INDIAN CIVIL SERVICE.

Open Competition of 1931.

An Open Competitive Examination for admission to the Indian Civil Service will be held in London in 1931. The *vivâ voce* test will take place in July, the written examination in Section B subjects will begin on the 25th July, and that in Section A subjects on the 1st August.

The number of persons to be selected at this examination will be announced hereafter.

No person will be admitted to compete from whom the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, has not received, on or before the 8th May, 1931, an application on the prescribed form, a copy of which is sent herewith. No allegation that an Application Form or a letter respecting such Form has been lost or delayed in the post will be considered by the Commissioners unless the person making such allegation produces a Post Office Certificate of Posting. Candidates who delay their applications until the last days will do so at their own risk.

Acknowledgments of such Application Forms are sent, and any candidate who has filled up and returned the printed Application Form but has not received an acknowledgment of it within four complete days should at once write to the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, Burlington Gardens, London, W. 1. Failure to comply with this provision will deprive the candidate of any claim to consideration.

*The Time Table of the written part of the examination will probably be posted towards the end of June to the address given on the Form of Application, and will contain instructions as to the time and place at which candidates are to attend. Candidates will be notified at the same time of the date and place fixed for their *vivâ voce* test and of the manner in which the fee (£8) is to be paid.*

NOTE.

If Open Competitive Examinations for the following services, *viz.* :—

Eastern Cadetships in the Colonial Service ;

Junior Grade of the Administrative Class in the Home Civil Service ;

should be held in 1931 concurrently with the Open Competitive Examination for the Indian Civil Service, candidates duly eligible in respect of age, &c., will be admitted to compete for any two or all three of these Services, subject to the following conditions :—

(1) Every successful candidate who may have been admitted to compete for either the Indian or the Colonial Service (or both), as well as for the Home Service, will be called upon to declare, immediately after the announcement of the result of the competitions, whether he prefers his name to remain on the list of candidates for the Indian or Colonial Service or on the list of candidates for the Home Service.

The name of any candidate who fails to declare his choice when called upon to do so will be removed from the list of candidates for the Home Service.

(2) Every successful candidate who may have been admitted to compete for both the Indian and Colonial Services will be called upon to declare, immediately after the announcement of the result of the competitions, whether he prefers his name to remain on the list of candidates for the Indian Service or on the list of candidates for the Colonial Service.

The name of any candidate who fails to declare his choice when called upon to do so will be removed from the list of candidates for the Colonial Service.

(3) All declarations of choice are irrevocable.

(4) Candidates for all three or any two of the above-mentioned services will be required to pay a consolidated fee of £8.

EXAMINATIONS FOR THE INDIAN CIVIL SERVICE.

Regulations for admission to the Indian Civil Service.

October, 1930.

* * * *The following Regulations, made by the Secretary of State for India in Council, are liable to alteration from year to year.*

1. An Examination for admission to the Indian Civil Service, open to all qualified persons, will be held in London in July and August of each year for such number of appointments to that Service as the Secretary of State may on each occasion determine. The date of the Examination will be announced beforehand by the Civil Service Commissioners.

2. A Candidate must be a male and either :—

(a) a British subject whose father (if alive) is a British subject or a subject of a State in India, or (if dead) was at the time of his death either a British subject or a subject of a State in India or a person in the permanent service of the Crown or a person who had retired from that service ; or

(b) a ruler or a subject of a State in India in respect of whom the Governor General in Council has made a declaration under Section 96A of the Government of India Act.

Provided that in the case of a male British subject the requirements of this rule may be waived by the Secretary of State in Council if he is satisfied that their observance would occasion exceptional hardship and the Candidate is so closely connected by ancestry or upbringing with His Majesty's dominions as to justify special treatment.

3. A Candidate must have attained the age of twenty-one, and must not have attained the age of twenty-four on the first day of August of the year in which the Examination is held.

4. A Candidate who is a Native of India must obtain a certificate of age and qualification under Regulations 2 and 3 issued under Notification of the Government of India, No. 1114, dated 12th September, 1918,* and signed, should he be a resident in British India, by the Secretary to Government of the Province, or the Commissioner of the Division within which his family resides, or, should he reside in a Native State, by the highest Political Officer accredited to the State in which his family resides.

5. A Candidate must be free from disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity, unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Indian Civil Service.†

6. A Candidate shall satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that his character is such as to qualify him for employment in the Indian Civil Service.

7. No person who, in a previous year, accepted the offer of a nomination as a Selected Candidate for the Indian Civil Service and subsequently resigned his position as a Selected Candidate, will be admitted to the Examination.

* This Notification is at present under revision in consequence of the recent amendment of Clause 2 of these regulations.

† The Civil Service Commissioners will regard no person as constitutionally fitted for appointment to the Indian Civil Service who has not been satisfactorily vaccinated within the last seven years.

8. Should the evidence upon the above points be *prima facie* satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners, the Candidate, on payment of the prescribed fee, will be admitted to the Examination. The Commissioners may, however, in their discretion, at any time prior to the grant of the Certificate of Qualification institute such further inquiries as they may deem necessary; and if the result of such inquiries in the case of any Candidate should be unsatisfactory to them in any of the above respects he will be ineligible for admission to the Indian Civil Service, and, if already selected, will be removed from the position of a Probationer.

9. The examination will include the following subjects.* The numerical value is shown against each subject.

SECTION B.—OPTIONAL SUBJECTS.

Candidates are allowed to take up subjects in this section up to a total of 1,000 marks, but candidates taking one modern foreign language in Section B may take, in lieu of the auxiliary language in Section C, a further subject in Section B carrying 100 marks, and candidates taking two or more modern languages in Section B may take, in lieu of both auxiliary languages (Sections A and C), a further subject or subjects in Section B to a total of 200 marks.

SECTION C.

Subject to the instructions at the head of Section B of this rule an extra numerum subject may be offered carrying 100 marks, and chosen from the following:—

General Anthropology. | Special Anthropology. | An auxiliary language.

10. The auxiliary language in Section A or Section C will be tested by means of translation from the language. The following languages may be offered:—French, German, Italian, Spanish, Portuguese, Dutch, Norwegian, Swedish, Danish, Russian, Latin, Ancient Greek.

No candidate may offer any language or General Anthropology or Special Anthropology twice in the examination.

No candidate may offer in Sections A and C together two languages of the group Italian, Spanish, Portuguese, or two of the group Norwegian, Swedish, Danish.

Only a candidate who takes two modern languages in Section B may offer Latin or Ancient Greek as an auxiliary language.

Instead of an auxiliary language a candidate whose mother tongue is and Indian language may offer as subject 5 either General Anthropology or Special Anthropology.

11. In subjects 50 to 67 the civilization subject associated with a language can only be taken by candidates who offer the language itself for examination.†

12. A candidate desiring to offer subject 24 or any of the subjects 31 to 43 must produce evidence satisfactory to the Commissioners of laboratory training in an institution of university rank. For Astronomy (29), Geography (44), the Physical Anthropology branch of Special Anthropology (46), and Agriculture (47), other equivalent training will be required. There will be no laboratory test as a part of the examination.

13. From the marks assigned to candidates in each subject such deduction will be made as the Civil Service Commissioners may deem necessary in order to secure that no credit be allowed for merely superficial knowledge.

* A syllabus, defining in general terms the character of the examination in the various subjects, is sent herewith.

† E.g., a Candidate desiring to offer subject to No. 51 (Roman Civilization), must also offer subject No. 50 (Latin Language).

14. Moreover, if a candidate's handwriting is not easily legible, a further deduction will, on that account, be made from the total marks otherwise accruing to him.*

15. A list of the competitors shall be made out in order of their proficiency as disclosed by the aggregate marks finally awarded to each competitor, and in that order so many competitors, up to the determined number of appointments, as are found by the Civil Service Commissioners to be qualified by examination, shall be designated to be Selected Candidates for the Indian Civil Service, provided that they appear to be duly qualified in other respects.

Should any Selected Candidate become disqualified, the Secretary of State for India will determine whether the vacancy thus created shall be filled or not. In the former case the Candidate next in order of merit, and in other respects duly qualified, shall be deemed to be a Selected Candidate.

16. Application for permission to attend an examination must be made in the handwriting of the candidate, at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

Procedure.

Immediately the results of the examination are known, all successful candidates will be summoned to attend at the Civil Service Commission to be medically examined and to state their choice among the services open to them and among the various Departments, Provinces, or Colonies. That statement of choice is irrevocable.

Evidence of Age.

A candidate born in the United Kingdom must not send in a birth certificate with this form, but must be prepared to produce it when required.

A European or Anglo-Indian who was born in India must be prepared to produce when required a certificate of baptism from the district in which he was baptized. If this does not also mention the date of birth it must be accompanied by a statutory declaration by one of the candidate's parents, stating the date and place of birth.

An Indian born in India must send in with this form a certificate as required by Clause 4 of the regulations for the Indian Civil Service. If the candidate's family is resident in British India the certificate must be signed by the Secretary to the Government of their province or by the Commissioner of their division. If they reside in an Indian State it must be signed by the highest political officer accredited to that State.

Fee.

Fees are *not* to be forwarded by candidates. Instructions respecting the manner of payment of the fee prescribed (£8), and respecting the time and place of the examination, will be sent to candidates before the examination.

EXAMINATIONS OF SELECTED CANDIDATES FOR THE INDIAN CIVIL SERVICE.**Regulations made under Section 97 of the Government of India Act for the Probation in the United Kingdom and the further Examination of Selected Candidates for the Indian Civil Service.**

* * The following regulations made by the Secretary of State for India in Council are liable to alteration from year to year.

(1) Candidates selected at the Open Competition held in London will be required to remain in the United Kingdom on probation for one or two years, as may be decided by the Secretary of State for India in Council.

(2) Candidates selected at the Open Competition held in India and candidates selected in India otherwise than by competitive examination will be required to proceed to the United Kingdom on probation for a period of two years. But in the case of a candidate who has taken part in the Open Competition held in London, and has been selected in India otherwise than by Open Competition, the Secretary of State in Council may direct that the period of probation shall be one year only.

One-Year Probationers.

(3) One-year probationers will, at or about the end of the year of probation, undergo an examination called the Final Examination. The subjects and the marks allotted to them are as follows:—

(7) Sub-section 1. Each candidate will offer for examination the vernacular shown in column 2 against his province in the following table unless he is already familiar with it or with a language closely allied to it. Sub-section 2. A candidate who is not required by sub-section (1) to offer a vernacular named in column 2 will offer the vernacular named in column 3 against his province if any such vernacular is named unless he is already familiar with the vernacular there named or with a closely allied one.

Sub-section 3. A candidate who is not required under the preceding sub-sections to offer a vernacular will offer history instead. A one-year probationer will offer British history; a two-year probationer will offer British history for the intermediate examination and European history for the final examination.

Any question as to the interpretation and application of this regulation will be decided by the Civil Service Commissioners.

(8) The ordinary session of the Final Examination for the testing of riding will take place in advance of the rest of the Final Examination, and a special session will when necessary be held at a later date for the benefit of any candidate who may have failed at the ordinary session.

Candidates who at the ordinary session satisfy the Commissioners that they are sufficiently at home in the saddle for the efficient performance of all duties required of members of the Indian Civil Service will be awarded marks ranging between 101 and 200 according to the degree of proficiency displayed.

Candidates who at the ordinary session fall short of this adequate proficiency but show such minimum proficiency as is evidence that with a moderate amount of practice they can attain full proficiency, will receive marks ranging between 1 and 100; they will be allowed to proceed to India and will on their arrival there be subjected to such further tests in riding as may be prescribed by their Local Government.*

If a candidate is absent from or fails to show minimum proficiency at the ordinary session he will be given a further opportunity of examination at a special session. If he then attains adequate proficiency he will not be subjected to further tests in India. If he attains minimum proficiency he will be allowed to proceed to India under the same condition as if he had attained minimum proficiency at the ordinary session. No credit in marks will be given for any performance at a special session.

Probationers may also be examined in riding at such time or times as the Commissioners may appoint during the course of the probationary period.

(9) Such deductions as the Civil Service Commissioners may consider necessary will be made from the marks assigned to candidates at the Intermediate and Final Examinations in order to secure that no credit is allowed for merely superficial knowledge.

(10) The Civil Service Commissioners will prepare lists of the candidates in order of merit; the order for the one-year probationers being based on the sum of the marks obtained by the candidates at the Open Competitive and Final Examinations, the order for the two-year probationers being based on the sum of the marks obtained by the candidates at the Intermediate and Final Examinations.

(11) The selected candidates whose performance in the compulsory subjects† of the Final Examination is such as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners, and who have also satisfied the Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of nationality, age, health, character, and conduct during the period of probation, shall be certified by the Commissioners to be entitled to be appointed to the Indian Civil Service, provided that they shall comply with the regulations in force, at the time, for that Service.

(12) If any candidate is prevented by sickness or any other adequate cause from attending the Final Examination, the Commissioners may, with the concurrence of the Secretary of State for India in Council, allow him to appear at the Final Examination to be held in the following year, or at a special examination. A selected candidate absent for such adequate cause from the Intermediate Examination may, under similar conditions, be allowed to appear at the Intermediate Examination a year later or at a special examination, or may be excused the Intermediate Examination and allowed to appear for the Final Examination in regular course.

Any candidate who at the Intermediate Examination shall appear to have wilfully neglected his studies, or to be physically incapacitated for pursuing the prescribed course of training, will be liable to have his name removed from the list of selected candidates.

(13) A selected candidate who wishes to pursue, in addition to the course prescribed above, an extra course of study, such as reading for a degree or for the examination for admission to the Bar, must first obtain the permission of the High Commissioner for India. If permission is accorded, it will be subject to review at any time.

Announcements made by the Civil Service Commissioners with the authority of the Secretary of State for India in Council:—

(i.) Selected candidates will be allotted to the various provinces upon a consideration of all the circumstances, including their own wishes; but the requirements of the Public Service will rank before every other consideration.

(ii.) A selected candidate who wishes to pursue an extra course of study, in addition to the prescribed probationary course, must submit an application, stating precisely the extra course of study which it is desired to pursue, to the Secretary to the High Commissioner for India, Education Department, India House, Aldwych, London, W.C. 2, through the appropriate authority at the University or College at which he is pursuing his probationary course. The appropriate authorities are:—

Oxford	The Indian Civil Service Delegacy.
Cambridge	The Board of Indian Civil Service Studies.
London	The Director of the School of Oriental Studies.
Trinity College, Dublin	The Registrar of the Indian and Home Civil Service School.

(iii.) An allowance of £300 a year, or, in the case of Selected Candidates possessing an Indian domicile, an allowance of £350 a year will be given to any candidate who passes his probation at one of the Universities or other Institutions that have been approved for the purpose by the Secretary of State for India in Council.

In the case of Selected Candidates on probation for one year, the allowance will be payable in five equal instalments, the first after the agreement prescribed in Announcement (iv.) has been executed, the second, third, and fourth on December 24^h, March 25^h, and June 25^h, respectively, and the fifth after signature of Covenant on appointment to the Service.

* Such candidates will receive no increase to their initial pay until they have passed the further tests in question to the satisfaction of their Local Government.

† The compulsory subjects include riding, and a candidate who fails at the end of the period of probation to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that he has reached the minimum standard of proficiency in riding will be liable to have his name removed from the list of selected candidates.

In the case of Selected Candidates on probation for two years, the allowance will be payable in nine approximately equal instalments, the first on September 29th or as soon thereafter as the agreement has been executed, the second on December 24th, the third to the eighth at quarterly intervals from that date, and the ninth after signature of Covenant on appointment to the Service.

Each selected candidate should intimate to the Secretary to the High Commissioner for India, Education Department, the address to which it is desired that the first instalment should be sent.

The payment of the various instalments of the allowance except the first instalment and the final instalment, and, in the case of the two-year probationers, the instalment payable at the end of the first year of probation, will be conditional on the receipt by the High Commissioner for India, through the authorities of the approved institution, of a certificate that the candidate had fulfilled up to date the requirements of the authorities and shown satisfactory progress.

If an Indian Government Scholar becomes a selected candidate for the Indian Civil Service, his scholarship stipend shall cease to be paid with effect from the 1st October of the year in which he becomes a selected candidate.

The whole probation must ordinarily be passed at the same Institution. Migration will not be permitted except for special reasons approved by the Secretary of State.

N.B.—The Secretary of State for India gives notice that the amount of the allowances will be reconsidered in 1931, with a view to a possible reduction with effect from the first instalment payable to candidates selected in that year.

(iv.) Each Candidate will be required before receiving the first instalment of his allowance to execute an agreement binding himself and one surety jointly and severally to refund all moneys he may have received from the Secretary of State for India in the event of:—

- (1) his failure to pass the Final Examination within the time prescribed by the Regulations, and to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners of his fitness for admission to the Indian Civil Service, or
- (2) his subsequent failure to execute the usual covenant, and to proceed to India, as and when he shall be directed by the Secretary of State for India.

(v.) All candidates obtaining Certificates will be also required to enter into covenants, by which, amongst other things, they will bind themselves to make such payments as under the rules and regulations for the time being in force they may be required to make for the pensions of their families. The stamps payable on these covenants amount to £1.

(vi.) A First Class passage to India will be engaged for Selected Candidates with a view to their proceeding to India after they have signed their covenants. If a selected candidate elects to travel overland from London to Marseilles, he may apply to the High Commissioner for India for payment of the overland allowance as fixed from time to time. No baggage expenses or other allowance will be admissible.

Selected candidates who desire to make their own arrangements for proceeding to India must first satisfy the High Commissioner for India that they have good reasons for wishing to do so and that the arrangements which they propose to make are suitable. They will then, on production to the High Commissioner for India of evidence that they have engaged a passage, be granted an allowance not exceeding £65* or the actual cost of the passage by the route selected, whichever is less.

(vii.) Candidates appointed to the Indian Civil Service after undergoing one year's probation will be senior to those appointed in the same year after undergoing two years' probation. The seniority of candidates of each class *inter se* will be determined by the order in which their names appear on the lists referred to in clause (10) of the regulations.

(viii.) A candidate who fails to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners at the Final Examination held in any year will be definitely rejected unless the Secretary of State in Council shall, after reference to the Civil Service Commissioners, allow him to sit for re-examination in the subject or subjects in which he failed. In general a candidate who is allowed re-examination will be required to forfeit the whole or part of the final instalment of his allowance, but if it appears to the Secretary of State in Council, after reference to the Civil Service Commissioners, that his failure to pass the examination was due to circumstances wholly exceptional and beyond his control, such forfeit of his allowance will not be required.

(ix.) "Overseas pay" will not be admissible to Indian members of the Indian Civil Service selected at Open Competitive Examinations held in London in 1925 and subsequent years.

ADMINISTRATIVE GROUP OF COMPETITIONS.

Syllabus for such competitions as may be held in London in the year 1931 for appointment to the following services:—

- Indian Civil Service.
- Junior Grade of the Administrative Class in the Home Civil Service.
- Colonial Service : Eastern Cadetships.
- Foreign Office and Diplomatic Service.
- Consular Services (General, Levant, and Far East) and Intelligence Officer Grade in the Department of Overseas Trade.

Evidence of Training.—Candidates who desire to offer any of the subjects 24, 29, 31-44, 46 (Physical Anthropology branch only), or 47 must send to the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission, so as to arrive not later than 15th May, 1931, the evidence of training described on pages 37 and 38. Such evidence should be in the form of a certificate signed by a responsible officer of the institution. In the case of an institution not situated in the British Isles, the certificate must state that the institution in which the work has been done is authorized to prepare candidates in that subject for a degree.

SECTION A.

1. *Essay.*—An essay to be written on one of several specified subjects.
2. *English.*—A paper of questions to test the understanding of English and the workmanlike use of words. An optional exercise in the writing of verse will be included.
3. *Present Day.*—Questions on contemporary subjects, social, economic, and political. A liberal choice of questions will be given. Effective and skilful exposition will be expected.
4. *Everyday Science.*—In this subject such knowledge will be expected as candidates will have who have studied science intelligently at school and have since then kept their eyes open. A liberal choice of questions will be given. Attention should be paid to orderly, effective, and exact expression.
5. *Auxiliary Language.*—Passages dealing with history and politics may be set, but no technical matter. Verse is not excluded. Accuracy and skill in the use of English will be expected.
6. *Viva Voce.*—The examination will be in matters of general interest, not in matters of academic interest; it is intended to test the candidate's alertness, intelligence, and intellectual outlook. The candidate will be afforded an opportunity of furnishing the record of his life and education. On the interview and record the Commissioners judge the value of the candidate's personality for each service for which he is entered. His value may differ for different services, and in that case the mark by which the Commissioners express their decision will differ for different services.

* This sum is liable to variation from time to time.

SECTION B.

HISTORY: Subjects 7-10.—A history subject will deal with the life of the people as a whole, political, social, literary, artistic, scientific, economic.

Candidates should know something of the original authorities, and have such a knowledge of geography as is necessary to the proper understanding of the history.

When a fixed date is given for the end of a period, candidates will be expected to have some knowledge of the subsequent development of movements which continued beyond the period; similarly when a fixed date is given for the beginning of a period, they will be expected to know in general outline how the initial position was reached.

7, 8. *English History.*—Period 1, to 1660; Period 2, 1660 to the present day. Candidates will be expected to know so much of European History as will make the external action of this country fully intelligible and will explain those movements at home which had their beginnings abroad, e.g., the Renaissance, the Reformation, and the reactions in this country of the French Revolution. In subject 8 the outstanding incidents and movements in the history of British possessions will be included.

9, 10. *European History.*—Period 1, from 400 to 1494; Period 2, from 1494 to 1763; Period 3, from 1763 to the present day. The history of the United States of America, of India, and of the Far East will be included in so far as it influences European fortunes to an important degree.

11. *General Economics.*—The subject will be treated as a whole, and candidates should be prepared to illustrate the theory by the facts and to analyse the facts by the help of the theory. The history of economic thought will be included.

12. *Economic History.*—Candidates will be expected to have a general acquaintance with the early economic history of England; but special attention will be paid to the economic development of the British Isles and other portions of the Empire during the last two or three centuries, and so much knowledge of European and American conditions will be expected as is necessary for the understanding of British economic history.

13. *Public Economics.*—The questions will deal with the main forms of state action, central and local, in the economic sphere, together with public finance.

14. *Political Theory.*—Candidates will be expected to show a knowledge of political theory and its history, political theory being understood to mean not only the theory of legislation, but also the general history of the State and its connection with kindred studies such as Ethics, Psychology, Jurisprudence, Public International Law, and Economics. Candidates will be expected to show a knowledge of original authorities.

15. *Political Organization.*—This will include Constitutional Forms (Representative Government, Federalism, &c.) and Public Administration, central and local. The history of institutions is not included, but candidates will be expected to know the earlier stages from which existing institutions have directly developed.

16. *Constitutional Law.*—The Constitutional Law of the United Kingdom and of the British Empire, and the Law of English Local Government.

17. *Private Law.*—The following branches of English Private Law:—The Law of Real and Personal Property (including the Law of Succession), Contracts, and Torts.

18. *Roman Law.*—Roman Private Law and its history studied in connexion with the Institutes of Gaius and Justinian, including the history of the legislative and judicial processes. Passages will be set for translation and comment, but credit will not be given merely for capacity to translate the texts.

19. *International Law.*—Public International Law.

20. *Moral Philosophy.*—The history of the subject will be included. Candidates will have an opportunity of showing their strength either in Ancient Philosophy or in Modern Philosophy.

21. *Metaphysics.*—As for Moral Philosophy.

22. *Logic.*—The subject will be interpreted in a wide sense. Epistemology in its bearing on logical problems will be included, together with Formal Logic and Scientific Method. Questions may be set on Mathematical Logic, i.e., on the Logic of Mathematics, Symbolic Logic, and the Logic of Probability, and also on the history of Logic. A considerable choice of questions will be allowed.

23. *Psychology.*—Questions on the history of the subject may be included.

24. *Experimental Psychology.*—A candidate who desires to offer this subject must produce evidence satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners of laboratory training in an institution of university rank.

MATHEMATICS: Subjects 25-28.—The use of the slide-rule and of mathematical tables will be allowed.

25. *Lower Pure Mathematics.*—Geometry of two and of three dimensions according to Euclid (synthetic geometry) to Descartes (analytical geometry), and to Monge (descriptive geometry, dealing with three-dimensional figures by the use of plan and elevation). The method of vectors including scalar and vector products, with applications. Only the main properties of conics and quadrics, including those of poles, polars and polar planes, are expected.

Algebra: Complex numbers; uniformly converging infinite series; the elements of the theory of equations, including the numerical solution of algebraic equations, but not including the formal solution of the cubic and quartic.

Infinitesimal calculus of real variables to partial differentiation and multiple integrals, with applications to geometry. Candidates should be able to deal with the types of differential equations occurring in elementary mechanics.

The proof of Taylor's series will not be required.

No great skill will be expected in solving complicated problems of an elementary nature. The questions will involve the use of mathematical instruments.

26. *Higher Pure Mathematics.*—Lower Pure Mathematics together with—

The geometry of curves and surfaces. Tensor calculus.

Elementary analysis, including simple functions of a complex variable and contour integration.

Differential equations in one independent variable. Elementary treatment of partial differential equations, with special reference to the differential equations of mathematical physics. Existence theorems are excluded.

Mathematical theory of probability, including theory of errors, method of least squares, curve fitting, and correlation.

Calculus of finite differences, including numerical integration and summation and linear difference equations.

A considerable choice of questions will be allowed, so that full marks may be obtained by covering about half the range stated.

27. *Lower Applied Mathematics.*—Statics, hydrostatics, dynamics, elementary theory of electricity and magnetism, including the induction of currents. Questions will be of an elementary character, but will not be confined to two dimensions; they will involve the use of the calculus. Candidates are free to use differential equations, but a knowledge thereof will not be necessary to answer the questions. Attention will be paid to problems which arise naturally and to general principles; artificial problems will be avoided. The questions will involve the use of mathematical instruments.

28. *Higher Applied Mathematics.*—Lower Applied Mathematics together with—

Statics to a more advanced stage, including graphical treatment.

Dynamics to the equations of Euler and Lagrange and including the theory of the vibration of strings and other simple systems.

Hydrodynamics, including the elementary theory of the motion of solids through a liquid, surface waves, and vibrations in gases.

Elasticity, including the elements of the vibrations of rods, plates, and bars.

Electricity and Magnetism.

Thermodynamics, kinetic theory of gases, radiation.

A considerable choice of questions will be allowed, so that full marks may be obtained by covering about half the range stated.

29. *Astronomy.*—Geometrical optics will be included.

A candidate who desires to offer this subject must produce evidence satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners of at least 20 hours' practical training in an observatory.

30. *Statistics.*—Some knowledge of the nature of the data available for the statistical discussion of prices, wages, incomes, trade transport, production, consumption, population, births, deaths, migration.

Frequency distributions, averages, percentiles, simple methods of measuring dispersion; graphic methods; elementary treatment of qualitative data; miscellaneous methods used in handling statistics of experiments and observations; interpolation.

Elements of modern mathematical theory of statistics:—Frequency curves and the mathematical representation of groups generally; accuracy of sampling as affecting averages, percentages, standard deviation; significance of observed differences between averages of groups, &c.; the theory of correlation for two variables.

NATURAL SCIENCE: Subjects 3-42.—The standard of the higher division of a science will be that which is required in the main subject for an honours degree at the universities. The standard for the lower division of a science will be that required in a subject subsidiary to the main subject whether required at the final degree examination or at a preceding examination.

A candidate who desires to offer a science must produce evidence satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners of laboratory training in that science in an institution of university rank; the period of training required is one academic year, whether the candidate offers the higher division of the science or the lower division or both divisions.

37. *Lower Geology* } Mineralogy will be included in each division.
38. *Higher Geology* }

43. *Engineering.*—Strength of materials; theory of structures; mechanism and dynamics of machines; heat and thermodynamics; surveying; hydraulics, including hydraulic machines; electricity and magnetism.

The subject will be treated in a general manner and the questions will be confined to the more elementary parts of the subject. The candidate will be expected to be familiar with graphical methods and to have some skill in mechanical drawing.

A candidate who desires to offer Engineering must produce evidence satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners of training for at least one academic year in an institution of university rank.

44. *Geography.*—Geography as understood in the universities, not excluding topics which concern geography jointly with other subjects such as economics, history, physics, botany, and geology. There will be a practical test which will necessitate a knowledge of cartographical methods and notations, and for this test drawing instruments may be required.

A candidate who desires to offer this subject must produce evidence satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners of training for at least one academic year in an institution of university rank.

45. *General Anthropology.*—Primitive culture in its various aspects; including economic pursuits (food collecting, hunting, fishing, domestication of animals, agriculture); the general scheme of primitive social organization; early religion and magic, mythology, beliefs, rituals and ceremonial; decorative art, music, dancing. Candidates will be expected to show some knowledge of the customs, institutions, and beliefs of living races of rude culture rather than knowledge of prehistory, archaeology, or evolutionary or historical conjectures.

46. *Special Anthropology.*—Candidates will choose between Social Anthropology and Physical Anthropology.

Social Anthropology.—A fuller knowledge of primitive social organization will be here expected: the tribe, the village community, kinship grouping, and the family. Study of the manner in which law works among primitive people and of their forms of administering justice. The economic organization of the primary pursuits and industries; the types of distribution, exchange, and trade. Exchange and the beginnings of currency. Adjustments of European economic systems, laws and morality to races on an earlier level or of a different type of culture. Early forms of magical and religious belief and ritual. The relation between faith and knowledge in primitive societies.

Physical Anthropology, with which are included Prehistoric Archaeology and Technology. Candidates will be expected to have such knowledge as may be acquired by laboratory and museum work, consisting mainly in the handling and study of specimens and exhibits. The subject will be treated with special, but not exclusive, reference to peoples of rude culture, including prehistoric civilizations.

A candidate who desires to offer Physical Anthropology must produce evidence satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners of training in an institution of university rank.

47. *Agriculture.*—Agricultural chemistry, agricultural botany, and agricultural zoology will be included.

A candidate who desires to offer this subject must produce evidence satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners of training in an approved institution.

48, 49. *English Literature.*—*Period 1,* from 1350 to 1700; *Period 2,* from 1660 to 1914.

Candidates should be prepared to show a first-hand knowledge of some of the works of the following authors and of their place in the history of their country:—

Questions on other writers will not be excluded, but, on the whole, the questions will be directed to the best-known authors and their best-known works. Candidates should know so much of the history as is necessary to understand the literature in its relation to other activities of the nation.

Questions will not be set on the history of the language before Chaucer, nor, in general, on its morphological or phonological changes since his time; the history of workmanship, style, and prosody will not be excluded.

CIVILIZATIONS AND LANGUAGES: Subjects 50-67.—In these the civilization subject associated with a language can be taken only by candidates who also offer themselves for examination in the language itself.

A civilization subject will include literature and history. It will deal with the life of the people as a whole, literary, political, social, economic, scientific, artistic.

In literature candidates will be expected to have a first-hand knowledge of the authors.

In history candidates will be expected to show a knowledge of the original authorities. They must also have such a knowledge of geography as is necessary to the proper understanding of the history.

50. *Latin Language.*—Translation and prose or verse composition. The composition paper will be so arranged that candidates may confine themselves to prose composition or to verse composition or, if they prefer, may take some prose and some verse.

51. *Roman Civilization.*—In history the outlines of the history and development down to 180 A.D. should be known; but the main stress will be laid on the period 133 B.C. to 117 A.D.

52. *Greek Language.*—As for Latin.

53. *Greek Civilization.*—In history the main stress will be on the period 510 B.C. to 323 B.C.

54. *French Language.*—Translation, free composition, set composition, and conversation.

55. *French Civilization.*—The outlines of the history prior to 1589 should be known; the period from 1589 to 1660 in somewhat more detail; but the main stress will be on the period from 1660 to the present day.

56. *German Language.*—As for French.

57. *German Civilization.*—In history candidates should know in outline the history of the Medieval Empire, of the growth of the German cities, of the Reformation in Germany, and of the Thirty Years War; but the main stress will be on the period from the accession of Frederick the Great to the present day.

58. *Spanish, Italian Language.*—As for French.

59. *Spanish Civilization.*—In history the main stress will be on the periods from the Union of Castile and Aragon under Ferdinand and Isabella to the liberation of the Netherlands, and again from 1800 to the present day.

Italian Civilization.—In history the main stress will be on the 15th century and the first half of the 16th century, and again on the period from 1789 to the present day. Sufficient should be known of the earlier period to understand the position of the Pope and the Emperor in Italy, the rise of the towns, and the position of Dante.

60. *Russian Language.*—As for French.

61. *Russian Civilization.*—Only the broadest outlines of the history prior to Peter the Great will be required; the period from the accession of Peter the Great to 1800 should be known in somewhat more detail; but the main stress will be on the period from 1800 to the present day.

62. *Arabic Language.*—Translation, free composition, set composition, conversation. The examination will be in the modern language.

63. *Arabic Civilization.*—The main stress in both history and literature will be on the period from the middle of the 6th century A.D. to the middle of the 13th century A.D.

64. *Persian Language.*—Translation, free composition, set composition, conversation. The examination will be in the modern language.

65. *Persian Civilization.*—The main stress in both history and literature will be on the period 1000 A.D. to 1500 A.D. Candidates will be expected to have a general knowledge of the history of Persia before 1000 A.D. and from 1500 A.D. to the present time.

66. *Sanskrit Language.*—Translation, prose composition, and questions on Vedic and Sanskrit grammar. Both Vedic and classical Sanskrit passages will be set for translation; composition will be required in classical Sanskrit alone.

67. *Sanskrit Civilization.*—Sanskrit literature and the history of the civilization and thought of India from the Vedic period to A.D. 1200.

REGULATIONS.

1. Any building or place (a) to which rats have direct access from drains, or (b) in which rat holes are found not properly blocked up shall be considered insanitary.
2. The owner or occupier of any insanitary building or place shall carry out such work as the Chairman, Sanitary Board, considers necessary to prevent the direct access of rats to such building or place.
3. Any person desirous of storing or keeping more than 2½ bushels and less than 25 bushels of imported rice in any place within the Sanitary Board limits of Polgahawela and Kuliya-pitiya must keep same in a rat-proof bin approved by the Chairman of the Sanitary Board.
4. Any person desirous of storing or having in possession at any time or in any place within the limits of the Sanitary Board towns of Polgahawela and Kuliya-pitiya imported rice in excess of 25 bushels shall keep the same in a rat-proof building approved by the Chairman of the Sanitary Board to whom plans of the building must first be submitted for approval.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended December 27, 1930.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 172 (1 European, 10 Burghers, 111 Sinhalese, 24 Tamils, 23 Moors, 1 Malay, and 2 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1930, viz., 270,700) was 33.1, as against 30.0 in the preceding week, 28.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 151 (8 Burghers, 90 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 21 Moors, 3 Malays, and 4 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 29.1, as against 29.5 in the previous week, 35.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.9 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 151 total deaths, 26 were of infants under one year of age, as against 35 in the preceding week, 36 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 19.

Principal Causes of Deaths.—1. (a) Twenty-one deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 10 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 3 each in Kotahena North and New Bazaar, 2 in Wellawatta South, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, and Kotahena South, as against 13 in the previous week and 12.2 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Four deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 1 each in Pettah, New Bazaar, Maradana South, and Wellawatta North, as against 10 in the previous week and 9 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Five deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in Kotahena North, 2 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 in Maradana North, as against 3 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. Eight deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 2 in San Sebastian, and 1 each in New Bazaar and Maradana South, as against 17 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

3. Three deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's, Maradana hospitals (of a non-resident) and Maradana North, as against 2 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from *Plague* was registered in Maradana hospitals, as against 3 in the previous week.

5. Nine deaths from *Debility* were registered, 8 from *Enteritis*, 6 from *Accidents*, 3 each from *Dysentery*, *Infantile Convulsions*, *Worms*, *Homicide* and *Puerperal Septicæmia*, 2 from *D. arrhœa*, 1 each from *Tetanus* and *Suicide*, and 67 from *Other Causes*.

6. **Reptiled Cases.**—Seven cases of *Chickenpox* and 4 of *Enteric Fever* were reported during the week, as against 7 and 6 respectively, in the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79.2°, against 79.0° in the preceding week and 77.1° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.937 in. against 29.964 in. in the preceding week and 29.915 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was nil against nil in the preceding week and 1.83 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on November 15, 1930, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated November 11, 1930.

Present : Mr. R. H. Whitehorn, Chairman ; Ratwatte Adigar ; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva ; Dr. G. P. Hay ; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail ; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake ; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa ; Dr. W. E. de Silva ; and Mr. H. P. G. Young.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on October 18, 1930, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1929 to October 31, 1930, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- Health Officer's report for October, 1930.
- Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of October, 1930.
- The reservoir readings for October, 1930.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house-service taps inspected during October 1930.

4. Petitions : J. C. Ratwatte Adigar presented a letter from Mr. K. Kumaraswami regarding the dismissal of Sandanam and certain other coolies of the Health Department.

Mr. Geo. E. de Silva presented petition from (1) Certain Buddhist residents of the town of Kandy asking that a water tap be installed in the Buddhist section of the Mahaiyawa General Cemetery ; (2) Mr. G. A. John asking that the notice served on his wife and family to quit model tenement No. 116 be withdrawn and they be allowed to continue occupation of the tenement ; (3) Mr. S. M. Abdul Cader praying that he be given the occupation of stalls Nos. 22 and 23, Public Market, for which he has applied ; (4) Mr. M. A. Marikar Saibo asking that he be allowed an extension of time by two months to work his lime kiln at Getambe ; (5) The residents of Pata Hewaheta Talwatte asking that they be exempted from the payment of rates on their properties.

Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake presented petition from Mr. M. A. Marikar Saibo, similar to the one presented by Mr. Geo. E. de Silva.

Mr. W. A. B. Soysa presented petition from (1) Mr. C. Gnanasekeram asking that he be allowed a remission of rates in respect of premises No. 22, Ward street; (2) Certain residents of the town of Kandy asking that a water tap be installed at the Anderson Memorial Hall in the Mahaiyawa General Cemetery; (3) Mr. P. S. Mohamado Yoosooof, the joint licensee of market granary "A," asking that the granary be not partitioned, that the order served on him to quit and vacate the granary be withdrawn and that he be given entire occupation of the granary, as the joint licensee has neither carried on business at the granary nor paid his share of the rent due.

The Chairman undertook to look into the matters referred to in the several petitions, and in regard to the petition from Mr. P. S. Mohamado Yoosooof, it was agreed to allow the petitioner the occupation of the entire granary for three months, if he consents to allow it to be partitioned forthwith.

5. Correspondence: (1) Letter No. E 19 of October 22, 1930, from Mr. D. K. Mc Minn resigning office as a nominated Councillor.—Read.

The Chairman moved—"That this Council do place on record its appreciation of the valuable services rendered to the Council by Mr. Mc Minn as a nominated Councillor."

The Chairman also welcomed Mr. Young, Mr. Mc Minn's successor. Ratwatte Adigar seconded.—Carried unanimously.

(2) Letter No. W 368/29 of October 31, 1930, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary nominating Mr. H. P. G. Young to be a member of the Municipal Council, Kandy, for the period ending December 31, 1932, with effect from November 20, 1930, *vice* Mr. D. K. Mc Minn.—Read.

(3) Letter No. A. B. 107 of October 18, 1930, from the Director of Education requesting that two members be nominated to serve on the Education District Committee for the area of the Kandy Municipality for three years, with effect from January 1, 1931.—Read.

Mr. Geo. E. de Silva moved and Mr. W. A. B. Soysa seconded the re-election of Ratwatte Adigar and Mr. S. A. Wijayatilaka to serve on the Committee.—Carried.

6. Papers *re* the assignment by Mr. Haji M. S. Mohamed Usoof Ismail of his interest in the lease of premises No. 4/1, Ward street, to Messrs. M. S. M. Ismail and M. S. M. Hassan.

Mr. De Silva moved and Mr. Wijayatilake seconded that the assignment be accepted by the Council.—Carried unanimously.

7. To create the post of City Analyst as provided in sections 59 (1) and 75 (d) of the Municipal Councils Ordinance and to appoint Messrs. Bamber and Bruce as City Analysts for the town of Kandy.

It was resolved that the post be created and Messrs. Bamber and Bruce be appointed as City Analysts for the town of Kandy.

8. Application dated October 28, 1930, from the Collector of Bus Stand Fees for an increased rate of commission. Resolved that the matter be deferred for consideration with the Budget.

9. To obtain a vote of Rs. 560 for the erection of a shed for the bier handed over to the Council by the Sucharita-biwardene Samitiya.

Resolved that the vote be sanctioned.

10. To sanction draft by-law for the control and regulation of poultry yards.

Resolved that the conditions for the granting of licences for poultry yards be first decided upon.

11. Papers *re* the licensing of tea kiosks and eating-houses on the market grounds.

It was resolved, Mr. de Silva dissenting, that the tea kiosk holders be allowed to carry on trade, without prosecution, till the end of March, 1931.

12. Papers *re* the obstruction of pavements opposite the Small Market.

Resolved that the areas within which trade can be allowed be redemarcated.

13. To approve the revised by-laws relating to the Public Market and the conditions for the issue of Market licences.

(4) Papers *re* the proposed mutton stall at Mahaiyawa.—Recommended no reduction in rent, and that if the present licensee does not commence the sale of mutton at once, the licence for the mutton shall be auctioned.

(5) Letter dated September 30, 1930, from T. K. Abdul Hamid stating that he is vacating vegetable stall No. 4, Katugastota market, as he is unable to carry on the business in the stall, with Chief Revenue Inspector's report thereon.—Recommended to re-auction as a vegetable stall; in default to auction as a beef stall.

(9) Accountant's memorandum dated September 30, 1930, suggesting that peons who do outdoor work be given a bicycle allowance of Rs. 2.50 each per mensem.—Recommended.

(10) To sanction the payment of Rs. 25 for the survey of site in railway approach road for a car park.—Recommended.

(11) To obtain a vote of Rs. 120 for 4 shelves and index cards for the Municipal Free Library.—Recommended.

(12) Accountant's memorandum dated September 26, 1930, suggesting that the balance of Rs. 16,609.54 remaining from the Government Grant received in 1923, for improvements to the Kandy reservoir, be utilized for improvements to the reservoir for which the Council recently voted Rs. 19,350 from the Surplus Funds.—Recommended.

(13) Accountant's memorandum dated October 15, 1930, asking that sanction be obtained to appropriate the unexpended balance of Rs. 19,912.95 of loan for New Generating Plant and for extension of lights to meet part cost of the Generating Plant, for which the Council voted Rs. 78,000.—Recommended.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works held on November 7, 1930.

(14) Papers *re* proposed bridge over the Meda-ela at Hirasagala road.—Recommended vote of Rs. 489, if the balance (Rs. 461) is paid from other sources.

(15) Application for house service pipes to (i.) 307 and 308, Peradeniya road, from M. L. Samsudeen.—Recommended. (ii.) 641 and 641A, Peradeniya road, from N. E. Weerasooriya.—Recommended.

(16) Revised Estimate for Rs. 2,000 from the Municipal Engineer for improvements to the Rice Granaries in railway approach road.—Recommended.

(17) To obtain vote for Rs. 140, half cost of barrelling open drain alongside premises No. 452, Peradeniya road.—Recommended.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Electricity Committee held on November 7, 1930.

(18) Papers *re* the disposal of not readily saleable fittings in store.—Recommended to invite Mr. A. Y. Daniel and Messrs. Schokman and Samarawickrema first to quote their terms for the sale of the fittings.

(19) Papers *re* the disposal of the storage battery.—Recommended to instruct the Municipal Electrical Engineer to communicate with the makers *re* the control gear, and to auction remainder locally, as recommended in (18).

(20) Accountant's memorandum dated October 29, 1930, *re* notifying landlords before lights are cut off for non-payment of dues.—Recommended to notify the landlord when cutting off notice is sent.

(21) To obtain a supplementary vote for Rs. 225 under the Head "Legal Expenses."—Recommended.

(22) Letter of October 24, 1930, from the Municipal Electrical Engineer submitting details of estimate for Rs. 325 for overhead mains in Talwatta road.—Recommended.

(23) Papers *re* deposits from consumers against the supply of Electricity.—Recommended to reduce the deposit to an equivalent of one month's average supply.

(24) Letter dated November 3, 1930, from the Municipal Electrical Engineer recommending the purchase of two fire extinguishers at a cost not exceeding Rs. 95.—Recommended.

The recommendations were adopted with the exception of (7) and (8), which were deferred for consideration with the Budget.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on Monday, November, 24, 1930, at 4.30 p.m., to consider the Draft Budget for 1931.

Present :—Mr. R. H. Whitehorn, Chairman; Ratwatte Adigar; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva; Dr. G. P. Hay; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake; Dr. W. E. de Silva; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa; Mr. H. P. G. Young.

The Chairman tabled the Draft Budget for 1931, which had been previously circulated among the Members and been open to public inspection at the Municipal Office, and generally explained the Budget and the Council's financial position.

Mr. De Silva offered comments. The Chairman replied.

On the motion of the Chairman seconded by Mr. de Silva, the Council went into Committee and the following amendments and proposals were made :—

(1) The proposal to tax the untaxed area in Hewaheta-Talwatta was considered and it was decided to defer it for consideration with the Budget for 1932.

(2) It was agreed to reduce the rents on inside stalls and spaces in the public market by 10 per cent. and on temporary boutiques by 15 per cent. temporarily from January 1, 1931.

(3) The proposal to auction the right of collection of market daily rents for one year from January 1, 1931, was approved. The reserve price to be Rs. 9,000 subject to the Chairman's right to reduce it to Rs. 7,500 if there were no higher offers.

(4) The item under Head 7—Rents—markets (temporary boutique rents) was increased from Rs. 13,000 to Rs. 13,800.

(5) The rent per living room with soiled linen room in the dhobies' tanks was fixed at Rs. 10 per mensem from January 1, 1931.

(6) The Chairman undertook to consider Ratwatte Adigar's proposal to provide additional dhobies' washing tanks.

(7) The Council, in considering the application of Mr. E. B. Peiris, Accountant, for an increase of salary, resolved that it views the application with considerable sympathy, but regrets that it is unable to consider the increase at the present time, but will do so as soon as conditions improved.

(8) The continuance of the post of Assistant Binder on a pay of Rs. 25 per mensem temporarily was approved.

(9) Medical Officer of Health's application for the appointment of an Additional Nuisance Watcher was disallowed.

(10) Application from Mr. Vanderwall, Assistant to the Municipal Engineer, for an enhanced rate of pay was disallowed.

(11) Payment of rent allowance to the Veterinary Officer at the usual rates was approved.

(12) It was decided to effect strict economies in the use of stationery, and to advertise tenders only locally on notice boards to save in advertisement charges.

(13) The commission payable to the Bus Stand Fees Collector on his collections from November 1, 1930, was fixed at 15 per cent.

(14) The Chairman undertook to look into the question of 25 per cent. commission allowed to the Bus Stand Fees Collector on fines recovered in cases instituted by him.

(15) The Chairman undertook to table a statement of the labour employed by the Medical Officer of Health and the Municipal Engineer with their rates of pay.

(16) The Medical Officer of Health was asked to report on the Charitable Institution conducted by Miss Chapman with a view to consider the question of a grant.

(17) The following amendments were made in items of expenditure :—

1A. Administrative: Other charges.—Stationery, Rs. 6,000 reduced to Rs. 5,000; advertising, Rs. 1,500 reduced to Rs. 1,000; printed forms and books, Rs. 5,000 reduced to Rs. 4,000.

4. Infectious diseases prevention.—Equipment and chemicals, Rs. 2,712.80 reduced to Rs. 1,000.

5. Scavenging streets.—Tools and materials, Rs. 975.35 reduced to Rs. 600; disinfectants, Rs. 1,216 reduced to Rs. 500.

6. Conservancy of latrines.—New drums and buckets, Rs. 5,900 reduced to Rs. 3,000; repairs to carts, Rs. 1,500 reduced to Rs. 1,000; repairs to drums and buckets, Rs. 2,500 reduced to Rs. 2,000; lanterns and oil, Rs. 1,500 reduced to Rs. 1,200; disinfectants, Rs. 2,173.60 reduced to Rs. 1,500.

23. Capital expenditure—Two muster sheds, Rs. 5,000 deleted.

(18) The Chairman agreed to furnish further details with regard to the votes asked under Head 23 for—Improvements to Halloluwa road, Rs. 5,666.80; five night soil depôts, Rs. 9,000.

The meeting then adjourned for Monday, December 1, 5 p.m.

Minutes of Proceedings of an Adjourned Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on Monday, December 1, 1930, at 5 p.m., to consider the Draft Budget for 1931.

Present :—Mr. R. H. Whitehorn, Chairman; Ratwatte Adigar; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva; Dr. G. P. Hay; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake; Dr. W. E. de Silva; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa; Mr. H. P. G. Young.

The Council continued to consider the Draft Budget in Committee.

2. The Chairman tabled statements of labour employed in the Works and Health Departments with their rates of pay.

3. The Chairman agreed to consider a proposal to have one annual inspection of the Fire Brigade by the Superintendent of the Colombo Fire Brigade instead of two.

4. The Chairman submitted the report of the Medical Officer of Health with regard to Miss Chapman's Home for Destitute Children, and the Council agreed to make a grant of Rs. 250 for 1931 subject to Government sanction.

5. It was decided to consider the question of dealing with vagrants when the report of the Kandy Social Service League is received in due course.

6. The Council agreed to repay the unexpended balance on the last waterworks loan and to rearrange future payments of Principal and Interest as suggested in the Accountant's memo of September 26, 1930.
7. The item of Rs. 5,666.80 under Head 23 for improvements to Halloluwa road was deleted.
- The vote under Head 8 for maintenance of "Halloluwa, Bahirawakanda, and Hospital roads" was increased from Rs. 1,500 to Rs. 3,000, the extra provision being for improvements to Halloluwa road.
8. The item of Rs. 9,000 under Head 23 for five night soil depôts was passed subject to two being first erected and approved by Council before the others are undertaken.
9. As a measure of retrenchment the Council decided to curtail expenditure voted for 1930 by cutting out the following votes:—
- Estimate 31/29.—Repairs to barrel drains Rs. 5,000 (part of Estimate for Rs. 10,000).
- Estimate 43/29.—Road through Bahirawakanda Rs. 5,000.
- Estimate 46/29.—Opening a further section of Lady Mannings Drive Rs. 5,000.
- Estimate 44/29.—Fire engine house Rs. 7,543.
- Estimate 27/29.—Building side drains in Peradeniya road Rs. 2,000 (part of Estimate of Rs. 5,500).
10. It was decided to include under Head 23, a sum of Rs. 3,500, for building drains opposite premises 25 and 26, Peradeniya road (Pullayar Kovil premises).
11. The tenders received for the supply of printed forms and books for 1931 were considered and Messrs. Schokman & Company's tender was accepted.
12. The question of day scavenging of Katugastota area on contract was considered and it was decided to ask the present contractor to enter into a contract for carrying out the work in 1931 for the present figure (Rs. 2,405.75), and if he declines, to accept the lowest tender from the tenders received.

ELECTRICITY DEPARTMENT.

13. A salary scale of Rs. 720—60—Rs. 900 was sanctioned for the attendant, Peradeniya Sub-Station (Mr. C. P. Gurusinghe) and Foreman Blacksmith (Mr. D. R. B. Perera).
14. A salary scale of Rs. 540—60—Rs. 720 was sanctioned for the 2nd Greaser (Mr. E. D. W. Krishnaratne) commencing from September 1, 1931.
15. A salary scale of Rs. 480—48—Rs. 960 was sanctioned for the Assistant Meter Inspector and Public Lighting Inspector (Mr. P. A. Martin) and Meter Reader and Cleaner (Mr. F. W. Perera) the salary for 1931 to be Rs. 576.
16. The travelling allowance of the Meter Inspector (Mr. D. W. Calugama) was fixed at Rs. 240 per annum.
17. It was decided that the Typist-Clerk, Recordkeeper, and Assistant Storekeeper (Mr. R. V. Selliah) should continue on his present salary scale.
18. The appointment of Mr. E. N. de Lanerolle as Installation Inspector and Plant Recordkeeper temporarily for six months from January 1, 1931, on a pay of Rs. 80 and a travelling allowance of Rs. 20 per mensem was sanctioned, the officer being required to keep a diary which should be submitted to the Electricity Committee Meeting each month.
19. The increase in the number of lamp lighters from five to seven was sanctioned.
20. The application of Mr. G. H. G. Goonewardena for an increase of pay was referred to the Electricity Committee.
21. The item of Rs. 3,000 under capital expenditure for house service meters was reduced to Rs. 1,000.
22. An item of Rs. 2,000 was included under capital expenditure for lighting Mavilmada road by overhead mains. The Council resumed and the Budget as amended was passed.
