RULES REFERRED TO.

Definition.—For the purpose of these rules a collecting station means a place in which (a) a distiller or a person nominated by him or (b) a toddy renter or a person nominated by him holds a licence to possess toddy collected from tapping gardens before it is removed to the distillery or the tavern.

1. No toddy shall be brought to a distillery except from a licensed collecting station ; nor shall toddy be brought to a tavern by cart or motor vehicle except from a collecting station.

2. Daily accounts of all toddy received in the distillery shall be kept in the following form, the third column of which shall be totalled at the end of the day :—

Date. 1	Number of the collecting Station. 2	Quantity of Toddy brought. 3

Daily accounts of all toddy received in a tavern shall be kept in such form as the Excise Commissioner may prescribe from time to time.

3. Accounts shall be open to inspection at any time of the day by Excise officers not below the rank of Inspector.

THE Officer Administering the Government has under section 24 of "The Excise Ordinance, No. 8 of 1912," directed that all licences to draw toddy for the supply of distilleries or taverns shall be subject to the following conditions, and be in the form given below.

CONDITIONS.

1. The licensee may tap the trees and draw the toddy himself or may employ for the purpose the tapper whose name is given in the licence.

All toddy drawn under this licence for the supply of a distillery or a tavern shall be delivered at a collecting station named in the licence, provided that toddy drawn for the supply of a tavern and transported other than by cart or motor vehicle may be delivered at the tavern direct. No toddy shall be disposed of in any other manner.
3. No trees shall be tapped between 6 P.M. and 6 A.M.
4. No toddy shall be kept in the tapping garden after — of the day on which it is drawn.
5. No toddy shall be taken into any house or shed, but shall either be taken direct from the tree foot to the collecting station or be poured into a transport cask placed in the open garden.
6. The toddy drawn shall not be diluted or adulterated in any manner.
7. All vessels in which the toddy is collected or transported shall be kept scrupulously clean.
8. No trees shall be tapped under this licence, nor shall fermented toddy be drawn from any tree, nor shall any pot be attached to any toddy producing tree, until the tree has been marked as prescribed by the Excise Commissioner nor shall the licensee tap any tree but those which he is hereby licensed to tap.
9. The licensee shall be bound to bring down the pots attached to any of the trees for inspection on the demand of any Excise Officer or Village Headman.
10. No toddy drawn under this licence shall be gifted.

Excise Notification No. 215.

IN respect of toddy drawn for the supply of distilleries and toddy taverns, the Officer Administering the Government has under section 24 of “The Excise Ordinance, No. 8 of 1912,” directed that licences for the possession of such toddy in a collecting station before its removal to the distillery or to the toddy tavern shall be subject to the following conditions and be in the form given below.

CONDITIONS.

1. The collecting station shall be enclosed by a fence of barbed wire up to a height of 4 feet and the intervals between the strands of wire shall not exceed, foot.

2. No person shall be employed in transporting, measuring, or collecting toddy unless he holds a transport pass; provided that a tapper may bring toddy drawn by him to the collecting station without a transport pass. Nor shall any person under the age of 16 be employed for any of these purposes. No person who does not hold such pass shall be admitted into a collecting station except tappers as provided above.

3. A complete list of all persons employed in tapping and in transporting, measuring, or collecting toddy shall be kept in the station.

4. A signboard shall be placed in the collecting station containing the following particulars :—

- (i.) The name of the distillery or toddy tavern.
- (ii.) The name of the village in which the collecting station stands.
- (iii.) The number of the collecting station.

5. Accounts shall be kept in the following form in English, Sinhalese, or Tamil :—

6. The first page in the book of accounts shall contain the following particulars :—

- (i.) Name of person licensed to draw toddy for delivery at the collecting station.
- (ii.) Names of tappers, if any, employed by him.
- (iii.) Licence number.
- (iv.) Number of trees licensed on each licence.
- (v.) Number of the transport pass for transporting the toddy to collecting station.

7. The accounts shall by day be open to inspection by all Excise Officers not below the rank of Inspector.

8. Gifting of toddy, and every form of disposal of toddy, other than dispatch to the distillery or toddy tavern is prohibited.

9. Dilution of toddy or adulteration in any manner is prohibited.

10. A collecting station shall not be less than 5 yards distant from a dwelling house, and shall abut on a main road.

11. All vessels for the collection or transport of toddy shall be kept scrupulously clean, their capacities shall be legibly marked on them in paint and dip-rods reading in gallons shall be provided for and kept with such vessels as have a greater capacity than 10 gallons.

12. Prompt notice of breakdowns on any day in the means of transport which might reasonably be expected to cause infringement of the conditions of the Transport Pass shall be given on that day by telegram or written message to the officer in charge of the nearest Excise Station or Excise Office.

13. The licence shall be exhibited in a prominent place in the collecting station.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended March 7, 1931.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 171 (3 Europeans, 7 Burghers, 115 Sinhalese, 17 Tamils, 20 Moors, 8 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1931, viz., 272,200) was 32·8, as against 30·5 in the preceding week, 41·8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 33·9 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 114 (1 European, 4 Burghers, 64 Sinhalese, 24 Tamils, 17 Moors, 3 Malays, and 1 Other). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 21·8, as against 23·2 in the previous week, 25·2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29·5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 114 total deaths, 23 were of infants under one year of age, as against 30 in the preceding week, 19 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 8.

Principal Causes of Death.—(a) Seven deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena South, Maradana South, and Slave Island, as against 14 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Five deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 each in Kotahena North and Slave Island and 1 in San Sebastian, as against 4 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Six deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 each in Kotahena South and Maradana hospitals (of non-residents) and 1 each in Kotahena North and Slave Island, as against 3 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Eight deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 4 in Kotahena South, 2 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 each in St. Paul's and Slave Island, as against 7 in the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Two deaths from *Phthisis* of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. (a) Four deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered in Maradana hospitals, as against 2 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Two deaths from *Enteric Fever* of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Angoda, during the week.

4. Two deaths from *Plague* were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's and San Sebastian, as against nil in the previous week and 1 the weekly average for last year.

5. Eight deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 7 from *Debility*, 4 from *Puerperal Septicæmia*, 3 from *Worms*, 2 each from *Tetanus* and *Accidents*, 1 each from *Diarrhoea*, *Dysentery*, *Infantile Convulsions*, and *Homicide*, and 52 from *Other Causes*.

6. **Reported Cases.**—Forty-one cases of *Chickenpox*, 12 of *Enteric Fever*, 2 of *Plague*, and 1 of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 26, 8, 1, and 1 respectively of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 83·5° in the preceding week and 80·5° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·920 in., against 29·920 in. in the preceding week and 29·870 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·39 in., against nil in the preceding week and 0·28 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

T. 458 of the Municipal Engineer's Department, who is condemned by a Medical Board as unfit for further service. The gratuity is based on his service of 147 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 41.96. Registered No. 1,546.—Recommended.

(29) To recommend, under rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 126.27 to cooly woman, Allagie, B. T. 4,068 of the Municipal Engineer's Department, who is condemned by a Medical Board as unfit for further service. The gratuity is based on her service of 156 months and her average monthly pay of Rs. 14.57.

Note.—This cooly woman's service had been interrupted by breaks aggregating to 19 months in all and there is no reliable evidence as to their cause. But they can be condoned under the second proviso to section 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, which runs as follows:—"It shall, however, be competent for the Council, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor, to award such gratuities in cases in which the service has not been continuous." Registered No. 1,547.—Recommended.

(30) To recommend, under rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 726·14 to Krishnan, Head cooly of the Municipal Council Stores, who is condemned by a Medical Board as unfit for further service. The gratuity is based on his service of 341 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 38·33. Registered No. 32.—Recommended.

(31) To recommend, under rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 98·44 to Parwadi, B. T. 2,723 of the Municipal Engineer's Department, who is condemned by a Medical Board as unfit for further service. The gratuity is based on his service of 145 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 12·22. Registered No. 48.—Recommended.

(32) To recommend, under rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 1,043·09 to Conservancy Overseer, D. J. Edirisinghe, of the Municipal Engineer's Department, who retires on the ground of overage. The gratuity is based on his service of 231 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 81·28. Registered No. 76.—Recommended.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on December 20, 1930, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated December 16, 1930.

Present:—Mr. R. H. Whitehorn, Chairman; Ratwatte Adigar; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva; Dr. G. P. Hay; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa; Mr. H. P. G. Young.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on November 15, 1930, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1929 to November, 1930, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's report for November, 1930.
- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of November, 1930.
- (e) The reservoir readings for November, 1930.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during November, 1930.

4. Petitions:—Mr. Geo. E. de Silva presented petition from (1) R. Narayanasamy and D. H. Wijeweera, occupiers of spaces in the market premises, begging that the present arrangements under which they hold the spaces be not disturbed and that they be allowed to continue to occupy them and to pay the rent regularly as they had done hitherto.

(2) Certain ratepayers in Hewahetta-Talwatta asking that their premises be not reassessed during the new year.

Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake presented petition from (1) certain traders of the Kandy Market begging that they be allowed to pay the arrears of rent due on their stalls and spaces in instalments.

(2) M. S. Sahul Hameed begging that he be given two or three stalls in the Market for the sale of beef and mutton.

(3) W. A. de Silva begging that he be given the vacant stalls Nos. 24 and 25 in the Kandy Public Market.

Mr. W. A. B. Soysa presented petition from (1) certain traders in Kandy complaining of the inconvenience caused to them by reason of the buses which load and unload their goods being not allowed to halt outside their business houses, which are away from the specified halting places for buses.

(2) A. B. A. Mohamado and others complaining of the loss caused to their trade as a result of goods being brought from Colombo and auctioned for sale regularly by unlicensed auctioneers.

The Chairman undertook to look into the matters referred to in the several petitions.

5. Correspondence:—(1) Letter No. W. 385/30 of December 10, 1930, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, intimating that authority has been issued to the Surveyor-General for the survey of the land required for use as an extension to the camp for segregating contacts from houses where infectious diseases occur.—Read.

(2) Letter No. M. 249/30 of December 13, 1930, from the Clerk to the Executive Council authorizing the Government Agent to acquire the land required for use as a Trenching Ground and for the construction of an Infectious Diseases Hospital at Gohagoda—for the information of the Chairman.—Read.

6. (1) Pursuant to notice Mr. de Silva moved:—"That the Conservancy and Scavenging of the Kandy Municipal area be entrusted to Contractors." With the permission of the House he added the words "and that a Committee be appointed to consider the details." Ratwatte Adigar seconded the motion, as amended.

The Chairman moved as an amendment:—"That a Committee of this Council be appointed to consider what economies and improvements can be effected in the Scavenging and Conservancy of the Council, and whether these services should be given on contract." Dr. G. P. Hay seconded.

The amendment proposed by the Chairman was put to the House and was lost by three to five:—

Ayes.—The Chairman, Dr. G. P. Hay, Mr. H. P. G. Young.

Noes.—Ratwatte Adigar, Mr. Geo. E. de Silva, Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail, Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake, Mr. W. A. B. Soysa.

After further discussion the following resolution was carried by five to three votes:—

"That the Conservancy and Scavenging of the Kandy Municipal area be given on contract and that a Committee be appointed to consider the details as to when and how such contract may be given."

Ayes.—Ratwatte Adigar, Mr. Geo. E. de Silva, Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail, Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake, Mr. W. A. B. Soysa.

Noes.—The Chairman, Dr. G. P. Hay, Mr. H. P. G. Young.

It was also resolved that the Committee consist of the Chairman and all the Members of Council.

6. (2) Pursuant to notice Mr. de Silva moved:—"That this Council do take steps to impress on the Central Government the necessity of putting into immediate operation the proposed reforms to the Kandy Municipal Council, which were unanimously adopted in the year 1922." Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake seconded.

The motion was unanimously carried.

6. (3) Pursuant to notice Mr. de Silva was to have moved:—"That this Council deplores the policy of closing down alternate standpipes in the town when water is abundant as thereby the ratepayers are put into great inconvenience."

In view of the fall in the level of the reservoir since Mr. de Silva gave notice of his motion, Mr. de Silva withdrew the motion with the permission of Council.

6. (4) Pursuant to notice Mr. de Silva moved:—"That this Council do request the Registrar of Motor Vehicles to grant all owners of motor cars, buses, and lorries an extension of time till the end of March, 1931, for the payment of licensing fees for the year 1931, in consideration of the severe hardships they are experiencing as a result of the depression in the country." Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail seconded.

After discussion the motion was amended and passed in the following form:—"That this Council suggests to the Registrar of Motor Vehicles to grant all owners of motor cars, buses, and lorries an extension of time for the payment of licensing fees for the year 1931, in consideration of the severe hardships they are experiencing as a result of the depression in the country."

7. Draft conditions in connection with the proposal to call for tenders for Lorry Services.

Resolved that the matter be considered by the Special Committee appointed in connection with the question of giving the Conservancy and Scavenging on contract.

8. Papers relating to the proposed extensions on Municipal limits.

Resolved that the matter be considered at the meeting of the Special Committee to be called to consider the question of giving the Scavenging and Conservancy on contract.

9. Papers relating to the proposed amendments to the Pension Rules.

Resolved that the amendments be passed.

10. Petition from M. K. Marikar Saibo asking that he be allowed to continue the brick kiln at premises No. 478, Peradeniya road, and connected papers.

Resolved to instruct the Medical Officer of Health to allow the petitioner such time as the Medical Officer of Health may think necessary for burning the bricks that have been already stacked.

11. To sanction the expenditure of Rs. 80, the cost of partitioning of Stalls Nos. 22 and 23, Public Market.—Resolved that the expenditure be sanctioned.

12. To approve the leasing of premises No. 81, Trincomalee street, for a period of five years for the Municipal Free Library.—Resolved to defer the matter for further consideration.

13. To sanction the lease of a plot of land at Mahaiyawa to the Parish Priest, St. Anthony's Cathedral, for the erection of a Chapel for the Municipal coolies.—Resolved that the lease be sanctioned accordingly.

14. To authorize the carrying out of minor repairs to leaks in taps, such as the renewal of springs or washers free of charge.—Resolved that authority be allowed to carry out the minor repairs mentioned, free of charge, with effect from January 1, 1931.

15. To elect a member to serve on the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment.

Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail was elected to serve on the Committee.

16. Recommendations of Standing Committees:—

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects held on November 15, 1930.

(1) Papers relating to the desirability of amending by law 213 relating to dangerous trees, so as to make it a penal offence for owners of premises to refuse to carry out the order to cut down dangerous trees in their premises.—Recommended to amend the by-law so as to provide for an order of court in failure to cut down, similar to that obtained under the provisions of the Housing Ordinance for demolition of buildings erected without permission.

(2) Letter dated October 22, 1930, from Mr. A. G. Frugtnit suggesting the desirability of building a retaining wall in front of his premises No. 11, Bahirawakande, and stating that he is prepared to pay half the estimated cost of Rs. 975.—Recommended to pay half the cost; the estimate to be referred to the Works Committee.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation held on November 15, 1930.

(3) Application dated October 20, 1930, from Mr. K. H. S. de Silva for the Fish Stall at Katugastota as no trade is carried on thereby the present licensee.—Recommended that the licence be cancelled and the premium auctioned.

(4) Letter dated September 19, 1930, from Mr. H. Harmanis Soysa, the licensee of Space No. 19, Small Market, stating that he desires to enrol Mr. P. A. Albert as his partner, and asking that the name of the latter be entered in the licence as Joint Licensee.—Recommended.

(5) Papers relating to the applications from Mr. A. M. Mohamado Meera Saibo, the licensee of the Rice Dépôt at premises No. 74, Katukele for the transfer of his licence to trade in the Rice Dépôt.—Recommended that the licence be transferred in favour of Hameed, provided the Chettiar agrees, on payment of arrears plus fee of Rs. 100.

(6) Papers *re* the proposal to make a general prohibition of the sale of articles by the roadsides, under section 203 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance.—Recommended that no course is feasible save to make a general prohibition of roadside sales, and to countenance exceptions where the vendors carry out such sanitary improvements as the Medical Officer of Health lays down, or provided that no objection is raised on grounds of obstruction, &c.

(7) Application dated October 13, 1930, from Mr. D. E. P. Joseph, Sanitary Inspector, asking that he be given the designation of Chief Sanitary Inspector.—Recommended that the designation of Senior Sanitary Inspector be given to Mr. Joseph.

(8) Letter dated October 16, 1930, from Mr. P. K. Abdul Cader, the Licensee of Spaces Nos. 58 and 59, Public Market, stating that he is taking on Mr. S. M. Zainulabdeen as his partner in the business carried on at the Spaces, and asking that the latter's name be entered in the licence as Joint Licensee.—Recommended.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment held on November 15, 1930.

(9) To sanction the purchase from Messrs. Miller & Co. of eight dozen buttons for Firemen's Uniforms at a cost of Rs. 36.—Recommended.

(10) To obtain a vote of Rs. 8.75 to meet the cost of oil cans, &c., supplied to the Town Clock Keeper for oiling the Town Clock.—Recommended.

(11) To obtain supplementary provision for Rs. 7,196 to meet probable excesses of expenditure over the estimates in respect of certain votes.—Recommended.

(12) Letter No. S. K. 1096 of October 13, 1930, from the Superintendent of Police, Central Province, Kandy, asking for the supply of 2,000 cartridges in connection with the destruction of dogs.—Recommended.

(13) To consider whether quarterly demands should be served on Absentee-landlords in respect of rates due on premises owned by them. Recommended to advise registered Absentee-landlords at the close of the quarter when rates are unpaid.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works held on December 5, 1930.

(14) Estimate for Rs. 1,110 from the Municipal Engineer for improvements to the road leading to the Mulgampola cemetery.—Recommended.

(15) To approve of the expenditure of a sum of Rs. 25 from savings under the Head "Car Park in Peradeniya road" for a survey, with spot levels, of the Katugastota road playground, with a view to its conversion into a Car Park.—Recommended.

(16) Estimate for Rs. 25 from the Municipal Electrical Engineer for providing two bathing spouts near the Power Station for males and females.—Recommended.

(17) Estimate for Rs. 175 from the Municipal Engineer for repairing the book shelves and almirahs at the Municipal Free Library.—Recommended.

(18) Estimate from the Municipal Engineer for Rs. 3,500 for improving the drain running through premises No. 25/26, Peradeniya road.—Recommended to obtain an agreement from the trustee of Pullayar Kovil that if this wall is put in hand he will absolve the Council from any further liability, and that all future responsibility must rest with him.—Recommended also to add that this Council accepts no legal liability in the matter.

(19) Mr. D. S. Rajapakse's offer to repair wells in Lady McCallum's Drive at Rs. 500 each.—Recommended to proceed with the one well in respect of which there is no objection: the other three to be started when satisfactory conditions have been made.

Notarial agreements to be obtained from all landowners.

Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Electricity Committee held on December 5, 1930.

(20) Application from Mr. G. H. G. Goonewardena for an increase of salary.—Recommended to give Messrs. Goonewardena and Thomas, Rs. 900 each from January 1, 1931, with annual increments thereafter as in Grade III.—Resolved that the recommendations be adopted.

17. To approve the sale by public auction of the privilege to trade in certain Market Stalls and Spaces: Resolved to allow the defaulting Stall and Space holders to pay their arrears in regular monthly instalments, added to the monthly rent, and to eject any Stall or Space holder who makes default in any such payment.

18. Papers *re* the sale of right to collect Market Daily Rents. Resolved to approve the conditions of sale, subject to the insertion of an additional clause preventing the contractor from having a regular set of traders carrying on business on the pavement or anywhere else on the Market grounds.

19. To elect a member to serve on the Standing Committee on Municipal works and the Electricity Committee.

Mr. H. P. G. Young was elected to serve on both Committees.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on December 20, 1930, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—(a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1929 to November, 1930, on account of the Municipal Fund ; (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date ; (c) Health Officer's report for December, 1930 ; (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of December, 1930 ; (e) The reservoir readings for December, 1930.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during December, 1930.

4. Petitions :—Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake presented a petition from Mr. K. Mohideen asking for permission to run a tea kiosk opposite the Bus Stand near the Market.

Mr. W. A. B. Soysa presented a petition from Mr. A. C. M. Haniffa for a beef stall and a mutton stall in the Public Market.

Mr. Geo. E. de Silva presented a petition from Mr. K. Mohideen, a copy of that presented by Mr. Wijayatilake.

The Chairman undertook to look into the matters referred to in the several petitions.

5. Correspondence :—(1) Letter No. W 320/30 of October 27, 1930, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, intimating that Government has decided to postpone proceeding with Back Lane Scheme B pending improvement in financial position.—Read.

(2) Letter No. W 44/26 of November 26, 1930, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, authorizing an expenditure not exceeding Rs. 7,000 against the vote of Rs. 90,000 appearing in the estimates for 1930–1931 for completing the Back Lane Scheme for Block I. and proceeding with preliminaries in respect of the schemes for Blocks E and F which are in course of preparation.—Read.

(3) Letter No. W 314/30 of December 19, 1930, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, forwarding copy of a draft Ordinance to amend the Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910.—Read.

(4) Letter No. W 112/26 of January 9, 1931, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, intimating that the Government is unable to undertake the reform of the constitution of the Kandy Municipal Council until the measures which are pending for the reform of the Colombo Municipal Constitution have been completed.—Read.

(5) Letter dated December 11, 1930, from the General Manager, Baptist Mission Schools, inquiring whether the Council would lease to the Mission a plot of land on the Upper lake road lying below the Wace park to erect more commodious premises for the Baptist Mission Free Vernacular School.—Read.—Resolved that the applicant be informed that the Council does not consider it desirable to lease the site applied for by the Baptist Mission for a Free Vernacular School.

6. Application to effect alterations to the Queen's Hotel.—Resolved to approve generally the Chairman's proposals, subject to a technical report being obtained from the Queen's Hotel regarding the quality of the effluent, which shall satisfy the Council that no nuisance or danger to health is likely to be caused.

Resolved also that a provision be inserted in the lease enabling the suspension of the privilege of way-leave if nuisance is caused. The above to be subject to the barrel drain being found in suitable repair to receive the effluent.

Resolved also that the use of lake water must be subject to interruption without raising a claim for damages.

7. Applications from D. S. Perera and M. F. Ibrahim for the post of Collector of Fees from stands for motor vehicles.

Resolved to inform the applicants that the Council does not propose to effect any alteration in the present arrangements for the collection.

8. To obtain a vote of Rs. 350, fee payable to Mr. S. N. R. Breckenridge for indexing the books of the Free Library.

Resolved that the vote be sanctioned.

9. Application for ten months' furlough leave from the Secretary, with effect from April 1, 1931.

Resolved that the leave be granted. Mr. E. B. Peiris, the Accountant, to act as Secretary during the Secretary's absence on leave, and to receive one-third of his own salary as acting pay for the period of the commuted leave.

(1) Revised by-laws relating to the Public Markets and the condition for the issue of market licences.—Recommended.

(2) Petition dated November 21, 1930, from outstation vegetable vendors who bring their vegetable for sale to the Kandy Market on market days, asking that they be permitted to unload their vegetable at the market grounds earlier than they are allowed now.—Recommended that vegetable vendors from outstations be allowed to unload their vegetable at the market grounds during the whole of the day preceding market days.

(3) Papers re the proposal to put up a notice at the car and bus stand outside the Queen's Hotel prohibiting bus and car drivers from causing nuisances at the stand, under by-law 209.—Proposal recommended as amended.

(4) Papers re the proposal to give Mr. Yooseof Mohamado, the Joint Licensee of Market Granary 1 A, notice of permanent ejection owing to his preventing the partitioning of the granary.—Proposal recommended.

(5) Application from Mr. A. Habibu Mohamado to erect a rice boutique and a tea kiosk at No. 33, Mavilmada.—Recommended that there can be no objection to mud and wattle in rural areas for a tea boutique only, but if rice is to be sold, the regulations must be insisted upon.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment held on December 20, 1930.

(6) To sanction the payments of Rs. 11.70 and 2.94 as overtime to the Librarian and peon of the Municipal Free Library, respectively, for the work done by them in connection with the cataloguing and cross-indexing of the library books.—Recommended.

(7) To obtain sanction for the payments of Rs. 312, Rs. 302, and Rs. 108 as compensation for the acquisition of certain lots of land in connection with the widening of Lady MacCarthy's road.—Recommended.

(8) Municipal Engineer's memo dated December 3, 1930, asking for a ruling on the new leave by-law 19 in reference to the payment of the "Child Birth" allowance to Municipal coolies.—Recommended that the "Child Birth" allowance be given in addition to the 14 days' leave.

(9) To obtain sanction for the expenditure of a sum of Rs. 28.58, incurred in excess of the vote of Rs. 325 sanctioned for the purchase of an additional siren for the fire engine.—Recommended.

(10) To sanction the refund of a sum of Rs. 4,943.54 to Government in respect of grant in lieu of rates overpaid on Military buildings.—Recommended.

The recommendations were adopted with the exception of (4). In regard to (4), the Chairman mentioned that Mr. Yooseof Mohamado had seen him and expressed his willingness to allow the granary to be partitioned. It was resolved to give Mr. Mohamado half share of the granary, if he allowed it to be partitioned immediately, and to impose a fine of Rs. 25 on him for obstructing the Council's employees from doing this work before, the money to go to the Kandy Social Service League.

In connection with (1), Mr. de Silva raised the question of having a few stalls in the Public Market set apart for the sale of beef and mutton by persons, other than present stall holders.—It was resolved to have the two vacant stalls made into two beef and one mutton stalls and to call for applications to be circulated to the Council. The approved applicants, thereafter, to bid for the premia for occupation of the stalls subject to approval of the Council, which will not be bound to accept the highest or any tender.

11. To reappoint the following Special Committees:—
