7. Children to attend School.—The parent of every child other than a Muslim or Tamil girl, of not less than 6 more than 14 years of age and the parent of every Muslim and Tamil girl of not less than 6 nor more than 10 years of age shall cause such boy or girl to attend a school, unless he has made other adequate and suitable provision for the statement of the statement provision for the education of such boy or girl, or unless there is a reasonable excuse for his or her non-attendance;

provided, that (a) no child shall be compelled to attend, a school from a distance of more than 2 miles, (b) no boy less than 8 years of age shall be compelled to attend a school more than 1 mile from his residence, and (c) no girl shall be compelled to attend a school more than I mile from her residence or a school in which no female teacher is employed.

By-laws regarding the Tax on Vehicles and ANIMALS.

- 1. The returns required to be furnished under section 179 of the Ordinance by an owner or other person whether resident within the urban area or outside and liable or deemed to be liable to pay taxes in respect of animals or vehicles shall be made in the form in Schedule A hereto. which shall be supplied by the Council and shall be filled up and returned by the person to whom such schedule is addressed.
- 2. If any person, after having filled up and returned such schedule, shall acquire, keep, or use any vehicle or animal, not mentioned in such schedule, he shall within one month of acquiring any such vehicle or animal, notify the Chairman in writing of the fact of such acquisition, and further furnish true and correct information in respect of every such vehicle or animal so acquired, kept, or used.

Whoever fails or neglects to notify the Chairman or to furnish such information as aforesaid shall be liable to a

fine not exceeding twenty-five rupees.

- 3. Subject to the provisions of section 175 of the Ordinance any person who has furnished the schedule referred to in by-law I shall without further notice be liable in respect of vehicles or animals entered in such schedule, to pay the tax for the year for which such schedule is furnished, and any person who has sent the written notice required by by-law 2 shall be liable to pay the tax on vehicles or animals referred to in such notice for the year in which such vehicles or animals were acquired by him or otherwise came into his possession.
- 4. Any person who, having furnished the schedule required by by-law 1 or the written notice required by by-law 2, claims to be exempt from the liability to pay any tax in respect of a vehicle or an animal which has been in his possession for less than 30 days in any year and is entered in or referred to in such schedule or notice shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Chairman of his claim for such exemption specifying the grounds on which such claim is made.

5. The annual tax prescribed under the provisions of section 175 of the Ordinance shall be paid on or before March 31 in every year in respect of all vehicles ordinarily used or to be used within the limits of the Matara Urban District Council and in respect of the animals if any employed in drawing them whether such vehicles have or have not been licensed under the provisions of the Vehicles Ordinance, No. 4 of 1916.

6. On payment of the annual tax the Chairman shall issue or cause to be issued in respect of every vehicle for which such tax is paid a metal plate with distinguishing letters for the several kinds of vehicles as specified in the Schedule B hereto and with figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number

in the register of vehicles.

Such plate shall be fixed on a conspicuous part of the vehicle in respect of which the plate was issued.

7. Where the plate prescribed by these by-laws has not been duly affixed to any vehicle ordinarily used or to be used within the limits of the Matara Urban District Council the owner or person in charge of any such vehicle in respect which the prescribed plate should have been so affixed shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding fifteen rupees.

# Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, December 13, 1930, at 9 a.m., pursuant to notice dated December 6, 1930.

Present:—Mr. G. S. Wodeman, Chairman; the Hon. Mr. H. M. Macan Markar, M.L.C.; the Hon. Mr. C. E. de Vos, M.L.C.; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. D. I. Durham; Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe; Mr. F. W. Sproule; Mr. T. Amarasuriya; Dr. S. P. Joseph; and Mr. P. R. Gunasekara.

The Minutes of the General Meeting of November 15, 1930, a copy thereof having been furnished to each

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. I. Durham asked the following questions:—(1) Can the Chairman give any information with regard to the Whaling Station at Watering Point? 5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. I. Durham moved.—That this Council do revert to paying the scale of charges in force before November 1, 1930, for the destruction of stray dogs in the Councillimits. The Hon. Mr. C. E. de Vos seconded. The Chairman explained the reasons for the reduction of the rates. The motion was put to the Meeting and carried.

# VITAL STATISTICS.

# Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended February 28, 1931.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 159 (2 Europeans, 5 Burghers, 103 Sinhalese, 24 Tamils, 19 Moors, 4 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1931, viz., 272,200) was 30.5, as against 30.7 in the preceding week, 37.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 33.9 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 121 (6 Burghers, 68 Sinhalese, 23 Tamils, 15 Moors, 5 Malays, and 4 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 23.2, as against 27.4 in the previous week, 31.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29.5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 121 total deaths, 30 were of infants under one year of age, as against 28 in the preceding week, 33 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 12.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Fourteen deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents, 2 each in Kotahena South and Slave Island, and 1 each in Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Wellawatta North, and Wellawatta South, as against 18 in the previous week, and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Four deaths from Influenza were registered, I each in San Sebastian, New Bazaar, Maradana North, and Kollupitiya, as against 9 in the previous week, and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from Bronchitis were registered, I each in New Bazaar, Maradana hospitals (of a non-resident), and Maradana South, as against 2 in the previous week, and 4

the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Seven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents) and 1 each in New Bazaar and Maradana North, as against 14 in the previous week, and 12 the weekly average for last

(b) Three deaths from *Phthisis*, of residents of Colombo town, occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama,

during the week.

3. (a) Two deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, I each in Maradana hospitals and Slave Island, as against 5 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Two deaths from Enteric Fever, of residents of Colombo town, convend at the Infactious Diseases Hospital

Colombo town, occured at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.

- 4. Eight deaths from Debility were registered, 5 each from Enteritis, Infantile Convulsions, and Accidents, 4 from Dysentery, 2 each from Worms and Puerperal Septicaemia, 1 each from Tetanus and Suicide, and 58 from Other Causes.
- 5. Reported Cases.—Twenty-six cases of Chickenpox, 8 of Enteric Fever, 1 of Measles, and 1 of Plague were reported during the week, as against 22, 9, nil, and 2, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather .- The mean temperature of air was State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.4°, against 81.4° in the preceding week and 81.0° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.920 in., against 29.921 in. the preceding week and 29.910 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was nil against 0.01 in. in the preceding week and 0.06 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
