REGULATIONS.

The regulations appearing under Chapter V. of the regulations in *Gazette* No. 7,692 of February 8, 1929, as amended by the notification in the *Gazette* of November 11, 1929, are hereby repealed and the following regulations substituted therefor:—

V.—COURSE OF CLINICAL INSTRUCTIONS HELD IN THE GENERAL HOSPITAL.

Rules for Students.

(1) Students of the third, fourth, and fifth years will attend courses of instruction in Clinical Medicine and Surgery under the Physicians and Surgeons of the General Hospital.

(2) Students in the second and third term of their third year and in their fourth year must put in six months Medical Clerking and six months Surgical Dressing in the wards of the General Hospital. During their fourth year they must put in three months Medical Clerking, and three months Surgical Dressing in the Out-patient Department.

In addition they must put in three months Gynaecological Dressing and one month as Midwifery Clerk in the fifth year.

No student will be allowed to take any two of the courses mentioned in this paragraph concurrently.

(3) A Post-mortem Clerkship must be held for one term, during the period served as Medical Clerk in the wards. No student will be allowed to attend post-mortems during his period as Surgical Dresser, Gynaecological Dresser, or Midwifery Clerk.

(4) A student may take out two three-months' clinical courses in either Medicine or Surgery, or, if he prefers, he may take out one six-months' course in either Clinical Medicine and Surgery.

(5) Clinical Clerking and Surgical Dressing are taken out at the same time as Clinical Medicine and Surgery and under the same Clinicians.

(6) Ward classes in Medicine and Surgery are taken out in the third year for Junior Students and the fourth and fifth year for Senior Students, these classes being conducted in the General Hospital.

(7) Clerks and Dressers will be allotted to the Visiting Physicians and Surgeons by the Medical and Surgical Registrars as far as possible at their own choice for periods of three months.

Each Clerk or Dresser will be allotted six beds, and he will be personally responsible for entering all notes of his cases on the bed head ticket, dressing these cases and carrying out such clinical laboratory tests as are ordered by the Visiting Staff.

(8) The systematic courses on Clinical Medicine and Surgery will be conducted during the three terms, and Class Certificates of attendance will only be issued during these periods.

A student may, however, attend the Hospital during the vacation period as a Clinical Clerk or Surgical Dresser.

(9) All parts of the Hospital, except the paying section, are available for affording clinical instruction to students.

(10) No student engaged in dissections or post-mortems will be allowed to enter the Operating Theatre.

(11) A student doing duty as Post-mortem Clerk, or attending the post-mortem demonstrations, will not be allowed during such duty, to do dressing in Surgical wards of the Hospital.

(12) All Clerks and Dressers must, when beginning their work, present their attendance cards to the Surgical and Medical Registrars and bring with them the following instruments:—

(13) All Clerks and Dressers must be in the wards by 7.45 A.M. and must remain in the wards till 10 A.M. During this time they accompany the Physician or Surgeon to whom they are attached on his morning rounds. On operation mornings they assist in the theatre till 10 A.M. after having finished dressing their cases.

(14) Clerks and Dressers must be in the wards in the afternoons, at the hour set apart for ward work in the Time Table, when all cases requiring two dressings a day must be redressed, and new cases examined.

A record of the morning and evening attendances will be kept by the Medical and Surgical Registrars.

No student may absent himself without asking in writing for permission to do so from the Medical and Surgical Registrars, stating the reasons for his absence.

(15) Clerks and Dressers work must not be interrupted by vacations, Government and Bank Holidays including Sundays except where special permission is granted by the Visiting Staff Member.

No Clerk or Dresser will be signed up for three months work, unless the attendance be put in in three consecutive months.

A 90 per cent. attendance is necessary for a three-months' course, but in cases of illness or special leave, the Registrar of the Medical College may permit a 75 per cent. attendance, if he be satisfied of a reasonable cause for absence from work.

(16) At the expiration of the Clerkship or the Dressership, the student must produce his attendance card to be filled in signed by the Medical and Surgical Registrars and countersigned by the Physician or Surgeon for whom he worked, and this card must be given to the office of the College Registrar before a card for a fresh Clinical Post be granted.

(17) All irregularities in the work of Clerks or Dressers must be reported by the Medical and Surgical Registrars to the Registrar of the Ceylon Medical College.

(18) Post-mortem Clerks must attend all teaching post-mortems during one term and must personally perform 6 post-mortems.

They must enter in the Post-mortem Book an account of the post-mortem, as described by the Pathologist.

(19) No students engaged in dissections or post-mortems will be allowed to enter the Operating Theatre.

(20) The regulations in force at the Lying-in Home must be followed by all students taking up their cases and doing clerking.

(21) Loitering in the corridors and verandahs of the Hospital and smoking in the Hospital, except in the Post-mortem Room, are strictly forbidden.

(22) Students obtaining sick leave or special leave must notify the Registrar, and Medical and Surgical Registrars of the General Hospital or the Medical Superintendent of the Lying-in Home as the case may be.

Out-patient Department.

(23) Clinical instruction in Medicine and Surgery is given in the Out-patient Department of the General Hospital. Students of the fourth and fifth years are enrolled at the beginning of each term for three-months' courses of instruction on either the Medical or Surgical side.

(24) Three months is the minimum period for which students are enrolled for clinical instruction in the Out-patient Department.

(25) Attendance at the Out-patient Department during vacation time is permitted.

(26) The following Attendance Certificates which shall include Medical and Surgical Clerking are required from students before they are permitted to enter for the Final examination:—

Medical	..	Six months
Surgical	..	Six months

(27) The main duty of the Out-patient Department Dressers is to dress cases in this Department from 7.45 A.M. to 10 A.M. Out-patient Department Clerks attend the Out-patient Department Physicians from 7.45 A.M. to 10 A.M., examining cases and carry out such clinical pathological tests as are required of them.

(28) All attendance cards must be returned to the College office immediately on expiration of the course prescribed, after being duly signed by the proper authorities.

(29) During the fifth year students must put in three-months Medical Clerking and three-months Surgical Dressing in the Out-patient Department.

RULES.

The Local Option Rules, 1928 (Excise Notification No. 146 published in *Gazette* No. 7,478 of August 14, 1925, as amended by Excise Notification No. 180 published in *Gazette* No. 7,661 of August 31, 1928, and Excise Notification No. 194 published in *Gazette* No. 7,764 of February 28, 1930), are further amended as follows:—

1. Rule 10 is hereby rescinded and the following is substituted therefor:—

10. For local option polls in Colombo, the voting area shall always be a ward; for polls in urban areas other than Colombo, the whole of the area administered by each Municipality, Urban District Council, Local Board, or Board of Improvement shall be the voting area.

Provided that when the population of the area administered by any Municipality, Urban District Council, Local Board, or Board of Improvement, accordingly to the latest census report exceeds 10,000, the Advisory Board may, in its discretion, divide such area into two or more portions so that no portion may contain more than 10,000 or less than 5,000 inhabitants. Each such portion shall be a separate voting area for polls for the abolition or grant of any ballotable licence within such portion.

Note.—For the purpose of this rule urban area shall mean an area administered by a Municipality, Urban District Council, Local Board, or Board of Improvement. All other areas are rural areas.

2. Rule 11 is hereby rescinded and the following is substituted therefor:—

11. In rural areas the voting area shall be, in the case of a single tavern, hotel, or place licensed to sell beer or porter, as nearly as practicable the whole area within a radius of two miles from the licensed premises in question. Where the circumference of the resultant

circle cuts a village in two, the whole of such village shall be excluded unless more than half of it falls within the said circumference; but where in any area there is more than one tavern, hotel, or place licensed to sell beer or porter, provided no two of them are more than one mile apart from each other, the area for all such taverns, hotels, or places shall be one and the same, but the circle comprising the area shall have its centre at as central a point as possible.

3. Rule 12 is hereby rescinded and the following is substituted therefor—

12. Provided that—

(i.) No part of an urban area shall be included in the voting area for polls for the abolition or regrant of any licence in a rural area or in any other urban area, and that no part of a rural area shall be included in the voting area for polls for the abolition or regrant of any licence in an urban area.

(ii.) When the area as determined under rule 11 includes a portion of an adjacent revenue district such portion shall be excluded from the voting area.

(iii.) In exceptional cases, when a voting area as defined by rule 11 is divided into two parts by a large unbridged river or other permanent geographical feature which makes inter-communication between the two parts difficult, the Advisory Committee may, at its discretion, include in the voting area only that part in which the licensed premises in respect of which the poll is held are situated.

4. Rule 13 is hereby amended by the addition of the words "in accordance with the provisions of rules 10, 11, and 12" immediately after the words "the exact boundaries of any area."

A Government contractor must not issue a power of attorney to a person, whose name is on the defaulting contractors' list authorizing him to carry on the contract.

11. 12. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders and the right of accepting any portion of a tender.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended September 13, 1930.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 165 (10 Burghers, 106 Sinhalese, 20 Tamils, 19 Moors, 6 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1930, viz., 270,700) was 31·8, as against 32·8 in the preceding week, 28·1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32·5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 130 (5 Burghers, 70 Sinhalese, 24 Tamils, 18 Moors, 5 Malays, and 8 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 25·0, as against 24·5 in the previous week, 32·5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30·9 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 130 total deaths, 28 were of infants under one year of age, as against 26 in the preceding week, 40 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 20.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Eighteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 3 each in Kotahena South and Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), 2 each in Maradana East, Maradana South, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, Maradana North, and Wellawatta North, as against 14 in the previous week and 22 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Seven deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 each in St. Paul's and New Bazaar, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena South, and Maradana North. The number registered during the preceding week was also 7 and the weekly average for last year was 9.

(c) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in Kotahena South, Maradana hospitals, and Maradana North, as against 1 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Eleven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), and 1 each in St. Paul's, New Bazaar, Slave Island, and Wellawatta North, as against 12 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Two deaths from *Phthisis* of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. (a) Six deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), and 1 in Slave Island, as against 3 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Enteric Fever* of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.

4. Ten deaths from *Debility* were registered, 7 from *Enteritis*, 5 each from *Worms* and *Accidents*, 3 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 1 each from *Tetanus*, *Homicide*, and *Puerperal Septicaemia*, and 52 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Twenty-five cases of *Chickenpox* and 9 of *Enteric Fever* were reported during the week, as against 14 and 7, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81·0°, against 79·2° in the preceding week and 81·7° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·901 in., against 29·870 in. in the preceding week and 29·874 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1·27 in., against 2·50 in. in the preceding week and 0·60 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Royal College Entrance Examination and Examination for Scholarships.

THE examination for admission to the Royal College First Form in 1931 will be held on Saturday, November 22, 1930, commencing at 9 A.M., at the Royal College.

2. Competitors (including pupils of the Training College Preparatory School) must have reached standard III. (Elementary) in 1930, i.e., must have passed standard II. by the end of 1929.

3. Candidates should be not more than 9 years and 6 months old on January 1, 1931. The examination for these candidates will be in English (Reading, Dictation, and Composition) and Arithmetic.

4. Entrance forms (obtainable at the Royal College Office) should be completed in every particular, and sent to the Principal, Royal College, arriving not later than November 15, 1930.

5. Birth certificates and record sheets will be called for after the examination from those who are likely to gain admission.

6. As a special case in this annual examination about 18 admissions for ordinary paying pupils may also be made into the Junior Cambridge forms, upon the results of the Scholarship examinations, particulars of which are set forth below. For this purpose, Scholarship candidates are requested to state in the appropriate place on the entrance forms, whether they are competing for ordinary admission, as well as for a Scholarship. Ordinary admission will be on a rather lower standard than the award of scholarships, and will probably be made chiefly from among candidates normally due to take the Junior Cambridge examination in December, 1931.

7. An examination for Governor's and Lorenz Scholarships and for admission into the Junior forms as in paragraph 6 above will be held at the Royal College on Friday and Saturday, November 21 and 22, 1930, beginning at 9.30 A.M.

8. Two Lorenz Scholarships of Rs. 220 per annum each, in addition to free tuition at the Royal College, will be awarded. Candidates must be under the age of 16 on January 1, 1931. The scholarship will be tenable for three years.

9. Senior Governor's Scholarships, entitling holders to free tuition at the Royal College for two years, are awarded to candidates under 17 years of age on January 1, 1931.

Junior Governor's Scholarships, entitling holders to free tuition at the Royal College for four years, are awarded to candidates under 15 years of age on January 1, 1931.

10. A proportion of the vacancies is to be filled by candidates whose parents or guardians have an income from all source not exceeding Rs. 2,500 per annum. The other vacancies are not so restricted. The probable total number of vacancies is 8.

11. Subjects for examination are: (a) English, (b) Latin, (c) Mathematics, (d) Science or Greek.

The Science paper will include alternative questions in Botany. In all papers questions are set up to Senior Cambridge standard, but questions of an easier kind will also be included.

12. Application forms (obtainable at Royal College Office) should be sent in completed to the Principal not later than November 10, 1930. Candidates offering Greek should state this on their forms.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

General Meeting.

Wednesday, August 13, 1930, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M. pursuant to notice dated August 6, 1930.

Present.—Mr. H. E. Newnham, V.D., M.A., C.C.S., Chairman; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, M.L.C.; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Mr. R. L. Pereira, K.C.; the Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, M.L.C.; Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy; the Hon. Dr. E. A. Coorey, M.L.C.; Mr. T. G. Jayewardene, V.D., J.P.; Mr. M. L. M. Royal; Dr. S. Muttiah; Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike; Mr. T. C. Dyball; Mr. F. Dadabhoy, J.P.; Mr. H. L. Grocock; Mr. E. G. Eastnam, O.B.E.; Lt.-Col. F. A. Ferguson, D.S.O.; and Dr. R. G. Jayetileke.

1. The Minutes of the Special Meeting of July 16, 1930, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the Special Meeting of July 16, 1930, be confirmed.

2. To submit, in terms of section 102 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, the Chairman's Administration Report for the financial year 1929.

The Chairman moved that, in terms of section 102 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, the Chairman's Administration Report for the financial year 1929 be submitted to His Excellency the Governor.

The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

3. Pursuant to notice, Dr. E. V. Ratnam asked the following questions which the Chairman answered:—

Q.—(1) If he will be good enough to call for reports from the Municipal Assessor and the Municipal Treasurer as to what relief can be afforded to ratepayers with regard to assessment of properties and the levying of rates on account of the falling of rents and the difficulties experienced owing to the general depression in trade prevailing at the present time? A.—Reports have been called for, as suggested, and they will be placed before the Finance Committee.

Q.—(2) Whether work in connection with Kochchikade Slum Improvement Scheme has been started and, if so, what progress has been made? A.—The acquisition inquiry relating to the property for the main scheme has begun but possession of the land has not yet been obtained.

4. Pursuant to notice, Dr. S. Muttiah asked the following questions which the Chairman answered:—

Q.—(1) When did the Medical Officer of Health visit Delhi for a Conference *re* Maternity and Child Welfare work? A.—In February, 1927.

Q.—(2) What was the cost of this visit to the Colombo ratepayers? A.—Rs. 992.27.

Q.—(3) Did the Medical Officer of Health submit a report on his return from the Conference as he was expected to do? If so, was this report tabled or circulated among the members of Council? A.—The Medical Officer of Health stated that he forwarded to the Chairman a copy of the official report of the Conference with his observations on the work done in various cities in India. No record of the receipt or circulation of this report can now be found. His report on the Calcutta Co-operative Milk Society's work was received and circulated.

Q.—(4) Can the Chairman give concrete instances where the Medical Officer of Health has applied knowledge he gained at that Conference to conditions obtaining locally? A.—The Medical Officer of Health has given the Chairman such instances.

Q.—(5) Was it not a fact that this visit was strongly opposed by a section of the Council? A.—When the proposal was circulated 13 Members recorded their opinions in favour of it and 2 against, 3 merely initialled the papers. When the Council sanctioned the proposal 17 Members were present of whom 4 spoke in opposition. There is no record of the voting.

Arising out of the above replies, Dr. S. Muttiah asked:—

Q.—Will the Chairman take steps to discover the report? A.—Yes. The matter will be placed before the Sanitation Committee this month.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike moved—"That the Housing Committee be requested to inquire into and report to the Council on the help, financial and otherwise, that this Council might give for the erection of dwellings in Colombo, to a Building Society that has been formed, with a view to providing suitable dwelling houses." Mr. M. L. M. Royal seconded.

The Chairman stated that he had received a letter from the Directors of a Building Society asking for assistance. They said that the Society had just been formed and that they had no capital. They requested the Municipal Council to give them land on which to build. It might be well to point out that the Council owned very little land and, even so, its land was not suitable for housing. The motion was put to the Meeting and carried.

6. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved:—That the Council should resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council to consider the following extracts from the proceedings of the Committees annexed to the agenda. The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

COUNCIL IN COMMITTEE.

The following Extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of July 28, 1930, was considered.

PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

(5) To consider a memorandum of the Medical Officer of Health (supported by the Municipal Treasurer) requesting sanction of Council for the abolition of the post of Relieving Dispensary Medical Officer and for the re-creation of the post of Relief Apothecary on a salary of Rs. 1,200—96—2,400 a year with a rickshaw allowance of Rs. 420 a year, as the advertisement for the post of Relieving Dispensary Medical Officer failed to get a suitable man. Registered No. 828.—Recommended that the post of Relieving Dispensary Medical Officer be abolished and that the post of Relief Apothecary be recreated on a salary of Rs. 1,200—96—2,400 a year, with a rickshaw allowance of Rs. 420 a year.

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) of July 28, 1930, were considered.

(2) To consider the motion of the Hon. Dr. E. A. Coorey in Council on June 4, 1930:—That this Council do resolve that a reasonable proportion of the cost of construction, drainage, and lighting of private lanes in the city, developed after 1915, be borne by the Council and that the Four Standing Committees be asked to report as to what proportion of cost is to be met by the Council. Registered No. 05,370.—Recommended that this matter be considered after the Council has dealt with all the lanes in existence before 1915.

(4) To consider a memorandum of the Chairman, dated May 7, 1930, suggesting that the post of Assistant Chairman be created in order to cope with the increasing volume of work and that Government be asked for the loan of a Class III. Civil Servant. *Note.*—The total cost, including salary, allowance, pensionary contribution, and passage, but excluding any leave pay, would be about Rs 1,800 a month. Registered No. 289.—Recommended that the appointment be not made at present.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

Mr. E. G. Eastman spoke to the recommendation and moved that the matter be referred back to the Four Standing Committees with an indication that the Council considered that if an Assistant Chairman was to be appointed that officer should be appointed from the Council's own service. Mr. T. C. Dyball seconded.

Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike and the Hon. Dr. E. A. Coorey opposed the motion.

The Chairman detailed the reasons for his suggestion for the appointment of an Assistant Chairman.

Mr. R. L. Pereira replied to the Chairman and opposed the motion.

Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy spoke against the motion.

The motion was put to the Meeting and lost.

The recommendation of the Four Standing Committees was then put to the Meeting and carried.

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of July 30, 1930, were considered.

GENERAL.

(2) To consider the suggestion of the Chairman, that the by-law regarding the selection of the names of 3 candidates for submission to Council for the purpose of selecting a candidate for appointment to a vacant post be revoked as it is useless. Registered No. 778.—Recommended that the by-law be amended as follows, the amendments are shown in italics:—

CHAPTER II.

(26) When the Council is about to appoint to an office, the salary of which exceeds Rs. 1,200 a year, the Committee making the preliminary selection shall, *whenever reasonably possible*, submit to the Council the names of three candidates, indicating at the same time, if they think fit, the candidate whom they recommend the Council to appoint. If the Council, instead of agreeing to the recommendation of the Committee, resolves to vote upon the candidates submitted, the Chairman shall put to the Council the names in alphabetical order, each member of the Council being at liberty to vote for one or more as he thinks fit, and the name of the candidate who has received the fewest votes shall be struck out. The Chairman shall then put the names of the *remaining candidate or candidates*, and, having declared which of them has received the most votes, he shall finally put the question whether such candidate shall be appointed to the office. If a majority of the members present, and voting, vote in his favour, he shall be declared to be appointed. If a majority of those present, and voting, vote against him, the matter of the appointment shall be referred back to the Committee concerned.

MUNICIPAL ENGINEER'S DEPARTMENT.

(3) To consider the petition presented, through the Hon. Dr. E. A. Coorey, in Council, on April 2, 1930, from Rev. Father P. M. Gueguen requesting that permission be granted to build on premises No. 58, Laurie's road, or the land be acquired by Council. Registered No. 489.—Recommended that the Council should not purchase the land in question.

Reconveyance of Properties, vested in the Council.

7. To recommend reconveyance of the premises vested in the Council, mentioned in the annexed list (as per annexure A) to the parties named, on payment of all rates and costs which would have been due up to the quarter in which the reconveyance may be signed, had the property not been vested in the Council.—Recommended.

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of July 30, 1930, were considered.

The street lines are for the purpose of assisting building operations. If approved, this may be declared a minor street, 30 feet wide and sanctioned under section 13 (4) of Ordinance No. 19 of 1915. *Note.*—This is a public street and the Council is ultimately liable to pay compensation for the land required if and when it is actually widened. There are no existing buildings within the proposed street lines and there is no liability in respect of setting back new buildings on bare land in the meantime. Registered No. 777.—Recommended.

(4) To consider the recommendation of the Municipal Engineer (supported by the Municipal Treasurer) that the question of Messrs. Broad & Co., Ltd. (received through the Council's Agents), amounting to £207 R.O.B. (approximately Rs. 2,795), less 2½ per cent. and excluding Agent's commission, be accepted for the supply of 72 Broad's Patent Heavy Road Manhole Covers and Frames. *Note.*—The cost will, in the first instance, be charged to Advance Account, Stores, and then debited to sanctioned estimates as and when the materials are issued. Funds are available. Registered No. 761.—Recommended.

(5) To consider—(a) Letter No. U 312/27, dated June 26, 1930, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary stating that Government is prepared to provide the 4 acres of the old Government Factory site for the proposed Central Market for Colombo, in addition to the area of 2 roods and 12 perches required for widening Gasworks street and Saunders place and also reserve a strip of land 59 feet wide for a new Cross street, provided the cost of construction of the road is borne by the Municipality. (b) A memorandum thereon of the Chairman. Registered No. 798.—Recommended that the offer of Government in Colonial Secretary's letter No. U 312/27 of June 26, 1930, be accepted.

(7) To consider—(a) The tenders received for cutting and splitting of logs into firewood at the Municipal Store Yard, Suduwella, for a period of 12 months from August 1, 1930. (b) The recommendation of the Municipal Engineer (supported by the Municipal Treasurer), that the lowest tender, namely, that of K. G. M. MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.**Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, August 23, 1930, at 9 a.m., pursuant to Notice dated August 15, 1930.**

Present:—Mr. M. M. Wedderburn, Chairman; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. D. I. Durham; Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe; Mr. F. W. Sproule; Mr. T. Amarasuriya; and Dr. S. P. Joseph.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of July 12, 1930, a copy thereof having been furnished to each member were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe presented a petition from the Rickshaw Puller's Association asking for a site in Jail road, or the neighbourhood, on which to erect a shed for a hearse.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. E. Perera asked the following questions:—(1) What is the revenue received from assessment taxes from each of the different wards of the Council? (2) What is the number of houses in the area between the Matara road, Circular road, the railway line, and the Gangarama temple? (3) How many houses in the Municipality carry an annual value less than Rs. 50? (4) Have the payment of assessment taxes gone into arrears by the reason of the financial depression? (5) How many houses have been advertised for sale for non-payment of assessment taxes during the year 1929 and 1930?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) The rates collectable at the beginning of 1929, for each ward were as follows:—

(2) To reply to this question it is first necessary to take a census of the houses in the area. I hope to be able to table the information at the next meeting. (3) The total is 6,680. (4) Arrears have not increased to any appreciable extent during the current year. (5) A large number of premises have been advertised. No premises have been sold as the rates due have been recovered within the month which elapses between advertisement and sale. The mesne profits of a few premises have been sold.

4. The following motion stood in the name of Mr. J. E. Perera—That the Superintendent of Works be directed to report upon and draw up an estimate for a scheme to take over and widen the present footpath which runs from the Circular-Udugama road junction to the Galle-Matara road, past the Gangarama temple including the construction of a bridge over the Moragoda-ela.

With the permission of the Council Mr. J. E. Perera amended his motion by inserting the words "into a road" after the word "widen" and substituting the word "excluding" for the word "including." Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe seconded.

The Chairman supported the motion, which was carried unanimously.

5. To submit letter No. F 954/1930 of August 16, 1930, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating that His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government has been pleased to approve the payment of a gratuity of Rs. 2,333-33 to Dr. E. Ludovici, Medical Officer of Health, on his retirement from service:—(1) Submitted; (2) The Chairman moved—that the Council desire to record their appreciation of Dr. E. Ludovici's services as Medical Officer of Health of the Galle Municipality from January, 1923, to June, 1930.

The motion was put to the meeting and carried unanimously.

6. To consider letter No. G 223/30 of July 11, 1930, from the Superintendent of Police, Southern Province, recommending that Council should pass a by-law prohibiting the parking of all vehicles on Middle street between Church street and Lighthouse street. The Chairman stated that by-law 15 of Chapter XV. of the by-laws framed under the Vehicles Ordinance, No. 4 of 1916, prohibited the parking of licensed vehicles on any street, and moved that notices, under section 53 (2) of "The Motor Car Ordinance, 1927," prohibiting the parking of motor cars on a part of Middle street, be posted at the hotel end and Lighthouse street end of Middle street. Mr. D. I. Durham seconded.

Mr. T. Amarasuriya moved as an amendment that one-way traffic only be permitted along this road, and that a Police Constable be posted at the junction of Lighthouse street during certain hours to regulate traffic. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded *pro forma*.

Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe supported the motion, but agreed with the amendment that a Police Constable at the junction of Lighthouse street is necessary.

The Chairman replied, and asked Council to accept the motion as an experiment. He said he would try to arrange to have a Police Constable posted at the junction of Lighthouse street, if possible, during the hours of opening and closing school.

The amendment was put to the meeting and declared lost by 2 votes to 5.

The motion was then put to the meeting and carried by 5 votes to 2.

7. To obtain the sanction of His Excellency the Governor, under section 154 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, as amended by section 10 of Ordinance No. 18 of 1917, to exchange lot 6 for lot 8 in preliminary plan No. 11,139.—Carried unanimously.

8. To consider an application from the Asiatic Petroleum Co. for a petrol service station at Oruppawatte Walawwa in Dagedera road.—Resolved that the site be approved, and the Chairman be requested to arrange for the removal of the parapet wall and for the covering of the drain.

9. Report of Mr. W. M. Thyne, Water Works Engineer, Colombo, on the Galle Water Supply Scheme.—The Chairman moved that the Council desire to record their appreciation of the services of the Consulting Engineer, Mr. W. M. Thyne, also of Mudaliyar D. J. W. Samarakone of Messrs. Samarakone Bros., the contractors, and the Council's Superintendent of Works and Water Works Engineer. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried unanimously.

10. To fill up a vacancy on the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation and on the Special Committee on Drainage; and to nominate a member to serve on (a) the Galle Municipal Education District Committee, (b) the Galle Excise Advisory Board, *vice* Mr. D. W. Subasinghe who has resigned.—Resolved that the matter be postponed until the next meeting.

11. Bo-tree planted on Sea street.—The Chairman informed the Council of the action taken by him. As the tree has not been removed he will consult the Council's lawyer before taking action.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Municipal Works and Finance and Assessment of July 26, 1930, were laid before the Council:—

12. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of July 26, 1930.*

(2) To consider 18 applications for water service.—Recommended that the services be allowed.

(3) To consider the question of enclosing verandahs of the reconditioned houses in the plague area.—Recommended that three months' notice be given to owners and lessees requiring them to keep their verandahs open, unless suitable structural alterations be carried out.

(4) To consider plans and estimates for a new ward in the Infectious Diseases Hospital, and additional accommodation at the Segregation Camp.—Resolved that the Committee consider permanent buildings unsuitable. They recommend that cement platforms be provided at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, and temporary superstructures erected on them when required. If the Council consider that there should be some permanent building, the Committee recommend that one such building be erected at the Segregation Camp.

(5) To consider letter No. O.A. 29/2 of June 6, 1930, from the Director of Electrical Undertakings recommending that the voltage at the Power House be altered from 240 to 230, which is now the standard lamp voltage.—Recommended that Council do notify all consumers that the change of voltage will be effected as from January 1, 1931.

(6) To consider Messrs. Crossley Brothers' letter of July 4, 1930, with reference to the payment of a skilled mechanic to supervise the new engine during the period of maintenance.—Recommended that Messrs. Crossley Brothers' proposal be agreed to for the whole period of maintenance.

(7) Application from the Superintendent of the Electricity Department for authority to spend about Rs. 1,500 for coupling the two coolers in the Power Station.—Recommended, provided the Director of Electrical Undertakings approves of the proposal.

Resolution.

With regard to item (4) Mr. J. E. Perera moved that a new permanent building be erected at the Segregation Camp for contracts, the existing building repaired and improved, and quarters provided for the care-taker. Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe seconded.

Mr. F. W. Sproule and Mr. T. Amarasuriya spoke in support of the Committee's recommendation regarding semi-permanent buildings.

The Chairman moved that for the present a new building be not erected, but that the existing building be improved and quarters provided for the care-taker.

Mr. J. E. Perera withdrew his motion in favour of the Chairman's, and intimated that he might bring up the question later.

The Chairman's motion was put to the meeting and carried unanimously.

With regard to item (7) it was resolved to increase the amount of the estimate to Rs. 1,650.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

13. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of July 26, 1930.*

(2) To recommend that the fish auction shed be provided with two electric lights at a cost of Rs. 74 for wiring and fitting.—Recommended that two batten lights be provided.

(3) To consider an application to waive a part of the charge for electric current supplied to the Wesleyan Church, Richmond Hill road, as indicated by the meter during September and October, 1929.—Resolved that as all care was taken to see that the meter was in good order, the Committee must assume that the consumption was due to a leak in the installation, and cannot recommend any reduction of the charge.

(4) To recommend that the following amounts be waived:—(a) Rs. 24.50 for electric current supplied to the late Mr. H. Dias of 91, Kumbalwella; (b) Rs. 2.42 being assessment rates on 476, Dadalla, from the second quarter, 1928, to the second quarter, 1930, on the grounds of poverty.—Recommended that (a) and (b) be waived.

(5) List of demolished buildings in Wards 2 and 5A.—Recommended that the rates be struck off.

(6) To consider claims for compensation for the destruction of goods in the plague area.—Recommended that no compensation be paid.

(7) Application from Inspector Haniffa to be placed in the Trained Inspectors' Grade and draw the emoluments of that Grade.—Recommended that although Inspector Haniffa cannot be treated as a trained Inspector in view of his good work especially during the last plague epidemic, he be paid the annual increments of that Grade, *viz.*, Rs. 80.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

Improvements in or relating to Electric Signalling Systems.

Abstract.—An electrical signalling system for train indicators is described in which the system comprises means for sending indications, comprising one or more electric impulses according to a predetermined code and, at the receiving station, means for receiving the indications transmitted. The receiving means are arranged to transmit successive indications to different members at the receiving station in dependence on the order in which the impulses are sent from the transmitter.

Improvements in Humidifiers.

Abstract.—The applicant describes a combination in one apparatus of a system of sprays, fan, pump and screens.

The screens receive the spray for the sprinklers and so assist the humidification.

Screens and a baffle plate in the outlet duct stop droplets of water. Expansion chambers may be provided to slow down the air as it passes through the screen.

The claims are:—

1. In Humidifiers a fan, pump, sprayers, screens and trunk, units combined as and for the purpose described.

2. In Humidifiers the combination of sprays, fan, pump, and screens or curtains, in one self-contained apparatus.

3. An improved Humidifier as claimed in the above claims characterized by the ability to inject all or part fresh-air humidified into the factory.

Process and apparatus for making rubber and the like in the form of a sheet by atomizing and drying latex.

Abstract.—A number of atomizers are fitted in staggered relation on the opposite walls of a long narrow tunnel. In one direction passes the hot air and in the other a conveyor on which the dried latex deposits. The layer of rubber so obtained passes under a printer and so is converted to sheet.

The claims are:—

1. Process for making rubber and the like in the form of a sheet by atomizing and drying latex and pressing the layer of rubber thus obtained, characterized by the feature that the material in question is atomized in an extremely fine condition by means of a number of small atomizers, arranged in a low, narrow, heated tunnel or the like opposite to each other at an angle with the length direction of the tunnel or the one after the other in the length direction of the tunnel and that the material under treatment is caught on a conveyor or the like moving below the atomizers in the length direction of the tunnel or the like.

2. Apparatus for carrying out the process as claimed in claim 1, comprising a low, narrow tunnel or the like with a number of small atomizers arranged opposite to each other at an angle with the length direction of the tunnel or the one after the other in the length direction of the tunnel, means being provided for heating the tunnel or the like.

Improvements in refrigerating plants for the freezing of fish and other goods.

Abstract.—Each freezing chamber is connected to the salt chamber by an inverted U pipe rising from its bottom to a considerable height and open to the atmosphere at the top by the provision of a chimney pipe. The bottom of each freezing chamber is also connected by a narrow pipe or a pipe and stop cock to the brine storage tank. When a chamber is functioning, the pressure raises the brine above the top bend of the U. When the inlet stop cock is closed the brine level falls below the top of the U and the chamber can then empty into the reservoir on opening the cock because air can enter through the chimney.

The claims are:—

1. A refrigerating plant of the kind referred to particularly adapted for the freezing of fish on board fishing vessels wherein the freezing chambers, and optionally the

brine cooler or coolers are connected with the following apparatus or receptacles by vertical bent tubes, provided with chimneys in communication with the outer air and which rise to a level such that the circulation of the brine by the effect of the static head, will be possible only in a determined direction.

2. A refrigerating plant according to claim 1, wherein said vertical bent pipes are combined with pipes of small cross section or with pipes provided with adjusting cocks, which form by-pass connections with a brine return collector or storage tank and serve for the automatic emptying of the apparatus when cut off from the brine circuit.

3. A refrigerating plant, substantially as described and as shown in the appended drawing.

Abstract.—The turned over edge of the bag, after gumming, is crimped or knurled so as to keep the gummed parts in contact while the gum sets. The gum is applied by a rotating horizontal disc as the bags are conveyed by it and at the same time a rotating scorer presses the bag top between the gum disc and a second one below it and so scores a line about which the top of the bag tends to turn over. After next passing through the turning down guides the bags are conveyed so that the tops of the turn over pass between two rollers which press the gummed portion while at the same time two inter-engaging toothed wheels below the rollers corrugate the bag neck.

By means of the rollers the hessian can be stretched tightly or again can be made to move horizontally under the comb to spread evenly or can be turned completely over to deposit the tea on the floor.
