Improvements in hermetic closures for cans, boxes, and like containers.

Abstract.—The box or container has a flange near the top edge. The lid has a flange at the skirt. A rubber ring, generally stretched and fitting into a groove above the flange on the box is compressed between the two flanges, and, with a partial vacuum in the box, forms an airtight joint. This joint can be broken by piercing with a knife or by pulling a tab.

The claims are :—

1. Means for the hermetic closure of cans, boxes or like containers of the kind specified, comprising a horizontally outstanding external flange or rim on the body of the container below its mouth and formed by flattening a bead, a horizontally outstanding flange on the lower edge of the skirt of the lid or cover and a jointing-ring of rubber or other suitable compressible and elastic material which is compressed, but not bent or doubled on itself into channel section between the said flanges on the container and its cover when the cover is closed down under a vacuum substantially as described.

2. Means for the hermetic closure of cans, boxes or like containers of the kind specified, comprising a horizontally outstanding external flange or rim on the body of the container below its mouth and formed by flattening a bead, a horizontally outstanding flange on the lower edge of the skirt of the lid or cover, and a jointing-ring of rubber or other suitable compressible and elastic material which is placed under tension around the container and is compressed but not bent or doubled on itself into channel section between the said flanges on the container and the lid or cover when the lid or cover is closed down under a vacuum substantially as described.

3. Means for the hermetic closure of cans, boxes or like containers of the kind specified as claimed in claim 1 or claim 2, characterized by the feature that an external groove is provided around the container immediately above its outstanding flange, in which groove the inner edge or side of the jointing-ring bears, substantially as described.

4. Means for the hermetic closure of cans, boxes or like containers of the kind specified as claimed in claim 3,

characterized by the feature that the horizontally outstanding flange on the lower edge of the skirt of the lid or cover is provided with a flattened part at the angle between the flange and the skirt, substantially as and for the purpose described.

5. The improvement in the manufacture of cans, boxes or like containers of the kind specified and intended for hermetic closure by means of an elastic pointing-ring that is compressed but not bent or doubled on itself into channel section between complementary outstanding flanges on the lid or cover and the body of the container, which consists in making the said flange on the body of the container by forming a bead and then flattening the bead between dies, substantially as described.

6. Cans or boxes provided with hermetic closure means substantially as hereinbefore described with reference to the annexed drawings.

Improvements in process for treating rubber latex and product.

Abstract.—An easily hydrolysable salt of a volatile acid and a volatile base is incorporated in the latex in amount enough to impart a pH near or below 7 to the water extract of the rubber obtained by evaporating the latex and then evaporating this, preferably by spray drying. Ammonium halides and nitrate are mentioned as suitable salts.

The claims are :—

1. Process for treating rubber latex which comprises incorporating with the latex an easily hydrolyzable compound of a volatile acid and a volatile base, and manufacturing rubber from the latex by evaporating methods.

2. Process in accordance with claim 1, wherein the easily hydrolyzable compound of a volatile acid and a volatile base is added to the latex in quantity to give a rubber the water extract of which has a pH not over approximately 7.

3. Process in accordance with claim 1 or claim 2, wherein the compound added to the latex is an ammonium salt of a volatile acid.

4. Process in accordance with claim 1 or claim 2, wherein the compound added to the latex is selected from the group comprising ammonium chloride, bromide, fluoride and nitrate.

Abstract.—A float is capable of being moved up a serrated guide rod by rising water, but is prevented from downward motion by the action on the guide rod of pawls or the like attached to the float. The float is provided with a through passage to take the guide rod.

The claims are :—

1. Apparatus for indicating the maximum height reached by a liquid during a determined period of time comprising in combination a movable float, a hollow tube disposed there through, a pawl or plurality of pawls or their mechanical equivalents mounted on said float and a serrated fixed guide-rod arranged coaxially with said hollow tube.

2. Apparatus, in accordance with claim 1, wherein the pawls or their mechanical equivalents are adapted to bear against the guide-rod by the action of gravity and/or by means of springs.

3. Apparatus, in accordance with claims 1 and 2, wherein the pawls or their mechanical equivalents are adapted to engage in the serrations of the guide rod on the cessation of upward motion of the float.

4. Apparatus, in accordance with claim 1, wherein the hollow tube is secured to the body of the float by any suitable means.

5. Apparatus, in accordance with claims 1 and 4, wherein the hollow tube is adapted to form a sleeve for the guide-rod.

6. Apparatus, in accordance with claim 1, wherein the guide-rod may be solid or tubular in section.

7. Apparatus, in accordance with claims 1 and 6, wherein the serrations of the guide-rod are formed of suitable shape for the purpose described.

8. Apparatus, in accordance with claims 1, 6, and 7, wherein the serrations of the guide-rod are spaced at suitable intervals for the purpose described.

9. Apparatus for the purpose explained, constructed, arranged or adapted to function substantially as described or substantially as described and illustrated.

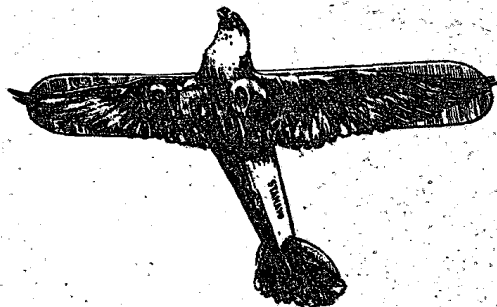

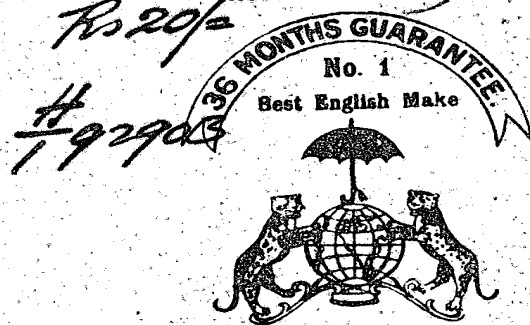

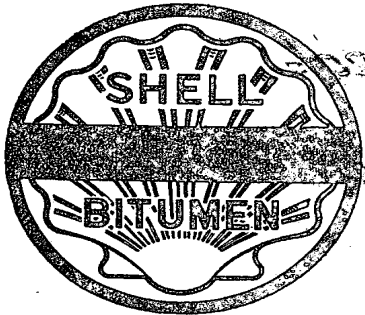

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended February 21, 1931.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 160 (3 Europeans, 12 Burghers, 87 Sinhalese, 31 Tamils, 18 Moors, 7 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1931, viz., 272,200) was 30.7, as against 35.6 in the preceding week, 39.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 33.9 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 143 (4 Burghers, 79 Sinhalese, 30 Tamils, 19 Moors, 6 Malays, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 27.4, as against 25.1 in the previous week, 32.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29.5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 143 total deaths, 28 were of infants under one year of age, as against 24 in the preceding week, 38 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 13.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Eighteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 11 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in Kotahena North, and Maradana East, and 1 each in New Bazaar, Maradana North, and Slave Island, as against 16 in the previous week, and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Nine deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 6 in San Sebastian, and 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, and New Bazaar, as against 3 in the previous week, and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Two deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in Maradana South and Wellawatta South, as against 7 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Fourteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents) and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Maradana East, Maradana South, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 13 in the previous week, and 12 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Two deaths from *Phthisis* of residents of Colombo town, occurred at the Anti-tuberculosis hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Five deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents) and 1 in Slave Island, as against 2 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. (a) One death from *Plague* was registered in St. Paul's. The number registered during the preceding week as also the weekly average for last year was 1.

(b) One death from *Plague* of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Infectious Diseases hospital, Angoda, during the week.

5. Fourteen deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 10 from *Debility*, 5 from *Diarrhoea*, 2 each from *Infantile Convulsions*, *Homicide*, and *Accidents*, 1 each from *Dysentery*, *Worms*, *Tetanus*, *Suicide*, and *Puerperal Septicæmia*, and 54 from *Other Causes*.

6. **Reported Cases.**—22 cases of *Chickenpox*, 9 of *Enteric Fever*, and 2 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 12, 9, and 6, respectively of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.4°, against 80.3° in the preceding week and 78.5° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.921 in. against 29.920 in. in the preceding week and 30.001 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.01 in. against 0.40 in. in the preceding week and 0.18 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
