KNOW Ye that We, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers vested in Us by section 31 of "The Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, 1895," do hereby, with effect from February 1, 1931, amend the schedule to the Proclamation under the said section dated June 24, 1899, published in *Gazette* No. 5,629 of July 1, 1899, by substituting for the words therein appearing and reproduced in column I. of the schedule hereof in respect of the division of Puttalam town in the North-Western Province, the words appearing in column II. of the schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

North-Western Province—Puttalam Town.

Column I.

Division as defined by Proclamation dated June 24, 1899.

North by road reservation, north of preliminary plans 425, 1,094, and 1,375; north-west by a straight line drawn from the northern boundary of lot No. 84,842 in a south-westerly direction past the north-west point of the bund of Nudunkulam tank to the lake; west and south-west by the Puttalam lake and a straight line drawn in a south-easterly direction from the 1st milepost Puttalam-Chilaw road to south of lot 62,629; south by a straight line drawn south of lots in preliminary plan 102 in an easterly direction to meet the road reservation; east by road reservation crossing Kurunegala and Anuradhapura roads and a straight line drawn from the north of it to meet the road reservation which forms the northern boundary.

Column II.

Division as defined by this Proclamation.

North: From the northern extremity of title plan No. 84,842 eastwards along the northern boundary of the said title plan; thence along the 30 links reservation lying to the north of title plan No. 103,236, west and north of title plan No. 180,677, north of title plans Nos. 103,238, 103,239, 140,289, 175,585, 175,584 running through title plans Nos. 175,580, 174,668, and lying to the north of title plan No. 190,445 to a point 30 links south of the south-eastern corner of title plan No. 174,668. East: From the last mentioned point a line drawn south-eastwards to meet the north-eastern corner of title plan No. 66,037; thence along the eastern boundaries of title plans Nos. 66,037, 66,038, 59,380, thence along the road reservation to the east of title plans Nos. 59,383, 62,610, 137,594, 62,611, 59,384, 53,327, 62,623, 62,616, and 137,595 up to its junction with road reservation to the south of title plan No. 137,595. South: From the last mentioned point westwards along the road reservation to the south of title plans Nos. 137,595, 146,288, 189,076, 58,701, 114,943, 114,941, 114,942, 135,235, 135,234, 62,619, and 62,629 up to the landmark on the south-western corner of title plan No. 62,629. West: From the last mentioned point a line drawn north-westwards to the 1st milepost on the Puttalam-Chilaw road, thence due west to the Puttalam lake, thence northwards along the Puttalam lake as far as the flood outlet channel (P. P. 3,637), thence north-eastwards along the flood outlet channel until it meets the Western Saltern road, thence south-eastwards along the Western Saltern road to its junction with the Mannar-Puttalam road, thence along Mannar-Puttalam road northwards to the landmark on the northern boundary of lot 232 in M. S. P. P. 20, thence from the said landmark a line drawn north-eastwards to the landmark on the south-western corner of lot 6 in P. P. 5,509, thence along the western boundaries of lots 12, 11, 7, 4, and 2 in P. P. 5,509, lot 16 in P. P. 6,135 and title plan No. 84,842 as far as the starting point of the northern boundary.

WHEREAS by section 4 (1) of Ordinance No. 3 of 1903, it is enacted that when it appears to the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time, that by reason of the existence or apprehension of crime and outrage in any district it is desirable to quarter police in such district, or should a police force have been already established there, to increase the same, he may by Proclamation, which shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, declare that for the reason aforesaid such district requires police, or additional police, and may order police to be quartered in such district, or additional police be employed there:

And whereas it appears to the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, that by reason of the existence of crime and outrage in the district defined in the schedule hereunto annexed, it is desirable to quarter police in the said district for a period of six months:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that by reason of the existence of crime and outrage therein, the said district in the Western Province requires police, and do hereby order that a police force consisting of 1 sergeant and 6 constables be quartered in the said district in the said Province, as from and after the First day of February, 1931.

And We do further hereby define the limits of the said district to be those set out in the schedule hereunto annexed.

"THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ORDINANCE,
No. 11 of 1920."

BY-LAWS made by the Moratuwa Urban District Council, under sections 164 and 168 of "The Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920," and approved by the Local Government Board, and confirmed by the Governor in Executive Council under section 164.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. The following by-laws shall be in force within the Lunawa lagoon and that portion of the Panadura river which lies within the administrative limits of the Urban District Council of Moratuwa.

2. The catching of fish by means of gunny bags is prohibited.

3. Fishing by rod and line is permitted throughout the year.

4. Fishing by kraals in the Panadure river is prohibited during the months of April, May, and June. At other times of the year it is permitted only under licence issued by the Chairman of the Council. The licence shall specify the situation of the kraal and the months during which fishing is prohibited. Fishing by kraals in the Lunawa lagoon is permitted throughout the year only under licence issued by the Chairman of the Council.

5. Every kraal shall have a central gap thirty yards wide and inshore gaps at each end ten yards wide.

6. No kraal for fishing shall be permitted within a distance of fifty yards from any other kraal.

7. No kraal shall extend to within fifty yards of the centre of the Panadure river, and the central gaps and inshore gaps shall be kept absolutely open and shall not be obstructed in any way, whether by submerged tats or strings of coconut leaves or any other obstruction.

8. The extreme ends of the kraals towards the centre of the Panadure river shall be marked by high posts flying a flag during the day and having a lantern or other light attached during the night.

9. If the kraal is abandoned or a licence for another year is refused or not renewed, the stakes or other appendages pertaining thereto shall be pulled out and removed within forty-eight hours.

10. A licence fee of Rs. 7.50 shall be paid for each kraal or any portion thereof. Every licence and every renewal thereof shall be in force until the Thirty-first day of December of the year for which the same is granted.

11. Any person committing a breach of any one of the above by-laws shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs. 50 for any one offence, and in the case of a continuing offence to an additional fine not exceeding Rs. 25 for every day during which the offence is committed after conviction or written notice from the Chairman of such contravention.

The Local Option Rules, 1928 (Excise Notification No. 146 published in *Gazette* No. 7,478 of August 14, 1925, as amended by Excise Notification No. 180 published in *Gazette* No. 7,661 of August 31, 1928, Excise Notification No. 194 published in *Gazette* No. 7,764 of February 28, 1930, and Excise Notification No. 202 published in *Gazette* of September 19, 1930), are further amended as follows:—

1. Rule 10 is hereby rescinded and the following is substituted therefor:—

10. The area shall, in the case of a single tavern, hotel, or place licensed to sell beer or porter be as nearly as practicable the whole area, within a radius of two miles from the licensed premises in question. Where the circumference of the resultant circle cuts a village in two, the whole of such village shall be excluded unless more than half of it falls within the said circumference.

2. Rule 11 is hereby rescinded and the following is substituted therefor:—

11. Where in any area there is more than one tavern, hotel, or place licensed to sell beer or porter provided they are not more than one mile apart, the area for all such taverns, hotels, or places shall be one and the same, but the circle comprising the area shall have its centre at as central a point as possible.

3. Rule 12 is hereby rescinded and the following is substituted therefor:—

12. Provided that for polls in Colombo the area shall always be a ward.

RULES.

1. All persons appointed as enumerators under section 7 shall attend for instructions or inspection at such places, on such dates, and at such hours, as may be specified by the Supervisors, by the Commissioners of Census, or by the Superintendent of Census.

2. No census officer shall disclose to any unauthorized person information collected for the purpose of filling up the Census Schedules or any information entered in any such schedule.

3. The particulars regarding which information shall be obtained for the purposes of the Census fixed by Proclamation to be taken on February 26, 1931, shall be as follows:—

(a) Within the Municipal limits of Colombo: for each individual the name, sex, race, religion, literacy, civil condition, age, place of birth, and occupation.

(b) Outside the Municipal limits of Colombo: the number of persons usually living in each building.

4. For the purpose of obtaining the information required within the area mentioned in rule 3 (a) every census officer shall ask of all persons within the limits of his local area the following questions and any others that may be necessary to explain the answers received or to obtain the information that is to be recorded in Schedule A:—

Case II.—What is your name?

Case 2.—What is your race? If Sinhalese are you Kandyan or Low-country? If Tamil or Moor, are you a Ceylon or Indian Tamil or Moor? Is your home on the Coast in India?

Case 3.—What is your religion? (In the case of Christians) to what sect of Christians do you belong?

Case 4.—Can you read and write your own language? Can you read and write any other language?

Case 5.—Can you both read and write English?

Case 6.—Can you speak English? Can you understand a question put to you in English and reply in English?

Case 7.—Have you ever been married? If you have, have you a wife (or husband) now alive? (To persons who say they are divorced) Have you obtained a legal divorce?

Case 8.—How old are you; that is, how many years have you completed?

Case 9.—Were you born in this Town or District (as the case may be)? If not, in what Town or District? If not in Ceylon, in what country? If in India, in what District of India?

Cages 10 and 11.—Do you earn your living by working? Or have you independent means? Do you augment the family income by your work? What is your principal occupation or means of subsistence, that is, the employment which brings you in the greatest income? What is your exact employment? If a merchant in what merchandise do you deal? If a trader, what is your trade? If a land owner, what is the principal cultivation on the land? Do you both own it and cultivate it? Do you let out any land? Do you make more out of that than from the land you cultivate yourself? (If the answers to all the questions at the beginning are No) what is the principal occupation or means of subsistence of the person on whom you are dependent.

5. For the purpose of obtaining the information required within the area mentioned in rule 3 (b) every census officer shall ask of all persons within the limits of his local area the following questions and any others that may be necessary to explain the answer received or to obtain the information that is to be recorded in schedule :—

- (a) How many persons usually live in this house ?
- (b) Does that number include those who are out temporarily ?

6. The form of schedule to be prepared by the Superintendent of Census for the purpose of being filled up with the particulars required by rule 3 (a) for the area within the Municipal limits of Colombo shall be the following :—

Important.

- The Census of Ceylon is to be taken on February 26, 1931, between 7 p.m. and midnight.
- The usual residents in the building or institution should be requested to be in it, as far as possible, between 7 p.m. and midnight on February 26, 1931.
- In bungalows, clubs, hotels, and boarding-houses particulars should be entered for all the servants present on the premises at 7 p.m. on February 26, 1931. The other residents may be enumerated at any other more convenient hour, provided that all persons resident on the premises for that night are enumerated.
- In other cases (except that of the Railway) entries should be made for all persons on the premises at 7 p.m.
- If the number of persons on the premises is likely to be large, it will probably be found to be convenient to enter up the Occupiers' Schedules before, or during the day of, February 26 for such persons as are likely to be on the premises at 7 p.m. At that hour these entries will be revised, and particulars for all persons who have arrived later will be added, and entries for those who have left will be struck out.
- All servants in bungalows, clubs, hotels, boarding-houses, leaving the premises between 7 p.m. and midnight on February 26 should be given a pass showing that they have been enumerated, and be told to produce it if any Enumerator tries to count them. Other persons leaving should be given a pass when possible. If not possible, they may be asked by notice or otherwise to see that they are neither omitted nor counted twice.
- All persons leaving other premises will be given passes (special rules are issued for the Railway).
- All persons arriving at any premises will be asked if they have been enumerated that night. If not, a column of one of the schedules must be entered with the particulars regarding each of them. If any person is not sure about being counted, he should be enumerated, a footnote being made that he is doubtful if he has been already counted.

How to Fill up the Schedule.

- Please use black ink and write very clearly.
- There is space for entries in respect of 5 persons on each schedule. One column will be filled in for each person. In general, the entries for the persons in the building or group of buildings will be made continuously, one person to a column throughout, no intermediate columns being left blank. But in special cases, e.g., hotels, clubs, &c., separate schedules may be issued to the various rooms, to selected individuals, &c., as may be convenient.
- Case 1. (Census Number of Building).**—For large institutions, &c., with sub-numbered buildings, the sub-number should be entered here by the Occupier.
- Case II. (Name).**—In the case of bungalows and dwelling-houses, enter first the name of the chief resident member of the family, whether male or female, then the names of the other members of the family in order of age, next the names of the resident servants, and lastly the names of visitors, if any. If a child has not been named, write "Not named." In other cases any convenient order may be followed, provided there are no omissions.
- Case 1 (Sex).**—For Males enter M in this case, and for Females F.
- Case 2 (Race).**—Enter the race of each person as English, Scotch, Irish, French, Kandyan Sinhalese, Low-country Sinhalese, Ceylon Tamil, Indian Tamil, Ceylon Moor, Indian Moor, Burgher, &c. Indian Tamils and Moors are Tamils and Moors who are only working or trading in Ceylon away from their coast, and whose homes are in India. But labourers and coolies must be entered as Indian Tamils or Moors, unless they can trace their origin to a Tamil or Moor District in Ceylon. For persons of foreign birth who have become naturalized British subjects, enter the words "British subject" after name of nationality.

- Case 3 (Religion).**—Enter the religion as Christian, Buddhist, Hindu-Muslim, &c. ("Hindu" means a worshipper of Siva, Vishnu, or other Indian deity.) In the case of Christians enter the sect, thus: Church of England, Roman Catholic, Wesleyan, Baptist, Independent Catholic, Dutch Presbyterian, Scotch Presbyterian, Salvationist, &c.
- Case 4 (Whether able to read and write mother tongue; if not what other language).**—Enter in this case his or her mother tongue under each person who can read and write it. If he or she cannot read and write his or her native language, but can read and write another language, insert the name of that language. Enter "None" in case of inability to read and write any language.
- Case 5 (Whether able to read and write English).**—Enter in this case under each person the word "Yes" if he can both read and write English; and if he cannot "No" should be entered.
- Case 6 (Whether able to speak English).**—Enter in this case under each person the word "Yes" if he can speak English. Able to speak English means able to conduct a short conversation, or understand and answer questions put, in English.
- Case 7 (Unmarried, &c.).**—Enter each person, whether infant, child, or grown up as either unmarried, married, widowed, or divorced. Divorced persons who have married again should be entered as "Married," and not as "Divorced."
- Case 8 (Age).**—Enter the number of years completed. For infants less than one year old enter the word "Infant." Every effort should be made to ascertain age as accurately as possible.
- Case 9 (Birth District or Town).**—In the case of persons born out of Ceylon or India, enter the country, this: China, England, France, &c. In the case of persons born in Ceylon outside a Town, enter the name of the district, e.g., Colombo, Kandy, Nuwara Eliya, Galle, Matara, Jaffna, Mannar, Ratnapura, Kegalla, Obilaw, Puttalam, &c., and not the name of the village in which the person was born. In the case of persons born in towns in Ceylon, enter thus: Colombo Town, Gampola Town, Moratuwa Town, &c., taking care to differentiate between the town and district by adding the word "Town" in the case of these persons. In the case of persons born in India, enter the name of the district as far as it can be ascertained, thus: India, Tinnevely; India, Cochin. Persons born in India should be asked the name of the Taluk (Taluk) or District in which they were born; if they cannot say, they should be asked the name of the Jilla (Jilla) or Province. If this information cannot be obtained, the name of the town or village, or such other place name they can give, should be obtained. The Province can always be traced if the name of the nearest Post Office to the place where they were born can be given.
- Case 10 (Principal occupation or means of subsistence of earner).**—The largest income, or that on which the earner depends most for a livelihood. Enter in this case only persons who actually work or carry on business, whether personally or by means of servants, or who live on private property, such as produce of lands, house rent, pension, &c. Leave this case blank for dependents, such as wife, children, unless they derive their subsistence independently of the head of the family. The occupation should be exactly described. Do not use general or indefinite terms, such as Merchant, Trader, &c., where explanatory terms can be used e.g., Rice Trader, Piece Goods Trader. If engaged in general business, enter General Merchant or Trader, as the case may be. Employees in shops should be shown by their specific employment. Persons temporarily out of employment should be returned under their last ordinary occupation. Growers of special products, such as tea, coffee, coconut, cinnamon, tobacco, rubber, &c., should be shown as such, thus: "Tea Estate Superintendent," "Rubber Estate Superintendent," "Coconut Estate Superintendent," &c. If he is also the proprietor, add "and Proprietor." A clerk's occupation should be fully stated thus: Municipal Accounts Clerk, Kachcheri Gansabhabwa Clerk, Merchant's Clerk, Proctor's Clerk, &c. No one should be entered merely as "Labourer" or "Cooly." It should be stated in what kind of labour he is engaged, thus: Rubber Tapper, Tea Plucker, House Cooly, &c.

Where a woman has an independent occupation or means of subsistence, such occupation should be stated: but where she is employed only in her household duties, cage 10 should be left blank for her.

15. *Cage 11 (If not Earner, means of subsistence of person on whom dependent).*—For non-earners, and those who have no independent occupation or means of subsistence, enter in this cage under the name of each person, the principal occupation or means of subsistence of the person who supports him or her.

Thus, if the head of the family is a lawyer, and his wife and children have no independent occupation or means of subsistence, enter under the name of such wife or child, in cage 11, "Advocate," or "Proctor," as the case may be, and leave cage 10 blank.

A domestic servant should not be deemed a dependent for the purposes of cage 11, for he or she earns a living by domestic service, and should be entered in cage 10 as Cook, Ayah, &c., as the case may be.

STATEMENT OF THE LAW.

1. Section 12 of the Census Ordinance, No. 9 of 1900, provides that a schedule may be left at any dwelling-house to be filled up by the occupier. His legal obligation is to fill it up, or cause it to be filled up, to the best of his knowledge or belief, so far as regards the inmates of the house, to sign to its correctness, and to deliver it to the enumerator.

2. Section 13 of the Census Ordinance provides that schedules may be delivered to—

- Every person in charge of a lunatic asylum, hospital, workhouse, prison, police station, reformatory, lock-up, or of any public, charitable, religious, or educational institution; or to
- Every keeper, secretary, or manager of any hotel, boarding house, lodging-house, or club.

The legal obligation of each such person is to fill up the schedules, or cause them to be filled up, to the best of his knowledge and belief, so far as regards the inmates of the building in his charge, to sign to the correctness of the entries, and to deliver the filled-up schedules to the enumerator.

10. The schedule, which may be left at any lunatic asylum, hospital, workhouse, prison, police station, reformatory, lockup, or any public, charitable, religious, or educational institution, or any hotel, boarding-house, lodging-house, or club, shall be in the form prescribed for any dwelling house.

11. All persons within the Municipal limits of Colombo travelling out of doors, whether on foot, in vehicles or in boats, shall, while the Census is being taken, be bound to stop when required to do so by any census officer.

12. The Master or Captain of any vessel lying in a Ceylon Port at or about February 26, 1931, shall, if required by the Superintendent of Census, or the Master Attendant, or the census authority of the Port report the number of persons on board his vessel.

- Section 19 of the Ordinance provides that any person who—
 - Refuses to answer to the best of his knowledge and belief any question asked of him by an enumerator which he is legally bound so to answer, or wilfully makes a false answer thereto; or
 - Makes, signs, delivers, or causes to be made, signed, or delivered any wilfully false or incorrect schedule, statement, or return; or
 - Refuses to allow the enumerator such reasonable access to a land, house, enclosure, vessel, or other place as he is required by this Ordinance to allow; or
 - Removes, obliterates, alters, or injures, before the expiry of four weeks from the time of the taking of census, letters, marks, or numbers which have been painted, marked, or affixed for the purposes of the census; or
 - Refuses or neglects to comply with any provision of this Ordinance, or of any rule made thereunder—

shall be guilty of an offence, and liable on conviction to imprisonment of either description of a term not exceeding one month, or to a fine not exceeding one hundred rupees, or to both.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended January 17, 1931.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 233 (1 European, 12 Burghers, 146 Sinhalese, 32 Tamils, 32 Moors, and 10 Malays). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1931, viz., 272,200) was 44.6, as against 44.6 in the preceding week, 38.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 33.9 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 114 (2 Europeans, 5 Burghers, 62 Sinhalese, 18 Tamils, 18 Moors, 8 Malays, and 1 Other). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 21.8, as against 26.2 in the previous week, 35.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29.5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 114 total deaths, 23 were of infants under one year of age, as against 39 in the preceding week, 42 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 16.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Seven deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (of non-residents), and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, Maradana South, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta North, as against 17 in the previous week, and 14 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Six deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 each in St. Paul's and San Sebastian, and 1 each in Kotahena South and New Bazaar, as against 5 in the previous week, and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) One death from *Bronchitis* was registered in Maradana hospitals (of a non-resident), as against 4 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. Eleven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Wellawatta South and 1 each in St. Paul's and Kotahena South, as against 9 in the previous week, and 12 the weekly average for last year.

3. One death from *Enteric Fever* was registered in Maradana hospitals, as against 3 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. Twelve deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 6 each from *Worms* and *Debility*, 5 from *Diarrhoea*, 4 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 2 from *Puerperal Septicæmia*, 1 each from *Dysentery* and *Accidents*, and 51 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Thirteen cases of *Chickenpox*; 6 of *Enteric Fever*, and 1 of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 23, 19, and 2, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79.7°, against 80.4° in the preceding week and 79.0° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.906 in., against 29.883 in. in the preceding week and 29.931 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 3.52 in. against 0.14 in. in the preceding week, and 2.05 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

AN auction sale of the under-mentioned ebony will be held at the Central Timber Depot, Kew road, Slave Island, Colombo, on Saturday, February 21, 1931, at 10 A.M., subject to the following conditions:—

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of November 5, 1930, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of November 5, 1930, be confirmed.

2. Dr. E. V. Ratnam, on behalf of Mr. T. G. Jayewardene, who had given due notice, presented a petition from the Carters' Association of Colombo, and asked that it be placed before the appropriate Committees.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. M. L. M. Royal asked the following questions which the Chairman answered:—

Q.—(1) Who the Council's contractor is for the clearing of imported articles of the Council from the wharf?

Q.—(2) Have tenders been called for such and a contract given out?

Q.—(4) If there is a contract, is it an annual one and what are the terms of the contract? A.—(1), (3), and (4).

There is no contract for this service and no tenders have been called for. This Ceylon Wharfage Co., have, for a number of years, cleared the goods consigned to the Council from abroad.

Q.—(2) What were the amounts paid in 1929 and 1930 for this service? A.—Rs. 20,651.30 in 1929 and Rs. 23,625.44 up to October 31, 1930.

Q.—(5) If not, will the Chairman call for tenders for the year 1931 and place them for consideration? A.—The Chairman will be happy to place the matter before the Works and Finance Committees again as he did in October, 1928.

4. Dr. E. V. Ratnam asked the following questions, on behalf of Mr. T. G. Jayewardene, which the Chairman answered:—

Q.—(1) With reference to the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health in his report of October 30, 1929, that three lavatories be built to improve the sanitary condition of New Bazaar Ward and the statement of the Chairman at the Meeting of Council on December 4 last that steps are being taken to select sites for the lavatories recommended and thereafter the cost of acquisition and construction will be worked out, will the Chairman be pleased to state how the position stands at present? A.—Two sites have been selected and the approximate cost of acquisition worked out. The sites will be submitted to the Sanitation Committee for approval.

Q.—(2) Will the Chairman also say what the situation is in regard to the building of underground or covered public drains in this ward, as recommended by the Medical Officer of Health in the same report? A.—The money was voted in the Budget for 1930 and the estimates for dealing with the surface water drains in Prince's Gate and Silversmith street were approved by Council on May 14. This work is due to begin this month.

Provision is made in the Draft 1931 Budget.—Recommended, subject to the votes being passed by the Council.

The Chairman moved that in accordance with the resolution of Council of February 5, 1930, Mr. S. Kumarasingham's appointment should be on three years' probation and that he should be required to pass the two examinations of the Surveyors' Institute to be held locally, within the three years, as a condition of his confirmation. Dr. S. Muttiah seconded.—Carried.

PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

(3) To select from the applicants and submit to the Council the names of 3 candidates for the post of Inspector-in-Charge of the Plague Campaign, indicating, if the Committee thinks fit, the candidate whom they recommend the Council to appoint. Registered No. 1,262.—Recommended that the post of Inspector-in-Charge of the Plague Campaign be classed in group 7.

Resolved that the following names be submitted to Council:—(1) Mr. S. L. Toussaint, (2) Mr. P. T. de Saram, (3) Mr. W. E. Perera, (4) Mr. S. N. Silvestri—with the recommendation that Mr. S. L. Toussaint be transferred to the post of Inspector-in-Charge of the Plague Campaign on his own salary.

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) of November 24, 1930, were considered.

(3) To re-consider—(a) The Colonial Auditor's query No. 31, regarding leave granted by the Chairman to Mr. T. B. Stewart, Assistant Waterworks Engineer, from December 21, 1929 to January 6, 1930. (b) A report of the Municipal Treasurer, dated August 8, 1930. (c) A memorandum thereon of the Chairman. Registered No. 05,128.—Recommended that the recommendation of the Finance Committee of September 20, 1930, be adopted, namely:—"That Mr. T. B. Stewart be granted: (1) Three days leave of absence from December 21 to 23, in lieu of the 1929 Easter Holidays. (2) Leave to be absent from his station during Christmas and New Year holidays, from December 24, 1929 to January 2, 1930, inclusive. (3) From January 3 to 6, 1930, four days vacation leave from the six weeks vacation leave due during 1930."—Mr. S. W. R. Dias Bandaranaike dissented.

(4) To consider the reference by Council of March 5, 1930, regarding the proposed acquisition of land for the playground for Wellawatta:—"That the matter be referred to the Four Standing Committees for consideration of the further suggestion referred to by the Chairman and also of the claims of other Wards." Registered No. 275.—Recommended that the owners of the land adjoining the canal be asked whether they will accept Rs. 25,000 an acre for the two acres on the west of the block. Four members dissented.

(5) To consider the proposal of Government, as announced in *Government Gazette* of November 7, 1930, to lease, without competition, to St. Michael's school, Polwatta, the open space, in extent, 1 rood 7.28 perches, adjoining St. Michael's road, which was previously used as a drying ground. Registered No. 015,428.—Recommended that the Council should agree with the views expressed in the Chairman's letter No. 351/O 15,428 of November 13, 1930, to the Hon. the Colonial Secretary.

(6) The Chairman moved in Committee—That the Council do resume.—Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried.

(7) The Chairman moved in Council that the resolutions of Council in Committee, and the recommendations of the various Committees, subject to any amendments of such recommendations by the Council in Committee, be adopted. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried.

(8) To submit, in terms of section 96 of Ordinance 21 of 1929, a Budget containing:—(a) An estimate of the available Municipal income; (b) Details of proposed expenditure for 1931. The draft budget was laid on the table.

ANNEXURE A.

Rules Regarding the use of the Municipal Hall in the New Town Hall.

1. The hall shall be called the Municipal Hall.
2. The hiring charges shall be as follows :—

	Rs.
(a) Day time—between 7 a.m. and 8 p.m.	75
(b) Night time—between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m.	135
(c) Saturday nights—between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m.	150
Charges per hour :—	
(d) Day time—between 7 a.m. and 6 p.m.	15
(e) Night time—between 6 p.m. and 7 a.m.	20
3. These charges are inclusive of fans, lights, chairs, and use of the piano (if required). Attendance will not be supplied.
4. There shall be no reduction for bookings for a series of dates at these charges and no reduction of charges shall be made in any circumstances whatsoever.
5. Applications for the use of the hall shall be made to the Municipal Treasurer.
6. Applications will be dealt with in the order of their receipt.
7. The Chairman shall have power to direct the Municipal Treasurer to refuse any application.
8. The Municipal Treasurer shall not hire out the hall during office hours for any purpose unless special permission has been obtained from the Chairman.
9. The applicant shall pay the hiring charges and also a security deposit of Rs. 75 with an additional Rs. 25, if the piano is required, to the Municipal Treasurer before the application is allowed. The Municipal Treasurer will issue a receipt and shall endorse upon the receipt the purpose for which the hall is being hired.
10. In the case of a public performance, as defined in the by-laws, published in the *Government Gazette* of July 12, 1918, the hirer shall pay a further sum of Rs. 10 per day as licence fee, and a licence shall be issued to him.
11. The hirer shall not use the hall for any purpose other than that endorsed upon the receipt.
12. If the hirer wishes to obtain from the proper authorities a licence for the sale of intoxicating liquor, his request shall be reported to the Chairman, who shall approve or disapprove, as he thinks fit.
13. The hirer shall be directed to produce the receipt to the Caretaker of the Town Hall, and until the receipt has been produced to the Caretaker, the Caretaker shall not allow the hirer to use the hall.
14. The hirer shall, in no circumstances, attach anything whatever to the walls or ceiling of the hall and it shall be the duty of the Caretaker to see that this rule is strictly obeyed.
15. The deposit shall be returned to the hirer on the certificate of the Caretaker stating that (1) no damage has been done to the hall, verandahs, staircases or rooms used by the hirer and (2) that the hall has been cleared of all goods belonging to the hirer.
16. If any damage has been done to the hall, verandahs, staircases or rooms used by the hirer during the period of hire, such damage shall be made good out of the deposit, any balance being returned to the hirer. If the extent of the damage shall exceed the amount deposited by the hirer, he shall be liable to pay the excess amount. If the hirer fails to remove the goods by the day following the engagement, he shall be liable to pay rent at the rate of Rs. 5 per diem until the goods are removed. This amount shall also be deducted from the deposit.
17. The ordinary cleaning of the hall after use shall be the duty of the Caretaker.
18. In the event of a hirer failing to make use of the hall reserved for him for the purpose for which it was intended, he shall forfeit the fees paid by him unless the hall is subsequently hired for that period in which case he shall forfeit only the difference between his fees and the fees received by the Council and the security deposit only shall be refunded to him. In the case of a hirer who has booked the hall for a definite number of hours, but uses the hall for a lesser number of hours the rent paid in excess shall be refunded.
19. A fee of Rs. 10 shall be charged for the use of the gas cooker, if required by the hirer, and also the cost of the gas consumed.
20. All goods shall be conveyed to and from the hall by the back staircase at the north west corner of the Town Hall.

Mr. T. G. Jayewardene asked that provision be made in the Budget for two lavatories in New Bazaar Ward, and enquired from the Chairman the cost.

The Chairman gave the available particulars, and with regard to the sites stated that one of these had been found to be unsuitable.

After a discussion Mr. T. G. Jayewardene moved that a sum of Rs. 20,000 be included in the Budget for the acquisition of sites and construction of two lavatories in New Bazaar Ward. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman moved that, with this addition, the Estimated Expenditure amounting to Rs. 6,616,502 be passed and that Estimated Deficit be therefore, altered to Rs. 55,786. Dr. R. G. Jayetileke seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman moved that the Council do resume. The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman formally moved in Council that the Budget for 1931, as amended, and the resolutions of Council in Committee with regard thereto be adopted. The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader moved that the Council do record their appreciation of the good work done by the Municipal Treasurer, Mr. G. H. N. Saunders, and his staff, in framing the Budget. Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy seconded.—Carried.

RULES.

1. No buffalo shall be slaughtered and no person shall cause or permit a buffalo to be slaughtered except under and in accordance with the terms of a permit in that behalf from the local authority. Every such permit shall be in the Form A in Schedule II. hereto.

2. No buffalo shall be removed or transported from the area of a local authority to any other area except under a permit in that behalf from the local authority from whose area such removal is to take place. Every such permit shall be in the Form B in Schedule II. hereto.

3. No buffalo meat shall be transported from the area of a local authority to any other area, except under a permit in that behalf from the local authority from whose area such meat is to be transported. Every such permit shall be in the Form C in Schedule II. hereto.

4. The local authority may, in his discretion, refuse or issue a permit for any of the purposes of these rules, or issue such permits subject to such conditions, if any, as he may think fit to impose.
