THE SCHOOL TEACHERS' PENSION ORDINANCE, No. 6 of 1927.

RULE made by the Governor in Executive Council under section 4 (1) of the School Teachers' Pension Ordinance, 1927.

RULE.

The School Teachers' Pension Rules, 1927, published in Gazette No. 7,631 of February 24, 1928, are hereby amended. By the deletion of rule 8 (ii.) and the substitution of the following therefor:—

(ii.) A teacher who ceases to be employed in a school from any cause whatsoever except as provided under rule 9 after completing 60 months of recorded service but is not eligible for a pension under rule 6 may receive a sum equal to the total contribution paid during the months of recorded service in terms of rule 5. Provided that where such a teacher returns to service, the previous service for which he has drawn his contributions shall not count for purposes of pension.

CODE OF REGULATIONS FOR ASSISTED VERNACULAR AND BILINGUAL SCHOOLS.

AMENDMENT REFERRED TO.

Clause 18 (i.). -Add as a fresh paragraph-

"One teacher who has passed the Intermediate or Bala Pundit examination referred to in clause 84, and who is employed in the Post-primary classes, may be allowed to count as a provisional certificated teacher in the assessment of the adequacy of staff. This concession will not be operative after 1936."

All schedules should state the time required for completion of the work.

5. The accepted tenderer will be required to complete and hand over the work to the Director of Electrical Undertakings, Colombo, on or before a date to be agreed

upon.

Any alterations made in the schedules of rates should bear the initials of the tenderer, and all schedules of rates containing alterations not so initialled will be

treated as informal and rejected.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended December 6, 1980.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 216 (2 Europeans, 14 Burghers, 119 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 45 Moors, 2 Malays, and 5 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1930, viz., 270,700) was 41 6, as against 38 9 in the preceding week, 38 4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32 5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 158 (2 Europeans, 6 Burghers, 89 Sinhalese, 33 Tamils, 21 Moors, 2 Malays, and 5 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annumwas 30.4, as against 26.0 in the previous week, 31.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.9 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 158 total deaths, 39 were of infants under one year of age, as against 27 in the preceding week, 30 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during

the week was 7.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Fifteen deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Kotahena South. 2 each in Slave Island and Wellawatta North, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebast an, New Bazaar, and Maradana East, as against 24 in the previous week and 22 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Tenth deaths from Influenza were registered, 3 in each St. Paul's and Kotahena North, and 1 each in San S bastian, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, and Slave Island, as against 9 in the previous week and 9 the weekly average

for last year.

(c) Fi e deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each St. Paul's, Maradana hospitals, Maradana North, Maradana East, and Maradana South, as against 3 in the previous

week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. Ten deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 in St. Paul's, and 1 each in Kotahena North and Wellawatta South, as against 8 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

3. (a) Three deaths from Enteric Fever were registered in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), as against 4 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average

for last year.

(b) One death from Enteric Fiver, of a resident of Colombotown, occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda,

during the week.

4. Three deaths from *Plague*, of residents of Colombotown, occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week. No deaths were registered within the city.

5. Twenty deaths from Debility were registered, 9 from Enteritis, 5 from Infantile Convulsions, 4 from Dysentery, 3 from Puerperal Septicaemia, 2 each from Worms and Accidents, 1 each from Diarrhoea and Homicide, and 68 from Other Causes.

6. Reported Cases.—Ten cases of Enteric Fever, (including 1 in Port), 4 of Plague and 3 af Chickenpox, were reported during the week, as against 7, nil, and 8, respect

tively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79.6°, against 80.0° in the preceding week and 79.8° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.908 in., against 29.891 in. in the preceding week and 29.920 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.25 in., against 1.13 in. in the preceding week and 2.08 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
