5. The tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application at the Office of the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services, and no tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized form. Alterations must be initialled, otherwise the tenders may be treated as informal and rejected.

6. A cash deposit according to the schedule hereunder will be required to be made at any Kachcheri, and a receipt produced for the same before any form of tender is issued. Should any person decline to enter into the contract and bond, after he has tendered, or fail to furnish the approved security, within ten days of receiving notice in writing of the acceptance of the tender, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown, and the defaulter will render himself liable to be included in the list of defaulting contractors precluded from having any concern in a Government contract. All other deposits will be returned upon signature to the contract. No deposits for tender forms will be accepted at the Office of the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services.

7. The successful tenderer will be required to furnish cash security according to the schedule hereunder, and to sign the bond given in the tender for the due fulfilment of the contract; also to furnish with each tender a letter in duplicate signed by two responsible persons, whose addresses must be given, engaging to become an additional security for the due performance of the contract. The amount deposited for tender forms will form part of the security.

8. Contracts may not be assigned, sublet, or otherwise transferred without the previous written sanction of the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services. Sanction will not be given for any transfers, including powers of attorney in favour of persons in the defaulting contractors' list. No defaulting contractor should be employed on any service connected with the contracts or the tenders.

9. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions above laid down have been strictly fulfilled.

10. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of accepting any portion of a tender or the whole of it for an year or any portion thereof.

11. No contract shall be entered into with any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors, either individually or jointly with any other person, nor shall the contractor employ any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors, or any other person to whom the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, objects after giving due notice of his objection in writing.

12. 13. VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 11, 1930.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 203 (14 Burghers, 117 Sinhalese, 35 Tamils, 26 Moors, 5 Malays, and 6 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1930, viz., 270,700) was 39.1, as against 34.1 in the preceding week, 32.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 119 (1 European, 3 Burghers, 60 Sinhalese, 30 Tamils, 15 Moors, 5 Malays, and 5 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 22.9, as against 22.7 in the previous week, 30.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.9 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 119 total deaths, 31 were of infants under one year of age, as against 24 in the preceding week, 32 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 22.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Eleven deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in Kotahena South and Maradana South and 1 in St. Paul's, as against 12 in the previous week and 22 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Six deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, and Maradana East, as against 5 in the previous week and 9 the weekly average for last year.

(c) One death from *Bronchitis* was registered in Maradana hospitals. The number registered in the preceding week was also 1 and the weekly average for last year was 3.

2. (a) Thirteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Maradana North, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Maradana East, Maradana South, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta South, as against 10 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Phthisis*, of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Two deaths from *Enteric Fever*, of residents of Colombo town, occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week. No death was registered within the city.

4. Thirteen deaths from *Debility* were registered, 6 from *Worms*, 5 each from *Enteritis* and *Infantile Convulsions*, 4 from *Dysentery*, 3 from *Diarrhoea*, 2 from *Tetanus*, 1 each from *Suicide*, *Puerperal Septicaemia* and *Accidents*, and 47 from *Other Causes*.

5. *Reported Cases.*—Sixteen cases of *Chickenpox*, 5 of *Enteric Fever*, and 1 of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 9, 6, and 2, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 78.6°, against 80.7° in the preceding week and 80.6° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.947 in., against 29.891 in. in the preceding week and 29.941 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 4.06 in. against 16.01 in. in the preceding week and 0.36 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

7. To appoint a member on the Special Committee on Drainage to fill a vacancy.—Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe moved that Mr. P. R. Gunasekara be appointed to fill the vacancy. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

8. To nominate a member to serve on (a) the Galle Municipal Education District Committee, (b) the Galle Excise Advisory Board, *vice* Mr. D. W. Subasinghe who has resigned:—

(a) The Chairman moved that Mr. P. R. Gunasekara be nominated to serve on the Galle Municipal Education District Committee. Mr. D. I. Durham seconded.—Carried.

(b) Mr. J. E. Perera moved that Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe be nominated to serve on the Galle Excise Advisory Board. The Hon. Mr. H. M. Macan Markar seconded.—Carried.

Dunlop Rubber Company, Limited.

Improvements in or relating to the manufacture of goods of rubber or similar material.

Abstract.—Materials are added to latex to render this "heat sensitive," i.e., susceptible to coagulation on heating. Rubber goods are then manufactured direct by contacting the heat sensitive latex, duly shaped, with a heating medium.

The claims are:—

1. A process for the manufacture of goods of rubber or similar material from aqueous emulsions or dispersions of the kinds hereinbefore specified which are or which have been rendered heat sensitive in the manner herein described wherein the emulsions or dispersions aforesaid are brought to the desired shape or lay-out and while still in the fluid state and subsequent to the removal thereof from the bulk of the aforesaid emulsions or dispersions are gelled by contacting with a fluid heating medium.

2. A process as claimed in claim 1, wherein any one or more operations such as dipping, spreading, impregnating, spraying, moulding, extrusion or electrophoresis are employed.

3. A process as claimed in claim 1 or 2, wherein the fluid heating medium is a liquid as for example, hot water, oils, naphthas, molten waxes, and molten metals.

4. A process as claimed in claim 1 or 2, wherein the fluid heating medium is a gas such as hot air.

5. A process as claimed in any of the preceding claims, wherein the aqueous dispersions aforesaid are brought to the desired shape or lay-out upon a suitable backing such as a conveyor belt and thereupon the aforesaid dispersions are made to come into direct contact with a fluid heating medium.

6. A process as claimed in any of the preceding claims, wherein the substances employed for gelling are those described in United Kingdom Application No. 30,108/29 (Serial No. 324,104).

7. A process as claimed in any of the claims 1 to 6, wherein a heat sensitive latex mixing is obtained by electro-deposition substantially as described.

8. A process as claimed in any of the claims 1 to 6, wherein a latex mixing described in United Kingdom Application No. 36,116/28 (Serial No. 326,210) is employed.

9. A process as claimed in claim 1, with reference to the foregoing examples.

10. A process as claimed in any of the preceding claims for the production of hard or soft rubber articles.

11. The process for the manufacture of goods of rubber or similar material from aqueous emulsions or dispersions of the kinds hereinbefore specified substantially as described.

12. Rubber or rubberised articles as for example tubes, sheeting, tyre treads when produced by any one or more of the processes claimed in any of the preceding claims.

Improvements in the production of preserved rubber sheets.

Abstract.—The applicants propose to add a solution containing cutch, gambier, and permanganate to latex before coagulating in order to give the sheet the appearance of smoked sheet without smoking it.

The claim is:—

A process for the impartation of preservative properties into crude rubber sheets by acting with a solution of either (1) Cube Gambier, Cutch No. 1 and Potassium Permanganate; or of (2) Cutch No. 1 and Potassium Permanganate on pure latex and water substantially as described, at a time to all intents and purposes co-terminous with the carrying out of the process of coagulation of the latex.

Improvements relating to the casting of molten metals or alloys.

Abstract.—Two hollow horizontal rotating drums can be cooled by an internal water spray. Spring controlled end plates convert the upper space between the drums into a constant level trough into which molten metal is delivered by distributors of various forms, the rate of delivery being controllable. Means may be provided for heating the metal near the distributor. Two metals may be delivered simultaneously by parallel distributors or otherwise to form a layer or sandwich sheet.

The claims are:—

1. A method of casting metals or alloys direct from a molten state consisting in feeding the metal or alloy at a predetermined temperature to a convergent space between two relatively travelling surfaces presenting an outlet of predetermined size and shape between them and travelling at a predetermined speed while being maintained at a predetermined temperature, and maintaining in a riding condition upon the surfaces a bulk of the metal or alloy of such a height that there are in effect three zones, namely, (1) a top or molten zone where the metal or alloy is arriving, (2) a bottom or solid zone where the metal or alloy has become solid and has been compressed and moulded at the gap and is in process of leaving the same, and (3) an intermediate or plastic zone where the metal or alloy is in a state of incipient solidification, and has developed on the travelling surfaces two adherent plastic cakes in process of being carried along by said surfaces towards the solid zone.

2. The method according to claim 1, in which the molten metal or alloy is delivered to the convergent space from a supply maintained at a constant head or level.

3. The method according to claim 1, including the step of operating in the presence of a neutral or reducing atmosphere.

4. The method according to claim 1, 2 or 3, including the step of feeding a solid material through the outlet concurrently with the travel of the metal or alloy whereby a lamination or incorporation of one with the other takes place.

5. Apparatus for casting metals or alloys direct from the molten state comprising a relatively travelling surfaces presenting between them a convergent space having an outlet of predetermined size, means for maintaining the said surfaces at a predetermined temperature with respect to the temperature of the metal or alloy and the speed of travel of the surfaces, and means for maintaining in a riding condition on said surfaces a bulk of the metal or alloy of such height that there are three zones, namely, (1) a top or molten zone where the metal or alloy is arriving, (2) a bottom or solid zone where the metal or alloy has become solid and has been compressed and moulded at the gap and is in process of leaving the same, and (3) an intermediate or plastic zone where the metal or alloy is in a state of incipient solidification and has developed on the travelling surfaces two adherent plastic cakes in process of being carried along by said surfaces towards the solid zone.

6. Apparatus according to claim 5, in which the relatively travelling surfaces are the surfaces of two rotary drums or discs spaced apart on parallel axes to present at their zone of nearest approach an outlet space for metal or alloy supplied to the space above the outlet.

7. Apparatus as claimed in claim 5 or 6, including means whereby the rate of supply of the molten metal or alloy to the convergent space is maintained constant.

8. Apparatus as claimed in claim 7, in which the constancy of rate of supply of material is maintained automatically.

9. Apparatus as claimed in claim 6, in which the space between the rotary drums or discs is converted into a hopper by the provision of end plates bearing against the end faces of the drums or discs.

10. Apparatus as claimed in claim 9, including means operating as an overflow weir for surplus metal or alloy.

11. Apparatus as claimed in claim 6, in which the rotary drums or discs are maintained at a constant temperature by temperature regulating fluid directed against their internal surfaces.

12. Apparatus as claimed in claim 7, in which the constancy of rate of supply of the molten metal or alloy to the convergent space is maintained by a self-regulating level control tank or tanks located between a supply reservoir and the delivery point of the molten metal or alloy to said space.

13. Apparatus as claimed in any of the preceding claims 6 to 12, including a delivery device for the molten metal or alloy into the convergent space, said device comprising a perforated pipe or a box having a row or rows of perforations or a slit or slits.

14. Apparatus as claimed in any of the preceding claims 5 to 13, in which a delivery device for the molten metal or alloy into the convergent space is maintained hot by constantly applied heat.

15. Apparatus as claimed in claim 13, or claim 14, in which the delivery device is maintained hot by constantly burning gas.

16. Apparatus as claimed in claim 15, in which the hot gases derived from the burning gas are conducted through a housing around the supply pipes leading to the delivery device from a molten metal reservoir.

17. Apparatus as claimed in claim 9, in which each end plate is provided with a wedge-shaped projection on its internal face substantially as and for the purpose specified.

18. The method of casting metals or alloys direct from the molten state into a continuous moulded solid product substantially as hereinbefore described with reference to the accompanying drawings.

19. Apparatus constructed, arranged and adapted to operate substantially as hereinbefore described with reference to the accompanying drawings for the purposes described.

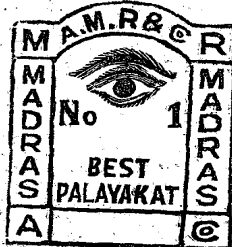
