BY-LAW.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. No person shall stand or loiter in Main street, after having been ordered to move on by a police officer on duty. The penalty for the contravention of this by-law shall be a fine not exceeding ten rupees.

2. Every person who drives or draws when it is disengaged, or when he is not carrying a fare, a vehicle licensed to ply for hire shall keep to the extreme left hand edge of the street. The penalty for the contravention of this by-law shall be a fine not exceeding twenty rupees.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 18, 1930.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 196 (2 Europeans, 12 Burghers, 119 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 23 Moors, 11 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1930, viz., 270,700) was 37.8, as against 39.1 in the preceding week, 33.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 142 (5 Burghers, 73 Sinhalese, 34 Tamils, 21 Moors, 6 Malays, and 3 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 27.4, as against 22.9 in the previous week, 28.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.9 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 142 total deaths, 31 were of infants under one year of age, as against 31 in the preceding week, 31 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 13.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Sixteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Slave Island, 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Kotahena South, Maradana North, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta North, as against 11 in the previous week, and 22 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Six deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in St. Paul's and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena North, and New Bazaar, as against 6 in the previous week, and 9 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, and Slave Island, as against 1 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Eleven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (of non-residents), 2 each in Kotahena South and Maradana North, and 1 in Slave Island, as against 13 in the previous week, and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Phthisis* of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Three deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 1 in Maradana hospitals and 1 each in Maradana North and Maradana East, as against nil in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from *Plague* was registered in Maradana hospitals, as against nil in the previous week.

5. Thirteen deaths from *Debility* were registered, 7 from *Enteritis*, 5 from *Worms*, 4 from *Dysentery*, 3 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Infantile Convulsions*, 2 from *Tetanus*, 1 from *Puerperal Septicaemia*, and 64 from *Other Causes*.

6. **Reported Cases.**—Nineteen cases of *Chickengpox* and 8 of *Enteric Fever* were reported during the week, as against 16 and 5 respectively of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79.5°, against 78.6° in the preceding week and 80.1° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.875 in., against 29.947 in. in the preceding week and 29.919 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1.93 in., against 4.06 in. in the preceding week and 1.28 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

THE following regulations are published for general information. They come into force in 1932, and thereafter:—

1. Ten Scholarships each of the value of Rs. 480 per annum will be awarded on the results of an examination held annually in March, at the University College to students who have passed the London Matriculation Examination or secured exemption from it. The date of the examination will be notified in the *Ceylon Government Gazette*.

No Scholarship will be awarded to a candidate who does not reach a sufficiently high standard. If in any year one or more Scholarships remain vacant, Exhibitions each of the value of Rs. 240 per annum may be awarded on the results of the same examination.

2. (i) No student will be admitted to the examination who completes his/her 19th year on or before the first of July of the year of the examination.

(ii) Students of the University College who satisfy the regulations in other respects may with the approval of the Principal be candidates for the Scholarship examination, provided that they are not of more than three terms' standing at the College.

(2) A candidate who proposes to follow the Honours course in Mathematics if awarded a Scholarship, must offer Group (c).

(3) Candidates who propose to follow the Honours course in History may offer English Literature with History but are advised to offer a language rather than English Literature.

(4) All candidates will be submitted to a *viva voce* test.

(5) No candidate will be considered for a Scholarship who does not reach a satisfactory standard in section (i.).

6. The awards are not made solely on the aggregate of marks.

7. Candidates who are elected to Scholarships or Exhibitions will be required to take an Honours course in one of the subjects on which they were adjudged worthy of Scholarships or Exhibitions, or in a cognate subject at the discretion of the College authorities.

In apportioning awards among the different groups offered by candidates the examiners will generally be guided by the desirability of giving due encouragement to the different Honours schools, subject to the proviso laid down in Regulation 1 that no Scholarship will be awarded to a candidate who does not reach a sufficiently high standard.

SYLLABUSES.

English.—One paper of three hours' duration which will consist of—(i.) Essay, and (ii.) General questions designed to test the candidate's intelligence and acquaintance with matters of current interest.

Latin.—Two papers each of three hours' duration:—(i.) Translation of a continuous piece of English prose into Latin; (ii.) Latin Unseen (passages from standard authors will be set for translation into English).

Greek.—Two papers, each of three hours' duration:—(i.) Translation of a continuous piece of English prose into Greek; (ii.) Greek Unseen (passages from standard authors will be set for translation into English).

Note.—Candidates who offer both Latin and Greek will be required to take in addition a general Classical paper of three hours' duration on Greek and Latin Grammar, Greek and Roman History, Literature and Antiquities.

Sanskrit.—Three papers, each of three hours' duration:—(i.) Translation of a continuous piece of English prose into Sanskrit; (ii.) Translation into English of passages of moderate difficulty from standard Sanskrit works such as are generally read in Ceylon; (iii.) A general paper, including questions on accident and syntax, outlines of early Indian History from 600 B.C. (circa) to the end of the Kushan dynasty, and Sanskrit Literature. Candidates will be expected to show some acquaintance with the Ramayana and Mahabharata and with the texts prescribed in Sanskrit for the London Intermediate Arts Examination.

Pali.—Three papers, each of three hours' duration:—(i.) Translation of a continuous piece of English prose into Pali; (ii.) Translation of passages of varying difficulty from Pali into English; (iii.) A general paper, including questions on accident and syntax, outlines of Early Indian History from 600 B.C. (circa) to the end of the Kushan dynasty, and Pali Literature. Candidates will be expected to show some acquaintance with the following works:—Mahawansa, Jataka Attha Katha, and Dhammapada Attha Katha.

Sinhalese.—Three papers, each of three hours' duration:—(i.) Translation of a continuous piece of English prose into Sinhalese; (ii.) Translation of passages of varying difficulty from Sinhalese into English; (iii.) A general paper, including questions on accident and syntax, outlines of the History of Ceylon, and Sinhalese Literature. Candidates will be expected to be acquainted with the works:—Amawatura, Kausilumina, Pujavaliya, Kavyasekhara, Selalihini Sandesaya.

Tamil.—Three papers, each of three hours' duration:—(i.) Translation of a piece or pieces of English prose into Tamil; (ii.) Translation of passages of varying difficulty from Tamil into English; (iii.) A general paper, including questions on accident and syntax, the outlines of the early History of South India (particularly of the rise, growth, and decline of the Chera, Chola, and Pandya Kingdoms), and the General History of Tamil Literature, with special reference to the Sangam works. Candidates will be expected to be acquainted with Naladiyar, Tirukkural, Kamba Ramayanam, Villiputturar Bharatam, and Arumuga Navalar's Periyapurana vacanam.

English Literature.—Three papers, each of three hours' duration:—(i.) English Literature from 1579 to 1700 with special reference to Jonson, Milton, and Dryden; (ii.) English Literature from 1700 to 1900 with special reference to Pope, Dr. Johnson, Blake, Shelley, and Tennyson; (iii.) The Age of Shakespeare, with a special study of Hamlet, Macbeth, Twelfth Night, Julius Caesar, and The Tempest.

History.—Two papers, each of three hours' duration:—(i.) A paper on *Modern British History, 1485-1914*; candidates should have a general knowledge, and a more special knowledge of any of the following periods:—

- (a) 1485-1688, (b) 1660-1815, (c) 1792-1914; special attention should be paid to the History of the British Empire, particularly in the 19th century;

(ii.) A paper to test the general information and intelligence of candidates, particularly in general historical, economic, and social questions. This paper will also include questions on the History of Ceylon, at least one of which must be attempted by all candidates. Much importance will be attached to this paper.

Physics.—Two papers, each of three hours' duration and a practical examination:—One of the papers will be on *Heat, Light, and Sound*, and the other on *Magnetism and Electricity*. A higher standard than that of the London Matriculation will be required.

Chemistry.—Two papers, each of three hours' duration and a practical examination:—*Theory*: The general principles of chemistry, chemical and physical changes, elementary and compound substances, symbols and formulae, equations including simple calculations based thereon. General characteristics of chemical action and chemical change. Characteristics of acids bases and salts, laws of chemical combination including combination of gases by volume. Equivalent masses, atomic theory and atomic masses, molecular theory and molecular masses, Avogadro's hypothesis, valency and structural formulae, classification of the elements including the periodic classification; combustion, thermal and electrolytic dissociation, the ionic theory and its application; general properties of gases, water and the atmosphere; the following elements and their more important compounds, hydrogen, oxygen, nitrogen, sulphur, carbon, chlorine, arsenic, sodium, potassium, copper, silver, calcium, barium, magnesium, zinc, mercury, aluminium, tin, lead, bismuth, chromium, and iron.

Practical: The preparation of simple substances; the qualitative analysis of simple salts including blowpipe analysis. Simple quantitative analysis including volumetric analysis.

Botany.—Two papers, each of three hours' duration and a practical examination on the syllabus of the Cambridge Senior Certificate Examination and the London Matriculation Examination with the addition of the following:—(i.) Internal structure of stems and root of Monocotyledons and Dicotyledons; (ii.) A comparative study of the following types and groups:—

- Algae.*—Chlamydomonas, Oedogonium, Spirogyra;
- Fungi.*—Mucor, Pythium, Yeast;

- Archegoniatae.*—(a) Bryophyta, Marchantia and Polytichum; (b) Pteridophyta, a Fern, and Selaginella.

Gymnosperms.—Cycas.

N.B.—Candidates are expected to cut sections, stain and mount specimens for observation under the microscope.

Zoology.—Two papers each of three hours' duration and a practical examination: [The Syllabus for Zoology does not demand a detailed or technical knowledge of the subject, but is designed to encourage the habits of observation and of comparison. Students should be familiar with the

animals they study and should cultivate the habit of looking for a reason in what they see, whether it be some detail of structure or peculiarity in habit.]—

1. The general principles and conditions of animal life as exemplified by types specified in paragraphs 2-9: Growth and metamorphosis as illustrated by the Frog, Butterfly, and Mosquito. The structure of the Cell. The differences between plants and animals.

2. The general structure of a Mammal. The more important characteristics as regards form and habits of Monkeys, Bats, Insectivores, Ungulates, Whales, Rodents, and Marsupials. The external form and habits of the common Mammals of Ceylon.

3. The external features of a Bird, and such details of structure as are connected with flight. The habits of the common Birds of Ceylon.

4. The external form, habits, and life-histories of the common Reptiles of Ceylon.

5. The external form, habits, and life-history of the Frog. A cursory knowledge of the functions of its chief organs:—Skeleton, alimentary tract and associated glands, vascular system, nervous system, and respiratory system.

6. The external features of the Bony Fish.

7. The characteristics of the Arthropoda. The external structure of the Prawn, Crab, Cockroach, Spider, Scorpion, and Centipede. The external form, habits, and life-histories of common Insects of Ceylon, such as:—Mosquito, Rhinoceros Beetle, Mantis, Dragonfly, Blowfly, Housefly, Ant, Termite, and Carpenter Bee. The life-history of a Butterfly or Moth.

8. The external form and habits of:—*Amoeba*, Jellyfish, Coral, Sea-anemone, Mussel, Horse Leech, and Earthworm.

9. Life-history of the Tapeworm.

Pure Mathematics.—Three papers, each of three hours' duration. Questions will be set on—

- (i.) Arithmetic;
- (ii.) Algebra, including the theory of indices, logarithms, graphs, elements of the theory of equations, determinants of the second and third orders, summation of easy series, permutations and combinations, and the use of the binomial, exponential, and logarithmic series. (formal proofs of the binomial, exponential, and logarithmic series will not be required);
- (iii.) Euclidean Geometry, including properties of the lines and circles connected with the triangle and of similar figures; elements of the geometry of space and properties of the simpler solids;
- (iv.) Plane Trigonometry up to and including the solution of triangles;
- (v.) Analytical Geometry of the straight line, the circle, and other conic sections (excluding the use of homogeneous co-ordinates); and Elementary Infinitesimal Calculus, including methods of obtaining the values of differential co-efficients and of definite and indefinite integrals, maxima and minima of a function of a single variable in simple cases, and easy geometrical and physical applications of the principles of calculus.

Note.—Papers I. and II. will consist of Arithmetic, Algebra, Euclidean Geometry, Plane Trigonometry, and Analytical Geometry of the straight line and circle; Paper III. of Analytical Geometry of the conic sections and Infinitesimal Calculus.

Alternative questions will be set in each paper.
Applied Mathematics.—Three papers, each of three hours' duration. Questions will be set on—

- (i.) Statics of uniplanar forces including properties of the centre of mass, simple mechanisms, simple linkages, graphical methods, and the elementary laws of friction.
- (ii.) Elementary Dynamics of a Particle including relative velocity, motion in a circle, and simple cases of direct and oblique impact;
- (iii.) Elementary Hydrostatics including pressure of liquids on plane areas and on solid bodies, partially or wholly immersed, and conditions of equilibrium of such bodies; specific gravities and densities of substances and methods of determining them. (The methods of calculus will be permitted.)

4. A Money Order for Rs. 20 payable to the Divisional Forest Officer should accompany each offer. If the offer is accepted, the successful purchaser will be given credit for the amount in the final payment of the timber, if the offer is not accepted, the amount will be returned to the tenderer.

5. A lump sum offer should be made, written both in words and figures for the whole lot of 35 satin logs.

6. The Conservator of Forests reserves to himself the right, without question, of accepting or rejecting any offer.
