REGULATIONS made by the "proper authority," to wit, the Local Board of Puttalam, under sections 18 and 23 of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," in respect of the General Cemetery at Puttalam.

REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

(1) No corpse shall be buried in any grave not specially provided for its reception upon due application made to and granted by the keeper.

(2) An application for a grave shall be made to the keeper of the cemetery not less than four hours before the time fixed for the burial of a corpse.

(3) At the time of such application the following fees shall be paid by the applicant or person acting on his behalf:—

For a full-sized grave ..	3 0
For a grave for a child under 10 years ..	2 0
For a grave for a child under 5 years ..	1 50
For a cremation ..	2 0

(4) No grave shall be constructed by any one except a duly appointed gravedigger.

(5) Graves shall be at least two feet apart and not less than five feet in depth.

(6) All lawful directions of the keeper for the preservation of order within the cemetery shall be obeyed.

(7) On arrival at the cemetery a funeral party shall obey all directions of the keeper as to the route to be taken or any other directions that he may give.

(8) Should it be necessary for the purposes of preventing the disturbance of one funeral party by another, and not otherwise, the keeper may require that one burial service should be concluded before another is commenced.

(9) The following fees are payable to the keeper:—

For inspection of plan of cemetery and the book of reference ..	0 50
For every entry or memorial of assignment of grant ..	1 0

The applicants shall sign the cemetery-keeper's book in token of all payments made by them:

Provided that on production of a certificate signed by a person especially authorized in that behalf in writing by the Chairman, Local Board, that the relatives and friends of any deceased person are not able to pay the fees authorized for a grave, the keeper of the cemetery shall cause a grave to be dug and the corpse to be buried therein free of charge.

VITAL STATISTICS.**Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended January 3, 1931.**

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 139 (2 Europeans, 12 Burghers, 77 Sinhalese, 26 Tamils, 18 Moors, 2 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1931, viz., 272,200) was 26.6, as against 33.1 in the preceding week, 27.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 33.9 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 138 (7 Burghers, 79 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 23 Moors, 2 Malays, and 2 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 26.4, as against 29.1 in the previous week, 40.7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29.5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 138 total deaths, 30 were of infants under one year of age, as against 26 in the preceding week, 41 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 7.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Sixteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals, 3 in New Bazaar, 2 in Slave Island, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Kollupitiya and Wellawatta South, as against 21 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Six deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in New Bazaar, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, and Slave Island, as against 4 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Two deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in New Bazaar and Maradana hospitals, as against 5 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. Five deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 3 in Maradana South and 1 each in Maradana hospitals (of a non-resident) and Kollupitiya, as against 8 in the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year.

3. Five deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals and 1 each in Maradana North and Slave Island, as against 3 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. Two deaths from *Plague* were registered, each in St. Paul's and Kotahena North, as against 1 in the previous week and 1 the weekly average for last year.

5. Twelve deaths from *Debility* were registered, 10 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 8 from *Enteritis*, 5 from *Puerperal Septicæmia*, 3 from *Diarrhoea*, 2 from *Worms*, 1 each from *Dysentery*, *Homicide* and *Accidents*, and 59 from *Other Causes*.

6. **Reported Cases.**—Ten cases of *Chickenpox*, 5 of *Enteric Fever*, 3 of *Plague*, and 1 of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 7, 4, nil and nil respectively of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.2° against 79.2° in the preceding week and 79.2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.943 in., against 29.937 in. in the preceding week and 29.459 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.02 in. against nil in the preceding week and 0.24 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 137 (4 Burghers, 79 Sinhalese, 20 Tamils, 20 Moors, 4 Malays, and 10 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 26.2, as against 26.4 in the previous week, 33.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29.5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 137 total deaths, 39 were of infants under one year of age, as against 30 in the preceding week, 32 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 16.

Principal Causes of Death. (a) Seventeen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 5 each in St. Paul's and Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), 3 in Maradana North, 2 in Slave Island, and 1 each in Pettah and Kotahena North, as against 16 in the previous week, and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Five deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena South, Maradana hospitals, and Maradana North, as against 6 in the previous week, and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Four deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Maradana hospitals (of a non-resident), and Maradana North, as against 2 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. Nine deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 2 each in Kotahena South, Maradana hospitals, and Slave Island, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, and Maradana South, as against 5 in the previous week, and 12 the weekly average for last year.

3. Three deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals, and 1 in San Sebastian, as against 5 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from *Plague* was registered in Maradana South, as against 2 in the previous week, and 1 the weekly average for last year.

5. Eleven deaths from *Debility* were registered, 9 from *Enteritis*, 7 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 5 from *Worms*, 4 from *Dysentery*, 3 from *Diarrhoea*, 2 from *Accidents*, and 57 from *Other Causes*.

6. **Reported Cases.**—Twenty-three cases of *Chickenpox*, 19 of *Enteric Fever*, 2 of *Measles*, and 1 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 10, 5, 1, and 3, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80.4°, against 81.2° in the preceding week and 79.4° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.883 in., against 29.943 in. in the preceding week and 29.932 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.14 in., against 0.02 in. in the preceding week and 2.85 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
