WHEREAS section 34 of "The Ceylon Railways Ordinance, 1902," provides that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to declare by Proclamation any road or path which the Railway may cross to be a "minor crossing" and whether such "minor crossing" shall be closed by gates or not;

And whereas it is deemed expedient to declare a road crossed by the Railway between Kodikamam and Meesalai stations in the Northern Province a "minor crossing";

Now know Ye that in exercise of the aforementioned powers vested in the Governor, I, the Officer Administering the Government, do hereby declare the road defined in the schedule hereto to be a "minor crossing" as from April 10, 1931, and that the said "minor crossing" shall not be closed by gates.

REGULATION made by the Officer Administering the Government in Council under section 253A of "The Criminal Procedure Code, 1898."

REGULATION.

Regulation 4 of the regulations under the said section dated October 17, 1927, published in *Government Gazette* No. 7,611 of October 21, 1927, is hereby revoked and the following substituted therefor:—

4. (1) No travelling allowance other than the fare shall be payable under Schedules A, B, or C for any portion of the journey to the Court-house or place where the trial or inquiry is held, which might reasonably have been performed by the railway or any regular motor, coach, steamer, or boat service.

Provided that witnesses, jurors, and assessors in Classes I. and II. of the schedules may draw mileage allowance, instead of tram or bus fare, if they have actually travelled by private or hired car or carriage.

(2) For any part of the journey which is performed on foot, travelling allowance shall be payable at the rate of 5 cents per mile subject to the limitation to fare by railway or other regular service imposed by the preceding sub-section.

(3) No batta shall be drawn under Schedules A, B, or C by any witness, juror, or assessor going by steamer if travelling in a class in which food is included in the fare payable by a passenger.

(4) Subject to any special direction by the Judge presiding at the trial, the amount payable to a witness shall be paid upon the production of a certificate from the Registrar or Secretary of the Court that there is no reason why the said amount should be disallowed. Payment of the expenses for attendance at the preliminary inquiry in the Police Court may be made on the certificate of the Magistrate after committal.

(5) Where two or more persons entitled to charge car or carriage hire under these rules use the same car or carriage on a journey, mileage shall be payable only to one person in respect of the conveyance used.

BY-LAW.

By-law No. 213 of the by-laws made by the Municipal Council, Kandy, dated December 18, 1906, and published in *Gazette* No. 6,165 of January 11, 1907, shall be revoked and the following substituted therefor:—

By-law No. 213.—Whenever any tree, or branch, or fruit of a tree, within the limits of the Municipality, shall be deemed by the Chairman to be likely to fall upon any house or building and injure the occupiers thereof, or whenever the same shall overhang any street, it shall be lawful for the Chairman to cause notice in writing to be given to the owner or to the occupier of the ground upon which such tree stands

to cut down or remove the said tree or branch or fruit; and if such owner or occupier shall not cut down or remove the same within three days of such notice, he shall be guilty of an offence punishable under by-law 306, and shall be liable to pay all expenses incurred by the Council in cutting down such tree or branch or fruit—such expenses being recoverable from the owner or occupier as provided by sections 223 to 228 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910.

AMENDMENTS REFERRED TO.

Clause 27 (a).—Insert a new clause as follows:—

Clause 27 (a).—The amendment of any regulation or any new regulation affecting the payment of grant to schools will, unless otherwise provided for in such amendment or regulation, come into operation at the beginning of the school year after such amendment or regulation has been confirmed by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council and published in the *Government Gazette*.

Clause 29 (second paragraph).—Add the following sentence:—

This will not apply to any appointments made on or after January 1, 1931, or to any appointments on salaries less than the approved scales which have not already been approved by the Director.

Clause 30.—The first two paragraphs to be called 30 (a).

Clause 30 (b).—The third paragraph of clause 29 to be renumbered 30 (b) and amended to read as follows:—

In the case of full-time or part-time vernacular teachers included in the staff for work in the primary classes, the grant paid shall be the salaries of such teachers according to the scale for vernacular teachers in English schools (Appendix A., Class IV.), or the salaries according to the appropriate scale for English teachers (Appendix A.) less the Manager's contribution (Appendix B.). Schools where more than one Oriental language is taught in the primary classes, may employ a full-time or part-time teacher in addition to the staff reckoned under clause 30 (a).

Clause 30 (c).—Clause 30 (b) to be renumbered 30 (c) and amended to read as follows:—

English schools which conduct an approved post-primary course in an Oriental language or languages up to the standard of at least the English School-Leaving Certificate may be allowed to employ, in addition to the staff reckoned under clause 30 (a), a full-time or part-time teacher for each such Oriental language. In schools where there is an average attendance of more than 150 learning an Oriental language in the post-primary classes, a further additional teacher may be allowed for each such Oriental language. Provided that the teacher or teachers employed in teaching the Oriental language shall have either—

- (i.) passed an examination in the Oriental language not lower in standard than one of the following:—

The Vernacular Teachers' Certificate,
The London Intermediate,
The Intermediate or Bala Pundit examination of the Oriental Studies Society or the Jaffna Oriental Society or the Madura Tamil Sangam.
The final examination in Arabic of a recognized Madrassa, or

(ii.) been approved on other grounds by the Director. The salary of such teachers will be according to the scale either—

- (a) of Vernacular teachers in English schools, or
(b) of English teachers.

Provided in the latter case that in addition to the qualifications in the Oriental language referred to above, the teacher holds at least an English Teacher's Certificate.

The grant for teachers of Oriental languages employed partly or wholly in the post-primary classes will be the salary according to the appropriate scale (*vide* Appendix A.) less the Manager's contribution (*vide* Appendix B.).

After 1936 no teacher of Oriental languages in the post-primary classes of English schools, who does not possess the requisite qualifications both in English and in the Oriental language, will be recognized for grant.

Nothing in these regulations shall affect adversely the position or salaries of Vernacular teachers already approved for grant in English schools.

Clause 30 (d), (e), (f).—The present sub-clauses 30 (c), (d), (e) to be renumbered 30 (d), (e), (f).

Clause 20.—Add a new sentence as follows: "A course of instruction up to Standard V. in the mother tongue of the pupils must be provided in each school."

Clause 30.—Insert a new clause as follows after clause 30.

Clause 30A.—The number of teachers eligible for grant at the end of the school year shall neither be increased by any new appointments nor maintained by the appointment

of any new teachers to fill a vacancy* except under the following conditions:—

(i.) Schools which have an average attendance of not more than 90 eligible pupils for the school year will be allowed to count one teacher for every 15 units of average attendance. For the units of average attendance over 90, one teacher will be allowed for every 20 units. Fractions of over one-half the quota shall count for an additional teacher.

(ii.) In making the above calculations the following conditions will be substituted for the conditions appearing in clauses 30 (c) and 38 (a), (b), and (h):—

(a) Schools in which there are a number of over-age pupils in the Elementary School-Leaving Certificate class, the Commercial class, or the Cambridge Senior or London Matriculation forms, will be allowed to count the attendance of these pupils for calculation of eligible staff up to ten per cent. of the average number of pupils on the roll in these classes.

(b) The attendance of the following pupils will be counted in calculating the units of average attendance:—

(i.) Pupils who are not under 5 years of age on the last day of the school year nor over 19 years of age on the first day of the school year.

(ii.) Pupils in the Infant Department who during the whole school year are not over 10 years of age.

(iii.) All pupils admitted to special classes."

Clause 49.—In the last line after "registered" insert "or employed."

Clause 50.—For the words at the end "be appointed to teach . . . period of three years" substitute "be employed temporarily as teachers."

Clause 51.—Add the following paragraph: "As from January 1, 1932, the words 'be provisionally registered for a period of three years' will be substituted for 'be registered as Provisionally Certificated Teachers' in line 7."

"*Clause 38A.*—The number of teachers eligible for grant at the end of the school year shall neither be increased by any new appointments nor maintained by the appointment of any new teachers to fill a vacancy* except under the following conditions:—

Vernacular Schools.—Vernacular schools which have an average attendance of not more than 80 eligible pupils for the school year will be allowed to count one teacher for every 23 units of average attendance.

For the units of average attendance over 80 units, one teacher will be allowed for every 25 units of attendance for the first 100 units, and one teacher for every 30 units of the remainder.

Fractions of over one-half the quota shall count for an additional teacher.

Bilingual (Non-boarding) Schools.—Bilingual (non-boarding) schools which have an average attendance of not more than 100 eligible pupils for the school year will be allowed to count one teacher for every 20 units of average attendance. For the units of average attendance over 100, one teacher will be allowed for every 25 units.

The quota for English teachers included in the above staff shall be 30 units of average attendance for one full-time or part-time teacher.

* Special application must be made to the Director to fill a vacancy caused by the departure of a specialist teacher.

Fractions of over one-half the quota shall count for an additional teacher except in the case of English teachers.

Bilingual Girls' Boarding Schools.—Bilingual Girls' Boarding Schools which have an average attendance of not more than 90 eligible pupils for the school year will be allowed to count one teacher for every 15 units of average attendance.

For the units of average attendance over 90, one teacher will be allowed for every 20 units.

The quota for English teachers included in the above staff shall be 30 units of average attendance for one full-time or part-time teacher.

Fractions of over one-half the quota shall count for an additional teacher except in the case of English teachers.

In making the above calculations the following conditions will be substituted for the conditions appearing in clause 52 (a) and (b):—

The attendance of the following pupils will be counted in calculating the units of average attendance:—

(a) Pupils who are not under 5 years of age on the last day of the school year nor over 18 years of age on the first day of the school year.

(b) Pupils in the Infant Department who during the whole school year are not over 10 years of age."

Clause 36 (d).—In line 4 for the words "for every" substitute "provided there are at least." In the last sentence omit "Where the number of units of average attendance is less than 80, proportionate."

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended March 21, 1931.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 153 (2 Europeans, 7 Burghers, 94 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 19 Moors, 5 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1931, viz., 282,870) was 28.2, as against 30.0 in the preceeding week, 31.8 in the corresponding week of last year and 33.9 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 119 (4 Burghers, 59 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 25 Moors, 7 Malays, and 2 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 21.9, as against 22.3 in the previous week, 28.3 in the corresponding week of last year and 29.5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 119 total deaths, 20 were of infants under one year of age, as against 25 in the preceding week, 31 in the corresponding week of the previous year and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 13.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Seventeen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 4 each in Kotahena North and Maradana hospitals, 3 in St. Paul's, 2 in Slave Island, and 1 each New Bazaar, Maradana North, Maradana East, and Kollupitiya, as against 10 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Seven deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in San Sebastian and 1 each in Pettah, Kotahena North, New Bazaar, and Slave Island, as against 4 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Four deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in Maradana North, Slave Island, Wellawatta North, and Wellawatta South, as against 6 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Sixteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 4 in St. Paul's and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena South, Maradana East, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta South, as against 19 in the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Phthisis*, of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Four deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents) and 1 in Maradana North, as against 3 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. Three deaths from *Plague* were registered, 1 each in San Sebastian, Maradana hospitals and Maradana East, as against 1 in the previous week and 1 the weekly average for last year.

5. Seven deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 4 from *Debility*, 2 each from *Infantile Convulsions* and *Puerperal Septicæmia*, 1 each from *Dysentery*, *Worms*, *Tetanus*, and *Accidents*, and 49 from *Other Causes*.

6. **Reported Cases.**—Thirty-five cases of *Chickenpox*, 4 of *Enteric Fever* and 4 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 29, 13, and 1, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82.0°, against 81.7° in the preceding week and 82.3° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.959 in. against 29.941 in. in the preceding week and 29.876 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.06 in., against 1.36 in. in the preceding week and 0.02 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

3. Lump sums offers should be made for each item in the schedule and be written both in words and figures. Offers may be made for more than one item in the same letter, but should be quoted for each item separately.

4. In the case of offers which in the aggregate exceed Rs. 20, tenderers may remit Rs. 5 either with their offers or within two days of their offers to the Divisional Forest Officer of the Division concerned. This sum will be returned if their offers are rejected. The purchaser will be given credit for the amount in the final payment for the timber. 5. The species, measurements, cubic contents, &c., of the material appearing in the schedule are to be regarded as only approximate, and intending tenderers are presumed to have inspected the timber before they make their offers and they should bring to the notice of the Divisional Forest Officer any serious discrepancies which they may notice. They should also satisfy themselves by personal inspection as to the condition of the timber they offer for.

6. Any tenderer whose offer is accepted shall, within three days of notification of acceptance of his offer, pay the full purchase amount in the case of offers aggregating to Rs. 20 and as follows in the case of offers exceeding Rs. 25 in the aggregate:—

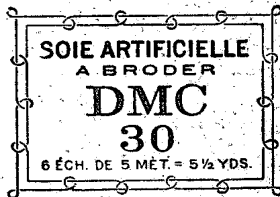

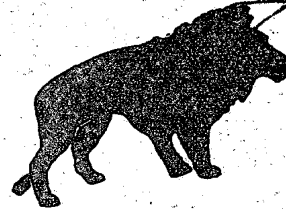

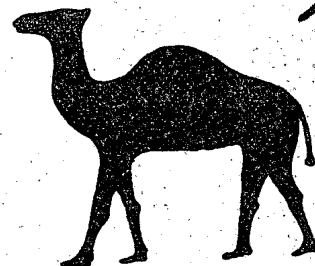

MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, February 14, 1931, at 9 a.m., pursuant to Notice dated February 7, 1931.

Present :—Mr. G. S. Wodeman, Chairman; the Hon. Mr. H. M. Macan Markar, M.L.C.; the Hon. Mr. C. E. de Vos, M.L.C.; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. D. I. Durham; Mr. C. L. Wickremasinghe; Mr. F. W. Sproule; Mr. T. Amarasuriya; Dr. S. P. Joseph; and Mr. P. R. Gunasekara.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of January 10, 1931, a copy thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Mr. T. Amarasuriya asked permission to present a petition from Messrs. Mohamed Sulaiman & Co. of 106, Main street. Permission having been given, Mr. Amarasuriya gave the gist of the petition, and asked that it may be inquired into.

3. With the permission of Council the following question, notice of which was received after the prescribed date, was asked by Mr. P. R. Gunasekara:—*Re* the decision of the Council to charge higher rates within the area bounded by Hume road, Richmond Hill road, and Elliott road, will the Chairman be pleased to inform the Council as to the probable date these higher rates will be levied?

The Chairman replied as follows:—I have forwarded a copy of the Council's resolution for the information of His Excellency the Governor, and applied for sanction to alter the Police limits. When sanction is obtained a water main has to be laid along Elliott road, arrangements made for the conservancy of the new area, and properties assessed. It is improbable that the higher rates will be levied in the new area before the beginning of 1932.

4. To submit the Hon. the Colonial Secretary's letter No. U 314/30 of December 19, 1930, forwarding a copy of the Draft Ordinance to amend the Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910:—Submitted.

5. To authorize the Chairman to apply for acquisition surveys for the acquisition of land for the following purposes:—(a) Opening a new road from Morris road to Hirimbura Cross road; (b) deviation of a portion of Steele road; and (c) site for a public latrine at Mahamodera, including access.—Resolved that the Chairman be authorized to apply for acquisition surveys. It was suggested that in the meantime deeds of gift be obtained from owners who are willing to gift land for (a).

6. To consider tenders for building drains at China Garden:—The Hon. Mr. H. M. Macan Markar moved that the lowest tender, viz., Rs. 7,682.50 from K. G. Silva, be accepted; that 15 per cent. be deducted from each payment due to the contractor, and retained as security; and the work completed within five months from the date of signing the agreement. Mr. F. W. Sproule seconded.—Carried.

7. Construction of drains along Wakwella road:—The Chairman stated that, in terms of the agreement, the work had to be completed on or before October 31, 1930. Council extended the date to December 15, 1930, and a second extension was given to January 31, 1931, subject to the penalty provided in the agreement. The work has not yet been completed.

Resolved that the contract be cancelled, and that the balance of the work be carried out by the Superintendent of Works.

8. To sanction the write off of Rs. 20,690.83, the value of a 100 h. p. Campbell Engine which had been scrapped:—Resolved that Rs. 20,690.83 be debited to Nett Revenue Account in 1930.

9. The Chairman reported the purchase, on behalf of the Council of premises No. 11, Dangedera in Ward 2, for non-payment of rates:—Resolved that the purchase be approved.

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Municipal Works, Finance, and Assessment, and Markets and Sanitation of January 24, 1931, were laid before the Council.

10. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of January 24, 1931.*

(2) To consider the following estimates:—(a) Rs. 550 for repairing the drain along Pettigalawatta road.—Recommended. (b) Rs. 2,500 for the maintenance of Victoria Park, the Esplanade, and public seats.—Recommended.

(3) To recommend 17 applications for water service.—Recommended that the applications be allowed.

(4) To recommend that the excess expenditure on road estimates 1, 3, 27, 31, 32, and 36 be met from the savings on other road estimates:—(1) Recommended, (2) resolved that the Superintendent of Works be informed that no estimate should be exceeded without the previous sanction of the Chairman.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

11. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of January 24, 1931.*

(3) To recommend that the excess expenditure for 1930 under certain heads be met from the unexpended balances on other heads of expenditure.—Recommended that the transfer of expenditure votes be sanctioned.

(4) To consider the Supplemental Budget for 1930.—Recommended that the Supplemental Budget for 1930 be sanctioned.

(5) To consider the suggested rate of 20 cents per unit of electric current for refrigerators.—Recommended that the rate be 20 cents per unit, with Re. 1 per mensem for rent of meter.

(6) To recommend an increase of the daily wages of assistant engine drivers D. A. Elaris for Rs. 2.30 to Rs. 2.50 and of P. W. Albert from Re. 1.65 to Rs. 2, from February 1, 1931.—Recommended.

(7) To recommend that a sum of Rs. 50,000 be placed on fixed deposit with a Colombo Bank.—Recommended that a sum of Rs. 50,000 be placed on fixed deposit with the Eastern Bank for one year.

(8) List of demolished buildings in Ward 3.—Recommended that the rates be struck off.

(9) To recommend that a sum of Rs. 2,835 be revoted for the completion of the drain along Wakwella road (Head 41 of 1930).—Recommended.

Resolution.

With regard to item (7) it was resolved to place a sum of Rs. 50,000 on fixed deposit with the National Bank of India, Limited.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

12. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation of the February 24, 1931.*

(2) To consider the question of leave to the Medical Officer of Health.—Recommended that during short leave, up to a week at a time, a competent Sanitary Inspector should attend to the necessary routine duties of the Medical Officer. In the case of longer leave special arrangements should be made by the Council.

(3) To consider the question of charging rent for occupation by vendors of the vacant land by the vegetable market.—Recommended that in order to safeguard the Council's rights, a fee of 50 cents per mensem should be levied from each vendor, beginning from February.

Resolution.

With regard to item (2) Mr. J. E. Perera moved that short leave be limited to three days. Mr. T. Amarasuriya seconded.

The Chairman moved as an amendment that the question be referred back to the Standing Committee for re-consideration.—The amendment was carried.

The recommendation of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining item was adopted.

13. Resignation of Mr. F. W. Sproule :—The Chairman mentioned that this is the last meeting at which Mr. Sproule would be present, and desired to express his own personal regret that he was leaving so soon. He called upon the Hon. Mr. C. E. de Vos to speak on behalf of the unofficial members.

Mr. de Vos, referring to Mr. Sproule's valuable service in Council and in Committee, said they would look back with gratitude at his connection with the Council.

Mr. J. E. Perera in seconding, referred to Mr. Sproule's usefulness in Committee, the improvements brought about by the tarring of roads, the widening of blind corners and improved drainage, and of the part he had taken in the re-conditioning of insanitary buildings in the bazaar.

The Chairman moved that they do place on record their appreciation of Mr. Sproule's services, and their regret at his retirement. The motion was put to the meeting and carried unanimously.

Mr. Sproule thanked the Chairman and members for the expression of appreciation of his services, and for their co-operation.
