“THE EXCISE ORDINANCE, No. 8 OF 1912.”

*Excise Notification No. 209,*

THE Governor in Council, under section 56 of the Excise Ordinance, No. 8 of 1912, hereby (1) exempts from the provisions of the said Ordinance, in the villages shown in the Schedules A and B annexed hereto, the following excisable articles, to wit :—

Unfermented (sweet) toddy drawn from (a) kitul palms within the villages named in Schedule A and (b) palmyra palms within the villages named in Schedule B, for the purposes of manufacturing treacle and/or jaggery or for immediate home consumption; and (2) cancels the following Excise Notifications, to wit :—

The licensee may draw unfermented toddy only for the purpose of manufacturing treacle or jaggery provided that such toddy when drawn from palmyra trees may before it is removed from the foot of the tree be consumed either by the licensee or the members of his family or by the tapper employed by the licensee to draw the toddy.

2. The licensee shall mark every tree which he is authorized to tap by painting a band not less than 3 inches wide round the trunk of the tree at a height of 5 feet from the ground. In the case of kitul and coconut trees the band shall be of tar and in the case of palmyra trees of white paint. The licensee shall repaint the bands when necessary and prevent them from becoming obliterated while the licence is in force.

3. No tree shall be tapped until it has been marked in the manner prescribed in Condition No. 2 above.

4. No tree may be tapped by any person other than the licensee or his tapper \_\_\_\_\_ of \_\_\_\_\_.

5. When the licensee employs a tapper to tap the trees he may pay the tapper either in cash or by permitting him to take the produce of the trees on every alternate day. The licensee shall take all the toddy drawn on \_\_\_\_\_ and on every alternate day thereafter.

6. Except in areas which have been specially exempted from this condition, all pots used for drawing toddy or for collecting such toddy shall be coated with lime daily.

7. No trees shall be tapped and no toddy shall be drawn except between the hours of 5 A.M. and 10 A.M. in the morning, and between the hours of 3 P.M. and 6 P.M. in the afternoon.

8. Except toddy that may be consumed under rule 1, all toddy drawn in the forenoon shall be placed over the fire to be boiled into treacle or jaggery not later than 10.30 A.M. and toddy drawn in the afternoon not later than 6.30 P.M.

9. All toddy drawn under this licence must be taken to the place where it is to be manufactured into jaggery or treacle and nowhere else.

10. No jaggery shall be manufactured by the licensee except in the garden called \_\_\_\_\_ in which he resides, and no jaggery shall be manufactured by the tapper except in the garden called \_\_\_\_\_ in which he resides.

11. The licensee shall produce on demand for inspection (a) by any Excise Officer not below the rank of Inspector, or (b) by any headman—

- (1) this licence.
- (2) all toddy drawn under this licence and not converted into jaggery or treacle.
- (3) all toddy in the course of manufacture into treacle.
- (4) all jaggery and treacle in his possession which were manufactured from toddy drawn under this licence.

12. Any Excise Officer not below the rank of Inspector, or any headman may between the hours of 5 A.M. and 7 P.M. enter the place used for the manufacture of jaggery or treacle.

13. If the licensee, or the tapper employed by him, commits a breach of any of the conditions of this licence, or if the Government Agent is satisfied that all the toddy drawn from the trees covered by this licence is not used in the manner contemplated by these conditions, then this licence may be cancelled without notice. When a licence is cancelled under this condition, the licensee shall forthwith deliver the licence to the headman of the village.

### VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended November 22, 1930.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 191 (12 Burghers, 114 Sinhalese, 30 Tamils, 25 Moors, 9 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1930, viz., 270,700) was 36.8, as against 40.6 in the preceding week, 35.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.5 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 159 (5 Burghers, 91 Sinhalese, 27 Tamils, 19 Moors, 8 Malays, and 9 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 30.6, as against 28.1 in the previous week, 29.2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.9 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 159 total deaths, 40 were of infants under one year of age, as against 41 in the preceding week, 33 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 14.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—1. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.936 in. against 29.943 in. in the preceding week and 29.894 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.98 in. against 3.94 in. in the preceding week and 4.0 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

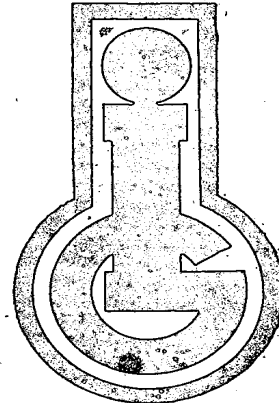

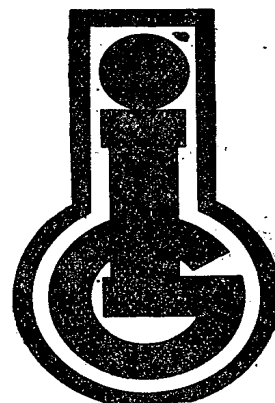

## MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

## Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on October 18, 1930, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated October 14, 1930.

*Present*: Mr. R. H. Whitehorn, Chairman; Ratwatte Adigar; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva; Dr. G. P. Hay; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake; Mr. D. K. McMinn; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa; Dr. W. E. de Silva.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on September 20, 1930, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—(a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1929 to September 30, 1930, on account of the Municipal Fund; (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date; (c) Health Officer's report for September, 1930; (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of September, 1930; (e) The reservoir readings for September, 1930.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, stand-pipes, and house-service taps inspected during September, 1930.

4. Petitions: Mr. de Silva presented petitions from—(1) Licensees of spaces in the vegetable market complaining against the prosecutions entered for using the pavements opposite the market; (2) The residents of the rural areas begging that the requirements of the Housing Ordinance be not enforced in the case of buildings erected in such areas; (3) D. P. K. Charles Appuhamy asking that he be given a stall in the market to be used as an office; (4) S. Batcha Rawther complaining of the delay to put him in occupation of the grain shed in Railway Approach road; (5) Babahamy complaining about being asked to quit model tenement No. 66; (6) S. M. Abdul Cader asking for the use of stalls 22 and 23, Public market.

Mr. Wijayatilake presented petitions from—(1) Messrs. Vasumal Hasamal complaining that the electric lights in one of the premises owned by them had been cut off without any notice to them for non-payment of electricity dues by the tenant; (2) A. M. Savul Hameed requesting that he be granted a licence for a tea kiosk for temporary boutiques Nos. 8 and 40 on the market grounds; (3) The residents of the rural areas re enforcement of the provisions of the Housing Ordinance in such areas (same as petition (2) presented by Mr. de Silva); (4) Mr. K. Kumaraswami re conditions prevailing at the Mahaiyawa model tenements and cooly lines; (5) Mr. A. Pate asking for reduction of the annual values of certain premises in Peradeniya road.

Ratwatte Adigar presented petitions from—(1) M. Meera Saibo applying for a licence for a beef stall at 217, Peradeniya road; (2) M. L. M. Ghouse, licensee of beef stall No. 352, Peradeniya road, protesting against the issue of further licences for the sale of beef in Peradeniya road.

The Chairman undertook to look into the matters referred to in the several petitions.

5. Correspondence: (1) Letter No. W 213/30 of October 8, 1930, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary authorizing the Council to charge fees in respect of certain offensive and dangerous trades.—Read.

(2) Letter of October 9, 1930, from Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail resigning office as Councillor for Ward No. 2. The Chairman proposed "That this Council do place on record its appreciation of the valuable services rendered by Mr. Ismail as Councillor for Ward No. 2." Ratwatte Adigar seconded.

Messrs. de Silva and Wijayatilake supported the resolution which was unanimously carried.

6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Wijayatilake asked—Will the Council be pleased to state why the construction of a section of the drains on Peradeniya road for which a vote of Rs. 5,000 was allowed over a year ago has not yet been taken in hand or given on contract?

The Chairman replied as follows:—This work cannot be done until the tree cutting and removal of roots are completed.

7. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Wijayatilake moved—"That this Council do allow a vote of Rs. 500 for the improvement of the road leading to the Mulgampola cemetery out of the sum of Rs. 15,000 earmarked for the improvement of village roads." Mr. de Silva seconded.—Carried.

8. (1) Pursuant to notice, Mr. de Silva moved—"That immediate steps be taken to make the cooly lines at Mahaiyawa more habitable and sanitary." Mr. Wijayatilake seconded.—It was agreed to carry out such improvements as funds permit.

8. (2) Pursuant to notice, Mr. de Silva moved—"That the summary ejection and the imposition of default rates and the consequent seizures and charges on the tenants occupying the model tenements be not put into execution at the present time." Mr. Wijayatilake seconded.

It was agreed that the time for collection of rent without costs be extended till the end of the month unless there is any unforeseen difficulty.

8. (3) Pursuant to notice, Mr. de Silva moved—"That in view of the severe depression the country is passing through at the moment, the rates levied on bus and car owners and drivers, as stand charges be reduced." Mr. Soysa seconded.—Resolved that the fees be reduced as follows:—Omnibuses: from Rs. 5 to Re. 3.50 per mensem and from 30 cents to 20 cents per diem. Motor cars: from Rs. 2.50 to Rs. 1.50 per mensem, and from 15 cents to 10 cents per diem.

8. (4) The following motion which stood in the name of Mr. de Silva was, with the leave of Council, withdrawn as the matter had been already dealt with:—"That as there is no adequate road to Mulgampola public cemetery, this Council do take immediate steps to provide a desirable approach to this spot."

8. (5) Pursuant to notice, Mr. de Silva moved—"That this Council do take immediate steps to lease out all lands belonging to the Council, which do not at present bring an income to the Council." Mr. Wijayatilake seconded. Resolved that the Chairman submit a report on the possibility of leasing part of Roseneath area and the Nittawela trenching ground and any other land suitable for leasing.

9 Memorandum dated September 30, 1930, from the Chairman pointing out that it is unnecessary to invite objections to assessment specially and that the usual course to deal with objections after the issue of the assessment notices can be followed.—This was agreed to and it was resolved that the existing rates be continued for the following year.

10. To sanction the transfer of the vote for removal of dung and offal from the slaughter-house under the following heads:—Scavenging, Head 5, item 2, Rs. 456.25. Conservancy, Head 6, item 5, Rs. 160.—Resolved that the necessary sanction be allowed.

#### 11. Recommendations of Standing Committees:—

##### *Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects held on September 20, 1930.*

(1) Letter dated September 13, 1930, from C. William Fernando stating that the members of the late St. Cecilia's Band have formed themselves into a new band, the Kandy Jazz and Brass Band, and applying for the same grant as that given to St. Cecilia's Band.—Recommended to withdraw the grant for the present.

(2) Letter dated September 1, 1930, from the Hony. Secretary, Kandy Law Library, applying for a grant of at least Rs. 500 for the purchase of books for the Law Library.—Recommended payment of Rs. 500 without obligation to make the grant annual. The Hony. Secretary to be asked to submit a list of the books proposed to be purchased.

(3) To amend the Municipal Free Library rules No. 30 and No. 32.—Recommended that the rules be altered as follows:—

Rule No. 30.—The Librarian shall be present at the library at all hours while the library is open, except between 12 noon and 2 P.M., and he shall be responsible to the Municipal Council of Kandy for all books, periodicals, publications, and papers in the library. He shall keep a correct catalogue of all the books in the library, and registers of books and periodicals issued to and returned by members, and of applications for books which are already in the hands of other members. He shall keep on the library table a suggestion book for the use of all visitors. He shall report to the Secretary for such action as the Executive Committee may deem fit the breach by any member of any of these rules or any improper conduct of any person in the library premises, whether a registered member or not. He shall carry out all orders of the Secretary punctually, and shall furnish security in such sum and in such manner as the Executive Committee may decide for the due performance of his duties.

Rule No. 32.—The Librarian will issue books to registered members from 8 A.M. to 11 A.M. and 3 P.M. to 7 P.M. daily except on Sundays and Public Holidays, when books will be issued from 8 A.M. to 11 A.M. only.

14. To sanction the appointment of an Installation Inspector, Electricity Department, on a salary of Rs. 900 per annum rising to Rs. 1,740 per annum by annual increments of Rs. 120 and a travelling allowance of Rs. 480 per annum.—Resolved that the matter be considered with the Budget.
15. To appoint a member to serve on—(i.) the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation; (ii.) the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment; (iii.) the Electricity Committee.

## MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, October 11, 1930, at 9 a.m., pursuant to notice dated October 4, 1930.

*Present* :—Mr. M. M. Wedderburn, Chairman; the Hon. Mr. C. E. de Vos, M.L.C.; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe; Mr. T. Amarasuriya; Dr. S. P. Joseph; and Mr. P. R. Gunasekara.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of September 13, 1930, a copy thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Mr. P. R. Gunasekara presented a petition from the Dangedera Gramarakshaka Jayawardena Sabha objecting to the extension of the conservancy area to include Dangedera.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe asked the following questions :—(1) Who supervise the tarring of roads? (2) Is the tarring of roads given on contract or is this work done under the supervision of the Superintendent of Works? (3) Is there any reason for the difference in the surface of the tarred roads of one section from another?

The Chairman replied as follows :—(1) and (2) The work, which is done on agreement, is supervised by the road overseer, and inspected by the Superintendent and the Inspector of Works from time to time. (3) Some of the roads have previously been treated with "Spramex" a hot mixture; they are now treated with a cold mixture—"Colas." Before the first application of "Colas" is made the road surface has to be brushed free of grit, and washed. This causes a certain amount of unevenness of the surface until the second coat is applied, which is some little time after the first application. A difference would be noticeable before the second coat of tar is applied.

4. The following motion stood in the name of Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe :—"That the tarring of the section of the Richmond Hill road beyond the house known as The Bower, which was occupied up till recently by Dr. A. H. de Silva, and in several other roads, is unsatisfactory, and steps be taken to prevent such unsatisfactory work." Mr. Wickremasinghe asked the leave of Council to bring up the motion at the next meeting. Council agreed to have it deferred until the next meeting.

5. To consider the Colonial Auditor's letter No. 3,592/24/29 of September 22, 1930, *re* the disposal of surplus stores purchased for the duplication of the Galle Water Service.

The Chairman moved that Council do approve of the accounting suggested by the Colonial Auditor. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

Resolved that inquiries be made from Local Bodies if they desire to purchase any of the surplus stores.

6. To consider letter No. U 329/28 of October 6, 1930, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, forwarding the report of the Select Committee of the Legislative Council appointed to consider the draft of the Ordinance to amend the Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910.—Resolved that the amendments be approved.

7. To consider the draft of a new sub-section to be added to section 110 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, empowering the Council to make regulations of fishing operations in Galle Harbour.—Resolved that the new sub-section be approved.

8. Assessment rates for 1931.—Resolved (1) to make and assess for the calendar year 1931, a rate of 17½ per cent. of the annual value of all houses and buildings of every description, and of all lands and tenements whatsoever within the Police limits; and a rate of 7 per cent. of the annual value of all houses and buildings of every description, and of all lands and tenements whatsoever outside the Police limits but within the Municipal limits of Galle, as required by section 115 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, payable by four instalments on or before the following dates:—First instalment on or before March 31, 1931; second instalment on or before June 30, 1931; third instalment on or before September 30, 1931; fourth instalment on or before December 31, 1931. (2) To adopt the valuation of properties for the current year subject to such alterations as the Chairman may from time to time find necessary to make for the purpose of rating for the calendar year 1931.

9. Date of the next General Meeting of Council.—Resolved that the next General Meeting of Council be held on November 15, and the meetings of the Standing Committees on November 1.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Municipal Works, Finance and Assessment, and Markets and Sanitation, and the Special Committee on Drainage of September 27, 1930, were laid before the Council:—

10. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of September 27, 1930.*

(2) To consider the following estimates:—(a) Rs. 2,400 for weeding and removing silt from the elias and outlet channels in the Talapitiya and Dewatura areas three times in the year, and cutting the sand bar when required.—Recommended that one-third of the estimate, viz., Rs. 800, be passed for one clearing of the elias, and that the Superintendent do report at the end of 1930, whether it will be necessary to clear the elias again next year. (b) Rs. 100 for building a retaining wall at the night soil bucket depot on Elliott road.—Recommended. (c) Rs. 350 for building a drain at the Talbot Town public latrine.—Recommended. (d) (i.) Rs. 325 for building two scavenging carts to replace two unserviceable carts and (ii.) Rs. 350 for building two spare carts.—Recommended (i.) the building of one cart to be drawn by two bulls, and one cart to be drawn by a single bull at a cost of Rs. 325; (ii.) that one spare cart to be drawn by two bulls be built at a cost of Rs. 175. (e) Rs. 400 for repairs to the fish market.—Recommended that the Chairman be authorized to have the slabs in one bay of the market—containing three stalls—covered with Minton tiles, as an experiment. (f) Rs. 206 for building a drain along Hume road.—Recommended. (3) To consider 20 applications for water service.—Recommended that the applications be allowed. (5) To consider estimates for providing additional accommodation at the Segregation Camp and the Infectious Diseases Hospital.—Recommended (1) that the following estimates be passed for additional accommodation at (a) the Segregation Camp:—(1) Rs. 2,350 for quarters for the caretaker; (2) Rs. 250 for a latrine for the caretaker; (3) Rs. 2,600 for one semi-permanent ward; (4) Rs. 2,400 for improving the existing permanent building. (b) At the Infectious Diseases Hospital:—(1) Rs. 2,600 for one semi-permanent ward; (2) Rs. 1,500 for one set of semi-permanent quarters for attendants. (ii.) That Government be requested to approve of, and contribute half the cost of the buildings at the Infectious Diseases Hospital and the matter brought up for further consideration when the reply of Government is received.

#### Resolution.

With regard to item (2) (a).—Resolved that the Chairman be asked to report on a more economical method of clearing the elias before any further clearing is done.

With regard to item (2) (e).—Resolved that the Provincial Engineer be asked if it would be safe to cover the existing slabs with Minton tiles.

With regard to item (5).—Resolved that consideration be deferred until the next meeting.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

11. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of September 27, 1930.*

(2) To recommend the payment of Rs. 20 for the services of a temporary clerk in the Health Department for 15 days.—Recommended.

(3) To consider an application from the shroff for the payment of notarial fees, amounting to Rs. 117, for drawing up a security bond.—Recommended that Rs. 117 be advanced to the shroff, repayable in twelve monthly instalments.

(4) To consider an application from Mr. C. L. V. Perera, clerk, Electricity Department, for increase of salary.—Recommended that the application be refused as the length of his services does not entitle him to any further increase.

(7) To consider the rates quoted for the year 1931 for (a) supply of coir dust, (b) supply of grass, (c) whitewashing Municipal buildings, and (d) purchase of house refuse and street sweepings.—Recommended that the following offers be accepted:—(a) Rs. 15 per 100 bags coir dust, A. P. Silva; (b) cents 18 per bundle of 20 lb., and cents 8 per bundle of 8 lb., W. L. K. Handy; (d) Rs. 305 D. Chas Seneviratna. The offer for (c) was considered too high.—Resolved to offer Rs. 87 per quarter as at present.

(8) Demolished buildings in ward 4E and 4W.—Recommended that the rates be struck off.

(9) Supply of water to the Railway.—Recommended that the free allowance of water to the Railway be increased from 30,000 gallons to 40,000 gallons a day, as long as ample water is available, and anything over 40,000 gallons be charged for.

(10) To recommend that the following amounts be written off as irrecoverable:—Rs. 174.50 electricity dues and Rs. 60 rent of meters for 1928 and 1929.—Recommended (1) that the amounts be written off as irrecoverable; (2) that unless accounts are paid within two months the installation be disconnected and be not reconnected until the arrears are paid in full.

(11) To recommend that half the available salary of the late Mr. N. V. Francis, clerk, Municipal Office, be distributed among the officers who temporarily discharged the duties.—Recommended that half the initial salary be distributed among the other officers of the department working overtime.

(12) To consider the proposal to extend the conservancy area:—(1) Considered. (2) Recommended that the extended area should be conserved as soon as the Medical Officer of Health can arrange for it.

(13) To consider an application from the Medical Officer of Health for two extra carts, one overseer and six coolies for the scavenging of wards 4 and 5.—(1) Considered. (2) Recommended that the two extra carts and six coolies be allowed with three kanganyas instead of one overseer.

(14) To consider the purchase of another motor lorry for conservancy.—Recommended that a lorry for conservancy and one for scavenging be provided in the budget for 1931.

(15) Proposal to establish a Whaling Station at Watering Point.—The Chairman explained the proposal and wished for an expression of the opinion of the members.

#### Resolution.

With regard to item (12).—Mr. P. R. Gunasekara moved—that the conservancy area be extended along Wakwella road, but that the extension along Dangedera road be not considered for the present. Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe seconded.—Carried.

With regard to item (15).—Resolved that while regretting that the amenities of Watering Point will be lost, the Council in view of the increase in business and employment which will result, have no objection to the granting of the licence, provided the neighbouring houses are protected from nuisance.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.



12. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation of September 27, 1930.*

(2) To consider the proposal to extend the conservancy area.—(1) Considered with the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment. (2) Recommended that the extended area should be conserved as soon as the Medical Officer of Health can arrange for it.

(3) To consider an application from the Medical Officer of Health for two extra carts, one overseer, and six coolies for the scavenging of Wards 4 and 5.—Recommended that two extra carts and six coolies be allowed, with three kangannies instead of one overseer.

(5) Proposal to establish a Whaling Station at Watering Point.—The Chairman explained the proposal, and wished for an expression of the opinion of the members.

*Resolution.*

With regard to item (2) (corresponding to item (12) of the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment).—Resolved that the conservancy area be extended along Wakwella road, but that the extension along Dangedera road be not considered for the present.

With regard to item (5) (corresponding to item (15) of the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment).—Resolved that while regretting that the amenities of Watering Point will be lost, the Council in view of the increase in business and employment, which will result, have no objection to the granting of the licence, provided the neighbouring houses are protected from nuisance. The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

13. *Extract from the Minutes of the Special Committee on Drainage of September 27, 1930.*

(2) Drainage along the Galle-Matara road.—Recommended the continuation of the Drainage Scheme along the Galle-Matara road, and the Council do contribute Rs. 10,000 as a half share of the cost, if Government will contribute a half share.

*Resolution.*

Resolved that the above recommendation of the Special Committee be adopted.

### A PROCLAMATION.

H. J. STANLEY.

WHEREAS by Proclamations dated February 10, 1899, and February 8, 1912, published in *Gazettes* Nos. 5,601 of February 17, 1899, and 6,489 of February 16, 1912, respectively, the Chief Headmen's divisions of Karachchi, Vadamaradchi West, Vadamaradchi East, and Pachchilaippali were brought under "The Village Communities' Ordinance, 1889," and the said Chief Headmen's divisions were subdivided into villages or convenient groups of villages in the manner specified in Column I. of the schedule hereto:

And whereas the said Proclamation is in force by virtue of section 4, sub-section (3), and section 6, sub-section (2), of "The Village Communities Ordinance, No. 9 of 1924":

And whereas by a Proclamation dated March 27, 1924, published in *Gazette* No. 7,384 of March 28, 1924, the Chief Headman's division of Vadamaradchi East comprising the subdivisions of Kudattanai and Chempianpattu, was abolished and the subdivisions of Kudattanai and Chempianpattu were added to Vadamaradchi West and Pachchilaippali respectively, and the Chief Headman's division of Vadamaradchi West was known as Vadamaradchi:

And whereas it is now deemed expedient to amalgamate the Chief Headmen's divisions of Pachchilaippali and Karachchi into one Chief Headman's division to be hereafter called and known as Pachchilaippali-Karachchi:

Now know Ye that I, the Governor of Ceylon, do hereby declare (a) that the Chief Headmen's divisions of Pachchilaippali and Karachchi shall be amalgamated and be called and known hereafter as the Chief Headman's division of Pachchilaippali-Karachchi, and (b) that the said new division and the division of Vadamaradchi shall be subdivided into villages or convenient groups of villages as specified in Column II. of the schedule hereto.
