WHEREAS by section 5 and sub-section (b) of "The Forest Ordinance, 1907," it is enacted that when the following event has occurred, viz., when lands have been declared to be the property of the Crown by an order passed under "The Waste Lands Ordinances, 1897 to 1903," the Governor may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, declare all or any of such lands or any part or parts thereof to be reserved forest, and such Proclamation shall specify the limits of the forest which it is intended to reserve, and declare the same to be reserved from a date fixed by such Proclamation:

And whereas the lands hereinafter mentioned have been declared the property of the Crown by orders passed under "The Waste Lands Ordinances of 1897, 1899, 1900, and 1903," dated October 10, 1913; December 19, 1913; March 13, 1914; August 27, 1920; and June 29, 1923, and appearing in *Government Gazettes* Nos. 6,584 of October 10, 1913; 6,598 of December 19, 1913; 6,615 of March 13, 1914; 7,124 of August 27, 1920; and 7,336 of June 29, 1923; and it is expedient to specify the limits of such forest:

Know Ye that We, the Officer Administering the Government, do hereby proclaim the forest, the limits of which are set forth in the schedule hereto, to be reserved forest from and after May 1, 1931; and We do hereby further specify the limits of the said reserved forest to be those set forth in the said schedule.

The rules made by "The Public Service Mutual Provident Association" under section 14 of the said Ordinance dated June 14, 1892, and published in *Government Gazette* No. 5,147 of June 17, 1892, as amended by the Notifications specified in the schedule hereto shall be further amended as follows:—

1. Rule 2 of Chapter I. shall be revoked and the following substituted therefor:—

Applications for membership and powers of Committee of Management in respect thereof.

2. (1) Application for admission shall be addressed to the Secretary and shall be in such form as may from time to time be prescribed by the Committee of Management. Membership shall commence from the first day of the month to which the first contribution is credited in the Association's books in due course and the name of an applicant shall be inscribed in the Register of Members as from such date.

(2) Any member who shall make a false statement in his application shall forfeit all moneys paid by him into the Association and his privileges as a member, unless he shall satisfy the Committee of Management that such false statement was not wilfully made.

(3) Every applicant for membership of the Association shall undergo a medical examination by a Physician nominated by the Committee of Management, and for such purpose shall with his application for membership

remit to the Joint Secretary and Treasurer of the Association a medical fee, not exceeding Rs. 7.50, as the Committee of Management shall from time to time fix.

(4) The Committee of Management shall decide on all applications for membership, and if they decide to reject any application they may do so without assigning any reason therefor.

2. Rule 4 of Chapter I. shall be revoked and the following substituted therefor:—

4. Every member shall contribute monthly to the fund of the Association a sum equal to either 2½ per centum, 5 per centum, 7½ per centum, or 10 per centum of his monthly salary or pension as he chooses. It shall be lawful for any member, by notice in writing given to the Joint Secretary and Treasurer of the Association on or before the first day of the month in and after which such increase or decrease is to have effect, to increase or decrease the percentage of his salary or pension so contributed by him within the limits and in accordance with the percentages above specified:

Provided that no member shall be permitted so to alter the percentage of his salary or pension so contributed by him more often than once in any period of twelve months:

Provided also that any member who is also a contributor to the Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund may contribute either at one of the above-mentioned rates or at the rate of one per centum of his salary or pension, save when the amount so to be contributed would be less than fifty cents per mensem, in which case he shall contribute fifty cents per mensem.

Provided further that any member may cease to pay his contributions on attaining the age of sixty years.

3. Rule 7A of Chapter I. shall be amended by the deletion of the following paragraph at the end thereof:—

Provided also that in the case of any former member who has been so reinstated in the Public Service or in the service of any quasi-Government Department, or granted a pension, prior to the publication in the *Gazette* of the confirmation of this rule by the Governor in Executive Council the date of such reinstatement of such former member or of his being granted a pension shall, for the purpose of this rule, be deemed to be the date of publication of such confirmation.

4. Rule 8 of Chapter I. shall be revoked and the following substituted therefor:—

Disposal of balance at credit on death of members.

8. (1) Upon the death of any member the amount to his credit in the books of the Association less any sum for which he is indebted to the Association shall be paid to his widow and legitimate children (which expression shall mean and include the legitimate issue of any deceased legitimate child per stirpes or by representation) in the proportions of one-half to the widow and one-half to the children in equal shares.

(2) Should there be no widow, the widow's one-half share also shall be divided among the legitimate children in manner provided in paragraphs (1) and (4) of this rule.

(3) Should there be no legitimate children, the whole amount shall be paid to the widow.

(4) Should any member desire that the legitimate children's share be distributed otherwise than in equal shares or that it be paid to any one or more of his legitimate children to the exclusion of the remainder, it shall be lawful for him to notify the Joint Secretary and Treasurer of the Association in writing of the distribution which he desires should be made and such notification shall, if received not less than one month prior to such member's decease, be binding upon the Association. Such notification by a member may be cancelled by such member at any time.

(5) Failing widow and children the amount shall be paid to the nominee or nominees of such member to the exclusion of his legally constituted heir or heirs or of any heir or heirs under an intestacy as set forth in sections 26 to 40 of Ordinance No. 15 of 1876; or failing a nominee or nominees, to his legally constituted heirs or to the heir or heirs under the intestacy or into court to the credit of his estate. Provided that no nomination shall be valid unless made and reported for registration at least one month prior to the decease of such member:

Provided also that in the case of minors it shall be lawful for the Committee of Management at their discretion, in the absence of a legal guardian, to pay the shares of minors to their natural guardian, if any, or to deposit the amount in the Ceylon Savings Bank until majority is attained. The Committee of Management may withdraw the interest accruing on moneys so deposited,

and pay the same to any person who may satisfy them that the money will be expended on the maintenance or for the benefit of the minors.

5. Sub-section (g) of rule 1 (ii.) of Chapter II. shall be revoked and the following substituted therefor:—

(g) Loans to members outstanding under rules 12 and 13, exclusive of interest thereon.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended March 14, 1931.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 163 (1 European, 10 Burghers, 93 Sinhalese, 31 Tamils, 21 Moors, 5 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1931, viz., 282,870) was 30.0, as against 32.8 in the preceding week, 33.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 33.9 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 121 (1 European, 7 Burghers, 68 Sinhalese, 18 Tamils, 22 Moors, 2 Malays, and 3 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 22.3, as against 21.8 in the previous week, 26.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29.5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 121 total deaths, 25 were of infants under one year of age, as against 23 in the preceding week, 24 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of still births registered during the week was 12.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Ten deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents) and 1 each in Kotahena North, Maradana North, and Kollupitiya, as against 7 in the previous week, and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Four deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 in New Bazaar and 1 each in San Sebastian and Slave Island, as against 5 in the previous week, and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Six deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents) and one each in Maradana North, Maradana East, and Wellawatta South. The number registered during the preceding week was also 6, and the weekly average for last year was 4.

2. Nineteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Kotahena South, 2 each in San Sebastian, New Bazaar, and Slave Island, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, and Wellawatta North, as against 8 in the previous week, and 12 the weekly average for last year.

3. Three deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident) and 1 in Wellawatta North, as against 4 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from *Plague* was registered in San Sebastian, as against 2 in the previous week, and 1 the weekly average for last year.

5. Six deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 5 each from *Worms*, *Tetanus*, and *Debility*, 4 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 3 from *Dysentery*, 1 each from *Diarrhoea*, *Suicide*, and *Accidents*, and 47 from *Other Causes*.

6. **Reported Cases.**—Twenty-nine cases of *Chickenpox*, 13 of *Enteric Fever*, 2 of *Measles*, and 1 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 41, 12, 1, and 2, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.7°, against 82.4° in the preceding week and 81.2 in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.941 in., against 29.920 in. in the preceding week, and 29.910 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1.36 in. against 0.39 in. in the preceding week and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Improvements in or relating to the manufacture of copper alloys.

Abstract.—Alloys of copper and iron in any desired proportion are produced by the use of an appropriate quantity of silicon. Such alloys, with or without the addition of phosphorus, are used as hardeners in the formation of high grade copper alloys with properties similar to those of bronze, phosphor-bronze, gunmetal and the like.

The claims are :—

1. A method for producing an alloy of iron and copper wherein iron and copper are caused to form a homogeneous alloy in all proportions by the addition of a sufficient quantity of silicon without other admixture.

2. A modification of the method claimed in claim 1 wherein a quantity of phosphorus not exceeding 10 per cent. is added.

3. A hardener for use in the manufacture of alloys consisting principally of copper, the composition of said hardener being maintained within the following limits :—

Iron	5 to 70 per cent.
Copper	20 to 85 do.
Silicon	10 to 65 do.

the quantity of silicon incorporated being sufficient to ensure the homogeneous alloying of the iron and copper.

4. A hardener according to claim 3, containing in addition phosphorus within the limits of from 0.1 per cent. to 10 per cent.

5. A hardener according to claim 3 or 4 for use as a substitute for tin in the manufacture of alloys of the character of bronzes, phosphor-bronzes or the like.

6. A hardener alloy, as in claim 3, 4 or 5, containing approximately 4 parts each of copper and silicon, 2 parts of iron and an amount of phosphorus equal to approximately 1 per cent. of the whole.

7. The process for the manufacture of copper alloys which consists in adding to copper a hardener as claimed in claim 3, 4, 5 or 6.

8. Alloys consisting predominantly of copper with which is alloyed the hardener as claimed in claim 1 or 2 or 3 or 4 or 5 or 6.

9. Alloys consisting predominantly of copper but containing also silicon up to 5 per cent., iron up to 12 per cent., and with or without phosphorus up to 1 per cent., the silicon being present in sufficient quantity to ensure the homogeneous alloying of the iron and copper substantially as described.

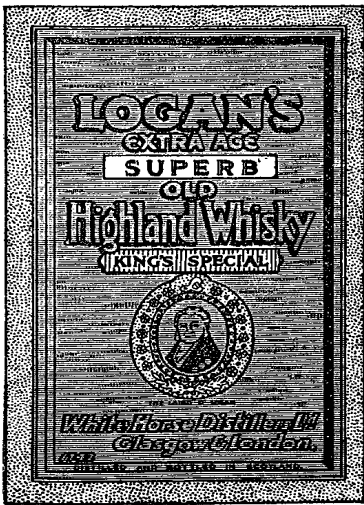

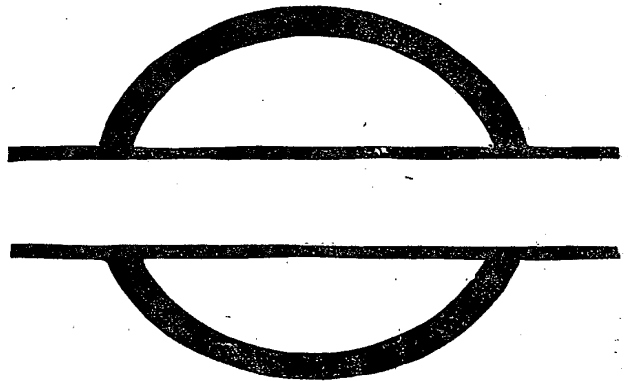

(b) Rs. 583·25 for laying a 3 in. main from the Galle-Matara road to Sea street.—Recommended. (c) Rs. 125 for building a tank for washing conservancy buckets.—Recommended. (d) (1) Rs. 10,000 for building drains along China Garden Middle street.—Recommended.

(2) Rs. 1,200 for building a drain from the China Garden public latrine.—Recommended. Tenders for (d) (1) and (2) to be invited.

(3) Papers *re* compensation payable for setting back premises No. 36 to 69 Bazaar to the street line, as and when they are rebuilt.—Recommended that (1) the application to rebuild No. 57 Bazaar be refused unless the building is set back to the street line ; (2) Inquiries be made from other public bodies regarding the basis of compensation payable under the provisions of Ordinance No. 19 of 1915.

(4) To recommend 7 applications for water service.—Recommended.

(6) To consider audit query referring to the payment of Rs. 264·75 made to contractor Ameresinghe for the construction of a drain along Dangedera road.—Recommended that audit be informed that the Council was threatened with litigation, and in view of the fact that no second opinion was taken before the drain was broken, Council was advised to compromise rather than let the matter be taken to Court.

Resolution.

With regard to item (3) it was resolved that the papers be referred back to the Standing Committee. The recommendation of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

5. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of December 20, 1930.*

(2) Papers relating to the extension of the Police limits.—Recommended that (1) the area north of Hume road and Cripps road lying within an imaginary line 3 chains west of Richmond Hill road, 3 chains north of Kumbalwella road, and 3 chains east of Elliott road be included in the Police limits and the rates increased accordingly ; (2) water and lighting be provided along Elliott road.

(4) List of demolished buildings in ward 4E, 4W, and 5.—Recommended that the rates be struck off.

(5) To consider a petition from licensed butcher M. B. Ismail that his licence for 1931 be not cancelled.—Recommended that the action taken by the Chairman be approved.

(6) To consider Audit Query relating to the payment of Rs. 264·75 made to contractor Ameresinghe for the construction of a drain along Dangedera road.—Recommended that the Council was informed that the Council was threatened with litigation ; and in view of the fact that no second opinion was taken before the drain was broken, Council was advised to compromise rather than let the matter be taken to Court.

(7) Lease of the trees in the Segregation Camp and Infectious Diseases Hospital.—The Chairman explained that the trees had been leased for five years from January, 1928, at Rs. 520 per annum. The lessee has petitioned for a reduction of the rent for 1931 and 1932 to Rs. 320 per annum owing to the present depression. Recommended that in view of the present position of the industry the rent for 1931 be reduced to Rs. 320 and that the matter be reconsidered at the end of 1931.

(8) To consider Audit Query relating to the advance given to Mr. E. H. Jansen :—The Committee agree that the terms of the advance are generous, but they do not recommend that they be altered. In future no loan should exceed three months' salary, and re-payment should be in 12 monthly instalments.

Resolution.

With regard to item (8) it was resolved that re-payment shall be in not more than 18 monthly instalments, and $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. interest charged on the amount outstanding.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

ARRACK RENT SALE CONDITIONS.

THE Officer Administering the Government has, under section 18 of "The Excise Ordinance, No. 8 of 1912," directed that the following are the conditions on which the exclusive privilege of selling arrack by retail within any local area is granted:—

Period for which the privilege will be sold.
Tenders which will not be accepted.

1. The privilege will be sold for the period from October 1 to September 30 next following on application by way of tender in the form and manner prescribed in these conditions.

2. No tender will be accepted from any person—

(a) whose name appears on the list of defaulting contractors, or on the list of defaulters in respect of toll, arrack, or toddy rents, or on the list of persons precluded for other reasons from having any concern in any Government Rent; or

(b) whose name is on the Excise Register of Offenders; or

(c) who is a habitual criminal or who has been convicted of any crime or of any Excise offence; or

(d) whose licence has been cancelled under section 26 of the Excise Ordinance, No. 8 of 1912.

Government Agent's power to reject tenders.
Tender forms.

3. The Government Agent may refuse to accept any tender.

4. Every tender shall be made on the prescribed form (which may be obtained from the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent of the district within which the tavern in respect of which the tender is to be made is situated), and shall bear affixed to it an uncanceled revenue stamp of Rs. 10. The value of this stamp will not be refunded, whether the tender is or is not accepted.

5. The privilege may be granted for the local area of an individual tavern, or for the area of a group of taverns as the Government Agent may decide.

Tenders to be in tenderer's own name.

6. Every tender must be made by the tenderer in his own name. No tender will be accepted if made through an agent.

Deposit receipt to accompany tender.

7. Every tender shall be accompanied by a Treasury or Kachcheri receipt acknowledging the deposit of a sum of Rs. 500, and the number and date of the receipt must be entered on the face of the tender form.

Refund of deposit.

8. If any tenderer, on being declared to be the purchaser of the privilege, declines to sign these conditions of sale or fails to furnish the required security when called upon to do so, the deposit of Rs. 500 made under condition 7 will be declared to be forfeited and the defaulter will render himself liable to have his name entered in the list of defaulters in respect of toll, arrack, or toddy rents. Subject to this exception the deposits of all tenderers will be returned after the conditions of sale have been signed by the successful tenderer.

Delivery of tender forms.

9. Every tender must be placed in a sealed envelope clearly marked in the top left hand corner with the name of the tavern in respect of which the tender is made and its number on the list of sanctioned taverns. The envelope shall be (a) deposited in the Kachcheri Tender Box, or (b) handed to the Government Agent or to the Assistant Government Agent or to his Office Assistant, or (c) sent by registered post so as to reach the Kachcheri before the time fixed for closing the tenders.

Privilege will be sold to person making the highest tender.

10. (a) Subject to conditions 2 and 3 above the privilege will be granted to the person offering the highest rent (exclusive of duty and cost price) in respect thereof.

No remission of rent.

(b) No remission of rent payable in respect of the privilege will be granted on any plea of the grantee's having over-estimated the value of any tavern or on any other ground.

Transfer of the privilege.

(c) The privilege shall not be transferable otherwise than with the sanction of the Governor first had and obtained.

(d) The successful tenderer (hereinafter referred to as "the grantee") shall pay the rent to the Government Agent in twelve equal monthly instalments. The first instalment of the rent shall be deemed to be due and payable on September 30, 19—, and succeeding instalments shall be deemed to be severally due and payable on the last day of each succeeding month. Interest at the rate of 9 per centum per annum shall be payable in respect of all arrears.

Duty and cost price.

11. In addition to the rent the grantee shall pay in respect of every gallon of arrack (at 33 degrees, or not more than 35 degrees, underproof) removed from the Government Warehouse the cost price and duty at the rates shown in Schedule A.

Signing of conditions and of bond and deposit of security.

12. (a) The grantee shall, immediately on being granted the privilege, sign these conditions and pay to the Government Agent as a security deposit a sum equivalent to three months' rent of the privilege which amount shall be liable to be forfeited by the Government Agent for breach of any of these conditions or for non-payment of instalments and such forfeiture shall be in addition to any other penalty prescribed by these conditions for such breach. The grantee shall also within fourteen days of the sale of this privilege enter into a bond with the Government Agent for the full amount for which he has purchased it and he shall specially hypothecate by such bond the said security deposit.

Warrant of attorney.

(b) The grantee shall at the same time execute, if so required by the Government Agent, a power of attorney in the form sanctioned by law to confess judgment in any action which may be instituted against him for the realization of the said sum as liquidated damages.

Postal address for notices.

(c) The grantee shall, on signing these conditions, elect and signify under his hand a Post Office or postal address to which all notices and processes whatever in connection with the privilege may be addressed under registered cover; and all such notices or processes as aforesaid, so addressed to such post office or so directed to such postal address, and posted in the due course, shall be deemed to be good and effectual for all purposes as if they had been served upon the grantee in person upon the day on which any such notice or process was so posted.

Consequence of failure to pay instalments, &c., when due.

(d) If any instalment or part of any instalment of the purchase money, or rent or any duty, fee, cost price or other sum due to the Crown from the grantee remains unpaid after the same shall have become due and payable, the Government Agent shall have power, after fourteen days' notice to the grantee of his intention to do so, without further process to law, to cancel the licence or licence issued to the grantee, and to resell this privilege at the risk and loss of the grantee. Such notice may be given in such manner as the Government Agent thinks fit.

Prohibition of "Off Sales."

13. The grantee shall not sell any arrack under the privilege in the tavern specified in Schedule B hereto for removal from such tavern.

14. The grantee shall have no concern or interest direct or indirect, (a) in the sale of fermented toddy, or (b) in the purchase of any privilege of selling toddy, or (c) in the sale of foreign liquor within the area to which the privilege of selling arrack relates. Toddy excluded
15. The grantee shall purchase arrack only from the Government Warehouse specified in respect of the district within which the tavern is situated in Schedule C hereto, and in quantities not less than those prescribed in the said schedule. Purchase from Government Warehouse minimum quantities.
16. The grantee shall accept such arrack as is available at the Government Warehouse, whether in bulk or in bottles. Such arrack as is available to be accepted.
17. The grantee shall draw such proportion of each consignment drawn by him as the Excise Commissioner or his Deputy or Assistant may require in sealed bottles. Proportion in sealed bottles.
18. The grantee shall pay all sums due to the Crown on account of duty, cost price, and the extra cost for bottled arrack at the Kachcheri of the district within which the area to which the privilege relates is situated and shall obtain a receipt therefor. Such receipt shall be delivered to the officer in charge of the warehouse, not later than 12 noon on the day on which the grantee wants to take delivery of the arrack. The Warehouse Officer will deliver to the grantee the quantity of arrack in respect of which the duty, cost price, and extra cost for bottled arrack, if any, have been paid. Payment at Kachcheri.
19. The grantee shall have no claim against the Crown for compensation (beyond a proportionate refund of the amount paid) in respect of any failure by the Crown for any reason whatsoever to deliver the full quantity for which the grantee has made payment at the Kachcheri as aforesaid. Refund in respect of quantity paid for and not delivered.
20. No payment of any sum due by the grantee to the Crown shall be deemed to have been duly made, unless the grantee shall produce a Kacheheri receipt in respect thereof. Kacheheri receipts alone valid.
21. The Government Agent shall have power, at his discretion, to refuse to issue any order on the Warehouse for the supply of arrack to the grantee till all arrears of rent in respect of the privilege have been settled with interest. Power of Government Agent to refuse order for arrack.
22. The grantee shall open the tavern or taverns on a day to be fixed by the Government Agent. Taverns to be opened on date fixed by Government Agent.
23. If the grantee, or any agent of, or person employed by the grantee, is, during the continuance of the privilege, convicted of an offence under Chapter XIII. of the Ceylon Penal Code, the Government Agent may, without notice to the grantee, cancel the privilege. Short measure, consequences.
24. The grantee shall be responsible for all acts of his agents and employees in relation to the privilege. Responsibility for agents' acts.
25. The grantee shall not have or make any claim to any reduction, or to the remission, of any sum due and owing by him to the Crown by reason of any loss alleged to have been sustained by him, whether on account of any closing of the tavern during the passage of troops or during the encampment of troops in the vicinity of the tavern or during the holding of any poll, or through any other cause whatsoever.
26. The grantee shall take over from the out-going grantee and pay to him an amount, which may be agreed on, equal to the cost of—
- (a) The balance of arrack remaining in a tavern, after the closing hour of the date of expiry of the privilege of the out-going grantee, and
- (b) Any bottled arrack, and
- (c) Transport, wastage, and other miscellaneous charges.
27. Where the in-coming and out-going grantee cannot agree with regard to the sum to be paid as aforesaid the out-going grantee shall forthwith remove the balance of arrack of a strength not below 35 degrees underproof on a permit, to the nearest Excise Warehouse, and deliver it to the Excise Warehouse Officer in charge thereof and obtain a receipt.
- The out-going grantee shall present such receipt to the Excise Commissioner who shall pay to such grantee the value of the arrack as delivered at the rates of duty, cost price, and extra cost of bottled arrack, if any, at which such grantee purchased such arrack.
- If the sum payable as duty and cost price by the in-coming grantee on arrack so taken over by him is higher than the sum paid for the said arrack by the out-going grantee, the in-coming grantee, shall, within fourteen days of the commencement of his privilege, pay such difference to the nearest Kachcheri.
28. (A) The rent shall be determined by (a) the expiry of the term for which the privilege shall have been granted; (b) the death of the grantee; (c) or breach of any of the conditions governing it. Termination.
- (B) The grantee shall account for all arrack purchased by him from time to time. The allowance made on account of wastage will under no circumstances exceed two per centum of the total quantity purchased. The grantee to account for all arrack purchased.

TODDY RENT SALE CONDITIONS.

THE Officer Administering the Government has, under section 18 of "The Excise Ordinance, No. 8 of 1912," directed that the following are the conditions on which the privilege of selling fermented toddy by retail is granted:—

1. *The rent period shall be :*

(a) In the Northern and Eastern Provinces from July 1 till June 30 next following : provided that the rent of any tavern supplying palmyra toddy only may be sold for such less period as the Government Agent may in his discretion determine.

(b) In all other Provinces, from October 1 to September 30 next following.
2. The Government Agent shall have power, in his discretion, to refuse to accept any bid or tender; subject to which power the highest bidder or tenderer shall be declared to be the purchaser of this privilege, and shall conform to and perform all the conditions under which this privilege is sold.
3. (i.) Where toddy rents are sold by tender the Government Agent may, if he considers it necessary, require that a deposit of Rs. 50 be made by every tenderer in respect of his tender. The deposit so made by the successful tenderer shall be liable to forfeiture should he fail to sign these conditions immediately he is declared the purchaser. The deposits of unsuccessful tenderers will be refunded after the sale is concluded.
- (ii.) No person is permitted to send in more than one tender for any one tavern.
4. Any person whose bid or tender is accepted and who fails to sign these conditions of sale or who, having signed these conditions of sale, makes default in respect of any condition, will be liable to be put on the list of defaulting renters, and no bid or tender will thereafter be accepted from such person in respect of the rent of any tavern.
5. The successful bidder or tenderer (hereinafter referred to as the grantee), shall immediately on being declared the purchaser of the rent, sign these conditions of sale and pay to the Government Agent as a security deposit a sum equivalent to two month's rent of the privilege, which amount shall be liable to forfeiture, in whole or in part at the discretion of the Government Agent, for breach of any of these conditions; and such forfeiture shall be in addition to any other penalty prescribed by these conditions for such breach. The grantee shall within fourteen days of the sale of this privilege enter into a bond with the Government Agent in form Excise T 23 for the full amount for which he has purchased it, and he shall specially hypothecate by such bond the said security deposit.
6. If the highest bid or tender under condition 2 exceeds the sum of Rs. 2,000, the grantee shall at the time of the execution of the bond as aforesaid execute, if so required by the Government Agent, a power of attorney in the form sanctioned by law, to confess judgment in any action which may be instituted against him for the recovery of any moneys due in respect of this privilege, and shall also furnish to the Government Agent within fifteen days of the date of the execution of such power of attorney a duly certified copy thereof for filing in the District Court under section 32 of the Civil Procedure Code.
7. The grantee shall, on signing the conditions of sale, elect, and under his hand signify, a post office to which all notices and processes whatever in connection with this privilege may be addressed under registered cover; and all such notices or processes as aforesaid so addressed to the post office so elected and posted in due course shall be considered as good and as effectual for all purposes as if the same had been served upon the grantee in person.

8. The grantee shall pay the purchase money or rent due in respect of this privilege and any further duty, fee, cost price, or other sum due by him to the Crown, to the Government Agent. The payment of the purchase money or rent shall be made in equal monthly instalments. The first instalment of the purchase money or rent shall become due and payable on 1931, and the subsequent instalments shall become due on the last day of each succeeding month. Interest at the rate of 9 per cent. per annum shall be payable in respect of all arrears.

9. No payment of any sum due by the grantee to the Crown shall be deemed to have been duly made unless the grantee shall have paid such sum at the Treasury or at a Kachcheri and shall have obtained an official receipt therefor; and no money which, for his own convenience, the grantee may think fit to leave in the hands of any shroff or any other officer of any Kachcheri shall be deemed to be money paid under this contract.

10. If any instalment or any part of any instalment of the purchase money or rent, or any duty, fee, cost price, or other sum due to the Crown from the grantee remains unpaid after the same shall have become due and payable, the Government Agent shall have power, after fifteen days' notice to the grantee of his intention to do so, without further process of law, to cancel the licence or licences issued to the grantee, and to resell this privilege at the risk and loss of the grantee. Such notice may be given in such manner as the Government Agent thinks fit.

11. The grantee shall at least twenty-one days before the date on which this privilege commences to run furnish to the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Excise an application on the prescribed form showing the numbers and situations of the trees which he proposes to tap for the supply of fermented toddy for sale at each tavern and the situations and numbers of the collecting stations for toddy which he proposes to establish; and no trees shall be tapped or toddy drawn in pursuance of this privilege otherwise than under cover of a licence setting forth the numbers and situations of such trees, the name of the drawer, the name of the owner or possessor of such trees, and the tavern for which the fermented toddy is intended. Any application to tap additional trees for any tavern shall be made to the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Excise three weeks before the grantee intends to commence to tap such trees. The Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Excise shall have power, subject to appeal to the Excise Commissioner, to refuse any application to tap trees for any tavern if such application is, in his opinion, open to serious objection.

N.B.—Tapping of trees in dry areas will not usually be permitted.

12. (i.) If toddy is to be transported in pursuance of this privilege by lorry, cart, or railway, the grantee shall establish collecting stations on the main road in places approved by the Circle Officer.

(ii.) The grantee shall keep at each collecting station a book, in which he shall cause the following particulars to be entered daily:—

(a) The quantity of toddy received from each tapper;

(b) The quantity of toddy in each consignment dispatched to the tavern, with the time of dispatch; and

(c) The number of the transport pass covering each such consignment, the method of transport, and the registered number of the cart or motor vehicle employed.

The grantee shall further cause the registered number of the cart or motor vehicle employed to be noted on each such transport pass.

(iii.) The grantee shall cause the morning yield of all trees to be lowered before 8.30 A.M. daily and the afternoon yield of all trees to be lowered before 4.30 P.M. daily. He shall cause every such yield to be removed at once to the proper collecting station. He shall not allow any toddy to be kept at any place other than a collecting station after 10 A.M. in respect of the morning yield or after 5.30 P.M. in respect of the afternoon yield.

(iv.) The grantee shall cause all toddy from the morning yield to be delivered at the tavern before 11 A.M. daily and all toddy from the afternoon yield to be delivered at the tavern before 6 P.M. daily:

Provided that in any case in which toddy is transported to any tavern from any place more than 20 miles distant therefrom, the Excise Commissioner may, if he thinks fit, extend the time, whether in respect of the morning yield or of the afternoon yield, within which such toddy may be delivered at the tavern.

(v.) The grantee shall cause the capacity of every storage vessel used for storing toddy at any collecting station to be marked upon it, and shall provide a dip rod for use therewith.

13. (1) The grantee shall not—

(a) Permit any tree to be tapped or toddy to be drawn from any tree for the supply of fermented toddy for sale at any tavern, unless such tree has first been marked for this purpose in the manner prescribed by the Excise Commissioner;

(b) Permit any toddy to be transported to any tavern otherwise than under cover of a pass issued by the Superintendent of Excise or an Assistant Superintendent of Excise to the grantee and setting forth the name of the person who is to transport the toddy.

(2) The grantee shall obtain separate passes for the transport of toddy by pingo carrier from the tree tope to the collecting station and for its transport by cart, lorry, or other vehicle from the collecting station to the tavern, and shall deliver the appropriate pass to such pingo carrier or to the person in charge of such cart, lorry, or other vehicle.

14. (a) If the grantee wishes to make vinegar from toddy he shall obtain a vinegar licence from the Government Agent. 16. The Government Agent shall not be bound to find a site for any tavern in the event of the grantee not being able to procure a site. The grantee shall not open a tavern on any site otherwise than with the approval of the Government Agent.

17. The grantee shall, within ten days from the date on which this privilege commences to run, or within such extended time as the Government Agent may allow, obtain from the Government Agent a licence or licences for the sale by retail of fermented toddy at the taverns within the area covered by this privilege.

18. (a) The Government Agent hereby reserves to himself the right to order the grantee to close any tavern for such period during the passage of troops or during the holding of any poll as the Government Agent thinks fit.

(b) The grantee shall not have or make any claim to any reduction, or to the remission, of any sum due and owing by him to the Crown by reason of any loss alleged to have been sustained by him, whether on account of such closing of any tavern during the passage of troops or during the holding of any poll, or through any other cause whatsoever.
