VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON FOR THE  
MONTH OF JULY, 1930.

**REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.**

THIS report deals with the Vital Statistics of the 35 principal towns in the Island, proclaimed under sections 31-36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

**Marriages.**

2. The number of marriages of residents in proclaimed towns was 350 (318 General, 3 Kandyan, and 29 Muslim), as against 375 in the preceding month and 477 in the corresponding month of last year.

**Births.**

3. The births registered numbered 1,809 (943 males and 866 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 32·3 per 1,000 of the population, as against 32·2 in the preceding month, 33·9 in the corresponding month of last year, and 31·2 the average for the corresponding months since 1920. The rate, exclusive of Lunugala and Kalpitiya where no births were registered, ranged from 10·9 in Ambalangoda to 59·3 in Negombo. There were 1,497 births of children whose mothers were residents of the towns, equivalent to an annual rate of 26·7, as against 27·8 in the preceding month and 29·6 in the corresponding month of last year.

4. In the city of Colombo the births registered numbered 697 (357 males and 340 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 30·3, as against 29·7 in the preceding month, 31·4 in the corresponding month of last year, and 27·2 the average for the corresponding months since 1920. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah wards, ranged from 9·8 in Kollupitiya to 41·2 in Wellawatta South. There were 571 births of children whose mothers were residents of the city, equivalent to an annual rate of 24·8, as against 25·2 in the preceding month and 27·4 in the corresponding month of last year.

**Deaths.**

5. The total deaths registered during the month numbered 2,019 (1,048 males and 971 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 36·1, as against 31·1 in

the preceding month and 35·7 in the corresponding month of last year. There were 1,540 deaths of residents of the towns, equivalent to an annual standardized rate of 29·8, as against 24·8 in the preceding month, 29·0 in the corresponding month of last year, and 31·8 the average for the corresponding months since 1920. The standardized death rate ranged from 7·6 in Hambantota to 64·2 in Vavuniya.

6. In the city of Colombo the deaths registered numbered 964 (504 males and 460 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 41·9, as against 30·3 in the preceding month and 32·8 in the corresponding month of last year. There were 784 deaths of residents of the city, which corresponded to an annual standardized rate of 39·3, as against 28·4 in the preceding month, 29·8 in the corresponding month of last year, and 31·3 the average for the corresponding months since 1920. The death rate of residents, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah wards, ranged from 35·8 in Maradana East to 11·6 in Kollupitiya.

7. The stillbirths registered during the month numbered 141 (73 males and 68 females), as against 113 in the preceding month and 113 in the corresponding month of last year.

**Infant Mortality.**

8. The deaths of children under one year of age amounted to 406, and corresponded to a rate of 213 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended July, 1930. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only, the rate was 224, as against 175 in the preceding month, 216 in the corresponding month of last year, and 235 the average for the corresponding months since 1920. There were 374 deaths of children under one year of age whose mothers were residents of the towns, which corresponded to a rate of 250, as against 187 in the preceding month and 226 in the corresponding month of last year.

9. In the city of Colombo the deaths of children under one year of age amounted to 223, and corresponded to a rate of 301 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended July, 1930. Reckoned on the births

registered during the month only, the rate was 320, as against 212 in the preceding month, 244 in the corresponding month of last year, and 264 the average for the corresponding months since 1920. There were 204 deaths of children under one year of age, whose mothers were residents of the city, which corresponded to a rate of 357, as against 232 in the preceding month and 247 in the corresponding month of last year.

#### Causes of Death.

10. The highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, to which 12 per cent. of the total deaths were due. *Enteritis* caused 9 per cent.; *Senility* and *Debility* (of children under one year of age) caused each 6 per cent.; *Phthisis* and *Dysentery* each 5 per cent.; *Malaria and Malarial Cachexia*, *Convulsions*, and *Diarrhoea* each 4 per cent.; *Diseases and Accidents of Childbirth*, *Anchylostomiasis*, *Bright's Disease and Nephritis*, *Enteric Fever*, and *Influenza* each 3 per cent.; *Intestinal Parasites* other than *Anchylostomiasis*, *Prematurity*, *Heart Disease*, *Accidents and Negligence*, *Bronchitis*, and *Paralysis* each 2 per cent.; *Cancer* and *Cerebral Haemorrhage* each 1 per cent.

11. In Colombo, the highest mortality was from *Enteritis*, to which 15 per cent. of the total deaths were due. *Pneumonia* caused 10 per cent.; *Influenza* 8 per cent.; *Phthisis* 6 per cent.; *Debility* (of children under one year of age) 5 per cent.; *Heart Disease*, *Diarrhoea*, *Dysentery*, *Enteric Fever*, *Diseases and Accidents of Childbirth*, *Convulsions*, and *Prematurity* each 3 per cent.; *Anchylostomiasis*, *Intestinal Parasites* other than *Anchy-*

*lostomiasis*, *Bright's Disease and Nephritis*, *Paralysis*, and *Bronchitis* each 2 per cent.; *Malaria and Malarial Cachexia*, *Accidents and Negligence*, and *Cancer* each 1 per cent.

12. Two deaths from *Plague* were registered (both in Colombo), as against 1 in the previous month and 2 in the corresponding month of last year.

13. *Infectious Diseases Reported*.—The infectious disease most prevalent during the month was *Dysentery*, of which 217 cases were reported (125 in Colombo, 36 in Kalutara). *Enteric Fever* followed with 106 cases (55 in Colombo, 25 in Galle); *Phthisis* 104 (80 in Colombo, 12 in Galle); *Chickenpox* 91 (79 in Colombo); *Continued Fever* 43 (22 in Colombo, 18 in Galle); *Mumps* 29 (18 in Matale, 6 in Kandy); *Measles* 9 (in Colombo); *Whooping Cough* 5 (in Colombo); *Diphtheria* 4 (3 in Colombo); *Plague* 3 (in Colombo).

#### Meteorology.

14. *Rainfall*.—Nawalapitiya recorded the highest rainfall (14.08 in.). In other towns rainfall ranged from 10.05 in. in Hatton-Dikoya to 0.02 of an in. in Chilaw. Colombo recorded 1.12 in.

15. *Mean Temperature*.—The mean temperature varied from 85.0° in Trincomalee to 61.0° in Nuwara Eliya, and was 81.4° in Colombo.
