## PASSED ORDINANCE.

Ordinance enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

No. 11 of 1930.

An Ordinance for making provision for the Public and Railway Services for the Financial Year 1930-31.

H. J. STANLEY.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Appropriation Ordinance of 1930.

Appropriation for year 1930-31.

2 Without prejudice to any other law authorizing any expenditure, sums not exceeding one hundred and fourteen million seven hundred and fourteen thousand one hundred and eighty-five rupees, thirty million rupees, and one million eight hundred and ninety seven thousand eight hundred and ten rupees are hereby declared to be payable for the service of the financial year beginning on October 1, 1930, and ending on September 30, 1931, out of the revenue and other funds of the Colony, the revenue of the Ceylon Government Railway, and the revenue of the Colombo Electricity Supply respectively; and the said sums may be expended as specified in the schedules to this Ordinance.

## DRAFT ORDINANCES.

## MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information, in substitution for the Draft Ordinance previously published in the *Government Gazettes* Nos. 7,777 and 7,780 of May 16, 1930, and May 23, 1930, respectively:—

An Ordinance to amend the Irrigation Ordinance,  
No. 45 of 1917.

III. 544.

**B**E it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Irrigation Amendment Ordinance, 1930.

Short title.

2 Section 3 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended as follows:—

Amendment of section 3 of the principal Ordinance.

(1) by the insertion of the following new definition immediately before the definition of the word "Proprietor":—

"Irrigation" includes any operation for the control of water for the purposes of cultivating or protecting paddy or any other crop, the cultivation of which is capable of being assisted by such control.

(2) by the addition of the following new paragraph (c) at the end of the definition of the expression "Irrigation work" :—

(c) Any work necessary for irrigation.

(3) by the substitution of the word "occupier" for the word "occupant" wherever the latter word occurs.

Amendment of sections 4 and 78 of the principal Ordinance.

3 Sections 4 and 78 of the principal Ordinance are hereby amended by the substitution of the word "occupier" for the word "occupant" wherever the latter word occurs in each of the said sections.

Amendment of section 76 of the principal Ordinance.

4 Section 76 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended as follows :—

(1) by the repeal of sub-section (1) thereof and the substitution of the following sub-section therefor :—

"(1) Whenever the owner or occupier of any land or premises, by the clearance or drainage of the said land or premises or by any other act or omission, whether of the same nature or not, in any way affecting any channel, water-course or ela used for irrigation purposes, or any other irrigation work—

(a) causes any such channel, water-course, ela or other irrigation work to be blocked up, obstructed or damaged, so that any lands deriving benefit therefrom are deprived of that benefit; or

(b) causes injury of any other nature to any lands in the neighbourhood of any such channel, water-course, ela or other irrigation work,

any person aggrieved by the act or omission of the said owner or occupier may make a complaint to the Government Agent."

(2) by the substitution of the word "occupier" for the word "occupant", and of the word "lands" for the word "fields", in the third and in the fourth lines respectively of sub-section (2) thereof, and by the insertion of the words "or if any of the parties to any such agreement fails to take or to assume, within a reasonable time, any of the steps or obligations which he has thereby agreed to take or assume," immediately after the word "injury" in the ninth line of the said sub-section;

(3) by the substitution of the word "lands" for the word "fields" in the third line of sub-section (6) and in the fifth line of sub-section (8) thereof; and

(4) by the substitution of the word "occupier" for the word "occupant" in the fifth line of sub-section (7) thereof.

#### *Objects and Reasons.*

The absence of a definition for the word "Irrigation" in the Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917, and the present narrowness of its definition of "Irrigation work" does not always make the scope of the Ordinance as clear as it might be and sometimes limits its utility. Clause 2 (1) therefore provides a suitable definition of "Irrigation" and clause 2 (2) enlarges the meaning of "Irrigation work".

2. Section 76 of the Ordinance makes provision for the settlement by arbitration of questions relating to injuries to fields below or adjacent to an irrigation work, which are caused by the clearing or draining of land situated above the irrigation work. Cases, however, arise where lands are injured as a result of the alteration of an anicut situated at a lower level, and as it is desirable that the arbitration procedure provided should be applicable in all cases where injuries are caused to lands in the neighbourhood of an irrigation work or deriving benefit from it, by the owners of land in the vicinity, the existing sub-section (1) of section 76 has in clause 4 (1) of this Bill been replaced by a new sub-section which will make arbitration possible in all such cases.

3. Section 76 (2) authorizes arbitration where no agreement can be reached between the parties concerned, but not in other circumstances. It happens in some cases that an agreement is reached, but the parties do not carry it out; the result is a deadlock, since arbitration is not then possible and there is no provision for enforcing the agreement. The Bill therefore in clause 4 (2) amends section 76 (2) so as to authorize arbitration in cases where an agreement is not carried out.

4. The remainder of the amendments contained in the Bill are consequential upon the alterations effected in section 76 (1), and are as follows :—

- (a) The word "occupier" has been substituted for the word "occupant" where the latter word occurs in the Ordinance (in one place side by side with "occupier", viz. :—s. 78) ; and
- (b) The word "lands" has been substituted for the word "fields" in section 76, as it seems undesirable to confine the benefit of this section to the cultivators of fields only.

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information :—

**An Ordinance to increase temporarily the export duty on tea imposed by the Tea Research Ordinance, 1925.**

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Tea Cess (Temporary Increase) Ordinance, 1930.

Short title.

2 This Ordinance shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1931, and shall continue in force until the 31st day of December, 1933.

Commencement and duration.

3 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the Tea Research Ordinance, 1925, there shall be charged, levied, and paid under section 11 thereof an export duty of fourteen cents per one hundred pounds of tea exported and so in proportion for any less weight, instead of the export duty of ten cents for one hundred pounds prescribed in the said section and in addition to the export duties charged under Ordinance No. 17 of 1869.

*Objects and Reasons.*

In order to provide an annual income from which the expenses involved in the anticipated activities of "The Tea Research Institute of Ceylon" may be met, section 11 of the Tea Research Ordinance, 1925, authorized an addition of 10 cents per 100 pounds to the export duty on tea ; and to assist the Institute in the initial capital expenditure essential to enable it to commence work Government lent it a sum of Rs. 1,000,000 at 6 per cent. interest per annum.

2. The Board of the Tea Research Institute finds that when interest has been paid on this loan and provision has been made for its ultimate redemption, the balance of the Institute's present income derived from the additional export duty referred to and other sources is insufficient to meet the essential extensions of its research organization that are necessary for its proper functioning.

3. To defer the proposed scheme of research till such time as the Institute's income may be able to bear the expenditure that is now necessary is, in the opinion of the Board, inadvisable, as this would postpone the date at which the Institute will become fully equipped and efficient ; but to proceed with its present plan of development without an increase in its income would involve the Institute, it is expected, in an accumulated deficit of approximately Rs. 231,464 by the end of 1934.

4. Therefore in consultation with the principal Associations interested in the cultivation of tea and with the approval, it believes, "of the whole of the tea industry of the Island" the Board has approached Government with the request that the additional export duty prescribed for the purposes of the Institute by section 11 of the Tea Research Ordinance be altered from 10 cents to 14 cents per one hundred pounds of exported tea for a period of three years ending on the 31st of December, 1933, by when it hopes the income on the present basis would be equal to the expenditure then necessary.

5. The purpose of this Bill is to give effect to the above request.
