“THE CEMETERIES AND BURIALS ORDINANCE, 1899.”

BY-LAWS made by the Local Board of Puttalam, under section 38 of “The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899,” and confirmed by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

BY-LAWS.

(1) All burial grounds within the area specified in the schedule hereto shall be registered in the office of the Local Board, Puttalam, on or before November 30, 1931.

(2) The applications for the registration of a burial ground under by-law 1 shall be made by the trustees, managers, or proprietors thereof, or by any person entitled in law to use it, and shall be accompanied by a survey plan of the burial ground prepared by a licensed surveyor.

(3) The trustees, managers, or proprietors of any burial ground, or the person having sole or principal charge, shall within one month from the date of proclamation of these by-laws nominate and appoint a person, hereinafter referred to as the “responsible officer,” who shall be responsible to the Local Board for the proper regulation of the burial and cremation of corpses in such burial ground, and for ensuring that graves shall be of proper depth; in default the Chairman of the Local Board shall nominate and appoint such a person.

(4) The “responsible officer” shall cause the burial ground or burial grounds in his charge to be kept clear of weeds and undergrowth, and shall prevent rubbish being deposited therein. Failure to observe these requirements shall constitute an offence.

(5) The “responsible officer” shall cause all graves to be dug in order, so as not to waste space, and to be not less than five feet in depth and not less than two feet from the nearest grave.

(6) No burial or cremation shall take place in a burial ground without the permission of the “responsible officer.”

(7) The “responsible officer” shall keep a register, in such form as may be prescribed by the Chairman, Local Board, of all burials or cremations occurring within the burial ground or burial grounds of which he is in charge. Failure to keep such a register, or to keep it accurately, shall be an offence.

(8) The “responsible officer” shall, not more than 24 hours after a burial or cremation in any burial ground or burial grounds of which he is in charge, send a copy of the entry in the register referring to that burial or cremation to the office of the Chairman, Local Board.

(9) If the “responsible officer” is unable from any cause to perform his duties, or if he cannot be found at the time when his services are required, the Chairman of the Local Board may authorize any fit or proper person to perform any of the duties which by these rules are assigned to keepers of burial grounds.

Schedule.

North.—From the northern extremity of title plan No. 84,842 eastwards along the northern boundary of the said title plan; thence along the 30 links reservation lying to the north of title plan No. 103,236, west and north of title plan No. 180,677, north of title plans Nos. 103,238, 103,239, 140,289, 175,585, 175,584 running through title plans Nos. 175,580, 174,668 and lying to the north of title plan No. 190,445 to a point 30 links south of the south-eastern corner of title plan No. 174,668.

East.—From the last mentioned point a line drawn south-eastwards to meet the north-eastern corner of title plan No. 66,037; thence along the eastern boundaries of title plans Nos. 66,037, 66,038, 59,380, thence along the road reservation to the east of title plans Nos. 59,383, 62,610, 137,594, 62,611, 59,384, 53,327, 62,623, 62,616, and 137,595 up to its junction with road reservation to the south of title plan No. 137,595.

South.—From the last mentioned point westwards along the road reservation to the south of title plans Nos. 137,595, 146,288, 189,076, 58,701, 114,943, 114,941, 114,942, 135,235, 135,234, 62,619, and 62,629 up to the landmark on the south-western corner of title plan No. 62,629.

West.—From the last mentioned point a line drawn north-westwards to the 1st milepost on the Puttalam-Chilaw road, thence due west to the Puttalam lake, thence northwards along the Puttalam lake as far as the flood outlet channel (P. P. 3,637), thence north-eastwards along the flood outlet channel until it meets the Western Saltern road; thence south-eastwards along the Western Saltern road to its junction with the Mannar-Puttalam road,

thence along Mannar-Puttalam road northwards to the landmark on the northern boundary of lot 232 in M. S. P. P. 20, thence from the said landmark a line drawn north-eastwards to the landmark on the south-western corner of lot 6 in P. P. 5,509; thence along the western boundaries of lots 12, 11, 7, 4, and 2 in P. P. 5,509, lot 16 in P. P. 6,135, and title plan No. 84,842 as far as the starting point of the northern boundary.

BY-LAWS.

The rates and fares, between the hours of 6 A.M. and 6 P.M., for goods and passengers, to be paid for vehicles licensed to ply for hire shall be as follows:—

(i.) For a hackery or 0 30 for the first 15 minutes

Do. .. 0 50 over 15 minutes up to 30
minutes

Do. .. 0 75 over 30 minutes up to 1 hour

(ii.) For a rickshaw 0 25 for the first 15 minutes

minutes

2. After 6 P.M. an extra charge of one-third the rates and fares prescribed in by-law 1 shall be payable.

3. Every vehicle licensed to ply for hire shall carry affixed in some conspicuous place inside such vehicle a card or plate inscribed with the rates and fares prescribed by by-laws 1 and 2.

4. By-law 27 of the by-laws made under section 19 (1) of the Vehicles Ordinance, No. 9 of 1901, as amended by Ordinance No. 22 of 1908, for the Local Board town of Moratuwa and published in the *Government Gazette* of October 29, 1909, is hereby repealed.

“THE LOCAL BOARDS ORDINANCE, 1898.”

BY-LAWS made by the Local Board of Health and Improvement, Kegalla, under section 56 of “The Local Boards Ordinance, 1898,” and approved by the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council, under section 57.

BY-LAWS.

C.—Eating-houses and Tea and Coffee Boutiques.

1. All eating-houses and tea and coffee boutiques shall be kept clean and sanitary to the satisfaction of the Chairman.

2. All utensils, furniture, and other requisites used in or belonging to any eating-house or tea and coffee boutique shall always be kept clean. The top of any table used in a tea and coffee boutique shall be covered with zinc.

3. The walls of all eating-houses and tea and coffee boutiques shall be plastered and limewashed, and the rooms shall be well ventilated and lighted. The floor shall be cemented.

4. All refuse and dirt in or about the premises of any eating-house or tea and coffee boutique shall be removed twice daily.

5. No person suffering, or who to the knowledge of any person in charge of an eating-house or tea and coffee boutique has recently suffered, from any contagious or infectious disease, or has been recently in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, shall be permitted by any such person in charge of the eating-house or tea and coffee boutique to be employed in or about any such eating-house or tea and coffee boutique.

6. The sugar used in an eating-house or tea and coffee boutique shall be kept in glass-stoppered wide-mouthed bottles.

7. All cakes, sweetmeats, &c., exposed for sale shall be kept in properly constructed fly-proof glass cases. No foodstuffs shall be exposed except in fly-proof containers. All vessels used shall be kept clean.

8. All waste tea, coffee, or milk, or remnants of food or cooking waste shall be collected in a proper receptacle and removed daily and shall not be thrown on the ground.

9. No adulterated milk shall be sold offered or exposed for sale or kept on the premises of any eating-house, or tea, or coffee boutique. For the purpose of this by-law adulterated milk shall mean milk to which water or any other foreign liquid or substance has been added for the purpose of augmenting its quantity or enhancing its apparent quality.

10. These by-laws shall be framed and hung up in a prominent place in every such eating-house or tea or coffee boutique.

11. The owner or proprietor of an eating-house or a tea and coffee boutique shall be liable for any breach of or non-observance of any of the foregoing by-laws.

D.—Galas.

1. Every licensed gala shall be registered by the Chairman and a notice board shall be hung up by the licensee at the entrance to every such gala with the words "Registered Gala No. ——" and the name of the owner painted thereon.

2. Every cattle gala shall be properly levelled and drained to the satisfaction of the Chairman, and the ground shall either be paved or properly consolidated with broken metal, so that it keeps a hard and level surface. All buildings in such cattle gala shall be so constructed and kept as to comply with by-law 3. Such cattle gala shall be kept in a clean and sanitary state, being thoroughly cleaned daily, and all dung and refuse removed daily to such place at a distance from any dwelling houses as the Chairman shall approve. No goods, materials, or substance of any kind shall be deposited upon such gala in such a manner as to obstruct such daily cleansing.

3. The owner of every building or shed used as a cattle gala shall provide the same to the satisfaction of the Chairman with suitable cemented drains to carry off washings, urine, or rain water. Provided, that the Chairman, if he considers it necessary, may require such drains to be so constructed as to convey the urine or washings into one or more covered receptacles constructed in such a manner as the Chairman shall direct, the contents of which shall be daily removed at the expense of such owner, and dispose of so that no nuisance is caused thereby. The floor of such building or shed shall be paved with brick rendered in cement, stone, cement concrete, asphalt, or other hard material which can readily be kept clean, and shall be kept even and in good repair. If such building or shed is so constructed that it can be whitewashed, this shall be done at least once in six months or oftener if the Chairman shall so direct. (Provided that the Chairman may relax any of the above regulations if, owing to the distance of the building or shed from human dwellings or any other reason, he shall consider the same unnecessary.) Provided also that the Chairman, may, if he considers it necessary, require any building to be used as a cattle gala to be constructed of stone, brick, or other permanent materials and to have a tiled or iron roof.

4. Every cattle gala shall be kept in a clean and sanitary state being thoroughly cleansed daily, and dung and refuse removed daily to such a place at a distance from any dwelling houses as the Chairman shall approve.

5. Every cattle gala shall be open for inspection at any time by the Medical Officer of Health, the Officers of the Board, or by any other person thereto authorized in writing by the Chairman. All orders which the Chairman is empowered to make under these by-laws shall be in writing.

6. The licensee of a registered gala shall be liable for any breach of or non-observance of any of the foregoing by-laws.

E.—Laundries.

1. For the purpose of these by-laws "laundry" means the premises occupied by any person carrying on the trade of washing clothes for hire, and "laundryman" signifies any such person or an employee or assistant of such person in such work.

2. Every laundryman shall, when required by the Chairman provide a separate room for soiled linen, which must be well ventilated and clean at all times and whitewashed twice annually.

5. A laundryman shall not store soiled linen in any room used as a living apartment.

4. The Chairman shall, when he considers it necessary in the interest and for the good of the public health, allocate special sites for the washing of clothes, such sites will be indicated by a notice board.

5. When any laundryman or any member of his family or household shall contract any infectious or contagious disease, he shall within 24 hours report the same to the Medical Officer of Health or the Sanitary Inspector.

6. When any laundryman or any other member of his family or household shall contract any infectious or contagious disease, all work in the laundry shall immediately cease, nor shall any clothes be taken into the laundry or sent out of it, after the outbreak and during the prevalence of such disease, save by special permission of the Chairman.

7. No laundryman shall, without the permission of the Chairman of the Local Board or the Medical Officer of Health receive soiled linen from any house in which there is reason to believe that a member thereof is suffering from any infectious disease.

8. Every laundryman shall, when called upon by the Chairman of the Local Board or the Medical Officer of Health give a list of the persons whose clothes he washes.

F.—Common Lodging Houses.

1. For the purpose of these by-laws "Common lodging house" shall mean any house or any part of a house in which four or more persons, not being members of the same family, are housed for hire.

2. A common lodging house shall be substantially built and kept in a good state of repair and the sleeping rooms shall be well ventilated and lighted to the satisfaction of the Chairman, and the walls thereof whitewashed twice annually.

3. The keeper of a common lodging house shall at all times keep the place clean and in a sanitary condition. He shall cause all filth and offensive matter to be removed from the premises.

4. When any person in a common lodging house becomes ill with any infectious or contagious disease, the keeper of such person shall immediately inform the proper authority through the Secretary or the Sanitary Inspector, and shall obey the directions of the proper authority with regard to the vacation of the lodging house, disinfection or destruction of bedding or clothing, and other articles, fumigation, disinfection, and limewashing of the house.

5. The keeper of a common lodging house shall be responsible for the provision of sufficient latrine accommodation for the inmates of, and for the keeping of the same in a sanitary condition.

6. The Chairman of the Local Board is hereby empowered to decide the maximum number of persons that may be accommodated in any common lodging house, and such number shall be endorsed upon the licence. Any common lodging house keeper allowing the number to be exceeded shall be guilty of an offence. For the purpose of this by-law two children under twelve years of age shall count as one person.

7. The premises of any common lodging house shall at all times be open to inspection by the Chairman of the Local Board, the Medical Officer of Health, the Secretary of the Local Board, or any Inspector of the Local Board.

H.—Dangerous and Offensive Trades.

1. Dangerous and offensive trades shall for the purpose of these by-laws mean and include any of the following:—Storage and manufacture of artificial manure, boiling of blood or offal, drying blood or offal, tanning, fat melting, fat extracting, soap making, soaking of coconut husks, fibre dyeing, coconut oil manufacture (where machinery is employed) manufacture or storing of fibre, storing of hides, bones, artificial manure, or any materials for the manufacture of artificial manure, storing of Maldivian fish in quantity of 5 cwt. in weight, the manufacture of bricks and tiles, the burning of lime, the manufacture of aerated waters, storing or curing of plumbago.

2. No owner or occupier of any land or premises within the limits of the Local Board or other persons shall carry on or suffer to be carried on upon such land or premises any offensive or dangerous trade or manufacture without a license from the Chairman of the Local Board who is further empowered to refuse such licence if in the opinion of the Board the granting of it is likely to be prejudicial to public health or to create a nuisance. Such licence shall be subject to such fees as the Local Board from time to time may determine with the sanction of the Governor in Council.

3. If any person shall have been convicted twice or oftener by any court of the breach of any of these by-laws it shall be lawful for the court recording such second or subsequent conviction to cancel the licence issued to such person under these by-laws by the Chairman of the Local Board. Upon such cancellation of a licence by a court the Chairman of the Local Board is empowered in his discretion to refuse to issue any fresh licence to such person.

4. All materials required for the purpose of carrying on any of the aforesaid trades, businesses, or manufactures, shall be stored so as to prevent effluvia of nuisance, and all such materials which have to be brought along any thoroughfare, and which are likely to be offensive and give off effluvia, shall be transported in non-absorbent covered receptacles or in such other manner as the Chairman shall direct, so as to obviate the creation of any nuisance.

5. Effective means shall be adopted for rendering innocuous any offensive vapours of gases emitted during any process or manufacture. Such vapours and gases shall either be discharged into the external air in such manner and at such a height as to admit of their diffusion without injurious or offensive effects, or they shall be passed directly through a fire or into a condensing apparatus. All premises shall be adequately drained and the drains kept in efficient order and washed daily.

6. Floors shall be maintained in a proper state of repair and cleansed daily, and when so ordered by the Chairman shall be constructed of such impermeable material as he may direct.

7. Walls shall be kept in good order so as to prevent the absorption of filth, and whitewashed twice annually or oftener if so ordered by the Chairman of the Local Board or the Medical Officer of Health.

8. All apparatus, including implements and vessels, shall be kept clean, and where possible they shall be cleaned daily. All refuse, sweepings, scrapings, together with waste and dye products, shall be removed daily from the premises in covered receptacles, unless intended to be forthwith subjected to further trade purposes on the premises.

9. Tanks used for washing or soaking skins or any other materials must be emptied and cleansed as often as may be necessary to prevent effluvia.

10. No person carrying on any offensive trade or manufacture, nor any owner or occupier of any land or premises upon which such offensive trade or manufacture is carried on, shall pollute any river, stream, canal, channel, well, tank, or open piece of water by discharging thereinto or suffering to flow thereinto any foul, ill-smelling, or offensive water or other fluid, or by throwing thereinto or suffering to be washed thereinto any offensive substance, nor shall he in any other way pollute or contaminate such river, stream, canal, channel, well, tank, or open piece of water.

11. The premises of all the aforementioned trades shall be open for inspection at all reasonable hours by the Chairman of the Local Board or by any person duly authorized by the Chairman.

12. The owner or occupier of any land from which clay, earth, stone, gravel, cobble, or any other material is cut for the manufacture of bricks or tiles or for building, or for any other purpose shall be responsible for seeing that proper drainage is provided, and that the pits or trenches cut are afterwards filled, so that water cannot stagnate therein.

13. The occupier of any premises in which any dangerous or offensive trade is carried on shall be liable for the breach or non-observance of any of the foregoing by-laws.

K.—Dairies.

1. For the purpose of these by-laws a "dairy" shall mean and include any farm, farmhouse, cowshed, milkstore, milk shop, or other place from which milk is supplied or in which milk is stored or kept for the purpose of sale. "Dairyman" shall include any cow keeper, purveyor of milk, or occupier of a dairy, and in case where a dairy is owned by more than one person, the manager or other person actually managing such dairy.

2. No dairy shall be located in any compound within 100 feet of an open cesspit or surface latrine or in a position where bad odours will reach it, and no open cesspit or surface latrine shall be erected within 100 feet of any dairy.

3. Every dairy compound shall be sufficiently provided with proper drainage to the satisfaction of the Chairman, and the drains shall be kept flushed. No foul water shall be allowed to stagnate in any dairy compound.

4. All refuse and dirt in and round the dairy premises shall be removed without delay. Cowdung shall be removed daily.

5. A pure and protected supply of water must be provided at convenient distance for the use of every dairy. No bathing or washing of clothes shall take place at or near this water supply.

6. The milk cows and buffaloes shall be free from disease, and no dairyman suffering from, or who to the knowledge of any person in charge of dairy has recently suffered from any contagious or infectious disease, or has been recently in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, shall be permitted by any such person in charge of the dairy to be employed in such dairy.

7. All dairymen shall see that their cattle are washed as to udders and teats before milking, and the milker shall wash his hands thoroughly with soap and water before milking. Every precaution shall be taken to prevent contamination of milk by dung or urine.

8. No dairyman or owner of a dairy shall adulterate milk by the addition of any water or any other foreign liquid or substance thereto, nor shall he sell or offer or expose for sale milk so adulterated.

9. All utensils, furniture, and other requisites used in or belonging to a dairy shall be kept clean.

10. All vessels sent out containing milk shall be scrupulously clean, and shall be properly covered, stoppered, or corked with clean materials, and shall not be carried under the armpit, nor shall the mouths of the bottles be fingered.

11. The sheds and yards where cattle are kept shall be subject to and satisfy the requirements of by-law 3 of the Local Board regulations regarding galas.

12. Every licensee of a dairy shall have a milk room, erected in such a position and at such a distance from the cowshed as the Chairman of the Local Board shall approve, for the storing and preparation of milk, and in which all vessels, used in his trade are to be stored after cleansing. The floor shall be cemented with rounded corners at its junction with the walls, the walls shall be of plastered masonry, smooth boards, or iron work, to be limewashed or painted periodically as directed by the Chairman or the Medical Officer of Health. At least two opposite walls of the milk room shall abut on the open air. The roofs shall be ceiled with grooved boards to prevent ingress of dust. There shall be at least one window and one door. The window shall be 3 feet by 2 feet, without glass or shutters, and be fitted with fly-proof netting. The door shall be opposite the window, be close fitting and fitted with fly-proof netting, and shall be kept closed. A table with a covering of marble, slate or zinc, or other approved impermeable substance shall be placed in the milk room. This room shall be used for no other purpose than that of storing and preparing milk.

13. Every licensee of a dairy shall keep a list of his customers, which shall be open at all times for inspection by the Chairman of the Local Board, the Medical Officer of Health, the Secretary of the Local Board or Inspector of the Local Board.

14. The number of cows for which each dairy is licensed shall be stated in such licence.

15. No licensee of a dairy shall change the location of his dairy without having first obtained the permission of the Chairman, nor shall milking take place other than at the licensed premises.

16. Every licensee of a dairy shall keep a report book in his milk room, in which inspecting officers may make their report each time they visit the dairy.

17. The Chairman of the Local Board, the Medical Officer of Health, the Secretary or Inspector appointed by the Board shall at all times be empowered to take a sample of milk for analysis from any licensed dairy or from any person selling milk or exposing milk for sale within Local Board limits.

18. Every dairy situated within the limits of the Local Board town shall be registered by the Chairman, who shall issue to each applicant a card of registration bearing his name and number. These cards are to be shown on demand to any authorized Officer of the Board or to any Sanitary Inspector when required by them to do so.

19. A copy of these by-laws shall be hung in the milk room of every dairy.

20. The licensee of a dairy shall be liable for any breach or non-observance of any of the foregoing by-laws.

ORDER OF HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR UNDER
"THE ENEMY PROPERTY ORDINANCE, NO. 23
OF 1916," AS AMENDED BY ORDINANCE
NO. 5 OF 1917.

WHEREAS at Versailles, on the 28th day of June, 1919, a Treaty of Peace was signed on behalf of His Majesty.

And whereas under Article 297 (b) of the said Treaty power is reserved to the allied and associated Powers to retain and liquidate all property, rights, and interests belonging at the date of the coming into force of the said Treaty, to German Nationals within their territories, colonies, possessions, and Protectorates:

And whereas His Majesty has been pleased, under and by virtue of the powers conferred on him by the Treaty of Peace Act, 1919, to make the Treaty of Peace Order, 1919, dealing with the enforcement of certain provisions of the said Treaty in certain parts of His Dominions, including Ceylon:

And whereas by Article 1 (XVI.) of the aforesaid Order, His Majesty has been pleased to declare that such property, rights, and interests and the nett proceeds of their sale, liquidation, or other dealings therewith are thereby charged with certain liabilities therein more particularly specified:

And whereas by Article 1 (XVII.) of the said Order it was provided that with a view to making effective and enforcing such charge as aforesaid, the Board of Trade may by Order vest in the custodian such property, rights, and interests:

And whereas provision is made in the said Order in Council for the legislature of any such part of His Majesty's Dominions making the necessary modifications in the said Order in Council for adapting it to the circumstances thereof:

And whereas in pursuance of the said provision of section 3 of "The Treaty of Peace (Enforcement) Ordinance, No. 7 of 1920," the Legislature of this Colony among other things has modified the expressions "Board of Trade" and "Custodian" occurring in the aforesaid Article to mean "the Governor in Executive Council" and "The Custodian of Enemy Property" appointed under "The Enemy Firms Liquidation Ordinance, No. 20 of 1916":

And whereas the property enumerated in the schedule hereto belongs to Georgina Amy Bernhard a German National, and it appears expedient to vest the same in the said Custodian of Enemy Property:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor is pleased, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, in terms of the aforesaid Treaty of Peace and Order of His Majesty in Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said property is vested in the said Custodian of Enemy Property, and that the said Custodian is authorized to sell, manage, or otherwise deal with the same and hold the proceeds thereof until further instructions are duly issued to him.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended December 20, 1930.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 208 (2 Europeans, 14 Burghers, 117 Sinhalese, 23 Tamils, 37 Moors, 11 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1930, viz., 270,700) was 40.0, as against 38.5 in the preceding week, 35.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 153 (7 Burghers, 94 Sinhalese, 18 Tamils, 27 Moors, 5 Malays, and 2 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 29.5, as against 31.8 in the previous week, 36.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.9 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 153 total deaths, 35 were of infants under one year of age, as against 43 in the preceding week, 36 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 12.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Thirteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 6 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Kotahena North, 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, Maradana North, and Maradana East, as against 18 in the previous week and 22 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Ten deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in Kotahena South, 2 in Kotahena North, and 1 each in Pettah, New Bazaar, Maradana North, Slave Island, and Wellawatta North, as against 7 in the previous week and 9 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in Kotahena South, Slave Island, Maradana hospitals (of a non-resident), as against 4 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Seventeen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in San Sebastian, New Bazaar, and Maradana North, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, Slave Island, and Wellawatta South, as against 18 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Three deaths from *Phthisis*, of residents of Colombo town, occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Two deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 1 each in New Bazaar and in Maradana hospitals, as against 1 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. (a) Three deaths from *Plague* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (of residents) and 1 in Pettah, as against nil in the previous week.

(b) One death from *Plague* of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.

5. Twelve deaths from *Debility* were registered, 10 from *Enteritis*, 3 each from *Dysentery* and *Worms*, 2 each from *Tetanus* and *Puerperal Septicæmia*, and 1 each from *Diphtheria* and *Infantile Convulsions*, and 1 from *Other Causes*.

6. **Reported Cases.**—Seven cases of *Cholera*, 6 of *Enteric Fever*, 3 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 7, 5, and nil, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79.0°, against 80.0° in the preceding week and 76.4° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.964 in., against 29.955 in. in the preceding week and 29.898 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was nil, against nil in the preceding week and 0.01 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

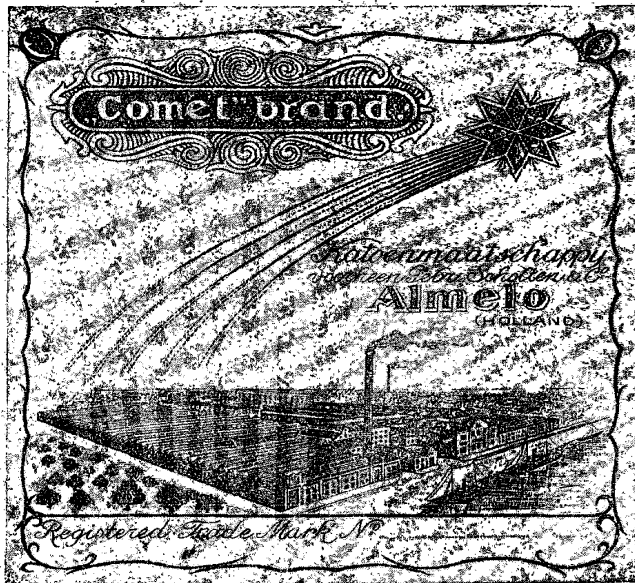

MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, November 15, 1930, at 9 a.m., pursuant to notice dated November 8, 1930.

Present:—Mr. M. M. Wedderburn, Chairman; the Hon. Mr. H. M. Macan Markar, M.L.C.; the Hon. Mr. C. E. de Vos, M.L.C.; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. D. I. Durham; Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe; Mr. F. W. Sproule; Mr. T. Amarasuriya; Dr. S. P. Joseph; and Mr. P. R. Gunasekara.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of October 11, 1930, a copy thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. T. Amarasuriya asked the following questions:—(1) What steps are now being taken to detect adulteration in milk sold within Municipal limits? (2) What steps are being taken to prevent unlicensed vendors hawking milk for sale in the town? (3) Have any prosecutions been entered for sale of adulterated milk since July 1, 1930.

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) Reference was made by the Medical Officer of Health in his diary of August 12 to 18, to the analysis of milk sold in the town. I have been in correspondence with the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services on the subject, and arrangements have now been made for samples to be forwarded for analysis by Messrs. Bamber and Bruce. (2) Vendors of milk are being compelled to have in their possession the card which is issued, under the by-laws, to registered dairymen. Any vendor who is unable to produce the card on demand is liable to arrest and prosecution. The Medical Officer of Health has often stopped vendors and demanded their cards, and on every occasion they have been produced. (3) No; because the by-laws lay down the procedure for taking samples of milk, and for the analysis of such samples by a qualified Analyst. Until arrangements had been made for analyses by a qualified Analyst no prosecutions could be entered.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. E. Perera asked:—How many houses have been advertised for sale for non payment of taxes? How many last year at the corresponding time?

The Chairman replied:—Sales for non-payment of rates of 2nd and 3rd quarters, 1929, were held together. 3,013 properties were advertised but only 10 were actually sold—the mesne profits from 1 to 10 years in the case of 8 premises, and the materials of two untenanted and ruinous houses. Rates on the others were paid before the date of sale. For the 2nd quarter, 1930, 2,014 premises have been advertised, and the sales are proceeding. Up to the 13th instant, 459 premises have been advertised. In 4 cases the mesne profits for one year have been sold, in one case the premises were bought in on behalf of the Council and have been redeemed, in 2 cases premises consisting of minute partition shares of the same land, the owners of which are not to be found, were sold outright, and in all other cases the rates have been paid.

4. The following motion stood in the name of Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe:—“That the tarring of the section of the Richmond Hill road beyond the house known as “The Bower” which was occupied up till recently by Dr. A. H. de Silva, and in several other roads, is unsatisfactory, and steps be taken to prevent such unsatisfactory work.”

Mr. Wickremasinghe asked the leave of Council to withdraw the motion. The leave of Council having been given, the motion was withdrawn.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. T. Amarasuriya moved:—“That the Medical Officer of Health takes early steps to prosecute vendors of adulterated milk, and unlicensed vendors of milk. Mr. P. R. Gunasekara seconded.”

The Chairman stated that the Medical Officer of Health has taken an interest in the matter, and reported several times. As he has stated in his reply to the question asked by the member, arrangements have now been made for the analysis of milk by a qualified Analyst in Colombo; but the by-law needs amendment. A prosecution under a similar by-law by the Sanitary Board of the Kandy District had been dismissed in appeal. He stated that that motion might be accepted, and undertook to refer the question to the Sanitation Committee with a view to the amendment of the by-law. The motion was put to the meeting and carried unanimously.

6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. P. R. Gunasekara moved—"That the Government be requested to send a copy of the Draft Ordinance on Municipal Reforms before its first reading to enable this Council to express their views." Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe seconded.

The Chairman stated that the proposed Ordinance is to apply to the Colombo Municipal Council only; but the Governor in Executive Council may, if he think fit to do so, direct that it shall apply, with modifications, to any other Municipal Council. He advised the Council to wait until the Ordinance had been in operation in Colombo for a few years before taking steps to apply it to Galle. He said the motion might be accepted; and that copies of the final draft would be circulated to the members in due course. The motion was put to the meeting, and carried unanimously.

7. Pursuant to notice, Mr. T. Amarasuriya moved—"That owing to the present depression the sale of properties for non-payment of taxes be enforced only in exceptional cases, the Chairman using his discretion in such cases." The Hon. Mr. C. E. de Vos seconded.

Messrs. J. E. Perera, C. L. Wickramasinghe, and P. R. Gunasekara spoke to the motion.

The Chairman explained the procedure and pointed out that at present the outright sale of properties is very exceptional. He said the motion might be accepted, but that he intended to report all such cases to the Council. The motion was put to the meeting and carried.

8. Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. E. Perera moved—(1) That an additional month's grace be given to ratepayers to pay their taxes from the time they fell due, in addition to the month allowed at present. The Hon. Mr. Macan Markar said he would second the motion if the mover would agree to the addition of the words "as a temporary measure" after the first word "That" the mover accepted the amendment. Mr. P. R. Gunasekara supported the motion.

The Chairman said he did not think it would be a concession to the owners to allow them an extra month in which to pay the rates.

Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe agreed with the Chairman. He moved that the motion be amended by the addition of the words "provided the owners make application within the month of grace." The amendment was not seconded.

The Hon. Mr. C. E. de Vos opposed the motion, and the mover replied. The motion was put to the meeting, and lost by 4 votes to 6.

(2) That the sum of Rs. 7,000 budgetted as income from meters in the Electricity Department be waived for the year 1931. Mr. T. Amarasuriya seconded and Mr. P. R. Gunasekara supported the motion. The Chairman, the Hon. Mr. Macan Markar, the Hon. Mr. de Vos, Mr. D. I. Durham, and Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe spoke against the motion, and the mover replied. The motion was put to the meeting, and lost by 3 votes to 7.

9. To nominate two members to the Education District Committee for the Galle Municipal area for three years from January 1, 1931:—

The Chairman moved that Mr. P. R. Gunasekara be nominated. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

Mr. J. E. Perera moved that Mr. A. M. Saheed be nominated subject to his willingness to serve. Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe seconded.—Carried.

10. To consider the proposed amendment to section 121 (2) of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910:—Resolved that Council is in favour of the proposed amendment.

11. Papers *re* water supply to the Railway.—Resolved that the rate of 50 cents per 1,000 gallons fixed by the Chairman for water consumed in excess of 40,000 gallons per diem, be approved.

12. Compensation payable for setting back premises No. 36 to 69 bazaar to the street line, as and when they are rebuilt:—

The Chairman said that the questions to be considered were—(1) Whether Council is prepared to adopt the proposal to set back the buildings to the street line, as and when they are rebuilt, and whether Council considers the amount of compensation—reckoned at 20 times the annual value—as reasonable. (2) Whether Council approves of the payment of compensation for all the premises.

He moved that the papers be circulated, and brought up at a subsequent meeting. Mr. P. R. Gunasekara seconded.—Carried.

13. To consider the question of leave to turncock, M. W. Sirisena who met with an accident arising out of his employment.—Resolved that he be granted leave on half-pay for another month.

14. To submit the Budget for the Financial Year 1931.—Submitted.

15. With the leave of Council the Chairman brought up the following items:—(a) An estimate of Rs. 400 for building a garage for the new motor lorry.—Approved. (b) Letter from Mr. E. M. Karunaratna asking permission to enclose the cricket ground on December 8 and 9, and for the exclusive use of the pavilion, for the cricket match against the team brought by the Maharaj Kumar of Vizianagram.—Resolved that permission be granted on payment of Rs. 10 a day for the enclosure.

16. Petition from the residents of Ward No. 5 for a recreation ground.—Tabled.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Municipal Works and Finance and Assessment of November 1, 1930, were laid before the Council.

17. *Extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of November 1, 1930.*

(3) To consider the following estimates:—(a) Rs. 200 for re-platforming the Ath-oya bridge.—Recommended. (b) Rs. 1,200 for building a drain along Front Cross street.—Recommended that the work be carried out in 1931, provided plans and levels are approved by the Provincial Engineer. (c) Rs. 450 for laying water along parts of Hall Cross road and providing two stand pipes.—Recommended. (d) Rs. 350 for making two scavenging carts, each to be drawn by a pair of bulls.—Recommended.

(4) To consider 29 applications for water service.—Recommended that the applications be sanctioned, with the exception of the services at No. 43, Pettigalawatta and No. 111, Hirimbura road.

(5) To consider a letter from the General Manager, Ceylon Government Railway, requesting that the halting of motor buses be not permitted opposite to the Galle Railway Station.—Resolved that it is not necessary to prohibit the halting of motor buses opposite the Galle Railway Station.

(6) To consider a statement of the cost of consolidating metal on Elliott road with a steam roller.—Resolved that the statement be circulated.

(7) To consider the charge to be made for water service connections.—Recommended that the actual cost of labour and materials plus 20 per cent. for departmental charges, be charged in future.

(8) Extension of time for completing the drain along Wakwella road.—Recommended that the time be extended up to December 15.

Resolution.

With regard to item (6).—Resolved that as a rule a steam roller be used for road consolidation.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

18. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of November 1, 1930.*

(2) To consider Audit query No. 43 of October 13, 1930.—Recommended that the minimum charge for electric lights for the months of June and July, 1930, be waived as the house No. 6, Parawa street, was unoccupied during those months.

(3) To consider an application from the stall holders of the fruit market for electric lights on a flat rate.—Recommended, on the conditions suggested by the Secretary.

(4) To strike off the assessment rates of No. 260, Kumbalwella (Ward 2) from 3rd quarter, 1930, as the house is uninhabitable.—Recommended.

(5) To consider an application from conservancy cooly P. K. Udaris for a gratuity on his retirement from service.—Recommended that a gratuity of Rs. 211.77 calculated on his service of 299 months, be granted.

- (6) To consider the following estimates:—(a) Rs. 343 for lighting fish market street.—Recommended. (b) Rs. 475 for copper wire for strengthening the yellow phase wire from Kaluwella Junction to Richmond College.—Recommended.
 (7) Supplemental vote of Rs. 1,500 for improving Hirimbura Cross road.—Recommended.
 (8) Rates for 2nd quarter, 1930.—Recommended that the sales for non-payment of rates for the 2nd quarter, 1930, be not stayed.

Resolution.

With regard to item (3).—Resolved that the application be allowed if not less than 60 per cent. of the stall holders take electric lights.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

19. At the conclusion of the business for the day the Hon. Mr. C. E. de Vos, referring to the Chairman's approaching departure from Galle, expressed on behalf of the Council their appreciation of his valuable services, and their gratitude for the cordial relations which have always existed between the Chairman and the Council. He moved that they place on record their appreciation and thanks for the excellent work the Chairman has done for the Council, and while congratulating him on his well-deserved promotion they express regret at losing his valuable services. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded, and the Hon. Mr. Macan Markar supported the motion and congratulated the Chairman on his promotion. The motion was carried unanimously.

The Chairman replied, and thanked the Council for the expression of appreciation of his services, and for their friendship and co-operation, and asked that it may be extended to his successor.
