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FINAL ORDERS.**Kalutara S. O. No. 141.****Order under Section 4, Sub-section 1 of "The Waste Lands Ordinances of 1897, 1899, 1900, 1903, and 1927."**

In the matter of the lands commonly called or known as Ellagodahena (reservation for stream), Galketihene-pitakattiya *alias* Ellagodahena *alias* Dolewattehena, situate in the village of Migahatenna of the Maha pattu south, in the Pasdun korale east of the Kalutara District, in the Western Province, and of "The Waste Lands Ordinances of 1897, 1899, 1900, and 1903."

WHEREAS in pursuance of section 1 of the said Ordinances it was duly declared and notified on the 3rd day of April, 1925, that if no claim to the lands commonly called or known as Ellagodahena (reservation for stream), Galketihene-pitakattiya *alias* Ellagodahena *alias* Dolewattehena, situate in the village of Migahatenna of the Maha pattu south, in the Pasdun korale east of the Kalutara District, in the Western Province, containing in extent 2 acres 3 roods and 37 perches, and shown as lots 342 and 344 in block survey preliminary plan No. 109, was made to Walter Terence Stace, Esq., Special Officer appointed under section 28 of the said Ordinances, within the period of three months from the date specified in the said notice, such lands would be declared the property of the Crown, and dealt with on account of the Crown (*vide* Notice No. 8,772) :
