THE SCHOOL TEACHERS' PENSION ORDINANCE, NO. 6 OF 1927.

RULE made by the Governor in Executive Council under section 4 (1) of the School Teachers' Pension Ordinance, 1927.

RULE.

The School Teachers' Pension Rules, 1927, published in Gazette No. 7,631 of February 24, 1928, are hereby amended. By the deletion of rule 8 (ii.) and the substitution of the following therefor:—

(ii.) A teacher who ceases to be employed in a school from any cause whatsoever except as provided under rule 9 after completing 60 months of recorded service but is not eligible for a pension under rule 6 may receive a sum equal to the total contribution paid during the months of recorded service in terms of rule 5. Provided that where such a teacher returns to service, the previous service for which he has drawn his contributions shall not count for purposes of pension.

Any timber not removed by the date of expiry of agreement shall revert to the Crown.

(2) Should the purchaser fell or remove trees from any area of the coupe he has not paid for, or from any area of forest outside the demarcated boundaries of his coupe, nothing in the agreement shall exempt him from liability to punishment for illicit felling and removal under the provisions of the Forest Ordinance, No. 16 of 1907, and of the rules framed thereunder. For the purpose of special condition it shall be presumed that the purchaser has, previous to entering into the agreement, satisfied himself as to the position of the lines demarcating his coupe, and that the purchaser has further agreed that he shall not, in the event of any dispute, put forward a plea of ignorance of the limits or extent of his coupe.

(3) The purchaser or his agent or any of his employees shall not block up the boundaries by depositing any brushwood or branches. Should the lines become blocked due to unavoidable circumstances, such lines should be at once cleared by the purchaser.

(4) The purchaser shall, not for the purpose of removing timber from his own coupe enter into any other area of forest not paid for by him, except with the permission of the Range Forest Officer, and along paths permitted by him.

(5) The purchaser or his agent or any of his employees shall not prevent any other purchaser of timber in the adjoining coupe from entering into the coupe paid for by the former, either in person or by his agent, or by his employees or from bringing in any animal for purpose effecting easy removal of timber, provided such entry is made with the permission of the Range Forest Officer, Trincomalee, in writing.

(6) Cart notes for removal of timber must be obtained from the Forest Officer in charge of timber exploitation, in respect of all forest produce before removal of any such produce to depôts outside the area of the coupe, and any removal of any forest produce without the authority of such cart notes will be considered an infringement of this rule and punished as provided hereunder. All such cart notes must be retained to be produced before the Range Forest Officer, Trincomalee, before removal permits can be issued for removal of such produce from such depôt to any final destination. For the purpose of this clause the purchaser shall select for his purpose, with the approval of the Range Forest Officer, Trincomalee, a plot of ground outside the limits of the coupe for a depôt. The site of such depôt shall not be changed without permission.

(7) The purchaser shall agree that for each and every infringement of the above conditions he shall be liable to a fine of an amount not exceeding Rs. 100, to be imposed in writing by and at the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer, Trincomalee, and this fine will be recovered from the tenderer's security deposit.

(8) The purchaser shall also agree that in the event of security money having become exhausted, it shall be within the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer, either (a) to accept a further security deposit amounting to 5 per cent. of the full purchase price, or (b) to cancel the agreement and to refund the purchaser such balance of the paid purchase money, if any, as remains after deducting the value of all timber removed by the purchaser of the date of such cancellation. VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended December 6, 1930.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 216 (2 Europeans, 14 Burghers, 119 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 45 Moors, 2 Malays, and 5 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1930, viz., 270,700) was 41.6, as against 38.9 in the preceding week, 38.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 158 (2 Europeans, 6 Burghers, 89 Sinhalese, 33 Tamils, 21 Moors, 2 Malays, and 5 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 30.4, as against 26.0 in the previous week, 31.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.9 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 158 total deaths, 39 were of infants under one year of age, as against 27 in the preceding week, 30 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 7.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Fifteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Kotahena South, 2 each in Slave Island and Wellawatta North, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, New Bazaar, and Maradana East, as against 24 in the previous week and 22 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Tenth deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in each St. Paul's and Kotahena North, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, and Slave Island, as against 9 in the previous week and 9 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Five deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each St. Paul's, Maradana hospitals, Maradana North, Maradana East, and Maradana South, as against 3 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. Ten deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 in St. Paul's, and 1 each in Kotahena North and Wellawatta South, as against 8 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

3. (a) Three deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), as against 4 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Enteric Fever*, of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.

4. Three deaths from *Plague*, of residents of Colombo town, occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week. No deaths were registered within the city.

5. Twenty deaths from *Debility* were registered, 9 from *Enteritis*, 5 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 4 from *Dysentery*, 3 from *Puerperal Septicæmia*, 2 each from *Worms* and *Accidents*, 1 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Homicide*, and 68 from *Other Causes*.

5. The species, measurements, cubic contents, &c., of the material appearing in the schedule are to be regarded as only approximate, and intending tenderers are presumed to have inspected the timber before they make their offers and they should bring to the notice of the Divisional Forest Officer any serious discrepancies which they may notice. They should also satisfy themselves by personal inspection as to the condition of the timber they offer for.

6. Any tenderer whose offer is accepted shall, within three days of notification of acceptance of his offer, pay the full purchase amount in the case of offers aggregating to Rs. 20 and as follows in the case of offers exceeding Rs. 25 in the aggregate:—

General Meeting.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M. pursuant to notice dated October 29, 1930.

Present.—Mr. H. E. Newnham, V.D., M.A., C.C.S., Chairman; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, M.L.C.; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy; Mr. G. W. Dodds; Mr. T. G. Jayewardene, V.D., J.P.; Mr. N. R. Blande; Mr. M. L. M. Reyal; Dr. S. Muttiah; Mr. F. Dadabhoy, J.P.; Mr. H. L. Grocock; Mr. E. G. Eastman, O.B.E.; Lt-Col. F. A. Ferguson, D.S.O.; and Dr. R. G. Jayetileke.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of October 1, 1930, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of October 1, 1930, be confirmed.

2. To consider letter No. A.B./107 of October 18, 1930, from the Hon. the Director of Education stating that Col. T. G. Jayewardene and Dr. S. Muttiah will cease to be members of the Education District Committee for the Colombo Municipal Council Area at the end of the year; having served their terms of office under section 18 (5) of Ordinance No. 1 of 1920, and requesting that two Members be nominated afresh to serve on the Committee, with effect from January 1, 1931.

The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader moved that Mr. T. G. Jayewardene and Dr. S. Muttiah be re-nominated to serve on the Committee, with effect from January 1, 1931.

Mr. M. L. M. Reyal seconded.—Carried.

3. Pursuant to notice, Dr. E. V. Ratnam asked the following question which the Chairman answered:—

Q.—What reply has been received from Government to his letter No. 277 of October 8, 1930, on the subject of the amendment of section 121 (2) of the Council's Ordinance, 6 of 1910, with regard to remission of rates on account of non-tenancy of buildings, and, if no reply has been received, whether he will be pleased to invite the attention of Government? A.—The Hon. the Attorney-General drafted an amending Ordinance on the lines desired by the Council and the Chairman on the Council's behalf approved it on October 28.

4. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved:—That the Council should resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council to consider the extracts from the proceedings of the Committees annexed to the agenda. The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of October 21, 1930, were considered.

PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

(2) To consider a memorandum of the Chairman, dated September 25, 1930, stating that Dr. L. F. Hirst, City Microbiologist's report on the fumigation of grain is practically complete, except that conditions in Rangoon require investigation by him and suggesting that, in order to ensure he will not recommend expenditure which might prove to be unnecessary, the Council should vote a sum of Rs. 400 so that Dr. Hirst might make this very useful visit. Registered No. 012,729.—Recommended and that a sum of Rs. 400 be voted.

(3) To consider—(a) An application from Dr. H. Ratnarajah, 3rd Assistant Medical Officer of Health, requesting that he be confirmed in his appointment in terms of paragraph 12 of his agreement. (b) The recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health supported by the Municipal Treasurer, that he be confirmed in his appointment. Registered No. 1,239.—Recommended that Dr. H. Ratnarajah be confirmed in his appointment, with effect from October 5, 1930, the date on which his agreement expired.

(4) To consider the suggestion of the Medical Officer of Health that the designation "Health Visitor" be altered to "Public Health Nurse" in order to get into line with Government. The Government Nurses engaged in similar work are called Public Health Nurses. Registered No. 1,261.—Recommended that the following designations be altered: (1) "Health Visitor" to "Public Health Nurse;" (2) that of "Superintendent, Child Welfare Centre" be altered to "Superintending, Public Health Nurse;" and (3) that of "Resident Health Visitor" to Resident Health Nurse."

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of October 22, 1930, were considered.

(2) To consider—(a) A petition from a number of residents of Galkapanawatta road, Grandpass, praying that Galkapanawatta road be closed to bus and lorry traffic and that it be declared that motor cars while taking this road should drive at a normal speed. (b) The recommendation of the Municipal Engineer that Galkapanawatta road be closed to lorries and buses between points A and B marked on 4-chain tracing attached to papers. Registered No. 1,169.—Recommended.

(3) To consider letter No. C 1,494 dated September 15, 1930, from the Superintendent of Police, Colombo, recommending that by-law made under section 18 (2) (j) of the Vehicles Ordinance, No. 4 of 1916, which prohibits lorries and buses from using Hulftsdorp street from the San Sebastian-Hulftsdorp street junction to Dam street junction, be extended to include bullock carts. Registered No. 1,142.—Recommended and that the following by-law be passed:—

*By-law referred to:—*The use by bullock carts of the road known as Hulftsdorp street from the San Sebastian-Hulftsdorp street junction to Hulftsdorp street-Dam street junction is prohibited, provided that this prohibition shall not extend to bullock carts going to or from houses to which this road affords the only means of access.

(4) To recommend that in terms of section 47 of chapter VIII. of the Municipal Council by-laws, notices be served on the owners of the following premises for the removal of dangerous coconut trees standing thereon:—(1) No. 138A, lane off Schofield place, (two trees). Registered No. 013,424. (2) No. 14, Ingham street (one tree). Registered No. 014,054.—Recommended.

their real cause. But they can be condoned under second proviso to section 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Minute which runs as follows:—"It shall, however, be competent for the Council with the consent of His Excellency the Governor to award such gratuities in cases in which the service has not been continuous." Registered No. 1,247.—Recommended.

(36) To recommend, under rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 283·37 to Ibrahim Saibo, B. T. 1807 of the Municipal Engineer's Department, who is condemned by a Medical Board as unfit for further service. The gratuity is based on his service of 122 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 41·81. *Note.*—This cooly's service had been interrupted by breaks aggregating to 110 months in all. But they can be condoned under second proviso to section 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Minute, which runs as follows:—"It shall, however, be competent for the Council with the consent of His Excellency the Governor to award such gratuities in cases in which the service has not been continuous." Registered No. 1,246.—Recommended.

(37) To recommend, under rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 312·8 to Suppen, B. T. 3115 of the Municipal Engineer's Department, who is condemned by a Medical Board as unfit for further service. The gratuity is based on his service of 166 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 33·84. *Note.*—This cooly's service had been interrupted by breaks aggregating to 7 months in all and there is no reliable evidence as to their real cause. But they can be condoned under second proviso to section 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Minute, which runs as follows:—"It shall, however, be competent for the Council with the consent of His Excellency the Governor to award such gratuities in cases in which the service has not been continuous." Registered No. 1,254.—Recommended.

(38) To recommend, under rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 348·01 to Mutoo, son of Pollamadani, of the Municipal Engineer's Department, who is condemned by a Medical Board as unfit for further service. The gratuity is based on his service of 253 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 24·76. *Note.*—This cooly's service had been interrupted by breaks aggregating to 52 months in all and there is no reliable evidence as to their real cause. But they can be condoned under second proviso to section 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Minute which runs as follows:—"It shall, however, be competent for the Council with the consent of His Excellency the Governor to award such gratuities in cases in which the service has not been continuous." Registered No. 1,255.—Recommended.

(39) To recommend, under rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 591·53 to Abraham Singho, B. T. 3953 of the Municipal Engineer's Department, who is condemned by a Medical Board as unfit for further service. The gratuity is based on his service of 262 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 40·64. Registered No. 1,253.—Recommended.

(40) To recommend, under rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 272·89 to Simon Gomes, B. T. 4161 of the Municipal Engineer's Department, who is found unfit by a Medical Board for further service. The gratuity is based on his service of 195 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 25·19. *Note.*—This cooly's service had been interrupted by breaks aggregating to 7 months in all and there is no reliable evidence as to their real cause. But they can be condoned under second proviso to section 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Minute, which runs as follows:—"It shall, however, be competent for the Council with the consent of His Excellency the Governor to award such gratuities in cases in which the service has not been continuous." Registered No. 1,266.—Recommended.

(41) To recommend, under rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 308·42 to watcher R. M. Sathappan, B. T. 1636 of the Municipal Engineer's Department, who is condemned by a Medical Board as unfit for further service. The gratuity is based on his service of 195 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 28·47. *Note.*—This cooly's service had been interrupted by breaks aggregating to 27 months in all and there is no reliable evidence as to their real cause. But they can be condoned under second proviso to section 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Minute, which runs as follows:—"It shall, however, be competent for the Council with the consent of His Excellency the Governor to award such gratuities in cases in which the service has not been continuous."—Registered No. 1,264.—Recommended.

(42) To recommend, under rules 2 and 12 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a pension, with effect from September 10, 1930, of Rs. 121·20 per annum to K. G. Perera, Peon, Municipal Engineer's Department, who is found unfit by a Medical Board for further service. The pension is based on his service of 142 months and his salary of Rs. 432 per annum. Registered No. 1,265.—Recommended.

(43) To consider—(a) Letter No. F 1,173/28, dated October 9, 1930, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, regarding pension to James Perera, Standpost Fitter, Waterworks Department. (b) A memorandum of the Municipal Treasurer, dated October 17, 1930, submitting revised figures of pension payable as follows:—Aggregate salary drawn under Government, Rs. 2,513·93; aggregate salary drawn under Municipal Council, Rs. 10,665.—Total, Rs. 12,978·93, Rs. 10,665 ÷ 12,978·93 × 448·35 = Rs. 368·42. The Council on November 7, 1928, sanctioned the payment of a pension of Rs. 378·46 a year, with effect from August 1, 1928, and the excess payments made amounting to Rs. 22·68 up to October, 1930, will be recovered from future payments. Registered No. 1,232.—Recommended.

Write off of Arrears of Rates.

(44) To consider a report of the Municipal Treasurer, dated October 15, 1930, recommending that arrears of rates amounting to Rs. 125·68, as per list attached to his report, be written off (27 cases, 24 on grounds of poverty, and 3 irrecoverable). Registered No. 014,342.—Recommended.

Reconveyance of Properties, vested in the Council.

(45) To recommend reconveyance of the premises vested in the Council, mentioned in the annexed list (as per annexure A) to the parties named, on payment of all rates and costs which would have been due up to the quarter in which the reconveyance may be signed, had the property not been vested in the Council.—Recommended.

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of October 28, 1930, were considered.

MUNICIPAL ENGINEER'S DEPARTMENT.

(3) To consider—(a) A request that premises No. 38, Maradana, a portion of which comes within the sanctioned street lines of the Maradana road, be acquired, in view of the refusal of the application to re-erect. (b) The memoranda thereon of the Chairman, the Municipal Engineer, and the Secretary. (c) The opinion of Mr. E. J. Samarawickrema, K.C. Registered No. 867.—Recommended that compensation be offered of Rs. 3,500 for the 1·34 perches after the re-erection.

(4) To consider—(a) A petition from a number of residents of Galkapanawatta road, Grandpass, praying that Galkapanawatta road be closed to bus and lorry traffic, and that it be declared that motor cars while taking this road should drive at a normal speed. (b) The recommendation of the Municipal Engineer that Galkapanawatta road be closed to lorries and buses between points A and B marked on 4 chain tracing attached to papers. Registered No. 1,169.—Recommended that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council be requested to make the following regulation, under section 58 of the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927:—

*Regulation referred to:—*The use by motor omnibuses and lorries of the following highway within the Municipal limits of Colombo is prohibited:—Galkapanawatta road from Grandpass road eastward up to a point 100 feet south of the junction of Galkapanawatta and New Urugodawatta road.

(5) To consider letter No. C 1,494, dated September 15, 1930, from the Superintendent of Police, Colombo, recommending that by-law made under section 18 (2) (j) of the Vehicle Ordinance, No. 4 of 1916, which prohibits lorries and buses from using Hulftsdorp street from the San Sebastian-Hulftsdorp street junction to Dam street junction, be extended to include bullock carts. Registered No. 1,142.—Recommended and that the following by-law be passed:—

*By-law referred to:—*The use by bullock carts of the road known as Hulftsdorp street from the San Sebastian-Hulftsdorp street junction to Hulftsdorp street-Dam street junction is prohibited, provided that this prohibition shall not extend to bullock carts going to or from houses to which this road affords the only means of access.

MUNICIPAL TREASURER'S DEPARTMENT.

(6) With reference to the resolution of Council on March 5, 1930, that Mr. F. Ginger's claim to a refund of Rs. 3,707.21 be admitted to consider—(a) Letter, dated September 10, 1930, from Mr. F. Ginger claiming Rs. 468.07 as bank interest at the rate of 2½ per cent. (b) A report thereon of the Municipal Treasurer. Registered No. 012,780.—Recommended that the sum of Rs. 468.07 being bank interest at the rate of 2½ per cent. be paid, on condition that Mr. Ginger gives a full discharge to his claims.

Reconveyance of Properties, vested in the Council.

(8) To recommend reconveyance of the premises, vested in the Council, mentioned in the annexed list (as per annexure A) to the parties named, on payment of all rates and costs which would have been due up to the quarter in which the reconveyance may be signed, had the property not been vested in the Council.—Recommended.

5. The Chairman moved in Committee :—That the Council do resume. The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

6. The Chairman moved in Council that the resolutions of Council in Committee, and the recommendations of the various Committees, subject to any amendments of such recommendations by the Council in Committee, be adopted. The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

7. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved that Mr. R. L. Pereira, K.C., who was absent from three consecutive General Meetings and thereby ceased to be a member, be restored to office, under the provisions of section 30 of Ordinance 6 of 1910. The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

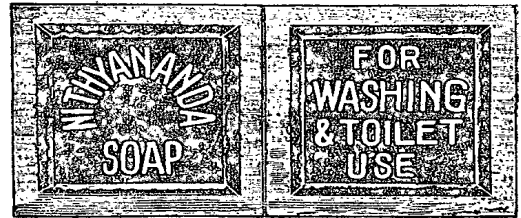
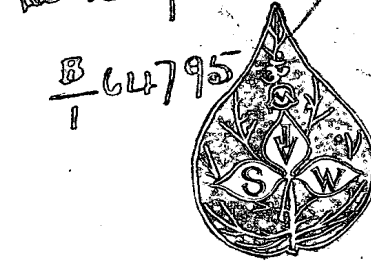
