to ship such cargo before entry has been passed and payment of all dues made and all requirements and regulations fulfilled. The interest on such deposit will accrue to revenue. Such person shall within four days of shipping such cargo, pass all entries and pay all dues and fulfil all requirements and regulations. The Collector may impose a penalty not exceeding Rs. 100 on any person who shall fail within the four days aforesaid, to pass all entries and to pay all dues and fulfil all requirements and regulations; and such penalty may be deducted from the sum deposited as aforesaid. The Collector may at any time return the deposit or the balance thereof, and require the person exporting cargo to pay all dues and make all entries and fulfil all requirements and regulations before shipping such cargo.

Note.—The deposit under paragraph 7 of the above regulations does not apply to security for the payment of export duty, which must be given separately.

Exportation.

8. With all goods brought for shipment there shall be sent a note giving particulars as to the number and contents of packages, the ship by which they are to be shipped, and the name of the shipper. It shall be given up at the gate or lock to the Tidewater on duty. A separate note shall be sent with each cart, lorry, boat, or other vehicle.

9. A shipping specification shall be furnished for all cargo sent for shipment, and no cargo shall be shipped until such specification has been received by the Export Officer.

10. (i.) With each boat load of goods laden for shipment there shall be sent a boat note specifying the number of packages and the marks and numbers or other description thereof, and the name of the vessel to which the packages are to be shipped, and the port of destination, and such boat note shall be furnished and signed by the shipper or his agent.

(ii.) Masters of vessels are prohibited from accepting boat notes not bearing the Customs stamp.

11. (i.) No goods shall be shipped before entries have been passed except in cases where the deposit required by section 7 above has been made. Shipment will not be allowed where the estimated duty on the proposed shipment exceeds the amount standing to the credit of the shipper, without the special permission of a Supervising Officer, and then only if permission has been obtained under rule 2.

(ii.) Entry must be passed, and further rent and dues, if any, paid within four days of shipment.

12. (i.) In the event of any goods laden for shipment being shut out for any reason, the original boat note shall be produced to the Landing Waiter before re-landing, with an endorsement thereon signed by the Shipping Company's Agent giving the number and description of the packages shut out. No such goods shall be re-landed until the Landing Waiter has given the necessary permission, and has initialled and dated the boat note.

(ii.) If the boat note cannot be produced, or if the Shipping Company desires its return, application to re-land shall be made in writing, full particulars of such cargo being stated.

13. The delivery for shipment shall close the first period of deposit as regards all dues. On re-landing and re-deposit in the warehouse, a fresh period shall commence from the day on which the cargo was shut out.

14. In the case of sailing vessels:—

(i.) If before all the cargo has been discharged the vessel has to be stiffened, the master may on application obtain a stiffening order, on production of which to the Export Officer permission may be given for the delivery for shipment of the cargo therein mentioned.

(ii.) If no stiffening order has been granted, the master must submit the clearing bill duly reported upon before shipment will be permitted.

Transshipment and Reshipment.

15. Unless special permission has been obtained to land the cargo into an import warehouse, all goods for reshipment must, in order to be entitled to be treated as reshipment cargo, be deposited in a transshipment warehouse and re-shipped therefrom on application on the proper forms. No reshipment shall be allowed until the deposit and shipment applications have been delivered to the Transshipment Landing Waiter.

16. If transshipment cargo has been landed into an import warehouse and cannot be removed to a transshipment warehouse for want of space, a certificate to this effect from the Landing Surveyor should be obtained on the deposit application, and from the date of such certificate the cargo may be treated for computation of harbour dues and rent as removed to a transshipment warehouse.

17. The Collector may, on application, allow the shipment of such cargo before payment of dues, provided the application is signed by steamer agents who have given a bond and provided the charges payable in respect of each package are stated on the application.

18. If any portion of the cargo taken for shipment is shut out, it shall not be re-landed without written permission on an application, to be produced to the transshipment Landing Waiter specifying the cargo shut out.

19. Separate applications shall be furnished for shipments in different vessels.

20. Applications to tranship direct from ship to ship shall be furnished in duplicate, and, when sanctioned by a Supervising Officer, shall be taken first to the Export Officer to be noted and then to the Charges Officer, who shall appoint an officer to each vessel to tally the deliveries and receipts by boat notes.

21. (i.) Coastwise goods brought for reshipment, if on a through bill of lading, shall be free of harbour dues, both inward and outward, but are liable to rent at the same rate as coastwise cargo locally consigned.

(ii.) In all other cases such goods are liable to harbour dues and rent as ordinary coastwise cargo, both inward and outward, if landed, but outward only if re-shipped without being landed.

22. (i.) Goods brought from abroad and re-shipped to a coastwise port (including passengers' baggage not cleared on a declaration) shall be treated as reshipment cargo, and dues shall be levied thereon according to the warehouse

in which they are allowed to remain. The usual application to deposit should be furnished, but, before reshipment, instead of the outward application, an entry containing the name of the landing vessel, port of sailing marks, number of packages, description and value of the goods shall be passed. Such entry shall bear on its face the words "To be removed under section 46 of Ordinance No. 17 of 1869 to _____ in the ss. "_____".

(ii.) A bond shall be entered into in double the amount of duty leviable to provide for the payment of the duty to the Collector at the port of destination due and for the due delivery of the goods.

(iii.) Such goods are not liable to export harbour dues.
23. For a breach of any one of these rules the Collector of Customs may impose a penalty not exceeding Fifty Rupees (Rs. 50) and such penalty may be recovered as a fine by a Police Court on the Collector's certifying that such penalty is due.

24. The regulations dated May 30, 1900, as amended by the regulations dated August 26, 1909, April 27, 1911, and July 2, 1917, are hereby repealed.

14. No tender will be considered unless the procedure laid down above has been strictly complied with. The Conservator of Forests reserves to himself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and of accepting any portion of a tender.

15. The special rules for felling, conversion, and removal, which the agreement will require to be observed are specified in the special conditions advertised below. Nothing in these special conditions shall render the purchaser in any way exempt from liability under the Forest Ordinance of 1907, should he be responsible for the commission of a forest offence outside the boundaries of his purchased coupe.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS.

(1) All trees to be felled within 1 ft. 6 in. of the ground, except hora and tawwenna, none of which species are to be felled.

(2) (a) The duration of the agreement shall be nine months from the date of the acceptance of the tender, as intimated by a letter from Divisional Forest Officer.

(b) On payment of the full purchase amount the purchaser will be entitled to fell and remove on or before the expiry date in the manner specified below, all firewood and timber contained in the purchased coupe. Any firewood not removed by the expiry date, shall *ipso facto* revert to the Crown.

(3) If the purchaser desires to pay by instalments payment of a first instalment of 40 per cent. of the full purchase price tendered shall entitle him to fell and remove one-third of the trees in the coupe. Payment of 70 per cent. of the full purchase price by means of a second instalment of 30 per cent. shall entitle the purchaser to fell and remove not more than two-thirds of the total number of trees.

(4) The purchaser shall pay for the second instalment, or in all 70 per cent. of the full purchase price, within four months, and the third and the final instalment within seven months of the date of execution of the agreement. Should the purchaser fail to pay the second and final instalment when due, it shall be within the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer to cancel the agreement as from the date of such default. Any unremoved timber will revert to the Crown as from the date of such cancellation and the purchaser will forfeit all claims thereto.

(5) Should the purchaser fell or remove timber trees in excess of the quantity specified in special condition 2, nothing in the agreement shall exempt him from being liable for illicit felling and removal under the Forest Ordinance, No. 16 of 1907.

(6) The purchaser will be required to spread the branchwood evenly over the coupe immediately after conversion, so as to leave no bare patches liable to soil erosion.

(7) The purchaser shall either exercise such personal supervision as will ensure the conditions of this agreement being efficiently executed or employ an efficient supervisor.

(8) The purchaser or his agent or his workmen shall not damage any boundary pillars or calamander plants, or block up the boundaries by depositing any brushwood or branches. All lines so blocked must be cleared by the purchaser.

(9) A general removal permit will be issued by the Divisional Forest Officer authorizing the purchaser to remove the firewood standing in one-third of the trees according to the purchaser amount paid, *vide* conditions 3 and 4 in such daily quantities as will be specified in cartnotes which must accompany each and every cart track in transit. The Forest Ranger or Forest Overseer or the Forest Guard will measure up the wood which is ready for removal twice a week between 9.30 A.M. and 3.30 P.M. and will issue the necessary cartnotes which shall accompany each and every cart in transit.

(10) The purchaser shall agree that, in the event of security money having become exhausted, it shall be within the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer either (a) to accept a further security deposit amounting to 10 per cent. of the full tendered purchase price, or (b) to cancel the agreement and to refund to the purchaser such balance of the paid up purchase money, if any, as remains after deducting the value of firewood removed by the purchaser on the date of such cancellation. For the purpose of this clause the value of each removed cubic yard of firewood shall be reckoned at full royalty rates.

(11) The purchaser shall have the right of appeal to the Conservator of Forests in the event of the enforcement of any of the penalties specified in the conditions, and the purchaser shall agree to accept the Conservator's decision as final and binding.

(12) In the case of services "A" and "D" the purchaser shall be required to cut all materials in the coupes in the coppice system by four distinct operations as follows:—

Operation 1.

All herbaceous and undergrowth other than tree growth shall be cut out. This operation shall commence along the full length of one boundary of each coupe and proceed in a straight line to the opposite boundary of that coupe. The whole area of each coupe must thus be covered including those portions, if any, which contain no tree growth.

Operation 2.

All tree seedlings and saplings which are under one inch diameter shall be coppiced out within two inches of the ground by means of sharp cattles or any other instrument authorized by the Divisional Forest Officer. This operation shall commence from and proceed to the same boundaries and in the same alignments as operation 1. Not less than three days shall have elapsed between the execution of operation 1 and the commencement of operation 2 in any portion of the area, and there shall be an interval on the ground of not less than one chain between operations 1 and 2 except where the terminating boundary is reached.

Operation 3.

All saplings which are over one inch in diameter and not exceeding eight inches diameter shall be felled within twelve inches of the ground, and on the day of felling the stools shall be coppiced by means of sharp adzes cleanly and flush with the ground. This operation shall proceed from and to the same boundaries and with the same intervals in relation to operation 2, as the latter is required to proceed with in relation to operation 1.

Operation 4.

All trees over eight inches in diameter shall be felled within two inches of the ground, and within three days of felling all the stools which are between eight inches and fifteen inches diameter shall be coppiced cleanly and to within one inch of the ground. This operation shall proceed from and to the same boundaries and with the same intervals in relation to operation 1.

Separate working parties shall be assigned to these four separate operations, and separate workmen shall be detailed to keep the coppicing tools invariably sharp. The purchaser shall either exercise such personal supervision as will ensure this work being executed efficiently, or employ an efficient supervisor.

(13) In services "A" and "D" if coppicing at any stage of the operations, after the work has commenced is not carried out rigidly as indicated above and is considered unsatisfactory by the Divisional Forest Officer he shall discontinue the issue of permits for removal of timber and firewood until the work is satisfactory: if the work continues to be unsatisfactory after two warnings the Divisional Forest Officer may at his sole discretion stop all felling and removal, cancel the agreement, and confiscate the security and all instalments paid up-to-date.

(14) In services "B," "C," and "E" all brushwood and refuse shall be evenly spread over the ground by the purchaser and completely burnt before the date of expiry.

SCHEDULE.

Service "A"—Dikkele.

The areas to be exploited are demarcated coupes in Dikkele forest, situated in Hipankanda village in Bentota-Walallawiti korale of the Galle District.

Coupe 7.—Approximately 4 acres in extent and estimated to contain 784 cubic feet of timber and 100 cubic yards of firewood.

Coupe 10.—Approximately 12 acres in extent and estimated to contain 3,862 cubic feet of timber and 600 cubic yards of firewood.

The area is estimated to contain 208 trees of 3 feet and over at breast height and is estimated to contain 2,000 cubic feet of timber and 1,300 cubic yards of firewood.

Service "C"—Yagirala.

The areas to be exploited are demarcated coupes in Pasdun korale of the Kalutara District.

Coupe 13.—Comprising about 18½ acres of jungle, is bounded on the north by paddy field and patana land, on the east by coupe 8 cut line, on the south by Domba area (Silva's block), and on the west by coupe 14 cut line.

2. All tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover, and should be addressed to the Chairman, Tender Board, Office of the Controller of Revenue, Colombo.

3. Tenders should either be deposited in the tender box in the Office of the Controller of Revenue, or be sent through the post.

4. Tenders should be marked "Tender for Supply of Firewood to the Forest Department Depôt, Trincomalee, 1930-31," in the left hand top corner of the envelope, and should reach the Office of the Controller of Revenue, not later than midday on Tuesday, September 23, 1930.

5. Tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application at the Forest Office, Trincomalee, and no tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized form. Alterations must be initialled, otherwise the tenders may be treated as informal and rejected.

6. A deposit of Rs. 20 will be required to be made either at the Treasury or Kachcheri, and a receipt produced for the same before any form of tender is issued. Should any person decline or fail to enter into contract and bond or to furnish approved security within ten days of receiving notice in writing from the Head of the Department or his duly authorized representative, that his tender has been accepted, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown, and the defaulter will render himself liable to be included in the list of defaulting contractors precluded from having any concern in a Government contract. All other deposits will be returned upon signature of contract.

7. Each tender must be accompanied by a letter signed by two responsible persons, whose addresses must be given, engaging to become security for the due fulfilment of the contract.

8. A rate per cubic yard of firewood should be quoted, written both in words and figures.

9. Sufficient sureties will be required to join in a bond for the due fulfilment of the contract. The amount of cash security required to be deposited by the successful tenderer shall be 5 per cent. of the value of the contract, and this amount will be required to be deposited before entering into the contract.

10. A penalty of 25 cents for every cubic yard of firewood not stacked or delivered at the monthly rate specified in the schedule below will be exacted from the contractor at the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer.

11. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions above laid down have been strictly fulfilled.

12. The Government reserves to itself the right without question of rejecting any or all tenders and the right of accepting any portion of a tender.

13. Contract may not be assigned or sublet without the authority of the Tender Board previously obtained.

14. The contractor must not issue a power of attorney to a person whose name is on the list of defaulting contractors authorizing him to carry on the contract.

15. No contract shall be entered into with any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors, either individually or jointly with any person, nor shall the contractor employ any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors, or any other person to whom the Divisional Forest Officer, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, objects after giving due notice of his objection in writing.

16. Tenderers should read and note a draft contract which is available in the Forest Office, Trincomalee, before they obtain their forms, and certify that they have inspected the demarcated blocks.

17. Rejected material will not be paid for, and it will lapse to Government. The contractor shall have no claim in respect of such material.

18. Tenderers who have not previously held Government contracts, when applying for tender form, should furnish the officer issuing the forms with a written statement giving their full names and permanent addresses, stating in which district or districts they own landed property or other interests. The extent of landed property and the nature and extent of other interests should also be given. In the case of persons who have carried out contracts with the Forest Department, but not in the division or district concerned in the notice calling for tenders, they should state in which division or district or divisions or districts they held contracts. In the case of persons who have carried out Government contracts with departments other than the Forest Department, the name of such department and the district in which the service was rendered should be stated.

Schedule.

(a) To supply 2,000 cubic yards, more or less, of firewood from a demarcated block of forest 50 acres in extent, east of 1928-29 block on the Anuradhapura road between the 6th and 7th mileposts, a distance of transport not exceeding 10 miles. The area will be pointed out by the Range Forest Officer.

(b) Each piece of wood to be 3 ft. in length and of 2 in. minimum diameter. Billets over 2 ft. girth should be split.

(c) All wood immediately after conversion to be transported to the delivery depôt, where it should be stacked in the manner pointed out by an officer of the Forest Department. Supplies are to be made weekly, and not less than 250 cubic yards of firewood should be supplied in a month.

(d) No firewood will be accepted and paid for, unless it is of the above description and properly cut and stacked.

(e) Only trees marked by the Range Forest Officer are to be felled, and only cart tracks marked and opened by the Forest Department are to be utilized.

(f) No loading or unloading of firewood shall be done by the contractor or his carters on Public Works Department roads, and the contractor will be liable for any damage caused to Public Works Department roads by his carts.

(g) The contractor shall clear a portion of the forest close to the road as intermediate depôt for loading and unloading firewood, and also erect strong temporary bridge over the side drains between the forest path and the Public Works Department road to prevent damage to Public Works Department road.

6. A deposit of Rs. 25 will be required to be made either at the Treasury or any Kachcheri in respect of each coupe, and a receipt produced for same before any form of the tender is issued.

7. Tenderers should satisfy themselves by inspection before tendering as to the acreage and contents of the demarcated coupes referred to in the annexed schedules as the figures therein are estimated only and their correctness is in no way guaranteed. The boundaries of the coupes will be pointed out by the Range Forest Officer, Ratnapura.

8. The successful tenderer will be required to execute a purchase agreement in respect of each coupe, and all tenderers should read and initial a copy of this agreement at the Office of the Divisional Forest Officer, Sabaragamuwa Division, Ratnapura, at the time of obtaining forms for tendering.

9. Before execution of the agreement, the purchaser will be required (a) to pay either the full purchase amount or, if payment by instalments, 40 per cent. thereof, (b) to deposit as security for efficient and punctual fulfilment of the agreement Rs. 100. If paying by instalments, the balance 60 per cent. of the full purchase price shall be paid by the purchaser in two equal instalments in accordance with clauses 3 and 5 of the special conditions set out below in this notice.

10. After payment of the first instalment of the purchase price, deposit of the security and execution of the agreement the purchaser will be entitled on application to a refund of the sum of Rs. 25 deposited by him prior to tendering.

11. Tenderers should make separate offers, written both in words and figures, for the timber and firewood contained in the coupes described in the annexed schedules.

12. No tender will be considered unless the procedure laid down above has been strictly complied with. The Conservator of Forests reserves to himself the right, without question of rejecting any or all tenders, and of accepting any tender not necessarily the highest tender.

13. Should any tender or offer be accepted, and should the successful tenderer after due notification decline or fail to pay any sum or sums stipulated for and to enter into the necessary contract within the time allowed, or in reasonable time, he will be held pecuniarily liable for any resultant loss to Government. Tenders and offers are made and received on this distinct understanding. The Conservator of Forests reserves the discretionary power to waive the terms of this clause in any degree as he may consider the circumstances justify.

14. The special rules for felling, conversion, and removal which the agreement will require to be observed are specified in the special conditions advertised below. Nothing in these special conditions shall render the purchaser in any way exempt from liability to punishment under the Forest Ordinance of 1907, should he or any of the workmen in his employ be responsible for the commission of a forest offence outside the boundaries of his purchased coupe or coupes.

Special Conditions.

(1) On payment of the full purchase amount the purchaser shall be entitled to fell and remove on or before March 31, 1931, in the manner specified below, all the timber and firewood contained in the purchased coupe or coupes. No extension of the time limit fixed for felling and removal will be granted except under very special circumstances, and all timber and firewood not removed by the date of expiry of agreement, *i.e.*, March 31, 1931, shall *ipso facto* revert to the Crown.

(2) The purchaser shall further agree that should any timber be left standing or lying felled within the coupe on the date of expiry, the expenses incurred by Government for their removal be defrayed from the amount deposited by him as security under clause (b) in paragraph 9 above.

(3) If the purchaser desires to pay by instalments, payment of a first instalment of 40 per cent. of the full purchase price of the coupe or coupes shall entitle him to fell and remove all the trees in an area not exceeding one third of the total area of such coupe. Payment of 70 per cent. of the purchase price by means of a second instalment of 30 per cent. shall entitle the purchaser to fell and remove all the trees in an area not exceeding two-thirds of the total area of such coupe.

(4) The purchaser shall agree to commence felling along the full length of one boundary of each coupe previously pointed out to him by the Range Forest Officer, Ratnapura, and laid down on the plan of the coupe annexed to the agreement. He shall further agree to progress the felling in a direction parallel to the boundary along which the felling has been commenced in the manner prescribed under clauses (a) and (b) below:—

(a) All tree seedlings and saplings which are under 3 inches in diameter shall be cut out flush with the ground.

(b) All saplings and trees over three inches in diameter shall be felled within 6 inches of the ground.

(5) If paying by instalments, the purchaser shall pay the second instalment or in all 70 per cent. of the full purchase price within 4 months, and the third and final instalment within 6 months of the date of execution of the agreement.

Should the purchaser fail to pay either instalment when due, it shall be within the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer to cancel the agreement as from the date of such default, and to declare same to be null and void.

Any unremoved or unfelled timber or firewood lying or standing in the coupe or coupes shall unconditionally revert to the Crown as from the date of such cancellation, and the purchaser shall have no further claim thereto. On no

account shall any postponement of the date of such payment be made.

(6) Should the purchaser fell or remove trees or firewood from any area of the coupe or coupes he has not paid for, or from any area of forest outside the demarcated boundaries of his coupe or coupes, nothing in the agreement shall exempt him from liability to punishment for illicit felling and removal under the provisions of the Forest Ordinance, No. 16 of 1907, and of the rules framed thereunder. For the purpose of this special condition, it shall be presumed that the purchaser has previous to entering into the agreement, satisfied himself, as to the position of the lines and pillars demarcating his coupe, or coupes and that the purchaser has further agreed that he shall not in the event of any dispute put forward a plea of ignorance of the limits or extent of his coupe or coupes.

(7) The purchaser or his agent or any of his employees shall not damage any boundary pillars or block up the boundaries. Should the lines become blocked or the pillars thrown down due to unavoidable circumstances, such lines should be at once re-cleared or such pillar re-placed.

(8) The purchaser shall not for the purpose of removing timber from his coupe or coupes enter into any other area of forest not paid for by him except with the permission of the Range Forest Officer, and along paths permitted by him.

(9) The purchaser shall further agree to compensate the Crown for any damage to produce caused by himself, his employees, his animals, his machinery or his material in transit over any area of forest not paid for by him at rates to be assessed by the Divisional Forest Officer, Ratnapura.

(10) If no objection exists in the opinion of the Divisional Forest Officer, the purchaser will further be permitted to erect wire shoots for the transport of materials always, provided that he pays full royalty values for the forest produce outside his own coupe or coupes, damaged during such erection or in using such shoot. The permission in writing of the Divisional Forest Officer, Ratnapura, must be obtained before erection of any and every wire shoot.

(11) A general removal permit will be issued by the Divisional Forest Officer authorizing the purchaser to remove the timber and firewood felled in one-third of the area of the coupe or coupes according to the purchase amount paid, *vide* special conditions (1) and (3), in such daily quantities as will be specified in cart notes which must accompany each and every cart load in transit. The Forest Ranger or any officer of the Forest Department deputed by him for the supervision of the felling will measure up the wood which is ready for removal twice daily at 9.30 A.M. and 3.30 P.M., and will issue the necessary cart notes which shall accompany each and every cart in transit.

(12) The purchaser shall agree that for each and every infringement of the above conditions he shall become liable to a fine of an amount not exceeding Rs. 50 to be imposed in writing by and at the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer, Ratnapura, and this fine will be recovered from the tenderer's security deposit.

(13) The purchaser shall also agree that in the event of security money having become exhausted owing to imposition of fines, it shall be within the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer either (a) to accept a further security deposit amounting to 5 per cent. of the full purchase price; (b) to cancel the agreement and to refund to the purchaser such balance of the paid up purchase money, if any, as may remain after deducting the value of all timber and firewood removed by the purchaser on the date of such cancellation and such amount as may be needed to carry out any of the provisions of special conditions (4) and (7) which the purchaser may not at the time of such cancellation have fulfilled. For the purpose of this clause the value of each cubic foot of timber and cubic yard of fuel removed shall be fixed at full royalty rates.

(14) The purchaser shall have the right of appeal to the Conservator of Forests in the event of any of the enforcement of any of the above penalties specified in the above conditions, and the purchaser shall agree to accept the Conservator of Forests' decision as final and binding.

SCHEDULE A.

To purchase all timber and firewood within the boundaries of the 12 acre coupe demarcated from Merekele Reserve of Ellawala-Ihalagama in Kuruwiti korale of the Ratnapura District. The timber is estimated at Rs. 76.68 and fuel at Rs. 48 per acre and the whole coupe is valued at Rs. 1,496.16.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended August 30, 1930.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 179 (1 European, 16 Burghers, 105 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 29 Moors, 4 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1930, viz., 270,700) was 34.5, as against 32.9 in the preceding week, 30.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 151 (15 Burghers, 87 Sinhalese, 31 Tamils, 16 Moors, and 2 Malays). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 29.1, as against 31.0 in the previous week, 33.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.9 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 151 total deaths, 24 were of infants under one year of age, as against 37 in the preceding week, 40 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 12.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty-five deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 14 in Maradana hospitals (including 8 deaths of non-residents), 3 each in Kotahena South and New Bazaar, 2 in Maradana North, and 1 each in Maradana East, Slave Island, and Wellawatta North, as against 16 in the previous week, and 22 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Three deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 in New Bazaar and 1 in Kotahena South, as against 6 in the previous week, and 9 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Five deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), and 1 in Kotahena South, as against 6 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Ten deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), and 1 each in St. Paul's, Maradana East, and Maradana South, as against 18 in the previous week, and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Three deaths from *Phthisis*, of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. (a) Eight deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), 2 in Slave Island, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Maradana East, and Maradana South, as against 3 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Enteric Fever*, of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.

4. Two deaths from *Plague*, of residents of Colombo town, occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week. No deaths were registered within the city.

5. Seven deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 6 from *Debility*, 4 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 3 each from *Diarrhoea*, *Tetanus*, and *Accidents*, 2 from *Suicide*, 1 each from *Dysentery* and *Homicide*, and 70 from *Other Causes*.

6. *Reported Cases.*—Twenty-one cases of *Enteric Fever*, 19 of *Chickenpox*, and 2 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 9, 11, and 1, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80.5°, against 81.0° in the preceding week and 80.7° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.865 in., against 29.868 in. in the preceding week, and 29.928 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.68 in., against 0.28 in. in the preceding week and 0.07 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF MASON'S MIXTURE, LIMITED.

1. The regulations contained in the Table marked "C" in the schedule to the Companies Ordinance, No. 4 of 1861 (hereinafter called Table "C"), shall apply to the Company and be deemed to be incorporated herewith except so far as they are herein expressly or by implication modified or excluded or declared not to apply and in the construction of these presents words importing the masculine gender only shall include the feminine gender and words importing the singular number only shall include the plural number and *vice versa* and words importing persons shall include corporations.

2. The following new regulations shall be inserted immediately before regulation 1 of Table "C," namely:—

BUSINESS.

(a) The Company may proceed to carry out the object for which it is established, and to employ and apply its capital as soon after the registration of the Company as the Directors in their discretion shall think fit; and if the whole of the shares shall not have been subscribed, applied for, or allotted as soon as in the judgment of the Directors, a sufficient number of shares shall have been subscribed or applied for.

(b) The Company shall forthwith adopt the agreement referred to in sub-clause (1) of clause 3. of the Memorandum of Association and shall carry the said agreement into effect with such modification (if any) as may be agreed upon. And it is hereby provided and declared that the basis on which the Company is established is that the Company shall acquire the business and property comprised and described in the said agreement on the terms therein set forth subject to such modifications if any as aforesaid, and that N. W. Bentley Buckle, C. F. Hutchinson, S. P. Hayley, and S. S. Mason are to be the first Directors of the Company (provided that the said S. S. Mason shall join the Board after allotment) and it shall be no objection to the said agreement that the said S. S. Mason and S. P. Hayley is or are vendor or vendors, promoter or promoters, Director or Directors, Agent or Agents, or that they stand or either of them stands in a fiduciary position towards the Company or that there is no independent Board of Directors. And the said agreement shall not be set aside or reduced and no claim shall be made by the Company or any member thereof against the parties thereto on any ground whatever and every member of the Company present and future is to be deemed to join the Company on this basis.

CAPITAL.

(c) The nominal capital of the Company is Rupees One hundred Thousand (Rs. 100,000) divided into 10,000 ordinary shares of Rupees Ten (Rs. 10) each.

(d) The Directors may, with the sanction of a special resolution of the Company in General Meeting, increase the capital of the Company by the creation of new shares of such amounts per share and in the aggregate and with such special, preferential, deferred, qualified, or other rights, privileges, or conditions attached thereto as such resolution shall direct.

(e) Except so far as otherwise provided by the conditions of issue or by these presents, any capital raised by the creation of new shares shall be considered part of the original capital, and shall be subject to the same provisions in all respects with reference to the payments of allotment money, calls and instalments, transfer, transmission, forfeiture, lien, surrender, and otherwise, as if it had formed part of the original capital.

(f) The Directors may also with the sanction of a special resolution of the Company reduce the capital or sub-divide or consolidate the shares of the Company.

3. The following new regulations shall be added after regulation 10 of Table "C," namely:—

(10) (a) The Board may, at their own absolute and uncontrolled discretion, decline to register any transfer of shares by a Shareholder who is indebted to the Company, or upon whose shares the Company have a lien, or otherwise; or in case of shares not fully paid up, to any person not approved of by them; and in no case

shall a Shareholder or proposed transferee be entitled to require the Directors to state the reason of their refusal to register, but their declinature shall be absolute.

(10) (b) Every instrument of transfer must be left at the office of the Company to be registered, accompanied by the certificate for the shares to be transferred and by such evidence as the Directors may reasonably require to prove the title of the transferor, and a fee of Two Rupees and Fifty cents or such other sum as the Directors shall from time to time determine, must be paid to the Company for the registration of every such transfer; upon payment thereof the Directors, subject to the powers vested in them by Article 10 (a) shall register the transferee as a Shareholder and retain the instrument of transfer.

(10) (c) The Directors may, by such means as they shall deem expedient, authorize the registration of transferees as Shareholders, without the necessity of any meeting of the Directors for that purpose.

(10) (d) In no case shall the Directors be bound to inquire into the validity, legal effect, or genuineness of any instrument of transfer produced by a person claiming a transfer of any share in accordance with these Articles; and whether they abstain from so inquiring, or do so inquire and are misled, the transferor shall have no claim whatsoever upon the Company in respect of the share, except for the dividends previously declared in respect thereof, but only if at all, upon the transferee.

4. The following new regulations shall be added after regulation 20 of Table "C," namely:—

BORROWING POWERS.

(20) (a) The Directors shall have power to procure from time to time, in the usual course of business, such temporary advances as they may find necessary or expedient for the purpose of defraying the expenses of working the Company's business, or of erecting, maintaining, improving, or extending buildings, machinery, or otherwise. Also from time to time at their discretion to borrow or raise from the Directors or other persons any sum or sums of money for the purposes of the Company, provided that the money so borrowed or raised and owing at any one time shall not, without the sanction of a General Meeting, exceed Rupees Twenty-five Thousand (Rs. 25,000).

(20) (b) With the sanction of a General Meeting, the Board shall be entitled to borrow such further sum or sums, and at such rate of interest as such meeting shall determine. A certificate under the hands of one Director and the Secretary, or of two Directors, to the effect that in taking any loan the Directors are not exceeding their borrowing powers, shall be sufficient and binding on the Company and all concerned, and shall be conclusive evidence thereof in all questions between the Company and its creditors.

(20) (c) For the purpose of securing the repayment of any such money so borrowed or raised, or for any other purposes, the Directors may grant, create, execute, and issue any mortgages, cash credits, debentures, debenture stock, bonds, or obligations of the Company, charged upon all or any part of the undertaking, revenue, lands, property, rights, and assets of the Company, both present and future, including uncalled capital or unpaid calls, or may make, accept, or endorse on behalf of the Company any promissory notes or bills of exchange.

(20) (d) Any such securities may be issued either at par or at a premium or discount, and may from time to time be cancelled, discharged, varied, or exchanged as the Directors may think fit, and may contain special privileges as to redemption, surrender, drawings, allotment of shares or otherwise.

(20) (e) Every debenture or other instrument issued by the Company for securing the payment of money may be so framed that the moneys thereby secured shall be assignable free from any equities between the Company and the person to whom the same may be issued.

5. Regulations 21 and 22 of Table "C" are expressly excluded.

6. Regulation 24 of Table "C" is expressly excluded and the following regulation substituted therefor, namely, "Subsequent General Meetings shall be held at least once in every year at such time and place as may be determined by the Directors."

7. A quorum at any General or Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company shall consist of not less than three Shareholders and regulation 32 of Table "C" is modified accordingly.

8. Regulations 39, 42, 43, and 44 are expressly excluded and the following regulations substituted therefor, namely:—

(a) On a show of hands every Shareholder present in person shall have one vote. On a poll every Shareholder shall have one vote for each share of which he is the holder.

(b) No Shareholder shall be entitled to vote at any General Meeting unless all calls or other sums presently payable by him in respect of shares in the Company have been paid.

(c) On a poll votes may be given either personally or by proxy or attorney.

(d) The instrument appointing a proxy shall be in writing under the hand of the appointor or of his attorney duly authorized in writing or if the appointor is a corporation either under the common seal or under the hand of an officer or attorney so authorized.

(e) The instrument appointing a proxy and the power of attorney or other authority (if any) under which it is signed or a notarially certified copy of that power or authority shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than forty-eight hours before the time for holding the meeting at which the person named in the instrument proposes to vote and in default the instrument of proxy shall not be treated as valid.

(f) An instrument appointing a proxy may be in the following form or in any other form which the Directors shall approve:—

9. Regulations 45 and 46 of Table "C" are expressly excluded and the following new regulations shall be added after regulation 44 of Table "C," namely:—

(44) (a) A meeting of the Directors for the time being at which a quorum is present shall be competent to exercise all or any of the authorities, powers, and discretions by or under the regulations of the Company for the time being vested in or exercisable by the Directors generally. The presence of two or more Directors and a representative of the Agents and Secretaries shall form a quorum at any Directors' Meeting.

(44) (b) A resolution in writing signed by all of the Directors shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Directors duly called and constituted and every such resolution shall be as soon as practicable entered on the minutes of the Directors' Meetings.

(44) (c) The seal of the Company shall not be affixed to any instrument except in the presence of two or more of the Directors, or of one Director and the Secretary or Secretaries who shall attest the sealing thereof; such attestation on the part of the Secretaries, in the event of a firm or registered company being the Secretaries, being signified by a partner or duly authorized manager, director, secretary, attorney, or agent of the said firm or company signing for and on behalf of the said firm or company as such Secretaries.

(44) (d) A Director may at any time give notice in writing of his intention to resign by delivering such notice to the Agents and Secretaries of the Company, and on the acceptance of his resignation by the Directors but not before his office shall become vacant.

(44) (e) As remuneration for their services the Directors shall be entitled to appropriate a sum not exceeding Rs. 3,000 annually to be divided between them in such manner as they may determine, but the Company

in General Meeting may at any time alter the amount of such remuneration for the future. If any Director shall be called upon to perform any extra services the Directors may arrange with such Director for such special remuneration for such services over and above the aforesaid annual remuneration either by way of salary, commission, or the payment of a lump sum of money as they shall think fit.

10. Regulation 48 of Table "C" is expressly excluded and the following substituted therefor, namely:—

(48.) The office of Director shall be vacated—

(a) If he becomes bankrupt or insolvent, or suspends payment or files a petition for the liquidation of his affairs, or compounds with his creditors.

(b) If by reason of mental or bodily infirmity he becomes incapable of acting.

(c) If he resigns his office under the provisions of regulation 44 (d).

(d) If he is absent from three consecutive Meetings of Directors.

No Director shall be disqualified from holding office by reason of entering into any contract with or doing any work for the Company or by reason of his being a member of any corporation, company, or firm which has entered into any contract with, or done any work for the Company or by reason of his being agent, or secretary, or solicitor, or being a member of a firm who are agents, or secretaries, or solicitors of the Company; nevertheless, he shall disclose to the Directors his interest in any contract work or business in which he may be personally interested and shall not vote in respect of any matters connected with any such contract work, or business.

11. Regulation 64 of Table "C" is expressly excluded and the following substituted therefor, namely:—

(64) (a) The Directors may at such times as the circumstances of the Company warrant the same declare dividends to be paid to the Shareholders in proportion to the number of their shares and the amount paid up or deemed to be paid up thereon respectively.

(64) (b) The Directors may if they shall think fit declare from time to time such interim dividends as in their opinion the position of the Company justifies.

12. Regulations 85, 86, and 87 of Table "C" are expressly excluded and the following regulations added after regulation 84 of Table "C":—

NOTICES.

(85) Notices from the Company may be authenticated by the signature (printed or written) of the Agent or Secretary, Agents or Secretaries, or persons appointed by the Board to authenticate the same.

(86) Every Shareholder shall give an address in Ceylon which shall be deemed to be his place of abode, and shall be registered as such in the books of the Company.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle, held in the Municipal Office, on Saturday, July 12, 1930, at 9 a.m., pursuant to Notice dated July 5, 1930.

Present: Mr. M. M. Wedderburn, Chairman; the Hon. Mr. H. M. Macan Marcar, M.L.C.; the Hon. Mr. C. E. de Vos, M.L.C.; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. D. I. Durham; Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe; Mr. F. W. Sproule; and Mr. T. Amarasuriya.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of June 14, 1930, a copy thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. T. Amarasuriya asked—(1) What inquiries were made by the Chairman to obtain higher offers than were made by tenders for the temporary shops near the Esplanade, in terms of the resolution (4) of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment at the meeting held on April 26, 1930? (ii.) To whom, and at what prices, were these buildings sold?

The Chairman replied as follows:—I inquired whether Messrs. Walkers and Clark Spence would make an offer for the temporary shops, but received no reply. In the meanwhile the Secretary, Galle Gymkahana Club, made an offer of Rs. 585 each for two rows of buildings on May 21; K. Hinni Appu Bass offered Rs. 560 for one row on May 24; and Mr. R. A. Solomons offered Rs. 550 for the last building on June 9. These offers were accepted in terms of the resolution of Council of May 10, 1930.

Arising from this reply, the Hon. Mr. H. M. Macan Marcar asked what the Council has lost on these buildings.

The Chairman asked that notice of the question may be given.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. E. Perera asked the following questions:—(i.) Whether the Chairman is aware of the insanitary condition of the area in Galupiadda between the Buddhist Temple at Kachchiwatta and Devature? (ii.) Whether the drains in this area which were pointed out to the Superintendent of Works by the Ward Member during the time of the Chairman's predecessor have been cleared and made serviceable annually? (iii.) When the Chairman proposes to hold the next meeting of the Drainage Committee?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(i.) The Chairman is not aware that this area in particular is insanitary. A report has been called for from the Medical Officer of Health. (ii.) The drains and outlet channels were last cleared in 1928. Provision has not been made for this work in the 1930 Budget. (iii.) The following proposals have been made:—(a) new central market, (b) steam roller, (c) fire engine, (d) Municipal granaries, (e) a section of the Town Drainage Scheme, (f) Gintota and Sarenthukade markets. I am awaiting Mr. Lanaway's report on (c) before I place these proposals before the Standing Committees, for a recommendation as to the order in which they should be taken up.

4. The Chairman stated that he had received a letter from Mr. D. W. Subasinghe tendering his resignation as a member of the Council. He moved that Council do record their appreciation of the valuable services rendered by Mr. Subasinghe as a member of the Council for the last 23 years. The Hon. Mr. C. E. de Vos seconded.

Mr. J. E. Perera and Mr. D. I. Durham spoke in support of the motion, which was put to the meeting and carried unanimously.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. E. Perera moved that the Drainage Committee be requested to report upon a site for a playground for the use of the residents and their children in Ward 3. Mr. T. Amarasuriya seconded.

The Chairman suggested that, as this motion had been adopted by Council on October 9, 1926, the Special Committee be asked to give priority in their report to this part of the terms of reference. The Hon. Mr. C. E. de Vos seconded, and the Hon. Mr. H. M. Macan Marcar supported.

The mover replied, and, in view of his explanation, the Chairman withdrew his suggestion; and the motion was put to the meeting and carried.

6. To submit the report of Dr. W. G. Wickremasinghe, Medical Officer of Health, on the outbreak of plague in 1929: The Chairman moved that the Council minute an expression of their thanks to the Sanitary Department and Dr. Wickremasinghe for the help rendered in dealing with the outbreak of plague in Galle in 1929. Mr. F. W. Sproule seconded.

Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe drew attention to the remarks in pages 2 and 34 of the report, and moved that the following words be added to the motion—" but express their regret that the report contained passages in pages 2 and 34 which imply motives to persons who were not in full agreement with the measures adopted." Mr. J. E. Perera seconded, and Mr. T. Amarasuriya supported the amendment.

The Hon. Mr. C. E. de Vos suggested that as the Council was not unanimous the matter might be dropped.

The Chairman stated that the matter was mentioned at the last meeting of Council and postponed. The reporters were asked not to publish any report on it, and therefore the matter should not be dropped. He thought it unnecessary and unwise for the Council to take any notice of the passages referred to.

The amended motion was put to the meeting and declared lost by 3 votes to 4.

The motion was then put and carried by 4 votes to 3.

7. With the permission of the Council the Chairman stated that there was a mistake in the amount of the salary of the Manager, Health Department, as shown in the statement annexed to the report of the Special Committee and approved by Council on June 14, 1930; and moved that the amount be altered from Rs. 744 to Rs. 768. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

8. With the permission of Council the Chairman moved that the Council do sanction, under section 7 (vi.) of the by-laws relating to leave, excess leave of 20 days over 72 days granted to Mr. N. V. Francis, Clerk of the Secretary's Office, in respect of 1929 and 1930, out of the available lapsed vacation leave in respect of 1927 and 1928. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

9. The Chairman mentioned the steps he had taken regarding the removal of the Bo-tree, in pursuance of the resolution of Council of June 14, 1930. He said he would endeavour to persuade the parties to remove the tree, and report further. Mr. T. Amarasuriya stated that the expressed opinion of educated Buddhists was against the present unsatisfactory site.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Municipal Works and Finance and Assessment of June 28, 1930, were laid before the Council:—

10. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of June 28, 1930.*

(2) To consider the following estimates:—(a) Rs. 275 for rethatching buildings in the Segregation Camp.—Recommended. (b) Rs. 270 for two water carts for the Works Department.—Recommended. (c) Rs. 270 for two hand carts for road work.—Recommended. (d) Rs. 180 for providing a street lamp on the cross road between Church street and Lighthouse street.—Recommended. (e) Rs. 350 for the purchase of one dozen 10 amp. and $\frac{1}{2}$ dozen 20 amp. house service meters.—Recommended.

(3) To consider 26 applications for water service.—Recommended that the services be allowed. A charge of Rs. 2 per quarter to be made for the services at 1, Front Cross street, 6, Pedlar street, and 42, Mahamodera where water will be used for other than domestic purposes.—Recommended.

(4) To consider tenders for building a drain on the western side of Dangedera road.—Recommended that the tender for Rs. 1,440 from R. K. Mohamado be accepted.

(5) To recommend that excess expenditure of Rs. 390.20 incurred on building a drain on the eastern side of Dangedera road to be sanctioned.—Recommended.

(6) To recommend that the unexpended balance of Rs. 217.40 on estimate No. 45, Head 46, be used for the purchase of 24 top push taps for stand posts.—Recommended.

(7) Papers *re* steam roller.—Recommended that an experiment be made in cost of using a steam roller, if one is available, on Elliott road or a similar road.

(8) Papers *re* special stopping places for motor buses.—Recommended that (a) 24 stopping places for motor buses be provided as suggested by the Superintendent of Police; (b) the estimate of Rs. 2,300 for providing and fixing 48 signs be approved, and provided for in the Supplemental Budget.

(11) To consider the report of the Superintendent of Works *re* building a culvert opposite Brothers Villa.—Recommended that the improvement suggested by the Superintendent of Works be carried out when the road work is done next year.

(12) To consider the adoption by the Council of the form of application for electric current used by the Government Electrical Department.—(a) Considered together with the Finance Committee. (b) Recommended that a similar application form be used by the Council.

Resolution.

With regard to item (3) resolved that the applications, together with a further list of 7 applications, be allowed. With regard to item (10) resolved that the matter be referred back to the Standing Committee.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

11. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of April 26, 1930.*

(2) (d) To consider an estimate of Rs. 2,750 for deviating a portion of Steele road.—Recommended that consideration be postponed.

Resolution of Council of May 10, 1930. Resolved that the Superintendent of Works should inspect the road with the Ward Member and report further.

Resolution.

Resolved that the matter be deferred for consideration with the budget for 1931.

12. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of June 28, 1930.*

(2) To consider the adoption by the Council of the form of application for electric current used by the Government Electrical Department.—(i.) Considered together with the Standing Committee on Municipal Works. (ii.) Recommended that a similar application form be used by the Council.

(3) List of demolished buildings in Wards 3, 4w, 4E, and 5.—Recommended that the rates be struck off.

(4) Application from Inspectors de Silva and Abeywardena for a loan of Rs. 150 each, for the purchase of bicycles for official duties.—Recommended that the loans be given to the Inspectors, repayable by monthly instalments of Rs. 10.

(5) Application to waive the rates for the second quarter, 1930, on premises 349, Sea street, as the building which is in the plague area has been demolished.—Recommended that the rates for the second quarter be waived.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

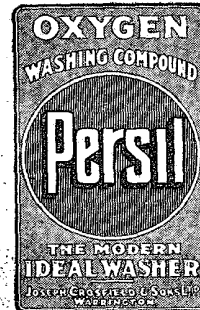
