## MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

An Ordinance to provide for the investigation and settlement of trade disputes.

**B**E it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

- Short title.** 1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Trade Disputes (Conciliation) Ordinance, 1931.
- Interpretation.** 2 In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires,—
- (a) " Board " means a Conciliation Board established under this Ordinance.
  - (b) " Commission " means a Commissioner or Commissioners appointed under this Ordinance.
  - (c) " Controller " means the person for the time being appointed by the Governor to be the Controller of Labour, and includes a person appointed by the Governor to act for the Controller during such time as he is on leave, whether within or outside the Island, or is ill or for any reason unable to act.
  - (d) " Trade " includes industry and any branch or section of a trade or industry, and includes agriculture.
  - (e) " Trade dispute " means any dispute or difference between employers and workmen, or between workmen and workmen, connected with the employment or non-employment, or the terms of the employment, or with the conditions of labour, of any person.
  - (f) " Workman " means any person who has entered into or works under a contract with an employer in any capacity, whether the contract is express or implied, oral or in writing, and whether it is a contract of service or of apprenticeship, or a contract personally to execute any work or labour.
- Appointment of Commission.** 3 (1) The Governor may at any time appoint a Commission consisting of one or more persons to inquire into any matter relating to trade which may be referred to it by the Governor.
- (2) If more than one person is appointed in any Commission, the Governor may appoint one of such persons to be chairman, who shall decide the quorum competent to act.
- (3) Inquiries by a Commission may be conducted either in public or in private, at its discretion, and the Commission shall report thereon to the Governor, and may make interim reports, if it thinks fit.
- Constitution of Boards.** 4 (1) A board shall, except where the Controller himself alone exercises the powers of a board, consist of a chairman and one or more other members as the Controller thinks fit, or may, if the Controller thinks fit, consist of one independent person alone.
- (2) Where the board consists of more than one person, the chairman shall be the Controller or an independent person as may be decided by the Controller in each case and the other members shall be either independent persons or persons appointed in equal numbers to represent the parties to the dispute.
- (3) The Controller shall in each case decide the quorum of the board competent to act.
- (4) A board may sit in public or private at its discretion.
- (5) All appointments to a board shall be made by the Controller.
- Power of Controller to refer trade disputes to conciliation boards.** 5 Whenever a trade dispute exists or is apprehended, the Controller may, if he thinks fit, subject to any general or special directions which he may receive from the Governor,—
- (a) take steps for the purpose of enabling the parties to the dispute to meet together by themselves or their representatives under the presidency of a chairman mutually agreed upon or nominated by the Controller or by some other person or body with a view to the amicable settlement of the dispute;

- (b) cause inquiry to be made whether a reference of the dispute to a board is likely to lead to a settlement; and
- (c) whether all parties consent or not, refer the dispute to a board for it to endeavour to effect a settlement.

6 (1) Where a dispute has been referred to a board under this Ordinance, it shall be the duty of the board to endeavour to bring about a settlement of the same, and for this purpose the board shall, in such manner as it thinks fit and without delay, investigate the dispute and all matters affecting the merits thereof and the right settlement thereof, and in so doing may do all such things as it thinks fit for the purpose of inducing the parties to come to a fair and amicable settlement of the dispute, and may adjourn the proceedings for any period sufficient in its opinion to allow the parties to agree upon terms of settlement.

**Duties of boards and publication of settlement by Controller.**

(2) If a settlement of a dispute is arrived at by the parties thereto after it has been referred to a board and during the course of the investigation thereof, a memorandum of the settlement shall be drawn up by the board and signed by the representatives of the parties duly nominated under section 6 (5), or in the case of parties for which representatives have not been so nominated, by the parties themselves, and the board shall send a report of the settlement, together with the memorandum, to the Controller.

(3) If no such settlement is arrived at during the course of the investigation, the board shall, as soon as possible after the close thereof, send a full report regarding the dispute to the Controller, setting forth the proceedings and steps taken by the board for the purpose of ascertaining the facts and circumstances relating to the dispute and of bringing about a settlement thereof, together with a full statement of such facts and circumstances and its findings thereon and the recommendation of the board for the settlement of the dispute.

(4) The recommendation of the board shall deal with each item of the dispute, and shall state in plain language what in the opinion of the board ought and ought not to be done by the respective parties concerned.

(5) The board shall, if practicable, in any settlement reported or recommended by it, nominate representatives of the parties to the dispute for the purposes of this Ordinance: Provided that—

- (a) no such representative shall be nominated by the board for any party unless the board is satisfied, after such inquiries as are possible in the circumstances, that such representative is approved by the party or the majority of the party; and
- (b) the Controller may, after any settlement has been reported or recommended to him by the board, change any representative of a party so nominated, and may nominate another representative, if he is satisfied that the party or the majority of the party so desires.

7 (1) Where any report of a settlement or any recommendation for a settlement is sent to the Controller under section 6 (2) or (3), the Controller shall forthwith publish the same by notice in the Gazette and in at least one newspaper circulating in Ceylon.

**Publication of report of or recommendation for settlement.**

(2) The Controller shall in the said notice require the representatives of the parties duly nominated under section 6 (5), or the parties themselves in the case of parties for which representatives have not been so nominated, to state in writing to the Controller, within fourteen days after the date of publication, whether they accept or reject the settlement reported or recommended, and any such requirement shall be complied with.

(3) Any statement in writing made under sub-section (2) by the representatives of a party duly nominated as aforesaid shall be deemed to have been made by that party.

(4) Any party which fails to make a statement as required by this section, either by its representatives duly nominated as aforesaid, or by itself in the case of any party for which representatives have not been so nominated, shall be deemed to have accepted the settlement.

8 The Controller shall, on the expiry of the fourteen days referred to in section 7 (2), publish in the Gazette and in at least one newspaper circulating in Ceylon the acceptance or rejection of the settlement by the parties, and every such acceptance or rejection shall be effective for the purposes of this Ordinance from the date of its publication under this section.

**Publication of acceptance or rejection of settlement.**

Prohibition of strikes, &c., without notice of repudiation of settlement.

9 (1) A settlement which is accepted by both parties shall be binding on them until the representatives of one party duly nominated as aforesaid or, in the case of a party for which representatives have not been so nominated, until that party itself shall, by notice in writing sent to the Controller, signify to him the intention of the party to repudiate the settlement.

(2) Any notice of repudiation sent to the Controller under sub-section (1) by the representatives of a party duly nominated as aforesaid shall be deemed to have been sent by that party.

(3) If, during the continuance of the settlement and before the end of fourteen days after notice of repudiation under sub-section (1) has been received by the Controller, an employer who is a party to the settlement, in breach of the terms of the settlement, employs or keeps in his employment any workman on less favourable terms than those specified in the settlement, or otherwise acts in contravention of the settlement, or any person, whether a workman or not, incites a workman to strike, or takes part in a strike, with a view to procuring the alteration of any matter settled by the settlement, that employer or person shall on summary trial and conviction by a police magistrate be liable for each offence to a fine not exceeding two hundred rupees.

(4) The Controller shall, on receipt of notice of repudiation under this section from any party to a settlement, inform the representatives of the other party duly nominated as aforesaid or, in the case of any party for which representatives have not been so nominated, the other party itself.

(5) The Controller may also, if he thinks fit, cause the fact that he has received notice of repudiation under this section to be published in the Gazette and in any newspaper circulating in Ceylon.

Means of ascertaining the wishes of workmen.

10 Whenever it is necessary to ascertain the wishes of any body of employers or workmen, such wishes may be ascertained by consultation with the representatives of the employers or workmen, if any such have been duly nominated as aforesaid, or by any other convenient means.

Procedure and powers.

11 (1) The Governor in Council may make regulations, to be published in the Gazette, as to the procedure to be observed by boards and Commissions.

(2) In default of or subject to any such regulations, a board or Commission may regulate its own procedure.

(3) All questions before a board or Commission shall be settled by the majority of votes of members present and voting. If the votes are equal, the chairman shall have a second or casting vote.

(4) For the purpose of dealing with any matter referred to it, a board and a Commission shall have all the powers of a District Court to summon and examine witnesses on oath and order the production of documents.

(5) Every matter before a board or Commission by virtue of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be a judicial proceeding within the meaning of sections 190 and 223 of the Ceylon Penal Code.

Application of Ordinance to persons employed by the Crown.

12 This Ordinance shall apply to persons in the employment of the Crown or Government only if their emoluments are fixed at daily rates:

Provided however that it shall not apply to persons in the naval, military, or air services of the Crown, or to the police or prison services:

And provided further that no action with reference to a trade dispute between the Government and workmen employed by the Government shall be taken under this Ordinance, except by the order of the Governor.

#### Objects and Reasons.

1. This Bill which is partially based on the Industrial Courts Act, 1919, has as its main object the prevention and settlement of trade disputes.

2. The Governor may appoint Commissions consisting of one or more persons to inquire into, and to report on, any matters relating to trade (including industry and agriculture) which may be referred to them (clause 3 (1)). The constitution, procedure and powers of Commissions are regulated

by clauses 3 (2), (3) and 11. It is anticipated that bodies of this nature will be of considerable assistance to Government in ascertaining the conditions of trade, and in the avoidance of trade disputes.

3. The Controller of Labour may appoint Conciliation Boards (referred to in the Bill as "boards"), consisting of one or more persons, and the procedure and powers of such boards are regulated (clauses 3 and 11).

4. The Controller may, by clause 5 (c), refer any existing or apprehended trade dispute to a board for it to endeavour to effect a settlement, whether the parties consent or not. The Controller may also take steps for the amicable settlement of a trade dispute without reference to a board, and may make inquiries whether a reference to a board is likely to lead to a settlement (clause 5 (a) and (b)).

5. A board will proceed to investigate any dispute referred to it, and if a settlement is reached, will draw up a memorandum of the settlement, which is to be signed by the parties or their representatives, and forward it to the Controller (clause 6 (1), (2)).

6. If no settlement is reached, the board forwards to the Controller a full report and its own recommendations for a settlement (clause 6 (3), (4)).

7. A settlement reported or recommended by a board must, if practicable, nominate representatives of the parties to the dispute, the board being satisfied that such representatives are approved by the parties they represent. The Controller may change a nominated representative if the party so desires (clause 6 (5)).

8. A settlement reported or recommended will be published by the Controller in the Gazette and in the press, with a notice requiring the parties or their representatives to state within 14 days whether they accept or reject it. If the notice is not complied with, the party in default will be deemed to have accepted the settlement, and a statement of acceptance or rejection by a nominated representative of any party will be deemed to have been made by that party (clause 7).

9. After the 14 days has expired, the Controller will publish the acceptance or rejection, and a settlement accepted by both parties is binding until either party or its representatives repudiate it by notice sent to the Controller. A penalty is attached to employers and others who act in contravention of the settlement, or who instigate a strike with the object of altering the settlement, while it is in force or before the expiry of 14 days after notice of repudiation. The Controller may publish the fact that he has received notice of repudiation, and is also required on receipt of such a notice from one party, to notify the other (clauses 8 and 9).

10. Clause 12 provides that the Bill will apply to Government servants whose emoluments are fixed at daily rates, and not to others. It will not apply to persons in the naval, military and air services of the Crown, nor to the police and prison services, and an order of the Governor is necessary before any action can be taken with reference to a trade dispute between the Government and its workmen.
