VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON FOR THE
MONTH OF JUNE, 1930.

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.

THIS report deals with the Vital Statistics of the 35 principal towns in the Island, proclaimed under sections 31-36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

Marriages.

2. The number of marriages of residents in proclaimed towns was 375 (325 General, 6 Kandyan, and 44 Muslim), as against 415 in the preceding month and 558 in the corresponding month of last year.

Births.

3. The births registered numbered 1,742 (905 males and 837 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 32·2 per 1,000 of the population, as against 33·0 in the preceding month, 32·4 in the corresponding month of last year, and 31·1 the average for the corresponding months since 1920. The rate ranged from 7·5 in Kalpitiya to 90·7 in Lunugala. There were 1,505 births of children whose mothers were residents of the towns, equivalent to an annual rate of 27·8, as against 28·1 in the preceding month, and 29·0 in the corresponding month of last year.

4. In the city of Colombo the births registered numbered 661 (343 males and 318 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 29·7, as against 28·3 in the preceding month, 30·6 in the corresponding month of last year, and 27·6 the average for the corresponding months since 1920. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah wards, ranged from 10·2 in Kollupitiya to 27·0 in Slave Island. There were 561 births of children whose mothers were residents of the city, equivalent to an annual rate of 25·2, as against 23·1 in the preceding month and 26·3 in the corresponding month of last year.

Deaths.

5. The total deaths registered during the month numbered 1,683 (951 males and 732 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 31·1, as against 30·6 in the preceding month and 30·4 in the corresponding month of

last year. There were 1,240 deaths of residents of the towns, equivalent to an annual standardized rate of 24·8, as against 22·2 in the preceding month, 24·4 in the corresponding month of last year and 27·3 the average for the corresponding months since 1920. The standardized death rate ranged from 5·6 in Ambalangoda to 62·0 in Puttalam.

6. In the city of Colombo the deaths registered numbered 674 (378 males and 296 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 30·3, as against 24·9 in the preceding month and 28·1 in the corresponding month of last year. There were 548 deaths of residents of the city, which corresponded to an annual standardized rate of 28·4, as against 21·8 in the preceding month, 24·8 in the corresponding month of last year, and 27·6 the average for the corresponding months since 1920. The death rate of residents, exclusive of the Fort and Pettah wards, ranged from 30·6 in Maradana East to 12·9 in Kollupitiya.

7. The stillbirths registered during the month numbered 113 (64 males and 49 females), as against 131 in the preceding month and 128 in the corresponding month of last year.

Infant Mortality.

8. The deaths of children under one year of age numbered 304, and corresponded to a rate of 164 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended June, 1930. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only, the rate was 175, as against 180 in the preceding month, 202 in the corresponding month of last year, and 230 the average for the corresponding months since 1920. There were 282 deaths of children under one year of age whose mothers were residents of the towns, which corresponded to a rate of 187, as against 187 in the preceding month and 203 in the corresponding month of last year.

9. In the city of Colombo the deaths of children under one year of age numbered 140, and corresponded to a rate of 195 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended June, 1930. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only, the rate was 212, as against 163 in the preceding month, 194 in the corresponding month of

last year, and 245 the average for the corresponding months since 1920. There were 130 deaths of children under one year of age, whose mothers were residents of the city, which corresponded to a rate of 232, as against 175 in the preceding month and 192 in the corresponding month of last year.

Causes of Death.

10. The highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, to which 12 per cent. of the total deaths were due. *Phthisis* and *Enteritis* caused each 7 per cent.; *Debility* (of children under 1 year of age) 6 per cent.; *Senility* and *Convulsions* each 5 per cent.; *Anchylostomiasis*, *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia*, *Dysentery*, *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, and *Influenza* each 4 per cent.; *Diarrhoea* and *Enteric Fever* each 3 per cent.; *Diseases and Accidents of Childbirth*, *Heart Disease*, *Intestinal Parasites* other than *Anchylostomiasis*, *Prematurity*, *Bronchitis*, *Accidents and Negligence*, and *Paralysis* each 2 per cent.; *Cancer*, *Diabetes Mellitus*, *Cerebral Haemorrhage*, and *Tetanus* each 1 per cent.

11. In Colombo the highest mortality was from *Enteritis*, to which 11 per cent. of the total deaths were due. *Peumonia* caused 9 per cent.; *Phthisis* 8 per cent.; *Influenza* 7 per cent.; *Senility*, *Debility* (of children under 1 year of age), and *Convulsions* each 5 per cent.; *Heart Disease* and *Diarrhoea* each 4 per cent.; *Enteric Fever*, *Bronchitis*, and *Dysentery* each 3 per cent.; *Cancer*, *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, *Accidents and Negligence*, *Prematurity*, *Paralysis*, *Intestinal Parasites* other than *Anchylostomiasis* each 2 per cent.; *Diabetes Mellitus*, *Anchylostomiasis*, *Puerperal Septicaemia*, *Cerebral Haemorrhage*, *Tetanus*, and *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia* each 1 per cent.

12. One death from *Plague* was registered (in Colombo), as against 4 deaths in the previous month and 3 in the corresponding month of last year.

13. *Infectious Diseases reported*.—The infectious disease most prevalent during the month was *Phthisis*, of which 125 cases were reported (86 in Colombo, 11 in Galle). *Dysentery* followed with 106 cases (72 in Colombo, 10 in Kalutara); *Chickenpox* 82 (53 in Colombo, 10 in Matale); *Enteric Fever* 80 (44 in Colombo, 10 in Galle); *Continued Fever* 43 (32 in Colombo, 8 in Galle); *Mumps* 14 (5 in Colombo, 3 in Badulla); *Measles* 7 (6 in Colombo, 1 in Moratuwa); *Whooping Cough* 2 (1 each in Colombo and Galle); *Diphtheria* 2 (in Colombo); and *Plague* 1 (in Colombo).

Meteorology.

14. *Rainfall*.—Nawalapitiya recorded the highest rainfall (31·13 in.). In other towns rainfall ranged from 18·12 in. in Hatton to 0·10 of an inch in Mannar. Colombo recorded 13·34 in.

15. *Mean Temperature*.—The mean temperature varied from 84·2° in Mannar to 60·8° in Nuwara Eliya, and was 80·3° in Colombo.
